

Prosecution deferred for grad student

State Attorney Bill Cervone has postponed prosecuting Kofi Adu-Brempong, the 35-year-old Ghanaian graduate student who was shot in the face by UF police March 2.

As a result of this decision, Adu-Brempong will not be punished for his charges of aggravated assault and resisting arrest with violence as long as he continues to undergo counseling, Cervone said in an interview Wednesday.

Adu-Brempong's case will likely not be officially closed for another three years, he said, though the time could be shortened or lengthened depending on whether Cervone is convinced Adu-Brempong's progress is

satisfactory for dismissal.

Cervone said many factors influenced his decision.

"Everything in it from the facts ... to his particular circumstances ... to what's best for him and best for the community," he said. "We will be monitoring his compliance. I assume he'll successfully comply."

Peg O'Connor, an attorney with Turner and Hodge, L.L.P., the firm handling Adu-Brempong's case, said she considered the case closed.

"We think this is a good resolution," O'Connor said. "We're pleased with the state attorney's decision."

The firm arranged for Adu-Brempong to receive counseling from an off-campus source in Gainesville, O'Connor said, where he will be treated for post traumatic stress, among other things.

Adu-Brempong was known to suffer from delusions prior to the shooting. Officers visited his on-campus apartment on March 1, after a professor in Adu-Brempong's department alerted police his colleague sent e-mails out to students stating he believed someone was out to hurt him, according to a police report of the incident.

That day, the officers decided Adu-Brempong was not a danger to himself or others, though they returned the next night when a neighbor reported screams from his room.

According to UPD reports, Adu-Brempong approached the officers with a pipe when they entered his apartment, and shooting him was a defensive measure.

Cervone found the officers not guilty of misconduct in the incident.

- **March 2:** Kofi Adu-Brempong, 35-year-old graduate student, is shot and arrested by UPD on five charges of third-degree resisting arrest with violence and one charge of third-degree aggravated assault. He's taken to Shands at UF where he is kept in critical condition.

- **March 5:** Adu-Brempong's charges are changed to one count of second-degree aggravated assault and one count of third-degree resisting arrest with violence.

- **March 16:** UF students hold a protest demanding, among other things, that the charges against Adu-Brempong be dropped.

- **April 15:** The Florida Department of Law Enforcement concludes its investigation of the shooting and releases it to the State Attorney's Office for legal consideration.

- **May 21:** State Attorney Bill Cervone releases a partial judgment stating the officers involved will not face any charges.

- **June 9:** Cervone announces the decision to defer prosecution pending Adu-Brempong's continuation to seek counseling. After a three-year period, the case will be officially closed and the charges dropped.

LOCAL 40 students protest new uniform rule

About 40 Alachua County public school students convened at the Kirby Smith Center on Tuesday to protest the new countywide school dress code policy.

For almost an hour, the protesters lined University Avenue and chanted slogans such as, "We won't conform; no uniforms!"

One sign, citing Billy Joel's song "It's Still Rock and Roll to Me," read, "What's the matter with the clothes I'm wearing?" Another read, "You can't legislate what you can't provide."

Though a majority of the protesters were high-school students, 11-year-old Amber Gillette represented Williams Elementary with a sign that said, "I'm getting punished for the rules I don't break."

Eileen Roy, one of the two school board members who voted against the policy, attended the protest.

"To be fair, the people who voted for this policy felt that doing so would enhance academic performance," she said. "I have not seen evidence that links wearing uniforms with increase in academic performance."

■ Fla. posting 1st signs warning swimmers about oil

PENSACOLA BEACH (AP) — Beachgoers in Florida's western Panhandle saw the first warning signs Tuesday telling them not to swim or fish off of a six-mile stretch of the oil-fouled Gulf of Mexico near the Alabama and Florida state line.

The Escambia County Health Department posted the signs after a tar substance was reported off Perdido Key. The warnings stretch from Perdido Key to the Gulf Islands Seashore national park.

It is the first time swimming and fishing has been restricted on any Florida beaches because of the massive spill that began with the April 20.

Marines killed in Afghanistan

MIAMI — Two Marines have been killed in Afghanistan.

