On Saturday, the butterfly exhibit at the Florida Museum of Natural History was upstaged by the maggot exhibit.

CSI: Crime Scene Insects, an educational exhibit that opened over the weekend, will remain in

Gainesville until January. Producers of the popular television show "CSI" contributed to the creation of the exhibit, said Paul Ramey, the assistant director of marketing and public relations for the museum.

The exhibit, which was partially sponsored with a \$60,000 grant from Student Government, is not intended for the squeamish, said Douglas Noble, the assistant director for exhibits and public programs at the museum. Graphic displays and pic-

Makeover affects SW Rec services

Although Southwest Recreation Center has been under renovation since September, the construction's recent developments may be driving some gym-goers away.

Alandria Mustafa, a Southwest Rec employee, said that there has been a lot of disappointment about non-accessible showers since the center's locker rooms closed on April 5. While Mustafa said that the new locker rooms will be an improvement to the facilities once they are completed, the current lack of locker rooms is responsible for students finding other

gyms to use this summer.

The expansion, which is being funded by a \$16.3 million dollar grant received in spring 2008, is scheduled to end in August.

The showers will remain closed until the beginning of the fall semester, according to the center's website.

An exact number of the students affected by the renovation is difficult to determine, Mustafa said, because precise numbers of locker-room users have never been kept.

The locker rooms' closure is not the only change students will have to work around in the

Census participation improves in county

More than a quarter of Alachua County residents have failed to prove they exist.

As of Monday, 71 percent of Alachua County residents have mailed in their census questionnaires. In 2000, the total mail-back participation was 62 percent for Alachua County.

The 2010 census will determine the use of more than \$400 billion of federal spending and the number of delegates in the U.S. House of Representatives, according to the U.S. Census Bureau's website.

On May 1, the Census Bureau began sending about 635,000 census enumerators to collect data door-to-door across America.

According to Ivy Bell, an Alachua County senior planner, this is the first year that the Census Bureau will not send a long form with the census questionnaire. In 2000, the long-form questionnaire was more than 50 questions long.

"[This year's census] is 10 questions. It takes about 10 minutes to answer them," Bell said.

In order to project future demographics, analysts need accurate data

Hedblom said it helped him worry less about other people's perceptions and ended up inspiring his senior class project on the psychology behind perceptions.


Teacher Adrian Antonini left the school after the bet was made.

Nebraska police nab alleged 'toilet paper' bandit

LINCOLN, Neb. — Police said they suspect they've captured the "toilet paper bandit." A man who concealed his face by wrapping his head with toilet paper robbed a Lincoln convenience store last month. Police said the man was armed with a knife, but no one was hurt in the robbery.

He escaped on foot with an undisclosed amount of money.

Capt. David Beggs said 29-year-old Joshua Nelson was arrested Saturday night. Beggs said a prescription pill bottle found near the store gave officers a clue to pursue. But he said it took until Saturday for officers to find enough evidence for an arrest.

A jail spokeswoman said Nelson remained in custody on Monday. His attorney did not immediately return a call from The Associated Press.

Police: Man makes up robbery to get ride home

LA PLATA, Md. — The Charles County sheriff's office said a man called 911 and made up a story about being robbed so that he could get a ride home. Authorities said they were called to Hawthorne Road near Manor Drive

in Ripley for a reported armed robbery on Thursday. The man told officers that he had been walking on Route 225 when a car stopped and a someone put a gun to his head and demanded money. The man claimed to have complied and the suspects fled.

But as officers searched the area and noticed inconsistencies in his account, the man admitted fabricating the robbery story because he wanted a ride home.

He said his cell phone was out of minutes and 911 was the only number he could still call. Officials say charges against the man are pending.

Minnesota city stops providing free doggie bags

EDINA, Minn. — Need to scoop up after your pooch in the affluent Minneapolis suburb of Edina? You'll now have to bring your own bag after the city stopped providing freebies. The Star Tribune reported Edina has been hit by thefts of city-provided dog poop bags, and also is looking to save money. So this year the city stopped providing the free bags at stations in Edina parks.

Director of Parks and Recreation John Keprios said park workers would fill dispensers in the morning and find them empty by noon.

