



# Officials obtain shooting-related video

## A neighbor filmed the events

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement has a copy of a video showing the moments leading to the March 2 University Police Department shooting of UF graduate student Kofi Adu-Brempong and is examining the video as part of its investigation.

One of Adu-Brempong's neighbors, who wishes to be anonymous, said she began filming when she heard police talking to the student. The video is about 10 minutes long.

Spencer Mann, spokesman for the State

Attorney's Office, said the video would only be made available to the public if the State Attorney's Office pressed charges and held an arraignment against any of the officers involved in the shooting.

Mann said it's too early to say what, if any, charges will be made.

"We're going to let the facts, the evidence and the state law speak for itself," Mann said.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement is investigating the case now. It will report its findings to the State Attorney's Office.

The office will assign a prosecutor to review the case before any charges are made.

Two of Adu-Brempong's neighbors and the witness who took the video said they heard five shots fired.

The neighbors said they heard three shots, a brief pause and then two more shots that sounded different than the first three.

The witness who took the video stopped filming after hearing the shots.

The witness added that one of the officers came out of Adu-Brempong's apartment after the shots were heard, sat down and put his head in his hands. Another officer put a hand on his shoulder.

Sheryl Quail, a graduate student in the school of forest resources and conservation, also lives at Corry Village and attended the UF Board of Trustees meeting at Emerson

Hall Tuesday to try to present the video.

Quail said she waited until the end of the meeting to attempt to present it using her laptop.

But Student Body President Jordan Johnson, who was at the meeting, said Quail was unable to present the video because the meeting was adjourned.

Johnson said she interrupted a board member's speech, and members were surprised by Quail's attempt to present.

"But, you know, we encourage free speech," Johnson said. "We understand this is America, and it's important to, you know, have a good pulse of the feelings of students on this campus."

UF spokeswoman Janine Sikes said Quail brought a list of demands to the meeting, and they were distributed to each member of the Board of Trustees.

# Gators exit tourney after first-round loss

OKLAHOMA CITY — Before tipping off the first round of the NCAA Tournament, BYU point guard Jimmer Fredette asked Chandler Parsons for a small favor.

"No game-winning shots tonight," Fredette said. "It was kind of just a little joke, just friendly competition."

Parsons, whose two game-winners in January were among the highlights of Florida's season, had a chance to do exactly what Fredette feared at the end of regulation Thursday afternoon in the Ford Center.

The junior forward missed a last-second turnaround jumper over Michael Loyd Jr. with the game tied at 75 to end regulation. Freshman guard Kenny Boynton missed on the final possession in overtime, and the Gators (21-13) ended their season with a 99-92 double-overtime loss to the Cougars (30-5).

"I felt like I had a good look and shot it," said Parsons, who finished

with 20 points, 10 rebounds and six assists. "I thought it was going to go down. It rode out. It happens. I'd like to have the shot again."

Boynton, who finished with 27 points on 8-of-16 shooting, was forced into a long, contested three-pointer that fell far short, and senior forward Dan Werner's attempted tip-in was off.

"I wasn't really sure how much

time was left so I just tried to tip it in," Werner said after his final game at UF. "Looking back, I probably should have tried to grab it, but I didn't think I could catch it, so I just tried to get a fingertip on it and get it up to the rim."

In the second overtime, the Gators lost their most effective scorer — Boynton fouled out — and were clearly too worn down to keep up with the Cougars.

"We had a hard time scoring because of fatigue," UF coach Billy

#### Reitz's summer job fair draws about 200

Spring hasn't even arrived, but students were already thinking about summer plans at the Summer Job Fair Thursday on the Reitz Union Colonnade.

The fair, which was sponsored by the Career Resource Center, featured 27 companies including Buckle, Gainesville Health & Fitness Center and various summer camps. It attracted more than 200 students.

#### Countywide scavenger hunt to start Saturday

## Cars drive 'green' talk

As six environmentally friendly cars rested on the Reitz Union North Lawn, students and environmental agencies talked about the possibility of more energy-efficient campus transportation options.

Progress Energy, the Eco-Trans Alliance, Wise Gas Inc. and UF had cars on display with presentations explaining the alternative sources of energy, such as ethanol, biodiesel and electric batteries that the cars use.

Most of UF's transportation runs on gasoline, but the Department of Transportation is planning on expanding the use of alternative fuels such as ethanol and electricity, said Jonathan Priest, UF's fleet superintendent.

