

# Uber fails in its attempt to expand through Florida

## It only exists in Jacksonville

Tap the app, click the car, pick the driver and rate him or her after. Customers can ride

in an UberX vehicle in more than 50 major U.S. cities, but Gainesville is not among them.

Citizen-driven UberX is one type of ride service offered by the San Francisco-based transportation company Uber, which failed to

jump the legislative hurdles necessary to operate in Florida last week.

The company wanted its Uber Black luxury line to operate without adhering to minimum fare requirements, accusing the state of charging inflated rates that dissuade competition.

"Florida residents and visitors should not have to pay arbitrarily inflated fares for sedan rides that are up to 28 times the minimum fare

of a taxi, even for a ride that is only 10 minutes long," the company wrote on its website.

Rep. James Grant and Sen. Jeff Brandes attempted to change this by sponsoring House Bill 1389 and Senate Bill 1618, respectively, but both bills died on May 2.

The service is operating in Jacksonville,

## Florida man flees crash, arrested with meth

Gainesville Police arrested a man carrying 14.37 grams of meth Wednesday after he fled a three-car crash scene at The Polos apartment complex, officials said.

Officers arrested 29-year-old Shawn Rutig, of Leesburg, on hit and run charges, drug possession, trafficking in methamphetamine and fleeing police, according to an arrest report.

At 5:20 a.m., an officer saw Rutig driving his car without any headlights at the

intersection of Southwest Archer Road and Southwest 34th Street.

The officer turned on his sirens and emergency lights to make a traffic stop, but Rutig accelerated.

Rutig then pulled off on Southwest 35th Place and drove through the apartment complex, located on 2330 SW 35th Place, according to the report.

An officer found Rutig's car crashed into three parked cars near building 13, causing \$11,000 in damages, according to the report.

Afterward, the officer saw Rutig get out of the car and flee while barefoot. About

two hours after the initial attempted stop, another officer found Rutig walking in the 2000 block of Williston Road.

During questioning, Rutig said he owned the black Ford Escape but would let his friend borrow his car for methamphetamine.

A search of the Escape revealed a brown bag located behind the passenger seat containing 14.37 grams of crystal meth, baggies and needles, according to the report.

Officers booked him into the Alachua County Jail at 8 a.m. As of press time, his bond has not been set.

## Graduate assistants union meets with admin

Seventeen UF graduate assistants entered the conference room together, sat down and pulled out their proposals. They were determined to drive a hard bargain.

The members of Graduate Assistants United, a labor union for teaching and research assistants at UF, met with administrators Tuesday in a series of bargaining sessions over issues, including rising fees, health care coverage and disciplinary procedures.

The two administrators, Bill Connelan, head of bargaining for UF Board of Trustees, and Paul Duncan, associate dean of academic affairs for UF graduate school, cited increased health care costs as a reason for the rise in fees, but confusion over past data and the role of an outside accounting firm pushed the issue to next Tuesday's agenda.

The opposing parties did agree on changes to grievance complaint procedures and to a revised article of the GAU-UF agreement, which now includes "domestic partners" among the list of people whose injury, illness or death could excuse the absence of a graduate assistant.

However, the main issue of UF's rising graduate fees persisted.

"UF's fees are unsustainably high," said 29-year-old GAU chief negotiator and co-president Emily McCann. "Unless the

## Family plans complaint after officer kicks boy

BOYNTON BEACH — The family of a teenage boy plans to file a formal complaint against Boynton Beach police after a video surfaced showing an officer kicking the teen's legs out from under him while his hands appeared to be restrained behind his back.

Kevens Jean Baptiste told WTVJ-TV that police were called after he was kicked off a school bus for refusing to follow the driver's order to close a window. The 13-year-old said he had breathing problems after perfume was sprayed inside the bus.

"I said, 'I don't care. I got asthma,' and I was coughing, and my face was turning red and stuff. So, I just let down my window," he said. The officer didn't say anything, Jean Baptiste said. "He, like, swept me off the ground. He kicked me," said Jean Baptiste. "He didn't say nothing. He just kicked me, and they put me in the back of the car."

The officer has been placed on administrative duty and the department is investigating, police spokeswoman Stephanie Slater said.

