Police up patrol after robberies

In response to a string of armed robberies, the Gainesville Police Department will deploy 25 more officers per shift in an attempt to not only catch robbers faster but also deter them from committing the crimes.

The extra officers have been taken from almost every department within the agency, including personnel, training and administration.

Interim Chief Tony Jones and Maj. Rick Hanna decided this would be the best way to combat the recent uptick in robberies, said GPD spokesman Keith Kameg.

Last weekend there were about 12 robberies in Gainesville with six of them occurring Friday night. So far this year, there have been about 50 more robberies than there were at this time in 2008, Kameg said.

Since Tuesday, there have been 35 to 50 officers patrolling per shift instead of the 18 to 25 officers normally on duty, Kameg said.

Swamp to ban smoke

■ **SMOKING AT GAMES WILL BE PROHIBITED STARTING SEPT. 5.**

Football fans will have to find a new way to relieve stress when the Gators are trailing during a game.

The Ben Hill Griffin Stadium will kick off the campus-wide tobacco ban by prohibiting smoking, while all forms of tobacco will be banned at UF's Health Science Center and all Shands HealthCare buildings as of Nov. 1.

As of the first home game, where the Gators will take on Charleston Southern University on Sept. 5, the Swamp will no longer offer its current four smoking areas and will become

smoke free, said Chip Howard, associate athletic director of operations at the University Athletic Association.

However, smokeless tobacco will still be allowed until July, when all of the UAA's facilities will ban all forms of tobacco in order to adhere with UF's campus-wide tobacco ban which will begin in July, Howard said.

He said the UAA decided to ban only smoking for the upcoming football season and not all forms of tobacco because there haven't been many problems with smokeless tobacco products, like chewing tobacco.

"More of the problems are with secondhand smoke," Howard said.

College wins \$100K grant

Despite its recent ranking as the nation's No. 2 party school, UF was one of five schools named a 2009 Model of Alcohol or Other Drug Abuse Prevention Program on College Campuses by the U.S. Department of Education.

The College of Health and Human Performance received a \$100,000 grant to continue its campus-wide alcohol abuse prevention program.

The program was rewarded for its "Less is More" campaign, featuring ads on buses that featured funny yet pointed messages

like "Sketchy drunk guys... Making girls feel uncomfortable since 1853. Warning: Avoid guys who drink too much."

The school's prevention programs were classified as exemplary, effective or promising based partly on the number of years the programs have been in place. UF's program received a "promising" rating.

While the school has had an alcohol and drug abuse prevention program for a long time, program leader Virginia Dodd said until they received a \$280,000 grant in 2006 from the U.S. Department of Education, they

After girl's death, Fla. may forbid owning pythons

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Florida wildlife officials are considering a ban on possessing several large, nonnative reptile species after a pet Burmese python killed a 2-year-old girl last month.

Col. Julie Jones, director of law enforcement for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, discussed the option with Gov. Charlie Crist when he visited Wednesday for an update on a python hunt Crist requested following the girl's death.

Jones said authorities are considering a ban on Internet sales of the snakes. The commission can adopt a ban on its own, but state and federal legislators also have talked about passing laws to prohibit such reptiles as pets.

Senators allot money to student organizations

Senators approved \$1,971 in aid for student organizations in the last Student Senate meeting of the summer Tuesday.

The money will go to Shakespeare in the Park, Gator Freethought, Word Up!, the Student Safety Research Colloquium and UF's Performing Arts.

The majority of the money went to Shakespeare in the Park, which will feature a performance of the bard's classic, "Much Ado About Nothing." The \$635 will go to set-building materials, costumes and advertisements for the play, set for performances in March of 2010.

Shakespeare in the Park President Joseph Sweeney attended the meeting and performed a brief monologue to encourage senators to vote in favor of the allocation.

Sweeney said he hopes to donate about \$3,000 of revenue from the play to A Spring of Hope, a charity that helps build wells in Africa.

The Student Safety Research Colloquium received \$256 to help continue its research on health and safety issues in Gainesville. Upcoming research includes compiling statistics regarding the midtown bar area, the effects of hookah smoking and drinking behavioral strategies and consequences.

"I'm sure you remember the people giving you pizza outside the bars and asking you about your blood alcohol level," Sen. Thomas Hilton said. "That was these guys."

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act has been a theme in several of the past meetings. With the passing of last week's bill allowing senators to access applications online and the question of FERPA limitations, Sen. Alan Yanuck said he is compiling an e-mail to send to General Council to help explain

FERPA to all senators.

"We've had a lot of questions about what FERPA is and how exactly does it ruin our lives," Yanuck said, laughing.

Supreme Court Justice Michael Patrone responded to Yanuck's comments to explain the importance of the act.

"When you go to law school and take constitutional law, the right of privacy is one of the most fundamental rights we have as Americans," Patrone said. "The courts have recognized that, so don't say FERPA is ruining people's lives. It's actually protecting them."

Several incoming senators and Senate meeting attendees expressed fond farewells and luck for those senators staying next semester.

Former Sen. Scott Cutshall gave a goodbye speech and urged senators to remember why they were elected.

"Students don't care about whether or not they can see an applicant's resume," he said. "They care about getting home safely from bars at night and getting a good degree."

Father John Gillespie spoke at the meeting, which was held at the St. Augustine Catholic Church. Gillespie thanked senators for the attendance and said he has followed the UF Student Senate since he was a graduate student in 1968.

Senate President Audrey Goldman thanked each senator for his or her work during the summer session and briefly outlined her plans for the fall semester, which will include more community service projects, she said.

The fall Senate Chambers commence on Aug. 25 at 7 p.m. in its usual place, Reitz Union Room 282.

Abdul's 'Idol' exit shakes up TV's top-rated show

NEW YORK (AP) — Say what you want about Paula Abdul, but give her this: She makes for great television, especially at her own wacky expense.

The watercooler moments she's provided as a judge on "American Idol" are endless. Like the time she told teenage contestant David Archuleta she wanted to squeeze his head off and dangle him from a rearview mirror.

Or when she critiqued two songs by Jason Castro after he'd sung only one.

And who could forget when she and frequent nemesis Si-

mon Cowell co-starred in an awkward sketch sipping champagne and kissing, causing the studio audience to howl.

