Compromise led to phased price increase

The cost of motorcycle and scooter decals will increase this fall because of a compromise made in 2008.

Rather than have a sharp increase in decal prices in the fall of 2008, UF administration and staff from Transportation and Parking Services spoke with some concerned students in a meeting that February and decided to raise the price over the span of a few years.

The cost of yearlong scooter decals will increase by \$48, bringing the total cost to \$144.

When students and faculty came to the table, they discussed a proposal to raise motorcycle and decal rates from \$36 per year to \$122 per year, the same as a yearlong student automobile at the time. Instead, the price of the decals was raised from \$36 to \$64.

“After reviewing the price and the rationale, the students and the administrators agreed that it was appropriate to increase the price to the same level as a student automobile decal, but not all in one jump,” said Scott Fox, director of Transportation and Parking Services.

Fox said meeting attendees decided to increase the decal prices in three stages until the price was the same as a student automobile

Police search for rapist

The Gainesville Police Department is calling on UF students to help them identify, catch and arrest a wanted man who robbed and raped a local woman Sunday.

Because the suspect and the victim are both of college age, and because the crime occurred so near the campus area, police have reason to believe students

are their best chance of bringing the suspect to justice, said GPD spokeswoman Tscharna Senn.

When the victim opened the door, the man threatened her with a knife and pushed her through the entrance.

Campus libraries stay open late for finals week

Keeping in line with popular demand, UF libraries will once again be offering extended hours during final exam season.

From April 17 to April 28, Library West and Marston Science Library will be open from 8 a.m. to 4 a.m. The Starbucks on the first floor of Library West will have the same hours as the library.

Barbara Hood, public information officer for the UF libraries, said UF has been implementing the change during fall and spring final exams for the past few years. Although it is still technically a pilot project, she does not anticipate it changing in the near future.

“As long as students keep coming [to]

those extended hours, the hours will continue,” Hood said.

Library associate Chris McHale estimated that thousands of students are in the library each day during finals, and he does not anticipate a decrease in numbers.

A recent policy change now allows students to reserve Library West study rooms days in advance.

McHale said students have been able to book study rooms up to two weeks in advance since late March. The rooms were previously lent to students on a first-come, first-served basis.

Around 6 a.m. Wednesday, the burglars came back.

The only thing stolen was the Lortab bottle filled with beans.

Investigators believe the burglar cut him or herself during the break-in because they found a trail of blood leading away from the building.



Embattled dogsitter now trying to make ends meet

■ HIS BUSINESS WAS SHUT DOWN IN FEBRUARY.

As Bruce Baber walks four dogs down University Avenue, he listens to "This American Life" and tries not to think about his own.

He walks with the dog leashes in one hand and a red "Save Bruce" lawn sign in the other. The logo is also printed on his white shirt, a remnant of a neighborhood movement to save Baber's dog-sitting business.

Since the Gainesville City Commission ruled in February that he was not allowed to run his dog-sitting business from his home, he's been trying to make ends meet by walking the dogs he used to watch all day.

He gets \$5 per dog for an hour-and-a-half walk, which he does a few times a day. However, it doesn't meet his day-to-day needs.

"There's not a lot of dogs to be walked," he said.

He made \$12 per dog, per day when he cared for them at his house. He made a very small profit back then. Now, he can't break even.

"The dipping into the savings is kind of scary," said Baber, 64. "I was planning on having that cushion."

His life changed that February. No more dogs to care for. No more smiling faces charging at him when he opened the door. No more guard dogs to protect him from strangers and loneliness.

"It was extremely much too quiet and lonely at night," he said.

But he said it's getting better.

Now, he gets into his Mazda 5 minivan and drives house-to-house through neighborhoods collecting his customers' dogs. He goes downtown with his canine companions panting out of every window to unload them for their walk.

Sometimes, he'll lead them to a dog park where they'll sprint and dig and play to their hearts' content.

"The dogs are getting a far less quality experience because they could've played with each other all day," Baber said.

When he walks them, they line

up side by side like sled dogs. They look back at him every so often with wide eyes and panting mouths as if to check that he's still there. They look like they're smiling.

He's always been introverted and doesn't like talking with people much, he said as Sadie, a fluffy goldenoodle, leaned her head on his leg.

"I just love dogs in general," he said. "I just have a rapport with them."

While they run around at a dog park on Main Street, a black dog, Abbey, stops and looks at Baber. He waves to her.

