



Dancers draw 1,800 for VISA talent show

■ **VISA RAISED ABOUT \$1,200 FOR GATORS UNITED FOR HAITI.**

Multicultural Gators gathered to shimmy and shake on stage for the 2010 Volunteers for International on Student Affairs Talent Show Thursday night.

Dancers from various groups, including Dancin' Gators, Club Creole, Sabor Latino and the African Student Union, performed their dance routines in hopes of showing the audience about cultural dances from around the world.

About 1,800 students and supporters cheered and stomped their feet as the dancers flipped, spun and Gator chomped across the stage.

India Inc., an Indian dance team, won first place again this year.

The Filipino Student Association dance team took second place.

Parita Patel, director of the VISA Talent Show, said the talent show was all about portraying the different cultures of all

the groups.

"I think they did a really good job out there," Patel said.

UF freshman Daniela Guzman said she came to the show to support her friends in Sabor Latino,

the Latin dance troupe.

"I think it's a really interesting cultural experience," Guzman

said.

The teams performed routines ranging from traditional folk dances and sensuous couples' dances to hip-hop routines and songs by the Backstreet Boys and the Pussycat Dolls.

VISA partnered with Gators United for Haiti for its International Month to help raise funds to send to earthquake victims in Haiti.

Patel said the dancers and their supporters raised about \$1,200 at the talent show.

Supporters for each team could put quarters and bills into a jar for each team.

The team with the most money in its jar by the end of the talent show's intermission got an additional two points added to its score.

Gators United for Haiti president Sky Georges thanked attendees for their help and support.

"I'm just really thankful for everyone who's been donating and continuing to support us," Georges said.

He said it was his first time coming to the VISA Talent Show, but he really liked what he saw.

"I thought it was amazing," Georges said. "I had a great time."

Tea Partiers protest

Yellow "Don't tread on me" rattlesnake flags waved in the air and the crowd cheered as speakers preached the Conservative gospel at the Tea Party's Tax Day Rally on Thursday.

About 300 people came to the rally at the Bo Diddley Community Plaza. Attendees varied in age from a 90-year-old World War II

pilot to toddlers dancing to Toby Keith's "Courtesy of the Red, White and Blue."

Thomas Hayes-Morrison, a professor at City College, was the master of ceremonies at the event and railed against the federal government and President Obama.

"With Obamacare, they're go-

Anti-gay Kan. church to visit

Gainesville is expecting guests this weekend, whether they are welcome or not.

About 10 members of the Westboro Baptist Church will visit four Gainesville locations starting at noon Sunday: Trinity United Methodist Church, the UF Hillel, the Queen of Peace Catholic Church and the Saint Augustine Catholic Church.

The 70-member church travels the U.S. year-round protesting Jews, homosexuals, Catholics, Muslims, African Americans and parents of American soldiers.

Student Government Student Alliance party Sen. Alan Yanuck, who passed a resolution April 7 condemning the church's views, said students

who oppose the group should just ignore them. "[Church members] go from place to place trying to get people to protest them, and that's exactly what they want," Yanuck said.

UF Associate Dean of Students Paige Crandall said students will gather Sunday for a counter-rally, "Love Conquers Hate: A Rally for Human Rights." The event will include speakers, tables for protesters to hand out fliers and music. It will be held from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at Bo Diddley Community Plaza.

"It's going to be a way for people to gather and show that we definitely do not support what the Westboro Baptist Church is saying," Crandall said.

20-year-old man.



‘Savage Love’ writer gives sex, relationship advice

Dan Savage did not come to Gainesville to promote what he called his “big, sweaty, gay agenda,” as some conservatives have thought he was guilty of in the past.

Savage shared advice on sex and relationships to a crowd of about 400 people Thursday night in the Reitz Union Grand Ballroom.

Savage is the internationally acclaimed writer of “Savage Love,” a relationship and sex advice column that is syndicated in more than 70 newspapers worldwide.

It is his humorous, blunt and downright dirty style of writing that has made his column popular, and he answered numerous questions from the audience in a similar way.

“He preaches to be yourself,” said Alyssa Craig, a UF psychology senior and director of speakers and performers for Pride Awareness Month.

“You have to love yourself first and then love will form around you,” Craig said.

That theme factored heavily into the questions posed to Savage by the audience.

One of his most in-depth responses was to a question asking how someone deals with their conservative parents.

“Firmly,” Savage said. “You have to be the grown-up during this process because they will be children. The only leverage you have is your presence in their lives.”

