# Heisman Handoff

With just one more touchdown run, Florida quarterback Tim Tebow as the all-time Southeastern Conference leader in career rushing touchdowns.

The Heisman Trophy winner will not only have the chance to do it in his hometown of Jacksonville but also against Walker's former team.

If Tebow breaks the record in Jacksonville Municipal Stadium against Georgia (4-3, 3-2), the result could be met with criticism.

Until 2002, the NCAA did not count bowl statistics and decided not to retroactively include them, so Walker's postseason success is not accounted for in his 49 career touchdowns.

In three bowl games, Walker rushed for five touchdowns to bring his actual total up to 54.

Another knock on Tebow if he

obtains the record will be that he needed four years to do it, and Walker accomplished his feat in only three years before bolting for the professional level.

While everyone would have expected the reigning Heisman Trophy winner to make the natural transition to the well-established NFL, Walker surprised everyone with his next move.

In 1983, the NFL didn't allow collegiate players to forgo their senior seasons in order to pursue a draft selection and subsequent contract in the NFL.

Walker made the decision to leave Georgia early anyway and signed a contract with the USFL, which had only been in existence for a year.

The all-time SEC great went on to play for the New Jersey Generals until 1985, when he moved to the Dallas Cowboys of the NFL after financial hardship struck the fledgling USFL.

Walker went on to a fairly unimpressive NFL career, spanning

roughly a decade, and Tebow has brought a lot of attention back to the former Bulldogs star.

Despite the possible complaints, unless the NCAA changes the rule, Tebow's next touchdown will put him ahead of the legend.

"It has been an honor to even be mentioned with Herschel. It is very humbling and I'm sure when I sit back and think about I'll realize how cool it is," Tebow said. "To be able to break the record against Georgia would be extra special."

Overtaking the career rushing touchdown record will just be another notch on the belt of Tebow's illustrious career.

He already broke the SEC record for most total touchdowns with 124 this season, surpassing former Gator Danny Wuerffel.

Another record on his mantle is the career SEC passing efficiency at 170.19.

Tebow already has a record of doing pretty well against Georgia.

In 2007, he threw for 236 yards and a touchdown as well as running for two more touchdowns.

Last season, he completed 10 of 13 passes for 154 yards and a touchdown and added 39 yards and three touchdowns on the ground.

In Tebow's last game against the Bulldogs, he will have more on his mind than just breaking Walker's record.

The No. 1 Gators (7-0, 5-0) will look to improve their poor performances in the red zone after emphasizing it in practice all week.

UF has scored touchdowns on just seven of its 25 trips into the red zone against conference opponents.

"Offensively we have to do a better job in some areas," UF coach Urban Meyer said.

"Third downs we were not good. Red zone production, we usually do it on Wednesday, we are going to do it earlier this week. We just need to improve."

Although the team has struggled inside its opponents' 20-yard line, when the ball gets down to the goal line, Tebow has been just as good as he has been since he arrived at UF.

The senior has scored five of his six touchdowns on runs of less than 5 yards, and it only took one attempt to punch it in on all of those runs.

He did not have as much success last week against Mississippi State,

failing to score on his two tries from just 1 yard out.

But when the Gators get down near the goal line, they are still going to let Tebow try to take it in himself.

"The single wing element has been so successful around here," Meyer said.

"The ability to take someone else out of the box is No. 1, No. 2 is he is a big powerful runner; he is also Tim and is going to give you everything he's got."

Tebow has been watching the Florida-Georgia rivalry since he was 4, and living in Jacksonville made it easy for him to attend the game frequently.

Growing up a Gators fan in Jacksonville made this rivalry extra special for the Nease High graduate.

He said he doesn't expect there to be any extra emotions in his last time playing in the rivalry with a chance to pass Walker.

In his hometown, Tebow is 1-1 as a starter, and in his one loss, he had to endure watching the entire Georgia team celebrate a touchdown in the end zone.

The play that still weighs heavily on the minds of the Gators and even got a response out of Meyer, as he called two late timeouts after the game was out of hand.

All the great memories from previous games are not the thing he thinks of first, when reflecting on what has made the game special for

him. "Going home and playing in that game makes it special for me, having a lot of people there supporting me," Tebow said.

