# NY artist draws 4K to band shell

■ THE PERFORMANCE COST \$70,000.

The music stopped at 9:45 p.m., only to be replaced by cheers of "Encore!" and "One more show!"

Clarence Greenwood, who goes by Citizen Cope on stage, returned to the stage and addressed the crowd of about 4,000 at the Flavet Field band shell Saturday night.

"How 'bout one more song? How 'bout a couple more songs?" Cope asked the crowd.

The music started again with screams of approval, and the free concert continued.

The concert, put on by Student Government Productions and

the Interfraternity Council, cost \$70,000 and was the first major performance at the new Flavet Field band shell. The band shell was completed during the summer.

The Whigs opened for Citizen Cope at about 7 p.m., and, as the night wore on, the crowd thickened from about 300 to about 4,000.

## On Campus

Aaron Crespin, the chairman for SG Productions Music and Entertainment, said he would describe The Whigs as a garage-style punk rock band and Citizen Cope as a laid-back, soft rock band with reggae influence.

Crespin said the bands were chosen based on requests from students and SG members.

# Funds up for UF research

In the face of university-wide budget cuts, outside funding for UF research has increased.

Funding for the 2008-2009 fiscal year increased by 2.2 percent for a total of \$574 million, received by about 2,000 faculty members, according to a university news release.

Federal funding, which makes up 58 percent of UF's total awards and comes from institutions such as the U.S. Department of Defense, National Science Foundation and National Institutes of Health, rose by 4.3 percent to \$336.5 million.

Funding from state agencies, which makes up 13 percent, however, decreased by 8 percent to \$75.8 million.

"Everyone knows Florida has had a

tough time economically, but this is a bright piece of news that is beneficial to everybody," said Steve Orlando, UF spokesman. "It's kind of refreshing, actually."

"The good news is that most of the money comes [from] out of state."

Orlando said medical research from state universities can provide long-term economic stability and growth in a state that relies on unsteady industries like tourism.

Half of UF's total research awards — about \$289.3 million — fund the Health

# Times to return Tues.

Free issues of The New York Times will be available on campus again starting Tuesday, but the program still faces the possibility of huge cuts next year.

When delivery resumes Tuesday, fewer copies of the Times and USA Today will be available due to rising subscription rates, according to Student Body Treasurer Maryam Laguna.

Instead of an average of 386 copies, there will be closer to 300 copies of each paper available on campus every day, she said.

The free papers are part of a \$60,000-a-year program run by Student Government, paid for by student fees.

If demand for the papers is high enough, it's possible to request more copies later in the semester, Laguna said.

"Yes, on [Tuesday] there might be

only 300 papers delivered," she said. "That doesn't mean we can't request 350 papers per day."

The temporary delay in the delivery of the Times this semester was the result of negotiations over the terms of the

new agreement that took into account a hike in rates.

Next year may be an entirely different story, as the current version of the SG budget would cut the amount dedicated for the program from \$60,000 to about \$30,000.

The proposed cut is due to a variety of factors, Laguna said, one of which is a major increase in overhead costs, the result of a recent change in the way UF bills its units for overhead.

Overhead costs, like the use of UF's payroll system, would increase from

## American commander: US on the road out of Iraq

BAGHDAD — The U.S. military is packing up to leave Iraq in what has been deemed the largest movement of manpower and equipment in modern military history — shipping out more than 1.5 million pieces of equipment from tanks to antennas along with a force the size of a small city.

The massive operation already under way a year ahead of the Aug. 31, 2010 deadline to remove all U.S. combat troops from Iraq shows the U.S. military has picked up the

pace of a planned exit from Iraq that could cost billions.

The goal is to withdraw tens of thousands of troops and about 60 percent of equipment out of Iraq by the end of next March, Brig. Gen. Heidi Brown, a deputy commander charged with overseeing the withdrawal, told The Associated Press. First out, Brown said, will be the early withdrawal of an Army combat brigade of about 5,000.

# Women dance on poles for breast cancer research

From the outside, the front studio of the Unified Training Center looked like just another stop on Gainesville's monthly Art Walk.

But the art on display at the center Friday night was not of prints or paintings. This art was in motion. Students and teachers of Studio Sensuale, a company that gives lessons in burlesque and pole dancing, showed off their moves on one of the polished metal poles affixed to the room's ceiling and floor.

"[Pole dancing] is about stripping off your layers and drinking in your sensuality," said Mary Jane Brunel, owner of French Addiction lingerie store and Studio Sensuale.