## One pleads guilty in smuggling venture that killed four

MIAMI — A Bahamian national who survived what authorities said was a failed smuggling venture that killed four Haitian women faces up to 20 years in prison after pleading guilty to illegally re-entering the U.S. after being deported. According to a plea agreement filed Tuesday in Miami federal court, prosecutors plan to seek the dismissal of other charges against George Lewis after his sentencing hearing July 25. He was among 11 people found clinging to the hull of a boat that capsized Oct. 16 off Miami. The four victims died underneath the boat. A change of plea hearing for the boat's operator Naaman Davis is scheduled Thursday. He faces charges of involuntary manslaughter, smuggling resulting in death and illegal re-entry.

While waiting at the Marion County Jail to make a court appearance Tuesday, Daniel Trent told the Ocala Star-Banner that he stabbed Mark Durham in self-defense Sunday night.

Trent is charged with second-degree murder. He said he argued with Durham over the last can of Natural Ice after they had finished two cases of beer. Trent said Durham grabbed a knife from Trent's kitchen and cut Trent's hand. That's when Trent said he grabbed the knife and stabbed Durham in the stomach and chest. He said Durham then

# Two Orlando hospital workers test negative for rare virus

## Doctors: infection is contained

ORLANDO — Two employees tested negative for a rare virus days after coming into contact with a Saudi resident infected with the second confirmed MERS case in the U.S., a spokeswoman for an Orlando hospital said Wednesday.

One of the two employees tested after showing symptoms of Middle East Respiratory Syndrome was hospitalized Monday, said Katie Dagenais of Dr. P. Phillips Hospital.

The other was discharged the same day. The hospitalized patient, identified only as a woman, was expected to be released sometime Wednesday, according to Dr. Antonio Crespo,

the Infectious Diseases Specialist at Phillips.

Dr. Kevin Sherin, health officer with the Florida Department of Health in Orange County, said Wednesday afternoon that all of the remaining health care workers have undergone at least some initial MERS testing, and those results have all been negative. However, he said they will continue to be subjected to more testing going forward.

Sherin added that doctors tracking the case in Orlando "believe that this infection is contained" and that there was "minimal risk."

MERS is a respiratory illness that begins with a flu-like fever and cough but can lead to shortness of breath, pneumonia and death.

Despite an increase in cases, the virus' spread in the Middle East and beyond isn't a global health emergency, the World Health Organization said Wednesday.

The White House also said Tuesday that President Barack Obama had been briefed on the MERS cases in the U.S. and that his team is coordinating with the Centers for Disease Control and officials in Florida.

however.

All vehicle-for-hire regulations are enforced on a local level, so if Uber wants, it can go to each city individually and ask for permission to subvert the standing regulations, as it did in Jacksonville.

In Jacksonville, New York City, San Francisco and more than 50 oth-

er cities, Uber drivers pick up their customers based on GPS location services from their smartphones, whereas taxis require a phone call and a specific address.

But many taxi drivers and limo operators, who make up most of the opposition to new legislation that would enable Uber to expand throughout Florida, find it unfair that Uber, which doesn't require

drivers insurance or a minimum fare, should not have to adhere to the same regulations as they do.

"They only want to cherry-pick the good fares and the good cities," said Roger Chapin, a Mears Transportation Group executive and a member of the Florida Taxicab Association Board. "They would like to change the rules to their benefit."

Because the company has to go

to each city hall to ask for permission, Chapin doesn't think Uber will make its way to Gainesville.

Twenty-year-old UF philosophy junior Tomas Barron wishes it would.

"I used it in New York and D.C.," he said. "It's really user-friendly, and it's really easy to set up."

He said it costs the same or slightly more than a regular taxi,

and he liked having the option to rate the drivers and request certain drivers.

If Uber did make its way to Alachua County, Barron said he thinks taxicabs would still do OK because mostly young people use Uber.

"Not a lot of older people know about it," he said. "But at the same time, it's definitely giving taxis big competition."

## Fees have increased by 110 percent in the past 10 years

university is tacitly OK with sending its graduate students into debt."

Fees for graduate assistants increased 110 percent over the past 10 years, and health care premiums rose as well, said McCann.

Proposed health care premiums are about \$2,000 to \$3,000 higher than last year. GAU asked the university to lower the premium portions considerably and to add vision and dental care to the plan.

"You realize that even those of us who work for the university have to pay for those?" Connellan said. The director of academic support services walked through the available numbers

with GAU until the issue was put aside, again, until the next meeting.

There are more graduate assistants at UF than faculty members, said McCann. She said the line between student and employee is heavily blurred, because many graduate assistants have to register for credits in order to conduct research, even if they are not doing coursework.

