## Journalism girls break news – and hearts, TFM says

In a column by totalfratmove.com, journalism was deemed the major with the hottest girls. Nursing and education took second and third place, respectively.

The journalism college has a large proportion of female students, and with a larger population, the chances would be better, said Mike Foley, UF journalism professor. His Reporting labs of about 20 students usually have only one or two men.

"I have had, over the course of 13 years here, two future Miss Floridas in my Reporting lab," he said.

## Higgs boson discovery leads to UF Nobel win

UF researchers are celebrating the completion of a project 50 years in the making, and it has paid off with Nobel Prize recognition Tuesday.

More than a year ago, a team of UF researchers contributed to the discovery of the Higgs boson, the "God particle" that was theorized about for decades.

The Higgs boson is a subatomic particle that explains how matter attains mass. As a set of elementary particles that make up the world, the model is the best explanation for how the universe works.

The researchers at UF were part of an international team that designed and built the muon detectors that were able

to prove the discovery, according to a UF news release.

"I'm very proud of our project and for our collaborators (for winning the Nobel Prize)," Andrey Korytov said. "We have 3,000 contributors. Everyone contributed in one way or another."

Korytov is a professor at UF and has been working on the project since 1995. He is one of 40 members at the university who have been involved in the research.

The UF High-Energy Experimental Group is one of the largest groups in the U.S. that helped to work on the research and is led by distinguished professor Guenakh Mitselmakher.

"We are very happy (about the Nobel Prize)," Mitsel-

## Gainesville man stunned, arrested for gas station scene

### Police: He poured beer on a cashier, then ate taquitos

A Gainesville man was arrested Tuesday night after Alachua County Sheriff's Office deputies alleged he poured beer on a cashier and ate food in the store without paying for it.

Deputies arrested Darius Julius Stacy on charges of battery on a law enforcement officer, damaged property, larceny and resisting an officer, ASO spokesman Art Forgey wrote

in an email.

At about 8:30 p.m., Stacy walked into the Kangaroo located at 3423 SE Hawthorne Road to buy cigarillos, which are short, thin cigars.

While the cashier was trying to scan the pack, Stacy pushed it away from the scanner.

He grabbed another pack of cigarillos and

left.

A few minutes later, Stacy returned with a beer and poured it on the counter and the cashier, Forgey said.

He left, came back and offered the cashier a cigarillo.

He also drank beer — Heineken and Budweiser — and Pepsi and ate taquitos before walking out again, according to the arrest report.

When a deputy told Stacy to stop, Stacy

said, "F\*\*\* you," Forgey wrote.

Stacy reached toward his waistband as he was walking away, so the deputy used a Taser on him. Afterward, he kicked another deputy in the face.

The Kangaroo's manager said the store will press charges for theft, according to the report.

Stacy was taken to the Alachua County Jail at about 10 p.m., where he remained Wednesday night with a \$50,000 bond.

Stacy told police he didn't steal the \$14.38 worth of items because he returned it all to the store.

# Bus route change means no weekend commuter lot stop

The Regional Transit System is fluttering its weekend riders to new destinations by adding stops to Route 25.

Starting this weekend, residents will be able to take the route to the Butterfly Rainforest exhibit, the Florida Museum of Natural History and the Samuel P. Harn Museum of Art. Some are calling the updated route the "butterfly bus."

Chip Skinner, RTS marketing and communications supervisor, said the route will no longer service the Commuter Lot during weekends because of the changes, but he thinks it will offer new opportunities for residents.

The decision to alter the route was a mu-

tual one between UF and RTS because UF funds Route 25.

Robert Miller, UF's associate vice president of business affairs, said the added stops may make it a few minutes longer to complete that route.

makher said. “After 20 years of searching for the particle, we found it. So, it justifies all of our efforts for this.”

The organization, which includes nine faculty members and more than 30 research personnel and students, helped make the discovery in July 2012.

“We are very involved in the stages of design and construction of the experiment,” Korytov said. “A big chunk of

this experiment was led from Florida.”

The research cost about \$1 billion and involved collaborators in 40 different countries, Korytov said.

“The whole discovery is really quite simple for physicists but not so simple for people who are not in physics,” Mitselmakher said. “I think this knowledge belongs to the most fundamental knowledge that we have in physics.”