The Department of Defense reports that 24-year-old Sgt. Zachary J. Walters, of Palm Coast, Fla., and 22-year-old Sgt. Derek L. Shanfield, of Hastings, Pa., died on Tuesday while supporting combat operations in Afghanistan.

They were assigned to 2nd Battalion, 6th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Lejeune, N.C.

Crist pushes for July session for oil drilling ban

MIAMI — Gov. Charlie Crist may call a special session in July for lawmakers to discuss a constitutional amendment that would ban offshore drilling.

Crist toured a new command post in downtown Miami on Wednesday where Coast Guard, state and federal officials and BP representatives will strategize over how to protect Florida's beaches if the oil hits South Florida. While there's no imminent threat, Crist said estimates change daily. He said it will be crucial to have the most accurate information about how much oil has been leaking since the Deepwater Horizon explosion and to monitor the loop current, which could whip the oil around Florida's east coast.

Crist is pushing for a special session sooner, but says he's met with resistance in the House.

Lower Gulf Coast property taxes sought in Fla.

PENSACOLA — Some advocates are calling for Florida legislators to allow tax appraisers to lower Gulf Coast property values immediately because of the BP oil spill.

Appraisers from three Panhandle counties and a state representative say the state should then push BP PLC to compensate the counties for lost revenue.

They say that otherwise the tax burden would shift to inland property owners.

State Rep. Dave Murzin and the appraisers from Escambia, Santa Rosa and Okaloosa counties say the Legislature should call a special session soon to deal with the crisis.

The spill began April 20 when a BP drilling rig off Louisiana exploded.

Tar balls and other oil products from the spill began washing up on Panhandle beaches last weekend.

Walmart workers accused of stealing hydrocodone

MARIANNA (AP) — Two employees at a north Florida Walmart pharmacy have been charged with trafficking a controlled substance after allegedly stealing thousands of hydrocodone pills.

The Jackson County Sheriff's Office says pharmacist Tresha Davis and Priscilla Ann Noble, a pharmacy technician, stole several hundred pain pills each week and then sold them to others.

Davis allegedly made \$200 for each sale and Noble \$100.

Investigators say more arrests are expected.

A Walmart spokeswoman says the company is working with authorities.

Jackson County Sheriff Lou Roberts commended the chain for cooperating with the investigation.

Both Davis and Noble have been released after posting \$30,000 bond each.

Labor posters displayed

Students who hate their jobs should visit the Harn this summer.

A selection of work incentive posters from the 1920s went on exhibit Tuesday at the Harn Museum of Art on UF's campus. "America at Work: Art and Propaganda in the Early 20th Century" features 30 vintage posters with catchy slogans that encourage people to be productive and happy in their work.

The posters, which are decorated in prototypical 1920s graphics and feature slogans like, "Be a Tight Wad! Own Something!" and "Long Winded Talkers Waste Time," were designed to encourage morale, teamwork and pride in the workplace, said Dulce Román, the modern art curator at the Harn.

"Since the posters are related to the theme of work, we hope people will be interested because of the economic downturn," Román said. "The posters sort of represent American values. I

wanted to show that."

The posters are owned by Ronald DeFilippo, who owns The Swamp Restaurant on University Avenue. DeFilippo, who is loaning the posters to the museum through Sept. 15, bought them more than 25 years ago at an antique shop in New York.

"I had them authenticated and restored because they were colorful," DeFilippo said. "I like them because they were the beginning stages of advertising, and as a restaurateur I like having them cover the walls."

On Campus

Although they may have been commercially successful in the early 20th century, in today's market the posters are worth quite a bit more than the lithograph paper they are printed on, DeFilippo said.

The posters were produced by Mather & Company from 1923 until 1929, when the stock market collapsed and put the company out of business, Román said.

Panel seeks BP payment

TALLAHASSEE — A panel of government officials and private citizens Wednesday discussed the idea of getting a big upfront payment from BP and the state taking over claims payments to businesses and individuals who have suffered losses from the company's oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

The Gulf Oil Spill Economic Recovery Task Force created by Gov. Charlie Crist, though, took no action on the proposal by Tallahassee lawyer Steve Uhlfelder.

