Less than a week into his term, Mayor Craig Lowe said he is expecting some of the toughest budget decisions in decades. Nevertheless, he still has high hopes for Gainesville by planning to improve the economic, environmental and neighborhood development.

Lowe's first goal is to prepare for the upcoming budget discussions, which he is doing by evaluating programs' costs and benefits, he said.

He also wants to partner with the Alachua County School Board to "see if we can work to improve student achievement in the school system."

While Lowe said he can't please everybody, especially with tough problems, there are benefits to being mayor, too.

"You do get to make a difference in the community that you love," he said.

Lowe said he views his job as "a challenge and an opportunity to serve the community," and as a way to practice what he learned from being a city commissioner.

"I can't imagine what it would be like assuming the office of mayor without serving as commissioner," he said.

## LOCAL Former Gator dies at 21

Lamar Abel, a former walk-on defensive lineman for the Gators, died Saturday after an apparent seizure.

After participating in a roadside cleanup with his fraternity brothers at Southwest 62nd Boulevard on Saturday afternoon, the 21-year-old reported feeling chest pains around 7 p.m.

He suffered a seizure at his home in Campus Lodge Apartments, according to Michael Bowie, an adviser to Abel's fraternity, Omega Psi Phi.

Bowie said one of Abel's fraternity brothers called the paramedics and tried to resuscitate him before help arrived. He was taken to Shands Hospital where he was pronounced dead shortly after midnight.

Bowie remembered Abel as a funny person who truly cared about people.

"He was more than just a student to me," Bowie said. "He was a friend."

When friends learned of Abel's death, they arrived at Campus Lodge Apartments to hold a prayer vigil in the parking lot, according to Kimone Codner, a close friend to Abel through the National Panhellenic Council.

"He touched a lot of people while here," Codner said.

Codner's sorority, Alpha Kappa Alpha, named him Mr. Congeniality during a men's appreciation event. Abel's sense of

## State Attorney makes judgment on shooting

State Attorney Bill Cervone released a partial judgment Friday stating the University Police officers who shot a Ghanaian graduate student in his on-campus apartment will not face any illegal action.

Cervone based his judgment on the completed Florida Department of Law Enforcement internal investigation of the incident.

The judgment gives UF the ability to complete its own internal affairs investigation, which is being independently reviewed by Margolis Healy & Associates, a campus safety organization, according to a statement released Friday by university spokeswoman Janine Sikes.

Cervone has yet to announce judgment on the student, 35-year-old Kofi Adu-Brempong, who currently faces

### Semi-truck carrying 17 million bees crashes in Minnesota

LAKEVILLE, Minn. (AP) — Rescue crews were using fire hoses to douse an angry swarm of bees after a fatal crash that involved a semitrailer carrying about 17 million of the insects.

Authorities say a truck hauling 7,000 bee hives was involved in the four-vehicle crash Monday on Interstate 35 near Lakeville, about 35 miles south of Minneapolis.

Minnesota State Patrol spokesman Lt. Eric Roeske says one person died and another person was airlifted to a hospital.

The hives housed roughly 17 million bees and were bound for Bauer Honey in northwestern Minnesota. It's unclear how many bees got loose, but many emergency workers were stung.

## Former astronaut can't end probation

ORLANDO — A judge in Orlando has denied a request from former astronaut Lisa Nowak to end her probation early, but he eased the conditions of her probation status.

Circuit Judge Marc Lubet denied the former astronaut's request on Monday, but he changed her probation status to administrative.

Under administrative probation, an offender doesn't have to

report on a regular basis to a probation officer.

Nowak was sentenced to a year on probation in November after pleading guilty to third-degree felony burglary and misdemeanor battery.

The former astronaut drove 1,000 miles from Houston to Orlando in 2007 to mount a bizarre attack on romantic rival Colleen Shipman.

The judge's order says Nowak will continue to have no contact with Shipman and William Oefelein, the former astronaut who was the object of Nowak's affections.

## Fla. school evacuated when student brings mercury

PALM BAY — Classes were canceled at a central Florida elementary school after officials discovered a student had brought a stash of mercury.

Police believe the 12-year-old may have taken the material from a dental office where his

mother works and sold vials to classmates. Dentists use mercury in tooth fillings.

School officials canceled the final day of class Friday, fearing the hazardous material may have been on the 730-student Palm Bay Elementary campus for days.

Five students who admitted handling the mercury had to remove their clothes, wash thoroughly and don gowns and booties.