Keprios said, "People walk up and take them until they're gone." He said it was "not just one isolated incident. It's everywhere and often."

It cost about \$12,000 a year to keep the dispensers full at the eight parks with the stations.

UF alumna's choreography to be performed in D.C.

Inspiration came from dancer's visit to Auschwitz

For recent UF alumna Megan Kendzior, dancing is more than just a means of self-expression.

This year, Kendzior's choreographed dance, "Witness," was selected to be performed at the National College Dance Festival at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Perform-

ing Arts in Washington, D.C., May 27 and 29. "Witness" is a collaborative dance among Kendzior and four other women and is set to the live musical accompaniment of Broadway accordion player Frank Ferraro.

To receive this opportunity, Kendzior's dance was selected for the Gala Concert at the Central Regional Conference at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Kendzior's creation was directly related to

her research as part of the UF University Scholars Program.

The dance was inspired by her scholarship-funded visit to Auschwitz concentration camp in Poland. "I use my dancing as a way to teach and carry on the story of the Holocaust," she said.

After her trip to Auschwitz, Kendzior felt a responsibility to show what she learned

and continue the story of Holocaust victims. Kendzior's work also won first place at the Spring 2010 Howard Hughes Medical Institute Celebration of Creativity in Arts and Sciences.

Kendzior graduated from the UF College of Fine Arts with a bachelor's in dance on April 30. During her tenure at UF, she was also a Student Government senator and founder of Dance for My Suitcase, a student organization for dance majors. She is currently in New York performing her works.

Crews try to thin oil using deep-sea robot, chemicals

ON THE GULF OF MEXICO — A remote-controlled submarine shot a chemical dispersant into the maw of a massive undersea oil leak Monday, further evidence BP expects the gusher to keep erupting into the Gulf of Mexico for weeks or more.

Crews using the deep-sea robot attempted to thin the oil — which is rushing up from the seabed at a pace of about 210,000 gallons per day — after getting approval from the Environmental Protection Agency, BP PLC officials said.

Two previous tests were done to determine the potential impact on the environment, and the third round of spraying began early Monday and it will last 24 hours.

The EPA said in a statement the effects of the chemicals were still widely unknown.

BP engineers, casting about after an ice buildup thwarted their plan to siphon off most of the leak using a 100-ton containment box, pushed ahead with other potential short-term solutions, including using a smaller box and injecting the leak with junk such as golf balls and pieces of tire to plug it. If it works, the well will be filled with mud and cement and abandoned.

However, none of these attempts has been tried so deep — about a mile down. Workers were simultaneously drilling a relief well, the so-

lution considered most permanent, but that was expected to take up to three months.

At least 4 million gallons were believed to have leaked since April 20. If the gusher continues unabated, it would surpass the Exxon Valdez disaster as the nation's worst spill by Father's Day.

The engineers appear to be "trying anything people can think of" to stop the leak, said Ed Overton, a LSU professor of environmental studies.

The new containment device is much smaller, about 4 feet in diameter, 5 feet tall and weighing just under two tons, said Doug Suttles,

BP PLC chief operating officer. Unlike the bigger box, it will be connected to a drill ship on the surface by a pipe-within-a-pipe when it's lowered, which will allow crews to pump heated water and methanol to prevent the ice buildup.

Back on land, National Guard helicopters ferried loads of 1-ton

sandbags to plug gaps in barrier islands that have been lapped at by a sheen of oil.

The effort to bolster the islands was meant to safeguard the area's vulnerable wetlands.

Authorities also planned to use south Louisiana's system of locks and levees to release water to help keep the worst of the oil at sea.

"We're trying to save thousands of acres of marsh here in this area, where the shrimp lay their eggs, where the fin fish lay their eggs, where the crabs come in and out," said Chett Chiasson, executive director of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission. "We're trying to save a heritage, a way of life, a culture that we know here in recreational and commercial fishing."

BP — which is responsible for the cleanup — said Monday the spill has cost it \$350 million so far for immediate response, containment efforts, commitments to the Gulf Coast states, and settlements and federal costs.

The company did not speculate on the final bill, which most analysts expect to run into tens of billions of dollars.

