## Academic expansion could be simpler for UF

► THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS WANTS TO AVOID DUPLICATING PROGRAMS.

UF sees itself as the flagship university of the state, and with such power comes responsibility.

In this case, that responsibility is to share the expertise and knowledge of its faculty with the state of Florida — something the Board of Governors is seeking to regulate.

In a meeting of the Board of Governors' Strategic Planning Committee last Friday, changes in regulation wording were approved and set to go before the full Board in September.

This proposed regulation addresses universities that are seeking to expand their academic programs outside of their geographic locations. The controversy comes when these expansions are made into another university's territory.

Under the new wording, universities seeking such expansion must gain approval by the Board of Governors' Chancellor Frank Brogan and chairwoman Ava Parker.

The proposed program must be deemed "market-driven," and "mission-justified" in order to avoid wasteful duplication of programs.

## Construction begins on 13th Street pedestrian overpass

It takes Sophia Ma five minutes to walk from her apartment to her classes at Shands.

Every day, the medical student crosses the vine-and-barbed-wire-wrapped overpass above Southwest 13th Street, uninhibited by the traffic below.

But her daily routine may soon be interrupted.

Construction has begun on 13th Street between 16th Street and Archer Road in preparation for an overhaul of the overpass.

Construction crews are working to lay utility

lines and install new streetlights — repairs that caused lane closures earlier in the week.

The overpass, once part of the Depot Avenue Rail Trail, is now a pedestrian and bicycle path.

Its \$1.2 million renovation, part of a larger effort to modify the entire rail trail and create a Depot Avenue Park, is being funded by the Gainesville Community Redevelopment Agency.

According to plans on the CRA website, the redesigned bridge will have a roof, lined with solar panels, in the shape of a double helix — a nod to the nearby Shands hospitals.

## University ranks 28th in country for contributing to society

### Ranking based on research, social mobility and service

UF has been ranked for its douchiness, social media presence, research endeavors and education value.

Now, the Gators have been ranked for how they give back.

In a list released by Washington Monthly, a bimonthly political magazine, UF ranked 28th overall in terms of its contribution to society.

The top three spots went to three Universities of California — San Diego, Los Angeles and Berkeley. Florida State University ranked 106.

UF spokesman Steve Orlando said this is the first time he's seen schools ranked based on their contributions to the public good.

"It's a good list to be on," he said. "It's important to remember that universities are here to serve people."

To determine the rankings, Washington

Monthly looked at three categories: social mobility, research and service.

Social mobility refers to the ability of a university to recruit and graduate low-income students. The magazine looked at the number of Pell Grants awarded and the graduation rates of low-income students.

In social mobility alone, UF was No.



# Ranking took into account participation in ROTC, Peace Corps

25. UF fell to No. 35 in the research category, directly behind Ohio State University.

This ranking was determined by the amount of money spent on research in a year, the number of Ph.D. students and the prominence of faculty members.

The service category took into account each school's participation in ROTC, the Peace Corps and community service.

Despite being named the second-best recruiting school by the Peace Corps in February, UF ranked 103rd in Washington Monthly.

Orlando said the university is always trying to improve, but he's happy with UF's overall ranking.

"If you look at the other schools on that list, we're in good company," he said. "I think it's a good reflection on the university."

## Provost: UF satisfied with rewording of regulation

This clause in the regulation had been tempered from a previous draft that required universities seeking to expand programs into another region to first gain approval from the local university's president before coming to the Board of Governors.

UF Provost Joe Glover, a member of the task force charged with rewording the regulation, said the university is satisfied with the result and does not think it will limit UF's future endeavors to expand programs.

An example of such a program brought up in an earlier meeting of the

Board was that of UF's pharmacy program at St. Petersburg College. The nearby University of South Florida also has a pharmacy school, and Brogan questioned if having two similar programs so close together was a waste of state funding.

All existing programs were grandfathered in, including UF's pharmacy school and the Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, which has outposts in all of Florida's 67 counties.

"We are willing to work with the Board of Governors and are confident that they will make decisions about our programs based on the best interest of the citizens of the state of Florida," Glover said.

