# UF expands campus gym

■ THE PROJECT WILL COST \$16.3 MILLION.

The Southwest Recreation Center will be bigger and better come Fall 2010 as a result of the demands made by students, UF director of recreational sports David Bowles said.

More cardiovascular equipment and a track on the second floor will be made available to students, he said.

The \$16.3 million project, which is funded by the Capital Improvement Trust Fund, is the solution to the scant amount of cardiovascular equipment available at the center.

Each student’s tuition contributes \$2.44 per credit hour to the fund and goes to build student services.

“The No. 1 demand from students right now is cardio equipment,” Bowles said. “And students should get

# Ride service launches

Gators will have a chance to party with the president Wednesday night.

The Student Body president, that is.

From 8:30 p.m. to midnight at The Swamp Restaurant, Student Government will kick off its “Be a Smarty...Think Before You Party” campaign, designed to reduce the number of student DUIs over the next year.

“We want students to forget about blood-alcohol levels and realize that the only safe amount of alcohol when drinking and driving is no alcohol,” Johnson said in an SG press release.

The “Welcome Back Kickoff Party,” free and open to anyone 18 and older, will celebrate the launch of Fabulous

Rides, a new transportation service for students who are out drinking and can’t drive their cars home.

Students can call 1-866-448-RIDE, and the service will send drivers to meet intoxicated students on collapsible motor scooters that will fit in most trunks. The drivers will then take the students home in their own cars.

Fabulous Rides also offers service in town cars, which are more luxurious versions of taxis, and coaches, which can transport 20 to 30 partiers.

# City muggings decrease

In less than a month, muggings in Gainesville have decreased from as many as 12 a day to five in the last two weeks.

Over the summer, the Gainesville Police Department saw a large number of robberies along Southwest 20th Avenue as students left bars early in the mornings, but the number of robberies has decreased significantly over the last few weeks, said GPD spokesman Keith Kameg.

“But our numbers are still way too high,” Kameg added. “We want people to be very aware of what’s going on.”

UF and GPD are focusing on making students aware of the string of crimes that occurred throughout the summer, reminding them that the summer robberies could

still affect the students.

Although the robberies around Gainesville have mainly targeted students, University Police Department spokesman Jeff Holcomb said on-campus robberies have not been as frequent as the city robberies have been.

**Local News** Only one robbery at Corry Village was reported when the crime rate rose, he said.

Holcomb said the biggest concern with theft at UF was with small electronics, such as iPods, laptops and cell phones, and bicycles.

“Students are now in charge of their own safety,” Holcomb said of the usual fall increase in crimes as students return for

## Retail thieves, aged 53 to 68, arrested in connection with Publix theft ring

MELBOURNE, Fla. — Authorities say they’ve broken up a retail theft ring that might have stolen millions of dollars in merchandise from central Florida Publix supermarkets over the past decade.

The Brevard County Sheriff’s Office and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement announced six arrests Tuesday. Deputies say the group stole about \$1,000 a week in hygiene products. The items were then sold on eBay and at flea markets in Brevard,

Osceola, Highlands and Orange counties.

An investigation of the ring began in March after a large number of thefts were reported at a Merritt Island store. Authorities say the suspected thieves, ranging in age from 53 to 68, pretended to be disabled and used motorized scooters. A 22-year-old accomplice helped them sell the stolen items.

**Bad valve forces NASA to call off shuttle launch**  
CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — NASA called off the launch of space shuttle Discovery for a second time Tuesday after a critical fuel valve failed to work properly. Officials halted the count-

down midway through the fueling process. The seven astronauts had not yet boarded the shuttle for the Wednesday morning flight to the international space station.

"Drats!" said astronaut Jose Hernandez in a Twitter update. Fellow astronaut Christer Fuglesang, a Swede, chimed in with this tweet: "Bad luck again."

It was unclear whether NASA would be able to meet the end-of-month deadline for launching Discovery. Over the weekend, managers said if the shuttle was not flying by Aug. 30 or so, the delivery mission could slide into October because of a pair of upcoming launches to the space station from Japan and Russia.