Above the oil leak, waves of dark brown and black sludge crashed into the support ship Joe Griffin. The fumes there were so intense that a crew member and an AP photographer on board had to wear respirators while on deck.

British prime minister to step down by September

LONDON (AP) — British Prime Minister Gordon Brown made a dramatic bid to keep his beleaguered Labour Party in power after it was punished in elections last week, announcing Monday he will resign by September at the latest even if the Liberal Democrats — being wooed by the Conservatives — decide to join his party in government.

The political theater, played out in front of the iconic black door of No. 10 Downing Street, comes as David Cameron's Conservatives — which won the most seats in Parliament but fell short of a majority — struggled in their attempts to win over the third-place Liberal Democrats.

Brown's party has been willing to entertain supporting the Liberal Democrats' demand for an overhaul of the voting system toward proportional representation, which would greatly increase that party's future seat tallies. But the evening brought a further twist with a counteroffer from the Conservatives — a referendum on a less dramatic type of electoral reform.

While uncertainty prevails, to the displeasure of the markets, one thing appears certain: The career of Brown — the Treasury chief who

waited a decade in the wings for his chance to become prime minister — is winding to an end.

Brown, looking statesmanlike but resigned to political reality, accepted blame for Labour's loss of 91 seats in last week's election and its failure to win a parliamentary majority.

No other party won outright either, resulting in the first "hung Parliament" since 1974 and triggering a frantic scramble between Brown's Labour and the main opposition Conservatives to broker a coalition — or at least an informal partnership — with the Liberal Democrats.

"As leader of my party, I must accept that that is a judgment on me," Brown said, offering to step down before the party conference in September.

Brown said Liberal Democrat leader Nick Clegg had asked to begin formal coalition talks with the Labour Party and said he believed their parties might form a center-left alliance. Clegg had previously suggested Brown's departure would likely be a condition of any deal with Labour.

The Liberal Democrats have seemed genuinely open to a deal with the Conservatives — who are less ideologically compatible with Clegg's party than Labour is — largely out of a

sense that Cameron won a moral mandate and supporting him was expected by the nation at a time of economic turmoil.

But Brown's statement appeared to give Clegg's party a viable alternative, and real temptation: join a possibly short-lived alliance, remove the unpopular Brown and pass electoral reform that could transform their fortunes and even banish the Conservatives to the political wilderness for many years.

Belying morning optimism and buoyant statements by party spokesmen, the Liberal Democrats announced by the afternoon that they hadn't yet reached an agreement with Conservatives on education funding, fair taxation and electoral reform. Then came Brown's offer.

Brown's office said Labour's legislators will meet Wednesday to discuss the status of negotiations with Clegg's party — indicating that Britain may face at least two more days without an end to its political stalemate. Liberal Democrat spokesman Simon Hughes said earlier that a deal was unlikely within 24 hours but predicted "a government by the end of the week."

Brown said he hoped a new Labour leader would be appointed at the party's annual convention in September.

Foreign Secretary David Miliband and Education Secretary Ed Balls will likely be leading contenders to succeed Brown as party leader.

Brown's announcement signals an end to a political career marked by great promise, considerable achievement and ultimate disappointment.

The 59-year-old politician spent a decade as Prime Minister Tony Blair's treasury chief, but craved the top job himself and is widely believed to have negotiated a handover years ago.

When he finally got it, in June 2007, he quickly found himself confronting an economic crisis, a divided party, and a parliamentary expenses scandal that fueled public disgust with politicians.

It was also a misfortune for Brown to follow the charismatic Blair. He was brooding and awkward by comparison. A run-in with a voter at the end of the campaign — he called her "a bigoted woman" not knowing he was being recorded — seemed to confirm the caricature and plunged his campaign into a tragicomic last-minute crisis.

The Gainesville Police Department arrested a godmother-to-be from Citrus Springs for attacking her 6-months-pregnant friend while the two were driving in west Gainesville early Sunday.

Jessica Harris, 24, was riding in the passenger's seat when the two got into an argument, according to a GPD report.

Harris, who had been drinking that night, became increasingly angered and attempted to pull the keys out of the ignition while the car was headed west on Newberry Road, the report stated.