But Friday, the women in provocative clothing and towering heels danced for more than personal satisfaction. The dance showcase served as a fundraiser. Raffle tickets for various prizes were sold and money was collected for breast cancer patients and research.

Brunel, whose close friend is a breast cancer survivor, wanted to donate to the cause.

"It's a very stressful transition from normal, everyday life to being a struggle to survive," Brunel said.

Studio Sensuale, which calls itself a "stripper school for beginners," has offered pole dancing lessons for about a year. The \$100 made from the first class was donated to breast cancer research,

and Friday's event collected about \$500.

"Pole dancing has all this baggage associated with it — dirty strip clubs, dirty old men — but that's not what it's about," instructor Rebecca

Butler said. "It helps [women] feel good about themselves."

Pop music set the mood as Butler took a spin on the pole to show the crowd what dancing is all about. In seven-and-a-half-inch

heels, she climbed up the pole with little effort, flipped herself and slid elegantly down. For two minutes, she spun and shook, a smile never leaving her face.

There were women and men, young and old, patrons of Studio Sensuale and curious locals who stumbled upon the event as they walked down West University Avenue. Nevertheless, viewers said they were wowed by Butler's flexibility and grace. They eagerly applauded her and chanted, "Go girl!" when she pulled off an especially gravity-defying twirl.


By the time Butler finished her demonstration, sweat had gathered on her forehead, and she sipped ice water in an attempt to cool off.

"It's not only fun and sexy, but it's also a good workout," she said.

The fundraiser was also a kick-off for Studio Sensuale's new home in the center. Classes were once taught in French Addiction. With only one pole in the shop and the burden of reorganizing racks of undergarments to make room for dancing before each class, it was a crowded location.

The new center lends more poles and more space to move.

Brunel said she plans to keep hosting fundraisers while helping women "into their femininity, their diva, their goddess side" through pole dancing.

# Bartending class to start

Hurry up, Gainesville residents who are 21 and older — registration for the home bartending class begins today at 10 a.m.

Home bartending is the most popular leisure course and fills up within the first 15 minutes, said Beth Waltrip, director for campus programs.

The class meets two hours a week for six weeks on Tuesday or Wednesday from 7 to 9 p.m. in the Reitz Union basement.

Course instructor John "Wonton" Gillooly said the class gives students the opportunity to learn the finer ways of drinking and the skills for becoming a successful bartender. Gillooly has traveled around Florida as a bartender for 12 years and has worked for various liquor distributors for more than 10 years.

The first class of each session covers the topic of alcohol consumption and the effects of alcohol on the body. Each succeeding week covers one specific type of alcohol, the history, how it is made, specific drink combinations and tasting.

Students will sample wine, beer, dark whiskey, vodka, gin, rum and tequila.

Gillooly said responsible drinking is his No. 1 priority.

"You don't need 25 drinks to have a good time — only one good drink," he said, adding he will cut students off if they look like they've had too much to drink.

Although applicants don't have to attend UF, they must be at least 21 to register for the class.

# UF shoots down Tebow-themed event

The promotion, which was changed to "What Would T.T. Do?" night, included a man walking on water, promise rings and a ceremonial jump pass with a football instead of a first pitch.

Initial ideas for the event also included a live circumcision, according to news reports. The idea was reportedly rejected by management.

In an e-mail sent to the team Wednesday, UF stated Tebow would have been ruled ineligible under NCAA rules if the promotion had used his name. Stacey Osburn, a NCAA spokeswoman, however, said the rule merely states that the student-athlete or the school must make an attempt to stop the commercial use of the student's name. UF fulfilled that obligation when it sent the letter, Osburn said.

Gary Sharp, director of promotions for the Fort Myers Miracle baseball team, said the event was meant to poke fun at overzealous Tebow fans.

"It was more a night of us mocking how people treat [Tebow] and put him on a pedestal," Sharp said.

# Volunteers renovate center for disabled

About a dozen volunteers gathered Saturday afternoon to plaster, paint and carpet areas of the Arc of Alachua County, an organization that serves the developmentally disabled community of Alachua.

Health Oriented Professional Engineering Society, or HOPES, UF's engineering and health organization, collaborated with volunteers from UF's Biomedical Engineering Society and Home Depot's community service branch, Team Depot, to renovate the 20-year-old building.