The problem occurred while launch controllers tried to shut the fill-and-drain valve in Discovery's engine compartment. There was no indication the valve closed, and it appeared to be broken, said NASA spokesman Allard Beutel.



# Senate discusses dropping NY Times

■ SENATORS VOTED TO KEEP SG OFFICIALS' PARKING PRIVILEGES.

After a late start, Student Senate kicked off the fall semester with some heavy debate.

Orange and Blue Sen. Ben Cavaturo proposed a bill that would end parking privileges for the eight Student Government officials who are allowed to park anywhere on campus.

"Rules are applied to everyone regardless of what title they have in front of their names," Cavaturo said.

However, some senators believed SG officials deserved to keep their perks.

Unite Party Sen. Jesse Sherman said he'd prefer if the executives didn't have to drive around looking for a parking spot.

"The decals allow them to get their business done," he said.

After 20 minutes of hearty debate, the bill failed.

Senators also discussed the possible elimination of The New York Times readership program on campus, where SG provides free copies of the newspaper to students.

Cavaturo said some of his constituents have complained about the possible cut.

"We need a true national newspaper of record, which is what students want," he said.

Student Body Treasurer Maryam Laguna, who stopped by the meeting to address the issue, said no final decision has been made to cut the program, adding SG is working to keep both The New York Times and USA Today on campus.

Senators did pass a bill giving the Student Body president the power to issue executive orders to create offices, departments and policies. However, his orders can be overridden by a two-thirds majority vote by the Senate.

During the bill's debate Orange and Blue Party Sen. Alden Gillespy voiced his concerns.

He said SG's legislative branch should not be able to overreach the executive, and the president should not be able to do something without the approval of the Senate.

However, Progress Party Sen. Dave Sch-

neider disagreed.

Schneider said the bill was necessary because it discourages too much centralization of one power.

Debate also followed the Budget and Appropriation's Committee's presentation of the 2010-2011 proposed Activity & Service Fee budget of \$14.4 million.

Although committee chairwoman Virlany Taboada assured questions concerning the budget would be answered at next week's meeting, some senators demanded their questions be answered Tuesday.

## Poster sale celebrates 35 years

"I'm looking for a variety of posters, from pretty cutesy ones to maybe some movie posters," said freshman English major Gracie Svatek.



# SEC Web site highlights academic accomplishments

On game day, LSU and the University of Tennessee are the enemies.

The rest of the year, LSU engineering students are designing playgrounds. Tennessee is helping guide the search for water on Mars.

To show that SEC schools are about more than sports, a new Web site showcases the academics and research at UF and the 11 other South-

eastern Conference universities.

The SEC Academic Network was launched last week by ESPN, the SEC and SEC universities.

"There's a common perception nationally that big southern schools are big football schools," said UF spokesman Steve Orlando. "But the reality of it is that there is remarkable research being conducted at these schools."

Each school has a page containing five short videos outlining exceptional accomplishments.

"You'd be amazed to see how many of our own students don't realize that Gatorade was invented here," he said.

"The goal is to make people stop and think about what their university is really about," he said. Tyson Kindig, associate of university relations at the University of Arkansas, said the

site probably won't change fan fervor, but he hopes it will spark interest in academic accomplishments.

"As a conference, I don't think we've done enough to establish an academic brand," he said.

Researchers at Arkansas recently worked to develop software that scans and then virtually recreates 3-D digital representations of obscure museum artifacts.

Mike Hill, associate athletics director at UF, said conferences like the Big Ten and Ivy League are more

known for academics than the SEC.

The site is a step toward enhancing the SEC's image as an academic conference, he said.

Public relations junior Samantha Fehr said she didn't realize how much research schools like UF conduct until she became a student and saw fliers for research studies.

"I feel like a lot of schools in the South have a stigma," Fehr said. "When you think of Ole Miss and Tennessee, you think of Southern belles."

## UPD to enforce seat belt law

■ OFFICERS WILL BE STATIONED ON, AROUND CAMPUS TODAY.

