



'CSI' star describes four-step success program

Hill Harper hates the word "try."

"Most people who use that little three-letter word, that's all they end up doing," he said.

More than 800 people packed the Reitz Union Grand Ballroom Monday night to hear the "CSI: NY" star and author speak about how he works to achieve his life goals.

The Accent show was also sponsored by Black History Month and the Black Graduate Student Organization, said Accent chairman Jason Attermann.

Harper was paid \$30,000, according to Student Government Finance records.

Harper expressed his concerns about people's tendencies to let things come to them and hope they fall into place, something he referred to as a "lotto mentality."

He suggested a four-step process to achieve goals, comparing the process to that of an architect preparing to build a structure.

The steps include sketching a blueprint, laying a foundation,

building a framework and making sure there are entry and exit points.

For Harper, one of the most important aspects of a foundation is education.

He told the audience about his encounter with Barack Obama while studying at Harvard Law School.

While shooting hoops alone at the school's gym, Obama came in to play some ball with him. They became friends, and Harper said he was astounded with how Obama had gone back to school after working for six years.

He said Obama had realized he needed to reinforce his foundation.

"I looked up to him, and not just because he was taller," Harper said.

LOCAL Pedestrian safety campaign kicks off

Local law enforcement agencies announced today that they are running a campaign to increase the number of drivers who yield at crosswalks and decrease the number of people who jaywalk during the next few months.

The Gainesville Police Department, the University Police Department and the Alachua County Sheriff's Office are participating.

Police hope to raise awareness of the high number of traffic crashes

involving pedestrians. Gainesville averages 140 such crashes annually, or three a week, according to a GPD press release.

"It is important to recognize that traffic safety is a responsibility shared by all road users and that pedestrians are at fault when they jaywalk or cross during the 'don't walk' phase at signalized intersections," the release said.

GPD spokeswoman Cpl. Tscharna Senn said both drivers and pedestrians can expect written warnings about such violations during the next few months.

Clinic offers free services

■ MEDICAL STUDENTS TREATED PATIENTS UNDER SUPERVISION.

Gainesville residents can get more than a book at a local library Monday evenings.

Operating out of a bus parked at the Tower Road Branch Library, 3020 SW 75th St., more than 15 volunteer students and physicians treated patients without health insurance at the Mobile Clinic.

The clinic can serve up to six patients a night but has only served three or four patients a night.

Patients first meet with undergraduate students, who help them create a Google Health profile.

The profile gives patients a virtual way to carry their health records to any doctor's office or hospital.

Medical students then treat the patients, under the supervision of a volunteer physician, in an exam room on the bus.

Ada Roberts, 51, works as a janitor, cleaning the library after it closes. She is uninsured and was visiting the clinic for the second time on Monday night.


The free clinic will continue every Monday night.

Ohio strip club hosts lap dance event to raise money for Haiti

TOLEDO, Ohio (AP) — A strip club in Ohio has raised \$1,000 for Haitian earthquake relief during what was billed as "Lap dances for Haiti."

Marilyn's on Monroe in Toledo donated the \$10 cover charges collected Saturday to ISOH (I-S-O-H)/IMPACT, an organization based in suburban Perrysburg that provides food and clothing for Haiti.

Marilyn's general manager Kenny Soprano says his establishment had been look-

ing for a reason to hold a charity fundraiser even before the quake, as a way to improve its image.

He said it is uncommon to hear much about strip clubs giving back to the community.

ISOH/IMPACT CEO Linda Greene doesn't have a problem with where the money came from.

She says her group appreciates any donations to help Haiti.

Panel discusses ways to help children in poverty

A group of four panelists described the working conditions of children in underdeveloped countries and highlighted efforts to help impoverished children during a discussion at the Pugh Hall Ocora Monday night.

A crowd of about 60 gathered to listen to the talk, sponsored by Gators for Asha, which educates underprivileged children in India, and the UF chapter of Children Beyond Our Borders, which helps more than 100 children in Colombia.

The discussion kicked off Education Awareness Week, which promotes the importance of helping impoverished children in developing countries.

Taryn Devereux, the public relations director for UF's Children Beyond Our Borders, moderated the discussion.

Devereux asked the panelists, which included two UF professors, a UF alumna and a UF student, about the best ways to help children in poverty create a better life.