The volunteers carpeted an exercise

room and redesigned the courtyard, incorporating new benches and a garden, which will attract seasonal populations of butterflies year-round. The group worked from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

HOPES will come back Sept. 10 to teach the regulars of the Arc minimal methods needed to maintain the courtyard. Development Director Bonnie Flynn said the group approached her last spring with the offer to restore the facility.

Luan Chau, the club's president, said the project received assistance from Paul Hirneise, a general contractor, and plant expert Mary Brandenburg.

HOPES treasurer and fundraising chairwoman Samantha Smith has a developmentally disabled brother who has had a great impact on her support of the Arc project.

"I know how hard it is for developmentally disabled people to get jobs and hold them," Smith said.

The Arc is the only center of its kind in Alachua, providing entertainment, education and employment for 200 to 300 developmentally disabled Alachua County residents.

Flynn is enthusiastic about the change.

"The exercise room is going to be beautiful," she said.



Science Center, according to the news release. Some of the center's studies focus on blindness, hypertension and smoking cessation.

Fifteen million dollars of the College of Engineering's \$72.8 million in awards is for developing alternative energy sources through the Florida Energy Systems Consortium.

The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences was awarded \$47.9 million. Some of the CLAS awards went to physics department research on gravitational waves, funding for which reached nearly \$4 million last year.

The Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences received \$120.1 million, some of which will be used to study the citrus genome and improve the flavor of tomatoes.

UF Vice President of Research Win Phillips said some of the faculty research funded by the awards can stimulate the economy by creating products that can be patented and sold, creating more jobs.

"The good news is that most of the money comes [from] out of state," Phillips said.

The university community — everyone from construction workers to graduate students — will benefit from UF's status as a large research enterprise, Phillips said.

UF's awards fund the construction of new buildings, such as the Pathogen Research Facility near the Genetics Cancer Research Center, which will provide research space. Graduate students are paid by research grants from the award funds to carry out the research

while undergraduates have access to the technology.

Phillips believes the faculty's energy and competitive spirit was a major factor in bringing in more outside funds.

"Our faculty are trying very hard because we believe in solving problems in our nation and world," Phillips said.

\$50,000 to more than \$400,000 under the proposed SG budget, which hasn't been passed yet.

Under the current plan, half of the increase would be taken from SG reserves for the first year, Laguna said.

The first vote on the 2010-

2011 budget is Tuesday, she said, and things could change before the final budget is passed.

### Student Government

Laguna said no decisions have been made about how the newspaper program would change under the proposed budget,

but she is hoping to find funding for the program before it is cut in half. Asked if one paper would be more likely to be cut than the other based on popularity, she said the numbers indicate that both papers are equally as popular.

"There's two different papers for two different types of people," she said.

# Beer Fear

## Orange and blue cans will not promote drinking

**B**ernie Machen can't make up his mind about drinking. Budweiser planned on releasing a number of "Fan Cans" in university colors for the start of college football season. One of the cans was set to be in orange and blue until Machen intervened on the basis that the promotion associated UF with drinking.

A quick look around the UF Bookstore, though, reveals a veritable industry revolving around the use of UF's colors and logo to peddle alcohol paraphernalia. Shot glasses, wine stoppers and Pilsner glasses can be found plastered with Gators insignia and the colors Machen said he was so intent on preserving.

Apart from the paraphernalia, UF offers a leisure course in bartending. Granted, the course has an age requirement, but the bookstore items can be used by anyone, including underage drinkers. It seems contradictory to try to disassociate UF from its party-school reputation and not have any qualms about teaching UF students how to channel their inner Tom Cruise in "Cocktail."

If Machen wants to take a hard stance against drinking, so be it. He should, however, follow through in all situations, including ones that profit UF. We think Machen's stance is extreme and unnecessary. Remember the collective container fiasco from last year? What about the proposed crackdown on drinking at the UF-Georgia game? We would at least like to see some consistency from him.

Underage students are going to drink on game day and every other day, too. Machen's theory that Fan Cans promote underage drinking is analogous to saying that 19- and 20-year-olds are more susceptible to color imagery than 21-year-olds or that Obama's beer summit will encourage drinking among diplomats. The cans might make Budweiser's sales go up in Gainesville around game day, but they would have zero effect on the number of underage drinkers.

Hell, if anything, the can would be more appealing to the alumni who arrive in Gainesville with 97 different types of Gators merchandise plastered all over their Suburbans than to a kid who wouldn't even question the "drinkability" of a partially-fermented Capri Sun.

Besides, Budweiser has already advertised in Gainesville. A billboard by Original Pizza Palace on 13th Street displayed an ice-cold Bud with the text "game day drinkability" in huge, white font all through the last football season.