Buckle up, Gators.

The University Police Department will crack down on unbuckled drivers and passengers today from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. in response to Florida's new seat belt law.

Under the new law, not wearing a seat belt is now a primary offense instead of a secondary offense, meaning officers can stop drivers if they or their passengers are not wearing seat belts.

According to UPD Lt. William Gainey, officers will stop a car if anyone in the front seat or anyone under 18 in the back seat is not wearing a seat belt. Officers will give warnings or citations depending on any previous violations.

"The purpose of this saturation detail is to educate incoming students — not to issue a lot of citations," Gainey wrote in an e-mail.

Officers will be stationed across the UF campus and near the P.K. Yonge Developmental Research School on Southwest 11th Street.



## Lawmakers should ban 'reptiles of concern'

A 2-year-old girl getting strangled by her parents' escaped Burmese python should finally convince Florida to ban the sale of dangerous reptiles.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission has put restrictions in place to prevent this kind of tragedy, but none of them managed to prevent Jaren Ashley Hare and Charles Jason Darnell of Sumter County from mismanaging their pet.

As the law currently stands, Floridians can own a "reptile of concern," which includes pythons, anacondas and monitor lizards, as long as they pay a \$100 fee per year, implant it with a microchip and meet "strict caging requirements." According to an article in *The Gainesville Sun*, Hare and Darnell discovered the snake had escaped from its glass cage earlier in the day, hours before the child was asphyxiated. Vaguely telling someone to store his or her snake in a "reliable" cage is not a "reliable" way to prevent irresponsible people from owning dangerous animals.

We are not against infringing on personal liberties in any way, but this is not analogous to something like the right to bear arms. Guns, like snakes, can be owned by both responsible and irresponsible people. But, unlike guns, snakes can act and move independently of their owners and kill people, like infants, who don't even have the manual dexterity to pull a trigger. Plus, the "right to hang out with snakes and monitor lizards" isn't in the Bill of Rights.

Reptiles such as Burmese pythons already pose a threat to Florida's environment as an invasive species. Now that a human fatality has occurred, hopefully the Florida Legislature will realize that the current law should be replaced by an outright ban on "reptiles of concern."

## Sober Scooters

Students who want to celebrate their return to Gainesville will have a chance to do so safely on Wednesday night.

As a way to introduce the "Be a Smarty... Think Before You Party" campaign, Student Government will throw a party of its own at The Swamp Restaurant to celebrate a new service available to students called Fabulous Rides.

While SG cannot provide the funds to make the service free, Student Body President Jordan Johnson's promotion of the service as an alternative to driving while intoxicated is a good compromise.

Students are already aware of other services that UF provides, such as the Later Gator bus service, but may be wary of them, as they force students to leave their cars at Midtown watering holes if they decide they are not capable of driving responsibly. The threat of towing may be enough to get someone who shouldn't be driving to take a huge risk.

By recognizing the holes in the Later Gator service and promoting Fabulous Rides as an alternative that allows for students to leave with their cars (and their lives), Johnson is showing his commitment to student safety is more than just lip service.

We encourage students to test-drive the service while it's free this week. It's cheaper than a taxi ride, and because it uses your car, it's like having a chauffeur. And hell, the money you'd spend on Fabulous Rides is probably equivalent to the gas money you'd waste circling the same five parking spots for an hour or paying for a spot in a parking lot.

## Internet invites people to gossip more

Sometimes, I think about how much the next generation will change because of the Internet, and I feel old in anticipation.

They'll never know what it's like to depend on the radio or a physical store to select music for them. They might never have to set foot in a library to do a research paper. They'll probably never use paper maps or huge yellow phone books. Even now, I haven't done most of those things in years.

But along with the way the Internet has changed how society gets information or entertainment, I wonder if it's already making us careless about what we say.