As the driver pulled into a parking lot, Harris became physically violent, swinging her legs over the center console to kick her pregnant friend in the stomach, the report stated.

During the scuffle, the driver was on the phone with a friend who told police he heard the woman say, "Don't kick me in my stomach, you know I'm pregnant."

When police arrived, they found bruises on the woman's belly from the kick, as well as scratches on her arms and bodily fluids secreting from her genitals, the report stated.

The woman was then taken to the hospital by EMS workers, the report stated.

Harris lost an artificial toenail in the fight and her left index finger was found in the patrol car's backseat, the report stated.

After being read her rights, Harris said the driver hit her in the jaw and admitted to knowing the woman was pregnant, which is a special offense, the report stated.

Harris is charged with one count of aggravated battery on a pregnant female. The bail is set at \$5,000.

Dance students to study abroad with Israeli peers

The UF/Israel Dance Exchange is making history.

Eleven UF dance students, led by program director Neta Pulvermacher, will spend three weeks studying dance alongside 30 Israeli peers.

On Thursday, the group will become the first UF study abroad program in the area of dance, as well as the first UF-sponsored study abroad program in Israel.

On Campus "It's really nice to take people where you come from, to take your students and share your culture experientially with your students," she said.

Jeremy Miranda, a senior dance student, is excited to see how his peers will react to leaving the country for the first time.

"It will be interesting to see how quickly their eyes will open to the possibilities and what else is out there," he said.

Closing 13th Street

Walmart hurts area

In spite of the many people who live and work on 13th Street, we could not be more ecstatic about the Gainesville City Commission's vote to allow Walmart to abandon the old location and move forward with a supercenter on 34th Street and U.S. 441.

Just look at the place. Its façade is passé, all the fluorescent lighting has yellowed and the tile is so dingy that those welcome mats might as well scoot themselves in front of the exit. It's time to knock it down and pave over it, or better yet, keep it standing as a reminder of how antiquated life was before the supercenter.

Never mind that it's the anchor in the neighborhood's economy, and forget all the customers it brings to all the businesses surrounding it. Those stores have had plenty of time to learn how to fend for themselves, and the training wheels had to come off someday.

We just wish other businesses would follow Walmart's example and let their buildings slide into dereliction until it becomes convenient for them to cut and run. After all, we cannot expect them to keep the rollbacks coming if they have to factor in renovations and basic maintenance.

All kidding aside, closing down the 13th Street Walmart will do immeasurable damage to the area and will likely cause a few other businesses to shut their doors as well. Yet it could easily outperform a supercenter at that location if they slapped a new coat of paint on it and opened a third register once in a while.

Poor Judge-ment

President Obama announced Elena Kagan as his nominee to replace Justice John Paul Stevens on the U.S. Supreme Court on Monday morning, calling her a "trailblazer," among other things.

The president is supposed to make sure the Supreme Court remains steady and insulated from the ebb and flow of American politics, but we are not convinced Kagan is the right woman for the job.

Kagan worked as a law professor at the University of Chicago, was the first woman to be the dean of the Harvard Law School and has served as Solicitor General since 2009, yet we cannot help but point out that she has no experience as a judge, federal or otherwise.

Sure, Earl Warren never spent a day in a robe until he became chief justice. And

sure, he was fundamental in the outcomes of landmark cases such as *Brown v. Board of Education* and *Miranda v. Arizona*, but he shifted the court's politics so much that former president Dwight Eisenhower said nominating him was the "biggest damned-fool mistake I ever made."

At 50 years old, Kagan would be the youngest person on the Supreme Court, and her tenure could easily outlast those of the other justices. The last thing the court needs is an unknown quantity shaking up the system.

Confirming Kagan could be the best, worst or most unmemorable thing the Senate ever votes on, and it is impossible to know looking at her record. Just cross your fingers that Obama doesn't have to borrow that quote from Eisenhower.

Government shouldn't force health care

During the next month, the Obama administration plans to release a new health care bill of rights, and the buzzword within appears to be "force." The bill details how government is either forcing people to have coverage or forcing companies to cover them. For a country of free markets, there appears to be a growing number of limitations and rules.