Katie Schubert, a graduate student, teaches a human sexuality course at UF and heard about the speech from her students.

“I like how he says how it is,” she said. “And his advice is very practical.”

Following the speech, Savage hung back to take pictures and sign autographs.

In the end, there were some questions even Savage wouldn’t answer. “Is polyamory a good idea in college?” a student asked.

Savage chuckled. “Pass.”

Savage’s speech was one of the headlining events of Pride Awareness Month, a series of events celebrating the LGBTQ community that runs from April 1 to April 21. Pride Awareness Month is spearheaded by Pride Student Union, and Savage’s speech was co-sponsored by Accent. Savage was paid \$10,500, according to Student Government finance records. The theme for Pride Awareness Month is “Love Lawlessly,” which organizers felt fit with Savage’s themes and writings.

Twin alumnae open cupcakery

Frozen yogurt is so four days ago.

Yum Cupcakery opened its oven doors on Monday, creating an infectious demand for a new kind of treat: cupcakes.

The bakery, 3345 SW 34th St., is owned by twin sisters, Stephanie and Claire Browning.

While both are UF alumnae, neither have a degree in baking. After graduating last May with degrees in classical studies and anthropology, the sisters decided it wasn't the right time for graduate school.

"We've always loved to cook and bake," Stephanie Browning said. "We've wanted to do this since we were little girls. We thought, let's just do this now."

The options for customers' taste buds are endless. There are 103 toppings, 30 different frostings and 18 flavors of cake, including carrot, red velvet and banana.

Yum Cupcakery also offers light, vegan, gluten-free, raw and 10 regular gourmet flavors.

Raw cupcakes are nutritious, egg-free and made with no animal products or ingredients heated above 115 degrees. Light cupcakes are half the calories of regular cupcakes.

On opening day, the bakery sold about 50 cupcakes, and the second day it sold about 75, Stephanie said. Customized cupcakes range from \$2 to \$3 and include the cake, filling, frosting and topping, Stephanie said.

"It's completely customizable and cheaper," Claire Browning said. "It's a better value for a more enjoyable experience."

Claire said future plans include offering tea sandwiches, a sweets buffet and a custom soda bar with

homemade Italian soda. The bakery is also planning to offer a delivery option, and customers will soon be able to place orders online

at their Web site, TheYumShop.com.

"It'll be like making your own pizza, but way cuter," she said.

Einstein Bros. was shut down

Students hoping for hot bagels were disappointed Thursday when the Einstein Bros. Bagels at the Hub was shut down because of plumbing problems.

The mainline pipe became

clogged, and the stopped-up water flooded the floor, said Art Wade of the University Physical Plant Division.

The physical plant also shut the water off in the Hub on Thursday afternoon to prevent further flooding, Wade said.

The flooding began Wednesday night, causing the restaurant to shut

its doors for the day, Wade said.

Einstein Bros. Bagels was the only restaurant affected because it's located at the lowest point of the Hub structure, Wade said.

The physical plant responded and shut down the women's restroom to gain access to the clog.

By 5 p.m., the clog had been cleared, and Einstein Bros. Bagels only needed to be cleaned up before reopening.

'Paradise' event to fight cancer

Dressed to impress in a tropical paradise, guests will take strides in the fight against cancer Saturday in a "Polynesian Paradise."

The event, hosted by Stop! Children's Cancer Inc., will be at 7 p.m. at the O'Connell Center and benefit pediatric cancer research at the UF College of Medicine.

Although the event will be a night of fun, fundraising for research is the main purpose.

"Research done for pediatrics can move up to adults, but most adult research does not move down to children," said Rebecca Burns, associate executive director of the organization.

Unlike last year's live auction, this year's event will have a silent auction with donated items rang-

ing from \$40 to \$1,500, Burns said. There also will be a feature auction for donated items more than \$1,500. Some of those items include a UF football signed by UF's Heisman Trophy winners Steve Spurrier, Danny Wuerffel and Tim Tebow; a vacation to the Bellagio Hotel in Las Vegas; and guitars signed by Tom Petty and Brad Paisley.

Burns estimates between 1,200 to 1,500 people will attend the event, which will have music, Polynesian cuisine and casino games.

Last year's event raised almost \$250,000, Burns said.

Federal grant offers appliance rebates

Local appliance stores are preparing to be bombarded by customers today during the Florida Energy Star Appliance Rebate Program.

