City to hold Friday festivals before UF games

Events will be held from 5:30 p.m. to 10 p.m.

Those in Gainesville for Gator games will now have something to do Friday nights aside from packing the cooler for the next day.

The United Way of North Central Florida will host downtown street festivals before each home football game as part of the United Downtown event series, said Debbie Mason, president and CEO of United Way of North Central Florida. The festivals will give the congregation of Gator fans a chance to have some family-friendly fun before the games, she said.

The city will close Southeast First Street between University Avenue and Southeast Second Place from 5:30 p.m. to 10 p.m. for the events.

City Commissioner Jeanna Mastrodicasa hopes the event

will raise awareness for United Way and give visitors a chance to see what Gainesville has to offer, she said.

It also gives the locals who usually stay in a good reason to go out.

"This brings more people downtown," she said. "And it will provide something positive for visitors to do."

Christian Moreno, 20, a student at UF, said people avoid downtown because it's too much effort to get there and park and then try to find entertainment.

"But if you can drag people out there," he said, "there's a lot of culture."

The events will feature local artists and live music and give people a chance to get involved with the United Way, Mason said. For people with kids, the event offers an alternative to the bar-type atmosphere often associated with home-game week-

ends. There will be face painting booths, bounce houses and other PG-rated things to do.

"It'll be a strolling festival with outdoor activities for families to enjoy," she said.

And for those who enjoy a drink to honor the football gods, a change in city ordinance will allow the sale of beer on the street during the events, Mastrodicasa said.

But those who envision a beer-soaked free-for-all will be sorely disappointed — the intent of the event is to remain family-friendly.

"This is not an outdoor party," Mason said. "This is an outdoor information and activities festival."

Taylor Nones, a freshman at UF, said it's hard for younger fans to feel like a part of The Gator Nation when so much focus is on drinking. "If [the festivals] nurture to families," she said, "maybe the games won't be so alcohol-oriented."

Changes coming to bus transit in fall

Gainesville's Regional Transit System has a few big changes en route for the fall semester.

New Later Gator buses, unlimited access passes for Santa Fe College students, new routes, extended services and bus frequency changes begin Aug. 15, when the Fall 2011 RTS bus service cranks up.

For those wanting to get downtown for late-night activities, two new Later Gator routes will be added to the growing lineup of public transit options. The new routes are Later Gator D and F.

RTS Marketing and Communications Supervisor Chip Skinner said the new routes are the result of numerous petitions by students living in distant apartment complexes who wanted a way downtown.

Route D will run every 30 minutes from the Rosa Parks Downtown Station to FloridaWorks at 4800 SW 13th Street. The service will be offered Thursday through Saturday from 8:45 p.m. until 2:30 a.m.

Route F will only be available

Saturday nights from 8:30 until about 2:30 a.m. Buses will travel from the Rosa Parks Downtown Station to Butler Plaza every 30 minutes.

Getting from campus to popular apartment complexes should be a little easier as well. Route 28 will travel from the Hub at UF to The Estates about every 22 minutes from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The Route 46 circulator will travel from the Reitz Union to Southeast 3rd Avenue every half hour from 8 a.m. until 5:45 p.m.

The new Later Gator routes will increase student transportation fees by 33 cents per credit hour, a necessity to pay for the new services, Skinner said.

"It's always a delicate balance between ridership numbers and fees generated," he said.

Sheriff selling pink underwear with Spanish print

PHOENIX (AP) — The Arizona sheriff famous for making prisoners wear pink underwear is introducing a Spanish-language version of the shorts he sells to the public.

Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio began issuing pink underwear to inmates more than 15 years ago to cut down on theft. He began selling them to the public after speaking about them on national television.

The versions that went on sale Monday are imprinted with "Vamos Jose!" The original shorts, also \$15, feature a sheriff's star and a "Go Joe" logo.

Renewed photographer speaks at Harn

Standing in front of a crowd that included the admiring eyes of some of his former students, Jerry Uelsmann said he does not have an agenda behind his photography.