A win would be one step closer to a third national title in Tebow's career, but one more rushing touchdown could mean passing a player many consider the greatest college football player ever.




# UF professor resigns after sex allegations

A UF department chair resigned earlier this month following accusations that he had sex with students.

Michael T. Garrett, 39, former chairman of the counselor education department in the

College of Education, submitted his resignation in late September and officially resigned Oct. 2.

UF learned of the allegations in early September and launched an investigation but dropped it when Garrett left.

As a result, UF made no decision on whether the allegations were credible.

Even so, UF spokeswoman Janine Sikes

said UF would probably not rehire Garrett and would tell other potential employers the same.

**On Campus** "The university condemns and, in fact, prohibits relationships between faculty members and students they supervise," Sikes said.

Officials in the education college held an open meeting Monday night where they dis-

cussed the situation and read statements from students who had been romantically involved with Garrett.

"I have sadly come to learn in the past couple of months that there are several other students who simultaneously shared that false hope and trust in Michael, believing as I did

# Vigil honors victims of breast cancer

Candlelight flickered in the humid Thursday night, as the normally bustling Plaza of the Americas quieted during a vigil for breast cancer.

About 50 people, their faces framed by the soft orange glow from their candles, formed a semi-circle at 7:30 p.m. to celebrate Candle Light for the Fight.

The event was hosted by UF Student Government's Health Affairs and Women's Affairs to conclude Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Claire Fluker, cabinet director of Women's Affairs, organized the vigil to create a more intimate awareness setting where students were encouraged to participate, she said.

For half an hour, the hushed crowd listened to testimonies from students whose lives were affected by a disease that, ac-

ording to the American Cancer Society, could kill as many as 40,000 women in the U.S. this year.

## Denslow: Trend typical during economic downturns

Stacy Hutton is going to be an angel for Halloween — again. Hutton, a junior health, edu-

cation and behavior major, is on a tight budget this year, and she'll be working at McDonald's through the weekend instead of going to costume parties or the UF-Georgia game.

Hutton is allowed to wear a costume Saturday night, but she'll be recycling angel wings from a previous year's costume.

David Denslow, a UF professor and research economist, said

many consumers this year might follow the same trend because of the recession. He expects most people to make their own outfits or, like Hutton, wear their old ones.

Denslow said it's typical for Halloween sales to be affected by a weak economy. He expects candy sales to be less flexible than costume sales since trick-or-treaters would be upset with last year's candy.



## On-campus residents share wireless Internet concerns

About 40 residents of Maguire Village and University Village South, two of UF's graduate and family housing facilities, met with officials from the Department of Housing Thursday night to discuss problems with their wireless Internet.

Azfar Mian, the director of housing for administrative services, answered questions from the residents about the reasons behind their unreliable wireless connection.

Based on a survey of the residents, which was completed by the Department of Housing, the wireless system gets overloaded from about 6 p.m. to midnight as residents return home, Mian said.

Alvaro Gurovich, a graduate student of applied physiology and kinesiology, said he has had to go into work at 4 a.m. to upload data because his wireless Internet did not work.

"We work for the university," Gurovich said. "We produce for the university. Our job made this university, and we can't have fair access to our data, to our servers."

Other residents expressed concern because, as parents, they cannot leave their children to use the wireless on campus.

In response to the residents' complaints and suggestions, Mian said he would look into having wireless access points in each building, rather than have 36 total for the Maguire and University Village South facilities.

He also said he would consider increasing the bandwidth of the wireless network so it could support more users.

Mian also said he would look into using a wired connection.

He said he will assess the prices of these alternatives and meet with the group again.

"What you have said, I'm taking that to the heart," Mian said.

## Campus group demonstrates against Planned Parenthood

Planned Parenthood, was the topic of interest Thursday when UF's Pro-Life Alliance held a demonstration on the Plaza of the Americas.

The organization called the demonstration Margaret Sanger Exposed and talked about her attitude toward eugenics, or selective breeding, through sterilization and birth control. They stated Sanger and Planned Parenthood specifically target minorities and people with disabilities for abortions.

"A lot of people see Planned Parenthood as a great thing that provides birth control and sexual education," said Patricia Aguerrevere, junior art history major and historian for the Pro-Life Alliance. "People do not realize that it's the largest abortion provider in the nation and targets minorities due to their socio-economic status."