Almost from birth, we learn we are responsible for every syllable that leaves our lips. At age 4, I figured out that when I talked back to the babysitter, my parents heard about it. And in my teens, copy-paste instant message conversations and the dangers of three-way calling a la "Mean Girls" trained me to think about what I said. Through the history of the world, whatever was said or written could be traced back to the source with very little detective work, with the possible exception of words written in permanent marker on bathroom stalls. Facebook has an "Honesty Box," where anyone can comment on a Web site anonymously, and bloggers can post their opinions to the entire universe without having their names attached.

On Wednesday, a Manhattan judge ruled that Google had to release the identity of an anonymous blogger who made defamatory comments about fashion model Liskula Cohen.

The blogger, 29-year-old Rosemary Port, didn't admit to doing anything wrong — instead, she complained to the *New York Daily News* that she felt her privacy had been violated and announced plans to sue Google.

What is it about the World Wide Web that, at its most innocent, can turn adults into middle-schoolers? And with anonymity, it is power without any strings attached. It's the rush that comes with writing an enemy's name in graffiti without the risk of getting caught.

Scarily, this loss of accountability brings traffic to Web sites. Sites like [juicycampus.blogspot.com](http://juicycampus.blogspot.com) become popular by promising complete anonymity in exchange for rumors about our neighbors. Rape victims see their names posted on blogs and their characters vilified. News stories about the shooting at the New York immigration center get blown up with racist comments from anti-immigrant readers.

And the public eats it up. We'll talk about how horrible it is over wine at dinner, but we go home to our computers and participate. If Paris Hilton wasn't called a slut so often that she can't sue everyone who does, we'd probably all be dealing with lawsuits.

There are no consequences for those who gossip or slander anymore — only for the subjects of our gossip. The power of ugly language is undervalued because it's so easy to spread.

When federal judges become the principals scrubbing obscenities off bathroom walls, I question whether interactive maps and search engines can outweigh society's gradual loss of accountability and humanity.

without realizing it. I was simply conforming to nonconformity. Letting go of pride in my own weirdness also meant letting go of the fear.

It's surprising how much fear we live with in our day-to-day lives — how deeply it is rooted in our every action. We don't even notice it. I bet at least half of those reading this right now are thinking, "What the hell is she talking about? I'm not afraid of anything!" But we are afraid.

Every time we've agonized over what to wear, every time we've kept our mouth shut even though we wanted to disagree, every time we've made fun of a cultural fad, we were afraid.

The key to letting go of the fear, whether it be of social rejection or loss of identity, is to question everything. By asking questions, we discover our good motives and bad motives, such as fear.

College is an awesome place. For many, it is a new start and an opportunity to let go of those misplaced social patterns kids felt forced into during high school. They go off to college to 'find themselves,' whatever that means, and many return with a new sense of confidence. Some change radically, and some simply become stronger in who they were already starting to be.

I did both. I tend to believe that most people do, and because that is the case, we don't have to be afraid. We're all conformists and nonconformists. We're all contradictory. We're all afraid.

You don't have to be who they say you should be, and you don't have to be who you really are either. You can just be.

# Obama may keep Bernanke

OAK BLUFFS, Mass. — President Barack Obama announced Tuesday he wants to keep Ben Bernanke on as Fed chairman, saying he shepherded America through the worst economic crisis since the Great Depression.

"Ben approached a financial system on the verge of collapse with calm and wisdom; with bold action and out-of-the-box thinking that has helped put the brakes on our economic free fall," said Obama, with Bernanke standing by his side. "Almost none of the decisions he or any of us made have been easy."

Obama made the announcement while on vacation on the island of Martha's Vineyard off the coast of Massachusetts after aides said initially that the president intended a news-free week there. Both he and Bernanke sported the open-collar look.

Bernanke, 55, is credited with turning the economy away from its deepest and longest recession since the 1930s. Now he faces the challenge of meeting White House expectations to chart the economic recovery considered critical to Obama's legacy.

In sticking with a Republican for the nation's top banker, the Democratic president was aiming for stability at a time of continuing, though easing, crisis.

The move was designed to reassure the U.S. financial sector as well as foreign central banks that

the Obama administration isn't changing course on its largely well-received approaches to the financial meltdown and overall monetary policy.

