Recount declares Lowe city's next mayor

■ **LOWE WON BY A MARGIN OF 42 VOTES.**

The wait is over.

After holding a mandatory recount required by law, the city of Gainesville has officially tabbed Craig Lowe to be the city's next

mayor.

Lowe, who has served on the City Commission since 2003, defeated local businessman Don Marsh in a machine recount Friday by a margin of 42 votes, or .34 percent.

The recounted results showed no change from Thursday evening, when the canvassing board met to decide on 21 provisional ballots. The board awarded 12 of

the ballots to Lowe, five to Marsh and disqualified the remaining four.

Since the margin between Lowe and Marsh was less than half of a percent but more than a quarter of a percent after Thursday's meeting, the recount was

conducted on 10 machines, each manned by one Republican and one Democrat.

Lowe, who intently watched the recount process from start to finish, celebrated the victory with his campaign staff while accepting congratulations from the core supporters who stuck out Friday's proceedings to the very end.

"Now that the election is over,

we'll all need to go home and be neighbors and work together to make Gainesville a better community," Lowe said.

Marsh, who had supporters at Friday's meeting, was not in attendance and could not be reached for comment.

Lowe, who will replace the current mayor, Pegeen Hanrahan, will officially be sworn in on May 20.

Protesters hold rally, counter-rally

The distance that separated the protesters spanned three lanes of traffic on University Avenue.

But for Shirley Phelps-Roper, it was the distance between heaven and hell.

Phelps-Roper, the daughter of the Westboro Baptist Church pastor, was one of about 10 members from the church who came to Gainesville to spread one message: God hates.

Insults flew like speeding cars, signs projected messages of humor and hate, and costumed protesters danced to an eclectic mix blaring from boom boxes.

At the four-stop protest Sunday, hundreds of counter-protesters outnumbered the members from the Kansas church, which has gained national notoriety for its Web site, godhatesfags.com.

Lou Bouton, a 51-year-old former drag queen from Gainesville, was among the counter-protesters who demonstrated against the church.

"I have nothing better to do, so I like to come out here and be an annoyance," he said.

But for some Gainesville residents, the real annoyance was the radical church, which has made national headlines for its controversial stances on homosexuality, Jews, Catholics, Muslims and African-Americans, among others.

Westboro Baptist Church began its Gainesville tour at the Trinity United

FDLE concludes investigation of March shooting

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement concluded its investigation Thursday into the recent shooting of an international graduate student by University Police Department officers.

A copy of the report has been given to UPD and the State Attorney's Office for consideration by those agencies, but its contents remain off-limits to the public, said State Attorney Bill Cervone.

Although Cervone could not share the details of the report, the information within will help him determine whether to press charges against student Kofi Adu-Brempong and whether police used unnecessary force.

Adu-Brempong faces charges for aggravated assault and resisting arrest with violence.

Adu-Brempong was shot by police in his on-campus apartment on March 2 after he allegedly resisted arrest with violence.

Some students have expressed concern about the validity of the officers' actions that night, demonstrating on campus and demanding that all charges against Adu-Brempong be dropped.

George Washington racks up late fees at New York library

NEW YORK (AP) — If George Washington were alive today, he might face a hefty overdue library fine.

New York City's oldest library says one of its ledgers shows that the president has racked up 220 years' worth of late fees on two books he borrowed, but never returned.

One of the books was the "Law of Nations," which deals with international relations. The other was a volume of debates from Britain's House of Commons.

Both books were due on Nov. 2, 1789.

New York Society Library head librarian Mark Bartlett says the institution isn't seeking payment of the fines, but would love to get the books back.

The ledger also lists books being taken out by other founding fathers, including Alexander Hamilton, Aaron Burr and John Jay.

The entry on Washington simply lists the borrower as "president."

Students meet with Machen again to discuss demands

Student activists met with UF President Bernie Machen again on Friday to discuss their demands for justice after the Corry Village shooting of Kofi Adu-Brempong.

The group of students reiterated their six demands to Ma-

chen, said Dave Schneider, an organizer of Justice for Kofi Adu-Brempong.