Members handed out brochures detailing various statistics on abortions by race to support of their argument. The organization also linked Sanger to the eugenics movement as an influence on Adolf Hitler.

Students had mixed feelings about what they learned.

"I'm pro-life, but I feel if you were raped you should have a choice," said Tiffany Bass, a UF freshman. Bass agreed with the organizations opinion of Planned Parenthood and felt that they do target minorities.

UF junior Andrew Scheuermann on the other hand felt the organization used emotions to get people riled up.

"I think it would be horrible if it was true, but I don't believe it," he said.

## After 250 years, composer comes to life for interview

He was a musician before the days of punk rock angst and raw-to-the-bone hip-hop. He was before rhythm and blues and before MTV.

But Thursday evening, Johann Sebastian Bach was back — he just looked a little different.

Re-animated in an original program engineered by Digital Worlds Institute artist-in-residence Arturo Sinclair, Bach appeared in a live video Web cast for

LiveVibeTV, a 60-minute production presented by the UF College of Fine Arts.

"Bach was, I believe, one of the greatest geniuses in the history of humankind," said Steven Thomas, a cellist and faculty member at UF's School of Music. "He belongs up there with Einstein and that group."

It's been more than 250 years since Bach's "Brandenburg concertos" and "Tocatta and Fugue in D minor" joined the ornate melodies of the Baroque music period, but Bach, the esteemed composer

of the 18th century, was enthusiastic and willing to answer the questions from the live audience of about 50 at Digital World Institute's REVE facility in Norman Hall.

Resembling the technology used by Pixar Animation Studios and DreamWorks Animation SKG, Bach's lips moved, his eyes twitched and his voice boomed throughout the studio.

"We live in a world with a lot of distractions," said Lucinda Lavelli, dean of the College of Fine Arts. "Here we were able to really focus and experience [the show]."

The program was a collaboration of two of the college's programs: the Digital Worlds Institute and the School of Music.

The first of four scheduled pro-

grams, this pilot episode of LiveVibeTV was all about the music.

Hosted by UF senior English major Cameryn Justice, the show featured the music of Thomas and Brazilian guitarist Welson Tremura as well as No Southern Accent, a UF student a cappella group.

The show ended with a collective performance from all of the participating musicians, a mash-up of music that would have made Bach proud.

## UF hopes to send emergency text with fewer delays

■ OFFICIALS DID NOT ANNOUNCE WHEN TODAY'S TEXT WILL BE SENT.

After a flubbed test of its emergency messaging system Wednesday, UF will send another batch of text messages to students and employees some time today.

In order to make the test more realistic, UF

won't announce to students or the company in charge of sending the messages when it plans to conduct the test, UF spokesman Steve Orlando said.

Orlando said this time UF is hoping the messages will be sent out within 10 minutes or less.

On Wednesday, because of a glitch that delayed messages for about 14 minutes, it took

about 23 minutes for all the texts to be sent to cell phone carriers, said Kenneth Allen, UF's emergency management coordinator.

UF **Administration**

That doesn't include the time it takes for carriers to deliver the messages to individual phones, Allen said.

Orlando said if today's test doesn't go well,

UF might have to replace Blackboard Connect, the company in charge of the system.

"This is essentially their last shot," he said.

Ed Miller, president of the company, said the problem has already been fixed and he's not worried at all.

"I'll sleep soundly tonight," Miller said Thursday afternoon.



# 'Drill instructor' gives billiards tips

In a free clinic Thursday night, Dominic "The Drill Instructor" Esposito put about 30 spectators through a billiards boot camp.

Esposito's appearance was well received by students, although there were some complaints about the event's timing.



## Smoking ban starts Sunday

The first phase of UF's campus-wide tobacco ban will go into effect Sunday at UF's Health Science Center and all Shands at UF facilities.

Ben Hill Griffin Stadium went smoke-free in September, and the rest of the campus will follow suit on July 1.

In preparation for the Nov. 1 phase of the ban, UF and Shands have been putting up posters detailing the new policy and removing ashtrays in affected buildings.

They've also been letting employees and patients know about ways to quit smoking, like free counseling sessions and free or discounted medications.

People don't seem to be rushing to the free sessions, however.