"We should look at a way to draw down a lot of money from BP now — 500 million, a billion — and let the state take over this process," Uhlfelder said. "I really believe this company's in serious economic trouble."

Uhlfelder said Florida also should get enough to cover state and local tax losses expected due to declining tourism and property values while BP still has the resources to cover them.

Several other members agreed, including state Sen. Durell Peadar, R-Crestview,

and Rep. Michael Horner, R-Kissimmee.

"This \$25 million at a time in little drips and drabs I don't think is cutting it," Horner said. "Put a few more zeros on there. We should be talking billions."

"I think we need to get what we can while we can," said Nelson Mongiovi, director of marketing and development for the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

Charter boat captain Robert F. Zales II, of Panama City, also liked the idea.

"The people in this state know more how to take care of their people than somebody from Houston, Texas, or Great Britain," Zales said.

The only opposition came from Attorney General Bill McCollum's deputy chief of staff, Bill Stewart. He said a state or federal takeover of the claims could mean taxpayers would pick up expenses now being paid by BP.

Crist's budget director, Jerry McDaniel, said state economists are trying to come up with figures on lost tax revenues.

Bakery teams up with UN campaign to stop hunger

The Flour Pot Bakery is battling hunger one cookie at a time.

The bakery, located in the Tioga Town Center in Gainesville, launched its three-month Summer of Edible Goodness program on Tuesday, in which the owners agree to donate a school meal to a hungry child in a developing nation for every food item the store sells.

"We're doing directly one for one," said Melissa Austin, 22, partial owner of the bakery. "How many customers come in is how many meals we're giving."

After research, the bakery's owners chose to donate the money raised from selling baked goods to the United Nations' Fill the Cup Campaign.

Bakery employees hand out tickets to customers and keep half of the ticket to track the number of food items sold.

"We want to give people a step up," Austin said. "Studies show that kids are more willing to go to school if they know they're going to get a meal."

In February, Austin assumed ownership of the store alongside her fiancé, Bryan Judah, 25, and his mother, Sally Judah. Judah's interest

in social entrepreneurship and Austin's family background in baking encouraged the family to try running the business, Austin said.

"Being a businessman, [Judah] doesn't want to neglect that need to help too," she said.

Tuesday also marked the one-year anniversary of the death of Julian Nobles, Judah's grandfather, whose favorite pastime was finding fresh produce for friends, family and even strangers, she said. Austin said the Edible Goodness program was made in honor of him.

"He would actually go door to door to pass out local produce to friends," she said. "We never saw him without a basket of potatoes or something. He just loved making people happy."

The bakery is open from 7 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday.

Items sold at the bakery's stands in any of the farmers markets will also count toward the campaign. The Flour Pot Bakery employees attend farmers markets downtown on Wednesdays, in Ocala on Fridays, and in both farmers markets held in Haile Plantation and Alachua on Saturday.

UF has most green buildings

UF has more eco-friendly buildings than any other American university.

A recently published paper about buildings in colleges recognized UF as having the most certifications by Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design.

The LEED certification system is operated by the U.S. Green Building Council, a Washington-based non-profit organization.

In 2003, UF became the first

organization in Florida to receive a gold LEED rating. In 2008, UF became the first organization in Florida to receive a platinum rating, which is the highest rank.

According to the paper, written by green building expert Jerry Yudelson, UF is a national trendsetter that is "well-known for [its] green building standards."

Some of UF's 15 certified buildings include Library West and Rinker Hall, with gold certifications, and Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's 60,000-square-foot expansion, which earned UF's

only platinum rating.

Harvard University, with 39 LEED projects, which are LEED buildings that are not yet completed, is second to UF's 60 LEED projects in the ranking.

UF's policy requires all new construction to earn at least a gold rating.

The university's next step is to upgrade existing buildings, said Bahar Armaghani, assistant director for the UF LEED program.

UF has selected 32 buildings that need renovation to be updated to meet LEED certification, Armaghani said.

Group plans second protest for Tuesday

Alachua County school board candidate Chris Smiley said the policy may cause unforeseen consequences.

