# Defense Defined

The Florida defense had reached its low point.

The year before, an experienced unit led the Gators to a national championship and gained a reputation as one of the toughest defenses in the country.

Plenty of roster turnover morphed the 2007 version into a group of young, talented players who were still searching for an individual and collective identity.

Michigan handed UF its fourth loss of the season in the Capital One Bowl after Chad Henne threw for 373 yards and the Wolverines piled up 524 yards of total offense on their way to a 41-35 win.

Eight players who started on defense that day are still on the team, and three of them — Brandon Spikes, Joe Haden and Major Wright — are still starters.

But it was time for a unit that allowed opponents to score 25.5 points per game to make a change.

Not in personnel, but attitude.

"I don't think (that motivated them). I know so," UF coach Urban Meyer said. "You could see the edge coming out of that bowl game that day."

How would the members of the defense allow themselves to be defined for the rest of their careers?

**swag** (swäg) *adj.* : the way one carries oneself, style, confidence or appearance.

None of them did.

Swag is an attitude that comes with success.

It grows with every sack, interception and goal-line stand.

The 2008 defense was a year older and too proud to take the beating week-in and week-out the way it did during the previous 9-4 season.

"(2007) helped us a whole lot to never want that to happen again — being the reason that you lose a game, you feel like it's all your fault," Haden said. "The offense would put up 45 points a game, and we would still almost lose. So with the defense, we know

how it feels to be on the highest high — not letting teams score — and we know how it feels to be low, when everybody is just looking at you like you're the worst defense in the country."

In 2007, players got playing time on defense because there was no one else ready to step in if a guy faltered. That all changed when the team reported for practice the following spring.

No one's job was safe, everyone was being pushed by the guy behind them on the depth chart, and experience was starting to become a strength rather than a weakness.

"There was something that needed to be corrected, but a lot of it was the youth of that defense, it really was," defensive line coach Dan McCarney said. "You see, fortunately right now, a lot of those guys who didn't play really well three years ago have played really well these past two years."

Going through growing pains together focused a young team for the next season, a shot at redemption.

The team responded by cutting its points-allowed total in half, giving up just 12.9 points per game on the way to the Gators' second national championship in three years.

The offense was explosive, but the defense became one of the team's greatest strengths, holding the highest scoring offense in college football history to 14 points in the BCS National Championship Game.

The tone was set on a jarring hit in the first five minutes of the game, when UF safety Major Wright leveled Oklahoma receiver Manny Johnson on a deep sideline route.

"(Opening up the game with a big hit) lets the receivers know that I'm here," Wright said.

That's swag.


**hype** (hīp) *adj.* : ready to go, prepared. "It gets us hype before every game."

The Florida coaching staff is legendary for its motivational tactics.

The Florida defense is legendary for feeding off of them.

Before almost every game this season, the coaches have tried to plant some sort of chip on the collective shoulder of a defense

that many thought would go down as one of the greatest ever.

Before playing Tennessee in the third game of this season, UT coach Lane Kiffin's offseason comments were put up all over the locker room.

Prior to facing Kentucky, it was a running back with a big mouth.

And ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit even became a source of motivation, when he "called out" Brandon Spikes and the defense leading up to the LSU game.

"Our coaches always say that stuff to try to motivate us, they say stuff like, 'They called you out!'" Stamper said. "Sometimes they probably say stuff the other team didn't say just to motivate us, but it works."

Stamper said UK's Alfonso Smith really did talk smack about the defense, but he didn't recall anything negative being said before playing under the lights at Death Valley.

The defense played with something to prove just the same, holding the Tigers to three points in front of a crowd that had watched 32 straight Saturday night home victories in Baton Rouge.

With Alabama on the horizon for this weekend's Southeastern Conference Championship Game, defensive coordinator Charlie Strong has been challenging his players

to "bring their big boy pads" to Saturday's game.