Kim Rose, a Shands at UF spokeswoman, said she hasn't seen an uptick in enrollment and Roger Keroack, who runs the sessions for employees and their spouses at UF, said attendance has been dismal.

UF can counsel about 45 people a semester, but a combined 20 people have either taken the class already or signed up for the semester's last one — which started this week — even though UF allows employees to participate during the workday without using leave time.

Keroack said more people might sign up when the campus-wide ban gets a little closer.

"Maybe in May people will get serious about it," he said. "Who knows?"

## Mayor explains stance on serving meals

Editor's note: This is an excerpt from an e-mail sent by Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan regarding an editorial and story published by the Alligator.

**Q: Is it true that the City Commission took action to prohibit St. Francis House from serving more than 130 meals at holidays?**

A: There has been no recent action or direction by the City Commission related to meal service at St. Francis House. Approximately 18 years ago, long before the tenure of any current elected official, the City Commission passed general code provisions that regulate food distribution centers for the needy that are not operated at a place of religious assembly (sec. 30-111) and those that are operated at places of religious assembly (sec. 30-91). These code provisions address, among other things, a limit on the number of meals within a 24-hour period, distance requirements and management plan requirements. These code provisions make no special distinction for holiday meals. This ordinance has not been reviewed by the City Commission at any time during my nearly 12-year tenure.

**Q: Why is there a 130-meal limit in the first place?**

A: This has been a provision in the Gainesville Code of Ordinances since before 1992. The intent was, and is, simply to distribute the services to destitute people across the community, rather than to concentrate them all in one location. St. Francis House has never been legally authorized to serve more than this number and has, or should have, been aware of this during its entire existence at its current location.

**Q: Isn't this immoral? Aren't people then left to starve?**

A: Every place of religious assembly throughout our community is authorized to serve meals and house homeless persons, subject to the limitations and permit requirements set forth in City Code Sec. 30-91. However, the

administrative enforcement of those limitations and requirements have been temporarily suspended since March 28, 2008, when the City Commission directed the city manager not to issue or deny any permits under Sec. 30-91 until the Community Development Committee studied those regulations and returned with proposed amendments. The Committee is returning to the City Commission with recommendations on Nov. 5.

**Q: The City of Gainesville has been listed as one of the nation's "Meanest Cities" toward homeless for closing Tent City and enforcing this meal limit. What is wrong with the city?**

A: In reality, the cities who have been placed on this list are actually all communities that are doing SOMETHING to help homeless people, albeit imperfectly. There are many communities that do little or nothing for homeless people, so those that take up the responsibility end up with "more than their fair share" of work to do. Unlike most government programs, one of the difficult issues around helping homeless people is that the better the services you provide, the more people who come forward to seek those services. In an environment in which there is no requirement for basic human needs to be met in all jurisdictions, those who do provide services end up taking up the burden for those who don't, and the better your services are, the more people you attract who need them. In reality, Gainesville is a city of 130,000 that is trying to provide almost all of the homeless services in a multi-county region of more rural, suburban and disadvantaged communities.

Michigan ordinance similar to local Charter Amendment 1

For an off-year election, Nov. 3 is shaping up to be pretty interesting day at the polls.  
 The more obvious reasons for this, and the ones getting the most attention from cable news channels, are a few races (including the gubernatorial elections in Virginia and New Jersey and a quirky special election for the U.S. House seat in New York's 23rd congressional district) being decided Tuesday that some political folks are characterizing as bellwethers for the mood of the country.  
 Maybe more significant, there are a few ballot initiatives being voted on that may serve as an indication of just how much progress the LGBT rights movement has made. Maine is voting on Question 1, which could reject via a "people's veto" a state law that legalized gay marriage; Washington state is voting on Referendum 71, which is asking voters to approve or reject a state law that expanded domestic partnership rights to match those of marriages.  
 But maybe the most relevant ballot initiative to Gainesville is the vote on Ordinance 1856, in which voters in Kalamazoo, Mich., will decide whether or not to approve a city ordinance that extended discrimination protections to LGBT people.  
 Why? Because what's playing out in Kalamazoo almost exactly matches Gainesville's vote on Charter Amendment 1, and eerily so.  
 Charter Amendment 1 was a proposed amendment to the Gainesville City Charter that had the intention of eliminating discrimination protections in areas like housing and employment based on sexual orientation and gender identity. (Protections for many other categories, like race and religion, are already protected under state law.)