"It is our position that no one should ever pay fees - ever," said McCann.

Connellan said he didn't believe any similar schools had zero fees.

"My position is negotiating a contract that we can all live with," he said.

UF administrators plan to return with more compelling data for the increases, and the members of GAU plan to scrutinize it.

## Senate seat unanimously appointed

The first Student Senate meeting of the summer was short and to the point.

Sen. Katie Backstrand was unanimously voted into the open member at-large Senate seat. She has served since Spring 2013, she said, and is currently a College of Agricultural and Life Sciences senator.

In an email sent to the Senate listserv, Backstrand cited her time on the rules and ethics committee and the information and communications committee as preparation for her new position.

"The Member At Large seat is a very significant position, as it requires the use of judgement and experience to select the most qualified individuals to serve as Senators and Committee members," she wrote.

Senate President Pro Tempore Joseph Michaels announced the multiple Senate and committee positions available over the summer. Vacant seats include 24 in various committees, eight for permanent replacement Senate seats and 29 during Summer A.

Michaels asked senators to encourage "any qualified candidate" to apply. Qualifications for joining

Student Senate include a minimum 2.5 GPA and 12-hour course load for undergraduates, or 3.0 and 9 hours, respectively, for graduate students. Applicants must also be free of financial obligation to the university and not be under conduct probation. Applications are due Friday at noon and may be found on the Student Government website.

The meeting wrapped up with an announcement of an intramural kickball team for the summer senators.

"This is a serious commitment," said Sen. Dylan Fisher. "We have a dedication to excellence in Senate."

## Trial of Tampa mom in teens' deaths winds down

► DOCTORS SAID SHE HAD A PLAN TO KILL HER CHILDREN.

TAMPA — Two psychiatrists testifying for the prosecution Wednesday in the murder trial of a Tampa woman accused of killing her two teenage children told a jury that the former military wife was sane at the time of the shootings, contradicting several defense experts who have contended she was not in control of what she was doing.

Julie Schenecker, a 53-year-old former military wife, is on trial in Hillsborough County Court. She's been charged with two counts of first-degree murder in the deaths of Calyx, her 16-year-old daughter and Beau, her 13-year-old son. The teens were shot to death while her now ex-Army officer husband was on a 10-day deployment to the Middle East.

Wednesday was the seventh day of testimony with prosecutors presenting three health experts as rebuttal witnesses. All said she had a plan to kill the teens. Closing arguments were set for Thursday.

Schenecker's fate hinges on whether jurors believe

she knew what she was doing when the teenagers were shot. If convicted of first-degree murder, Julie Schenecker would receive a life sentence, since prosecutors chose not to seek the death penalty. If acquitted by reason of insanity, to which she is pleading, she would be committed to a hospital until she is no longer a danger to herself or others.

Two doctors said Schenecker had a plan to kill her children and cited her journal writings that detailed the plan as evidence. They also said the fact that she drove to a gun shop, told a clerk she wanted a gun so she could protect herself and then returned following a three-day waiting period proves that she intended to kill her children.

Defense attorneys say Schenecker suffered from bipolar disorder with psychotic features and depression and that she was insane at the time of the January 2011 deaths in the family's Tampa home.

Upon questioning from Schenecker's lawyer, Dr. Donald Taylor did say that her mental condition was on a downward spiral in the months leading up to the crime.

Schenecker told the judge Tuesday that she wouldn't testify on her behalf, and the defense rested.

## Police arrest fled estranged husband who threatened wife

Alachua County Sheriff's deputies arrested a man Monday after he walked into his estranged wife's Alachua house and tried to shoot her boyfriend, deputies said.

Officers arrested 27-year-old Derrick Day on charges of attempted homicide, battery, robbery and assault, according to an arrest report. At about 11:30 p.m., Day, from Bell, Florida, came home to visit his 27-year-old es-

tranged wife, according to the report.

He pushed his way into the home while holding a black semi-automatic handgun, according to the report. Day began hitting and kicking his estranged wife.

He then pushed her into the kitchen and

began saying "Where is he?," referring to her new 36-year-old boyfriend.

Day then began to shoot toward the back of the house, saying, "I'm going to f\*\*king kill him," according to the report.

Several bullets hit the wall next to where the boyfriend was hiding.

Day then got into his gray GMC truck and left the area, according to the report. High Springs Police Department later spotted the truck and detained Day.

Day had a black, semi-automatic, .45-caliber handgun on the passenger side floorboard of the truck, according to the report.