## Lane closures, construction will not affect traffic on gameday

The overpass will be partially made of recycled materials. Crews plan to build stairs on 13th Street to lead pedestrians and cyclists up to the overpass, as well as a plaza and an overlook for pedestrians and trail users.

The CRA plans to install art throughout the plaza, including a large sundial, and to build a rain garden near the overpass to collect storm water runoff.

Thirteenth Street will not experience any lane closures over the weekend, so football gameday traffic will not be affected.

Traffic should be running just as smoothly on the west side of town.

As of Monday, the shoulder of the northbound Interstate 75 exit ramp at Newberry Road has been reopened.

"We got it done just in time for the foot-

ball game," said Laurie Windham, spokeswoman for the project.

Resurfacing the shoulder and the exit ramp was the first step in the construction project at the Newberry Road exit, scheduled to be completed by next summer.

By that time, the other three exit ramps at Newberry will be resurfaced, and the northbound exit will have two additional turn lanes. Windham said the volume of traffic on Newberry Road and the northbound I-75 exit make the construction project crucial.

There will not be any lane closures in the area from Friday through Monday due to the holiday weekend.

## Thornebrook Gallery marks 30th year open for business

► THE GALLERY OPENED IN 1981 AS A FRAMING SHOP.

If you're a customer of the Thornebrook Gallery, Tricia Fisher probably knows you.

The gallery manager knows if your mother's ears aren't pierced or if she prefers long, dangling earrings. She knows where your brother goes to school, if your dad's knife collection could use an update and whether you prefer abstract paintings or nature scenes.

If gallery owner David Arrighi orders a piece Fisher thinks you'd like, she'll give you a personal phone call.

Originally opened in 1981 by two UF alumni as a framing shop, it is this sense of intimacy and friendliness that has kept the Thornebrook Gallery alive for 30 years — a milestone which the gallery will celebrate throughout the month of September.

The gallery, located in the Thornebrook Village shopping center off Northwest 43rd Street, is filled with art ranging from paintings, artisan jewelry and glass sculptures to intricate knives, woodworking and pottery. But it hasn't forgotten its origins in framing.

A wall in the back of the store boasts six sliding displays of frames — a service the gallery and its employees take pride in.

"What we attempt to do with the frames is enhance what is already there," Fisher said.

The 1980s frame shop slowly grew into an art gallery as the owners began displaying the two-dimensional artwork, such as paintings and photography, of local artists.

As the gallery continued to grow, Arrighi expanded his collection to include other three-dimensional mediums such as glass, jewelry and ceramics.

The 30th anniversary is a celebration of both local artists and the relationship they have with the Thornebrook Gallery.

The gallery will kick off its celebration on Sept. 9 with "The Mob" — a showcase of 37 local artists that will run through Sept. 14.

Each artist will bring one piece to display and sell, and the gallery will provide live music and refreshments.

The party will continue through the following weekend with the opening of the gallery's Trish Beckham exhibit — a local artist who paints realistic Floridian nature scenes — and the launch of Gallery Magazine, a publication focusing on local art, culture and food.

# Fair provides information on alternative transportation

If few parking spaces and pedestrian-filled streets weren't enough, the Alternative Transportation Fair Wednesday proved there's another reason not to drive to campus.

The fair, hosted at the beginning of each semester by the Office of Sustainability, aims to educate students about the various types of transportation available.

"Students, staff and faculty are fresh, and maybe they're settling into a new routine for the year, so it serves to be an educational reminder of what kind of modes and options are on campus and around Gainesville," said Ashley Pennington, outreach coordinator for the UF Office of Sustainability.

Different organizations set up booths for the fair.

The Office of Sustainability, RTS services, UF Transportation and Parking Services, the City of Gainesville, Gainesville Police and GOTCHA Ride each had its own booth.

RTS services distributed fliers about various bus routes.

UF transportation services spoke to students about the Zipcar program, which is a by-the-hour car rental program available to UF faculty and students.

Gainesville Police and the City of

Gainesville spoke about bike safety and traveling rules.

GOTCHA Ride advertised its free services to students who need a safe ride home from downtown.

"It's a safe, easy and eco-friendly way to get home," Pennington said.

The fair is the kickoff to the Office of Sustainability's One Less Car program.