Angelica Suarez, a UF alumna and panelist, emphasized the importance of listening to impoverished children.

"If we don't listen to them, we will fail every time we try to implement a new project," Suarez said. "Listening to children is the best

way to get through to them."

Suarez said children who grow up in poverty are not exposed to a wide variety of career goals and may

not form high career expectations.

"I want to be a mother, housekeeper or taxi driver," she said. "These are the type of answers we would get when we ask the children what they want to be when they grow up."

Her solution is to give the children a glimpse of what is outside their environment.

"We try to give them exposure to other things they can achieve," she said.

The other panelists included Renata Serra, a lecturer in UF's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and a development economist; Tim Fogarty, a UF professor and the program coordinator for the UF in Nicaragua study abroad program; and Ali Zuaiteer, a UF business major.

Shivashankar Halan, a member of Gators for Asha, was pleased with the outcome of the discussion panel.

"It was really informative," Halan said. "Although our goals are the same, it was interesting to see how other like-minded organizations work on implementing these types of projects."

Mayor candidate plans to tackle crime, meal limit

Ozzy Angulo has been a bus boy, a bartender and a manager at Taco Bell.

This March, he's hoping to add another job to that list. Angulo, 29, is running for Gainesville mayor, and as the election nears, he is looking beyond his opponents.

"I'm not in it to beat someone else," he said. "I'm in it to raise awareness in the community, and nothing can be fixed unless the community and government work together."

If elected, Angulo said he plans to tackle the climbing crime rate and public transportation policy, specifically for Santa Fe College students.

But for the New York native who accompanied his girlfriend to Gainesville in July 2008, there is another issue at the foundation of his political platform.

Currently, the city limits the number of meals the homeless can receive from churches and the St. Francis House soup kitchen.

"It appears the city is trying to alleviate the pressures of the homeless population by limiting their ability to eat," Angulo said. "But all it's really doing is limiting their ability to live."

He volunteered at St. Francis House Saturday, encour-

aging residents of the shelter to register to vote.

James Bryant, 58, a St. Francis House resident, worked alongside Angulo, promising the candidate a vote in the upcoming election.

"It's good to see someone come in," he said. "It's good to see people get involved. Anytime a man steps up like that — I like that. Here, we wash each other's hands."

At St. Francis House, residents like Bryant are looking for someone to be their voice.

Lugging a water cooler out into the cafeteria for the dining homeless and hungry, the candidate related the issue to his former career in the U.S. Marine Corps.

"When you get put in a position where you lose your resources, you go into survivor mode," he said. "... I've been in survival training."

But in terms of the brewing mayoral race, he is hardly surviving.

Angulo knows this, just like he knows the likelihood of victory isn't likely.

According to the latest campaign finance report, Angulo has raised no money.

"I think of defeat every single day," he said. "I feel like Rocky Balboa in 'Rocky' I."

And although Angulo has accepted his position in the race, he has not accepted the current state of local politics, especially in regard to the homelessness regulations.

"I know I am the obvious underdog," he said. "But I'm not trying to divide people further. I'm trying to unite a community."

UF will no longer sanction, sponsor student trips to Haiti

■ NEW POLICY BASED ON SAFETY WARNINGS FROM GOVERNMENT.

UF announced in a memo last week that it will no longer sponsor or sanction student trips to Haiti.

UF spokeswoman Janine Sikes said the new policy is based on health and safety warnings from the federal and state governments and from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

She said riots and disease will make the country unsafe.

"It's going to be progressively more dangerous in Haiti," Sikes said.

Students and faculty can still travel to Haiti, but they must take time off from classes and research and pay their own way, Sikes said.

Under the new policy, organizations such as Project Haiti, a group that has been going to Haiti and the Dominican Republic during spring break since 1996 to provide free medical care, would not be allowed to travel.

Daniel Lombardo, a second-year UF medical student and one of the group's trip

leaders, said the organization could lose about \$6,000 in Student Government funding should it choose to go to Haiti because SG funding would constitute university sponsorship.

The announcement also affects the plans of Jon Bougher and Roman Safiullin, two UF graduate students who were filming a

documentary in Haiti when the earthquake struck.

Bougher said he is unsure if they will be permitted to return to Haiti because the film is part of their master's thesis work at UF.