The fifth-graders were cleared by authorities and turned over to their parents, and another 15 students were released after authorities determined they had limited exposure.

# Auction, concert benefit the arts

■ THE MUSICAL CHAIRS PROJECT RAISED ABOUT \$2,500 FOR LOCAL SCHOOLS.

About 200 people bought hand-painted chairs and donated money to hear live music in support of local arts programs Saturday night in downtown Gainesville.

The Musical Chairs Project raised about \$2,500 for the Friends of Alachua County Public Schools Elementary Arts Programs Fund, which is coordinated by two retired Alachua County teachers. The event consisted of an auction followed by a concert.

Fourteen revamped chairs were sold during the auction, which drew a crowd of about 100.

UF's College of Fine Arts was about to discard the old chairs, but Katie Levy, UF graphic design alumna and co-organizer of the event, asked local artists to paint them for the auction instead. Levy used Facebook to contact bands and arranged for the venue space.

"It was a lot of work but very rewarding," said Levy, adding that she's been involved in the Alachua County public school arts programs since she started school.

About 100 more people came out to hear bands Levek and Umoja Orchestra and singer Ricky Kendall, band member of Paxico Via Mexico.

**Local News** Anna Walters, a UF sophomore, said she came to see Levek after enjoying the band's music earlier in the week at Flaco's Cuban Bakery. She didn't know it was a benefit concert but said that supporting the fund was an added bonus.

Sue Johnson, a retired art teacher who co-formed the fund, said she was glad to see different generations come to the concert and donate.

"With all that goes on in the world, it's pretty cool to be connected through the arts," Johnson said.

Gail and Jim Moss, who purchased a mosaic-decorated chair for \$300, attended the concert after to continue to show their support of the arts.

"These young people are doing amazing things," Gail Moss said. "I have to support that."

The remaining 13 chairs sold for between \$50 and \$300 each. Johnson started the fund after the school board was forced to cut the music and arts curriculum in half in 2008 because of budget cuts. The fund, which is also coordinated by retired music teacher Cheryl Poe, has contributed \$1,000 to each art and music program in 25 elementary schools in Alachua County, totaling \$50,000.

Johnson said their goal is to start a \$100,000 endowment to secure the future of the elementary arts and music programs.

"We want to see the program grow and keep a high level of awareness in the community," she said. "The arts open you up to so many different things, and it's connecting all of us."

# \$580 million budgeted for Shands

The UF Health Science Center and Shands HealthCare announced a \$580 million, five-year-plan on Thursday.

The plan will be primarily funded through philanthropy, grant income and UF support, according to a press release.

After a nine-month planning

process by a 25-member cabinet of university and hospital leaders, the plan, known as "Forward Together," was formed to increase research potential for the university.

"[W]e want to become a national model for education in the health science profes-

sion," David S. Guzick, head of UF & Shands health system, wrote in the release.

Future plans include the creation of an electronic medical record system, the building of a Shands Hospital for Children and Women and the construction of primary care offices throughout the area.

"This is a significant investment," Guzick said. "But it will have significant impact."

# Tax group identifies wasteful spending in budget

TALLAHASSEE — A financial watchdog group Monday said Florida's new budget contains nearly \$61 million in "turkeys" that Gov. Charlie Crist should veto.

Florida TaxWatch issued its annual list of spending projects either not requested by Crist or state agencies or which had bypassed usual selection processes. Most, but not all, of the 41 turkeys are local projects.

About half appeared in neither the House nor Senate versions of the budget. They were

added later by conference committees or budget chairmen for the two chambers, Rep. David Rivera, R-Miami, and Sen. JD Alexander, R-Lake Wales, including several for their hometowns.

A variety of local transportation projects account for most of the turkeys. There's also \$8.5 million for a Florida A & M University pharmacy and rural health care facility in Crestview and \$1.7 million for a senior center, complete with domino room, in Miami's Little Havana.

Other examples are \$150,000 for emergen-

cy generators in the Miami suburb of Golden Beach, nearly \$500,000 for a canal rowing facility in Brevard and Indian River counties and a series of museum and historic projects including \$250,000 for the Holocaust Documentation and Education Center's rail car renovation in Broward County.

Crist has through Friday to sign or veto the \$70.4 budget for the fiscal year beginning

July 1. He also has the power to veto line items such as the turkeys.

This year's list is longer than the \$15 million worth of turkeys that TaxWatch, which draws much of its backing from business interests, identified a year ago. It's still much shorter, though, than lists of between \$200 million and \$300 million for seven of the past 10 years.