Mitselmakher said he is not sure of the impact the discovery will have in fu-

ture years but said it will have a significant effect on the future of humanity.

The research was led by ATLAS and CMS, which are two separate general-purpose particle physics experiments.

Korytov said his research team will take a few years off and return in 2015.

“What’s important for science is important for humanity,” Mitselmakher said. “I think it’s one of the reasons for the university being great. So, I’m happy to contribute to that.”

News racks in Turlington Plaza have recently been filling up — but not with newspapers.

Since Student Government did not renew The New York Times subscription, a number of modular

distribution units across campus are empty.

Unauthorized distributors have been using the racks without applying for permission from UF Business Affairs, which regulates who can place material in the units, according to UF Regulation 2.003. However, Bob Miller, associate vice president of Business Affairs, said there are currently no unprocessed applications, and the fliers in these boxes may be unauthorized.

"We have an employee that removes fliers or any graffiti and takes unauthorized materials down," he said.

However, Ellis Starkey, a 20-year-old UF telecommunication junior, said people should take advantage of the circumstances.

"If the boxes are only meant for newspapers, then people handing out fliers should be prepared to vacate the space when it's rented back out again," she said.

## You can't control everything Like thigh gaps

Some people have blue eyes, and some people have green eyes. Some people have innie belly buttons, and some people have outie belly buttons. Some people have narrow hips and legs that touch, and some people have wider hips with thighs that don't touch. All these particular body parts are affected by the arbitrary genetic hand you're dealt at birth, yet young girls have chosen to obsess over whether they have a "thigh gap."

As the Alligator reported yesterday, the pervasive thigh-gap idea has been perpetuated by users on sites like Tumblr and Pinterest who glorify having upper thighs that don't touch. Having a thigh gap, as health professionals have reported, is not indicative of good health.

Vonda Wright, a Pittsburgh-based orthopedic surgeon and fitness expert, talked to Jezebel about the logistics of having a thigh gap and the impracticality of striving for one. She said a person would have to be both skinny and wide-hipped in order to have one.

"Besides, Wright said," according to Jezebel, "it isn't a goal worth chasing. Most fit people won't have a thigh gap because their thighs are muscular enough that they touch," she said.

"Skinny does not mean fit or muscular," said Wright, who works with Division I athletes. "I cannot think of one athlete I deal with who has a thigh gap."

Women just can't cut a break, it seems. If it's not a thigh gap, it's a flat stomach or prominent collar bones or back dimples or avoiding "cankles" or whatever ridiculous beauty trend is en vogue.

In her memoir "Bossypants," our Lord and savior Tina Fey said, "Now every girl is expected to have Caucasian blue eyes, full Spanish lips, a classic button nose, hairless Asian skin with a California tan, a Jamaican dance hall a\*\*, long Swedish legs, small Japanese feet, the abs of a lesbian gym owner, the hips of a nine-year-old boy, the arms of Michelle Obama, and doll t\*ts."

"The person closest to actually achieving this look is Kim Kardashian," Fey wrote, "who, as we know, was made by Russian scientists to sabotage our athletes."

On the flip side, since the thigh-gap debate has received as much attention as the classic vodka-eyeballing of 2010, people have felt compelled to weigh in on the subject a little too harshly, labeling girls with thigh gaps as "bowlegged" and "shaped like a human nutcracker."

Unfortunately, unrealistic beauty ideals aren't going anywhere. No matter how many exposés are written, no matter how many documentaries are filmed, and no matter how many op-eds are written, women will be faced with ridiculous and arbitrary standards of beauty.

The only line of defense, then, is to quit worrying about the stuff you can't control. Whether your thighs part at the top or kiss gently, remember that your worth as a human being isn't based upon your looks.



## Congress and McCutcheon v. FEC

Obviously, there aren't many people happy with what's happening in Washington right now. And because we live in a democracy, citizens can actually hold the members of Congress responsible for the shut-down — but we probably won't.

The problem is that we're not the hand that feeds Congress anymore — corporations are. Votes have become essentially sold to the highest bidder, and candidates with more funding can get their messages out easier. Because when more people know a candidate and his or her message, they're more likely to vote for that person.