In order to make the return trip, they would need a travel authorization from the university, Bougher said.

But Bougher said the film is between 50 percent to 60 percent complete, and he wants to go to Haiti.

"I understand the liability issues with students going [to Haiti], but we need to go down and get the rest of the story," Bougher said.

Sheriff's office posts mugshot links on Facebook page

The Facebook wall on the Alachua County Sheriff's Office fan page is no longer just a place for announcements and Christmas party pictures.

The ASO public information office began posting links to pictures of people with felony and misdemeanor warrants in Alachua County on its profile page Friday.

The links, which will be updated weekly, are expected to enable Facebook users to provide tips and help officers locate criminals, according to ASO spokesman Art Forgey.

"We're new to the social media thing," he said.

The sheriff's office first created a Facebook profile, a YouTube channel and Twitter account in June and July of 2009.

However, until now the accounts have all been mostly used

to post official updates, event notices and event pictures and videos.

The sheriff's office Facebook page had 440 fans as of 7:30 p.m. Monday.

The use of media and social

networking tools by law enforcement agencies is a growing trend, Forgey said, because nearly everyone is online.

"There are so many people on social media sites all the time," he said. "We're missing a resource if we don't use it. You take the info to where the people are."

Forgey also pointed to the new additions to the Facebook page as another trend in the growing virtual cooperation and communication between local citizens

and police as an innovative way to tackle crime.

Because keeping up a Facebook page takes little time and is free to use, it would be worth having even if it yielded only one tip, he added.

Those who wish to browse criminal listings or submit a tip to the Alachua County Sheriff's Office can find the profile by typing "Alachua County Sheriff" in the Facebook page finder.

Harper roamed around the crowd and engaged audience members one-on-one.

He equated the individual choices people make to advance their dreams to the choices builders make as they create a building framework.

On Campus Gainesville resident Candy Ganyo, 53, said she walked away with advice that even people her age could use, adding it's not too late for her to pursue her goals.

"He was inspiring," Ganyo said.

UF sophomore Samantha Lawton said the speech encouraged her to think about what lies ahead in her life.

Lawton hopes to become an occupational therapist and go into the Peace Corps.

"It really made me think about my future," she said.

UF benefitting from Parsons' new versatility

■ THE JUNIOR IS AVERAGING CAREER HIGHS IN POINTS, REBOUNDS AND ASSISTS.

Chandler Parsons garnered plenty of praise earlier this season for his late-game heroics, but he has proven to be adept at far more than just last-second 75-footers and buzzer-beating three-pointers.

Parsons posted an 18-point, 12-rebound, six-assist performance in Florida's 69-62 win over Mississippi State on Saturday, displaying his versatility throughout his team-high 33 minutes of play.

The 6-foot-9 junior crashed the boards for a game-high five offensive rebounds, got to the free-throw line more than any other player on the court and spent some time at point guard — a far cry from the outside-shooting perimeter player he was a year ago.

Parsons' teammates aren't surprised by the way he has developed a better all-around game this season.

"I knew Chandler was capable because he does it for us every day in practice," sophomore point guard Erving Walker said. "It was just a question of him putting it all together and putting it out there on the court."

No longer playing in the shadow of former UF and high school teammate Nick Calathes, Parsons has stepped up and taken on more responsibilities. The most noticeable change has been his intensity on the glass.

Parsons is averaging 6.7 rebounds per game, second on the team behind Alex Tyus' 6.9. Also, he leads the team with 7.4 boards per game in Southeastern Conference play, including a team-high 22 offensive rebounds in the Gators' nine league games.

"On the offensive boards, it'd be tough to keep me off if I keep going hard," Parsons said. "At my position, I feel like I should be rebounding like this."

UF coach Billy Donovan said he thought Parsons has always been a talented rebounder, but the junior

Monday's match served as a good preview for the level of the competition that will be featured at the ITA Team Indoor Championship in Madison, Wis.

Gators in 10th after one round at Northrop Grumman

After one round of play in the Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge in Palos Verdes, Calif., the Florida women's golf team finished tenth overall.

The team carded a 304, 20 strokes over par and 20 strokes behind the number-one seed, Southern California.