"Why did we let this happen?" he said. "There's no reason to implement it if it's going to force an undue financial burden on students and parents."

Sara Bicknell, one of the protest organizers, said the new policy might be financially difficult for her family.

"I live with a single mom who works on a teacher's salary," she said. "She's raising four kids. She doesn't have enough to get all new wardrobes for all of us. It's just unrealistic."

In order to have the policy removed, some students are prepared to go to even more drastic measures than just protesting outside the Kirby Smith Center.

Bicknell said she and her peers are discussing a uniform boycott. If enough students participated, she said, the faculty would have no way of enforcing the policy.

"Why did we let this happen? There's no reason to implement it if it's going to force an undue financial burden on students and parents."

"You have to keep protesting," she said. "People have to keep boycotting for weeks or else it's not going to change anything."

The same group is organizing another protest for Tuesday, when the school board will hold a meeting.

Cafe's income falls

■ THE FAT TUSCAN REPORTS A 50 PERCENT DROP IN INCOME SINCE CHANGING ITS HOURS.

After two weeks of adhering to a zoning code diet, the Fat Tuscan Café is not as plump as it once was.

Between December and May, the café had been functioning in quiet defiance of its zoning code, which prohibited the café from operating on Sundays and past 4 p.m. on weekdays. The café had also been hosting live, amplified music in its courtyard, which further violated the code.

After a noise complaint in May, owners of the Fat Tuscan were issued a citation that forced staff to comply with the pre-existing zoning code.

The new code enforcement has resulted in a 50 percent drop in income, said Michelle Reeves, partial owner of the café.

Since then, Reeves said, she has canceled the café's dinner menu, laid off two staff members and cut other workers' hours to one shift a week.

"We have no plan B," she said.

Karen Orr, who has lived for 30 years at 715 NE Second St., one block from the café, said she does not think the restaurant should be in her neighborhood at all.

Even if the café abides by the noise ordinance, she said, she would still hear the live music, because she lives within 200 feet of the building.

Most of her neighbors who live on the side of the street closest to the café are renting their homes and have not had to live with the noise, she said.

An agreement is implied between residents and the city that the houses that share the block with the Fat Tuscan should act as a buffer for the noise coming from Main Street, she said.

"That contract between the city and its citizens, when they approved [the café], was broken," she said. "There's no way that this can go on with these teeny tiny lots and not be intrusive."

Absentee ballot troubles SG

■NOTIFYING STUDENTS WAS THE MAIN CONCERN.

After proposing four amendments to the same bill, senators agreed to disagree during Tuesday's meeting.

Senators debated for more than an hour about the phrasing of an amendment to a bill for how to apply for an absentee ballot for Student Government elections.

The bill, which passed last week, mandated that the supervisor of elections must notify each student about the absentee ballot process in an e-mail. Before it passed, members of the Unite Party added an amendment that permits the supervisor of elections to notify students using means other than e-mail, arguing that notifications were already sent to each student via the Gator Times.

Student Alliance party members, who authored the original bill, said during this week's meeting that the Gator Times had not mentioned ab-

sentee ballots within the past year.

Student Alliance party president Keir Lamont said the Unite Party may not have been intentionally relaying false information, but it was still incorrect.

"We can admit that they were at least misinformed about the statements they made," Lamont said.

Unite Party Sen. Ben Meyers said SG staff members usually send ballot information to the Gator Times, though the Gator Times does not publish it. Senators did not know this during the last senate meeting, he said.

Members of the Student Alliance party responded by drafting another amendment to the bill Tuesday that would require the supervisor of elections to send the information about absentee voting to the Gator Times. The Unite Party changed that amendment to say students would receive the information by an unspecified "online notification."

Meyers said the notification could appear in the Gator Times, an e-mail, on the SG website or on ISIS.

"It's the same thing you're saying, we're just being less specific," Meyers told senators.

Meyers said this wording provided for the fact that the Gator Times might not always be around, and students who do not read it would still get the information. The supervisor of elections wouldn't be subject to any negative consequences if the students did not get the information via the Gator Times, Meyers said.