Each year, a day in October is chosen to be One Less Car Day.



# Downtown cafe offers fast, healthy choices that won't bore

Gainesville never seems to fail to provide us with new hang-out hubs. And now, one more spot has been pinned to the grid.

Ffresh Café, located on 204 SW Second Ave., had its soft opening during Gator Stompin' and officially opened its front gates the weekend of May 1.

Ffresh Café has a wide variety of freshly prepared dishes that don't use processed meat, additives or frozen foods. If you order french fries, the potato will be washed, chopped and cooked right before it comes out.

Melvin Shackelford, owner and chef, saw the need for a restaurant that would appeal to people who want to eat healthy and avoid fast-food joints on the way home. He and a couple of friends set out to open a restaurant that would provide quality food and a quality atmosphere for all its guests.

"We wanted a place where you could eat good food and sit in a good environment," Shackelford said. "With most places, you only get one."

Ffresh Café's menu is vegetarian and vegan-friendly. Serving breakfast, lunch and dinner all day, there are no restrictions when it comes to finding the perfect meal for your mood. The menu includes an array of burritos, omelets, sandwiches,

wraps, salads and entrees.

One popular dish is the Picadillo, where you go through three stages to prepare your meal. First, you choose the style — either house specialty or spicy Thai peanut. Then you grab some beef or tempeh for protein. Lastly, you choose yellow

or brown rice.

Lance Clark, owner and chef, wanted to create a menu fit for an outdoor restaurant. With only outdoor seating for about 90 customers, the café needed food that people could grab and go.

In addition to its variety of foods,

the café is open from 8 a.m. to midnight Monday through Wednesday, 8 a.m. to 3 a.m. Thursday and Friday, 11 a.m. to 3 a.m. Saturday and 11 a.m. to midnight Sunday.

The late hours make it a fabulous place for club-goers to grab a meal after a night downtown.

Adding to the quaint environment is Open Mic Night on Thursdays and a solo, acoustic guitar performance by local musician Bobby Kennedy on Saturday nights. Clark also performs his own songs on Thursday nights and encourages anyone interested in performing to stop by.

"If anyone has a guitar and just wants to jam, we welcome them out here on Thursday nights," Clark said. "We're trying to build up that environment where people can just come and hang out."

Customer Bailey Piper saw Ffresh Café about a month and a half ago, and she has been stopping by every Saturday night since. She and Kennedy drop in for a few hours so he can perform while she enjoys a vanilla milkshake or Cuban sandwich.

"The food is more diverse here than other health restaurants," Piper said. "I haven't stopped coming here since I found it."

Ffresh Café is undergoing some renovations to add even more spice. The owners plan to cover the entire outside with bamboo to create an indoor atmosphere. The backside of the restaurant may even become a lounge. But for now, the café carries an outdoor-getaway atmosphere with African-print futons and plenty of tables to sit at to enjoy a nice cold beer and good music.

"We've got good food and cheap beer," Clark said. "What more could a college student want?"

With the flick of a finger, he can access your name, location, phone number and destination.

But that didn't matter to the sophomore the Student Nighttime Auxiliary Patrol van driver picked up on Sorority Row.

"I'm never such a cynical bitch unless I'm in a SNAP van," she said. Then, she stuttered to say, "I love it."

As the rest of the van stared in awkward aversion at the young woman continuing to

grumble, she may have missed the fact that SNAP has been making some snazzy technological upgrades. They have developed a new system for transporting the tired, the studied-out and even the wasted around UF's campus.

The new system includes automated reservation and dispatch services, a web-based application to reserve a ride, a soon-to-be-unveiled smartphone app and a phone system that recognizes phone numbers and stores a rider's previous route requests to cut down on time.

According to University Police officer Gregory Castronover, the SNAP coordinator with UPD's Community Services Division, the new system allows 100 percent of phone calls to be put into the system, whereas previously some students couldn't even get an answer with the old manual phone operating.

You could tell it must have been working with the crazy amounts of people squeezing in and out of the clumsily heavy van doors.

After another stop, the van was loaded with a group of about eight freshman girls and three freshman boys.

"Is this even a road?" asked one of the boys as we drove behind Little Hall on a road clearly marked for Service and University vehicles.