"I let the viewer find the storyline they can make up," he said.

The 77-year-old former UF graduate art professor discussed his career and his photographs at a lecture Sunday afternoon at the Harn Museum of Art.

About 350 people attended the event, where Uelsmann discussed his early experimentation with photography and revealed some of his unseen work.

He also revealed work by Maggie Taylor, his wife and a digital image artist who scans and manipulates images on a computer.

Uelsmann contrasted his composite printing technique to Taylor's use of digital techniques in her images.

"People tend to want me to be anti-digital, but you can't even buy film anymore," Uelsmann said.

Former director of Appleton Museum Leonard Weinbaum was one of Uelsmann's former students attending the lecture.

"He was a big influence on me, and I was very privileged to be a student at that time," Weinbaum said. Uelsmann received \$2,000 for his lecture from funds set aside for Creative B, a summer program that combines many creative programs offered at UF.

Uelsmann's work is on display at the museum, with 89 images in an exhibit that will run until Sept. 11 and then continue on to the Peabody Essex Museum in Salem, Mass.

The museum will celebrate Uelsmann's exhibit Thursday with art activities and dances inspired by his photography.

Brazil boy seems to attract metal objects

SAO PAULO — An 11-year-old boy in Brazil's northeast-

ern city of Mossoro is drawing attention with his purportedly magnet-like qualities.

The Globo TV network has broadcast images of Paulo David Amorim demonstrating how forks, knives, scissors, cooking pans, cameras and other metal objects seem drawn to his body and remain stuck on his chest, stomach and back.

The boy's father tells Globo that he decided to test his son after learning of a boy in Croatia with a similar ability.

Junior Amorim says he was surprised to find "a fork and knife stuck to his body."

The youth says classmates call him "magnet boy."

Dr. Dix-Sept Rosado Sobrinho tells Globo it is the first time in his 30-year career that he has seen a case like this.

Vet department picks new chair

Rowan Milner spent his week adjusting to his new position as chairman of the Department of Small Animal Clinical Sciences.

Milner, 55, is replacing Colin Burrows, who retired after holding the position for 30 years. The appointment became effective July 1 and will last five years.

The department focuses on research about animal health and disease. Faculty also provide oversight for clinical services in

the UF Small Animal Hospital, which, according to its website, offers medical and surgical care for dogs, cats, birds and exotic pets.

UF **Academics** had a strong interest in research, and I'm looking forward to promoting that," Milner said.

The department, which is part of the College of Veterinary Medicine, is one of the largest in the college, Milner said. As chairman, he will oversee about 90 faculty members and be responsible

for faculty recruitment, mentoring and promotion.

He will also be responsible for budget management, leadership in research and veterinary and graduate student education.

Milner, a native of South Africa, began working at UF in 2001 as part of the internal medicine service team. In 2005, he became the chief of veterinary oncology services, a post he held until 2009. He has also held the position of associate chair for research and graduate studies and continues to teach classes within the college.

Number of buses to increase in the fall

Just like UF students, Santa Fe students will gain unlimited access to RTS buses. A new Florida law, which grants the college permission to charge a transportation fee of about \$3 per credit hour, allows Santa Fe students, faculty and staff to flash an ID card to gain access to all RTS routes, Skinner said. The fee is expected to generate more than \$1 million in the first year, he said.

The difference between transportation fees at Santa Fe and UF is there is more demand for transportation options at the latter institution.

New routes are also planned for the Santa Fe area. Route 62 will connect the Lexington Crossing apartments to the Oaks Mall hourly Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Hopping on Bus 23 will then take you to the Santa Fe campus.

Route 27, an east-side circulator, will service the downtown Santa Fe campus, as well as residents in east Gainesville — an area that has long seen a disparity in service with west Gainesville, said Mayor Craig Lowe.

Skinner said RTS plans to increase the number of buses from the current 105 to 112 in the fall.