UF is working specifically on expanding its use of biodiesel, Priest said.

Biodiesel, which is typically made from soy beans and animal fat, makes up about 20 percent of energy for a vehicle. The rest of the energy comes from diesel. Biodiesel costs \$2.65 per gallon, Priest said.

According to the American Automobile Association, diesel fuel costs \$2.928 per gal-

lon.

For fleets, the extra cents add up, Priest said.

Gregory Hyde, the special projects manager of the Eco-Trans Alliance, a company that uses renewable energy sources for transportation, said alternative transportation is the most effective.

"It's transportation without pollution and no heavy expenses," Hyde said. "People are intrigued."

During the event, Hyde showed the cruise car, which looks like a golf cart with large solar panels placed on its roof.

Cruise cars can run on various sources of energy, but most run on a combination of solar energy and electric batteries.

Hyde said the cruise car is ideal for a university setting because some cars can hold as many as 14 passengers.

## Museum to host 'dig'

Tales about snakes more than 40 feet long will be told, plate tectonics will be explained with Oreos, and stones will become jewelry Saturday at the Florida Museum of Natural History.

The museum, the Gainesville Gem and Mineral Society and the UF Department of Geological Sciences will host the fourth annual event, "Can You Dig It?" from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Between 1,500 and 2,000 people are expected to attend, and about 30 to 50 UF graduate and undergraduate students will volunteer.

"Our students really love what they do. Geology is a calling," said Matthew Smith, a UF professor of geological sciences and the coordinator for

this event.

The museum will have different stations with educational and interactive activities geared for many age groups. One activity calls for people to create earthquakes by measuring their jumping intensities on seismometers, Smith said.

Because the event is no longer on a school night, the timing for outside activities won't be constrained, Smith said.

**On Campus** In addition to the indoor and outdoor stations, visitors can view existing museum exhibits and listen to geology experts.

Ellen Martin, professor of geological sciences at UF, will speak about global warming.

In the event's past years, Martin has debated with 10-year-olds about whether global warming is happening.

**Residents encouraged to create fake \$100 bills**

Usually the creation of counterfeit bills is discouraged.

But today, those in Gainesville can design fake \$100 bills for a good cause.

Artists and environmentalists alike can stop by the Dwight H. Hunter Northeast Pool, 1100 NE 14th St., at 6 p.m. in support of the Fundred Dollar Bill Project, an effort to raise awareness about the effects of lead-poisoned soil.

Participants will create mock \$100 bills to be picked up by the Fundred truck, which will then transport them to Washington, D.C.

The goal is to collect 3 million mock \$100 bills from 125 nationwide collection sites.

The conceptual sum of those bills — \$300 million — is the cost to improve soil conditions in New Orleans, said Mary Rubin, the project's director of national affairs.

Rubin estimated volunteers with the project have collected about 400,000 bills so far.

"It's really important that everywhere, everybody and anybody makes their Fundred," she said.

Rubin said organizers hope the symbolic bills will encourage the cleanup of lead-contaminated soil in New Orleans.

Although lead-poisoned soil is common, it can result in negative health effects when absorbed by the skin.

About 30 percent of inner-city children in New Orleans are affected by the lead-contaminated soil, according to the project.

"By creating a Fundred dollar bill, you're supporting the generational solution to the health of our communities," Rubin said.

**Dentist helps fund revamp**

It wasn't in his job description to fundraise, but he made a huge impact at the UF College of Dentistry anyway.

Dr. Robert E. Primosch, a pediatric dentist, led the fundraising initiatives for the renovation of the pediatric dentistry facility at Shands at UF.

He will be recognized today in a ceremony at the UF College of Dentistry at 11:45 a.m. UF President Bernie Machen will speak along

with other dentists from the facility.

About \$750,000 from private donations raised over the past seven years paid for the renovations. About 85 percent of the donations came from alumni.

In 1995, Primosch and Dr. Marcio Guelmann, a pediatric dentist at UF's College of Dentistry, formed an alumni group to raise

state money to build a new clinic. However, the state reneged on their promise to match dollars, Primosch said.

He said the makeover was much needed. "The facility was really worn down," Primosch said. "I wouldn't want my children to be seen there."

# Council demands grand jury probe

Graduate students stood up for one of their own Thursday.

The Graduate Student Council unanimously passed a resolution calling for a grand jury investigation of the shooting of graduate student Kofi Adu-Brempong by University Police Department officer Keith Smith on March 2. The resolution will be sent to the State Attorney's Office and the clerk of the Eighth Circuit Court.