One reason is the bad economy that has depleted state coffers in the past three years and another is a new emphasis within the Legislature on making the budgeting process more transparent.

# Disappointing Decision

## UPD officers not charged

Imagine a world where all you had to do to get away with shooting a disabled man in the face was say you felt endangered and the law would be on your side.

State Attorney Bill Cervone announced Friday that the University Police Department officers involved in the March 2 shooting of Kofi Adu-Brempong will not face criminal charges for their actions.

We cannot say that we find this shocking because the only people who witnessed the events at Adu-Brempong's apartment were the officers and Adu-Brempong himself, but we would be lying if we said we are not disappointed in the state's decision.

When police showed up to the apartment in Corry Village, they were responding to reports of screaming coming from inside. Adu-Brempong was alone and in a state of mental distress. Cervone said police decided to force entry into the apartment because they were concerned about the doctoral candidate's safety.

This would have been all right if police were working to protect the Ghanaian student and diffuse the problem, but somehow their initial concern for his safety ended in the man being shot in the face by an assault rifle. He is still recovering from his injuries and being fed through a tube. It is hard to imagine that doing this to a man who walks with a cane could ever be legally justified.

When violence is committed against a police officer, the perpetrator is dead to rights. Protecting the safety of our police officers is a righteous cause, but turn the tables and somehow we are expected to accept a police officer's word on whether a shooting is warranted.

When it comes to the law, police officers are given a blank check, but that does not mean there is nothing we can do to keep this from happening again.

UF President Bernie Machen still has to decide how the university is going to respond to the shooting, possibly changing university policy on how the University Police Department responds to calls like the one to Adu-Brempong's apartment.

We think there needs to be more oversight and control governing when police officers are justified in shooting someone and a way to accurately review incidents like this without having to take an officer's word at face value. There is a forward-facing camera in most squad cars that records officers whenever they pull someone over. Measures like that protect officers and citizens and make sure everything is done by the book.

Cameras do not lie; we would feel better about the UPD officers getting off the hook if there was a way for us to see an unbiased account of what led up to their decision to shoot Adu-Brempong.

University police departments may have a good deal in common with other law enforcement agencies, but they are also unique because they make sure we can get our education in a safe environment.

UF is not just another piece of land. People send their children here, people grow up here, and maybe once in a while people go through something where they just want to scream in their apartment.

We just want to be assured that the UPD knows that, and until it proves that to us we will not be satisfied with how this situation is being handled.

## Driving comes with social responsibility

A couple of weeks ago, at the tender age of 19, I finally got my Florida driver's license. After a three-year saga of excuses and missed opportunities, I finally sucked it up and studied hard enough to pass—despite running over a cone and failing my first attempt. While pretty much all college students and young drivers can relate to the experience, I feel like I have a unique view of the whole process.

I did not grow up in America, and the idea that it was imperative I get my driver's license was a foreign one. I had always used public transportation or asked my parents for a ride while never giving much thought to how important it was for me to drive on my own.

After I got tired of the stares when I lugged my bags of Publix groceries onto the bus and of my friends and my parents making fun of me, I was finally goaded into getting one.

Yet as I was sitting in the Department of Motor Vehicles, which is perhaps the least accommodating place on Earth, I began to realize two greater truths behind this event. The first was that I am becoming an adult. In our culture, attaining a driver's license has been inexorably tied to adulthood and becoming a full-fledged member of society. I remember when people would ask for my driver's license as a form of identification, and I would be forced to hand over my scratched and ratty Gator 1 Card.

Often, the look on their faces seemed to question my own maturity and abilities as a person. I feel that, without a driver's license, people are without power and seen by society as immature and unable to make decisions for themselves.

As I sat longer in the DMV, I began to realize an even bigger truth about driver's licenses and their purpose in our culture, beyond simply making the roads safe for all

### Adult entertainment industry veteran explains .xxx domain

As a 20-year veteran of the adult entertainment industry, I can tell you this isn't about controlling access to adult material. This is about money, plain and simple.

The company asking for the top-level domain is ICM Registry, which has no background and no affiliation with the very industry that this TLD would affect.

The industry does not want the .xxx TLD. We have made this very clear to the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers, or ICANN. It may be the only thing that the adult industry, the Christian right and the Bush administration will ever agree on.

The .xxx TLD would do nothing to control porn on the Internet.

Children could be protected in a much simpler way, namely by using a .kids domain with a strict oversight committee and browsers that parents can set to access only that domain. But let's face it, there isn't nearly as much money in that.