Powerbombs, pageantry on display at wrestling show

As he strutted around the ring wearing a feathery purple cape and a cocky grin, Lucky Cannon briefly stopped and turned toward a screaming youngster who just wouldn't quit.

Leaning toward the boy, who was informing the 6-foot-5, 266-pound, long-haired villain he wasn't a fan, Cannon, who goes by Jon Emminger when he's not cracking chair shots off his opponents, decided he had had enough of the taunts.

Locking his eyes on the young fan, Cannon fired back with a "you SUCK," leaving the boy and surrounding fans in a humbled silence.

Any other time, this may have been grounds for a call to child services. But on Friday night, it was all part of the show.

Florida Championship Wrestling, which serves as a developmental program for industry superpower WWE, brought its "Summer Slamarama" tour to the Martin Luther King Jr. Multipurpose Center for an event linking sport, theater and plenty of fanfare.

For local wrestling fans, these shows have become their best chance to see the spectacle they love in person, as WWE has not visited the area since 2006.

"We're a small market," wrestling fan J.C. Currias said. "But these guys come here because they care about getting into the small markets, and it's really amazing."

Friday night was FCW's fourth show in Gainesville in the past year, and enthusiasts like Bobby Pitts do not understand why the support for FCW hasn't translated into more WWE shows.

"I can't see any reason," he said. "Gainesville is a famous city. I mean you know, national champions; what more do you need?"

Wrestling fans are a passionate bunch. Many were lined up two hours before the 8 p.m. bell time trying to be the first through the door for a pre-show meet-and-greet with such names as WWE star John Morrison and recent "Tough Enough" winner Andy Leavine.

Some fans even have in-ring ambitions of their own.

"[Pro wrestling is] the only thing I've ever wanted to do," Pitts said. "I'd like to be famous so I can come back to Gainesville. ... When I come here, it will be 'Mr. Primetime' Bobby Bennett."

When asked for further details, Pitts was very specific of what "Mr. Primetime" would look like.

"If I could look like any wrestler, [Morrison is] the one," he said. "You could grate cheese on his abs. It's ridiculous."

UF grad Shari Krull traveled from Tampa to see the show even though FCW does weekly TV tapings a short drive from her house.

"It's just amazing that you have the breeding ground for the WWE right in your backyard, and you don't even realize it," Krull said.

Some performers pull double duty, working both the hectic WWE schedule and the FCW slate.

Celeste Bonin, better known by fans

as "Kaitlyn," is on the roster for WWE's "Smackdown" brand in addition to serving as a host for Summer Slamarama. Her typical week begins with "Smackdown" tapings on Tuesday followed by appearances at non-televised live shows and then a flight home to Tampa, where FCW takes up any possible off days.

"You miss out on a lot of sleep and down time," Bonin said. "I could never explain how intense it is to someone until someone actually goes through it. It consumes your life. It's a lifestyle."

When not on the road, wrestlers fill time with long hours of in-ring practice and classes where wrestlers practice their verbal skills, which are crucial in advancing choreographed storylines.

Wrestlers who weren't included in Friday night's show were relegated to working as ushers, selling programs and setting up the ring. They spent whatever free time they had heckling those fortunate enough to perform.

Like its parent company, FCW markets itself as "sports entertainment" instead of

wrestling. Performers prefer to be referred to as "superstars" or "divas" in lieu of wrestlers.

For instance, the first thing that took place after an intermission was not a match, but a "Superstar Idol" contest in which a large bald man sang the Norwegian national anthem, and a 6-foot-10 Irish native won with his rendition of "Ice, Ice Baby."

Before the first body-slam of the night, there was a lengthy comedy routine where a "heel" — pro wrestling jargon for a bad guy — complained that one "babyface," the good guy, was trying to pull down his tights. At another point in the show, a heel stopped his match to inform the crowd via microphone he was the "King of Africa."

"Everybody has their opinions, but we are entertainment, and we come to entertain," Florida Heavyweight Champion Bo Rotundo said. "I guarantee you, if you come to an FCW show, you're going to get entertained."