But Abdul's latest stunt might be her most shocking. She dropped an online bombshell Tuesday night on her Twitter page, posting that she had decided to leave the show after eight seasons.

That leaves a three-judge panel of Cowell, Randy Jackson and Kara DioGuardi, who signed up for another season after joining as a fourth judge last year.

The abrupt announcement raises questions about the future of the Fox franchise — not to mention her own career.

Ahmadinejad sworn in as Iran's president amid crisis

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — Mahmoud Ahmadinejad was sworn in to a second presidential term Wednesday with a call for the divided nation to "join hands," but it was greeted by protests in the streets and snubs inside Iran's parliament.

The oath-taking ceremony capped a cycle of outrage over claims of massive fraud in the June 12 elections and moved Iran into a new phase: A weakened leadership facing a wider opposition that includes powerful clerics and internal splits among conservatives.

President Barack Obama has given Iran until next month to show willingness to open dialogue after a nearly 30-year diplomatic standoff.

UPD investigation finds officer guilty of battery

A sergeant with the University Police Department was asked to resign or be fired last month after an internal investigation found he was guilty of hitting and kicking a man while off duty and likely lying about his actions to avoid charges.

Sgt. Christopher Avery, who opted to resign, was charged with one count of misdemeanor battery by the State Attorney's office for the incident, which occurred in March.

The internal investigation was released last week.

In June, Avery accepted a deferred prosecution agreement with the state, a type of unsupervised probation that means he must abide by certain restrictions for six months. The charge will be dropped after six months if he has not violated the restrictions.

Michael Weaver, the other man involved in the incident, told investigators he was driving home after work around 5:40 p.m. on March 24

when Avery, not in uniform, pulled up behind him on his motorcycle and began revving his engine to get Weaver to move out of the way.

After he moved out of the way, he said he got back into his original lane. Avery noticed this and pulled into the turn lane then got back into traffic, pulled up to Weaver's car and told him to pull over, Weaver said.

After the two pulled over, Weaver said, Avery looked like he wanted to fight.

"It seem[ed] like he wanted me to take the first swing at him," he said.

Weaver said Avery then kicked him in the groin and threw two punches, the first of which he ducked. The second punch landed between his right eye and temple.

Avery then jogged to his bike and drove off, Weaver said.

A witness recorded Avery's license plate number, according to case records.

Avery refuted Weaver's version of events, telling investigators that Weaver had been tailgating him, so

he pulled into a turn lane and yelled for him to pull over so he could educate him about Florida's traffic laws.

When they pulled over, Avery said Weaver was screaming and cussing at him.

"[T]here was literally spit coming out of his mouth. He was screaming so loud," Avery said, adding that he acted in self-defense, kicking the man once in the chest and attempting to strike him two more times with an open hand after Weaver lunged at him.

"I did what I had to do to defend myself from this guy's very aggressive attacks on me," he said. Avery said he then left on his motorcycle in order to avoid further attacks.

But statements from three wit-

nesses of the events on the side of the road indicated that Avery was the aggressor.

"The guy on the motorcycle just — I just felt he was going to keep beating the crap out of him," one witness told investigators.

Avery was placed on paid leave in mid-April pending investigation results.

"I think Mr. Avery was a good cop and could be a good cop again," said his lawyer, Huntley Johnson. "I think he used bad judgment that day, and he was having a bad day."

The investigation found that Avery "exercised extremely poor judgment" and took actions that "would lead one to believe that Sergeant Avery attempted to allude detection and then falsify the facts of the incident."

The investigation also found that although Avery notified three lieutenants about the incident, it was not immediately brought to the attention of the chief of police. As a result, UPD Lt. Robert Wagner said, the three lieutenants involved were reprimanded.

Avery's is the only case in 2009 that resulted in sustained charges against a UPD officer.

There were three in 2008, including the case of Officer Keith Smith, who was punished for his involvement in the egg-throwing incidents in the Porters neighborhood with Gainesville Police Department officers.

In another case, an officer was found to have made questionable comments to a drunken, underage student at Jennings Hall in September.

The officer was cited for inappropriate comments but was not disciplined.

Another officer received counseling, but no discipline, for being rude and aggressive during a traffic stop.

According to information provided by Lt. Wagner, complaints against UPD have fallen from 34 in 1995 to nine in 2008. He said the new police chief, Linda Stump, has a lot to do with the drop.

"This chief expects more," he said, "and she gets more."

UPD to offer GPD backup in exchange for fire support

■ **THE CITY CURRENTLY PROVIDES FREE FIRE SERVICES TO UF.**

Hoping to make up for some of the \$2.9 million a year in free fire service provided to UF, the city will use University Police Department officers to help patrol late-night parties and the bars along University Avenue.

Maj. Brad Barber said the department will likely provide a handful of officers to help the Gainesville Police Department with its Party

Patrol unit and to police midtown bars.

The specifics of the arrangement are still being worked out, Barber said.

In a June 2008 letter to UF President Bernie Machen, Gainesville Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan suggested a fire fee that would have been phased in over four years.

Machen responded by saying he could not agree to the proposal because of budget cuts.

Hanrahan's letter was written when the city was considering a citywide fire fee to prevent cuts to the fire department. The proposed fee was voted down.

Florida law would've exempted UF from the fee because the campus is government property, but the commission asked if the uni-

versity would be willing to pay anyway.

Although the city has provided free fire service to UF for years, some commissioners said they might eventually consider pulling the plug if UF didn't start repaying the city.

"Ultimately, we may come... to the point where we need to say that we can't do this any longer," Commissioner Craig Lowe said at a November commission meeting. "I hope that's a point we never get to."

According to city documents, UF accounted for 10 percent of Gainesville Fire Rescue's non-medical responses in 2006.

Other state universities, like Florida State University and Florida Agricultural and Me-

chanical University, pay fire fees to their host cities.

City Manager Russ Blackburn said the arrangement between UPD and GPD is a natural one because of the existing cooperation between the two agencies during football games and off-campus traffic details.

It's not clear yet how much UPD's assistance would be worth, he said, or whether it would come close to the \$2.9 million price tag of its fire services, he said, but at this point, the city is not looking at other forms of repayment.