Here's the thing: Despite Republicans' adamant protests against the nationalized system, they still want health care for every citizen. My dislike of the nationalized system does not stem from a desire for some to have access to health care and some not. I love my fellow citizens, and they deserve to be provided for if they cannot make it on their own.

The key here is "if they cannot make it on their own." The current plan forces working citizens to provide help to people who might not need it. Like many government entitlement programs, it provides coverage for free-riders and people who would take advantage of the system with no oversight. Why? Because that's how the government operates: no-budget, little-oversight programs that make politicians in power look good and pass the cost to citizens.

That said, we still need a solution. So, how do we provide for those who truly need help while keeping oversight and accountability? We keep government out of the process.

If I were in office, I would work to support reform that provides tax incentives for the operation and support of private, nonprofit organizations working on a local level to support the needy. For example, I used to work for the United Way's Loaned Executive Program. Its mission is to provide programs that support the community, ensure accountability and reduce dependency. Imagine that. Reduc-

ing dependency is a novel concept to the government.

One of the United Way's programs focused on children's dental work. It provided dental work for more than 1,000 children in an area school. Because tooth-related problems are the No. 1 reason for in-class distractions, this program provides health care and builds futures for the participants, eventually allowing them to further their own charity work rather than depend on it.

If the government devoted even a fraction of the resources to supporting nonprofits that it does to nationalized health care, imagine what good could be done. We wouldn't be accumulating uncontrollable debt with a plan like this, because it does not require the government to spend but simply reduces the tax burden on citizens who support nonprofits. With a tax cut, nonprofits could potentially operate at lower costs and receive increased financial support. More could open, and every niche that the nonprofit community could fill would be filled.

There would be certain areas where the government would have to step in. The health care system cannot entirely rely on private interests. But if we implement a system of programs specialized to local needs with accountability, oversight and supplemental efforts by the government, we could provide health care to citizens who cannot provide for themselves in a more adept and efficient manner.

The only trouble with this solution is getting the government to admit when it is unable to do something at optimum efficiency. I wish the government would replace its favorite word, "force," with "efficiency." Then, we might have a sustainable health care system for those who need it.

Students should know all their rights as apartment renters

Students pay anywhere from \$200 to \$2,000 a month in rent, and what do we get in return? Apartments that are filthy and in disrepair. I had several issues during my tenancy at one particular community. For one, the management was unwilling to repair a broken window. I requested to have it fixed every week for four months, but it never happened. When I returned from winter break there were dead bugs everywhere in my bedroom. That was my breaking point. I learned a lot from that experience and would like to share that knowledge with my fellow students.

Make sure you keep an accurate record of everything, especially all maintenance requests. Put a date on all records and, if possible, get someone else to sign and date them as well. I'm a picture person, so every time there's an infraction I take a picture. Make sure to keep track of the actual maintenance request forms. When the maintenance staff leaves you that little carbon copy stating it "repaired" something, think of it as evidence instead of trash.

Also, make sure you read the lease in its entirety and seek

legal advice before signing it. Attorneys can be wonderful people when they work for you. They can tell you what that fine print means and how it can mean something else in certain situations. They can also tell you what your rights are as a tenant. If you are a full-time UF student, you are entitled to free legal advice from UF's Student Legal Services. Three Rivers Legal Services, a non-profit organization that provides legal services to eligible people in North Florida, is another good resource. Visit their website at trls.org.

You can find landlord-tenant laws by looking up Florida Statutes chapter 83 online. You can also find information about landlord-tenant rights at the Floridabar.org. This is a great resource, especially if managers at the community are refusing to do any future repairs simply because you filed a complaint. Their refusal may constitute retaliatory action, and you can file a complaint in a court of law.

If you think there is a housing code violation, call the Gainesville Code Enforcement Division at 352-334-5030. After


discovering the dead bugs in my bedroom, I called them and reported my broken window. They set up an appointment to visit my apartment. They cited the complex for my complaint and other infractions that I wasn't even aware of. Typically, repairs speed up after they contact management but if they aren't made in a timely manner, management could be fined.