However, just because it is entertainment and events are scripted doesn't mean there aren't harsh realities.

"It's not fake," said Titus O'Neill, who was in Friday's six-man tag-team main event. "It's predetermined. We know who's going to win or lose. But at the end of the day, guys really get hurt. Injuries really do happen. You do get kicked and you do get punched."

O'Neill, who in a previous life was UF defensive end and Student Body Vice President Thaddeus Bullard, needed a new line of work after his football career fizzled. It was when his friend and six-time world champion Dave Bautista showed him his WrestleMania check that he saw a potential future in "the business."

But for others such as Rotundo, whose real name is Taylor Rotunda, it's a family tradition. Wrestling fans might know his grandfather and father as the mustachioed, cowboy hat-wearing Blackjack Mulligan and the suspender-clad, unruly accountant Irwin R. Schyster, respectively. His two uncles wrestled, as does his older brother, better known as Husky Harris.

"You grow up around it, and you're so comfortable, and it's something you love," he said. "It's a lot of fun."

We want readers to know that we consider this a blemish on the face of journalism.



UF plans for first class of spring-summer students

■ THE MODEL IS FIRST OF ITS KIND.

A new UF enrollment model will be doing away with the summertime farewell, "See you in September."

The Innovation Academy, scheduled to begin spring 2013, is a pilot program in which students attend classes only during the spring and summer terms for the entirety of their col-

lege careers at UF.

The program's goal is to maximize the university's capacity during the spring and summer terms as well as to increase the use of underutilized resources while reducing crowds during the fall, UF spokesman Steve Orlando said.

All requirements for academic programs within the Innovation Academy will remain the same as the rest of the university.

Orlando said students who choose this track will receive the same quality of education as any other student who is regularly en-

rolled at UF.

"We're really breaking the ground with this because nobody has ever tried it before," he said.

Orlando said the two biggest advantages of the program are the ability to maximize the use of resources, such as building space, and to increase access to students.

There's no reason universities can't run at full capacity all year, Orlando said.

UF Provost Joe Glover said other institutions in Florida and outside the state have ex-

pressed interest in the program.

Innovation Academy students will be able to receive Bright Futures during summer terms, which is not available to current students.

Although the admissions department is still deciding on a number, Glover said he believes 500 to 800 freshmen and transfer students will be admitted in the first group.

Eventually, there will be a broad selection of majors available to Innovation Academy students. Glover said the list of majors should be complete by mid-August.

UF to get \$7.2M to put scientific data online

UF and Florida State University are putting aside their differences and teaming up to digitize the nation's biological data.

The National Science Foundation awarded a five-year, \$10-million grant to both schools for the project. The grant is part of the foundation's Advancing Digitization of Biological Collections program.

The two schools will coordinate 92 institutions in 45 states to make biological data available online.

According to UF officials, the data gathered could help government agencies and others make decisions related to biological issues such as biodiversity and climate change.

U.S. institutions hold about one billion physical specimens, said Larry Page, the project's lead principal investigator. Page estimated less than 10 percent of that information is available online.

Page said the grant will help increase the rate of digitization, which

is already occurring at institutions like the Florida Museum of Natural History. Many institutions only have pictures and records available on-site.

The National Science Foundation also awarded \$10 million per year for the next 10 years to the other institutions participating in the effort, Page said. These institutions include colleges, universities and museums not affiliated with schools.

The Florida Museum of Natural History staff put together the proposal at the end of 2010.

Four of the five principal investigators are at UF, and the other is at FSU. Page said UF will coordinate the overall activities of other institutions to keep the project running efficiently. Of the \$10 million grant to the two schools, UF will receive \$7.2 million.

Page said UF's principal investigators will form research teams based on how their information will be digitized. Researchers working with insects will digitize their information differently than plant researchers, for example.