**On Campus** Matt Vernon, vice president of the Graduate Student Council, said a grand jury investigation will ensure thoroughness and impartiality.

Vernon said UPD is doing an internal investigation of the shooting, and the university has hired outside investigators.

"Myself and quite a few others feel that this is not the way to go about this, considering the circumstances," Vernon said.

Members of UPD and colleagues of Adu-Brempong have been ordered not to speak about the incident until the investigations are complete, Vernon said.

"[The grand jury] will be able to subpoena all the people who have been muted and have not been able to speak," Vernon said.





**People's voice must be heard on immigration crisis**

**M**y parents are Americans. They are citizens of this great country, which they are proud to call home. They are also immigrants.

My father immigrated to this country from Mexico in 1972 when he was 18 years old. At the time, he wanted little more than to provide for his growing family. My mother, then pregnant with my oldest brother, had come over a few months earlier. Before crossing the border, my dad was told to squeeze into the spare tire compartment of a station wagon as they drove through customs in Tijuana. For more than an hour, he prayed and thought of his young wife while he tried not to inhale too much of the exhaust that was seeping in from the tail pipe.

That night he slept in a country where dreams come true, in which people from all over the world are risking death just to live.

The next day, my father went to work at a plant nursery earning \$1.35 an hour. He worked there for five years. In 1977 he started working for General Motors where he drove cars off the assembly line. It was a turning point in his life: My dad didn't have to hide in the spare tire compartment anymore.

As a first-generation American born to Mexican immigrants, I remember reciting the Pledge of Allegiance every day before class. It gave me the clarity of something I could depend on. The words came out of me like a song, and the rhythm seemed to synchronize itself with my heartbeat. I was taught to base

the rest of the day on the simplicity of the Pledge. I would focus on the passage, "liberty and justice for all." At the time, it just did not occur to me that even though anyone could cry out his or her allegiance to this country some people would simply never be heard.

Countless communities across the U.S. are filled with people who have no say. In Shelbyville, where I live, we are repeatedly reminded of the plight of immigrant families who have no confidence in a system they feel has little use for them.

We are constantly receiving reports of honor students being told they cannot continue their higher education because they do not have a

Social Security number. Victims of crime have come to me and said they are afraid to file a report after they have been robbed simply because they fear legal-status scrutiny by police. We have spoken to children who say they become worried when their parents are coming home late because they believe their mothers or fathers have been detained by immigration authorities.

In order to bring a logical and rational solution to our immigration crisis, the people must first be heard. We are students; we are teachers; we are engineers; we are builders; we are civilians; we are soldiers; we are dreamers; we are human; and we are here. And we are marching for America.

## Chapman's breakout year solidifies bullpen

■ UF TAKES ON MISSISSIPPI STATE TONIGHT.

The purple scar slithers from the inside of Kevin Chapman's elbow to the top of his forearm.

It is the only proof of the Tommy John surgery Chapman underwent in 2008 after tearing a ligament in his left elbow.

In his return this season, the southpaw has become No. 6 UF's best reliever, and he will try to continue his scoreless streak tonight when Florida hosts Mississippi State at 7. The junior has yet to allow a run in 11 2/3 innings this year.

"He was always a guy that scouts have coveted," coach Kevin O'Sullivan said. "It's not like he's come out of nowhere. I think it was just a matter of time of 'when is he going to start reaching his potential?'"

Chapman has overpowered hitters so far this year, and he estimates about 90 percent of his pitches have been fastballs. He can also throw breaking balls and changeups, but opponents are hitting just .128 against his mostly one-dimensional style.

Chapman's heater reached a personal-best 95 mph Tuesday against FSU.

"Until they start hitting my fastball, I don't think there's any point in throwing a different pitch," Chapman said.

Chapman likes O'Sullivan's pitching philosophy more than that of Pat McMahon, UF's previous coach. When Chapman was a freshman, McMahon told him to make batters chase bad pitches with two strikes.

O'Sullivan, on the other hand, wants Chapman to challenge hitters, which means more fastballs.

Chapman's favorite pitch isn't just overpowering; it also moves

## Boynton deserves praise for effort

Florida was one of the last teams in the NCAA Tournament, and one of the first teams out of it Thursday.

The stay was short, but after a gut-wrenching 99-92 loss to BYU in double overtime, give the Gators this: They left everything on the court in Oklahoma City in their first tournament appearance since winning back-to-back titles in 2006 and 2007.