He said the city is willing to be forgiving because it realizes UF has a significant positive impact on the community.

UF journalists react to safe return of detainees

After 140 days of uncertainty, the fate of two American journalists has been decided in a carefully orchestrated visit by former President Bill Clinton.

Laura Ling, 32, and Euna Lee, 36, left North Korea on a private jet with the former president on Tuesday, according to an article in *The New York Times*.

"We were shocked," Ling said in a press conference held Wednesday. "But we knew instantly in our heart that the nightmare of our lives was finally coming to an end, and now we stand here home and free."

At UF's College of Journalism and Communications, professors and students are relieved to know that they have protection even in foreign countries.

"I feel like it's incredible that the U.S. is taking such initiative in our safety overseas," said Katherine Laguna, a junior telecommunications major. "I feel comfortable going overseas to report."

Associate professor of journalism John Freeman reacted positively to the outcome of the North Korean conflict.

"It's always scary when people are doing their jobs and get accused of doing something else that's wrong," Freeman said. "I think it's thrilling when you see them coming down the steps and thinking about what they had to endure for no reasonable reason."

Study-abroad courses at UF are aimed to help students gain experience in working outside of their comfort zone.

"Whenever we meet with foreign journalists in Berlin, they've always have a broad background in understanding other cultures," Freeman said.

Each spring, Freeman takes 15 students to Berlin on a two-week trip to expand their knowledge of photography and learn how to work in an international setting.

"Being in Berlin is always exciting because at one time it was communist on one side," Freeman said. "That thought is always there about the dangers."

The College of Journalism and Communications offers classes such as World Communications and Problems and Ethics of Journalism in Society to help prepare students to work outside of the United States.

In an earlier interview, former USA Today Baghdad Bureau Chief Rick Jarvis said the best way to learn how to internationally report is "just getting out there."

The College of Journalism and Communications will continue its study abroad opportunities with a trip to Brazil this fall.

"The whole concept of study abroad is something that Florida students should do so they can become global in their thinking," Freeman said. "A lot of people are too geared toward the USA only."

Gators fans say social aspect just as important as booze

Chanel Munezero, a senior at UF, eagerly anticipates his annual road trip to Jacksonville for the UF-Georgia game, with or without tickets.

"It's the time to not think about classes, go out and have fun. Of course you drink a lot; but it's about having fun with a big group of people," Munezero said.

In July, *The Florida Times-Union* reported that UF President Bernie Machen, in a letter to the mayor of Jacksonville, called for reduction of the number of alcohol vendors and a prohibition of liquor shots.

Some students feel this defeats the point of traveling to Jacksonville for the game.

"It's like going to a huge party and only having club soda," Munezero said.

The UF-Georgia game is a rivalry dating back to 1915. In 1933, the game moved to Jacksonville, a middle ground for the Gators and Bull Dogs.

"No doubt it's a big piece of history. People think about it as an institution," said Steve Orlando, a UF spokesman. Some at the University of Georgia agree.

Thomas Jackson, Student Affairs spokesman at Georgia, has not missed a game since 1973.

However, the tradition encompasses more than the game itself, with nearly 100,000 fans, gathering at The Jacksonville Landing for pre-game tailgating and then again for a post-

game party, earning the event the title of "The Largest Cocktail Party in the World."

In the past few years, both universities have insisted on ditching the title.

"We don't use that, and we ask that people who are officially covering it don't use it too. We would like to see that name disassociated with the event."

Times change, however, and presidents of both universities have struggled to reduce alcohol abuse.

Orlando feels that past tragedies require a change in the game.

"Sadly, a spate of student deaths that occurred in Jacksonville during Florida-Georgia game weekends during the past few years illustrate what can happen when alcohol is consumed irresponsibly," he said.

Jackson agrees with Orlando's views of alcohol consumption.

"[Alcohol] plays too big of a role, as it generally does in college football. Abuse of alcohol is dangerous, and we wish it wasn't so closely affiliated," Jackson said.

cameras will be installed and how much they will cost, said Sharon Blansett, UF's assistant director of housing.

She declined to give estimates but said the money for the cameras would come from UF's Department of Housing and Residence Education budget, which generates its own revenue, meaning nothing will come from UF's state-funded budget.

Though no installation date is

set, Blansett said, they will likely go up after the start of the fall semester because the housing staff is currently focused on getting ready for the flood of fall students, she said.

On Campus

The department currently has cameras installed at other housing units, but Blansett declined to say which units had cameras or how many cameras are operational.

"[With] some of the best pro-

grams related to surveillance, you don't necessarily announce the locations of the cameras to everyone," she said.

The camera installation follows two recent armed robberies at the housing complexes, one at Corry Village last month and one at Tanglewood Village in December.

At Corry Village, located at Village Drive and Museum Road, a student was walking from the parking lot to his apartment when

a man with a gun demanded his car keys, according to the University Police Department.

The student refused to give up his keys, so the man stole cash and a cell phone instead.

At Tanglewood Village, 2901 SW 13th St., a married couple was robbed at gunpoint moments after they returned to their apartment, according to UPD.

Two suspects stole their wallets and cell phones.

Psychologists say 'let them be gay'

NEW YORK (AP) — The American Psychological Association declared Wednesday that mental health professionals should not tell gay clients they can become straight through therapy or other treatments.

In a resolution adopted by the APA's governing council, and in an accompanying report, the association issued its most comprehensive repudiation of "reparative therapy" — a concept espoused by a small but persistent group of therapists, often allied with religious conservatives, who maintain gays can change.

No solid evidence exists that such change is likely, says the resolution, adopted by a 125-4 vote. The APA said some research suggests that efforts to produce change could be harmful, inducing depression and suicidal tendencies.

Instead of seeking such change, the APA urged therapists to consider multiple options — that could range from celibacy to switching churches — for helping clients live spiritually rewarding lives in instances where their sexual orientation and religious faith conflict.

The APA had criticized reparative therapy in the past, but a six-member task force added weight to this position by examining 83 studies on sexual orientation change conducted since 1960. Its report was endorsed by the APA's

governing council in Toronto, where the 150,000-member association's annual meeting is being held this weekend.