The meeting showed the students they need to keep pressuring the administration, Schneider said. He said they also need to turn their efforts toward initiating a grand jury investigation into the shooting and persuading the state attorney to drop the charges against Adu-Brempong.

UF spokeswoman Janine Sikes said the university is still awaiting the results of the FDLE investigation. Those results

have been sent to the State Attorney's office and administrators are still awaiting his decision on the matter.

Sikes said that, after the meeting, she thinks students understand the administration is still unable to do more than talk about their demands and at this point in time.

"We're still in a kind of sit-tight mode," Sikes said.

The coalition is planning a rally Tuesday at 3:30 p.m. Schneider said Justice for Kofi Adu-Brempong will continue to call for justice during the summer and after the results of the Federal Department of Law Enforcement investigation are released.



Strict new Neb. abortion law faces long legal road

There is no precedent to support the law

LINCOLN, Neb. — It's been called a groundbreaking law, but a measure approved in Nebraska last week that changes the rationale for abortion bans probably won't go into effect anytime soon — if ever.

Instead, abortion opponents are hoping it will become the most important case on abortion to reach the U.S. Supreme Court

in recent memory. Even they acknowledge the ban on abortions at and after 20 weeks of pregnancy won't see the light of day unless the high court rules that it is constitutional.

Mary Spaulding Balch, legislative director for National Right to Life, said a court injunction will likely prevent the implementation of the law. The measure passed last week by Nebraska's nonpartisan Legislature and signed into

law by Republican Gov. Dave Heineman is scheduled to take effect in October.

Lower courts have no precedent to support the law, which **National News** bases the new restrictions on the assertion that fetuses feel pain.

"This is a case of first impression," Spaulding Balch said.

The long trip to the high court — if it indeed lands there — com-

bined with the time it takes for a ruling there could mean a final decision on the law is several years away.

First, a legal challenge must be posed. No one has stepped forward yet, but Dr. LeRoy Carhart, one of the nation's few late-term abortion providers, is considered a likely candidate.

Carhart, who practices in an Omaha suburb and is the target of the new Nebraska law, was a plaintiff in two of the biggest abortion cases of the last decade that reached the U.S. Supreme

Court.

Carhart said in a statement that the passage of the law and another that requires women to get pre-abortion screenings for mental and physical problems has strengthened his commitment to protecting women's reproductive rights.

The Center for Reproductive Rights, which has close ties to Carhart, hinted in a letter to Heineman urging him to veto the bills that it would be involved in a challenge of the ban on late-term abortions.

Walker fights sexual abuse

Lauren Book-Lim is on a journey to fight against sexual assault one step at a time.

Book-Lim, 25, is walking from the South Florida city of Aventura to Tallahassee in order to educate people about sexual abuse and to lobby for legislative changes during Sexual Abuse Awareness Month.

Friday she made a stop in Gainesville, and about 30 people showed their support for her cause by joining her on a trek from the Reitz Union Colonnade to the Plaza of the Americas.

Book-Lim was sexually abused for six years, from age 10 to 16. Her "Walk in My Shoes" walk started April 2 in the home where she was abused and will end in Tallahassee Tuesday, where she will lead a rally urging the state to continue funding crisis centers in Florida. Each day she walks between 25 and 30 miles, stopping to speak about sexual assault awareness.

On the Plaza of the Americas, Book-Lim thanked the crowd for joining her.

Shari Robenson, the assistant director of the Counseling and Wellness Center, also spoke and educated spectators about the free counseling services available on campus.

"It's important you have a place where you feel safe," Robenson said.

At about 10:15 a.m., after Book-Lim had spoken on the Plaza of the Americas, her cell phone rang. The bill she sponsored, which allows people who are registering for driver's licenses and license renewals to donate \$1 to her cause, passed in the

Senate with a 38-0 vote.

The walk hasn't been easy.

"It's been challenging," she said. "But the bruises, blisters and shin splints will all go away."



Graduate student questions university's academic integrity

My thesis partner, Roman Safiullin, and I recently reached a compromise with UF to include video footage shot for our thesis film in post-earthquake Haiti after the recent UF travel ban had been imposed.