What's the difference between a billboard and a can? How can the UF Bookstore sell so many products that promote drinking, while a Budweiser can with orange and blue colors crosses some sort of nebulously defined line? How can UF be against drinking culture while they offer a class that promotes drinking culture?

Apparently Bernie Machen is the only one who can make these reconcile.

Machen needs to recognize that changing the colors of a beer can isn't going to transform a Puritan into a binge drinker, but mostly he needs to either back down from his attempts to curtail drinking or pursue them enough that they can actually coalesce into an easily recognizable stance.



## Dems do little to combat craziness



**Students should rally to permanently reinstate newspaper**

In Friday's edition of the Alligator, Student Body Treasurer Maryam Laguna wrote that The New York Times would be restored to newspaper boxes on campus starting Tuesday. However, what she didn't mention is that despite the temporary return of the Times, the readership program has been cut from Student Government's proposed budget.

The Times is a respected newspaper that many students on campus use to stay informed. Fifteen hundred people have already joined a Facebook group to save the Times at UF. One student even said that the Times was the only thing SG ever directly did for her. Why then is it the first thing to go? The Times' presence is part of what makes UF a true uni-

versity. Access to information is part of the academic experience, and students deserve a reputable national newspaper.

This cut comes from the Student Senate's budget committee and its chairman, Virlaney Taboada (Unite Party — District D), the same group that tried to defund several student organizations last year. In a \$14.4 million budget, why are the services that actually benefit real, ordinary students the first to go?

The budget committee suggested that the online version of the Times will suffice, but having articles online and an actual newspaper in your hand are two different things. Even worse than the committee's choice to cut the Times is that they left huge examples

of wasteful spending on the books. If cut, this could easily cover the cost of the Times readership program. The so-called "SG Master Plan," which according to Laguna will be used to hire consultants to make an "assessment of Student Government" and "evaluate how Student Government operates," remains in the budget for \$35,000. And the \$50,000 in the previous year's "Master Plan"? That's being used to "give us an idea of the services/space we would need if a new Student Union was built." Give me a break.

As a student senator, I promise to vote against any budgets cutting the Times and to

keep wasteful spending, like the SG "Master Plan" and perks for SG officials, on the books. I invite any senator, regardless of party, to join me in this pledge. However, the few senators who support the Times cannot do this alone.

# Gators sweep opening matches

Florida ended the weekend with the same amount of downed sets as when they began it — zero.

The No. 8 UF volleyball team (2-0) began the season on a high note as it swept UNLV 3-0 (25-16, 25-23, 25-19) on Friday and Colorado 3-0 (25-20, 25-22, 25-15) on Saturday in the Campus USA Credit Union Invitational in the O'Connell Center.

"This was a good opening weekend for us — a good little practice run," senior libero Elyse Cusack said. "I think now that we put this under our belt, we feel a little more confidence."

The Gators two-setter offense featuring Brynja Rodgers and Kelly Murphy was a success, as it led to 74 assists combined between the two players over the weekend. The versatility of Murphy, who can play setter along with the right hitter position, gives UF the flexibility to play this type of scheme.

But even coach Mary Wise didn't know whether to expect this type of success from the offense due to Rodgers' arrival in Gainesville late this summer after transferring from New Mexico State.

"The key player has been Rodgers," Wise said. "She's been here all of three weeks with these players. Imagine starting a freshman quarterback who didn't enroll early. That's what it would be like."

On the other hand, Wise expected this from Rodgers' counterpart. She even admitted to sometimes expecting too much from Murphy, who won the AVCA National Freshman of the Year award last season.

# Hyde lifts UF to late win vs. USF

A pair of second-half goals from midfielders Lauren Hyde and Tahnai Annis helped the No. 7 Florida soccer team overcome an early deficit, spoiling South Florida's upset bid 2-1.

The Bulls (1-1-0) surprised UF (3-0-0) at the end of the first half when Noelle Pineiro snuck into the box and put the ball past keeper Katie Fraine with 35 seconds left in the half. Up until that point, the Gators controlled the tempo of the game.

"In our sport, you can play better than the other team and end up losing," Fraine said.

Just before the goal, Hyde shifted from midfield to defense as part of coach Becky Burleigh's rotation. Hyde blamed herself and vowed to make up for it.



"I told my teammates, 'I'm going to score six goals if I have to. I'm not losing this game,'" she said.