The announcement also came nearly concurrently with a piece of bad economic news. Obama interrupted his vacation to telegraph his decision just ahead of a White House report that gave more bleak assessments of the nation's deficit picture.

Figures released by the White House budget office on Monday foresee a cumulative \$9 trillion deficit from 2010-2019, \$2 trillion more than the administration estimated in May. Moreover, the figures show the public debt doubling by 2019 and reaching three quarters the size of the entire national economy. Also Monday, analysts with the nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office projected a cumulative \$7 trillion deficit from 2010-2019, more in line with the administration's May estimate.

The White House said Obama decided on the last-minute schedule addition to help "put him more in 'vacation mode.'" "There's been a lot of speculation out there, and the president wanted to put it to rest," Deputy Press Secretary Bill Burton told reporters as the presidential entourage headed from the site of the announcement to a golf course.

# Sides react to probe

■ CONSERVATIVES FEEL IT TARGETS PEOPLE WHO KEPT AMERICANS SAFE.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Conservatives and liberals alike reacted critically, though for different reasons, to Attorney General Eric Holder's decision to appoint a federal prosecutor to investigate possible abuses by CIA interrogators in using harsh tactics on terror detainees.

Conservatives, led by former Vice President Dick Cheney, said the probe wrongly targeted those who helped keep the nation safe after the Sept. 11 attacks and would diminish the ability of the government to safeguard Americans.

Civil liberties groups were unhappy that officials from the administration of President George W. Bush were not targeted in the

probe.

Holder on Monday appointed federal prosecutor John Durham to look into abuse allegations after the release of an internal CIA inspector general's report that revealed agency interrogators once threatened to kill a Sept. 11 suspect's children and suggested another would be forced to watch his mother be sexually assaulted.

National News

President Barack Obama has said interrogators would not face charges if they followed legal guidelines.

However, the report stated some interrogators went beyond Bush administration restrictions that gave them wide latitude to use severe tactics such as waterboarding, a simulated drowning technique. Three suspects underwent waterboarding scores of times.



# Brown receives 5 years probation

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A judge on Tuesday sentenced Chris Brown to five years of probation and six months of community labor for the beating of Rihanna and ordered the R&B singer to stay away from his former girlfriend for the next five years.

Los Angeles Superior Court Judge Patricia Schnegg told Brown that he could be sent to state prison if he violated any terms of his sentence, including an order to stay 100 yards away from Rihanna unless they're attending music industry events.

A probation report prepared for Tuesday's sentencing describes two previous violent incidents. It said the first happened about three months before the February beating while the couple was traveling in Europe; Rihanna slapped Brown during an argument, and he shoved her into a wall. In the second instance, Brown allegedly broke the front and passenger side windows on a Range Rover they were driving while visiting Barbados, Rihanna's home country. Neither attack was reported, the probation report states.

Brown will serve his sentence in his home state — Virginia — and his community labor will be overseen by the police chief in Richmond.

The judge said she wanted to ensure that Brown, 20, performs physical labor instead of community service, such as mentoring young people. He will also undergo a year of domestic violence counseling.

Rihanna did not attend Tuesday's sentencing.

# Web site swamped as dealers request clunker cash

■ 665,000 VOUCHERS WERE SUBMITTED.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The wildly successful \$3 billion Cash for Clunkers program has generated more than half a million car sales. Now dealers hope to get paid.

The deadline for car dealers to submit reimbursement paperwork for the federal car incentives ended Tuesday night, a day after the government halted new sales under the program. Dealers received extra time to submit records for the car rebates as the government's Web site set up to handle the program struggled to accommodate dealers' rush to submit last minute claims.

With hundreds of thousands of consumers having already driven off in new fuel-efficient vehicles since the program began in late July, many car dealers worry about further delays in getting repaid for the \$3,500 or \$4,500 per vehicle incentives despite assurances from the Obama administration.