The report breaks new ground in its detailed and nuanced assessment of how therapists should deal with gay clients struggling to remain loyal to a religious faith that disapproves of homosexuality.

Judith Glassgold, a Highland Park, N.J., psychologist who chaired the task force, said she hoped the document could help calm the polarized debate between religious conservatives who believe in the possibility of changing sexual orientation and the many mental health professionals who reject that option.

"Both sides have to educate themselves better," Glassgold said in an

interview. "The religious psychotherapists have to open up their eyes to the potential positive aspects of being gay or lesbian. Secular therapists have to recognize that some people will choose their faith over their sexuality."

In dealing with gay clients from conservative faiths, says the report, therapists should be "very cautious" about suggesting treatments aimed at altering their same-sex attractions.

"Practitioners can assist clients through therapies that do not attempt to change sexual orientation, but rather involve acceptance, support and identity exploration and development without imposing a specific identity outcome," the report says.

"We have to challenge people to be creative," said Glassgold.

She suggested that devout clients could focus on overarching aspects of religion such as hope and forgiveness to transcend negative beliefs about homosexuality, and either remain part of their original faith within its limits — for example, by embracing celibacy — or find a faith that welcomes gays.

"There's no evidence to say that change therapies work, but these vulnerable people are tempted to try them, and when they don't work, they feel doubly terrified," Glassgold said. "You should be honest with people and say, 'This is not likely to change your sexual orientation, but we can help explore what options you have.'"

Study suggests spite is harmful

A new study shows people who witness co-workers being rude to each other experience the same effect as the people toward whom the rude behavior is directed.

Amir Erez, an associate professor of management at UF, and Christine Porath, a professor from the University of Southern California, conducted three experiments that each showed the same result of observers becoming less able to think creatively and solve problems.

UF Research In the study, participants observed a fellow student being reprimanded for arriving late to class while participants in the control group only saw a tardy student be dismissed from class.

Those who witnessed the rude behavior toward a student were less able to recall information and found less creative uses for a brick.

Michael Lillie, 46, Weimer Hall building supervisor, said the study is representative of his workplace.

"[Rudeness] puts you in a bad mood," he said. "It's not professional."

Sunday nights, trash nights, before I roll the garbage out to the curb, I strip off all my clothes and leave them in a little pile on the bench by the front door. Naked, I approach the street with the garbage can, which smashes the grass under its weight. It's one of the busiest streets in Akron, Ohio, during the day. But come 2 a.m., traffic is sparse. After the can is in position on the curb, I don't hurry back to my pile of clothes. Instead, I pace the dew-soaked grass, and I let the night air touch all the parts of my body it normally can't.

Normalcy. In psychological terms, this word governs our existence in America. It's the argument-ending phrase every parent employs with a child who is asking nuisance questions, "Because, that's how it is." It is the understood way of doing things, and if a person decides to go against those societal customs, they are not normal.

Nudity has always been a normal part of humanity. Generally speaking, art, fashion, literature and documentaries about indigenous tribes throughout the world illustrate that point. Not until the Puritans landed in America and founded a country based on a strict moral code has nudity become taboo. That status has held through the centuries. Consequently, being naked in America is not normal.

If a car happens to drive by, maybe the headlights will catch a piece of exposed flesh. The driver will pass by thinking, "Did I just see some nakedness?" And you can walk back to your clothes near the front door wearing only a smile.

The Harvest of Hope Foundation will host its first-ever Vegan Chili Cook-off from 1 to 8 p.m. at The Kickstand, a community bicycle shop, 722 S Main St.

More than 20 different vegan chilies will be prepared by individuals, teams and local restaurants such as The Top, Jones, Boca Fiesta, Booklover's Cafe and Volta, according to event organizer Mike Ferrell.

The cook-off will also feature arts, crafts, ice cream and acoustic performances. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own bowls and spoons to reduce waste. An after-party for the benefit will take place at The

Atlantic, 15 N Main St.

Local bands such as Whiskey and Co., New Bruises, Towers of Hanoi and Hot Graves will perform. Tickets are \$8 for attendees under 21 and \$6 for those old enough to drink. The show starts at 9:30 p.m.

The event will raise money for the Harvest of Hope Foundation, which provides emergency and educational aid to migrant farm workers.

After Ferrell and a friend from Harvest of Hope judged a vegan chili cook-off a couple of years ago, he decided it would be a great way to raise money for the organization.

"We thought it was spectacular. We thought that we could get more people involved and do it for charity," he said.

The majority of the robberies are occurring on or near Southwest 20th Avenue, Kameg said.

Known by police as the Juliet zone, the area was annexed to Gainesville on June 1. Since then, Kameg said there have been about 15 robberies in that zone. Ten of them occurred over the past weekend.

"We will be in zero-tolerance mode in that area," he said.

Most of the newly deployed officers will be concentrated in the Juliet zone, he said adding GPD has seen an increase of robbers in that area targeting Hispanics.

GPD will request \$40,000 from the Gainesville City Commission for the department's state forfeiture account, which is made up of money the department recovers from drug investigations, Kameg said.

Local News "We do not want to use any of the taxpayer's dollars to fund this surge," he said.

Kameg said the incident that sparked the surge occurred last week when a 71-year-old man was attacked in his yard, brought into his house and bound to a chair with duct tape. The robbers then rummaged through his belongings.

The college will use the \$100K for campus anti-alcohol ads, research

had not had much success curbing student drinking.

This year's \$100,000 grant will go toward ads around campus, further research to evaluate the program's efforts and continuing the CORE Drug and Alcohol Survey, which collects data on student drug and alcohol consumption, Dodd said.

"We're very excited to have this opportunity," she said. "It says to other schools, 'Hey, look at what they're doing.' Hopefully our efforts can help others."

Program researchers also plan to begin studying the effectiveness of the taxi stands in downtown Gainesville that provide students an alternative to driving drunk and examine the alcohol concentration levels in underage drinkers using

breathalyzers.

Dodd said the program began research in 2006 to find student perspectives on alcohol consumption, and by 2008, the high-risk drinking rate had fallen by 7.6 percent.

The program also evaluated past prevention techniques and looked at the difference between game-day drinking and everyday drinking to decide on its student-guided ads.