Considering that would be six more goals than she had scored in her four-year career, Hyde's promise was lofty. But she came through when she bent a free kick into the upper-right corner in the 50th minute from 25 yards out, tying the game. It was the third goal resulting from Gators free kicks this weekend, including two Friday night that lifted UF past Florida International 3-0.

"(Assistant coach) Alan (Kirkup) yelled at me, 'Kick it hard,' because that's the main thing we focus on when we go up there," Hyde said. "We know how to kick it, but we usually don't kick it hard enough."

Hyde has received numerous accolades during her four-year career, but had never scored a goal until Sunday. She was a prominent defender for UF,

# Debose's injury could require surgery

## SENIOR LINEBACKER DUSTIN DOE RETURNED TO PRACTICE.

Andre Debose might be following in Percy Harvin's footsteps after all.

During his time at UF, Harvin dealt with frequent injuries that seemed to outlive their original diagnoses, and his expected replacement is facing the same thing now.

The talented freshman receiver has struggled with a hamstring injury this offseason, and coach Urban Meyer said it appears to be more serious than he originally thought.

"It's a real injury," Meyer said Saturday. "We were worried it was just a tight hamstring, a hamstring pull or a hamstring strain. It might be something more. We'll have more details on Monday."

Meyer added that it could be a torn tendon, which he believes Debose suffered in his high school state track meet.

**DOE RETURNS:** Senior linebacker Dustin Doe returned to practice Friday, Meyer said.

Doe was suspended in July after an arrest for repeatedly driving with a suspended license, and after his return, he worked on conditioning during practice. On Saturday, Doe practiced with the

second-team defense, joining fellow linebackers Lorenzo Edwards and Jon Bostic, who had the black stripe removed from his helmet.

Meyer said he'll announce Doe's status for the upcoming games next week.

**MCCRAY IN CAST:** Sophomore linebacker Lerentee McCray broke a bone in his right hand but practiced with the team on Saturday.

"He has a broken bone with a big club on it, but he goes as hard as he can," Meyer said. "I love Lerentee."

McCray saw action mostly on special teams during his freshman season, but the coaching staff has praised his ability to pass rush off the edge in three-downlineman sets and said he could see increased playing time in that role.

"I think we are guilty of that with Murphy because of the type of elite plays she can make," Wise said.

Murphy enjoyed a tremendous start to her season over the weekend and was named the MVP of the tournament.

She tallied a total of 27 kills, 34 assists and eight digs in the two-day event and fell

only three digs short of notching her seventh career triple-double on Saturday.

Benefiting from the assists Murphy and Rodgers dished out were sophomore outside hitters Kristy Jaeckel and Colleen Ward, who combined for 44 kills in the two matches.

Ward especially came on strong late Saturday, as she recorded eight kills and four digs in the third set. She finished the match with 12 kills and 11 digs for her first career

double-double.

"If you talk to our strength coach, Matt DeLancey, he would say Ward had the most productive summer out of all of them," Wise said. "In terms of how much she's improved and what she was able to accomplish, she worked really hard."

earning third-team All-America honors in 2007, but coach Becky Burleigh moved her to midfield this season to get her more involved with the offense.

The game remained tied until the 78th minute, when sophomore Jazmyne Avant crossed the ball to Hyde.

Hyde's shot was deflected, but Annis corralled the ball and knocked it in from 8 yards out.

Burleigh put an emphasis on attacking early in the game, and UF had opportunities from the beginning.

Angela Napolitano was the most creative player on the field and set up Ashlee Elliott and Jessica Eicken with good shots in the first five minutes.

Although the Gators looked dominant, they struggled to find the net as USF goalkeeper Mallori

Lofton-Malachi played well between the posts.

Lofton-Malachi, who had a 0.88 goals-against average last year, saved all four UF shots on goal in the first half and cut off Lindsay Thompson's angle to the goal when she got past the defense, forcing the shot wide.

Fraine said she tried to raise her own game watching Lofton-Malachi, whom Fraine shared playing time with during the summer for the Tampa Bay Hellenic of the United Soccer Leagues.

UF lost a valuable offensive weapon when Elliott, who was involved in the Gators' first two scoring opportunities, went down in the 16th minute after trying to use her size to power through the USF defense.

It was determined she had a left knee sprain, and Burleigh said the injury's severity would be known later.

**JUMPBALL****How much of its arsenal should UF show against Charleston Southern?**

Florida's backups could beat Charleston Southern on Saturday.