The amendment passed with a vote of 54 to 14. Unhappy with this new word choice, senators continued to debate. Last week, Unite Party senators argued that notifications were already sent through the Gator Times, Jonathan Ossip said. This week, he argued that senators did not want to make it a requirement because it was too specific.

"I'm just very confused about which side you want to take," Ossip told senators.

The final amendment, which passed with the bill, requires the supervisor of elections to send out at least two online notifications to students before SG elections. It does not specify what means will be used.

Smoothies sold to find a cancer cure

If the year-long program is successful, then the two organizations could form a longer-lasting relationship, he said.

Deferred prosecution doesn't end controversy

The State Attorney's Office announced Wednesday that it has entered into an agreement to defer criminal prosecution against Kofi Adu-Brempong, the UF graduate student who was shot in the face by a UPD officer in March.

Under the agreement, the charges against Adu-Brempong would be dropped in three years if he continues to receive counseling for his mental health issues and agrees to take any medications prescribed to him. This is a big step in the right direction, but the case is far from closed.

We hope that Adu-Brempong will finish his doctorate work at UF, but we are more concerned about how this event will affect the rest of his time in Gainesville. Will he be allowed to teach again, or is he going to be shoved quickly through the program in the hopes that this controversy will finally die?

We are still waiting to hear UF's plan to keep things like this from happening again. It would be nice if we knew there was some progress on that front, but as of now all the money that would fund mental health programs for students is being diverted to Student Government until further notice.

It might also be nice if we knew what UPD's new plans for handling delicate situations like this will be. It was an explosive event that deserves some explosive answers. Instead we are stuck waiting for UF to conclude its own investigation and release its findings to the public. Most of all we are saddened by the impact this ordeal has had on Adu-Brempong and his family, and we hope this agreement gives them some peace.

City commissioner stands by underage drinking ordinance.

Tuesday's editorial asks the question about underage drinkers caught in bars: "Why doesn't the city implement a huge fine and prohibit them from going into a bar again?" The answer is simple: In Florida, only the state legislature can make laws such as these, not local government. Local government can only do two things: regulate the hours, and regulate whether the bars can admit 18- to 20-year-olds or if

they have to be 21 and up. Only the state can take away a liquor license through an administrative proceeding or make harsher punishments for violating state laws.

The city of Gainesville made its local ordinance as a compromise, rather than simply deciding to make all the bars 21 and up as recommended by many. The ordinance merely requires that those bars who go over the threshold of a certain number of underage drinking offenses would have to become 21 and up after 9 p.m. Our goal

was to reduce the load of the Gainesville Police Department, who were finding that a handful of bars were very lax in their duties in keeping a liquor license. Most bars do an excellent job in managing their premises and should not be penalized for those who do not.

We have had great success since this ordinance was implemented in April 2009 with a 66 percent decrease in documented underage drinking in Gainesville's bars. In addition, there have been no significant

increases in calls for party patrol or code enforcement in our single-family neighborhoods near campus.

The tax-paying citizens of the city should not be spending a significant portion of their tax dollars on policing irresponsible bars; the success of this ordinance allows GPD to spend more time keeping the community safe. I stand by the intent and the results of this ordinance.

Audience participation is key to 'Shear Madness' plot

Mrs. Schubert in the salon with the scissors? Don't put it past "Shear Madness," a comedic whodunit that is as entertaining and flamboyant as it sounds.

The longest-running non-musical play in America, "Shear Madness" is now showing at the Hippodrome State Theatre downtown with eight performances a week.

The script is meant to be flexible, so each show is completely up to date with local gossip and current events. Director Mary Hausch brainstorms with the actors on a daily basis to incorporate the latest news into the shows. A steady stream of jokes poke fun at everything from the Gainesville Police Department and Tim Tebow to Lady Gaga and British Petroleum.

The plot is as interactive as it is modern. At "Shear Madness," the audience is part of the drama and attendees solve the mystery.

Tony Whitcomb (Cameron Francis), owner of the Gainesville Salon where the play is set, has the audience laugh-

ing from the moment they meet him in his pink sneakers, popped-collar polo and rhinestone belt.

Whitcomb isn't alone in his banter and innuendo. He is joined by fellow hairdresser and employee, Barbara DeMarco (Jennifer Smith), whose taste in fashion is as wild as her taste in men.