"He's going to keep repeating it, 'Major, what are you doing? Bring your big boy pads!'" Wright said. "I know that coach, I got my big boy pads."

Strong keeps repeating catchphrases — telling his cornerbacks that tall wide receivers are "going to eat peanuts off your head" is another one — and his defense keeps repeating wins.

Now 22 in a row.

**juice** (jōōs) *n.* : respect, power.

It's easy to develop swag.

It can be even easier to get hype before a game.

But juice is something very few teams ever obtain.

Juice means opposing quarterbacks are handled with kid gloves by their coaches, forced to dump the ball into the flat and told not to challenge Florida's lockdown corners.

Juice means the coach of one of your rivals runs the ball down by 10 points with six minutes to go in the fourth quarter because he would rather try to keep it close than win.

UF's defense, which is loaded with future NFL talent, is allowing fewer than 10 points per game, best in the nation.

Brandon Spikes and Co. have the juice.

Meyer has often repeated a phrase that Spikes, the team's defensive leader, has coined.

"It's what we do," Meyer says.

The saying means nothing, really.

It's the team's way of saying, "Whatever incredible feat happens on the field is nothing new for us."

The Gators' defense expects to go out and dominate the same way opponents expect to be dominated by them.

Juice is the universal recognition of dominance.

Before the season, Strong had some words of advice for a unit that had aspirations of going down as the best in college football history.

"If you're going to sell those tickets, you better be ready to cash them," he said.

It's doubtful anyone will be asking for a refund from Strong's defense come Sunday.

## UF group builds 'sweet' houses

Members of the UF chapter of Habitat for Humanity held their third annual Candy House Building Competition Thursday afternoon on the Reitz Union North Lawn.

More than 40 people voted for their favorite of five gingerbread houses decorated with M&M's, Mike and Ikes, Life Savers and candy canes. Each house was built by a team of two from the UF Habitat for Humanity.

"Last time I built one, I was in first grade, so it brought back some memories," said Stephany Vento,

## Students protest fees for class assignment

Students with a homework assignment to organize a protest did just that Thursday afternoon on Turlington Plaza, choosing to demonstrate against escalating education costs.

The students, enrolled in a class called "Social Problems," protested UF's 15 percent tuition increase, changes to the Bright Futures scholarship and the proposed student fee to fund part of the \$70 million to \$80 million in Reitz Union renovations, among other things.

Their teacher, Meggan Jordan — a graduate student — joined in as students marched in a circle, hoisted homemade signs and chanted phrases like "We say no! Our fees must go!"

"The theme of the class has been speaking out, speaking truth to power and knowing when you're getting screwed," Jordan said.

Students who didn't feel like participating were allowed to sit the protest out, she said.

### What do cats do home alone? Cat cams have answers

LOS ANGELES — What do cats do when their owners are away? There was one way to find out — "cat cams."

Fifty house cats were given collar cameras that took a photo every 15 minutes. The results put a digital dent in some human theories about catnapping.

Based on the photos, about 22 percent of the cats' time was spent looking out of windows, 12 percent was used to interact with other family pets and 8 percent was spent

climbing on chairs or kitty condos.

Just 6 percent of their hours were spent sleeping.

The 777 photos showed the cats looking at a television, computer, DVDs or other media 6 percent of the time and hiding under tables 6 percent of the time.

Coming in at 5 percent was playing with toys; eating or looking at food finished at 4 percent.

#### Fla. lawmakers open special session on rail

TALLAHASSEE — Senate President Jeff Atwater says

he's confident his chamber will reverse its prior opposition to legislation that would clear the way for a commuter rail system in central Florida.

Identical House and Senate bills being considered at a special legislative session that begin Thursday also include up to \$15 million each year in additional state money for the financially troubled Tri-Rail commuter line in South Florida.

Atwater, R-North Palm Beach, said the bills respond to at least some issues that twice before doomed similar proposals in the State Senate after they'd been passed in the House.