The group pushing for the amendment's passage, Citizens for Good Public Policy, said that protecting LGBT people constituted giving them "special rights" and insinuated that keeping protections for transgender people would lead to men entering girls' restrooms and raping them. Gainesville voters called BS both on that argument and the amendment itself, voting it down on March 24.  
 But evidently, what's past isn't prologue for the anti-LGBT protections group in Kalamazoo pushing for the rejection of the ordinance. (The "yes" vote in this election is the pro-LGBT protections vote; the "no" vote is the anti-LGBT protections vote.)  
 The group, Kalamazoo Citizens Voting No to Special Rights Discrimination, is trying to say that these protections, far from working against discrimination, are in fact discriminatory against people who don't want to work with or provide services to LGBT people. In other words, they're saying that Ordinance 1856 discriminates against people who want to discriminate (well, yeah) and that "elevating the beliefs of one group over those of another is indeed both a 'special right' and discrimination" (because not getting fired because of the person you love is, indeed, a special right).  
 (On a sidenote, even if we're going to follow Kalamazoo Citizens Voting No's argument that we shouldn't elevate one group's beliefs over another and that sexual orientation and gender identity is a choice, I'm skeptical that they're going to spearhead the effort to repeal discrimination protections based on religion.)

And, of course, there's the "men in girls' restrooms" argument again. The group's talking points sheet is titled, "Is There a Man in Your Daughter's Bathroom?" And they've even pilfered wholesale Citizens for Good Public Policy's TV commercial featuring a pedophile following a little girl into the bathroom for an Internet ad, except they swapped the word "Gainesville" for "Kalamazoo." (You can compare the two on YouTube - tinyurl.com/KzooAd and tinyurl.com/GvilleAd - if you're curious.)  
 Perhaps the sneakiest thing Kalamazoo Citizens Voting No is doing is distributing signs and fliers that say "No Discrimination: Vote NO on Ord. 1856" — a clear attempt to hoodwink low-information voters into thinking that the "no" vote is the vote in favor of discrimination protections.  
 I'm not presumptuous enough to tell Kalamazoo voters how they should cast their ballot. After all, I've never even been to Kalamazoo (though I've heard it's a really pretty city, especially in the autumn). And besides, I'm pretty sure they can make up their own minds.  
 But for what it's worth, I can say that I had never been prouder to live in Gainesville when voters — both locals and students — rejected Charter Amendment 1 by 16 percentage points. And contrary to what the at times cartoon-like absurd campaign waged against LGBT protections wanted us to believe, our city is better for it, and we're better people for it.  
 It's disheartening to see the same scare tactics that were used here being used in Kalamazoo, but with any luck, the outcome will be the same. Fingers crossed, Kalamazoo.

# Rivals to battle for huge paddle

This year a new tradition will be put in order. Student Body President Jor-

dan Johnson said an anonymous donor presented him with a 10-foot-long oar to heat up the rivalry between UF and the University of Georgia. The trophy will join the likes of the Golden

Boot between Louisiana State University and University of Arkansas and Paul Bunyan's Axe between University of Minnesota and University of Wisconsin.

Johnson and UGA's Student Body President Katie Barlow will highlight the old rivalry's new addition during a 2 p.m. CBS broadcast in the parking lot of the Jacksonville Municipal Stadium this Saturday.

Johnson said the oar isn't just for the winning school's Student Government but for the whole Student Body.

"It instills a sense of pride to the game, a sense of responsibility to students from both sides and a sense of sportsmanship and great tradition that SEC football is known for," he said.


Johnson said the oar is made from wood in the Okefenokee Swamp, which is common in both states and is engraved into the histories of both Florida and Georgia.

SG press secretary Eric Conrad said the oar was carved from a 1000-year-old tree.

The wood symbolizes the conflict that arose when Florida and Georgia drew the state-boundary line through Okefenokee Swamp, a conflict that came long before the rivalry on the football field.

Barlow said both schools have been talking about having an award for years, adding the oar will add to the tradition and rivalry of the game.