Chandler Parsons went for 20 points, 10 rebounds and six assists, Vernon Macklin scored 16 and grabbed seven boards, and freshman guard Kenny Boynton turned in one of the gutsiest performances I have ever seen by a Florida basketball player.

Boynton dumped in 27 on 5-of-10 three-point shooting and led the Gators back from a 13-point deficit with 9:16 remaining in the game.

The streaky shooter scored 14 points

in a row for UF, including three three-pointers in a row, to cut the lead to 66-63 with just less than five minutes left.

Toward the end of his incredible run, Boynton

could be seen on the right wing, hunched over and grabbing his shorts while the ball was in play.

Scoring 14 points in a row is tiring.

Scoring 14 points in a row while guarding BYU leading scorer Jimmer Fredette, who carried the Cougars with 37 points, is exhausting.

Yet there Boynton was on every defensive possession, butt down, arms up and working as hard to prevent Fredette from scoring as he was put-

## UF WOMEN'S SWIMMING Gators in fourth at NAAs

At the Women's NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, the UF women's swimming and diving team did not waste any time before taking home gold.

After a strong Thursday morning performance in the preliminary rounds, the Gators' 200-yard freestyle relay squad of Shara Stafford, Gemma Spofforth, Stephanie Napier and Sarah Bateman won the first event of the finals session and gave UF its first ever national title in the 200-yard freestyle relay. The winning relay time of 1:27.79 set a school record.

UF is in fourth place with 107 points. They trail California, Georgia and leader Stanford who is at 142.5 points.

"We had an absolutely great night," coach Gregg Troy said. "We put ourselves in a great position today. This morning, we came out and swam so good in the first relay, and I think it put a little bit of pressure on us to perform well, which may have affected Gemma's 200 [individual medley]."

After Spofforth failed to make the A final for the 200-yard individual medley, she

swam 1:55.61 in the B final. Although she finished ninth in the event, she swam the fourth-best time out of all the swimmers.

"This is exactly what we wanted to do tonight," Spofforth said. "We wanted to come in and set the tone this morning. We knew we needed to be good in the relays and we started the meet off great. This morning, I didn't have as great a turn on the final freestyle wall as I wanted to, but tonight I came out and had a much better freestyle leg in the IM race."

In the final event Thursday night, the Gators' 400-yard medley relay team of Spofforth, Lindsay Rogers, Jemma

Lowe and Stafford placed third with a time of 3:31.69, second-fastest in school history. "Tonight, we returned and swam so well. Obviously the 200 free relay was a great way to start the night. Gemma responded and swam outstanding in the IM. Shara was also consistent for us all day," Troy said. "We had great relays and look forward to racing the rest of the weekend."

## Gators advance in WNIT with 61-54 win over USF

Faced with a win-or-go-home game in the Women's National Invitation Tournament, Florida unleashed a barrage of three-pointers while barely containing USF's Jessica Lawson in a 61-54 win.

"It wasn't pretty, but I don't think we expected it to be pretty. We just expected to pull it out," UF coach Amanda Butler said.

The Gators opened the game with a 20-6 lead off six three-pointers between Jordan Jones, Steffi Sorensen and Sharielle Smith.

"Shooting is contagious on our team," Sorensen said. "[Jones] came out hot and all of us kind of followed behind her. It just got us

off to a good start. It was a good feeling just to really dominate those first few minutes so that you know you're in control."

Center Azania Stewart, who missed five games at the end of the regular season with a stress fracture in her left foot, had 15 points in 18 minutes. The sophomore returned to game after leaving following a scary fall where she seemingly reagravated the injury.

"I feel pretty good," she said. "Like coach says, just rub some dirt on it."

It wasn't the easiest return for Stewart, who had her hands full — as did the whole team — with Lawson.

USF's double-double threat scored 26 points and collected 12 rebounds. She made as many shots, 10, as the rest of her team combined.

"She's an SEC [I-type] post player," Butler said. "She wasn't ready for her career to end, and it showed in the way that she played."

She single-handedly brought her team out of a first-half rut, scoring 11 points in the opening period. Not even her big numbers and the Bulls' 58-37 rebounding advantage could make up for the team's 26.7 shooting percentage.