Law enforcement later collected shell casings and bullet fragments from the house.

Officers detained Day near the 25000 block of Northwest 182nd Avenue in High Springs.

Deputies booked Day into the Alachua County Jail at about 3 a.m. Monday, where he remained as of press time in lieu of a \$475,000 bond.

## International students limited in receiving credit for MOOCs

Massive open online courses are growing in popularity with students in the U.S. and around the world, but with this growth comes restrictions, namely for international students.

Some colleges and universities

offer free open-course classes, called MOOCs, as course options for enrolled students. But according to a press release from the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, students with a full-time student visa may only count a single three-credit course per semester. However, anyone is free to take a MOOC class and not receive credit.

Andy McCollough, associate provost of UF and interim director of UF Online, said although MOOCs

like those UF offers on Coursera are free, students, including international students, do not get credit at UF for the classes they complete.

"You can't get credit at this university, but they can help to accustom international students to the educational system of the U.S.," McCollough said.

This rule doesn't affect UF's other online education model, UF Online, which launched on Jan. 6. McCollough said the two programs are dif-

ferent. UF Online students earn their degrees entirely online, he said.

Jo-Anne Carrenard, a 20-year-

old UF journalism senior, has taken courses through Coursera.

She said everyone should have the option to receive credit for online classes because that would encourage more students to complete them.

The average rate of completion, McCollough said, is less than 10 percent.

"I signed up for a whole bunch of classes," Carrenard said, "but I never had time to do them."



Chasing conspiracy theories is no way to run a country — unless you want to run it into the ground.



# No motive yet in Fla. killings

TAMPA — Investigators still don't know what drove a Florida man to kill his wife and teenage children before setting their rented mansion ablaze and killing himself.

There is no evidence of any misuse of funds at the children's private school, where Darrin Campbell volunteered as treasurer, said Carrollwood Day School spokeswoman Erma Ruffkess on Tuesday.

"As speculation naturally occurs, we have no indication there has been any financial impropriety as it relates to our school," Ruffkess said. "There are extensive checks and balances and protocols in place to ensure the security of all school bank accounts and accounting/financial records. A complete independent financial audit of the school is conducted by a professional accounting firm on an annual basis."

Investigators are conducting a financial audit on Campbell, as well as searching his computer histories and interviewing friends and family members, said Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office spokeswoman Debbie Carter.

"At this point, it's very meticulous," Carter said. "It could be months before we have anything, or we may never find a motive."

Campbell had been an executive for several high-profile businesses, including a stint at PODS, the mobile storage company. Harry Costello, a lawyer representing Campbell's last employer, digital services provider Vastec, said the company is not auditing his work as chief operating officer.

Authorities have said Campbell shot his wife and two teenage children in the head last week, then scattered gasoline and fireworks around their home before setting it on fire and killing himself. He had no criminal history.

The Campbells had been renting their 6,000-square-foot home from retired tennis star James Blake. The million-dollar home was located in Avila, an exclusive gated community known for its resident sports stars and CEOs.

A private service is being planned for Campbell's children, 18-year-old Colin and 15-year-old Megan, Ruffkess said.

# British official: Nigeria won't swap girls for felons

ABUJA, Nigeria — Nigeria's government is ruling out an exchange of more than 270 kidnapped schoolgirls for detained Islamic militants, Britain's top official for Africa said Wednesday.

President Goodluck Jonathan has "made it very clear that there will be no negotiation with Boko Haram that involves a swap of abducted schoolgirls for prisoners," Mark Simmonds, British foreign office minister, told journalists in the Nigerian capital, Abuja.

But Nigeria's government will talk to the militants on reconciliation, Simmonds said, talking after a meeting with Jonathan.

"The point that also was made very clear to me is that the president was keen to continue and facilitate ongoing dia-

logue to find a structure and architecture of delivering lasting solution to the conflict and the cause of conflict in northern Nigeria," Simmonds said.

He told Nigeria's Defense Ministry that extremists had again attacked the remote northeastern town of Chibok, from which the schoolgirls were abducted.

In a video released on Monday, Boko Haram's leader says he will free the girls only if the government releases jailed members of his group. The footage was verified as authentic by Nigerian authorities, who said 54 of the girls had been identified by those who watched the video late Tuesday.

Nigerian government officials have given conflicting responses to Boko Haram's offer of a swap.

One senior official said on Tuesday that "all options" are now open — including negotiations or a possible military operation with foreign help — in efforts find the missing girls.

