



# Skimmer victims turn to banks for advice

■ WOMAN USED CREDIT CARD AT GAS STATION WHERE SKIMMERS WERE DISCOVERED.

Liz woke up one morning to a voicemail on her phone. The call was from her bank, USAA, notifying her that her account had suspicious charges on it and was flagged for fraud. She checked her statements and discovered two fraudulent purchases, each for more than \$100 at a gas station in Tampa. But Liz hadn't been in Tampa. She was asleep in her Gainesville residence when the

charges were made. Liz, who requested her last name not be used, is just one of the unknown number of Gainesville residents who had their credit card information saved onto a gas-pump skimmer and downloaded via Bluetooth by identity bandits. The 25-year-old said she frequently bought gas from the Kangaroo station at 3424 SW Wiliston Road, where two skimmers were found on the weekend of July 24. Before the charges appeared, the last purchase made with her card was gas from that station, she said. She responded by calling the bank and discussing the problem with USAA's fraud department. After about a week, she was able to

# 2,900 grads to walk

More than 165,000 credit hours. That's about how many credits were taken by the undergraduate students expected to attend their graduations Saturday. The recommended study time for that many credits would be 7.5 million hours, or 860 years, according to Martin Simpson, director of the Reading and Writing Center. About 1,400 undergraduate students plan to attend the graduation ceremony Saturday, according to Donna Stricker, director of the commencement. She said she's unsure

how many students will receive their degrees without attending the ceremony. The number of students expected to attend the graduation was determined by the number of students who ordered caps and gowns. The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences has the most students graduating, "by far," Stricker said. The college expects about 268 graduates. In addition to the undergraduates, there will be more than 1,500 graduate and professional students graduating Saturday. Some professional schools, SEE GRAD, PAGE 5

# Laid-off professor officially reinstated

UF educational psychology assistant professor David Therriault was officially reinstated to his position Monday after he received a layoff notice in July 2009. In a hearing held June 28 at Emerson Alumni Hall, arbitrator Tom Young decided Therriault was unjustly laid off because university administration did not attempt to find him an alternative position within the department of educational psychology or the College of Education and deemed him ineligible to apply for tenure. Both are violations of the Collective Bargaining Agreement. "The university is supposed to make an active effort to find him another position, but instead they chose to ignore this part of the agreement," said Candi Churchill, service unit director at the United Faculty of Florida. United Faculty of Florida, an organization that represents

graduate employees and faculty throughout Florida universities, spoke on behalf of Therriault at the hearing. "There's no good way to make the cuts that we made, and unfortunately there were some decisions to make layoffs." **Janine Sikes**

The university cited adverse financial circumstances as the reason he was laid off. Between 2008 and 2009, \$100 million was cut from UF's budget, said UF spokeswoman Janine Sikes. "There are thousands and thousands of faculty on this campus and the university was facing a severe budget deficit," she said. "There's no good way to make the cuts that we made, and unfortunately there were some decisions

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# Meals, phone bills spared

■ SG SPENDS \$16,000 FOR OFFICIALS' PHONE BILLS, MEAL CARDS ANNUALLY.

Senators voted against a bill that would limit funds given to Student Government officials for meals and cell phone bills during Tuesday's meeting.

Members of the Student Alliance party authored the Student Government Fiscal Responsibility Act, that would have, if passed, put a cap on the money given to SG officials for cell phone usage and meal cards.

According to the bill, the Student Body president, vice president and treasurer each receive between \$1,200 and \$1,500 a year for cell phone usage and up to \$3,000 for meal cards. All of this money comes from the SG budget.

This money, combined with money given to other SG officials, costs SG more than \$16,000 per year. This number excludes salaries and travel costs, according to the bill.

In the bill, the Student Alliance party proposed giving the officials only \$65 a month for their cell phone bills, and \$500 a year toward their meal cards, which can be used at

any Gator Dining location.

Jonathan Ossip, Senate leader for the Student Alliance party, said he doesn't want to see their compensations cut completely, nor is he against them receiving a salary, but he doesn't think so much money for SG officials should be taken from the Student Body when the funds could be used for something else.

Putting a cap on these reimbursements is an obvious solution, Ossip said.

"This could be going back to regular students, and that's what this bill is trying to do," he said.

Ben Meyers, who represents the Unite Party, said the money is given to these officials because they cannot have a part-time job while serving in SG.

He said these members of SG spend most of their time in the Reitz Union, so they typically eat there, and they spend a lot of time on the phone working with people such as the SG lobbyists in Tallahassee.

"These so-called perks are necessary to help them do their jobs," Meyers said. "We're lucky that we still even have leaders that are willing to serve."

# UF employee, student arrested for auto theft

A UF employee and an electrical engineering student were arrested Wednesday for grand theft auto after they admitted to stealing two scooters.