Hopefully we can shut this bad idea down once and for all.

Finally, as a pornographer I assure you we don't want your kids getting our product.

We are fighting tooth and nail to stop most of the free, adult material on the Internet because it is in violation of our copyrights.

We do this to make money, and we don't make money when people steal our content and "share" it.

Nor do we target your children. We target people with credit cards, and your children don't have credit cards. There is no return on investment if I target my content to your children.


the Student Body president weren't being simply rubber-stamped.

# LOCAL Building 'total loss' in fire

The day after the fire, the air still smelled of charred wood. Neighbors gathered around the fenced-off building and stared quietly.

The roof of the two-story building was gone, fallen walls and debris lie all over the ground. Looking at the surrounding trees, observers could discern where the flames had licked the leaves and left them brown.

The 16-apartment building at Paddock Club Apartments on Fort Clarke Boulevard was severely burned late Wednesday. It was determined to be a "total loss" by Alachua County Fire Rescue officials.

"It's pretty scary. We saw the smoke across town on 34th [Avenue]," said Luis Vargas, a resident of Paddock Club Apartments. "[My neighbor] said she didn't even open her windows and the whole room was glowing orange."

Each of the building's residents, 28 adults and seven children in all, were displaced from their homes. Members of both the Alachua County Fire Rescue and Gainesville Fire Rescue arrived on the scene to fight the blaze. But their efforts were not sufficient to quickly quench the fire, as virtually all possessions in-

side the building were destroyed. No one was hurt, however, and all residents have been accounted for, said ACFR spokeswoman Carol Davis.

The State Fire Marshal's office sent officials down to aid in the investigation process, she said. The marshals have estimated the damage to be around \$1.5 to \$2 million. Although investigators continue to look into the cause of the fire, they know it began on the second floor, Davis said.

Many apartment complexes in town have joined to help the Salvation Army and Red Cross in their relief efforts, alerting their residents to the displaced families' needs.

E-mails are circulating that call for linens, bedding and pillows, food, clothing of all sizes, furniture and monetary donations to be brought to Paddock Club Apartments main office. To help, contact the complex manager, Becky Sands, at 352-333-9922.

# Man, 21, drowns in pool

A 21-year-old Gainesville man drowned in a pool at the Bellamy Forge condominium complex shortly before noon Saturday.

The victim, Wayne Lawrence II, who was visiting a friend, swam into the deep end of the complex's pool and sunk beneath the surface, according to Tscharna Senn, spokeswoman for the Gainesville Police Department.

"Everyone was in the pool having fun," she said. "They didn't actually realize he was underwater."

Once those at the scene realized Lawrence was underwater, they pulled him out and tried to resuscitate using him CPR, Senn said.

Responding to a call made by someone on the scene, EMS took over upon arrival and transported Lawrence to the hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

Although the investigation is ongoing and no autopsy has been submitted, Senn said the investigating officers do not believe the incident is drug- or alcohol-related.

**Local News** Senn also said the police have no indication that any suspicious activity or foul play was involved.

Investigators are not currently considering suicide as a possibility, she said.

According to Lawrence's Facebook page, he was an alumnus of Santa Fe College and Buchholz High School.

Lawrence leaves behind an infant daughter.

## Master gardeners sell 4,500 plants to public

Caleb Burton was looking for plants for his landscaping project. Every year for his wife's birthday, he does gardening work. This year, he went to the Alachua County Master Gardener Plant Sale.

The program, a volunteer-based organization that helps the public with plant care, uses the plant sale to fund its projects, according to Howard Leinart, a master gardener.

About 4,500 of the 4,700 plants at the Alachua County Master Gardener Plant Sale were sold Saturday. The plants were grown by about 95 master gardeners, and about 80 master gardeners volunteered at the plant sale, according to Wendy Wilber, a horticulture extension agent with the Alachua County Agricultural Extension Office.

The plants were sold cheaper than at local plant stores, said Burton, a

Gainesville carpenter.

"We're definitely getting a lot more for our buck than other places," he said.

The Master Gardener program is part of UF's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences Extension Service.

Volunteering as a master gardener is free, outside of the \$160 in materials and 75 hours of volunteer time, Leinart said.

Leinart, who became a master gardener in 2007, enjoys serving the public.

### Around Gainesville

"I retired and my wife said that I need to get the hell out of the house," he said.

"It's good. I like giving to the public, sharing my knowledge."

Leinart said one of the primary costs covered by the plant sale is the Master Gardener's school program.