"So far, our research has found

that the number of UF students who are participating in binge drinking is low compared to the number of students who attend UF," Dodd said in a release. "I think there is a misconception that UF is a 'party school.'"

UF advertising sophomore Leah Harrison agreed that while UF deserves its party school status, its reputation doesn't mean that students are careless about drinking.

"It's ironic, I guess," Harrison

said. "But just because we're a good party school doesn't mean [we drink carelessly]. Maybe we're just smart about it."

The University of California, Santa Barbara and University at Albany/State University of New York, were named effective programs, while the University of North Carolina Wilmington and University of West Florida were named promising programs.

Teen country singer to perform at 'Free Fridays' concert

Caitlin Nicole Eadie has more in common with Hannah Montana than she'd ever like to admit.

Just like the country music superstar on the hit Disney show, 16-year-old Eadie is an All-American high school girl. She gets good grades, takes advanced placement classes and wants to go to law school one day. She has a high school sweetheart, and she's on a first name basis with all her neighbors in her hometown of Lake City.

Weekends, however, are a completely different story.

Then she can be found on any given stage in Florida singing country songs with her acoustic guitar.

Eadie said she's shy and introverted, but all that goes away when she steps on stage to sing.

Her mother has two names for her — The hazel-eyed, bleached-blond teenager is Caitlin, and the fiery performer with the "old soul" and concrete voice is Nicole.

"It gives me a rush. Whether I'm singing for my parents or a bunch of people at a stadium it just gives me the best feeling," she said. "Nothing else I do gives me that feeling. It's never enough. I'm addicted to singing."

Eadie doesn't share the details of her double life with her high school friends. She's worried that they won't accept her, or they'll be critical.

"There are really exciting things going on, and I just prefer to keep it to myself," she said. "I just want to do what I do and enjoy it and not have everybody telling me what they think about it."

Eadie's popularity as a country singer is rapidly growing. Her MySpace music page has 25,437 friends, she's on the cover of the current issue of Muse Revolution Magazine, and she recently moonlighted as an anchor for "American Music Video Network," a 24-hour country music channel.

Even though Eadie is only 16, her love for country music started when she was much younger.

As a girl, Eadie heard her grandfather play a cassette tape of "I Will Always Love You," by LeAnn Rimes.

She was blown away by the power and range of Rimes voice and was inspired to start singing herself.

That Christmas, her father bought her a "an old clunker of a karaoke machine. The kind with the speaker on it and the corded microphone."

She would lug it around the house and sing her little heart out to anyone who would listen. Her parents quickly intervened.

"Basically my mom said, 'Listen, Caitlin. You can't be going around the house singing like that. You're gonna have to get

voice lessons or something,'" Eadie said.

She took voice lessons for a month but lost interest when her teacher tried to steer her toward Broadway singing.

"My heart was in country music," she said. "I just wasn't interested in anything else at the time."

Eadie said singing was not easy at first, but her desire to get better, instilled in her by her parents, drove her to keep trying no matter what.

"It was not a natural thing for me," she said. "It was hard, hard work."

These days, Eadie has a debut CD, "Country Girl," in which she co-wrote four of the 10 songs. She performs about 60 shows per year at various festivals and fairs, and she has opened for Tim McGraw and Jason Aldean, two of country music's biggest superstars. She said being a country girl is all about attitude.

"I just live in a regular house with a bunch of neighbors. But the thing is, I'm country," she said. "The way I talk. The way I sing. I've just been around it for so long. It's how I carry myself."

Eadie will bring her particular brand of country music to the Gainesville Downtown Plaza, 111 E. University Ave., for the "Free Fridays" concert series where she'll be playing a mix of cover songs and original material. The show starts at 7 p.m.

Eadie said people can expect some high-octane country excitement, and they should be ready to have some fun.

"I can't describe it. You have to come see it for yourself," she said.





UF alumni holds top post at fashion magazine

"You can't be afraid to reach out to people you don't know."

Cavanna said one of the most important tools job seekers should employ is attending networking events.

"Go to 20,000 networking meetings," she said. "And never leave without asking for one more contact. Eventually one of them is going to get in touch with you."

UF continues to lead its students out from the Swamp and straight into success.

From broadcasting on ESPN to winning Heisman trophies, Gator students prove their success through athletics, scholarship, and perhaps less recognized, their fashion sense.

In the New York offices of Hachette Filipacchi Media, the world's largest magazine publisher, UF alumni Kate Cavanna holds the title to Assistant Managing Editor at Elle.com.

After graduating from UF in 2006, Cavanna made a quick transition to the city. A former advertising major and retail associate, she searched for a job in the city's publishing industry, unaware that the opportunity of her dreams would be riding the subway.

What is now a flourishing career for Cavanna began with a fellow subway rider wearing a Gators sweatshirt.

"Go Gators!" said Cavanna, approaching the girl who seemed to be about her age.

True to the Gator Nation's widespread presence and plentiful pride, the fellow Gators chatted about their beloved community.

When it could have been the end of the conversation, Cavanna asked, "Where do you work?"

Much to her delight, the woman worked in the human resources department of Condé Nast, a major publishing company.

"Lightbulb!" thought Cavanna.

An ordinary transit turned into business, when the two exchanged contact information. Cavanna followed up and stayed in contact every week or two, checking for any job openings.

Shortly after, she snagged a job writing for Brides.com, one of Condé Nast's publications.

"It is all about networking and who you know in this marketplace," Cavanna said.

It's no coincidence that Cavanna's resume is loaded with .com jobs.

"Online is becoming bigger, and people want their information right away," said Cavanna. "This generation is about immediate gratification, and on-demand information is key."

Today's generation is at the cusp of a changeover.

Between the pull of old-fashioned ways

and the tug of technological advance, the journalism industry is awkwardly fluttering between print and digital.

People don't entirely know what the future is going to bring for newspapers and magazines.

Cavanna advises students who face this ambiguous reality to learn how to publish online.

"You will be ahead of the game," she said.

Although the future of her industry is uncertain, Cavanna is enjoying the creative and glamorous opportunities her job offers now.

Cavanna will attend New York Fashion Week in September and gets to work with celebrities on a routine basis.

