



# Students discuss demands

*They spoke at a private meeting*

Behind closed doors, Vice President for Student Affairs Patricia Telles-Irvin met with members of the Coalition for Justice Against Police Brutality Tuesday afternoon to discuss the demands the coalition made at last week's rally protesting the University Police Department shooting of UF graduate student

Kofi Adu-Brempong.  
 After the meeting, Telles-Irvin said the administration is waiting for the results from the shooting investigation before taking any more action.

She also said she reassured the students that their opinions will be treated fairly, and she offered to meet with them again.

The coalition's demands include

dropping all charges against Adu-Brempong, implementing an independent review board for UPD consisting of students, faculty, community members and coalition members, and improving mental health and crisis services on campus.

Coalition member Fernando Figueroa said the group felt the meeting was inconclusive.

"We came with many questions, and we leave with more questions," he said.

# 5,000 gather for SNL star

#### Former Navy Seal to speak on campus

Eric Greitens wants to challenge students to serve their communities by helping those who have already served their country.

Greitens, a former U.S. Navy Seal, will speak tonight in the

Bob Graham Center for Public Service.

"Eric Greitens: A Different Kind of Service" begins at 7 p.m. and is free and open to the public, according to Vicki Gervickas, Graham Center spokeswoman.

Greitens co-founded The Mission Continues, a nonprofit organization dedicated to matching veterans with three-month volunteer fellowships in the community.

"We try to partner them with an objective that is appealing to them, something they can believe in," said John Roy, the central Florida outreach coordinator for The Mission Continues.

Roy said volunteers are needed for tribute projects, which commemorate someone who has devoted his or her life to service.

Although Greitens is constantly changing his presentations, he said the event will be directed toward student volunteer opportunities.

Roy said Greitens' project is needed because veterans who voluntarily agreed to serve their country really struggle to adjust when they are injured. Their goal to continue to serve hasn't changed, he said.

"The real story is helping wounded and disabled veterans transition," he said.





## Comedian hypnotizes six

Under normal circumstances, a trip to outer space would require years of scientific training and expensive equipment.

For Sailesh the Hypnotist, it only takes one touch of the arm and a few words.

Sailesh, who was named the "Best Hypnotist on the Planet" by MTV Europe, performed in front of an audience of about 30 people Tuesday at the Reitz Union Auditorium.

Sailesh placed members of the audience under a hypnotic trance by doing controlled breathing exercises and lightly touching them on the arm.

He also incorporated humor into his performances.

The volunteers acted out scenarios, such as watching television and flying in a space shuttle. Sailesh was even able to convince one volunteer that his belt was something to be afraid of. Sailesh grabbed the belt and flipped it around. As the belt moved, the volunteer switched from being calm to being fearful.

For Sailesh, who was first introduced to hypnotism when he was 20, hypnotism

acts as a natural sort of therapy. According to Sailesh, the average student falls under a hypnotic trance 112 times in the average day.

Since August 1, Sailesh has performed about 140 times and has 60 more booked.

Amanda married Ben, Bennett married Craig, and Amy married Christina.

The couples exchanged Ring Pops, not diamonds, and Hershey's Kisses rather than real smooches.

UF Levin College of Law students gathered from noon to 2 p.m. for a "marry in" to protest the Defense of Marriage Act — an event sponsored by the student organization Outlaw.

In 1996, the Defense of Marriage Act was passed, defining marriage as a union strictly between a man and a woman.

Outlaw is a UF student group that works to inform people about the legal issues faced by members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community.

Participants were able to symbolically get married and sign petitions that will be sent to Sen. George LeMieux, R-Fla.,

and Bill Nelson, D-Fla., in hopes that the Defense of Marriage Act will come to a revote and eventually be repealed.

Amy Levenberg, a first-year law student and vice president of Outlaw, said she thinks the bill is hateful and goes against the American value of equality.

Levenberg "married" Christina Vilaseca, also a first-year law student.

"We're actually on our honeymoon now," Vilaseca said jokingly.

Karen Middlekauff, a first-year law student and president of Outlaw, said the organization married about 40 couples during the two-hour event.

She said about 20 of the couples were same-sex, while the others were heterosexual couples or friends who wanted to show their support.

One heterosexual couple celebrated their anniversary by getting "married."

Bennett Ostroff, a second-year law student, said he is heterosexual but married his friend Craig Cox to show his support.