The not-so-innocent beauticians are plagued by the incessant piano playing of their upstairs neighbor Isabel Czerny. Until they find out she

has been murdered and they are the suspects.

Like the beauticians, the clients are also suspicious characters. Mrs. Shubert (Sara Morsey), the ridiculously wealthy cougar, and Eddie Lawrence (Kevin-Michael Chu), a sleazy antiques dealer, both have surprising connections to the deceased.

Detective Nick Rossetti (Gregory Jones), GPD, controls the scene and questions not only the characters but the audience as well. Rossetti uses intermission to gather more clues and investigate theories, so

don't be shy if you have some dirt.

The detectives don't, however, decide who is getting arrested. You do. Though police detain Tony one night, Mrs. Shubert heads to the jail the next.

The cast delivers the comedy fast and doesn't miss a beat. And if you talk to them, they'll talk right back.

Hausch, who has directed more than 120 productions, traveled to Washington, D.C. in 2003 to participate in an intensive director's training. While there, she watched eight performances of the play and learned all of the ins and outs that come with the improvisational wit of "Shear Madness."

"The audiences observe different things," Hausch said over the phone. "They push the actors in different directions, and that creates a whole new environment that most people don't have a chance to experience."



step in a bigger direction, which goes hand in hand with the fact that it is the first of their releases to be put on Columbia, rather than Sub Pop Records.

The band uses more grandiose arrangements than on previous records, an aspect that die-hard Horses fans may or may not be privy to.

Many songs are built on string and synth arrangements in the background. Along with the arrangements, the lyrics in *Infinite Arms* may

create a clear division between fans and skeptics.

With lyrics like, "I was thinking it over at the snack machine/I thought about you in a candy bar" may come off as either quirky and cute, or base and annoying.

Either way, *Infinite Arms* is a solid addition to the band's already beloved discography and an encouraging release for the remainder of 2010.

TBS show walks the line

Suicide, drug addiction, bestiality and glory holes. Dark and disturbing realities in our society, or a family-friendly pilot episode that is "very funny"? TBS aired its first original primetime animated series, "Neighbors From Hell," on Monday.

The basic idea is that Satan sends a family from Hell to Earth with a mission to stop a giant company from drilling into Hell. To complete said mission, they have to blend in with suburban America. It's a fairly tired premise (i.e., "Coneheads," "The Addams Family," "The Munsters"), but what sets this show apart is the all-star cast of voices and the dark and edgy references.

The three main characters in the show are Balthazor Hellman (Will Sasso), Tina Hellman (Molly Shannon), and dog Pazuzu (Patton Oswalt). Balthazor is basically Fred Flintstone meets Homer Simpson meets Peter Griffin. Three words: dumb, fat, dad. Tina is bitchy. Her most memorable scene involves her awkwardly

Fake weed offers smokers a more legal, less potent alternative

Sold in a small pouch clearly labeled "not intended for human consumption," Gainesville Green Sense is marketed as an herbal air freshener. The finely crumbled blend of dry plant matter smells slightly sweet, similar to a fruity bubblegum.

Different companies market products like Spice, K2 and, now, Gainesville Green Sense as incense or potpourri. Unofficially, the products are known to mimic the effects or marijuana when smoked.

I'm sitting in a room full of seasoned pot smokers. One of them, Cari*, gingerly empties a packet of the potpourri into the bowl of a water pipe. Lighting the bowl, Cari inhales deeply and blows out a dragon-style stream of smoke, accompanied by a cough or two.

"It's a lot like inhaling tobacco except less harsh and it tastes sort of sweet," Cari said post-cough.

"I was smoking with my friend who told me about something new and similar to weed, but legal. I trusted him and I smoked it," Will, another former pot smoker who made the switch, said.

Gainesville Green Sense is sold in one-gram packets and fractions of an ounce. The marketing uses unmistakably cliché pot branding – just the name Gainesville Green Sense evokes memories of the famous strain of local pot that put Gainesville on the map in the 1970s.