One difference is that the rail legislation is now being sold as a step for possibly obtaining \$2.6 billion in federal stimulus money to also build a high-speed system between Tampa and Orlando with a possible future link to Miami.

"My conversations with members over the last week have been that they wanted to see something bigger and bolder," Atwater said. "When they have a chance to hear all of the bill and see the elements of this bill that we're looking bigger, farther down the road."

Atwater and other rail advocates argue the bills (HB 1B, SB 2B) would also establish a framework for future commuter service in other urban areas by creating two new entities.

The proposed Statewide Passenger Rail Commission would advise the Department of Transportation, and the Florida Rail Enterprise would oversee development of commuter lines as well as a high-speed system.

# County to provide free H1N1 vaccines

Gators who forgot to sign up for H1N1 vaccines at the Student Health Care Center will have another shot Saturday.

Vaccines will be given at four sites around the county: Fellowship Church of High Springs, Easton-Newberry Sports Complex, Trinity United Methodist Church and First Baptist Church Waldo. All locations will give vaccines from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. except First Baptist Church Waldo, which will be open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Both the injectable and nasal mist form of the vaccine will be offered.

The Alachua County Health Department does not expect to run out of vaccines, and vaccinating high risk groups will be a priority.

The groups at highest risk are pregnant women, health care and emergency workers, people who live with or care for infants, children between 6

months and 4 years and children between 5 years and 18 years who have pre-existing conditions.

Once those groups have received their vaccinations, people between 5 and 24 years old and people between 25 and 64 who have pre-existing conditions will be next in line.

"We are encouraging citizens who are most at risk for severe complications from H1N1 swine flu to receive the vaccination," wrote Jean Munden, administrator of the health department, in a press release. "Getting a vaccination is the primary means of preventing infection."

## \$5,000 raised for libraries

A program co-sponsored by the University Athletic Association and UF Alumni Association is scoring big for students.

## Experts recommend H1N1 vaccines despite declining cases

With flu season in full swing and H1N1 cases popping up in campuses all over the nation, officials are urging college students to take time from their busy schedules to get vaccinated.

"We're not out of the woods yet," Secretary of Education Arne Duncan told reporters in a conference call Thursday. "The flu season is just beginning."

According to Duncan, despite the decrease in cases of H1N1 across the country, it's important that as many college students, who are some of the most likely to catch the virus, get vaccinated as soon as possible.

A study from the American College Health Association shows 84 percent of colleges have vaccines for the H1N1 virus, and Duncan said colleges receive more on a daily basis.

UF students are taking advantage of the free flu vaccines available at the Student

Health Care Center.

Dr. Phillip Barkley, the center's director, noticed a decrease of patients coming in with flu-like symptoms, down to about 50 students a week, but an increase of interest in regards to the H1N1 vaccines.

"We had about 700 students come in Wednesday for the vaccine, and we've done several outreaches these past months," he

said.

Despite warnings, students are still going to class sick because finals are just around the corner.

"You're not helping your peers by going to class if you are sick," Duncan said. "If you are sick, you are highly contagious and need to stay home."

Duncan also hopes that college faculties and administrations will be flexible with college students who are infected with H1N1 and provide make-up exams.

## Study: Some teens don't consider 'sexting' a problem

WASHINGTON (AP) — Think your kid is not "sexting"? Think again.

Sexting — sharing sexually explicit photos, videos and chat by cell phone or online — is fairly commonplace among young people, despite

sometimes grim consequences for those who do it. More than a quarter of young people have been involved in sexting in some form, an Associated Press-MTV poll found.

That includes Sammy, a 16-year-old from the San Francisco Bay Area who asked that his last name not be used.

Sammy said he had shared naked pictures of himself with girlfriends. He also shared naked pictures of someone else that a friend had sent

him.