The school program, according to Bob Fennell, a master gardener involved with the program, teaches about 50 kids each from about half of Alachua County's elementary schools how to garden.

charges of one count of second-degree aggravated assault and one count of third-degree resisting arrest with violence.

In his statement, Cervone acknowledged UPD's right to enter the residence, as the officers had a legitimate reason to believe Adu-Brempong might have hurt himself inside.

"Had that action not been taken and had he or others come to harm because of inaction," he said, "... an equal or stronger issue as to the propriety of police inaction would doubtless have been raised."

Cervone added that it is not his place to review crisis procedure, just the legality of the action. He said questions of policy were best left to community discussion.

He also found no reason to charge the officers for their use of force, citing that "No one else, civilian or otherwise, was in a position to hear anything directly relevant to those events other than Adu-Brempong," adding that the student's credibility was tarnished by his apparent unstable mental health.

Under Florida law, anyone has the right to use deadly force against someone who appears threatening. Cervone reasoned the police reports were concurrent with that law.

Cervone ended his statement with a call to put the issue to rest.

# Youngest Everest climber wants others to 'go big'

BEIJING — For Jordan Romero, the 13-year-old American who became the youngest climber to summit Mount Everest, it all began with the desire to dream big.

The eighth grader from California said that he first came up with the idea to climb the highest peaks on all seven continents four years ago. On Saturday, he reached the top of the world's highest mountain — and nearly completed his quest.

"The record is one thing, but standing on top of the world is just the best feeling you could ever imagine," he said in an interview Monday by satellite phone from the 21,320-foot Advanced Base Camp.

Two days earlier, Jordan had succeeded in scaling the 29,035-foot peak, accompanied by a team that included his father, his father's girlfriend and three Sherpa guides. Before him, the youngest climber to scale Everest had been Temba Tsheri of Nepal, who reached the peak at age 16.

Jordan said he hoped his achievement would encourage young people worldwide to set their own big dreams and pursue them.

"I'm doing this to inspire other kids, hopefully across the world, to get outdoors and to set goals in life. I'm doing this to set an example for them," he said.

His success means he remains just a climb away from his overall goal of reaching the highest peaks on all seven continents. The final peak is the 16,076-foot Vinson Massif in Antarctica, which he hopes to tackle at the end of the year.

The group, dubbed "Team Jordan," had chosen to climb the technically more difficult northern side of Everest because the Chinese side has no age limits for climbers. The southern approach from Nepal requires climbers to be at least 16.

The climb had many tough moments, the teen said. At one point, the water bottles froze, and the team went without liquids for 10 hours. The most difficult point came when he developed stomach cramps on

the final ascent.

"It was the toughest part of the climb because I was thinking, 'Man, I don't know if I'll make it 'cause this is the worst pain I had ever felt in my stomach.' But when we approached the summit, it all just faded away. I just felt happiness," he said.

When the group finally reached the top, Jordan recalled touching the colorful prayer flags draped at the peak before standing with his arms outstretched, yelling in exultation.

"I was so happy that all of us as a team, both my parents and all our

Sherpas, had made it to the summit," he said. "I was happy about that ... that I had accomplished something so unbelievable. It was a feeling that will definitely be with me for the rest of my life."

His next step was to call his mother, Leigh Anne Drake, who lives in California, with the news.

"The first thing I said was, 'Mom, it's your son calling from the top of the world.' Right away, I heard on the other line just craziness going on," he said.

Jordan credits a few good luck charms that he carried with him, including a rabbit's foot, a Tibetan prayer necklace, a cross from his grandfather, and a pair of kangaroo testicles given by a good friend.

The curly-haired teenager, from Big Bear in California's San Bernardino Mountains, said his parents have been supportive of his dream ever since he was inspired at age 9 by a mural at school that showed the highest mountains on the seven continents.

His father, Paul Romero, a heli-

copter paramedic who is trained in high-altitude rescue, and his father's girlfriend, Karen Lundgren, have trained him for top-level mountaineering. They reached the summit of Mt. Kilimanjaro in Africa, the first of the seven peaks, when Jordan was 10 years old.

Romero and Lundgren are both adventure racers who compete in week-long endurance races that combine biking, climbing, mountaineering and paddling through wilderness areas.

"They are the most supportive parents ever. I do feel lucky for that. I don't know if other parents would encourage their kids to go big. But that's what I'm doing this for — to encourage kids who don't have that, to go big and set goals in life," Jordan said.

Jordan said he hopes to tackle the final peak in Antarctica by December or January.