He said she's his favorite right now, but, then again, she belongs to him. Baber adopted Abbey last week after being her foster father for four months.

She keeps him company at home and on his 15-mile weekend walks when he clears his mind of the stress that plagues him on a daily basis.

"Any anxiety I might have," he said, "I get to walk off."

He likes most of his neighbors,

but there is one family he tries not to think about. Getting angry won't solve anything.

The Gainesville Board of Adjustments initially approved his request for an exception to city code so he could keep his dog-sitting business.

Then, the neighborhood family — the Bowes — complained that the dogs were too loud.

They won, and Baber was out of business.

"I'm past the point of being angry," Baber said. "I still have some resentment ... I try not to think about that now."

Tuesday, he heard the best news he's heard in a while. The Gainesville Community Development Committee is considering changing a city code to allow pet businesses. There would be restrictions on how many animals could be kept at once and the types of animals that could be kept for pay.

"It's never going to be a real business situation," Baber said. "It will be a making-ends-meet situation."

But it would give him back the business he started in 1987, which he's said is his life.

He said he's optimistic that the commission will change the code.

Commissioner Thomas Hawkins, who is chairman of the committee, said it would take at least six months. It could take longer.

He said he supports the code changes Baber's attorney suggested, but some members of the committee aren't behind the changes just yet.

At the last meeting in March, the committee decided to ask for some changes before they look at the proposal later this month.

Unlike with the February appeal, Hawkins said the Bowe family's complaints probably will not be taken into account since they haven't come to any of the the committee meetings.

The Bowe family could not be reached for comment.

Besides, Hawkins said, the rest of the neighborhood seems to believe that Baber is a neighborhood gem, not a nuisance.

Baber said after everything he's been through, he's happy things might take an upward turn.

"It's been a real roller-coaster ride," he said.

Skater views life through a lens

■ HE TOOK UP PHOTOGRAPHY IN HIGH SCHOOL.

To simply take a walk with Sean Rozycki is impossible. Instead of going for a casual stroll, you're more likely to take a series of disjointed strides punctured with many starts and stops.

That's because every half city block or so, he'll crouch unannounced or freeze and twist his body to get that perfect shot that most people would pass by, unnoticed.

"You'll never find someone more passionate about photography," he said.

Locals may know the 24-year-old as the pierced and tattooed metalhead behind the bar of Mars Pub and Laser Tag. If they don't recognize him from that, they may know him as the organizer of the Silver Q pool league.

It's likely they've also noticed him with his Nikon D90.

His love for photography goes back to childhood. His mother was a shutterbug and being around her planted the seeds for a budding interest in everything to do with cameras.

Growing up in Stuart, Fla., Rozycki attended Martin County High School, which offered an intensive photography program.

He signed right up.

But that first semester, he was more interested in working on his skateboarding technique, for which he was starting to gain some real recognition around town — until his teacher took him aside and said he had a talent that shouldn't be wasted.

After that, he said he got 100s on every assignment.

"I slowly realized my style and passion," he said.

He graduated and moved to Gainesville in 2006, trying to escape the heartbreak of a marriage engagement broken by infidelity. Photography took a backseat to skating and living life.

He almost got a sponsorship and went pro, but a lack of resources sent

that opportunity south. After a series of bad luck and tough times, he fell into a depression and started drinking — a lot.

He floated through life without direction until, fed up with his situation, he focused on quitting his bad habits and saved money to buy a Nikon D40.

Behind the lens, he remembered why he loved photography in the first place.

These days, Rozycki can be found walking the streets of downtown, camera in hand, collecting shots, which can be seen at seanrozycki.blogspot.com, and working toward his goal of becoming a photo novelist.

"People pass by everyday things and don't appreciate them and I'm not yelling at them for it," he said, "I'm photographing it so they have a chance to see it."

Program helps turn pages for migrant families

For most UF students, a typical Friday evening offers a golden opportunity to unwind from the wear and tear of the week.

For Jennie Costa, the start of a weekend means driving 20 miles to Alachua, reading English to Spanish-speakers and playing soccer with Mexican children.

And she wouldn't have it any other way.

The UF health science sophomore volunteers for Proyecto Libros de Familia, or Project Family Books, a program funded by the Office of Migrant Education. The program helps migrant families succeed and adjust to frequent moves by providing tutors for their children and placing volunteers with families to work with every week.

Costa and two friends have been volunteering every Friday since October, she said, except for holidays. She said they are lucky to have been placed with their

family because they've formed a close bond.