While we are happy that our film would not have to be compromised in any way, we feel that our situation shines an informative light on the operation of UF and College of Journalism and Communications. And although we have often kept our comments brief and indirect, we now feel the obligation to speak out.

Let's first be clear — the university agreed to a compromise only after we offered the concession of a disclaimer at the beginning of our thesis film that stated the university did not "sanction, sponsor or approve" post-earthquake material.

If this concession was not accepted, we would have filed suit in federal court through our attorney, Gary Edinger.

The university has since admitted that the administration's interpretation of the policy was overly broad.

It is extremely disappointing that it took the threat of a lawsuit to reach a compromise, and it suggests that the university administration is one that operates primarily on confrontation rather than cooperation.

The university has since opened a Human Resources in-

vestigation into the actions of our professor, Churchill Roberts. While the intentions of this investigation have not been clearly defined, it appears as

another threatening and retaliatory measure. Churchill was a supporter of our film but had no hand in our decision to return.

Unfortunately, the College of Journalism and Communications was unwilling to forcefully challenge the administration on core issues of academic freedom and faculty and student rights. We had hoped the college would advocate for the values of journalism in Haiti during this tragic time.

Instead, the college encouraged us to submit a film that was half-finished, raising serious questions about academic integrity. Despite a permanent installation of the First Amendment within its walls, the college appeared disinterested in speaking on its behalf.

But a larger issue remains — the university still enforces a travel ban that is unnecessarily restrictive and denies graduate students and faculty from performing important work in Haiti.

While we understand the need for liability protection, we feel that liability waivers or additional paperwork could be

completed to offer the university proper protection. Other universities throughout the country have offered similar measures.

We believe that the tenor of comments from the administration regarding the travel ban have also served to perpetuate negative stereotypes about the Haitian people. During this process, the administration stated that we could be "harmed, injured or killed" while working in Haiti even months after the earthquake.

Having traveled to the country since the earthquake, we can say from firsthand experience that the administration has an inaccurate and ill-informed picture of the country.

In the end, we believe our situation should question the type of values that the university instills in its students.

Rather than promote a community of engaged citizens, the university seems to prefer a Student Body that submits to bureaucratic complacency and legal restraint.

We can only hope the issues that our situation raises will promote a discussion, both in the College of Journalism and Communications and the university, about the academic sacrifices that are often made in the name of administrative duty and bureaucratic technicality.

Methodist Church, followed by a stop at the UF Hillel. They then went across town to Queen of Peace Catholic Church before rounding out the day at St. Augustine Catholic Church.

Phelps-Roper, whose father, Fred, is the pastor of Westboro Baptist Church, said the city is made up of rebels against God who are sprinting toward destruction.

"Your university is a beacon of disobedience that shines forth from this nation," she said. "[God] gave you that fag of a mayor because you're thankless."

Phelps-Roper was referring to Mayor-elect Craig Lowe, who briefly addressed a counter-protest at the Bo Diddley Community Plaza downtown while members of the Westboro Baptist Church picketed at UF.

At the counter-protest, which was called Love Conquers Hate: A Rally for Human Rights, Lowe spoke about ways gay and lesbian rights can be expanded in Florida.

"Let's commit together so that in Gainesville, Florida, love will conquer all," he said.

Lowe wasn't the only public

figure speaking out against the Kansas church.

Former mayoral candidate Don Marsh picketed alongside the counter-protesters at the Trinity United Methodist Church protest.

Carrying signs that said, "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" and "Prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God ahead of you," Marsh made it clear that the church did not represent his viewpoints.

"These are not my people," he said.

But Wayne Sapp, a pastor with the Dove World Outreach Center

stood with members of his congregation alongside the Westboro Baptist Church members at Trinity United Methodist Church.

Sapp's group and Westboro Baptist members sang songs such as "This Land is Going Straight to Hell" and "I'm Ashamed to Be an American," to the tune of "This Land is Your Land" and "I'm Proud to Be an American" respectively.