Through early Tuesday, dealers had submitted 665,000 vouchers totaling \$2.77 billion. Many dealerships have worked overnight in recent days to submit each trade-in vehicle's 13-page reimbursement application, including the title, proof of

registration and proof of insurance.

Chuck Eddy, a Chrysler dealer in Youngstown, Ohio, completed more than 100 Clunker deals in late July

and August and wrapped up his final deal on Saturday afternoon. He considers the program a "true, true stimulus" but said he's still owed

\$390,000. "I still haven't been paid my first dollar," Eddy said. "That just makes you a little nervous...It's the best program we all hate."

Jim Arrigo, who owns two Chrysler dealerships in south Florida, estimated his two stores are owed more than \$1 million for 270 deals. He has only received payment for six vehicle sales.

"Thank God that we have the cash flow to make it, but in some cases, a lot of dealers, it's been very difficult for them," Arrigo said.

The government's Web site has been overloaded as more consumers than expected rushed to take advantage of rebates taken off the price of new cars in return for trading in older, less fuel-efficient vehicles. Through Thursday, the most recent data available, the Transportation Department had reviewed and processed more than 150,000 applications and approved just \$140 million in payments to dealers, a fraction of the program's funding.

Some members of Congress have urged the administration to speed up the payment process. "It is up to the U.S. Department of Transportation to respond to the applications submitted by our auto dealers in a fair and timely manner," said Rep. Tim Walz, D-Minn.

The National Automobile Dealers Association recommended that dealers e-mail claims to the clunkers Web site, CARS.gov, to create a backup paper record in case they couldn't get their deals in on time via online submissions.

## Hill impressing coaches, teammates in bid for snaps

With both starting safeties from last year's BCS national championship team returning and on pre-season All-Southeastern Conference teams, Will Hill's chances of expanding his role on defense in his second year at Florida seemed slim.

However, he has proven this fall that he has the ability to be the best safety on the team.

"He's been playing the best on defense — me and Brandon Spikes were talking about it," cornerback Joe Haden said.

It hasn't just been the two pre-season All-Americans praising the sophomore safety.

UF coach Urban Meyer declared Hill a starter for the Gators.

That doesn't mean he has taken a job from returning starters Major

Wright or Ahmad Black, who have missed practices due to injuries, allowing Hill more opportunities to impress the coaches.

The emergence of Hill as a "starter" has raised many questions about how time will be split among all three safeties on game days, but that isn't a concern of the coaches quite yet.

"There will be some point where we have to decide who gets the majority of the snaps, but we're not at that point yet," safeties coach Chuck Heater said.

To give themselves more options, the coaches have had all three players working at both safety spots.

Meyer considers all of them starters and plans to rotate them at safety this season because he doesn't want to have to use Hill at the nickelback too much again. Hill's progress since arriving last fall has made it hard to take him off the field, even if it has meant finding time for him at other spots.

At first, Hill struggled to adjust to the college football grind.

"Last year, he was going through the freshman transition of going through the heat, the pace, the tempo and the expectations of how to play a play," Heater said.

And yes, the pain does affect him, but that doesn't mean it will limit him come kickoff time.


After having surgery on his shoulder, Tebow said he now smiles instead of grunting when he gets hit.

# Fraine embraces role as Florida's primary keeper

## Berlingo transferred to Washington State

Katie Fraine has tunnel vision. And while that may seem like a scary thought for the UF soccer team, considering Fraine is the team's starting goalkeeper, it's the best thing possible.

That's because Fraine's vision has her looking only straight ahead.

"It's exciting for me to finally get to be the No. 1," Fraine said. "But it's also like in the back of my mind, 'You have to keep it.' I'm ahead and everyone else is on their horse trying to catch me."

Last season, Fraine split playing time with Meghan Berlingo. Fraine started 10 matches and played in two others. Berlingo started in 14 matches.

Berlingo transferred to Washington State at the end of last season.

"In the beginning, it was frustrating because you'd get your mind in it for one week and then out of it the next week," she said. "Basically, I wanted to explore my options and see if there was a team that I could make a complete impact on."