What he didn't realize at the time was that young people across the country — in Florida, Indiana, Ohio and Pennsylvania — have faced charges, in some cases felony charges, for sending nude pictures.

"That's why I probably wouldn't do it again," Sammy said.

Yet, "I just don't see it as that big of a problem, personally."

That was the view of nearly half of those surveyed who have been involved in sexting. The other half said it's a serious problem — and did it anyway. Knowing there might be consequences hasn't stopped them.

"There's definitely the invincibility factor that young people feel," said Kathleen Bogle, a sociology professor at La Salle University in Philadelphia and author of the book "Hooking Up: Sex, Dating and Relationships on Campus."

"That's part of the reason why they have a high rate of car accidents and things like that, is they think, 'Oh, well, that will never happen to me,'" Bogle said.

Research shows teenage brains are not quite mature enough to make good decisions consistently. By the mid-teens, the brain's reward centers, the parts involved in emotional arousal, are well-developed, making teens more vulnerable to peer pressure.

## Students also protested 15 percent increase in tuition

Steven Shanik, one of two leaders of the event, directed the protest from atop a concrete table in the plaza.

Shanik, a UF freshman, said rising tuition and declining support from scholarships like Bright Futures is squeezing some potential students out of a chance to get a college education in Florida.

UF raised tuition by 15 percent this year, the maximum allowed each year under a new state law that lets state universities raise tuition until they reach the national average.

As a result, tuition and fees for most undergraduates at UF are now \$145.76 per credit hour, up from \$125.91.

Meanwhile, Bright Futures will continue to pay only \$126 per credit hour for Academic Scholars, the

highest scholarship level.

UF students could also see their fees increase by \$20 a year, in addition to \$3 more per credit hour to pay for renovations to the Reitz Union.

Jordan, who was standing next to a sign protesting the fee, said it would impact graduate students — particularly those with families — more than undergraduates, because they are not eligible for Bright Futures.

"You're basically taking money out of the pockets of families," she said.

# Camera gives closer look at cancer

A new tool developed by a UF researcher could revolutionize cancer treatment and allow for much earlier detection of tumors.

Endoscopes are a common tool used in the detection of cancer. A camera affixed to a long, thin tube allows doctors to see abnormal growths on the surface of internal organs.

Huikai Xie created a "scanning micro-endoscope" by replacing the camera with an infrared scanner that allows a doctor to "see" beneath an organ's surface tissue.

"It's a technology which can see through tissue, so it can see depths of information, not just the surface," he said.

While traditional endoscopes give a view of an organ's surface tissue, doctors can't see how deep or exactly how big the growth is, making biopsies inexact, unnecessarily random and often dangerous when performed on vital organs, Xie said.

Biopsies can cause internal bleed-

ing and trauma to organs. They can also take several days to be processed by a lab to determine whether the tissue is cancerous or not, leaving a patient's peace of mind hanging in the balance.

Once a growth is visible on the surface, Xie said it is likely the rest of the organ could fail.

Xie's scanner allows doctors to look beneath the surface of the tissue before a cancerous growth is big enough to be seen.

By seeing through the tissue rather than just its surface, doctors can also determine the exact size and margins of a growth, taking the guesswork out of biopsies and eliminating the chance of over-cutting.

"Our organs are very valuable," Xie said. "And today's biopsies are not a good technique."

Xie's scanners have a resolution 10 times higher than the only other non-camera based endoscopes avail-

able, and one of his scanners can even produce a 360-degree image of the surrounding tissue.

Eventually, Xie said he hopes to be able to use his scanners not only in the detection of cancer cells but also in the surgical removal of tumors.

He is working to attach a cutting instrument to his scanners that would allow doctors to have a real-time view of areas undergoing surgery. While currently they rely mostly on still MRI- and CT-scanned images taken before the surgery.

This would be most beneficial in high-risk, precision operations, where over-cutting could lead to permanent damage, such as in brain surgery, Xie said.