According to Sapp, the Westboro Baptist Church teaches the whole Bible.

"Churches like to talk about love and acceptance, but they forget to talk about rebuke and cor-

rection," Sapp said. "The world has rejected God. Now God is rejecting the world."

Despite the singing and chanting, both sides remained civil.

"It's the most peaceful protest I've ever seen," said Lt. Stan Perry of the Alachua County Sheriff's Office.

The tranquil mood turned more spirited once the protesters left Trinity United Methodist Church and drove to the UF Hillel, where the church members were surrounded by a swarm of costumed individuals who danced, sang and carried signs with messages such as "God hates

hats," "This is a sign," "Drink the Kool-Aid" and "Fred Phelps is Mah Baby Daddy."

"The Song that Never Ends" was the longest-lasting song sung by the counter-protesters, who also chanted as they marched in circles in front of the Kansas church members.

"We're here to steal [Westboro's] thunder and celebrate life," said Thomas Baker, a UF aerospace engineering senior who was dressed as a merman.

Amid the absurdity, tensions rose when one Jewish student confronted Phelps-Roper.

"You're a lying son of a bitch," Phelps-Roper told the student. "You know God is going to cause the nations to march on Jerusalem, and your women are going to be ravished."

Jewish students joined the counter-protesters at the UF Hillel, which was decorated with blue and white balloons in celebration of Israel's Independence Day.

"I'm so happy so many [counter-protesters] came by," said UF mechanical engineering senior Josh Greer, who is Jewish. "[Westboro Baptist Church] doesn't even believe that these people have a right to exist. It's unfathomable."

Katrina Bryant, a 6-year-old who attended the Hillel protest with her mother, said Westboro Baptist Church does not represent the image of God she believes in.

Although she is just learning to read, she knew that the messages on the church's signs were not those of her own.

"I wanted to show that God loves," she said. "God is a really, really good person."



As vice president of external affairs for Planned Parenthood of North Florida, Strain helped organize a concert Saturday night to benefit the Get Yourself Tested campaign, a monthlong movement to encourage people of all ages and backgrounds to get tested.

About 100 people gathered at Brophy's Irish Pub for the show.

The event was the brainchild of Katie Coyne, who has been working at Gainesville's Planned Parenthood clinic as a family planning assistant since February.

"I think it's a good way to reach out to the youth of the community," she said.

Tables had buckets filled with condoms and information packets as centerpieces, and attendees were greeted with red,

gold and blue beaded necklaces with condoms as the pendant.

Local indie band The Rochevanies played its first show since October for the benefit. Bassist and vocalist Stefanie Gay said she was excited to help support a good cause.

The Rochevanies was one of three acts that played.

Another performer, folk singer Marce, sang and swayed with her acoustic guitar as a percussionist beat on a hand drum.

Mayor-elect Craig Lowe attended the benefit, saying he felt Planned Parenthood provides a good service to the community.

"I want to make sure everyone in Gainesville is treated fairly," Lowe said. "I think Planned Parenthood plays an integral part in that."

Members of UF's chapter of Voices for Planned Parenthood helped staff the event, which raised \$558 to offset the costs of a discounted testing package being offered at Planned Parenthood's clinic in Gainesville.

UF English senior Christina Garcia de los Rios said Planned Parenthood is an important institution that has been influential in her and her partner's lives.

"They gave my partner and I answers we couldn't get anywhere else," she said.

Staci Fox, chief operating officer for Planned Parenthood of North Florida, said the mission of both the event and campaign is important to Florida because the state tends to have the highest rate for sexually transmitted infections.

According to the most recent national statistics released by the Center for Disease Control, in 2008, Florida had the third most cases of gonorrhea and the fourth most cases of chlamydia and syphilis.

On Saturday, he skipped a free breakfast at Mt. Olive Primitive Baptist Church to join other residents in picking up trash as part of the Great American Cleanup,


sponsored by Keep America Beautiful.



DeSclafani's struggles cost Gators finale against Wildcats

On a day meant for celebration, Anthony DeSclafani had little to be happy about.