The Samsung Tablet PC is another product of SNAP's new changes. They can dispatch vans based on location thanks to the tablet's GPS capabilities, and they can enable calls to be dispatched and displayed instantaneously on a touch screen instead of being yelled into the blaring radios of yesterday.

Also, within the next few weeks, the SNAP smart phone app will be up and running, with codes for scanning and downloading the app to be adorned on all vans, business cards and occasionally posted as a public service in the Alligator.

For now, students can use a Web-based application to place pick-up requests, which can be accessed from any computer or smart phone with Internet access.

However, SNAP still hasn't come out with an app to drown out the squeals of inebriated freshmen trying to figure out where their stop is (which would be very helpful).

# Rent the Runway On Campus puts spotlight on college fashionistas

Rent the Runway has already become a staple for fashionistas on a budget, and now the company is focusing on college women with a desire for designer.

In 2009, Rent the Runway, which allows users to rent designer items from dresses to jewelry to handbags for a fraction of the retail cost, expanded to college campuses nationwide with Rent the Runway On Campus (RTRonCampus.com). The extension is a college-dedicated website that offers beauty advice, fashion tips, girl talk, entertainment news and information on RTR's Runway Rep program.

The site also serves as an interactive community for all 500 Runway Reps across college campuses to monitor each campus's progress, allow networking opportunities and serve as an open forum to share ideas. The site is powered by 14 bloggers stemming from college campuses throughout the

U.S. Since its development, the program has grown from 50 to 125 schools (including UF) and from 150 to 500 Runway representatives.

According to Rent the Runway president and co-founder Jenny Fleiss, college-age women account for 20 percent of RTR's customers.

"[Students] are already renting for all of the occasions in their lives, whether it is sorority events, 21st birthdays, tailgating parties, weddings, spring breaks or graduations," Fleiss said.

Rent the Runway allows users to search for dresses by occasion and price range, according to Kelsey Munyan, a RTR UF public relations representative.

"We're obviously college students," Munyan said. "We don't have tons of cash lying around, yet we have all these big events going on in our lives right now. You're getting a \$2,000 dress to wear and you're only paying \$100 for it, where if you would have bought it for \$2,000, you may have only worn it once."

UF's branch of RTR On Campus (rtroncampus.com/tag/uf) is kicking off its second year. This year, Munyan said the number of UF RTR representa-

tives has grown to eight and that the program will also be hosting more events. There will also be a RTR fashion show, but a date has not been set yet, she said.

"[RTR On Campus] is more about bringing together this community of young women for fashion-minded people," Munyan said.

Rent the Runway offers items from more than 150 designers, 25,000 dresses and 4,000 accessories.

When an order is placed, the customer picks her dress of choice in two sizes to ensure a fit. Each item is rented for a maximum of four days. Shipping is free when returning the product.

Retail prices for dresses range from around \$200 to more than \$2,000, but RTR users only shell out \$50 to \$350 for a rental. Beauty products and accessories are also offered.

The inspiration for RTR came when its co-founder, Jennifer Hyman, was home for Thanksgiving and had a "closet full of clothes but nothing to wear at the moment," Fleiss said.

"Women everywhere can live the life they dream today by having access to designer brands that otherwise would have been unattainable," she said. "We aspired to make high-end fashions as accessible as renting a movie from Netflix."



*“Hesher” offers star-studded cast, dark plot*

A band's debut album is never perfect. There are usually some great songs and ideas that don't work well together until the band gains more experience. The same can be said with directors. Most often, a debut film is full of great ideas and scenes that aren't fully executed. This describes Spencer Susser's directorial debut of "Hesher" spot on.

"Hesher" is seen through the eyes of 13-year-old TJ (Devin Brochu) as he and his father, Paul (a morose, bearded Rainn Wilson), deal with the loss of TJ's mother. Paul becomes a pill-popping vegetable, TJ takes beatings from a bully, and both rely on the fragile grandmother (Piper Laurie) to take care of them.

Cue Hesher.

In a burst of frustration, TJ tosses a rock through a window of an abandoned house, unaware that an

angry, malevolent vegetable named Hesher (Joseph Gordon-Levitt) is inside. Security is soon alerted and forces Hesher to abandon the house, which makes TJ the squatter's newest target.