If his project gets the funding it needs to continue in research and receives all the necessary FDA approvals, Xie said he expects his scanning micro-endoscopes could be on the medical market in two or three years.

He is already collaborating with doctors at Shands at UF to perfect his instruments and said they could be the first in the field to work with them.



# Improved conditioning frees up Donovan's coaching

■ FLORIDA WILL PLAY AT JACKSONVILLE TONIGHT AT 7.

Florida's 6 a.m. workouts and relays this summer have paid dividends beyond just improved conditioning.

With his players finally in good enough shape to endure the physical demands of practice, UF coach Billy Donovan has been freed up to prepare his team in a way that wasn't possible a season ago.

"The last couple years, he was just trying to get guys to play hard. He couldn't even really teach," senior forward Dan Werner said. "Now, we're playing at a different level. He can explain stuff to us, we can figure things out a little better and we get more shots up every day."

In its matchup with Jacksonville (0-4) tonight at 7 in Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena, No. 13 Florida (7-0) will get another chance to show the strides Donovan has been able to make with his team in practice.

The most noticeable and effective example of the Gators' improved conditioning so far this season has been their full-court pressure. Werner said Donovan has worked on the press in practice more than he has the last two years, and UF has used its athleticism and newfound endurance to help force almost 18 turnovers per game

this season.

"We ran on offense last year, but we were not able to pressure the ball like I would have liked to just because we had a lack of depth," Donovan said. "You get better when the defense transitions back and they don't let the offense score in the first five seconds."

Due to a combination of injuries and players who weren't capable of running

the floor, UF wasn't able to do that kind of work on the transition game in practice last year.

Donovan pointed to guard Ray Shipman, center Kenny Kadji and former UF players Eloy Vargas and Allan Chaney as not being in good enough shape last season.

Even point guard Erving Walker, who has recently drawn considerable praise

from Donovan for his tireless work at the front of the press, wasn't ready to do all his coach needed from him.

As a result, Donovan was lucky if he could work on transition defense and offense without taking a break — something the Gators have executed with ease on the court this year but weren't even capable of doing in scrimmages last year.

"We had a tough time putting all that together at the same time," Donovan said. "We've gotten better, and we can have more competitive practices because I think guys are better conditioned."

Unlike last season, Donovan has a full roster of players who can keep practices competitive and run the floor, as Walker, Shipman and the rest of the returning Gators whipped themselves into shape over the summer under the supervision of strength and conditioning coach Matt Herring.

Even this year's freshman class started in far better condition than the previous group. Kenny Boynton, Erik Murphy and Rod Tishman didn't need to be eased into practice, allowing Donovan to finally focus on coaching basketball as opposed to coaching effort.

"I feel like the bottom part of our team this year is in much better shape to contribute to make practice more competitive," Donovan said. "They understand now the commitment that they need to make physically to be in that type of shape to play that way."

However, the Gators still showed no post-season nerves as they stormed out to an early 5-1 lead.

They never trailed in the first set thanks to the play of sophomores Kristy Jaekel and Colleen Ward, who each had five kills each in the opening frame.

"There was only one ball where (Ward) hit out of bounds when I thought she made a bad decision," Wise said.

"When we started this season, we would have been thrilled if it was one per game, and so what we are seeing is the maturing process of Colleen as a hitter."

Ward finished with 14 kills to help lead the team to a .476 hitting efficiency, the highest percentage the Gators have ever hit in the NCAA Tournament.

"I thought our passing was great tonight, and it allowed us to get the ball to a bunch of different people," sophomore setter Kelly Murphy said.

"We just stayed patient and made really smart decisions with our hitting."

Wise decided to use the one-setter offense Thursday, which worked successfully again.

College of Charleston's outside hitter Katie Robinson, who went to Oak Hall High School in Gainesville, did not enjoy her homecoming as much as she would have liked.