I don't think anyone would consider that much of an outlandish statement, but to drive the point home, here's the score from the Buccaneers' 2008 season opener:

Miami 52, Charleston Southern 7.

The same Hurricanes team turned around a week later and lost 26-3 inside The Swamp.

So there will be no Appalachian State-Michigan repeat here. Not even a hint of it.

Charleston Southern is much worse than Appalachian State, and the Gators are a lot better than the Wolverines (Florida isn't a 63-point favorite for nothing).

So Tim Tebow doesn't need to be on Florida Field past the opening 15 minutes. Neither do Brandon Spikes, the Pounceys or any other veteran starter. In fact, anyone with a hint of an injury (the things football players routinely play through) should watch the last three quarters from the bench.

The reasoning is the same as the Orange and Blue Debut or a preseason NFL game — why risk an injury? Why show wrinkles or tricks up your sleeve?

Obviously Florida-Charleston Southern will count in the record books, and spring games and pro preseason games do not, but the outcome is not in doubt here.

That's why the Gators shouldn't waste anything special on the Buccaneers. No fake punts, double reverses or anything of the sort. These plays depend on the element of surprise, and that is worth more than the ability for coaches to see how something would work. Don't give opponents the film. Save the tricks for a key moment.

Just let the basic offense and defense do the work. Run the spread and show off the ri-

dicrous speed Florida has. Let the defensive line rush four guys and pressure the quarterback. Maybe even sprinkle in a basic blitz to give the defense a chance for a big play. But nothing more.

I'm not calling for players to play scared, but smart. Tebow, it really is OK to slide. The following 13 games are much more worthwhile than running over a Charleston Southern linebacker for a few extra yards.

Keep it controlled. The Gators don't need SportsCenter Top 10 plays after Saturday's game. They need a team healthy and focused enough to continue one of the most anticipated seasons in program history.

A win against Charleston Southern won't make the team any more focused, but erring on the safe side can help ease the risk of trainers having to tend to an injured Gator.

I realize injuries can happen at any given moment in a season, but with a veteran team that's been there before, the Gators don't need to open themselves to any more liability than necessary.

Get Tebow and the first-team offense a few series to sync and see kinks that need to be worked out in practice.

Let the starting defense show how ferocious it is going to be. Then have the very-capable backups (and third-stringers for that matter) do the work and see if they can keep the shutout going.

There will be plenty of plundering against the Buccaneers on Saturday.

Just let the backups do the heavy lifting.

Since moving into my new house this semester, I've started playing a lot of ping pong with four of my roommates.

The competition has been generally balanced, but there is one roommate who is a little bit behind the big four — think Man U, Arsenal, Chelsea and Liverpool.

Every time I play that roommate — Sunderland, let's say — I use it as a time to develop my game. There's little to no chance of me losing to him, so maybe I bust out a new serve or attempt a slam I wouldn't normally try. My forehand is a little weak, so I try to force myself to hit more forehands against him.

Now, I have developed a stronger serve and a serviceable forehand for whenever I play the big boys.

That is exactly how Florida should treat the upcoming Charleston Southern game.

There's little to no chance of an App State-level upset happening, but that doesn't mean there isn't something to gain from playing a team like the Bucs to open up the new season's schedule.

Try Joe Haden at quarterback, see how a three-man defensive line looks or get a new offensive package some work in a low-pressure environment.

Urban Meyer and the coaching staff think that stuff might help them win down the road, but they can't really be sure.

What could be a better idea than experimenting in a game that you will probably win 999 times out of 1,000?

Sure, Haden could get hurt playing

quarterback, but he could get hurt playing cornerback, too.

If you think the benefit you will receive from having him play in a real game situation outweighs the injury risk, then it makes sense to use

him.

Charleston Southern is still a better litmus test than practice, if for no other reason than the 90,000 screaming fans causing an intense, pressure-filled atmosphere.

Another plus to experimenting this weekend: It gives the coaches one more chance to throw the new stuff out if it doesn't work.

If the under-center package looks limiting and unsuccessful against Charleston Southern, the Gators probably won't want to use that when they travel to LSU or when FSU comes to town.

Yes, other teams will have some tape to watch and help them prepare, but it's not like Florida would be unveiling something completely unique.

Tennessee can prepare for the Wildcat whether or not the Vols have tape of five to 10 snaps of Haden running through the Bucs.

Just because my other roommates saw me use a new serve or forehand against Sunderland doesn't mean that my game wasn't better for having developed it against a lesser foe.