Whether it's Steve Spurrier screaming at his quarterbacks or Urban Meyer fawning over Florida's punt coverage, nearly every college coach is remembered for the pet project they took on during their tenure.

For current UF coach Will Muschamp, it may very well be the secondary.

The 1994 Georgia grad played safety all four years with the Bulldogs.

Once Muschamp made his break into coaching, he continued to oversee the position he excelled at.

In 2008 at Texas, Muschamp took over as defensive coordinator and inherited a porous defense which allowed a school record 4,498 total yards — 3,306 of those in the air — just a year prior.

But despite starting two freshmen safeties, Muschamp's system paid instant dividends as the Longhorns led the Big 12 in defensive scoring and total defense.

In his first year with the Gators, Muschamp will face a similarly daunting task following major personnel losses to Florida's defensive backs this offseason.

UF commits on display at Nike's "The Opening"

For 150 of high school football's most elite athletes, last week was filled with copious amounts of free Nike swag, intense competition and tutelage from an array of NFL players.

"The Opening," an invitation-only showcase, stretched from July 5-9 at Nike World Headquarters in Beaverton, Ore., and gave high school football a national television spotlight.

Included in the field were three players who have orally committed to UF: Boynton Beach High offensive tackle Jessamen Dunker, Citra North Marion High wide receiver Latroy Pittman and Stephenson High (Ga.) running back Mike Davis.

"It felt great [to be invited]," Dunk-

er said. "It was an honor, definitely. It was a great experience to help me find out what I need to work on and everything."

For the athletes, their time in Beaverton began with the Nike SPARQ (speed, power, agility, reaction, quickness) Rating National Championship.

The event used the combination of scores in the vertical leap, agility shuttle, powerball toss and 40-yard dash to name a top athlete. The title went to Geismar, La., safety Landon Collins, who also went on to win MVP of the event's 7-on-7 tournament and holds offers from Alabama, Florida and LSU.

the weight he is carrying is really unbelievable," Davis said of the six-foot, 199-pound Collins.

Davis, at 5-foot-9, 192-pounds, finished just outside the finals of the SPARQ competition, landing in 14th after admitting he had no idea what the competition was before arriving at "The Opening."

Pittman, who ran a 4.64 40-yard dash and finished 68th, brushed off the importance of the combine.

Players were coached in SPARQ events by guys like Jerry Rice, Ray Rice and former Gators cornerback Joe Haden.

Meanwhile, linemen like Dunker worked on their technique in the trenches with San Francisco 49ers offensive tackle Alex Boone and Detroit Lions defensive tackle Ndamukong Suh.

"When we were working on pass protection, [Boone] was telling me I was turning my hips a little," Dunker said.

"He was basically telling me to keep my hips square and meet the defensive lineman at one point. ... [Suh] was basically telling us if a defensive player is doing this, you do this. So I liked that."

For the skill position players, Friday and Saturday brought an opportunity to display their game skills.

Coached by Arizona Cardinals cornerback Patrick Peterson, Davis' Vapor Carbon team went undefeated before losing in the championship game to Alpha Talon — a squad led by Tampa Berkeley Prep athlete Nelson Agholor and Melbourne Holy Trinity safety Mar-

cus Maye, who was named to the Nike 7ON All-Tourney team.

Pittman said he felt like his performance with his Superbad squad showed he is "pretty much there" with the top guys in the nation.

With two touchdowns on the weekend, Davis seemed a little more confident.

"I believe I put it out there that I'm the best in the country," the running back said.

Florida's oral commits attended "The Opening" not just as participants but also as recruiters.

"The coaches from UF wanted me to go out there and recruit people," said Dunker, who did not compete in Saturday's lineman challenge because of a bruised hand.

"They had me and Latroy Pittman out there. We were recruiting everybody."


Davis said he particularly targeted Maye and Miramar High cornerback Tracy Howard.

"I was telling them every day while I was there 'You know, any day you want to commit to Florida, it would be nice,'" he said.