In 2010, an important case was decided in the Supreme Court — Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission. Citizens United is a nonprofit corporation that wished to advertise a documentary about then-Sen. Hillary Clinton during the 2008 election primaries. Because it is a corporation, however, it was illegal for the people of Citizens United to spend money on what the law considered an "electioneering communication" so close to an election. The Supreme Court ruled that was a violation of Citizens United's First Amendment right.

Fast forward to today, and there's a similar case to be heard in the Supreme Court. In the upcoming McCutcheon v. Federal Election Commission, limits for individuals may be changed. Currently, individuals are limited in how much they can give a candidate — \$2,500 per election per candidate and up to \$46,200 for all candidate donations in a two-year period. McCutcheon is not challenging the limit per candidate but the blanket two-year limit.

Before I go any further, I will pause and say that the most important freedom we have under the Constitution is the First Amendment. Without it, we wouldn't be allowed to criticize the government and maintain a healthy democracy.

The Supreme Court feels strongly about the First Amendment, too, and it's historically ruled to protect that right — especially when it comes to political speech. Justices look at

any restriction on content with scrutiny, a standard that makes regulating political speech difficult. Thus, you have the Citizens United ruling, which extended the concept of "speech" to not only how individuals spend money, but corporations and labor unions as well. And it was protected.

However, the Citizens United ruling allowed corporations to donate an unlimited amount of money to political action committees, or PACs, even though they can't do the same to individual candidates. And while PACs are legally barred from actively cooperating with campaigns on strategy, they can, and do, release advertisements supporting or attacking specific candidates. Essentially, donating to a PAC is donating to a candidate.

It's easy to buy influence with unlimited donations from Wall Street allowed. Campaigns are getting bigger, and more money is required to stand a chance come election time. That means small-name candidates — ones who haven't been bought by special interests — aren't able to get elected. Without the support of the PACs, they have no campaign.

Supporters of the Citizens United decision argue as the Supreme Court does. This kind of spending is protected by the First Amendment, and striking down the decision would be a limit on political speech. However, that's not the case.

Tying money to speech takes power away from those with fewer resources. While corporations may have a ton of money to spend buying campaigns, the average person doesn't.

This causes a disproportional representation of the interests of a few corporate CEOs, suppressing any competing viewpoints with the power of their dollars.

# creative Art workshops help UF Health patients cope, grow

A laughing group of people collaborated on collages that circulated around two long tables. Torn-up magazine pages toppled off the tables as the collages filled up.

"You can tear pictures off," said Elif Akcali, UF associate professor of industrial and systems engineering. "You can put your own pictures on. You can cover someone else's picture."

Everyone was distracted from his or her own sickness. A Creative for Health workshop was in full swing.

Creative for Health workshops allow those affected by cancer to express themselves through various art mediums. The group meets Thursday at 5:30 p.m. in Room 1302 of the Criser Cancer Resource Center.

"We're here to help humanize

the health care environment," said Dylan Klemptner, artist in residence at UF Health Shands Hospital and organizer of the workshops. Shands' artist in residence program aims to bring art directly to the patient.

"What I want people to do is come in the door and get lost in the act of creating and let whatever is in their hearts and minds just flow from there," Klemptner said.

When people come to the hospital, they need to be cured. They don't get to choose what or when they eat nor what they wear. They're told what medicine to take and when. They give up control for the healing process, Klemptner said.

"They give up the elements of control that define them as individuals," he said. "The artist comes to the bedside and helps them in a journey that helps them get control of their lives back in a small way."

In her collage workshop, Akcali shared the works of Henri Matisse, Carla Accardi and other famous artists who influenced her own collages. Small snippets of magazines from her previous projects fell out of the art books as she held them in front of the group.

"Collage is very freeing," she said. "You just cut and paste. It is very free-form."

Art has helped free Akcali from the areas of stress in her own life.

"I walked into my class today and realized I forgot the papers on my desk," she said. "Five years ago, I would have had a heart attack. A disruption would happen, and I wouldn't be prepared with how to deal with it, but today ... I said, 'OK, well I forgot the quiz problems, so why don't you write a new quiz altogether and go.' It's made me take life as it comes."

Burt Kempner, 65, of Gainesville, worked with the Arts in Medicine program in the past doing oral histories.

As a former volunteer, he understands the significance of bringing art to patients.

"I saw the difference it makes in their lives," he said. "The chance to talk or do something not related to their disease ... is a respite for some."