"It sounds corny, but it's like what you see in movies and are like, 'Whoa!'" she said.

But play does not come without hard work.

Working online, time management is a big issue. Information has to be continuously disseminated and updated.

"Learning the politics for any job is also just as challenging. You're not just answering for the editor in chief. There's so many more people involved."

Cavanna offers a final piece of advice to anyone searching the job market: "People get very strict about 'tracks'. If you are really focused on what you want, then do not be afraid to take different paths because you never know where that's going to lead you," she said.

Courage is essential.

"Don't be afraid to try anything once. Anything you can learn, it's only going to benefit you," she said. "And then you might find something you love."

As Cavanna's story shows, people should never underestimate where a ride on the subway, or any other seemingly trivial events, might take you.

Defend yourself with dignity

I step into the dojo quietly and respectfully trying not to disturb any of the other classes, and I am greeted by immediate chiding from one of the senseis.

"Shoes off! Shoes off!" he yells — I'm still wearing my sandals like some ignorant Westerner.

Sensei Tom Huffman, a wiry, middle-aged man clad in a weathered gi tied with a worn-out black belt to match, stands at the other end of the room. He's holding a broom and has just finished sweeping a large, padded mat.

In addition to Aikido and other weapons classes Huffman teaches at the Unified Training Center, he also teaches Iaido, "the art of drawing the sword such that as soon as the sword leaves the scabbard it is on the path of a lethal cut." Huffman, a fourth degree Akiaki black belt in Aikido, has more than 23 years of Aikido experience, six of them in Japan.

He opens a duffel bag and hands me a bokken, a wooden practice katana. Huffman wields a real one. Although its edge is purposefully dulled, there is no doubt in my mind that he could finish me before I even knew he was moving.

Huffman gingerly slides three picture frames containing photos of his former senseis, now deceased, from his duffel bag and hangs them on the wall. He says they are more inspirational than anything. We stand in the center of the mat, bow toward the front of the dojo and hold our swords laterally in our palms, presenting them to the spirits of the deceased sensei.

Then it's down to business. We walk to the edge of the mat, and the lesson begins. Huffman spends all of five minutes meticulously in-

structing me on how to remove the sword from its PVC scabbard, or saya, which he molded in his oven to shape it to the sword.

We begin on our knees, katana in saya, and Huffman leads me through a series of steps involving explicit manipulation of the katana in slices, jabs and swings.

I earned my black belt in karate at age 13, but it's been a long time since I set foot in a dojo. He patiently picks apart all of my clumsy moves with the bokken as he demonstrates his own ability. As he glides through all the moves of the kata, a combined series of sword moves, his sword swishes through the air audibly.

"You hear [the sword] singing?" he asks. "That's the old sensei talking to you."

For a fee of \$10 per lesson, this is what any first-timer can expect at the dojo. Iaido lessons are held at 6:15 p.m. Mondays and Wednesdays at the Unified Training Center on University Avenue.

Huffman, a Navy and Marine Corps veteran, was stationed in Japan from 1990 to 1997 and studied under various Aikido and Iaido masters. Framed scrolls of their writings line the walls of the dojo along with the samurai code of conduct.

The "live by the sword, die by the sword" idea that most people get from old samurai movies is not what Huffman aims to teach. Instead, he describes Iaido as a non-aggressive form of defending oneself with dignity and grace.

"The more relaxed you can stay," Huffman said. "The stronger your techniques get."

'Peter Pan' play delights

The Sunday afternoon performance of "Peter Pan" opened its curtains to a sold-out crowd of children, parents and those young and old who just don't want to grow up.

The play begins with the Darling children, Wendy, John and Michael, getting ready for bed while Mrs. Darling frets to her husband about a dirty little boy she has seen in and around the nursery.

Mr. Darling dismisses her concerns but is forced to believe her when she shows him the "shadow" the little boy left behind — a surprisingly realistic, mesh-looking cutout.

The parents go off to their dinner party after making sure Nana, the family dog, the children's unofficial "nurse" and the only one who seems to actually care about the kids' safety, is chained up outside, unable to prevent any little boy intruders from breaking in.

After the parents are gone, Peter Pan, played by UF grad Loren Omer, predictably returns to the nursery in search of his shadow. Wendy wakes up, befriends Pan and the story that most of us know and love continues on routinely — flying to Neverland, meeting the Lost Boys and eventually defeating Captain Hook.

What is not routine is the way that

director Erin Kleim executes J.M. Barrie's classic.

The sets, costumes and acting are much better than you would expect from a community theater. The dirty, exaggerated outfits of the pirates and the Lost Boys are a bit over the top, but it works. Pan's costume is classic and effectively hides the fact Peter is a woman. Hook's ensemble is more flamboyant, though, and makes it pretty hard to take him seriously as a villain.

I expected to wince every time someone spoke in the more-than-two-hour production, but the British accents also exceeded expectations — especially for Omer, who was not only pretending to be British but to be a young boy as well.

Overall, the production is well done and "Pan" fans will enjoy the retelling.

Though you should be prepared for mildly abrupt booing from the children (and some adults) in the crowd each time the pirates or Hook appears on stage.

"Peter Pan" will be performed at the Vam York Theatre, 4039 NW 16th Blvd., through Aug. 9. Showings are Wednesday through Saturday at 8 p.m. and Sundays at 2 p.m.

Zumba offers fun fitness alternative

Before Erica Hyatt walks through the door, she is a chemical engineering major. She is a student at the UF. She thinks about homework and grades and meetings for the intramural softball team she is on. But for the hour she is in the room, she forgets all of that. She throws her arms in the air and sways her hips to the blaring music.

For an hour, she is just a woman, nothing else.

Fifty energetic bodies join Hyatt as they twist and shake in unison. Every person dances as if no one is watching, though the room is full of people. The sweat in the air forms a condensation on the mirrors, slickens the floors, but nobody cares. This is the chance to let go and just dance.

This is Zumba.

The fitness class developed in the early 1990s but has only influenced the workouts of gym patrons at UF for about a year. The UF Department of Recreational Sports offered the class five times a week last fall, and it reached capacity almost every time.