The program, made possible by a federal grant and legislation signed by Gov. Charlie Crist in 2009, will provide 20 percent rebates for about 68,000 new Energy Star appliances purchased from Florida retailers.

Stores will have additional inventory, extended hours and extra staff to assist customers applying for rebates.

Crist said appliances purchased between today and April 25 will qualify for rebates, according to a press release. Purchasers can reserve rebates by applying for a priority number starting at 11 a.m. today.

Energy Star refrigerators, freezers, washers, dishwashers, gas tankless water heaters and room air conditioners are eligible for rebates.

Robert Jammer, appliance professional at Martin Appliance Family on Northwest Fourth Boulevard, said employees have been working day and night to accommodate the high number of customers they expect. The store has also been assisting customers by offering layaway sales that will end Friday.

The store will be extending its hours over the weekend, staying open from 6 a.m. until at least 2 a.m.

"This is the biggest appliance day in the last 20 years," he said.

Governor vetoes controversial bill

TALLAHASSEE — Florida Gov. Charlie Crist on Thursday vetoed the most far-reaching education bill of its kind in the nation, legislation that would have made it easier to fire teachers and linked their pay to student test scores.

The veto put him at odds with Republican legislative leaders and former Gov. Jeb Bush, who worked hard for the bill's passage and touted it in national media interviews.

Crist denied the veto was a signal he's about to drop out of the Republican U.S. Senate primary, where he badly trails in the polls, and instead campaign for that seat as an independent.

He said the veto was not about politics but about the state's children though he acknowledged an outpouring of opposition by teachers, parents and local school officials around the state had an effect. Phone calls and e-mail ran 65,259 against to 3,090 for the bill.

Crist once favored the legislation and said he still supports the concept of pay for performance and holding

teachers accountable.

He said he began having second thoughts about how the bill would achieve those goals when a friend back home in St. Petersburg called him and questioned how his special needs child could be fairly tested.

"It touched my heart, frankly," Crist said. "His son's teacher came to him and was crying about how she might be evaluated."

Crist cited several other problems with details of the bill (SB 6) and the way his fellow Republicans, who control both legislative chambers, rushed it through.

He compared it to GOP criticism that the Democratic Congress had rammed through President Barack Obama's health care overhaul.

"A month later, the very same thing happens here in education," Crist said.

The bill was sponsored by Sen. John Thrasher, chairman of the Florida Republican Party.

ing to tell you who can have children," he said. "And how and when you're going to die."

He called the president a liberal, socialist, communist, Marxist and fascist, and he rallied against high taxes. When asked, he couldn't name any new taxes created by the Obama administration, other than health care taxes on the upper class and some businesses.

The speakers also discussed local issues. Mayoral candidate Don Marsh stopped by on his way to the Supervisor of Elections Office to thank the Tea Partiers for supporting him in the city election.

Michael Katz, a Marsh supporter who owns a body shop, spoke against Gainesville Regional Utilities' high rates, which he said help the city pay for services other than energy.

Katz works with Gainesville's Elder Care Board and told a story about an elderly sick woman who couldn't afford to pay her heating bill without help from a charity.

And while the Tea Partiers promoted the importance of the Constitution and the First Amendment, not everyone's views were welcome at the event.

Two activists were booed for holding "9/11 truth" signs. As they walked around the plaza with their signs, Tea Partiers circled them with American flags and told them to leave.

Gainesville police intervened to make sure an argument between the protesters didn't turn into anything physical or violent.

Elizabeth Wachman, a rally participant who volunteers with the Republican Party of Alachua County, said she's been politically active for 48 years.

"I've always been the Tea Party," she said. "It's just now they've given it a name."

Obama plans Mars exploration

CAPE CANAVERAL — President Barack Obama boldly predicted Thursday his new plans for space exploration would lead American astronauts on historic, almost fantastic journeys to an asteroid and then to Mars — and in his lifetime — relying on rockets and propulsion still to be imagined and built.

"I expect to be around to see it," he said of pioneering U.S. trips starting with a landing on an asteroid — a colossal feat in itself — before the long-dreamed-of expedition to Mars. He spoke near the historic Kennedy Space Center launch pads that sent the first men to the moon, a blunt rejoinder to critics, including several former astronauts, who contend his planned changes will instead deal a staggering blow to the nation's manned space program.

"We want to leap into the future," not continue on the same path as before, Obama said as he sought to reassure NASA workers that America's space adventures would soar on despite the impending termination of space shuttle flights.