Berlingo took it up with UF coach Becky Burleigh and the two talked it over.

"It was an uncomfortable situation for everybody," Burleigh said. "(Meghan) wasn't happy, Katie wasn't happy. We weren't absolutely happy, either."

The switch worked out for everyone involved.

Berlingo said she keeps in contact with her teammates and there were no hard feelings.

"I'm still best friends with all the girls," she said.

Having a two-headed goalie system allowed the team to excel (19-4-1 in 2008), but sometimes the goalies felt they were stalling.

Even Fraine's seven-save game against then-No. 4 FSU on Sept. 7 last season didn't save her from sitting the next game. She had six saves the following game but allowed two goals and believes if she had not sat out, she may have been able to capitalize on the rhythm from her FSU game.

"Before, I felt like sometimes I was playing a bit scared, just because I felt like, 'Oh, I can't make a mistake because then (Berlingo's) going to totally win it over,'" Fraine said. "I wasn't playing to my potential as much as I think I'll be able to this year."

One goalie's transfer is another's opportunity.

"That's a decision for (Meghan), it's going to work out in my favor and I wish her the best of luck," Fraine said. "I feel like I can finally

play the way that I want to play."

Fraine seems to be at ease about being the sole No. 1 and feels her teammates trust her as the de facto starting goalie.

"For me this summer, it was

about reproofing myself and just hitting the nail in the coffin," Fraine said. "Making sure that everybody, hands down, knew that it was my turn and nobody could take this from me."

# Williams sisters become minority owners of Dolphins

DAVIE — Serena and Venus Williams enjoyed a firsthand look at their favorite NFL team Tuesday.

The tennis-playing sisters paid a visit to the Miami Dolphins' complex as the latest celebrities to own a small stake in the franchise. Their deal, first reported last week, was confirmed at a news conference overlooking the practice field.

The Williams sisters watched practice and met quarterback Chad Pennington and linebackers Jason Taylor and Joey Porter. The sisters live in Palm Beach Gardens, about an hour's drive from the Dolphins' stadium.

"To have this opportunity is really where

our heart is," Venus said. "We're South Florida girls. When we get off the road, this is where we come home to. When we come home to Dolphins games, it's going to be exciting."

The sisters are the first female African-Americans to hold an ownership stake in an NFL franchise, the Dolphins said. The NFL has no African-American majority team owner.

Musicians Gloria and Emilio Estefan and Marc Anthony recently bought small shares of the team. The Estefans are the first Cuban-Americans to hold an ownership stake in an NFL team, and Anthony is a New York native of Puerto Rican descent.

Dolphins owner Stephen Ross has also forged a partnership with singer Jimmy Buffett. The Dolphins say the involvement of the

celebrities reflects the diversity of South Florida and shows that the franchise is connected with the community.

"We are thrilled to have Venus and Serena join the Dolphins as limited partners," Ross said. "They are among the most admired athletes in the world and have become global ambassadors for the game of tennis. Their addition to our ownership group further reflects our commitment to connect with aggressively and embrace the great diversity that makes South Florida a multicultural gem."

Serena has won 11 major titles and Venus has won seven. They staged their latest sibling showdown last month at Wimbledon, where Serena beat Venus in the final, and will play in the U.S. Open beginning next week.

Ross, a New York real estate billionaire, completed his purchase of the Dolphins from Wayne Huizenga in January and began a partnership in May with Buffett. The agreement with the Estefans was announced in June, followed by the deal with Anthony last month.

Buffett and the Estefans are longtime Dolphins fans. The Williams sisters said they root for the Dolphins, and Serena dated former NFL players LaVar Arrington and Keyshawn Johnson.

"We're just really excited to be a part of such a wonderful franchise," Serena said. "We obviously love the Dolphins. For us it was an honor to have an opportunity to be co-owners. We thought, 'Wow, this is a great opportunity for us.'"

"It was really a struggle for him, and it took a while for him to get a hold of it."

Hill said the toughest part was treating every practice like a game, because in high school he was able to just go through the motions.