Zumba will be offered at the Student Recreation and Fitness Center again this fall, according to Patricia Figueroa, a group fitness instructor and a certified Zumba teacher.

Figueroa described Zumba as a

fusion of all kinds of Latin music with easy-to-follow moves that allows people to feel more like they are at a party than working out. "It's a great way to burn a lot of calories without even realizing it," Hyatt said. "And when you leave, you feel happy."

Marissa Noelte, a graduate student in the Masters of Occupational Therapy program at UF, said that after a long day of studying, Zumba classes helps her to relieve stress.

Before Zumba, Noelte's workouts consisted of 30 minutes on the treadmill or elliptical and some strength training. The monotony made her very aware that she was working out.

"When I do Zumba it is fun and gives me variety, so an hour goes by very quickly," she said.

Noelte said that even if you aren't a dancer or very into choreography, it doesn't matter. The moves are easy to follow and allow you to have fun.

Figueroa said it is an effective workout strategy for those wanting to tone their bodies and burn calories. Zumba is a high-intensity cardio workout, which means it burns calories by bringing the heart rate really high and then bringing it back down repeatedly.

She said people that come to her class each week see visible re-

sults quickly, and she encourages new people to give it a try.

"I think it lets girls break out of their shell," she said. "It lets them be a new person, just for that one hour."



Cooper returning for senior season despite MLB deal

Riley Cooper will be wearing orange and blue this fall after all.

The senior wide receiver will be returning to the Gators to play his final season of college football despite agreeing to terms with the Texas Rangers to sign a pro baseball contract.

Cooper was drafted by the Rangers in the 25th round and has been playing minor league baseball all summer.

NCAA rules allow an athlete to become a professional in one sport while maintaining their eligibility in another, so with the Rangers' permission, the road was paved for the 6-foot-3, 215-pound wideout to return to Gainesville for the fall.

Signing a contract with the Rangers will end his college baseball career, however.

Coach Urban Meyer's statement regarding Cooper's return alluded to Meyer's big expectations for the senior.

"We are excited to have Riley back as part of our 2009 team," Meyer said. "He will be counted on heavily to be one of our go-to receivers. I've said numerous times during the offseason that we need someone to step up with the departure of Percy Harvin and Louis Murphy. We haven't had someone step up yet, and Riley can certainly be someone that does."

That wasn't all. He went on to praise Cooper, who started 12 games in 2008 and finished fifth on the team in receiving with 18 catches

for 261 yards.

"Riley is an extremely gifted athlete," Meyer said. "His speed, size and strength make him a tough

matchup for defenses. Our whole offense is predicated on matchup problems for the defense, and Riley certainly helps do that for us. He is a

big-time playmaker.

"In all of my years of coaching, I don't know if I've ever coached a player that can compete at such a high level in football and baseball. He is a special talent."

With the loss of Harvin to the NFL and an inexperienced receiving corps, Cooper will provide another familiar face for senior quarterback Tim Tebow. Cooper had only three touchdown catches last year, but Tebow connected with him for a 5-yard score with 2:50 remaining in the SEC Championship Game to put UF up 31-20 and seal the win.

"I'm glad to hear that Riley is coming back," Tebow said in a statement. "He has the ability to stretch the field and give us the ability to score from anywhere. He has made a bunch of big plays for us, and I'm looking forward to hooking up with him for many more big plays."

Cooper was originally drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies in the 15th round after graduating from high school in 2006, but he elected to come to Gainesville instead of signing a contract. He was ineligible to be drafted again until after his junior year, and the Rangers grabbed him this time around in June's MLB Draft.

"It was a tough decision, one of the hardest I've ever had to make, but I'm excited about being part of the Texas Ranger organization and coming back and playing football for my final season," Cooper said in a statement.

But the games are played in the fall, and this is where the fall truly begins.


You've probably been salivating since the time you finished celebrating on South Beach.

The last time a team was this hyped heading into fall was 2005. USC came off an undefeated 2004 campaign, and the Trojans' 13-0 record allowed them to hold the top spot in the AP poll from preseason to post-season, a distinction only one other team can claim (1999 Florida State). Matt Leinart won the 2004 Heisman Trophy, and USC won by an average of 25.2 points per game, including a 55-19 shellacking of Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game at Dolphin Stadium.

Hm — a stacked team coming off a win over Oklahoma in the BCS title game in Miami. Sound familiar?

For the record, UF's 2008 comes off as even more impressive based on victory margin. The

Can Tebow win another Heisman?

During his three seasons at UF, Tim Tebow has won, in chronological order, a national championship, a Heisman Trophy and another national championship.

Last year, Tebow finished third in the Heisman voting behind winner Sam Bradford and runner-up Colt McCoy despite receiving the most first- and third-place votes.

In 2009, those three quarterbacks will once again battle it out for college football's most prestigious award.

So the question is: Will Tebow become the second player ever to win more than one Heisman Trophy?

Although continuing the alternating pattern of winning a national title and a Heisman would certainly be amusing, it's impossible to believe it would mean more than a third championship ring to UF's senior quarterback.

Last year, the margin from Bradford to Tebow (151 points) was the second-closest gap between the winner and third-place finisher.

Considering the fact Tebow and Bradford have already won one each, voters may be swayed to put McCoy atop their ballots rather than let one of the two previous winners join Archie Griffin as the only players with two Heisman Trophies.

In 2007, Tebow became the first sophomore to ever win the award, a feat Bradford matched in 2008.

If the argument is boiled down to statistical success, Tebow may not have the strongest case.

First, it's likely the Gators will open up such a big lead on many opponents that the first-string offense won't even play during the fourth quarter.

Second, UF will look to spread the ball around and involve many of its other weapons on offense.

Finally, the ridiculous numbers Tebow put up in 2007 may have hurt him last year and could do the same this year, as matching up to his unbelievable Heisman campaign is nearly impossible.

Granted, Tebow will likely lead the Gators in rushing, as he has done the past two years.

Although his passing numbers may not be as impressive as they were with Percy Harvin and Louis Murphy at receiver, they will still compare favorably to McCoy's.

If voters favor the best player on the best team, as they have done when no candidate separates himself as Tebow did in 2007, then he could very well lead the pack.

The Gators are, at this point, the front-runners to win the national title, and if they make it, Tebow will be the one to lead them there.