Around Gainesville

"I love it," she said. "I look forward to it every week."

Once they arrive, they read with the kids for an hour. They'll read books she brings, such as "Oh! The Places You'll Go" and "The Giving Tree."

The parents moved to the United States from Mexico, and the mom cannot read English. The dad is working on pronunciation, she said, and the students have been tutoring the parents as well as the children.

Victoria Gomez de la Torre, a teacher specialist for Proyecto, which has been around for more than 30 years, said the children of migrants tend to fall behind academically due to their families' need to move frequently.

Although hesitant toward education at first, the children, de la Torre said, make radical changes. Some even consider going to college.

In the end, she said, they believe in themselves and see possibilities for their lives.

"When we can address their specific needs, it is then that we can start really making a difference," de la Torre said.

decal.
The second increase came in 2009, when yearlong decals went up to \$96. This year's increase is the third and final increase.

Ata Sarajedini, current chair of the Parking and Transportation Committee, said the committee, which is made up of students and faculty, occasionally goes out of its way to seek additional input if a special issue comes up.

He said people sometimes forget that the department doesn't get university funding, so it has to make its own revenue, and sometimes that means raising decal prices.

"It has to be self-sustaining," he said.

Fox said his department heavily encouraged students to use motor-

cycles and scooters years ago.

But after surveying drivers, he said about 80 percent used vehicles instead of buses. On top of that, about 80 percent of motorcycle and scooter drivers surveyed said they took six or more trips a day around campus because parking was so available.

"You compare that to what someone in a car does," he said. "They tend to drive on campus, find their spot and stay put all day long."

He said the rationale was that motorcycles and scooters were more environmentally friendly than cars, but since drivers took more trips, they actually burned more gas than students who drove cars.

Also, the department didn't want to encourage students to drive motorcycles and scooters instead of taking the bus.

He took her iPod, cellphone and some cash. He then ordered her to strip and forced her to have sex with him.

He left the house on foot.

The man is described as a college-aged black man about 5 feet 10 inches tall with a slim build with short, cropped hair.

He was last seen wearing a black T-shirt, denim jeans and M&M boxer shorts.

Anyone who believes they may have information about the crime or the suspect is asked to call Detective Lorraine Fair at 352-393-7610, or give an anonymous tip at 352-372-7867.

Gainesville Police have canvassed the victim's neighborhood as well as notified university authorities who have taken it upon themselves to distribute a flier among the Student Body describing the suspect and the crime.

Beyond the hope that students may help catch the rapist, police would like to remind students to be aware of their surroundings and the dangers of answering their doors for strangers.

"He appears to be a stranger which we don't see hardly in Gainesville ... parents have been calling from all over the place," Senn said.

"We want to make sure [students] are being very careful who they open their doors to and not to walk alone at night."



Abortion stance key to conservatism

"I am fiscally conservative but socially liberal." How many times am I going to have to hear that?

We are in an era of increasing awareness of the importance of fiscal responsibility, coupled with a moral decline that has led to personal responsibility being hardly an afterthought. So it is certainly no surprise that this has become a very sexy and chic political philosophy.

It essentially boils down to this: "I am for lower taxes and smarter spending and all that, but don't get me caught up in that abortion stuff."

The problem is that so-called social issues cannot be divorced from true conservatism. This philosophy, often called neoconservatism, results in little more than a speed bump in the path of the progressive movement toward its ultimate goals of statism and tyranny.

Conservatism, boiled down to its most basic form, promotes a stable government that allows equal opportunity and justice for all members of society while staying within its bounds. Any true conservative will thus be appalled about excessive taxation, deficit spending, intrusive agencies and overbearing regulation.

For the same reasons, any true conservative will also be appalled by abortion.

In 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion on demand. In so doing, the branch of our government charged with enforcing the justice of our laws executed the most farcical miscarriage of justice in the history of our nation. Millions of lives were on the line — lives that were protected under every system of law in the history of Western civilization. Abortion had been treated as first-degree murder in every courtroom and legislative body for countless generations, and a single vote in a court of law overturned centuries' worth of legal precedent.

While there was no legal precedent for abortion, there actually was precedent for the general ruling, which stated that unborn babies "are not persons" and therefore are not

subject to legal protection as human beings. Similar rulings were made in Nazi Germany, the USSR and elsewhere. Radical liberals never have a problem with stripping humanity away from a certain demographic of the population based on ethnicity, physical or mental handicap, religion or natal status in order to allow mistreatment or extermination on a

Why do conservatives feel the need to accept this tragedy? Because liberals were, as usual, given the opportunity to frame the argument.