"I really believe that homophobia is the new racism," Ostroff said.

McKeen said Lewis is very popular with his students and his colleagues.

Lewis' years of experience in journalism help make him a strong professor, he said.

"I never hear anything but praise for Norman," he said.

Lewis worked as a journalist and editor for 25 years before going into teaching.

He lived in seven different states and worked at publications such as The Washington Post.

Lewis received his Ph.D. in journalism from the University of Maryland in 2007. His thesis discussed plagiarism.

As a professor, Lewis said he tries to present his students with ethical dilemmas they might face during their journalism careers.

"I try to make it as practical as I can," Lewis said. "It's practical ethics, not philosophy."

Lewis wants to help students like his college adviser helped him and point them in the right direction on their career path.

"I want you, as my student, to be the best you possibly can," Lewis said.

Lewis often reviews cover letters and resumes from students and offers them advice from the perspective of a former hiring editor.

Brian Kelley, a journalism and economics senior took two of Lewis' classes and said Lewis wrote him two letters of recommendation.

He also took a journalism ethics class with Lewis during a study abroad trip to France in May 2009.

Kelley said Lewis is probably one of his favorite teachers.

"He just genuinely cares about the students," Kelley said. "He wants them to do well in life."

## Inventors spar for \$50K

Florida's inventors now have the opportunity to earn a little more cash to fund their creations.

The Cade Museum Foundation of Gainesville is sponsoring its first competition to recognize Florida innovators with a cash prize of \$50,000 for the most innovative project.

The deadline for entries is March 31.

The foundation is part of The Cade Museum for Innovation and Invention, which is scheduled to open in 2013 in downtown Gainesville. It is named for Dr. James Robert Cade, the lead inventor of Gatorade.

"It's a continuation of the legacy of Cade and fostering the creative spirit

in Gainesville," said program director Monika Oli.

The Cade Prize for Innovation will also consist of one year of free office space at the Gainesville Chamber of Commerce and access to the Gainesville Technology Enterprise Center.

"We've had a decent number of submissions, but I expect many to come in the last 48 hours," Oli said.

The 500-word project summaries should show the idea is innovative, creative, interdisciplinary and have problem-solving characteristics and commercialization potential.

Three finalists will be picked by May 31 by a local panel of judges, and the winner will be announced after a final pitch on June 12 in front of a panel of nationally renowned judges.

## Pepsi products shed calories

UF's vending machines will still look the same, but many of the products inside them might look and taste a little different when one corporation makes big changes.

PepsiCo Inc., which includes such product names as Pepsi, Frito-Lay, Gatorade and Tropicana, is altering some of its products to make them healthier, according to the company's Web site.

The company plans to reduce saturated fat, sodium and sugars and add whole grains, fiber, fruit, vegetables and key vitamins and minerals to its products.

Pepsi is also targeting the school system by eliminating full-calorie beverages and offering healthier choices, including water, sports drinks, juices and no- or low-calorie drinks, according to the Web site.

Robin Zukowski, a personal trainer and weight loss coach at Gainesville Health and Fitness Center, believes the changes made to Pepsi products are the result of people demanding it.

"I think now is one of the first times there is an awareness about it," Zukowski said. "As cancer and obesity increase, it is

a time everyone is concerned about what they are eating and feeding their children."

Janis Mena, registered dietician at the Student Health Care Center, said Pepsi's change could help lead America to solving its obesity problem.

"It's a step in the right direction," Mena said.

About 60 percent of Americans are overweight or obese, and in Alachua County, one in three children are obese, she said.

"Education is important for behavioral change," Mena added.

It is important to reinforce healthy eating and to promote education about food choices, but restricting certain foods won't solve the problem, she warned.

"People just need to be aware," Mena said.

## Web site raises money to oust Limbaugh

Instead, the site Google.cn began redirecting users to the Hong Kong server, which is not censored due to the "one country, two systems" concept.

In retaliation, the Chinese government has disabled searches that were found offensive and blocked links in order to restrict what can be seen from mainland computers.

Right now, things seem to be pretty much where they started unless they're looked at more deeply.

We are disappointed that the outcome of this has peo-

ple shrugging and saying, "So what? China's still censored and censoring. Nothing has changed."

But what must be recognized is Google's effort. For months, there has been speculation on whether they would leave China after almost four years of censoring, and they have managed to make a decision that is both strategically and morally right for them.