"I was pretty nervous," Robinson said. "I knew that a ton of people were going to be here but I just tried to block that out of my mind."


She finished with a -.286 hitting efficiency in the loss to the Gators.

# Healed Howell gives depth in IMs

■ THE SOPHOMORE RETURNED TO COMPETITION TWO WEEKS AGO.

After suffering an injury early this season, Florida sophomore Brian Howell returned to competition in November and has made the best of his opportunity since.

Howell broke his hand while hanging out with his teammates after practice and was confined to a splint for three weeks, unable to swim.

In his first tournament back, the South Carolina Invitational two weeks ago, Howell showed he had the potential to be one of UF's elite individual medley swimmers.

He was fourth in the men's 200-yard IM and second in the 400 IM.

Howell said his performance in that first meet was close to what he expected after not competing in the earlier meets this season.

"The amount of training that I'd done and that being my first real competition of the year, I can't say I was disappointed," Howell said. "I

would've liked to swim faster, but it was a good starting point."

On a team loaded with talented athletes, Howell has managed to put himself in the mix with the more recognized names.

He swam the sixth-fastest time (1:52.99) for UF this season in the 200 backstroke, and he owns the fifth-fastest time (1:51.41) this year in the 200 IM.

His most notable time this fall came in the 400 IM, back in South Carolina, where he swam a 3:56.21, placing him behind junior Conor Dwyer for the second-fastest time in the event.

The sophomore said he has dealt with the pressure of swimming for

one of the nation's top programs, and the depth of the team is a driving factor for the team's improvement.

"There's definitely a lot of pressure here because the team is so good," Howell said. "If you don't step up, there's someone else right behind you who'll step up and do the job just as (well) or better than you could."

"A spot is never guaranteed, and that's why everyone keeps getting better."

When UF's fourth-ranked men and fifth-ranked women compete in the Georgia Invitational today through Sunday, Howell said he'll be looking to get more race experience, but coach Gregg Troy will be looking to the sophomore to see just what he can do.

This is UF's last meet until January.

"He's one of the guys we're especially going to watch this weekend because he's got some good talent," Troy said. "He didn't get to race quite as often as we would like this fall, but he did do a good job of recovering and staying on track, so he's one that we really want to see some more racing from."

## Tebow, UF's offense will dictate whether Gators return to BCS title game

This one is on the offense.

For 12 games, Florida's defense has dominated. The Gators have suffocated top-notch run games, stifled quality passing attacks and had a knack for big plays in big moments.

The unit deserves a helping hand Saturday against Alabama in the SEC Championship Game.

During that same stretch, UF's offense has been almost entirely underwhelming. Sure, there were 40-point outbursts against Kentucky and Georgia, and yes, Florida State's defense made everything look A-OK.

Maybe it is, or maybe it's not. Honestly, I've been waiting for Saturday to see just how much the offense has grown during the year. It's hard to judge a unit when it can literally do next to nothing and win because of an out-of-

this-world defense and a great punter.

The numbers have gotten better, but is that a true sign of development? I'm just not so sure.

It'd be ludicrous for me to suggest the offense is going to carry the defense Saturday. That simply won't happen. A terrible game by the defense would result in a loss to Alabama nearly 100 percent of the time.

Thankfully for the Gators, the odds of that happening are close to zero. But Charlie Strong's defense might not be able to give UF the overwhelming advantage it has all season.

This SEC Championship Game is going to feature two great defenses going against one another, with the loser being the first one to blink. It's a near-guarantee that Florida's defense will come ready to play, but Tim Tebow is going to have to lead his team down the

field for a few iconic drives just like last year if the Gators are going to win.

Few have mentioned this week that Percy Harvin didn't play in this game a year ago, so offensively, UF is only down Louis Murphy.

Riley Cooper caught the game-clinching touchdown an inch off the ground last year in Atlanta. Jeff Demps scored the go-ahead touchdown early in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard run.