Once he adjusted to the difficulty of the college game, he began to show his teammates and coaches why he was so highly recruited out of high school.

Hill was on numerous high school All-American teams, won New Jersey's Player of the Year award twice and was the highest-rated player at his position, according to Rivals.com. As last season progressed, Hill's

role expanded from special teams to the nickelback, and he finished sixth on the team in tackles with 48, including a team-high 22 special teams tackles.

Hill was able to shine even in his limited role, with his biggest performance coming against Kentucky when he finished with a team-high 11 tackles.

Not many could question his athletic ability or talent, but it has been the effort he has put in off the field that has made the biggest difference for him this year.

"I go in and watch extra film, watch the receivers every day and go out to practice and go 100 percent," Hill said.

I have a feeling Tebow may have a slight lead on me in the toughness department, so if I can play hurt, I'm sure he has no problem with it.

Tebow will have some new injury that limits him in practice this season, but there is no need to worry because come Saturday he will be out there lowering his shoulder into the chest of defenders along with the 21 other people on the field playing with pain.

# Many barriers block path to paying college athletes

Even big schools like UF have struggled financially in the past.

In all, UF's athletic program brought in \$106 million in 2007-2008 against \$98 million in expenses.

Administration and the general costs of running the University Athletic Association used 22 percent of the budget. The operating costs of the football team were 16 percent of the budget, and money for scholarships occupied 8 percent.

Although the revenues outweigh the expenses now, this has not always been true. In the late 1980s and early 1990s, the UAA spent more than it had coming in. Throughout the 2000s, the UAA broke even with its budget.

Only since 2006 has the UAA had surplus revenue, according to the budget summary.

With Florida only recently turning a profit on sports, athletics director Jeremy Foley said there's no chance other schools would be able to afford paying their athletes.

"You'll never see that rule passed," he said.

Dr. Ruth Alexander, a former UF professor and an expert in sports management and finance, said 80 percent of college football programs lose money, including 60 percent of Division I schools.

"Revenue to a college program depends on many factors which change every four to six years," Alexander said in an e-mail. "So many colleges are struggling to just pay scholarships to athletes, let alone salaries."

With such an unpredictable source of income and a large outstanding debt, it would be difficult to generate a fair system of paying student-athletes.

If college athletes were to be paid, there would be several hurdles to clear. First, the NCAA would have to amend its laws, which

Tampa sports talk radio host Dan Sileo said are outdated.

"This is not like 1956 when the first NCAA rules and bylaws were put in," said Sileo, who played football at the University of Miami in the 1980s. "Back then, coaches were making \$15,000 a year and it was a cute business. The education then still outweighed anything the coach did."

Currently, college athletes are not classified as employees, leaving the NCAA and its members free to reap the rewards from their play-

ers' labor. If student-athletes were ever ruled to be employees in court, they'd gain the right to unionize and take part in collective bargaining under the National Labor Relations Act.

In lieu of such a ruling, many proposed payment systems would only pay the athletes who made money for schools, but generally the only sports that make money are football and men's basketball.

To only pay student-athletes on teams that generate revenue would violate educational amendment Title IX, which states that female athletes must have the same opportunities and benefits as men. Sileo believes only athletes on revenue-generating teams should be paid and that Title IX needs to be revised.


"I think the kids who are on the women's basketball team, they're lucky they have programs like Florida football and Florida basketball," he said. "They're getting a scholarship out of it, and they're lucky they're even in the building because if it wasn't for those football and basketball teams, they wouldn't be there."

Sileo said paying players a stipend of a few hundred dollars per month would be doable for programs like Florida, and it would help curtail the under-the-table payments he witnessed while playing for UM.

Despite the fact that larger programs would have the ability to pay more than smaller ones, Sileo doesn't think it would create a recruiting advantage beyond what already exists.

"When Central Florida goes to the Liberty Bowl and Florida goes to the BCS National Championship Game, \$17 million is going to Florida while \$1.2 million is going to UCF," he said. "There's already a built-in economic imbalance in the type of bowl games they go to."