With this quest nearly finished, the teen already has his eyes on the next goal: He plans to climb the highest peaks in all 50 U.S. states.



## Gators sweep Regional

■ UF BEAT FIU 13-3 TO CLINCH A SUPER REGIONAL BERTH.

Although it was coming off its worst loss of the season, the Florida softball team proved last weekend it can play its best when it matters most.

The No. 4 Gators (47-8) successfully rebounded from last week's 9-1 Southeastern Conference Tournament semifinal loss to then-No. 17 LSU by rolling through Gainesville's NCAA Tournament Regional, which ended with UF's five-inning 13-3 run-rule beatdown of FIU (38-21) on Sunday.

All weekend, Florida's brightest star was junior ace Stephanie Brombacher, who gave up only three runs and 11 base

runners while pitching every one of the team's 19 innings.

"The way she's been pitching the last two games, I gotta give her the ball," coach Tim Walton said of his decision to start Brombacher in her third game in as many days. "She had to have the ball today and she really pitched well."

Brombacher was aided by Florida's potent offense, which averaged more than eight runs per game on the weekend and twice gave Brombacher a lead before she ever took the field.

The Gators' quick-strike ability was never more apparent than on Sunday, when the team scored five runs on one hit in the top of the first thanks to a grand slam by freshman Brittany Schutte.

"(The run support) just lets me go out there and make my pitches and lets my

### Adams ends long slump

Josh Adams began the regular season with a bang and ended it with one, too.

But he has not enjoyed that same success in between.

The junior second baseman hit two home runs in the season opener, and tallied four RBIs in the last two games of the Gators' schedule Friday and Saturday. Adams hit 9 for 12 in those three contests.

However, he still came into last weekend's monumental series against South Carolina hitting just .221.

"(Slumps are) not easy. You just go out there and keep playing because you know everybody goes through it," Adams said.

But by the time that series came to an end, his average had shot up 16 points as Adams helped the Gators take two of three from the Gamecocks

to clinch the No. 1 seed in the Southeastern Conference Tournament. No. 4 Florida (40-13, 22-8 SEC) will face LSU (36-20, 14-16 SEC) in the first round of the tourney Wednesday at 5:30 p.m. in Hoover, Ala.

His numbers from the weekend could have been even better if South Carolina right fielder Whit Merrifield hadn't stuck his glove over the fence and stolen an opposite-field homer away from Adams Sunday.

But the fact he has been staying back and taking the ball the other way is a good sign for the Gators.

"(Hitting the ball to opposite field has) been my approach ever since I got here. I kind of strayed away from that in the beginning of the season," he said. "It has just taken me a while

# Wade takes witness stand in restaurant lawsuit

MIAMI — In his NBA job, Miami Heat star Dwyane Wade follows a rulebook. The people suing him for \$25 million want the same concept applied to his business dealings.

With opposing attorney Richard Bales often referring to the contract related to a failed restaurant venture as “the rulebook” and grilling Wade for hours, the Miami Heat star spent a full day on the witness stand Monday in a breach-of-contract suit brought against him by two scorned ex-business partners who say he walked away from the deal and cost them millions.

In short, plaintiffs Lauren Hollander and Mark Rodberg say Wade didn’t follow the rulebook — the contract — and, because of his estimated \$30 million salary through basketball and endorsements, could simply walk away from the deal. Wade says Hollander and Rodberg side is guilty of the foul, and he was committed to having the restaurant plans work.

“I didn’t want to end it,” Wade said Monday on the witness stand. “This is something

I was excited about, outside of basketball, something that thrilled me to think about the possibility.”

Wade also testified for about an hour on Friday. He will be back on the stand again today.

One of the central issues in the case deals with why Wade and longtime associate Marcus Andrews originally accepted a deal for a 12 percent stake in the planned chain of D. Wade’s Place sports-themed restaurants, then increased their request to 30 percent shortly after the paperwork was signed.

Only two of the restaurants opened, both closing relatively quickly. Rodberg and Hollander filed suit in December 2008. Wade is also seeking damages, contending that his likeness and name were used in ways he did not approve.

Wade seemed relaxed much of the day, smiling often and chatting with court personnel during breaks while sipping water. He and Bales were even downright conversational at times, confiding in each other that neither views math as a personal strength.

When asked by Bales about certain percentage increases in the contract, Wade re-

plied, “Mr. Bales, I left school early and this would be a reason why. I’m lost with the percentages. I don’t think I’ll get the percentages analogy.”