The UF pitcher, who turned 20 on Sunday, struggled from the start and helped dig a hole No. 7 Florida (25-10, 10-5 Southeastern Conference) could not climb out of as Kentucky (22-14, 5-10 SEC) escaped a series sweep with a 6-5 victory.

The Wildcats scored all of their runs in the first three innings against the sophomore, who was making his first start on the mound since March 24, and jumped out to an early 6-0 lead.

"We obviously didn't get a great start from Anthony," UF coach Kevin O'Sullivan said. "It's just unfortunate we fell behind early in the game."

DeSclafani lasted just 2.1 innings and gave up six runs on eight hits. In the three innings he appeared in, the right-hander allowed the first two hitters to reach base in each one.

Despite the bad start, UF still had ample opportunities to win Sunday thanks in part to the performance of freshman reliever Steven Rodriguez.

Rodriguez, who made his first appearance since going down with a finger injury March 24, came out of the bullpen and threw a career-high five innings of scoreless baseball.

Rosario to transfer to Florida

Florida took a big step toward improving its backcourt this weekend, and the Gators aren't done recruiting yet.

Former Rutgers guard Mike Rosario will transfer to UF after visiting Gainesville this weekend, a team source confirmed, saying it was a "done deal."

The 6-foot-3, 180-pound guard, who averaged 16.7 points per game as a sophomore with the Scarlet Knights, will have to sit out next season but will be eligible to play during the 2011-12 season.

Rosario becomes the program's second Big East transfer in the last three years, joining junior center Vernon Macklin, who came to UF from Georgetown.

While picking up Rosario will go a long way toward fixing the Gators' lack of backcourt depth in the future, UF coaches were also working this weekend to add more guards for next season.

Matt Carlino, a 6-foot-2 guard from Bloomington (Ind.) South High, came to Gainesville on an unofficial visit with his father.

J.R. Holmes, Carlino's high school coach, said UF assistant coach Richard Pitino visited Carlino last week, attempting to persuade the high school junior to graduate this summer, skip his senior year and commit to the Gators for next season.

"I think they're looking to try to get him to come, from my understanding, now," Holmes said. "That possibility is there, and I think that's one of the things they're looking at. I think he'd be smarter off staying in high school and getting

UF drops final home game

It was clear from the opening draw that Florida would have to fight for any opportunity it would get and capitalize on the chances it had if it was going to beat Vanderbilt on Sunday.

However, the Gators couldn't do that.

UF (9-6, 1-3 American Lacrosse Conference) fell 12-7 to the No. 8 Commodores (11-3, 4-0 ALC) behind a poor offensive effort and sub-par defense.

Attacker Ashley Brunns led UF with three scores, all of which came with less than 15 minutes left in the game, while Caroline Cochran, Caroline Chesterman, Colby Rhea and Brittany Dashiell each accounted for one of UF's seven

scores.

Midfielder Kitty Cullen had the team's sole assist.

Offensively, the Gators played a close first half. They took six of the eight draws and had six more shots than the Commodores, but their failure to convert on those shots led to a low-scoring half. Florida had shots flying way wide, bouncing off the goal post, and others going straight

they would witness something truly funky during the Gators’ pregame.

The most notable sight among the team’s cleats and sliders? The team’s 6-foot-4 pitcher, Kevin Chapman, busting a move to the song “Walk It Out.”

But while rap is booming throughout the locker room, there are some more, well, sensitive songs being shared.

“I don’t know if I should say this,” infielder Nolan Fontana said. “Josh [Adams] and I listen to ‘Our Song’ by Taylor Swift. But it was Josh’s idea.”

The songs oozing with femininity don’t just hide themselves for pregame pump-up in the locker room, they leak onto the field too.

Infielder Jerico Weitzel’s at-bat song sticks out like a sore thumb among his teammates’ Lil Wayne, Jay-Z and Eminem tunes.

His song? The pop-club hit “TiK ToK” by artist Ke\$ha (a tune softball pitcher Ensley Gammel also uses).

“I didn’t choose that,” Weitzel said. “I had trouble picking out a song so Preston [Tucker] picked that out for me.”