"It's just something to kind of symbolize the victory," Barlow said.

that they were involved in an exclusive, intimate, committed relationship," a statement read, according to an article on InsideHigherEd.com. "Those students, consequently, are also experiencing intense pain right now."

The article quotes three anonymous students who said they had intimate relationships with Garrett, two of whom admitted having sex with him.

One former student said she had sex regularly while she was enrolled in his class. Another told Inside Higher Ed that she exchanged nude pictures with him.

"His classes were intimate," one student said in the article. "We exposed really personal stuff, and he would continue to talk to us about personal stuff. That's what he initiated contact with."

E-mails and a voicemail message requesting comment from Garrett were not returned Thursday.

One former student and teaching assistant of Garrett's said she was shocked to hear about the allegations against him when contacted on Thursday.

"He was one of the best professors I had ever had," said the recent UF graduate, who wished to remain anonymous.

"He just really, really, really cared about his students."

She said Garrett was always very professional and conceded that she

could see how some female students might have felt an attraction for him, but she never thought he would cross the line with any of them.

Another former student, Amy Mazak, also said the allegations came as a surprise and that Garrett was one of her favorite professors.

"He talked about his family a lot in class, and I even met his young son on several occasions," Mazak wrote in an e-mail. "His son was the world to him, that was obvious."

Garrett, who was hired in 2006, was on the fringes of another scandal earlier this year when UF investigated the abuse of university credit cards, known as purchasing cards.

UF learned that an employee in his department had been sharing her card, a violation of university policy, with other members of the department, including Garrett.

The employee had her card canceled, but UF decided not to take any action against Garrett.

According to a biography on the UF Web site, Garrett has authored dozens of articles and book chapters, many about the counseling of Native Americans.

Garrett, who was paid about \$106,000 at UF — according to salary information from March — grew up on a Cherokee Indian reservation in western North Carolina.





## Redshirt freshmen duo hungry for first title

While the Gators were busy running through every conference rival en route to a perfect SEC record in 2008, Barney and Williamson watched from the sidelines, hobbled by knee injuries.

Tonight at 6, as No. 10 Florida (13-4-2, 7-1-2 SEC) hosts No. 13 South Carolina (15-2-1, 7-2-1 SEC), the Gators will have a chance to live up to the expectations set by last year's team. With a win, UF — the team picked in the preseason to take the conference — will have its fourth-straight SEC title. As the Gators have scrapped back to the top of the conference with five wins in their last six games, the play of Barney and Williamson has been pivotal.

Barney has scored five goals in SEC play and was recently moved from midfielder to starting forward while Williamson has been a staple for the Gators' backline, starting every game this season.

The two redshirt freshmen missed all of

Barney rehabbed and was healthy again after six months, but on just the third day of preseason practice last season, Barney went

# Gators vie for first SEC title since '97

It has been 12 years since the women's cross country team has won a Southeastern Conference title.

"They put enough pressure on themselves," coach Todd Morgan said. "They know SEC titles are never easy to win and so it is going to be a fight, but they are ready for it this weekend."

The No. 5 women's team was a pre-season favorite to win the conference title, and now the Gators will have a chance to make good on that projection as they travel to Oxford, Miss., to compete in the SEC Championship on Saturday.

After finishing two runners in the top 10 at the Pre-NCAA Invitational on Oct. 17 and finishing in second place at the meet, the Gators realize the goals

they set out at the beginning of the season can be accomplished.

Morgan prohibited his players from talking to the media this week in an effort to keep them away from the hype and focused on the task at hand.

The runners are focused on the SEC Championship on Saturday as well as the South Regional meet on Nov. 14 and the NCAA Championships on Nov. 23,

Morgan said.

The team finished second at the 2008 SEC Championship but want to place higher than that this season with the addition of three new runners.

Graduate student Stacey Johnson, whose eighth-place finish at the Pre-NCAA meet was the best on the team,

will run in her first SEC Championship meet, along with freshmen Sydney Devore and Mandy Perkins.

"Most of our girls are running the best they have ever run," Morgan said. "We have several that could be our first girl across the line on any given day. There is a lot of talent on that roster."

Although the women's team has many talented athletes, Morgan said Arkansas and Tennessee are two teams that are capable of winning the race on Saturday.

Arkansas, who was the only other team to receive first-place votes in the SEC Cross Country Coaches' Poll, was projected to finish in second while Tennessee came in third during the pre-season poll.