He follows TJ home and forcefully moves himself into the garage. Paul, strung out on pills, just accepts his new house guest. TJ tries to get rid of the shirtless nuisance, but Hesher physically overpowers him, adding to the burden of TJ's heavy life.

Hesher repairs and destroys TJ's life through unconventional life lessons, whether it's berating TJ for not taking an early walk with his grandmother or forcing him to stand up to a bully by torching said bully's car.

Early in the film, TJ falls for a down-on-her-luck grocery store clerk, Nicole (Natalie Portman), after she saves him from a bully. The two develop a friendly rela-

tionship until Hesher decides to stir that pot as well.

"Hesher," at its core, is a film about how people deal with grief. And man, does it pack a lot of grief. Especially for TJ, who deals with more shit in a weeklong period than most do in a lifetime. This is easily the most heartbreaking and heartwarming film I've seen this year.

Gordon-Levitt is clearly the star, in one of the best roles of his career. His crazy, chain-smoking, vulgar portrayal of Hesher is reason enough to see the film. Add a "Garden State"-era Natalie Portman and Dwight Schrute as a troubled father, and it's clear that the cast of "Hesher" really packs a punch.

But that's not to say the film is without faults. "Hesher" feels like two movies forced into one as part drama, part dark comedy, that just don't settle together.

It breaks character with a flashback to TJ's mother's death, something I wished they would have kept vague and left to the viewer's imagination, as the rest of the film seems to do.

Overall, "Hesher" was a great watch, if not just for the performance of Gordon-Levitt, who will surely nab himself an Oscar.





## Weis blown away by speed of Demps, Rainey

Jeff Demps and Chris Rainey are not just the fastest players at Florida; they are some of the fastest players ever, according to offensive coordinator Charlie Weis.

Weis has coached for 32 years, including 16 seasons in the NFL, and he said Tuesday he has never seen running backs fly like Demps and Rainey.

Demps' greatest accomplishments at Florida have come on the track; he has won national championships in the 60- and 100-meter sprints. Rainey also ran track in 2010 but elected to participate in spring practices this year.

Weis is especially excited because Demps and Rainey are similar backs. If one goes down, Weis won't have to change the play-calling. Rainey said Wednesday he and Demps have been on the field at the same time "quite a bit" during practices.

Said Weis: "They'll both be out there a whole bunch. They'll both be tired after games."

**Wenger like an extra coach:** Center Jonothan Harrison said Dan

Wenger has brought a much-needed veteran presence to an inexperienced offensive line. Wenger, who is listed as the starting left guard on the Gators' latest depth chart, played at Notre Dame before transferring to Florida.

He has a pre-existing relationship with Weis and position coach Frank Verducci, both of whom coached for the Irish while Wenger was there.

"He's been able to point out the little things that maybe the coach couldn't relate to us as well," Harrison said. "He'll slow it down and explain it if we're not getting it at first."

**Elam wants stability:** Safety Matt Elam seems to be the only sure thing in UF's defensive backfield, at least right now. Elam, a sophomore, has been thrust into a leadership role perhaps prematurely because of the unit's youth.

## Gators looking for physical, fast defense under Quinn

Dan Quinn's shirt said it all Wednesday.

As Florida's first-year defensive coordinator spoke of his unit leading up to Saturday's season opener against FAU, he donned a grey shirt with the words "Ball Hawk" emblazoned across the front.

That's what he expects of his unit this year: a relentless defense that's both fast and physical for 60 minutes.

"I want you to see the tape and see these guys are really physical," Quinn said. "You hope that after the tape comes off and after you watch the game, you say, 'That's a fast, physical team. They went after the ball; they're tough, good tacklers.'"

With the season on the horizon, Quinn said the defense is still adjusting from a predominantly 4-3 scheme to a hybrid system that also runs 3-4 principles. However, he said he's pleased with the progress he's seen

from the unit.

"[The system] may look harder at times than it is," Quinn said. "When you combine both the 3-4 and the 4-3 packages it adds some value in how the offense will have to prepare against you. That's one thing Will (Muschamp) and I have always believed in."