While Tucker’s prank will be vibrating over speakers for the entire baseball season, the team is all about seriousness during their routine pregame prayer and discussion of the opposing team’s pitcher.

And when they step up to the plate, it’s time to get in the zone.

“I step out (of the box) and tell myself what pitch I’m looking for,” Weitzel said. “Most hitters do something before getting in the batter’s box.”

Fontana swipes the dirt to clear the plate off.

Freshman Brian Johnson infuses his faith into his on-field routines by making a cross over the plate when he’s up to bat, and drawing another cross before the start of each inning when he’s performing on the pitcher’s mound.

“I do it because I’m so blessed to be out there playing,” Johnson said.

“In the Air Tonight”

Who would’ve thought that a bus driver’s jam would become a staple on the softball field?

But sure enough, a Phil Collins song makes its way into every UF softball game.

“At the [Southeastern Conference Championships] in 2008, our bus driver was obsessed with the song ‘In the Air Tonight,’” catcher Tiffany DeFelice said. “It became our anthem — we kept winning with it.”

Phil Collins’ song can be heard during the team’s stretches, and the players even perform the classic drum solo in unison.

However, DeFelice has her own plethora of rituals she goes through before the series of stretching and air-drumming, and it starts when she’s getting dressed.

“I have to put my clothes on in the same order,” DeFelice said. “My stirrups go on last. If I don’t put them all on in order, then I’m all out of whack.”

And when the clothes are all on and ready? Time to join in on the fun in what the team refers to as “Club Locker Room.”

“The locker room gets really, really loud,” Gammel said. “Sometimes, someone busts out a dance move and things get real rowdy.”

While the locker room is popping with music, the players still find time to primp in front of the mirror amid the chaos.

“If I don’t have a ribbon in my hair and my nail polish and makeup and hair done, then it is not going to be a good day,” Gammel said.

Once the Gators have everything perfectly in place, they go onto the field, and

each athlete brings her own ritual to the clay.

Gammel touches the dirt before every pitch.

After her counterpart, pitcher Stephanie Brombacher, has applied her signature blue eyeliner and ribbon, she has some ornate rituals of her own on the mound.

Rather than let a teammate hand it to her, Brombacher is sure to pick the ball up off the ground to start the inning, and she isn’t ready to throw until she taps the ball on her leg.

And once DeFelice has spit out her gum and put her clothes on in just the right order, she lives up to her nickname of “Raging Bull” when she makes her debut in the batter’s box.

“I’m a different person on the field,” DeFelice said. “I’m the aggressive one and I destroy the batter’s box. But I’ve tried to take that back a bit.”

“Show Time”

Gymnastics meets are full of plenty of sparkle and shine to paint the perfect scene for some serious entertainment.

While other sports have spectators admiring the back-and-forth competition, the gymnasts are performing and putting on a show. The UF gymnastics team recognizes its position on center stage during team huddles, when the Gators shout “Show time!”

In gymnastics, the beat they bounce to is a big deal.

And unlike the bounce before a back handspring, the melodies aren’t taken lightly.

Lots of planning goes into each of the songs for the individual floor dances.

“In the summer, each of the girls get a couple of weeks where I sit down with them,” UF gymnastics volunteer coach Jeremy Miranda said. “They know their body and what they like. It gives them ownership of their routines, and they are excited to have work to create the final product.”

Miranda oversees all of the creative aspects for the team, dealing with the music and choreography.

“This year, the girls chose sassy and strong beat music,” Miranda said. “They wanted the crowd to be clapping and they wanted to keep a driving rhythm.”

Freshman gymnast Liz Green had to reshape her floor routine from high school and tailor it to fit her new surroundings competing at the college level.

It didn’t take long to select her music.

Once Miranda played a Britney Spears’ mix, Green pounced.

With the gymnasts, it’s all about finding confidence in their floor routine songs, and impressing the judges is something that could make or break them.

“If you just look at the judges and smile at them, once they smile back you can really get into your floor routine,” freshman Ashanee Dickerson said.