His prediction was reminiscent of President John F. Kennedy's declaration in 1961, "I believe that this nation should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the Moon and returning him safely to Earth." That goal was fulfilled in 1969.

Obama did not predict a Mars landing soon. But he said that by 2025, the nation would have a new spacecraft "designed for long journeys to allow us to begin the first-ever crewed missions beyond the moon into deep space."

"We'll start by sending astronauts to an asteroid for the first time in history," he said. "By the mid-2030s, I believe we can send humans to orbit Mars and return them safely to Earth. And a landing on Mars will follow. And I expect to be around to see it."

But several Republicans, including Sen. David Vitter of Louisiana and Rep. Rob Bishop of Utah, assailed Obama's plan and speech, calling his plans "job-killing."

Red Bull chariot race to make stop at UF

Florida keeps winning despite injuries to key players

The Gators won twice as many games as they lost in the last month, but it has been painful.

Two starting pitchers were injured on the mound. A pair of relievers suffered tendinitis. The third baseman couldn't even hold a bat.

And then there was right fielder Kamm Washington, who suffered a season-ending hamstring tear in his right leg after diving into a fence on Saturday. The team trainer described the collision as "the closest thing to a car accident that we can simulate."

Time will heal those wounds, but No. 7 Florida (23-9, 8-4 Southeastern Conference) is impatient. The Gators want a regular-season SEC championship, meaning a thin UF team hopes to not waver tonight on the road at 7 against Kentucky (21-12, 4-8 SEC).

"No one's going to feel sorry for us," UF coach Kevin O'Sullivan said. "We've got to figure it out, and we've got to play our best baseball in the next couple weeks. It is what it is, and we've got to battle through it."

UF received some good news this week with the return of third baseman Bryson Smith, who has not played since dislocating his left index finger while diving into first base against Mississippi State on March 20.

Smith's finger snapped backwards to form a 90-degree angle and looked like a reverse L. Florida trainer John Barrett said only rest could heal the injury.

While waiting to recover, Smith said he hit off a tee and unsuccessfully tried catching fly balls with a left-handed glove.

"It's been a struggle," Smith said. "I've never sat out this long for an injury during a season."

Smith's finger healed enough for him to field ground balls on Monday, and he started hitting against a pitching machine Tuesday. Smith said he was relieved to be back on the field, but his footwork was awkward and his defense was porous this week.

"You can't really take off three weeks in baseball and expect to be right back out in perfect shape," he said.

But just getting Smith on the field is a relief for Barrett. The trainer said most of UF's injured players will be healthy again soon, but this has been his busiest season.

"Maybe we were just lucky in the past," Barrett said. "The baseball gods were good to us, but we've got some challenges now."

With injuries to starting pitchers Tommy Toledo (facial fractures) and Brian Johnson (strained back muscle), UF does not have a Sunday starter this week. O'Sullivan said he will pick a pitcher after Saturday's game, when he can look at his roster and see who is still fresh.

But the most important member of the team right now is Barrett, who said he is rehabbing more players than any trainer in the SEC.

"I've got the most chips in this poker game," he said.

The majority of UF's injuries are not serious, Barrett said, so O'Sullivan is optimistic that his team can be back to full strength in about a month, when the stakes rise.

"If we can weather the storm," O'Sullivan said, "I think we can be a team that hopefully nobody wants to play against come regional time."

Gators still looking to add another guard this offseason

Billy Donovan may not have been able to bring in top guard recruits Brandon Knight and Ray McCallum, but the Gators are still actively pursuing players to help fill out their backcourt.

Knight and McCallum signed with Kentucky and Detroit Mercy, respectively, so Donovan is focusing on other options — both trans-

fers and recruits, a few of whom will visit Gainesville this weekend.

According to SNY.tv, Mike Rosario, who was recently granted a conditional release from Rutgers, will make an official visit to Florida this weekend.

"If he's going to leave [Rutgers] because he's not happy with his individual development, Billy Donovan is very good at developing players," Bob Hurley, Rosario's high school coach, told SNY.tv.

Rosario, a 6-foot-3 guard who

averaged 16.7 points per game last season, will have to sit out next year due to transfer rules, but he has the ability to be an immediate contributor whenever he goes.

Donovan has expressed his desire to fix his backcourt for next year, though, so he is also pursuing point guard recruits for 2010.

"We've been actively recruiting players all year long," Donovan said. "I think it all depends on the fit and the need, and is it someone we feel is going to be able to contribute over a period of time."