I admit I didn't listen to my own advice when signing my lease. I assumed that I'd just look at apartment ratings online to see what previous tenants said about apartment complexes and then pick the place that was rated higher. I don't recommend that now.

My parting statement is directed at the management and office staff of "typical" college apartment communities: If you are having difficulty leasing apartments, continually need to offer residents "the special" or have disgruntled residents, do not make the mistake of attributing your increase in vacant apartment numbers to the economy. It is because of you that residents choose not to live there.

tures of dead bodies throughout the exhibit illustrate the role that insects can play in helping investigators determine when and where crimes occur.

The presence of fly larvae and eggs in a corpse, for example, can give investigators an idea of how long a person has been dead.

Other insects can also be helpful in solving crimes. Investigators in Texas recently convicted a murderer with the help of a dead grasshopper that was found on the victim's body. One of the insect's detached legs was found in the pant cuff of the culprit.

Museum curators hope the edgy exhibit will do something that few exhibits have done: attract students.

"When I was in college, I had interests that didn't correspond to going to museums," Noble said with a laugh.

When more students return to Gainesville for the fall semester, the museum's marketing department is planning a large campaign to promote the exhibit, Ramey said.

"The purpose of these exhibits is to engage an audience and be educational," he said.

Death and decay are common themes for the museum this year. In addition to the CSI exhibit, a time-lapse photography display of a decomposing panther head will be exhibited during the fall semester, Ramey said.

Starting in the fall, museum en-

tomologists will also put decaying pig carcasses on display in the area behind the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts.

Despite the macabre nature of these exhibitions, the museum is a good place for students to take their significant others, Noble said.

"Coming here is a good first date," he said with a laugh. "We're pretty safe."

next few months.

Intramural captain's meetings will be held in the New Engineering Building, Room 202, and the Intramural Sports office was relocated to a trailer outside of the center. The office will be open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

At 140,000 square-feet, the facility will be 40 percent larger than the original structure.

The new center will include an indoor, 1/9-mile track on the second floor.

to base their predictions on, said Stanley K. Smith, director of UF's Bureau of Economic and Business Research.

"It also would affect a variety of statis-

tics, such as when you calculate birth, death and crime rates," Smith said. "Those are all based on population counts or estimates, so if you have inaccurate population counts or estimates, then you'll have inaccurate measures for these types of rates. It will give a

very misleading idea about an area or population."

In addition to allocating funding and political representation, a higher participation in the census gives a more accurate picture of the U.S. population, he said.

Janine Monfries, a second-year sociology student, said her dorm required her to fill out the census questionnaire.

"[The census bureau] already [has] the commercials showing they are really trying to get the stragglers," said Monfries.



Tyus to return to UF for senior season

Billy Donovan's squad will have a familiar look to it this upcoming year.

The Gators will return all five starters next season after rising senior Alex Tyus withdrew his name from the NBA Draft on Saturday.

He announced the return on his Twitter account.

"I will be returning to gator nation!! Let's get ready to make a run boys!!!" Tyus said.

The power forward started every game last season while averaging 11.8 points on 50.3 percent shooting and grabbing 6.9 rebounds per game. Tyus took a slight step back from his sophomore year when he put up more than 12 points per game on 59 percent shooting.

"When I began this process it

was with the intent of gathering information to see what I needed to work on to one day compete at the next level, and I believe I have been successful in doing just that," Tyus said in a statement.

"I have withdrawn my name from the NBA Draft and look forward to completing my senior year at the University of Florida. We made tremendous strides as a team a year ago that I look forward to continuing to build upon."

Confusion is the key to success

You have 15 seconds to translate UF doctorate student Andrew Charles Thoron's thesis into plain English.

Here's the title: "Effects of Inquiry-Based Agriscience Instruction on Student Argumentation Skills, Scientific Reasoning and Student Achievement."

You probably couldn't do it. And you probably couldn't do it because Thoron, like many doctorate students, was trained to make his work needlessly complicated.

But don't blame Thoron. For all you know, he's just like you – illegally downloads music, wastes time on Facebook, watches ESPN.

And that's the problem.

Sure, elitism is prevalent in the education system's highest levels. But it's just as prevalent at the Worldwide Leader in Sports, a place supposedly sacred to the every man.