# Armed robbery suspect faces felony charges

TALLAHASSEE — One of the suspects in a shooting near Florida State University has been charged with armed robbery and other felonies, Tallahassee police said.

Authorities said Arthur James, 40, and Tommy Jackson, 39, were fleeing an armed robbery scene Monday and were shot by officers who were chasing them. Part of the chase wound its way through FSU's campus.

Jackson later died from his injuries at the hospital.

Six officers have been placed on administrative leave pending an investigation, though not

all fired their weapons. Officers Doug Clark, Steven Britt, Derek Kidd, Ray Garcia, Brian Perry and Matthew Wagner are all under review to determine if they followed department policy.

Police have said Jackson shot at officers. But police spokesman Scott Beck said Wednesday they are still investigating who shot first and whether James fired at police.

James is being charged with armed robbery with a firearm, burglary with person assaulted and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Additional charges are expected.

Police said investigators have conducted more than 20 interviews and have reviewed surveillance video and police vehicle video.

# UF engineering trio win business competition with new water bottle

Three UF engineering students took home \$25,000 from the Gator Business Plan Competition May 2 for their invention of aqUV, a bottle that purifies water using hand-powered ultraviolet light.

"It's just like any regular sports bottle, but it has a UV light in it," 27-year-old UF environmental engineering graduate student Erica Gonzaga said, one of the creators of aqUV.

Twist the crank enough times and the light comes on, she said. The UV light will then purify the water in the bottle.

"You would need only about two-and-a-half minutes for disinfection," she said.

Gonzaga and her partners, Rob Damitz, a 26-year-old UF chemical engineering Ph.D. candidate, and Daniel Blood, a 26-year-old UF mechanical engineering doctoral student, hope to create a TOMS-like business plan in which they donate an aqUV bottle to Haiti for every bottle they sell commercially in the U.S.

The three came up with the idea for a project in an entrepreneurship for engineers class. Blood, Gonzaga and Damitz used the tools in Blood's garage to crank

out a rough prototype of the aqUV bottle during the semester.

After receiving positive feedback, the team decided to enter it in the May 2 competition.

The trio beat 140 applicants and 16 semifinalists for the \$25,000 grand prize, sponsored by Warrington College of Business Administration's Center for Entrepreneurship & Innovation. Much of that money will go to intellectual property protection, said Gonzaga.

Third-place winners Xiang Mao, a 27-year-old UF electrical and computer engineering doctoral student, and Alexander Cohen, a 21-year-old UF information systems and finance senior, took \$5,000 for Rewardify, a mobile application that can analyze a user's past purchases and tell them which credit card to use in order to optimize rewards.

Cohen said he was impressed with aqUV.

"They literally invented a water bottle that's going to change the world," he said.

isman, a partner in the New York law firm Reisman Peirez Reisman and Capobianco. "You can't just have different states having different laws all

over the place," he said. After the ruling, the Idaho Republican Party issued a statement reaffirming the organization's stance against same-sex marriage,

and contending that the 10th Amendment gives states the power to regulate and define marriage. "The disintegration of marriage will lead to the disintegration of

our society," Idaho GOP Chairman Barry Peterson said in a prepared statement. Gay couples who choose to get Idaho marriage licenses Friday are still open to housing and employment discrimination, noted former state Sen. Nicole LeFavour, Idaho's first openly gay lawmaker and a leader of the "Add the Words" campaign.

"Add the Words" has become the catchphrase for amending Idaho's Human Rights Act to include protection from discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Reisman said the federal judge's decision to toss out Idaho's gay marriage ban could make it easier for people to bring a lawsuit over the Idaho Human Rights Act. A plaintiff could claim lawmakers' failure to include protections for gay or transgender people in the act is a violation of the 14th Amendment's equal protection clause, he said.

Gay rights activists have since won multiple lower-court cases, and many legal observers said they expect the Supreme Court eventually will rule that gays can marry in every state. So far, gay marriage is legal in 17 states and the District of Columbia.

BOISE, Idaho — A federal judge's decision to allow same-sex marriages in Idaho starting Friday has attorneys for the state scrambling to appeal and gay rights advocates planning their next steps.

U.S. District Magistrate Judge Candy Dale overturned Idaho's ban on same-sex marriages Tuesday, and on Wednesday she refused to put pending marriages on hold while Gov. C.L. "Butch" Otter and Attorney General Lawrence Wasden appeal.