Not altogether leaving China allows them to keep a "technological toehold," and refusing to censor material allows them to do what they feel is right. Censorship still exists, and our focus is not China's reaction. Instead, we can see Google doing making a difficult choice in an attempt to do what's right.

to flourish during this exhaustive national debate on a gamble of a political strategy aimed at making health care reform Obama's "Waterloo."

How craven, how unscrupulous, how cheap.

Even as the bill's passage was imminent late Sunday night, the vitriol only began to peak. All of this was expected. And yet, the Democrats in both the House and the most important one sitting in the Oval Office stayed true to their convictions — that a family shouldn't go bankrupt just because someone had the bad chance of getting sick, and that politics should be more than about simply helping yourself, but helping your neighbors too — and passed this historic reform bill, with it signaling the return of that little bit of George W. Bush we've all been missing: certitude in your convictions.

**Bright Futures changes match purpose**

According to the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program's Web site, the scholarship was created in 1997 "to reward students for their academic achievements during high school by providing funding to attend post-secondary education in Florida."

It's been only 13 years since Bright Futures began funding students' education, and already the program is running out of funds. The proposed raising of the standards for the program are both beneficial and necessary for the program to continue. The program's original purpose was to retain the "bright" — isn't the state clever? — students within the state, but now it's being viewed as an umbrella scholarship for anyone staying in Florida for higher education.

It was designed to reward high-achieving students, so why would raising the standards ever be considered a bad thing?

The problem with a program like this is that it creates the feeling of entitlement. With

so many students at UF on the program, the idea is created that Bright Futures is a permanent structure for a state-funded university education. But a college education is no more of a right than any material goods are. Merit as a basis for a scholarship is not just logical, it's a reflection of every other opportunity in life that a person receives because they're good enough, not because the state gets bullied into spending money. The higher merit standards will help states and universities get out of their economic ruts.

When a 970 SAT score, which is average for the old, 1600 point SAT test, gets about half of your college education paid for, something is wrong. Mediocrity shouldn't be rewarded. Nothing is special about being average. When we're talking about that state's money, standards should be raised before we dole it out to every student who stumbles through high school.

# Google forum offers answers

## About 30 people attended

At a public forum Tuesday, Dan Rua told a group of about 30 people why Google should give a gig for Gainesville.

Rua, president of Gainesville Area Innovation Network, a network that encourages technology enterprises in Gainesville, emphasized the need for support of Gig4GNV, Gainesville's campaign for ultra-high-speed Internet.

Friday is the deadline to submit community support for Gainesville's bid.

Rua encouraged members of the community to nominate Gainesville then post Facebook and YouTube videos to support the campaign.

"I want to see more funny and passionate videos from the stu-

dents," he said.

Google is planning to build an ultra-high-speed fiber broadband connection in a city that best shows its qualification and enthusiasm.

Google plans to offer the Internet upgrade at a competitive price to a city ranging from 50,000 to 500,000 people, according to Rua.

### Around Gainesville

Rua explained the network would result in a speed about 100 times faster than what's available in homes now.

Ted Kellerman, director of GRU's GRUCom telecommunications services, said Google would be spending between \$200 million and \$300 million to construct the network in the city of Gainesville.

A Santa Fe College student

raised concerns over privacy issues for potential Google Internet users.

"What's to stop them from selling our data to the government or businesses?" Garrett Krinsky asked.

Moselaine Elan, who moved to Gainesville in early March from Fort Pierce, said she is hopeful Gainesville will be chosen.

"I think it offers so many amazing things for our community and education," Elan said.

At the forum, attendees could record video clips to post to the Gig4GNV's YouTube channel.

Ian Elsner, who recorded videos in a separate room during the forum, said he thinks the city is very qualified.

"If Gainesville can harness the wildness and creativity of its people, then we will have a good chance to win," Elsner said.

## Fontana looks to continue on-base streak against FGCU

After smacking 15 homers and racking up a school-record 85 RBIs in his freshman year, everybody expected Preston Tucker to pick up his fair share of walks this season.

But what people didn't foresee was that freshman shortstop Nolan Fontana would be the one to draw more free passes than any player on the Gators through the first 19 games.