Quinn said the transition to playing more 3-4 was difficult for some at first, but through a full spring and fall camp, the unit has adjusted nicely to the new principles.

In order to keep opposing offenses on their toes with the new system, Quinn has had the entire defense — and more specifically, the front seven — cross-training at every position.

The interior linemen (Omar Hunter, Jaye Howard, Dominique Easley and Sharrif

## Wins, losses not the only concern for first-year coach

Will Muschamp faces a difficult task as a first-year coach in the Southeastern Conference, but the odds are stacked in his favor.

As his friend and second-year Tennessee head man Derek Dooley will attest to, taking over a program is a complex job.

"I could probably write a book on the first year," Dooley said. "It's trying to relay the expectations of everything you do, at every stage."

A coaching switch does not happen in one swift movement. It takes place over and over again, at every level of team activity.

Spring practice. Summer program. Training camp. Weekly schedule. Week-end games. Every phase is a fresh start for a first-time coach.

"Even though a new coach right now would be about 7 or 8 months into his job, he's really starting over as it relates to game week," Dooley said. "I think that's the biggest change your first year: taking

every component over the course of 365 days and implementing how you want to do things."

As Muschamp enters his next fresh start, he has a leg up on those who came before him.

South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier noted that Muschamp has the luxury of a top-tier talent base, something not usually present in situations that call for change. He specifically cited former coach Urban Meyer's top-ranked recruiting class from 2009.

"I don't know how many of those guys are still there, but they've certainly got a lot of good ball players, we all know that," Spurrier said. "I think they'll be a very strong team — hopefully not too strong — but they'll have a good year."

# Freshmen Solaun, Sapienza bring local energy to Gators

From their glory days at Gainesville Buchholz High to rooming together in college, freshmen Havana Solaun and Kim Sapienza have shared nearly every experience in their young soccer careers.

Now four games into their first season at No. 13 Florida (3-1-0), the two also share a common role on their new team as key contributors off the bench in the midfield and on the back line.

"It's really neat to have two kids from local Gainesville making big contributions to our program," UF coach Becky Burleigh said. "I think that helps add local interest and the

fact that the two of them have been able to make an impact right away is huge for both of them."

In Florida's 3-2 win against Texas A&M last Friday, Solaun and Sapienza became the first pair of local players in the program's 17-year history to see the field at the same time. Only two other Gainesville natives — Kelli Eisenbrown (2003-2006) and Karah Smith (1996) — have ever played in a game for Burleigh.

The novelty of their rotation into the Gators' lineup has worked brilliantly, with Solaun scoring in the season opener against Miami and then dishing an assist to junior Erika Tymrak in the matchup with the Aggies.

"Havana has been involved in a lot of our goals, maybe not directly on the stat page with the assists, but certainly with part of the balls that have been set up to get the assist and then lead to the goal," Burleigh said.

The 5-foot-4 Sapienza, meanwhile, began her first year behind the learning curve, as she made the switch from an attacking midfielder at Buchholz to a defensive role with Florida.

"Transitioning from high school to college, you just keep your options open because you never know where they're going to see you playing," Sapienza said. "It could be completely different."

In her senior year with the Bobcats, Sapienza led the team in scoring with 28 goals, nine ahead of Solaun. If the Gators' coaches called for it, Sapienza said she could see herself eventually making the change back to an attacking role as she gets older.

The defender showed a flash of her old offensive prowess less than a minute after being subbed in against UCLA on Saturday, when

she was able to fire off a quick shot in transition on Bruins goalie Katelyn Rowland.

"She kind of always intended on playing a defensive role, but she still gets into the attack a lot even as a defender," Solaun said.

With Florida's home opener against Texas Tech (3-1-0) in James G. Pressly Stadium coming up this Friday, both players expect a large contingent of family and friends at the game. While playing collegiately is still an adjustment for her, Solaun said staying in town has given her a comfort level not seen by most freshmen.

"It's kind of been ingrained, being able to go to school where you grew up and play for the team and play with the girls you've always idolized," Solaun said. "Watching them play and being able to play with them, it's always been a dream."

Floyd) are switching between nose tackle and defensive tackle, or defensive tackle and defensive end.