Two more important issues will weigh on Tebow's mind this season.

In his last season at UF with his NFL future looming in the distance, he will likely be looking to become a more complete, all-around quarterback.

And as selfless and team-oriented as he has proven himself to be, he will primarily focus on leading his team to an undefeated season and another national championship, cementing his already-impressive legacy.

With that in mind, perhaps the two more interesting questions regarding Tebow will not be answered during the course of his senior season.

Can he become a more NFL-ready quarterback?

And will he be remembered as the greatest player in college football history?

Will the football team repeat as national champs?

From the time confetti was falling on Dolphin Stadium, people started talking about the 2009 UF football team.

The Gators had just won their second national championship in three years, with a pretty young team to boot.

By the time Tim Tebow announced he was coming back (and was joined by Brandon Spikes), college football experts began discussing it.

The question is one that has already been asked a thousand times: Can the UF football team repeat as national champions?

There is certainly little doubt surrounding the consensus preseason pick for national champion.

The four major preseason magazines already released — Phil Steele, Lindy's, Athlon and Sporting News — all peg the Gators as No. 1.

They have been installed as 2-1 favorites by sportsbooks, according to VegasInsider.com. The next closest team? The school UF defeated in this year's championship game, Oklahoma, at 9-2.

At SEC Media Days, UF was the first

unanimous selection to win its division since the league split into East and West in 1992. The Gators also earned 63 of 64 media votes to be predicted as overall SEC champion.

As has been mentioned plenty of times before, UF returns its entire two-deep on defense. Tebow is set to go down as one of the best college quarterbacks ever, and Jeff Demps and Chris Rainey showed they can be ample home-run threats on any carry last season.

The offensive line loses two starters (Jason Watkins and Phil Trautwein) but has sophomore Matt Patchan switching back to the O-line, where he earned All-America honors in high school, and Sam Robey showed he could start at center with a breakout spring.

It should be noted, however, that this is a perilous journey. There has not been an undisputed repeat national champion since Nebraska did it in 1994-95.

Teams easily can become complacent and expect to roll over opponents without putting in the work. Certainly UF's experience and leadership from Tebow and Spikes will help fight that.

The Gators tumbled after winning the crystal ball in 2006 and finished 9-4 in 2007 with a disappointing 41-35 loss to Michigan in the Capital One Bowl. But that 2007 team was much different from the year prior — this time, the 2009 team looks an awful like 2008, only with another year more experience.

Besides complacency, the biggest factor will be the departure of Percy Harvin to the NFL Draft and the inexperienced receiving corps.

But even that can't stop the excitement from fans and analysts alike.

In fact, some people have Tebow holding a crystal ball in Pasadena as such a sure thing that they started wondering if UF will lose any games at all.

The Vince Young-led 2005 Texas team was the last undefeated national champion.

Lost in the midst of last year's now-famous The Promise, Tebow let it slip that an undefeated season was the goal — last year.

"We were hoping for an undefeated season. That was my goal, something Florida has never done here."

Was he just a year off?

Only time will tell.

Gators' 13 wins were by an average of 33.2 points. What about the one loss, you say? Factor in the 1-point defeat to Ole Miss, and UF had an average margin of plus-30.7 points in 14 games.

If you don't remember the fate of the 2005 Trojans, let me quickly remind you. They started the season as everyone's pick to win it all and repeat (like the Gators are). USC rolled through its first 12 games, winning by an average of 28.7 points. The Trojans would later have 11 players picked in the 2006 NFL Draft.

Analysts slotted USC into their lists of all-time great teams before the title game was even played.

The problem was a pesky Texas team. The Longhorns were also undefeated entering the title game, except no one really paid attention because they were facing the Mighty Trojans.

Texas quarterback Vince Young had a different thought, as he passed for 267 yards and ran for another 200 and three scores and Texas won 41-38.

It is the best college football game

ever played (sorry, Boise State), but yet "one of the best college football teams of all time" didn't even win the national championship.

Don't assume another crystal ball is on its way to Gainesville. Don't build yourself up to the point that a single loss will make 2009 a complete failure.

Enjoy the ride. Tailgate. Get to games early. Keep your ticket stubs. Bemoan every score the defense allows, but don't let the game be a disappointment because UF wins by two touchdowns and not four.

If you only enjoy the destination and not the ride, what happens if the destination never comes?

Cherish Tebow's last season. Hold onto every defensive stop and the sideline celebrations. Enjoy the special teams plays and Urban's refusal to ever give his team a full vote of confidence.

On Jan. 8, the morning after the 2010 BCS Championship Game, you might be joyous. You could be bitter.

Just do yourself a favor.

Make sure you stop and smell the roses, and don't wait until a possible trip to Pasadena to start.

a teammate's 14th straight missed runner in the lane — but you feel the results in their expletive-laden rant. Sometimes it's just one four-letter word screamed so it could be heard from Southwest Rec to the O'Connell Center. But The Timebomb always goes off.

THE HIGH SCHOOL STAR: They're often marked by their jerseys — primarily the fact they still wear them. They're generally running the point or making the paint their home away from home. These players are just out of your league, and they tend to alter the outcome of every game they play. The High School Star probably has a 146-2 record and averages 7 points per 11-point game just because they're almost always the best players in every game. THE MAD BOMBER: No shot is out of The Mad Bomber's range, but these players are not particularly efficient 3-point shooters. Two for 10 from behind the arc is enough to justify The Mad Bomber's never-ending barrage of treys. They are the bane of your existence when you're on their team. You've got a wide-open layup, but The Mad Bomber prefers the 27-footer with a hand in their face.

THE ASSASSIN: They take you by surprise with their talent. The Assassin is dressed just like you, wears the same off-the-Foot-Locker-shelves shoes as you and jokes around off the court just like you. This generally leads to a mediocre defender picking to guard The Assassin, a decision the defender will come to regret after one trip down the court. Unlike The High School Star, they don't call home to their dad after a good night of pick-up hoops to report on their success, but their talent is a welcome surprise. Physically, they tend to be relatively unassuming — probably the third or fourth pick in most games. In extreme cases, they're out of shape but have the basketball IQ of Al Horford.