Leading by eight at the break, UF's shots started to miss in the second half, as the Gators made just 3 of 13 from three-point range. But whenever the team needed a basket, someone delivered, whether it was Smith with a three-pointer or Stewart in the

post. Sorensen led the team with 16 points, Stewart had 15 and Jones added 10. Smith and Lonnika Thompson chipped in eight and nine apiece.

After surviving the first-round game, the Gators will head south to Miami to play their second straight intrastate rival on Sunday at 2 p.m.. The Hurricanes defeated Florida Gulf Coast 70-57 on Thursday night.

**THREE TRANSFERRING:** A trio of usual faces was missing from the Gators' bench. Sophomore Trumae Lucas and freshmen Christal Caldwell and Tessah Holt were sitting in the stands after decisions to transfer from Florida.

Lucas saw the most time this season out of the three, averaging 16.4 minutes per game.

Since coming to Florida, Rachael Zimmerman has undergone enough changes to make the sophomore's head spin.

Zimmerman arrived in Gainesville a midfielder, but in December, UF coach Amanda O'Leary asked her to switch to defense, which she graciously did.

Zimmerman had to work hard because her weak footwork and over-aggressiveness had prevented her from being a defender before, but after about two months of adjusting, the next change happened.

O'Leary said Zimmerman is dynamic, and she understands what the team is trying to accomplish offensively.


However, Zimmerman saw her role adjusted once more in the Gators' 22-3 win over the Red Foxes because O'Leary added a new dimension — a series of offensive, defensive and midfield substitutions.

Before the first face-off of the match, Zimmerman and freshman attacker Janine Hillier waited by the substitution box.

Zimmerman entered the game when UF took control of the draw, replacing starting defender Kayla Stolins. For the rest of the game, the two would alternate for offense and defense.

Hillier was paired with midfielder Kitty Cullen in the new system, and the two traded off after three sets of playing both ends of the field.

"It's a lot of running," Zimmerman said. "You have to really hustle off the field."

left-to-right about eight inches. Batters who catch up to the fastball have trouble making solid contact because they misjudge where the ball will be.

"It's almost like he's got two pitches in one," O'Sullivan said. "It's not only a 92-to-95-mph fastball, but it moves half the distance of the plate."

Neither O'Sullivan nor Chapman blamed the left-hander's injury on bad form, but he still re-worked his delivery while rehabbing.

Chapman used to slightly swing his arm behind his back before his follow-

through, and now his motion is more direct.

"Sometimes an injury like that becomes a positive for you because you have eight, 10 months just to work on your mechanics," O'Sullivan said.

Chapman also said time away from baseball made him more excited to play.

"They always say you never really know what you have until you lose it," Chapman said. "I lost it for a little bit, so it really helped me realize how fun this game is and how much I'm blessed."

ting the ball through the net.

Up until Boynton fouled out with four minutes remaining in double overtime, he could only muster four more points after his 14-point run.

As admirable of a job as he did guarding BYU's primary ball handler, he didn't exactly shut him down. No one is capable of that.

The way Boynton was stroking the ball, it would have been wise to save his energy and foul for the offensive end of the court, where he may have carried UF for as long as necessary.

Billy Donovan will take some heat for failing to draw up a functional last-shot

play at the end of regulation and the first overtime — and rightfully so — but I think his biggest mistake was not putting Ray Shipman, one of their best on-the-ball defenders, on Fredette, who wore Boynton out by always keeping his dribble and eventually drew the call that fouled the freshman out of the game.

Donovan even had to sit Boynton down for a few seconds to catch his breath immediately following his last three-pointer in that incredible run. There's no way he was best served on the bench in that situation; he could've been resting on defense.

With the possessed look Boynton had in his eye the whole game, I'm sure he would've rather guarded two people than be taken off Fredette, but it clearly took a toll on him.

The players tried everything they could to get a win. I'm just not totally sold that Donovan did.

# Well-rested Florida to host Utah to end regular season

## The Gators are coming off their only bye week of the year

Boynton was given the tall order of guarding Fredette, and chasing around BYU's top scorer tired out Boynton, who still had one of his best offensive games of the season.

Although Boynton kept up with Fredette fairly well, the junior guard was as good as advertised and finished with 37 points on 13-of-26 shooting.

The unexpected star of the day was Loyd, who was averaging 4.6 points per game before going off for 26 points on 7-of-10 shooting Thursday. He helped BYU take the lead at the end of the first half by coming off the bench and scoring 10 straight points.

The Cougars extended their lead

to as many as 13 points in the second half, but the Gators were able to overcome that deficit before running out of gas in the second overtime.