Bales wanted to know why Wade and Andrews asked for a substantially higher interest in the venture, something Wade said happened only after Richard von Houtman, another former partner in the failed deal, allegedly did not “do what he said he would do as a partner.”

Wade originally was to be paid \$1 million as well as receive 10 percent ownership in the venture, with Andrews getting a 2 percent stake. The rest would go to von Houtman and Rodberg.

On the stand, Wade testified that he and Andrews eventually proposed that Rodberg receive a 70 percent interest, with them splitting the remaining 30. The business relationship broke down quickly from there.

“The conversations with Mark, it was just mutually agreed upon that Richard wasn’t doing his job,” Wade said. “So we came back

and asked for an increase in our percentages because as we knew and as Mark knew, we were doing our fair share — if not even more — to make sure of making sure that these restaurants were being successful and we had a partner that wasn’t.”

The original plan to market a line of T-shirts, according to von Houtman and court documents, quickly turned to talk of upscale, sports-themed restaurants that would sell all sorts of Wade memorabilia. Von Houtman brought in Rodberg, who had experience in developing restaurants, and the two of them inked the D. Wade’s Place deal with Wade and Andrews on Aug. 6, 2007.

“I didn’t want to terminate the joint venture agreement,” Wade testified. “As I stated, getting involved in these restaurants was something that I always wanted to do, so I just trying to find a way to make it work, Mr. Bales, not terminate it.”

The trial will continue Tuesday and Thursday this week, with Wednesday off for a juror to attend a family funeral and Friday off so Wade can appear at a hearing related to his ongoing divorce and custody fight in Chicago.

## NFL owners to discuss and vote on proposed changes

IRVING, Texas — Ready for an outdoor Super Bowl in cold, possibly snowy weather? Thinking that new overtime rule adopted for playoff games should be used in the regular season, too?

NFL owners will discuss those things and more Tuesday.

The 2014 Super Bowl site definitely will be picked. It's widely expected to go to the new \$1.6 billion Meadowlands stadium that will become home to the Jets and Giants this season, although Miami and Tampa also are bidding.

The new stadium for the New York City area would seem like a natural site for the NFL's marquee event, especially with league headquarters in Manhattan. Plus, the league has a history of rewarding cities for building expensive new stadiums by giving them a Super Bowl.

But there's a fundamental problem: the Meadowlands doesn't have a roof and temperatures are usually in the 20s during early February in East Rutherford, N.J. There's even a league rule aimed at ensuring good weather, either by playing in a warm climate or by having a roof; the fact it was waived for this bid shows that this might be a shoo-in.

Yet there will still be a vote and teams in other cold-climate cities could support it in hopes of permanently scrapping the weather rule so they, too, can host the lucrative event.

"I don't see how it's not played here," Jets coach Rex Ryan said. "We've got the best city in the world. I think that's indisputable. We've got arguably one of the top stadiums in the league, a brand-new stadium and it helps two teams."

As for overtime, when owners last met, in March, they voted to change the sudden-death rule so that if a team losing the coin

toss immediately gives up a field goal, they still get a chance to score and either tie it or win — but only in the playoffs.

There's a sentiment that if the rule is good enough for the postseason, it should be done in the regular season.

"It is on the agenda for a 'possible vote' after consultation with the clubs," said Atlanta Falcons president Rich McKay, co-chairman of the competition committee. "In March, there were a number of clubs who wanted to discuss it at the May meeting, and we will see if this leads to a vote on the issue."

Owners also will talk about the proposed sale of the St. Louis Rams.

Illinois businessman Shahid Khan reached agreement with owners Chip Rosenbloom and his sister, Lucia Rodriguez on Feb. 11 to

buy the team for an estimated \$750 million. Last month, Missouri billionaire Stan Kroenke — who already owned 40 percent of the team — exercised his right to match the offer and purchase the remaining 60 percent of the club.

Beyond the financial issues, there's also a problem because Kroenke owns the NBA's Denver Nuggets and the NHL's Colorado Avalanche, and NFL rules prohibit owners from also owning clubs in the NBA, NHL or Major League Baseball.

Commissioner Roger Goodell also is likely to address a Supreme Court ruling against the league Monday in its quest for antitrust protection. Justices said the league must be considered 32 separate teams — not one big business — when selling branded items like jerseys and caps.

Smith and the NFLPA lauded the court for a move it says keeps the league from acting like a monopoly.

The truth — that freshmen are recruited to put points on the board immediately — currently comes across as brash.