Alt-rock ensemble Panic! at the Disco hasn't released an album for two years (since 2011's "Vices & Virtues") but its signature sound has yet to fade. "Too Weird To Live, Too Rare To Die!" is classic Panic! — melodic, slightly biting and bursting with energy. Front man Brendon Urie is as honest as ever with his lyrics, and the overall record (while maintaining a more pop-friendly edge) is on par with the band's shiny, theatrics-ridden discography.

Lead singles "This Is Gospel" and "Miss Jackson" start the album off with an arguably harder edge compared to previous work. The latter embodies the term "catchy chorus" with darkly repetitive chants that will be stuck in your head hours after the song ends.

From there, the album takes a more '80s-infused spin a la contemporaries Neon Trees — I'm definitely throwing my vote in for a co-headlining tour.

"Vegas Lights" is upbeat and full of synth — but those chants in the background maintain the album's overall deeper tone. Similarly,



"Girl That You Love" and "Girls/Girls/Boys" have a Depeche Mode vibe, mixing both lighter and darker sounds to create pieces that are catchy yet haunting.

"Casual Affair" and (my personal favorite) "Nico-tine" are the most haunting tracks. Again, this album has an overlying dark effect that is reflected in both the lyrics and the musicality — but that's what makes it so intriguing to listen to.

Urie's vocals have always had that distinguishable edge, and he continues to stretch his range to its full extent on every track. Listen to almost any Panic! song, and you know the man can sing high, but it's his lower register that gets a workout in songs like "Far Too Young To Die" and the very dance-able "Collar Full" (seriously, please do a collaboration with Neon Trees).

I may be a longtime fan, but honestly, if the group continues to put out records that are able to balance versatility and coherency in this fashion, I'll listen forever.

Robert Mueller, a senior faculty member in printmaking at the art school, said the event will showcase several hundred pieces of art.

"There is no theme to this show," Mueller said, "only a one-day showcase of student art to the community."

Ben Weary, a 24-year-old store associate at the UF Bookstore, said he hasn't heard much about the event but would definitely attend.

"I've lived in Gainesville all my life," Weary said. "I would definitely be interested in anything that caught my attention."

High school or middle school students from around the Gainesville area are also encouraged to bring their art pieces to be showcased at the event, Mueller said.

"Art bash is all about making the visual arts visual," he said.

## Pump up with Protein

### Eat more chicken!

Well, not just chicken — any protein-rich foods. Everyone needs to include protein in his or her diet. Made up of chains of amino acids, protein is essential for the health, growth and maintenance of body tissues and cells (meat-head translation = muscle growth). No, you do not need to eat mass quantities like Dwayne “The Rock” Johnson on cheat day. But yes, you need to include protein sources into your meals.

### How much protein should you eat per day?

This will depend heavily on age, activity level and health of each individual. For the average person, here is the recommended daily allowance formula\* to gauge the grams of protein you should consume in a day. Divide that evenly among four to six small meals.

#### Formula

$$[\text{Weight (in pounds)} / 2.2] \times 0.8 = \text{number of grams of protein per day}$$

*Note: If you work out and weight train frequently, this number will need to be higher in order to properly fuel your body and muscles.*

#### Top five best protein sources:

- 1 Chicken or turkey breast (17 grams of protein in 58-gram breast)
- 2 Fish (22 grams of protein in 3-ounce serving)
- 3 Lean beef and veal (31 grams of protein in 3-ounce serving)
- 4 Eggs and egg whites (6 grams of protein per large egg)
- 5 Protein powder supplement (grams vary per brand and type of protein. See my blog post “Breaking down protein powders” to learn more about the different types of protein powders.

#### Top five protein-rich foods that may surprise you:

- 1 Quinoa (8 grams of protein in 1 cup cooked)
- 2 Cottage cheese (12 grams of protein in ½ cup)
- 3 Nonfat Greek yogurt (11 grams of protein in ½ cup)
- 4 Nuts and seeds (9 grams of protein in 1-ounce serving)
- 5 Beans (6 to 9 grams of protein in ½ cup)



## Florida basketball dealing with preseason distractions

One word summarizes the start of Florida's 2013-14 season: uncertainty.