The Gators will have a week off after the SEC Championship before the NCAA South Regional meet in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

for a header along with three other players.

"Knees were everywhere, elbows were everywhere," Barney said. "Someone's leg knocked my knee or something, and I thought I heard the famous 'pop' in the air."

This time, Barney tore her right ACL.

Williamson also tore her ACL in the fall of 2007, but she did not allow her ligament to fully heal. She tried to practice again three months after the tear, and she damaged her patellar tendon in the same knee in April of 2008.

Williamson did not have surgery on her knee for another three months, as local doctors failed to diagnose her injury.

"It was extremely difficult not knowing what was wrong and how to fix it," she said.

Once they finally got their respective surgeries last year, Barney's and Williamson's time was almost entirely dedicated to getting back on the field.

They would wake up, go to therapy, go to class, go back to therapy, do special workouts at practice, go back to therapy again, sleep and repeat.

"Kat and McKenzie are workhorses, and they want to get back and they want to play," trainer Emily Kiefer said. "Motivation for them is not an issue."

Kiefer said the only thing holding the players back was time. Williamson's less-severe injury required three months to heal while Barney's demanded six months.

As they sat on the sidelines, Barney and Williamson were told by Burleigh to watch specific players. During the games, they would hear the coaches' comments about mistakes made by their healthy teammates.

"Me and Kat learned so much last year from watching, and I think it really transferred over to this year," Barney said.

After all the time spent on the sideline, keeping their weight off their weakened knees, Barney and Williamson have learned how to appreciate life on the field.

"I feel so fortunate to actually be actively part of this team, because I felt like so long I was just verbally contributing instead of physically having my presence out there," Williamson said. "It's a great experience. I love it. I love every minute out there."



# Class of '12 to lead UF on road

■ THE TEAM WILL FACE UA AND MSU THIS WEEKEND.

After 18 years of conference dominance, coach Mary Wise has seen many successful graduating classes pass through Florida.

Perhaps none of them accomplished as much in their first two years as these sophomores.

The class includes setter Kelly Murphy, middle blocker Cassandra Anderson and outside hitters Kristy Jaeckel and Colleen Ward — all of whom have started every match this season.

They will lead No. 10 UF (16-3, 10-2 Southeastern Conference) as it heads to Tuscaloosa to face Alabama (6-16, 4-8 SEC) at 8 p.m. before traveling to Starkville to take on Mississippi State (5-18, 1-11 SEC) on Sunday.

This is not their first go-around. The sophomores now know what to expect from life on the road in the SEC.

"It was kind of trial by fire a year ago, but what a difference a year makes," Wise said. "You can talk about what it's like to play at Alabama or Mississippi State, but they have already

been there now. We aren't spending any extra time on doing those types of things."

The four sophomores are already on their way to becoming the faces of the program this season as Anderson leads the team in blocks; Ward has the most kills; Jaeckel is second on the team in digs; and Murphy has the most triple-doubles, the most assists and the highest hitting percentage.

"I think we've definitely grown a lot," Jaeckel said. "It's hard sometimes to make the adjustment at first between high school and college because the speed of the game is just completely different."

But it's not like they didn't have an impact in their freshman year either.

Murphy, Jaeckel and Ward were all named to the SEC All-Freshman Team, and the trio finished atop UF's total kills list last season.

The sophomore class made history in 2008 as Murphy became the first player in school

history to win the AVCA National Freshman of the Year. She also broke the school record for most triple-doubles in a career in her first season with six and now has five more to add to that total with another nine matches remaining in her sophomore season.

"I think it's just really exciting," Jaeckel said. "The youth of our team is something we can use as an advantage, but it's also something we also can't use as an excuse."

The fourth member of the group was quietly impressive in her freshman season as well. Anderson has led the Gators in blocks ever since she first set foot on campus while also becoming one of just seven freshmen in school history to average more than one block per set.

"Cassandra is one of those players who may go under the radar of our fans or the media, but she is at the top of our list because she leads us in blocking," Wise said. "We understand that the only chance we have of making a run in the NCAAs is with blocking."

But all of these accomplishments and records don't mean anything to the sophomores. Their primary focus is on helping this program do something it has never done before — win a national championship.