"This golf course is everything you could ask for," coach Jan Dowling said. "You've got to drive the ball great, you've got to hit great iron shots and position yourself in

the right place. The greens are really fast and well protected so you've got to chip a putt really well. To come out and play this as your first round of tournament golf for the spring is a challenge."

Despite a foot injury, junior Jessica Yadloczky rose to that challenge, leading the Gators with a Round 1 total of 73 (+2). She is currently 12th in the tournament. Yadloczky came out strong, in her third appearance on this course, shooting an even par on her first seven holes of the back nine but followed up with back-to-back bogeys.

"[Yadloczky] came out ready

to play," Dowling said. "She had been nursing a foot injury, so for her to come out and play the way she did today is great. She feels really comfortable on this course, it's her third year playing [in Palos Verdes] and it's the kind of course that requires playing quite a few rounds of golf to get comfortable on. She took advantage of that and I look forward to watching her play the next few days."

Following four strokes behind their team leader, sophomores Marika Lendl and Evan Jensen and freshman Mia Piccio each carded scores of 77 (+6). The trio is currently tied for 39th place.

Lendl and Jensen started out strong with three even par holes, but started to struggle on the next two holes with a double bogey and a bogey.

Lendl went on to make two birdies, another bogey and finished the round with a double bogey.

Jensen finished with two birdies, three bogeys, and another double bogey to end her day.

"There are definitely things that each one of our players can improve on," Dowling said. "We're just going to take it shot-by-shot and day-by-day. That's really what I thought was positive today, that they did stay positive out there, which is hard to do on such a tough golf course."

Coming in last for the Gators was freshman Isabelle Lendl who carded 79 (+8) and tied for 55th. She recorded a bogey on three of her first five holes and entered the next nine at three over. She finished her round with a double bogey and three more bogeys.







has finally matured enough to turn his potential into production on the court.

"What he thought went into becoming a good player and a successful player was really way off-base from what reality was," Donovan said.

Part of Parsons' improvement has been taking on whatever role Donovan asks him to play. After being used at both forward spots his first two years, Parsons found himself at shooting guard this season due to the Gators' lack of natural guards.

Since the Tennessee game on Jan. 31, Donovan has used his swingman in another position: point guard.



Men's Basketball

Walker and freshman guard Kenny Boynton have taken on most of the ballhandling duties all season, but when the pressure and physical demands became too much to handle, Donovan puts the ball in Parsons' hands.

"That's a lot for both Walker and Boynton to handle," Donovan said. "With a lack of depth in our backcourt, I've got to find some ways to relieve those guys from being on the ball all the time."

Parsons' height allows him to see over the defense more than the 5-foot-8 Walker and 6-foot-2 Boynton, and Donovan trusts his passing and his ability to drive into the lane.

"If Erv and KB are getting pressured, I feel like I'm a guy who's reliable," Parsons said. "I can get my teammates involved, get to the basket and not turn the ball over — just do whatever I can to help the team."

SEC Freshman of the Week, defeated No. 52 Ecaterina Vasenina on Court 2 in straight sets 6-2, 6-0.

Embree, who sat out Sunday, said her shin has been bothering her, but after Monday's match she said she felt "100 percent."

No. 15 Embree defeated USF's No. 77 Irene Rehberger in straight sets 6-3, 6-2 at the No. 1 spot.

Earlier in the day, Thornqvist said he expected to see his Nos. 4-6 players tested by USF's depth.

After the match, he said he felt Caroline Hitimana on Court 5 was "not tested." She won her match in straight sets 6-1, 6-1 finishing before the rest of her teammates.

Even with two freshmen ranked in the top 15, Thornqvist has said this is Boonstra and Revzina's team.

No. 92 Revzina won her match on Court 4 in straight sets, 6-3, 6-4.

Thornqvist thought Revzina played excellent in the first set, lost her focus in the second set that became as close as 5-4, but did not panic and managed to close it out strong.

On Court 6, sophomore Claire Bartlett was in the only match to go beyond two sets. Since the victory was already clinched for Florida after Bartlett and USF's Natalia Guevara split their first two sets, they played a tiebreaker instead of a full third set. Bartlett won the tiebreaker 11-9.

Sunday's match against Troy and Monday's match against USF was the Gators' first time playing on back-to-back days.

At the ITA Team Indoor Championships, beginning Friday, they will play at least three matches in three days, or four in four days if they advance to the championship round on Monday.