At about 4 p.m., Gainesville Police officers spotted UF student Jared Wolffis, 24, and Bryan Urban, 22, suspiciously driving a truck around various apartment complexes off of Southwest 20th Avenue, according to the arrest reports.

When the officers followed the truck into Canopy Apartments, the pair stopped suddenly and made a U-turn in the parking lot, the report stated.

Police followed their truck until the officers pulled them over in Rockwood Villas Apartments, the report stated.

As police approached, Wolffis, who

was in the passenger seat, got out of the truck and ran away, despite officers' demands to stop, the report stated.

After being read his rights, Urban admitted to stealing the scooter in the bed of the truck from Canopy Apartments, the report stated.

A police dog, Justice, was brought to search for the student in the area around the apartment complex. Within minutes, Justice found Wolffis and bit him, according to a GPD statement.

The pair were also connected to the theft of another scooter from near 200 SE Second Ave., the report stated.

Wolffis is charged with grand theft auto, resisting arrest without violence, and loitering and prowling. Urban is charged with grand theft auto and loitering and prowling, the report stated.

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# FSU alumni bring version of ZipCarts to Gainesville

## Carts are electrically run, paid for by advertising

Most taxis charge their customers, but there will soon be five new electric carts roaming the streets of downtown Gainesville looking to give people a free ride.

Next week, the first three electric carts will be arriving from the Gotcha Media Group, an Atlanta-based company started by two Florida State University alumni.

The carts should be in service in just a couple weeks, according to company co-founder Drew Sfugaras.

The carts seat five passengers, besides the employed driver who works for tips,

and are 100 percent electrically run, Sfugaras said.

The carts, specially designed with college students in mind, will be fitted with CD, DVD and MP3 players, as well as flat-screen TVs, he said.

"If the Jetsons' car had wheels, that's kinda what they look like," he said. "We want them to be fun."

The drivers will also act as concierges, offering up-to-date information on local events and hot spots, he said.

The carts can run two to three hours on one charge, and use a rapid-charge system that fully energizes the battery in 30 minutes.

The company is currently discussing

with UF the best places to set up charging stations, Sfugaras said.

The carts can be hailed like paying taxis, or called in through a dispatch number. They will run from 7:30 a.m. until noon, he said.

They will then start back up sometime in the evening and run until 3 a.m., so they will be available for students who have been out drinking, he said.

"The goal is that everyone gets home safely and we get everyone who needs a ride," he said.

Gotcha, which stands for Green Operated Transit Carrying Humanity Around, can afford offering free rides because the

carts will be "wrapped in advertisements," he said.

The idea for the company came from trying to solve the pan-collegiate problem of difficult student parking while also giving advertisers the chance to make an impression on college students, Sfugaras said.

"It's really the best way to get in front of these people," he said. "We love the model of providing a free service to students while marketing."

Other late-night transportation will still be available for students. ZipCarts, a nightly shuttle service, and a formerly free ride, now charges \$3 per person and will compete with Gotcha taxis.

Student Government also offers Student Nighttime Auxiliary Patrol, the free campus transportation service, until 3 a.m.

recover her money.

Bob Page, Alachua County president for Alarion Bank, said that under Federal Regulation E, consumers who have been victimized only need to pay up to \$50. Of course, that depends on whether or not the bank deems the claim legitimate.

The skimmers haven't just been affecting consumers, but local businesses as well.

Patrick Daniel, co-owner of Go Video, a small video rental shop located inside the Chevron at 5221 NW 43rd St., said that he has been losing business because people are refusing to leave their credit card information with him.

Go Video rents videos to customers by the day. To charge its customers, Go Video must

keep credit card information on file in order to prevent people from absconding with its movies.

To accommodate worried customers, Daniel has had to take cash deposits on his rentals.

"I couldn't explain to them that the skimmers, they get you at the pumps," he said.

Daniel also said that he has noticed a major increase in people who walk inside to pay.

Though she does not buy gas at the Chevron where Go Video is located, Liz is included in the multitude of people who now pay inside with cash.

"I've gotten yelled at [by my husband Dustin] for not paying inside," she said. "If I just swipe at the gas pump, I get talked to."

like the Levin College of Law, won't have a ceremony. About 15 students are expected to get their law degrees, but they won't walk until spring, Stricker said.

to make layoffs."

Therriault, however, had an almost \$1 million external grant from the National Science Foundation.

Furthermore, a briefing filed by Churchill reads that the College of Education continued to hire tenure-track faculty and post open positions after Therriault was laid off.

"From my position, if this is a budgetary issue, the university should have a hiring freeze," Churchill said.

Therriault continued working during the past year.

"My responsibility is to my students and to my research and I take those things pretty seriously," he said. "I am very happy with the results and to be able to get back to work and not be distracted by all this."