Chris Denson, a Rivals.com three-star point guard from Midland, Ga., will also be in Gainesville over the weekend, according to the Orlando Sentinel. The 6-foot-2 Denson is also considering Auburn, Villanova, UNLV and North Carolina Greensboro.

"He can play at a high-major level. I think he would really thrive at the mid-major level. He's one of those bubble guys," Rivals.com recruiting analyst Jerry Meyer said.

UF is also interested in 6-foot-2 Brandon Young from Baltimore, Md., who Rivals.com lists as the 33rd-best point guard in the nation. Young is committed to DePaul, but he will likely be looking to make a move after Oliver Purnell replaced former coach Jerry Wainwright.

No. 8 Commodores pose tough task for Gators

Florida beat its first conference opponent — then-No. 14 Penn State — at home two weeks ago, but when No. 8 Vanderbilt comes to Gainesville this weekend, UF will need its home-field advantage once again if it is to get another American Lacrosse Conference win.

UF (9-5, 1-2 ALC) took down Penn State, 13-11, in a clean and competitive match on April 3. The Gators, 7-1 at home, charged ahead in the second half after being tied at the break to grab the victory.

However, against Vanderbilt (10-3, 3-0 ALC), UF will need to play a nearly flawless game.

The Commodores will be ready to add the Gators as another notch in their current nine-game winning streak. They lost their first two games of the season, but have won 10 of the last 11.

"They are a fantastic team," UF coach Amanda O'Leary said. "They have a lot of upperclassmen. I don't think they start any freshmen. They are a talented team, they are an experienced team, and they have great stick skills, so we're trying to find the Achilles' heel of Vanderbilt."

The Commodores don't have a fatal flaw for opponents to capitalize on as they average about 15 goals per game, allow opponents to score just fewer than 11 goals and hold teams

to a .399 shooting percentage.

The challenge for Florida will be to contain Vandy's multiple threats and prevent the Commodores' offense from being the deciding factor in the game. They have four players who have scored 30 or more goals already this season and another four players with double-digit goals.

"They have great stick skills, so we're trying to find the Achilles' heel of Vanderbilt."

O'Leary said the Commodores have quality players but are also beatable.

However, UF must focus on its play rather than its opponent's game, and it must also finish its shots and take advantage of opportunities.

Freshman Caroline Chesterman said the Gators will take advantage of the game's location on Sunday as it battles for a second ALC win.

"We've only lost one game at home so far, against Georgetown, and even then, we played really well," Chesterman said. "There's something about playing here in front of our friends and family that we usually come out really hyped and ready to go, so hopefully we do the same thing against Vandy."

Young has skyrocketed up recruiting boards recently, going from an unheralded prospect to one of the more intriguing unsigned point guards remaining.

Another guard option looking to get out of his current commitment is Jalen Steele, a 6-foot-2 guard who was released from his letter-of-intent with Auburn last week.

Steele signed with Auburn in November, but he has received a lot

of attention from other Southeastern Conference schools, particularly Ole Miss and Mississippi State.

Meyer said Steele is another fringe, mid-major to high-major recruit, but given UF's inability to land top-tier guards like Knight and McCallum, that's the most the Gators can hope for in the late signing period, which ends May 19.

"That's the big question with all these guys that Florida is left to recruit now. Not that they're bad players. Just that they're not defi-

nite high-major prospects," Meyer said. "They have definite flaws as prospects. Sometimes those flaws can be overcome and these guys are great, and then there's other times they don't, so it's a very difficult call."

UF is also interested in two 6-foot-7 forwards, Will Yeguete and Marcus Thornton. Meyer said Thornton, a three-star

forward from Atlanta, will probably stay close to home and sign with Georgia or Georgia Tech, or be reeled in by Kentucky coach John Calipari. Yeguete, a forward from Melbourne Florida Air Academy, is the more likely option for UF, Meyer said.

Regardless, the top priority for the Gators remains bringing in another guard to relieve Erving Walker and Kenny Boynton, especially after Ray Shipman's decision to transfer.

If this offseason is a repeat of

last year, when UF missed on John Wall, Eric Bledsoe and several other guards before signing Rod Tishman, Donovan will again find himself with depth issues in the backcourt.

"They can function — Walker and Boynton will be better as playmakers than they were last year," Meyer said. "But I think it's safe to say it would be a disappointment. Florida really wanted to get a quality point guard, and it's looking questionable if that's going to happen now."