Demps and Chris Rainey have to be bigger factors this year. Rainey was hurt last time, and Demps finished with 53 yards on 14 carries, an average of 3.8 yards per carry.

Aaron Hernandez will have to continue to be a playmaker. Alabama allowed a few devastating shovel passes to Hernandez last year. I wouldn't expect that to happen again, but Tebow will need Hernandez to get free down the field.

Of course, no discussion of the offense is complete without mentioning Tebow. He led two fourth-quarter drives to win last year, and those 15 minutes of football are still mentioned often. He will probably have to pull some kind of heroics again.

Then again, I learned long ago not to doubt Tebow. He gave the world his promise, and 22 games later, he still hasn't walked off the field a loser.

For him to keep that going Saturday, it will have to be his offense that makes the difference.

# Florida, Alabama square off for trip to BCS title game

The previous three teams that won the national championship finished the season with at least one loss.

Neither No. 1 Florida nor No. 2 Alabama can afford to suffer its first loss of the season Saturday and still expect to play in the BCS National Championship Game.

With the winner heading to Pasadena, Calif., to play for the national title, Saturday's Southeastern Conference Championship Game in Atlanta will have the feel of a national championship semifinal.

The Gators and Crimson Tide are No. 1 and No. 2 in the BCS rankings and were ranked first and fifth, respectively, in the preseason AP poll.

UF coach Urban Meyer has already been to two SEC Championship Games and two BCS National Championship Games as a Gator, but he said he couldn't think of a bigger game that he has been a part of than the upcoming one.

"Now that we're here, I can feel (the national championship-like atmosphere)," Meyer said. "People were trying to make it that type of game back in September. I think if I remember right, both teams were picked to make it to the championship game."

The matchup was set after Alabama's 24-15 victory over LSU on Nov. 7, but the talk of a rematch of last year's SEC Championship Game started soon after the last one finished.

Both teams had key players depart after last season, mostly on the offensive side of the ball.

Florida lost the services of wide receivers Percy Harvin and Louis Murphy, and Alabama no longer has quarterback John Parker Wilson, running back Glen Coffee or left tackle Andre Smith. The Gators returned all of their starters on defense, and the Crimson Tide brought back nine of their 11 before losing star linebacker Dont'a Hightower to a knee injury early this year.

The experience of the defenses has been obvious as both units have dominated opposing teams

most of the season.

Alabama's and Florida's defenses are ranked in the top eight in the nation in total, scoring, rushing and passing defense.

The most points either team let up in a game was the 24 Alabama allowed Virginia Tech to score, and the most UF has given up was 20 to Arkansas.

The two units have different styles of play, but they still share certain traits of a great defense.

"There's a lot of similarities, both great defenses. There are similarities with our defense. A lot of team speed," quarterback Tim Tebow said. "They run for the ball, make big plays."

Despite finishing the regular season undefeated, neither team's season was without drama.

Alabama trailed heading into the fourth quarter in three games this season and was leading by no more than seven points when the last quarter began in two other games, including a 12-10 win over Tennessee that needed two blocked field-goal attempts by nose guard Terrence Cody.

Florida never entered the fourth quarter trailing in any game this season, but four games were within a touchdown at the start of the final period, including a 23-20 win over Arkansas that required a 27-yard field goal by Caleb Sturgis.

The Gators also dealt with a new off-the-field storyline almost every week and have another one this week with the recent arrest and suspension of starting defensive end Carlos Dunlap.

Junior cornerback Joe Haden said the goal was not to go undefeated but to get to the SEC Championship Game because Meyer did not want the team to feel like the season was a failure if they lost a game early on. While both teams' goal was not to finish undefeated but win a championship, they will now have to finish without a blemish to accomplish that aspiration.

"If you lose a game, then was the season a failure? He didn't want that to be the case," Haden said. "Now we're sitting here undefeated. SEC Championship, we win this, we go on to the national championship."