He plans to apply for tenure, and the university has already stated it will comply.

**Competition should extend to other services as well**

In Tuesday's Alligator, the Editorial Board took a strong stance in favor of adding more Gainesville utility providers, finally bringing the free market to our power and water and working to stop the city-controlled socialists at GRU. Frankly, I couldn't agree more.

At its base, nerdcore is about having fun, and the shows reflect that, Tobias said.

An Aug. 14 show will feature HDNinja, Magi-Tek and Emergency Pizza Party.

Krondor Krew, a group in which all the band members dress up like ninjas, and Epic-1 will perform Sep. 18.

Both shows will be at The Laboratory and will offer a friendly introduction to nerdcore, Tobias said.

## Hot Water Music frontman struggles to find balance

He steps up to the microphone – eyes shut, sweat streaming down his face and guitar – as the raspy sound of his voice cuts through the twangy, bluegrass sound of his band.

His thick, brownish-red beard almost touches the microphone as he sings and bangs out chords on his worn acoustic guitar, the pickguard long gone.

He may not look like it, but even

now, as he entertains screams of “Chuck yeah!” from the audience between sets while casting a serene look on the crowd – the kind you give your family after you’ve just finished Thanksgiving dinner – Chuck Ragan is fighting for balance.

That’s because he’s headed out on the road again, a road that offered him thousands of screaming fans when he started as the frontman for punk band Hot Water Music. It was also a road that he hated coming back from – back to the reality of eviction notices

tacked to the doors of empty houses that he used to call home.

Back to hauling his belongings from trash cans in the front yards of those houses. Back to donating blood to make rent payments.

That was the life Ragan had called normal until 2006, when the band went on an indefinite hiatus to deal with the exhaustion, relationships and personal lives of its members after a run of touring between 1997 and 2005.

“You can only run a machine for so

long before it needs maintenance,” he said.

Since then, aside from some touring and writing music independently, Ragan said he has been focusing on life in Gainesville.

He said he’s been spending time with his wife, fishing with friends on Orange Lake and around Shell Mound near Cedar Key and bringing back the fish to throw on the grill and sit in his lawn chair.

“You have to find a balance between doing what you love, making a living and

running yourself into the dirt,” he said. Since the band reunited and revamped itself in 2008, Ragan said he’s gotten better about that balance between music and the rest of his life. He said he realized that last week when he was sitting on his porch in Gainesville, writing songs with the rest of the band, just like before his rigorous and costly tour schedule.

But, he said, some things still haven’t changed.

## Brantley begins new chapter

A new era is about to begin.

Former Gators quarterback Tim Tebow, who is in Denver participating in practices as a member of the Denver Broncos, is gone.

In steps redshirt junior John Brantley – Florida's new signal caller.

"Well, you can't replace (Tebow)," senior safety Ahmad Black said. "You only hope to keep up the tradition, and keep up what he's done."

But as UF begins its training camp today, Brantley will look to create his own legacy.

The Ocala native is more of a pocket passer than Tebow was, but will provide less with his legs.

Last season, Brantley threw for 410 yards and seven touchdowns to go along with zero interceptions in seven games, mostly in mop-up duty for Tebow.

"We're not going to run our quarterback as much," center Mike Pouncey said. "He's not as big as Superman was."

However, UF coach Urban Meyer does not expect that dynamic to change the offensive scheme very much if there are other weapons that can spread the field.

"(Our offensive scheme) is not going to be dictated as much by the quarterback," Meyer said. "I know what he can do. It's the people around him."

Even though the two primary offensive targets from last season, wide receiver Riley Cooper and tight end Aaron Hernandez, are now in the NFL – the Gators expect even more playmakers to step up this year.

Wide receiver Deonte Thompson, who struggled at times and accumulated just 343 yards through the air last season, is expected to be the deep threat and the leader of this year's receiving core.

But the players that could end up benefitting the most from Meyer's de-

cision to stick with the spread offense are speedy wide receivers Andre Debose and Chris Rainey, who made the move to the position from running back in the offseason.

Debose, who Pouncey said would be the offensive player to emerge this year, came into UF last season as the No. 2 wide receiver recruit, according to Rivals.com. But he never had the chance to play because of a hamstring injury. Debose has received comparisons to Percy Harvin and could play the same role in this offense.

Other potential passing targets

for Brantley are redshirt senior Carl Moore and redshirt sophomore Omarius Hines.

Brantley will be able to spread the ball around. But the biggest benefit he may have is the experience he has gained from watching Tebow handle the position for the last three seasons.

"John Brantley, he's had a great run at Florida," Pouncey said. "He's been there three years, learning from one of the best quarterbacks that played the game. He's ready to lead this team to a championship."

## Gators fans should leave lofty expectations at the door

The Gators open up their preseason training camp today, and that can only mean one thing around these parts: UF fans already have their eyes on a trip to Glendale, Ariz., in January.