Both Davis and Pittman said Maye should be a lock for the Gators while Howard feels Miami is "on the rise."

Pittman said Maye could orally commit to UF at Friday Night Lights on July 22 and also added an interesting twist in the less-documented courting of five-star speedster Agholor.

"Nelson told me if Maye will commit [to the Gators], he will commit [to the Gators]," Pittman said.

in tackles and interceptions, graduated.

The enigmatic Will Hill, who struggled mightily as a junior but still finished with 54 tackles and two interceptions, left the Gators as an undrafted free agent.

Then in late April, Florida's secondary took its biggest hit with the dismissal and transfer of All-American cornerback Janoris Jenkins — who most rate as college football's top NFL prospect at the position.

In the wake of these departures, it's up to Muschamp and newly-minted defensive backs coach Travaris Robinson to try and improve upon a group that was solid in 2010.

With the trio of Black, Hill and Jenkins prowling the secondary, UF's defense ranked ninth in the nation in to-

tal yards and 13th in passing yards allowed.

This season, a wealth of Meyer-era talent looks to step into the roles of consistent starters, but they may not be the type of player Muschamp prefers for his defense.



Muschamp

While defensive playmakers like Matt Elam — a sophomore safety and 2011 Jim Thorpe Award candidate — and junior corner Jeremy Brown (3 interceptions, 5 pass breakups) look to be locks for playing time, incoming recruits and current underclassmen may see limited roles once Muschamp gets to recruit his brand of secondary players.

While Meyer preferred speed over size; at Texas, Muschamp was renowned for utilizing tall, physical cornerbacks.

Last season, Muschamp had five players six-foot or above at the position.

However, only 6-foot-3 redshirt senior Moses Jenkins currently hits the mark on Florida's roster.

Despite missing the ideal players for the Gators' new defense, sophomores Cody Riggs and Joshua Shaw and freshman De'Ante Saunders could have time to grow in a potential down year for Southeastern Conference quarterbacks and receivers.

Seven of the SEC's 10 leaders in receptions per game last year — including stars A.J. Green, Julio Jones and Randall Cobb — were either drafted or ran out of eligibility.

But Florida's current crop of cornerbacks and safeties will still have to perform well to sustain Muschamp's exceeding expectations for the position.

No. 5 - Florida State

2011 Outlook

After waiting on Bobby Bowden to retire for two seasons, it didn't take former coach-in-waiting Jimbo Fisher long to rack up wins for the Seminoles faithful. Fisher's 10 victories last season were a school record for a first year FSU coach and 2011 looks like it could be more of the same. Added with Rivals.com's No. 2 rated recruiting class, the Seminoles return 16 starters. FSU will have to replace quarterback Christian Ponder after he was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings with the 12th overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft. However, junior signal-caller E.J. Manuel heads into the starting job with plenty of experience, registering 17 appearances over the last two seasons for the off-injured Ponder. On defense, senior inside linebacker Nigel Bradham returns as the team's leader in tackles and looks to improve upon Florida State's 40th ranked squad in total yards allowed.

Key Game

Sept. 17 vs. Oklahoma: An early season matchup in Doak against the No. 1 team in the nation could springboard the Seminoles to BCS favorites. FSU will have to overcome the demons of last year's 47-17 shellacking in Norman, Okla., though.

2011 Outlook

Stanford was nearly decimated this offseason with the NFL courting head coach Jim Harbaugh and 2010 Heisman Trophy runner-up Andrew Luck. While Harbaugh bolted for the San Francisco 49ers, Luck decided to stay put for his senior year despite many tagging him as a possible No. 1 overall draft choice. The Cardinal are coming off their best season since 1940, winning 12 games. Stanford capped off its one-loss season with a 40-12 throttling of Virginia Tech in the Orange Bowl. But with three starters off the offensive line and Luck's top two receiver targets gone, promoted offensive coordinator David Shaw will have to find a way to make Stanford's offense click in his first year as head coach in the high-powered Pac-12.