The Supreme Court wrongfully decided that an arbitrary "right to choose" trumped the right to life, which was listed first among the unalienable rights in our own Declaration of Independence. Inconvenience was made a capital offense, the ultimate price for which has been paid by millions of voiceless Americans while those who have a voice are shamed to silence by those who gain from this genocide.

If our government has the power to change the definition of a human being, do we really think we can stop it from raising our taxes?

If real change is to be effected in Washington, a wholesale transformation must occur in how our elected officials perceive life — yours, mine and that of the unborn.

Taunting makes its way to Congress

Rellegated primarily to elementary school playgrounds, taunting, name-calling, and insult-lobbing have made their way into the houses of Congress, according to a study released by Stanford and Harvard professors.

Justin R. Grimmer of Stanford University and Gary King of Harvard University found that 27 percent of congressional press releases that their team analyzed consisted of "partisan taunts."

The study started by analyzing press releases from Sen. Frank R. Lautenberg, a Democrat from New Jersey who famously called Republicans "chicken hawks" in a floor speech in the Senate.

Paula Penariu Speaking Out

After also analyzing a State of the Union address from President Bush and a series of Reuters articles, the team took 64,033 press releases from 2005 to 2007 to estimate the presence of taunting.

From those releases, Grimmer and King found that 27 percent of releases are taunts, and that taunting increases when a senator faces less competition in his or her state.

King hopes to be able to determine whether Democrats or Republicans are responsible for the majority of political put-downs and whether taunts tend to be employed by particular congressmen over others.

"The whole point of democracy is to represent, and if they want to do so by taunting each other, they will keep doing just that," King said.

Florida pulls off monumental upset

There's a reason why Kitty Cullen didn't care about the last 15 seconds.

The No. 6 Gators were about to defeat No. 2 Northwestern 13-11, locking up the top seed in the American Lacrosse Conference Tournament in front of a season-high crowd of 1,518, and she was dead set on sprinting down to the south goal to celebrate with the goalie who made it possible.

As the final buzzer rang, Cullen was quickly joined by her teammates in a mass of screams, outstretched arms and flying lacrosse sticks.

"It's just indescribable. Last year we were down 14-0 at half and now we just beat them," said Cullen, who scored a game-high six goals. "It just shows how much we've matured in the last year."

The end result was a stark turnaround from the position the Gators (13-1, 4-0 ALC) were in against the Wildcats (12-1, 2-1 ALC) only 3:34 beforehand.

Down two players for the game's final minutes due to yellow cards, goalie Mikey Meagher had every right to crumble down the stretch. She was outgunned defensively, her team had once again been dominated draw control (17-9), and the Gators' back line was giving up free-position shot opportunities on nearly every NU possession.

"I feel like my team played fantastic, the defense as well," said Meagher, who had 10 saves on the night. "They never really put me in a bad position, and they held their own. Mistakes are going to happen, and then that's when I have to be there to clean them up."

With two saves in the last 30 seconds, including one off a free-position shot, the sophomore held Northwestern's offense, including NCAA points leader Shannon Smith, who scored her final goal with 6:37 left in the game.

That's when Cullen scored one of

her NCAA-best 67 goals to close the game for Florida.

With 5:35 left, Cullen beat a Wildcats defender outside the left 12-meter arc with a stop-and-go move. Her acceleration was so sudden it caught the

rest of the defense off guard. The lone Northwestern player left between Cullen and the goal slipped, leaving goalie Brianne LoManto out to dry against the

Adams living up to preseason promise after rough 2010

Senior leads team into series vs. Georgia

Prior to the start of the 2011 season, senior Josh Adams expressed relief and optimism about the opportunity for a fresh start.

Coming off a miserable junior campaign, UF's second baseman said, "It's a new year. New things can happen. I had a bad junior year, but I can't dwell on it. Now, I've got to move forward."

Thirty-four games into the season, No. 4 Florida's senior steward

has put his words into action.

After a career-worst junior campaign, which came on the heels of first-team All-Southeastern Conference accolades in his first two years at UF, Adams' pop has returned.

A year removed from barely eclipsing the Mendoza line (.206) in SEC play, the slick-fielding infielder leads the Gators in batting average (.362) and is second in multi-hit and multi-RBI games.

"It's what I envisioned after last year," Adams said. "I'm where I want to be."