Hundreds of UF doctorate students wrote thesis papers in the weeks leading up to the NFL Draft. This isn't a coincidence. If you want to learn jargon, look no further than ESPN's talking heads around draft time.

Mel Kiper and Todd McShay are the company's best analysts, but they are also ESPN's pseudo-linguistic experts. And with the draft finished, they now have time to co-author "From Ball Hawk to Tweener: The Upside

of Talking like Us," featuring a foreword by Jay Bilas.

Here are some excerpts:

Ball Skills – Also known as "being able to catch a ball." Example: Ted Ginn Jr. does not have ball skills.

Body Catcher – 1: A player who can't catch the ball with his hands. Example: Not only does Ted Ginn Jr. not have ball skills, he isn't even a body catcher. 2: A murderer.

Baseball:

- The No. 4 Gators baseball team is now tied for the Southeastern Conference lead with South Carolina. Two conference series remain in the season.

- Florida swept LSU, the defending national champions, in a three-game home series.

- Freshman pitcher Brian Johnson has hit two grand slams in the last four games.

- Johnson was also named SEC Freshman of the Week following the LSU series which was played from April 30 to May 2.

Softball:

- The Gators are on a hot streak, winning their last seven games by a combined score of 82-2.

- Senior Francesca Enea set the UF single season home run record with her 20th long ball and broke the Southeastern Conference career home run record with her 61st on Saturday.

- Brittany Schutte set the UF freshman home run record with her 14th.

- UF is the No. 2 seed in the SEC Tournament in Fayetteville, Ark.

Men's Tennis:

- The No. 6 Florida men's tennis team was swept in the Southeastern Conference Tournament final against No. 2 Tennessee on April 25 in Lexington, Ky.

- UF won its first two tournament matchups, each 4-1, against Mississippi State and LSU.

- The Gators will host the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championships Saturday and Sunday. UF will need to defeat South Carolina State Saturday to face the winner of Troy vs. Auburn in Sunday's second round.

Women's Tennis:

- The No. 3 Gators women's tennis team won their 16th Southeastern Conference Tournament on April 25 in Athens, Ga.

- UF shutout LSU and No. 16 South Carolina in the second and third rounds before beating No. 13 Tennessee 4-1 in the finals.

- No. 65 senior Marrit Boonstra was named Tournament MVP after going 3-0.

- Florida will begin play in the NCAA Team Championships at home against South Carolina State Friday at 2 p.m.

Track and Field:

- Following the Penn Relays April 24, most of the Gators were on a two-week hiatus to get ready for the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Championships that begin Thursday.

- 26 Gators participated in the Seminole Twilight Invitational last weekend as a tune-up for the SEC event.

- Florida won eight events, and senior thrower Mariam Kevkhishvili set a Mike Long Track record by tossing the shot put 18.17 meters, leading the Gators to a 1-2-3 sweep in the event.

Lacrosse:

- Florida ended its inaugural season with a 10-8 record after falling to No. 10 Vanderbilt 16-9 in the semifinals of the American Lacrosse Conference Tournament in Columbus, Ohio.

- One day before the season-ending loss, Florida upset No. 20 Johns Hopkins 14-3 in a game coach Amanda O'Leary called her team's "best performance of the year."

- UF ended its regular season with a loss to Northwestern, the five-time defending national champions.

Gymnastics:

- Freshman Marissa King had her worst performance of the season as the Gators competed in the Super Six at the NCAA Championships for the fifth straight year. Florida was unable to recover from its slow start and finished in fifth place April 24.

- King bounced back from her nightmarish Super Six performance and finished fourth on vault and tied for fifth on floor.

- Both the individual and team championships were held in Gainesville. UCLA won its sixth national championship.

Golf:

- The Florida women's golf team shot a +21 in the final round of the NCAA East Regional May 8 in Greenville, N.C., causing the team to fall from eighth to 11th place in the 24-team field.

- UF needed to finish at least eighth to advance to the NCAA Championships, and the women's golf team has now missed the tournament two straight years.

- The Florida men's golf team won the Golden Ocala Invitational May 6 against a field that included UCF and FSU.