But before they get their hopes up too much, I think now would be the best time to warn fans to curb their expectations for this year's football team, because there are sure to be a few bumps in the road.

Now, I know many of you have been spoiled the last four years, with two Southeastern Conference titles, two BCS titles and a Heisman-winning quarterback who just so happened to be one of the greatest – if not the greatest – college football players of all time.

But that was the past. Tim Tebow is gone, as are his two favorite receiving targets from last season in Riley Cooper and Aaron Hernandez.

Add in the losses of Joe Haden, who was arguably the best shutdown cornerback in the nation, linebackers Brandon Spikes and Ryan Stamper, safety Major Wright and defensive ends Carlos Dunlap and Jermaine Cunningham, and it adds up to a lot of voids to fill from a team that went 13-1 and didn't even win its conference championship.

Those losses leave many questions surrounding this team – questions that fans won't find out the answer to until at least Sept. 11 against South Florida in the Gators' only real test before they begin their SEC schedule.

The biggest questions remain on offense, where John Brantley will take over for Tebow. Brantley has been highly touted coming into the season, and by all accounts, he has the tools to be a great player by the time he leaves UF. But he has yet to prove anything as a starter.

More uncertainty revolves around the pieces surrounding Brantley on offense. Who will emerge as the team's go-to receivers?

"We have a lot of talent," coach Urban Meyer said at SEC Media Days last month. "I can't list you the top six or seven playmakers in order. I know we have them."

Meyer can't list them in order because it's clearly an unknown commodity. The potential is there for Brantley and the playmakers, but it's just a matter of turning that potential into production during games.

The Gators also bring in the No. 2 recruiting class, according to Rivals.com, and some of those freshmen are sure to have positive impacts this season. But they won't all pan out immediately – if at all.

So before you go booking a trip to Glendale in January, Gators fans, take off the orange-and-blue-tinted shades and look at this team for what it really is – talented, but unproven.

# No. 1 Alabama: Crimson Tide look to defend title

■ **THEY LOSE 11 STARTERS COMBINED ON OFFENSE AND DEFENSE.**

Alabama finished last season atop the college football world, and that's exactly where it begins this season, coming in as the unanimous No. 1 in the alligatorSports' preseason college football poll.

But coach Nick Saban, who has won national championships at both LSU and Alabama, knows that was last season and in order to get back to the top this year, his team will have to stay hungry and stay focused. And that will be no easy feat.

"You really can't look in the rearview mirror and be able to accomplish these things," Saban said at Southeastern Conference Media Days last month. "You have to look forward and stay focused on the present moment in terms of what it takes to be successful."

As if repeating as national champions in college football isn't difficult enough – Nebraska was the last school to win back-to-back titles in 1994 and 1995 (both Associated Press titles) – Alabama will have to replace a lot of components of last year's title-winning team. The Tide lose 11 starters combined on offense and defense, plus their kicker and punter.

Of the losses, Alabama's defense takes the biggest hit, losing eight of 11 starters from last year. Out of those eight defensive

players, six were drafted in April's NFL Draft, including linebacker Rolando McClain (105 total tackles, four sacks, two interceptions), cornerbacks Kareem Jackson (49 tackles, 13 passes broken up) and Javier Arenas (71 tackles, five interceptions, five sacks), and behemoth defensive tackle/

gap-plugger Terrence Cody (28 tackles, six tackles for a loss).

Despite those losses, Alabama does return a starter at each level of the defense. In the secondary, defensive back Mark Barron returns to lead the defense. He led the team with seven interceptions – including

one for a touchdown – and was second in tackles with 76.

At linebacker, Dont'a Hightower returns after an injury that kept him out of all but four games in 2009. Saban has said Hightower could move around on defense and play multiple roles.

On the line, Alabama returns BCS title game MVP Marcell Dareus, who led the team with six and a half sacks last year. However, his status is up in the air, as he is the subject of an ongoing NCAA investigation.

While the defense is going through quite a makeover, the offense should look familiar. The Tide return eight starters, including running back Mark Ingram, who rushed for 1,658 yards and 17 touchdowns en route to becoming the first player in school history to win the Heisman.

Joining Ingram in the backfield is Trent Richardson, who rushed for 751 yards and eight scores as a freshman behind Ingram. The two will combine to form arguably the best one-two punch in college football.

Quarterback Greg McElroy, who hasn't lost a game as a starter since the eighth grade and did an ample job of managing the offense in his first year as a starter for Alabama, also returns, as does his favorite target, wide receiver Julio Jones.

To make things even easier for those skill players on offense, three starters return on the offensive line, so the offense shouldn't lose a step. And if Saban can get the newcomers on defense to buy into his scheme, Alabama is a real threat to repeat as national champions.