The 5-foot-11, 190-pound freshman has reached base in every game except the first one of the season, and he will look to continue that 18-game streak tonight as No. 2 Florida (16-3, 3-0 Southeastern Conference) goes up against Florida Gulf Coast (12-6) at 6:30 in McKethan Stadium.

"He doesn't swing at balls out of the zone," UF coach Kevin O'Sullivan said. "I can count on my hand, how many times I remember that he's swing at balls out of the strike zone."

Fontana has started every game this season, and has only struck out five times while earning a team-high 16 walks.

He has drawn three more free

passes than Tucker and has tallied one less punch out.

"My mindset is to be patient, but it's also to be aggressive when the one pitch in the at-bat comes," Fontana said. "I try to be patient at the start of the at-bat to see as many pitches as I can, but when I see that one pitch, I try to put a good swing on it."

"It certainly gives us another element offensively.

He's a really good all-around baseball player. He's played outstanding defense for us, he bunts well and runs the bases well. There is really no glaring weakness in his game."

Usually, that one pitch is a fast-ball, Fontana said.

But when the freshman does get on base, he doesn't stop there. He has stolen five bases on six attempts this season, while scoring 15 runs in 19 games.

## Cornell poses test for UF

■ **FLORIDA WON ITS LAST TWO GAMES BY A COMBINED 37-6.**

On paper, Florida looks like a lock to continue its dominant ways tonight against Cornell, but numbers may be misleading.

The Gators (5-3, 0-1 American Lacrosse Conference) are on an emotional high after winning their last two games by a combined score of 37-6, and they'll host the Big Red (2-4, 1-1 Ivy League), losers of two-straight, at 6:30 p.m.

"We're coming off a really great win, and we just need to keep that momentum going, play hard, and continue do-

ing what we did on Saturday," UF coach Amanda O'Leary said.

But Cornell will give Florida a more difficult challenge than its last two opponents, New Hampshire and Marist, so a blowout may not be in the cards for the final match of a three-game home stand.

Cornell suffered three of its four losses by two points, and two of the three were against top-25 teams Rutgers and Loyola.

And the Gators will be without sophomore Rachael Zimmerman, who injured her knee during pregame warm-ups against New Hampshire.

O'Leary said an MRI revealed that the attacker, who also played defense

### Rumors swirl around Donovan

Florida coach Billy Donovan has been surrounded by rumors the last few years, and this offseason doesn't appear it will be any different.

Two days after the Gators' season came to a close with a first-round loss to BYU in the NCAA Tournament, Donovan's name was brought into the mix for the vacant coaching jobs at St. John's and Oregon.

A New York Daily News report Tuesday said Donovan turned down a \$3 million per year contract to coach the Red Storm in New York City, but UF spokesman Fred Demarest said there was "no truth" to the report.

"Billy was hugely flattered about being offered a job with such potential," a source told the Daily News. "But he and his family have something great going on in Gainesville."

Demarest said Florida was never con-

tacted about the job, and Donovan was not offered a contract.

The Daily News cited a "confidant of Donovan," who said wealthy St. John's alumnus Mike Repole offered the Long Island native the contract on behalf of the school.

The Eugene Register-Guard reported Tuesday that Oregon will soon offer Donovan a deal as well, as sources have indicated the program's interest in Donovan.

Donovan's current contract with UF is worth about \$3.5 million per season, a deal he agreed to after winning back-to-

back national championships and leaving the Gators for a short stint with the Orlando Magic before returning to UF.

Last offseason, Donovan was mentioned as a candidate for the then-vacant Kentucky job, which was filled by John Calipari.

# Hartung joins Cirque du Soleil

Corey Hartung came to UF not knowing what she wanted to do after she finished her collegiate gymnastics career and got her degree.

"At first I was like, 'No, no, no,' but I knew a few girls who did it, like [former Florida gymnast Nicola Willis] and I started thinking I would do it," Hartung said.

Over the next few months, she decided to pursue the opportunity with the support of UF coach Rhonda Faehn, who thought Hartung would be a great fit.

In June, Faehn e-mailed people she knew who were involved with Cirque du Soleil. Later on that day, Hartung heard back from the peo-

ple in charge of recruiting for the show.

They began sending e-mails back and forth, and Hartung sent them an audition tape displaying her conditioning, flexibility, bar, tumbling and dance skills.


By August, Hartung received a call with an offer to start training for Viva ELVIS, Cirque du Soleil's Elvis Presley-themed show.