But if people realized how experienced first-year players really are, the truth would not lead to unfairly negative comparisons to R. Kelly, who in 2007 said:

"I'm the Ali of today. I'm the Marvin Gaye of today. I'm the Bob Marley of today. I'm the Martin Luther King."

# UF vies for national title

■ THE GATORS WILL PLAY FOR THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP TODAY AT 2 P.M.

When the season began, UF women's tennis coach Roland Thornqvist said he felt like it had been a long time since 2003, the year Florida won its last national title.

He might not be referencing 2003 much longer. The No. 3 Gators (29-2) have the opportunity to bring a fifth NCAA Team Championship back to Gainesville when they face No. 8 Stanford (25-1) today at 2 p.m. on ESPN.

The 2003 championship was won in a 4-3 upset against the Cardinal in Gainesville, where the home crowd was a factor. This time, the Gators will not be on their home court when they face Stanford, but the Dan Magill Tennis Complex is hardly foreign to this team.

Monday's 4-0 win against No. 2 North Carolina marked UF's seventh win this season in Athens, Ga.

Florida's top three singles players all enter the match on a high note.

Southeastern Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player Marrit Boonstra continued her strong showing in Athens with a 6-2, 6-2 win over North Carolina's Sophie Grabinski that extended her singles win streak to 17 matches.

Her doubles partner, No. 8 Allie Will, put UF in position to clinch with a 6-3, 6-3 win over No. 54 Katrina Tsang at the No. 2 spot.

Will enters today's match undefeated in dual-match singles this season with 26 wins.

Fellow freshman sensation No. 9 Lauren

Embree sent the Gators to the championship match with a 6-2, 1-6, 7-5 defeat of Sanaz Marand.

Since a tough three-match losing stretch at the ITA Team Indoor Tournament in February, Embree has strung together a 16-match winning streak heading into the championship match. Embree's strong showing at the No. 1 position this year for Florida helped make her the first freshman to be named the SEC Player of the Year. She was also named the ITA Southeast Region Rookie of the Year.

Saturday against Miami, Embree achieved her most impressive win of the season when she upset No. 7 Laura Vallverdu.

However, she may face her toughest challenge today when she takes on No. 4 Hillary Barte.

In Stanford, the Gators face a traditional power (15 national titles), but a relative unknown in regards to this year.

Many fans and experts consider this to be a down year for the Pacific-10 Conference in women's tennis and Stanford did not take part in the ITA Team Indoor Tournament in Madison, Wis.

UF faced one Pac-10 opponent at the indoor tournament in February, UCLA, and lost 4-1. More recently, the Gators defeated Washington 4-0 on May 14 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

The No. 6 Gators men's tennis team (21-5) will not be taking part in the men's portion of today's championships. No. 12 Georgia, the tournament host, upset UF 4-2 in the round of 16 Friday. Senior Antoine Benneteau and junior Alexandre Lacroix will take part in the NCAA Individual Championships beginning Wednesday in Athens.

# Gators advance past Regional to NCAA Championships

The Gators enjoyed the luck of the Irish in South Bend, Ind., at the Central Regional this past weekend, and finished high enough to earn a bid for the NCAA Championships.

Florida joins first-place Stanford, runner-up FSU, and Duke and LSU who finished in the fourth and fifth spots.

"To finish in third wasn't exactly what we wanted, but we live to see another day," UF coach Buddy Alexander said. "It was an interesting week of ebbs and flows, but I think we played solid for the most part. We are happy to be advancing to the next round."

This is Alexander's 22nd appearance in the NCAA Championships in his 23 years as UF's coach.

Florida finished the first day of the Central Regional in second place

at 279, -1. Freshman Phillip Choi (69,-1) and junior Bank Vongvanij (68, -2) were the standouts for UF on day one. Vongvanij hit 16 straight pars before sinking back to back birdies to finish the round.

"Bank was terrific, and it was a great round for him," Alexander

said. "We played solid in spite of a shaky start; the team really turned things around on four and five."

The second day of the tournament was suspended due to inclement weather with all five UF golfers scattered between holes 13 to 16. UF finished the day in fourth place with a score of 506, +5.

The Gators were a couple shots off the bubble, and were encouraged by Alexander to 'step up and get a good round in'.

After strong finishes earlier that day including the holes from the suspended second day, the Gators played well as they posted a one-under, 279 in the final round and carded a final tournament score of 838, -2.

"By far the biggest and best thing was that we were able to finish off the second round as we did. It gave us cushion going into the final round that we didn't have," Alexander said.