Particularly, Quinn said Floyd, who was the No. 1 defensive tackle recruit in 2010 according to Rivals.com, will be playing end in the Gators' base defense and tackle in their nickel package.

Cross-training allows each player to be interchangeable at several positions to fit the type of strategy the Gators want to implement based on the opponent's offensive tendencies.

"Part of it is you wanted to put out the best guys," Quinn said. "Sometimes it might just be for the opponent you're playing. This is a really big run team and we'd like to have a bigger team on the field that time, and if there's a nickel situation, you'd like to have more rushers."

The Gators' defensive coordina-

tor went on to single out a handful of players as the team's best pass-rushers: William Green, Lerentee McCray and Ronald Powell the best from the outside, and Easley and Floyd the most consistent inside.

Beyond strategy, Quinn said cross-training also helps in the event of an injury.

With Florida's unproven depth in the front seven, if one player goes down, another can just slide into the position without having to worry about losing a step.

"We certainly are a work in progress," Quinn said.

"But I'm encouraged with where we're at and where we're heading with that group."

which cornerbacks will start in Saturday's season opener.

Moses Jenkins, Cody Riggs, Marcus Roberson and Jaylen Watkins are competing for playing time.

While a rotation could keep the group's energy high, Elam wishes the team had established starters.

"It's hard not to know who will play beside you, but I just continue to push the other players so that they can get better," he said. "I want to feel comfortable."

**Injuries:** Receiver Omarius Hines (hamstring) and cornerback Jeremy Brown (sprained knee) remain questionable for Saturday's game.

Brown ran during practice earlier this week, but he has not been able to participate in football activities, Muschamp said.

**Etc:** With Texas A&M's move to the Southeastern Conference appearing imminent, several SEC coaches were asked about the impact of the move.

Muschamp danced around the topic, saying expansion won't change UF's approach: "We're going to recruit the best players in the country; and if some of those are in Texas, so be it."

Muschamp is perhaps most famous for his passionate tirades on the sidelines. He said he won't change his antics just because he's a head coach: "I plan on being emotional; that's kind of me."

After leading what should have been a rebuilding Gamecocks team to a 7-4 record, Spurrier got the nod for SEC Coach of the Year in his first season at South Carolina.

Muschamp's Gators may not have the talent of last year's group, but it's fair for fans to optimistically expect a Spurrier-esque season, at the least.

When Houston Nutt took over at Ole Miss in 2008, he was assuming the task of changing the entire mindset of a program that hadn't put together a winning season in four years.

His plan? Eliminate penalties, take care of the ball and develop a familial attitude — things Muschamp has tried to do at Florida.

The adjustment was admittedly slower than Nutt anticipated, but a few critical early season wins, including the inception of Tim Tebow's famous 2008 speech, really convinced his players to buy in.

With a brutal October schedule featuring matchups against LSU, Alabama, Auburn and Georgia, Muschamp will have similar opportunities to score a galvanizing, statement victory. And even if he doesn't, the memory of the 2008 national championship is only three years old.

Winning is still a part of this culture.

If Nutt can take Ole Miss from 3-9 in 2007 to 8-4 in his opening season, then the sky should be the limit for Muschamp's Gators.

Nutt's results may represent an outlier, but first-year SEC coaches have fared well overall. Of the ten returners — Vanderbilt's James Franklin is also entering his first year — only three failed to maintain or improve their team's re-

cord in their inaugural season.

Of those three, only Bobby Petrino, whose depleted Arkansas team went from 8-4 to 5-7 upon his arrival, was more than a single win worse.

Pundits point to the schedule as a reason Muschamp won't succeed, but Dan Mullen brought Mississippi State from 4-8 to 5-7 in his first year despite facing the nation's most difficult slate.

Even Dooley expects Muschamp to have a big season, so much so that he opted not to counsel his close friend on the challenges that await him.

"Will doesn't need my advice," Dooley said. "He's a great football coach, he's been around a lot of great programs and he's ready for the job. He doesn't need any help from me, that's for sure."

Muschamp supporters expect a lot from him, and the situation he enters is as strong as any a new coach could ask for.

It's on him to deliver.