Dickerson can join the likes of Beyoncé in that they both seem to have their own alter ego — Beyoncé has “Sasha Fierce” — when performing.

Shy and reserved in everyday life with a soft-spoken voice and timid demeanor, Dickerson is anything but that on the gymnastics floor.

“It’s a place where I can just let it all out and have fun,” Dickerson said.

Dickerson gets an extra pep talk before meets through her cell phone, as her old coaches pray with her and send her a text before each meet.

And as a team, the Gators make sure to pay special attention to a certain someone in the locker room.

“When I first got here the older girls told me that you have to be sure to touch the alligator in the locker room before every home meet,” Green said.

Other musts of those in leotards? Each competition, one girl is responsible for providing a motivational word and quote. One week’s word was simply “dominate,” and the word made its presence with the repetition of the word alongside each rotation during the week’s meet — shouted in the team huddle.

But it’s what’s outside the floor, the locker room and the practice studio that makes for the biggest difference — and it’s in the bleachers.

The gymnasts stress they get their biggest adrenaline boost from the fans.

“The crowd plays a big role,” Dickerson said. “Especially seeing all of those orange shirts in the crowd at the SECs.”

But the adrenaline doesn’t terminate upon the transition from stage to seats — the audience gets in on the gymnast “show” as well. In each floor routine, the girls have kept the longtime tradition of incorporating the Gator Chomp to do along with the audience.

And who says the audience can’t join in and dance to the floor or walk-up songs? Enough thought was put into them so that everyone can bust a move — in the locker room or not.

Brombacher throws shutout in UF's 5-0 win over Kentucky

While it was another conference game on paper, Florida felt like it was in the NCAA Tournament.

"I just wanted them to take the approach of taking this like a Super Regional matchup, where it's a 1-1 matchup and we've gotta win it," coach Tim Walton said. "We don't lose very often and we're in a tight race for the SEC (Southeastern Conference), so we can't afford to have a week-end letdown."

After starting hot and then fizzling out down the stretch in the first two games, the No. 3 Gators (34-5, 14-3 SEC) were able to sustain their first-inning momentum and ride a dominant performance from ace Stephanie Brombacher to a 5-0 victory and a series win over Kentucky (27-18, 11-11 SEC).

Brombacher scattered eight hits over seven innings of scoreless softball, striking out nine Wildcats en route to her fifth shutout of the season.

It was a bounce-back performance for the team and for Brombacher, who gave up three runs in 5.1 innings of action on Saturday.

"I felt like I was more in command of my pitches," Brombacher said. "I was placing them where I wanted them, and I actually had an inside pitch to throw."

Florida jumped out to a first-inning lead for the third-consecutive game, this time scoring a pair on RBI doubles from Francesca Enea and Brittany Schutte.

In Saturday's doubleheader, the Gators scored a combined seven runs in the first inning but only brought a single run across the plate in

innings two through seven. That lone run came courtesy of Kelsey Horton, who came through with another home run Sunday, leading off the second inning with a deep blast to center.

The home run was Horton's third in only 16 career at-bats, and came in only her third-career start.

"It feels really good to be a contributor," Horton said. "When you get a really good swing on it and it goes far, it's a good feeling."

Enea led off the third with a home run and Michelle Moultrie singled home a run in the fourth, giving the Gators the 5-0 lead that would eventually become the final.

Kentucky loaded the bases with no outs in the fourth and later with two outs in the seventh, but in each case Brombacher was able to pitch her way out of it.

"Today I mentally was more prepared for it and I stayed a little bit mentally stronger and pitched through those tough situations," Brombacher said.

The win improves Florida's record to 5-0 in games following losses.

Sunday's victory also kept the team's goal of winning every SEC series alive.

"I think we responded really well," Brombacher said. "Our goal is to win the SEC, and we need to win every series to do that."

The offense relied on the long ball for the third-straight day. Florida hit three homers Sunday to push its total to nine round trippers in the three-game series. Before this stretch, it took the Gators 10 games to hit its previous nine homers.

another year of experience."

Holmes said Carlino will also visit UCLA, Butler and California in the near future. Carlino originally committed to Indiana in 2008, but reopened his recruitment in late March and has not yet made a decision about his future.