UF coach Kevin O'Sullivan

praised Adams' efforts, saying, "I'm awfully proud of the way he has battled through that adversity and put together a really solid start this year."

The second baseman attributed his struggles in 2010 to mental gaffes but said he has been much more patient at the plate this season.

"Last year, I was swinging at a lot of balls outside the zone," Ad-

ams said. "This year, I'm sticking with my approach and taking it at-bat by at-bat."

O'Sullivan also said Adams' ability to punish pitchers for their mistakes has become noticeably better.

"When he gets his pitches, he's not missing them," O'Sullivan said. "Last year, I thought he missed a bunch of pitches he could hit. This year, he's doing the exact opposite."

Adams added that his improvement was a product of batting lower in the order — something that changed again last weekend.

When Florida (26-8, 9-3 SEC) takes on Georgia (18-16, 8-4 SEC) tonight at 7 in Athens, Adams will

be slotted in the two-hole, but the second baseman said his rebound this year is a result of getting better pitches to hit because of the players placed around him.

"I'm pretty much thanking them every day," Adams said. "It's definitely helped me out."

After batting Adams seventh or lower 22 times this season, O'Sullivan shuffled the lineup again last weekend at Mississippi State, sliding Adams back into his customary two-hole, where he began the season.

"I've just got to keep working at it and hopefully keep the numbers up," Adams said.

Moultrie providing unmatched versatility for Gators

While Aja Paculba, Kelsey Bruder and Megan Bush often receive national attention for their gaudy numbers, the group has one person to credit for its success: leadoff hitter Michelle Moultrie.

When she is not laying down textbook bunts or swiping bases, the dynamic junior is chasing down fly balls most players wouldn't have a chance at.

Despite her reserved personality, her value speaks for itself.

"I've been coaching softball for 13 years, and this is my second time to have a player of her importance to a team," UF coach Tim Walton said. "She might hit a home run. She might drop a bunt. You get too close, she might hit you."

Moultrie's versatility has been key to UF's success this season. She leads the team in batting average (.466), on-base percentage (.548) and stolen bases (19) and is tied with Bruder for the team lead in runs scored (48).

"I don't know what we'd do without her in center field," Paculba said. "She saves a lot of runs and a lot of extra-base hits."

Moultrie will need to set the tone tonight at 7 as No. 10 Florida (34-7, 10-6 Southeastern Conference) faces a tough road matchup against No. 24 Auburn (32-9, 11-6 SEC).

The Tigers may not have the Gators' offensive firepower, but they do have one of the best rotations in the country.

While UF's pitching staff carries an impressive 2.05 earned run average, Auburn's three-deep rotation holds an even better 1.85 mark.

After leaning on freshman Hannah Rogers for more than a month, the Gators could be getting a boost against the Tigers as senior Stephanie Brombacher looks to return from a bicep injury.

Walton said she could have pitched Wednesday against FIU if UF had jumped out to a bigger lead, but he didn't want to put her in a high-pressure situation.

"Yesterday she threw hard, and today she threw harder, so it was good to see that and get a positive message back from her," Walton said after Wednesday's 8-0 win. "Today was the first day she really wanted to get out there and pitch."

Joining the back-to-back NCAA indoor champion Florida men's team will be defending champion Texas A&M, which brings its No. 2 men's squad and No. 1 women's team for the Tom Jones Memorial Classic, beginning at noon Saturday.

"For them to come down here is big because we don't normally get to see them until championship time," senior Terrell Wilks said. "To have them come to our home track is going to be fun. It'll be a very competitive meet."

The Aggies swept the NCAA Outdoor Championships last season, taking home the men's and women's titles.

UF scored 40 points, finishing a distant third on the women's side, but the competition

between the men's teams was much closer.

The Aggies edged the Gators 55-54, handing UF its second consecutive second-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

"They're the reigning national champions, and we've got to dethrone them. So, keeping that in mind, we just put our best foot forward and run with it," junior Christian Taylor said. "There's definitely a revenge factor, especially when it's come down to just one or two points."

This weekend's meeting will mark the first time the two have met since the NCAA Indoor Championships in March, when Florida won the event with 52 points and Texas A&M placed second with 40.

However, as UF coach Mike Holloway has maintained throughout the year, the No. 1 men's team is focused on its own results and continually improving its marks.

"Anytime you put Florida and Texas A&M on the same track, there's going to be an adrenaline rush. But we're going to focus on Florida," Holloway said. "We would like to run well this weekend, but I'd like to run very well at the conference and national meets, where it counts."