Billy Donovan, who is entering his 18th season as Florida's coach, reaffirmed Wednesday during the team's annual media day that senior forward Will Yeguete (knee) and Rutgers transfer guard Eli Carter (leg) would not be cleared to play for the Gators' first practice on Friday. Both players are questionable for Florida's season-opener against North Florida on Nov. 8.

With five-star forward Chris Walker still not enrolled at UF, and Scottie Wilbekin set to miss an unknown number of games due to a suspension to begin the year, Florida heads into the season with question marks scattered throughout its roster.

"Those two guys (Yeguete and Carter), I don't know when they'll be back," Donovan said.

"We'll try to prepare like those guys are not going to be there ready to play. Hopefully, there will be a time when they can get themselves ready. They'll have to do a lot of things in terms of maintaining and conditioning and picking up on what's going on.

"I have less of a worry about Will because this is obviously his senior year. He has an understanding, but for Eli, who is trying to pick up a new system and a new style of play, everything is going to be different. When you

can't go through things on a daily basis, that's always challenging."

Yeguete underwent arthroscopic debridement on his right knee May 22 to remove loose cartilage. Carter suffered his injury during Rutgers' game against DePaul on Feb. 16 and underwent surgery 12 days later.

"I don't have a timetable," Carter said. "I'm getting better every day, every week."

Walker is in the process of

completing online courses so he can be academically eligible to play for the Gators. If the Bonifay native enrolls for the 2014 spring semester, the earliest he could return would be mid-December.

"He's working really, really hard. I'm optimistic that he'll be back here," Donovan said.

"That's the challenge, is him trying to play catch-up for what he will have missed. We'll have to see how much or how well he can pick it up. That's the unknown for me."

Despite facing a suspension to begin 2013-14, Wilbekin will rejoin the team in practice on Friday.

He practiced at UF's basketball facility for a portion of the offseason separate from the team.

"He's been very humble, just trying to get back with the team, get back with the players," forward Casey Prather said.

"You could just tell a major difference in his attitude, his work ethic and everything like that."

During Friday's practice, the Gators will have available four mainstays — center Patric Young, shooting guard Michael Frazier II, Prather and Wilbekin — from last year's rotation that reached the Elite Eight.

Five-star point guard Kasey Hill will partake in his first practice as a Gator on Friday, while transfers Dorian Finney-Smith (Virginia Tech) and Damontre Harris (South Carolina) will practice for the first time as active members on the roster.

Sophomores DeVon Walker, Dillon Graham, junior walk-on Jacob Kurtz and the younger Billy Donovan will also be available.

The elder Donovan hopes he can make the best of who he has available going forward.

"My challenge, as a coach, based on your personnel, is to evolve," Donovan said. "We're going to have some things philosophically that we're always going to believe and that we're always going to do, but I feel like my responsibility on the offensive end of the floor is to put these guys in situations to take advantage of the skillset that they have."

**Chris Walker not eligible for fall:** The five-star forward from Holmes County High is not academically eligible to join the team until the fall semester ends in

December. Donovan said he is proud that the 6-foot-10 Walker is doing everything he can academically to become part of the squad.

If the NCAA clears Walker to play following the fall semester, Donovan said he will make on-court adjustments to add Walker into the UF rotation.

"Do you cut down what you're doing if you have to just to be on floor playing just to make it a little bit more simple for him. We'll probably have to do that with him being a freshman," Donovan said.

"If that opportunity presents itself for us, we'll figure out a way to try to utilize him as best we can."

**Harris and Young to share time on court:** Donovan said that when Florida needs more size on the court, Damontre Harris, who sat out last season after transferring from South Carolina, will

play center and Patric Young can shift to power forward.

"That would give us a lot of size at the basket if we needed to play that way," Donovan said. "Damontre brings a different kind of presence because Damontre is much more of a pure shot blocker

naturally than Patric is."

Donovan added that he is concerned that Harris has not grown at a pace he would have liked to see after dealing with the effects of a dislocated shoulder and torn labrum.

But Young, who played center

last season, said he expects immediate relief from the 6-foot-10 Harris because of his size.

"It'll be nice because I'll play a more natural position for myself," Young said. "It'll help lighten the load on the rebounding game, and I know I can count

on Damontre defending-wise. He can block a lot of shots. A lot more shots than I can."

Young was third in the Southeastern Conference last season with a team-leading 58 blocks. He also led the Gators with 6.3 rebounds per game.