"I think he's just testing the waters," Holmes said. "It was just a situation he wasn't 100 percent sure of, and he wanted to make sure he was 100 percent sure before he committed to going somewhere for four years."

Florida coach Billy Donovan is planning to travel to Bloomington, Ind., sometime this week to follow up on Pitino's visit, Holmes said.

Holmes added that, while Carlino is a talented scorer, he might not be ready to play point guard at the college level yet.

Given the Gators' current allotment of guards for next season — not including Rosario, who can only practice with the team

— Carlino could find playing time at either backcourt spot if he joins the team for the 2010-11 season.

"I've only had him for one year, but he's really athletic. He can shoot the three, take the ball to the basket," Holmes said. "In our program, he's trying to become more of a point guard. Another year of that will make him a much better prospect for the college level."

Rivals.com lists Carlino as the 122nd-best overall and 30th-ranked shooting guard in the 2011 class, from which UF has already gained a commitment from highly touted guard Bradley Beal. The Gators are also still in the running for

2011 guard Austin Rivers.

Chris Denson, a 6-foot-2 senior point guard from Midland (Ga.) Shaw High, also visited Gainesville this weekend on an official visit. Denson has already received scholarship offers from Western Kentucky, Buffalo and North Carolina Greensboro.

ing."

In the second half, UF looked to be picking up its scoring and even led 6-5 with 10:19 to go, but draw controls were the Gators' eventual downfall.

UF won 12 of the 21 total draws but allowed its opponent to capture four-consecutive draws after the 6:56 mark in the second half, with Vanderbilt already up 8-7. The Commodores converted on those chances to push the game out of the Gators' reach.

After the game, the Gators knew they had missed a good opportunity to take down a top-10 opponent and to get a second conference win. The disappointment was blatant.

Smith sets year's best time in 400 at Tom Jones Invite

The Tom Jones Memorial Classic was created to commemorate the former Florida track and field coach. The current Gators used the meet to make some memories of their own.

UF athletes won 11 events and set 16 personal-best marks in the home meet at Percy Beard Track. The meet gave the Gators another opportunity to prepare for the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Championship Meet in May.

The meet's highlight was the men's 400-meter dash. Senior Calvin Smith won it in a personal-best and world-leading time of 44.81. He beat World Championship medalists Tyson Gay and Renny Quow while slicing off .15 seconds from his previous best.

Senior Mariam Kevkhishvili set a personal-best mark in the outdoor shot put with a throw of 18.46 meters. It was the second-best throw in school history.

Fellow senior Shara Proctor won the women's triple jump with a distance of 13.29 meters.

It was the last home meet for Smith, a 15-time All-American,

Kevkhishvili, a four-time NCAA champion, and Proctor, a four-time SEC champion.

"When our seniors like Calvin

[Smith] and Mariam [Kevkhishvili] joined this program, it wasn't at the level we are at today," UF coach Mike Holloway said. "They

believed in what we were doing and you can see the results of that today."

Jeremy Postin won the men's

hammer throw with a personal-best distance of 60.59 meters. It broke his own school record and continued Postin's record-setting freshman season.

Javelin thrower Evelien Dekkers, also competing in her final home meet, won the event with a throw of 52.12 meters. Keely Medeiros was second in the women's shot put and finished third in the discus.

Junior Shot putter Kemal Mesic landed the best distance among collegiate competitors with his 19.38-meter heave.

UF went one-two in the men's long jump with two-time defending NCAA indoor triple jump champion Christian Taylor winning with a distance of 7.51 meters, nearly half of a meter better than freshman Omar Craddock.

The Gators also put up the top two marks in the men's 4x100-meter relay. The "A" team won in 39.06 seconds while the "B" team finished in 39.31.

UF placed second through fifth in the men's 800-meter run, lead by John Mitchell's second-place run of 1:50:52.

Michael Anderson won the men's steeplechase in 9:09:48 while Julie Northrup finished second in the women's 1,500-meter run with a personal-best time of 4:28:90.