Spice entered the "legal bud" market circa 2006. Since then, laboratories confirmed the presence of JWH-018 in the product – a

synthetic cannabinoid that manufacturers spray onto a combination of otherwise innocuous herbs.

"The biggest difference for me is that I know what I'm smoking every time. When you buy weed off the street, it could be any strength," Will said.

Smoking the so-called synthetic weed may not be without consequence, however. The American Association of Poison Control

Centers received more than 100 phone calls regarding the products since 2009.

People with negative reactions report symptoms like anxiety, paranoia and a racing heart beat. "People are just having a reaction similar to that of smoking too much marijuana – i.e. intense paranoia or anxiety," Will said. In addition, synthetic cannabinoids may be

stronger than THC, the active component in marijuana, and easier to unknowingly ingest too much of.

As the smokers continued to pass around the water pipe, their eyes reddened, giggles ensued and discussion of new taco flavors began.

"They should make tacos with Doritos-flavored shells – meta-tacos," Cari said.

One of them, Susan, took notes about her experience. She noted that she "feels stoned, has the munchies, and loves Fleetwood Mac."

Because the introduction of Spice into the market, other products have cropped up that use Spice's marketing scheme to attract customers looking for a legal or easier-to-purchase weed alternative.

"It's a little bit different than a normal high, but I'm not sure how to describe it," Susan said. "It feels like a more active high."

Since the synthetic cannabinoids are not listed as controlled substances, the blend remains legal in most states.

Kansas passed the first statewide law prohibiting the sale or possession of synthetic cannabinoids on March 10.

Kentucky and Alabama followed suit soon after. Other states considering banning the substance include Georgia, Missouri, and Tennessee. Sales remain legal throughout Florida.

"I switched [to Spice] because its legal and I need to get drug tested. I still prefer weed. I just can't smoke it right now," Will said.

UF to host Miami in super regionals

The Gators seem to know when to turn the switch on.

They entered NCAA Regionals with three meaningless losses in their last five games. But all that changed last weekend when they dominated their regional and outscored their opponents 32-5 in three games.

No. 4 Florida (45-15) will look to continue its postseason surge when it attempts to advance past No. 20 Miami (43-18) in the NCAA Super Regional which begins Friday at 7 p.m. in McKethan Stadium.

"Our sights are on playing for a while into the summer," coach Kevin O'Sullivan said.

If the Gators are to accomplish their coach's plans and make it to the College World Series for the sixth time in school history, they will need to sustain their performance from the regional to top the Hurricanes.

Whether it be defense, pitching or hitting – Florida excelled.

In the three games, it continued its defensive success from the regular season and committed zero errors.

UF is strongest up the middle, with shortstop Nolan Fontana (.989 fielding percentage), second baseman Josh Adams (.984) and center fielder Matt den Dekker (.984).

O'Sullivan said this is one of the areas the Gators have improved in the most since last season, when shortstop Mike Mooney committed 18 errors and sported just a .930 fielding percentage.

The UF pitching staff has benefited from the improved defense all season, but it helped itself this weekend.

The starting pitchers pounded the strike zone. Seventy-four percent of their pitches went for strikes as they allowed just five runs in 19.1 innings of work while striking out 22 batters in the Gainesville Regional.

Gators look to add speed in 2011

Although the 2007 recruiting class consisted of just two players, it still managed to become the most successful class in Florida softball history.

Over the course of their careers, Corrie Brooks and Francesca Enea either tied or set school records for a four-year period with 233 wins, two Southeastern Conference regular-season championships, two SEC Tournament championships, four NCAA Super Regional appearances and three trips to Oklahoma City for the Women's College World Series.

But through all that success, they never accomplished the ultimate goal of a national championship – a feat those who are returning will be hungry to achieve come 2011.

The 15 players returning to UF next season will be aided by the arrival of five highly touted recruits, who will be beginning a transformation coach Tim Walton hopes to put his team

through over the next few years.

"The goal is in the next couple recruiting cycles to get more athletic," Walton said. "I'm not putting any blame on anybody but we hit 109 home runs and we're not beating out very many infield singles, so we've got to do some things a little bit differently."

Walton clearly did a lot of his recruiting with that objective in mind, as each of the four position players who will be joining the team in 2011 has proven to be a threat on the basepaths.