UF looks to repeat success at home

Former UF track and field coach Percy Beard helped create and build one of the best men's teams in the country. This Saturday's meet on Percy Beard Track will commemorate one of the most important figures in the women's team's history.

The third-annual Tom Jones Memorial Invite will give the men's and women's track teams another home meet to prepare for the Southeastern Conference and NCAA Championships in May and June, respectively. It will also honor an icon of UF track and field.

Jones died on Mar. 21, 2007 at age 62 after battling cancer. He coached the women's cross country and track teams from the fall of 1992 until the spring of 2007 and led them to six SEC championships.

"He had a huge impact on UF, and it's really important to him that we perform well in the meet to remember him," middle-distance runner Charlotte Browning said.

The meet features teams from UCF, USF, Florida Atlantic, Kentucky, Brown, Princeton and UCLA. It begins at 1 p.m. on Saturday on the track at James G. Pressly Stadium.

"When we have a home competition, we want to show our best to the people who watch us

from Gainesville," shot putter Kemal Mesic said.

After a highly successful Florida Relays two weekends ago that saw the Gators set two school records and win 10 events against some of the best competition in the country, the Tom Jones Memorial will give UF a more low-key meet to prepare for the championship competitions later in the season.

Browning said this is the most important time of the year for the team because the athletes can put in some of their hardest training without tapering their workouts to compete in regular-season meets.

This will be the first meet for Steve Lemke as associate head coach. Lemke has served as throws coach for the past four seasons at UF and has coached 12 Olympic qualifiers during his 25 years of collegiate experience.

"He's one of the best coaches in the world for throwing events," Mesic said. "He's a hard worker, and he makes us work hard to achieve our goals."

Lemke has assembled one of the most talented throwing units in the world and features athletes from the Netherlands, Brazil, Georgia, Australia and Bosnia.

The group is led by Mariam Kevkshvili, who is a four-time NCAA Champion in the shot put, including winning the event in the indoor this year.

No easy outs in UF's batting order

■ FLORIDA FACES KENTUCKY IN LEXINGTON THIS WEEKEND.

Against a lineup like Florida's, opposing pitchers never get so much as a second to breathe.

Normally, pitchers have the luxury of working around the stronger hitters and attacking the weaker ones, but for the Gators, each batter is as dangerous as the next.

And it only gets worse each time through the order.

Over the course of Southeastern Conference play, the Gators have proven that every bat in the lineup is capable of doing damage, and that they only get stronger as the game wears on.

This is a trend No. 3 Florida (32-4, 12-2 SEC) will look to continue when Kentucky (26-16, 10-9 SEC) comes to Gainesville for a weekend series starting Saturday at 1 p.m.

The Gators are tops in the SEC and third in the nation with 7.38 runs per game, a figure that has been critical to the success of a team that is 50th nationally with a 2.22 team ERA.

"That's the name of the game," UF coach Tim Walton said. "We've been doing a good job of finding a way to score runs and gets wins."

The strength of the team's line-

up has come from its ability to get both hits and home runs from a number of different players.

UF is the only team in the SEC that has seven starters hitting better than .300. Tennessee, Georgia and Ole Miss are all tied for second with five. The Gators are also the only squad to have a trio of players with 10 or more home runs, with only Georgia and Arkansas having as many as two.

"We've got a lot of options and a lot of good things going on," Walton said. "Everybody gets hits, and I'm very happy with that."

Earlier in the season, it was easy to point to Francesca Enea as the reason for the Gators' offensive success.

The senior, who was recently named a finalist for the 2010 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award, leads the SEC with an .892 slugging percentage, 15 home runs and 50 RBIs.

But Enea is only eighth on the team with a .243 average in SEC play, although Florida has still managed to go 12-2 in conference.

Over that span, the Gators have relied on their ability to make quality in-game adjustments to keep their run production high.

In conference games, UF hitters are only batting .206 the first time through the order.

But that average shoots up to .296 the second time through, then increases to .426 during the third trip around.

Junior Aja Paculba, who is usually responsible for sparking these shifts at the top of the order, attri-

butes the spike in production to learning the pitcher and adjusting to her tendencies.

"It's just making adjustments and not swinging at bad pitches and not letting the pitcher beat

us," Paculba said. "That first at-bat, we're kinda just trying it out, and after that, it's like we all know this is what she's pitching me, this is what I need to do, and this is what I need to look for."