The graduation of Enea and Brooks will also be addition by subtraction in that regard, as the pair combined for just seven stolen bases on nine attempts last season.

But that is not to say the seniors won't be missed, as Brooks' defensive prowess and Enea's power will be difficult to replace.

"Those two did just a phenomenal job buying into what we were talking about in the early

Taylor wins solo title

Christian Taylor just keeps winning and this time he took his act out west.

Taylor, the Southeastern Conference Field Athlete of the Year, won a NCAA Championship in the men's triple jump with a 2010 American-leading leap of 17.09 meters at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, Ore.

"Getting the outdoor title means a lot to me," Taylor said. "Helping the team and trying to win that team title would really be special."

Freshman Omar Craddock placed sixth overall in the triple jump to earn All-America honors and score vital points for the men's team.

Florida scored 13 points on the opening day to put itself in prime

position to accomplish its goal of "Finishing the Mission."

The UF men's 4x100-meter relay team, the defending NCAA Champions, clocked the fastest time in the prelims at 38.94, advancing to the finals.

The 4x100-meter final consists of eight teams, five of which are from the SEC. Florida's biggest competition in capturing the

men's overall NCAA Championships, Texas A&M, also qualified for the 4x100-meter final.

Sprinter Jeff Demps, who anchored the top 4x100 relay team with a blazing time, advanced

"The one thing this club does better than a lot of teams we've faced is they pitch in very well," said FAU coach John McCormack, who lost to UF on Sunday.

But it wasn't like the Florida arms didn't have a lead to pitch with.

The Gators received production from up and down the lineup in the regional. They crushed nine home runs and posted a .385 average during the weekend.

"I think that's the most encouraging thing going into (super regionals) - we are doing all three phases of the game as well as we have done them all year long," O'Sullivan said.

going," Walton said. "It's sad for them to be leaving us, but I'm very happy with their effort."

For the first time since Feb. 9, 2008, the Gators will have someone other than Brooks manning third base, and the primary candidates at this point look to be rising junior Lauren Heil and incoming freshman Kasey Fagan.

"Lauren obviously has been working in our program for two years so she'll get a chance to earn (the job), but Fagan coming in from Dunnellon High School is a pretty talented kid, so we'll see how it goes," Walton said.

The other primary challenge will be replacing the powerful bat of Enea, who established the SEC career record for home runs with 61 and the UF career record for RBIs with 221 during her time as a Gator.

At this point, the plan seems to be to slide the versatile Brittany Schutte, who set the UF freshman records for home runs (19) and RBIs (59) this season, from designated player out to Enea's spot in left field.

"It's going to be interesting to see what we can do with Schutte," Walton said. "I really like what she can do at a lot of positions, but I think ideally she'd be in left field."

Schutte's move to the outfield would free up the designated player position for freshman Kelsey

Horton, a backup catcher who slugged a team-leading .881 in limited playing time this season.

Another new face in the Gators' starting lineup for 2011 could be incoming freshman Cheyenne Coyle, a shortstop and 2010 USA Softball Junior Women's National Team camp invite who hit at a .526 clip

and had a fielding percentage of .995 while playing at Chatsworth High School in West Hills, Calif.

It is clear that incumbent shortstop Brittany Walker, like every other player on this season's roster, will have to fight for her job come next season.

20 things to know before watching the World Cup

THE AZZURRI – The defending champion Italians enter the tournament older than an adult YMCA basketball team. While Italy can never be written off, will the hunger still be there on a team that looks identical to the one that won in 2006?

BAFANA BAFANA – South Africa has the opportunity to host the world's greatest tournament, it doesn't have much else going for it. Bafana Bafana, or "the Boys the Boys," are ranked dead last in the field of 32 teams and could become the first host nation ever not to advance past the group stage.

THE FAVORITES – Brazil, Spain, Portugal, Netherlands, Italy, Germany, Argentina and England. These eight, in order of FIFA rankings, all have a legitimate chance of winning.


R-STARS – Ronaldo (Portugal), Rooney (England), Ribery (France) and Robben (Dutch) are other stars to watch. The R-stars