Both Otter and Wasden said Wednesday they would ask the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals for an emergency stay while they fight the lower court's ruling.

Matrimonial law expert Seymour J. Reisman said the appellate court is likely to issue the stay, and the U.S. Supreme Court is almost certain to take up the matter.

But with several other states appealing rulings similar to the one handed down in Idaho, it's anyone's guess which state's case the high court will consider, said Re-

# Gainesville resident self-publishes new book under pen name

By day, Gainesville resident Dianne Farb is a practicing attorney, but by night, she trades her legal name in for her pen name, Rebecca Heflin, and writes romance novels.

Heflin is the author of three books, and her third and newest book, "Dreams of Perfection," was published May 5 on Amazon.com as an e-book for the Kindle. Heflin said that having a day job in addi-

Freeman said he knows a professor who self-published on Amazon. The professor had a love for Haitian literature.

"Self-publishing was another great venue to disseminate information," Freeman said.

No matter what form of publishing people use, if more people are able to get art into the world to share then it is a good thing, Freeman said.

# Met Gala 2014 highlights social media's impact on fashion biz

Guests at this year's Metropolitan Museum of Art Gala, held last week, paid homage to Anglo-American couturier Charles James with a host of trendy looks.

and Vivienne Westwood, just by sponsoring the event.


The Met Gala continues to grow as a stage for high-end fashion, but the event is proving to be popular among the business side of the industry as well.

"They are all promoting around that one theme."

# Lykke Li releases 'I Never Learn,' a dark riff on realistic romances

Swedish singer-songwriter Lykke Li may have just released one of the best albums of 2014 thus far.

With songs that convey realistic struggles, her third studio album "I Never Learn" manages to balance seemingly simple production with complex themes.

While female singers like Katy Perry and Lana Del Rey cater to the imaginations of teenage youth, Lykke Li offers a relatable glimpse into the often confusing aspects of relationships and personal happi-

ness. Make no mistake, though; the songs featured on "I Never Learn" deliver these themes with catchy tenacity and fluid production.

Lead single, "No Rest For The Wicked," guides the listener through an arrangement of subtle drums, a soft piano tune, and paradoxically calming, yet lurching, lyrics. Lykke Li sings lines such as "I let my good one down / I let my true love die / I had his heart, but I broke it every time" with such tranquil crooning that it may confuse the listener.

Perhaps the greatest attribute of the album is the way it offsets its

indie-pop production with often cold lyricism. Songs like "Just Like A Dream" and "Love Me Like I'm Not Made Of Stone" base themselves off simple, almost-familiar guitar licks and drumming but subvert expectations with haunting thoughts delivered in beautifully-controlled singing.

"I Never Learn" strives to make the listener question the common tropes of romance and consider more realistic viewpoints. Such contradictory ferocity is welcome in today's music. Lykke Li's complexity is here to stay.

# Big Guava impresses with big crowds, likely to return next year

Bright stage lights suddenly dimmed as thousands of people yelled and screamed in anticipation. A cube lit up, which re-

vealed a kitchen table and gray smoke. Suddenly two silhouettes appeared and burst to life as everyone sprung from their seats and cheered in utter glee. The energetic notes of "Bombs

Over Baghdad" played over the speakers — Outkast had finally returned to Florida.

Big Guava Festival in Tampa proved to be a monumental success for the city's live music scene. Held at the Florida State Fairgrounds from May 2 to 4, thousands flocked to see their favorite bands, discover new artists, ride the numerous thrill rides and enjoy the wide selection of food trucks.

Acts such as Vampire Weekend, Tegan and Sara, and Haim dominated the MidFlorida Credit Union Amphitheatre, while rising bands like Terraplane Sun played on smaller stages dispersed throughout the fairgrounds.

"[Florida] makes me feel like I'm on a tropical vacation" said Ben Rothbard, frontman of Terraplane Sun.

It was the first time the band had ever played Florida, and the members were ecstatic to play at the festival.



# Who's the Spidey-est Spider-Man?

The Spider-Man franchise did right by its fans when they chose Andrew Garfield for the series reboot, "The Amazing Spider-Man 2," which premiered May 2 in the U.S. and earned about \$92 million in its opening weekend. Though our



superheroes have been and will be portrayed by many actors, we should appreciate when one performance so completely captures what we love about a familiar character.

Garfield appears to understand the character's duality and expertly renders the angsty Peter Parker, who has been the champion of discombobulated youths everywhere for decades. He plays the part with a nuanced, methodical physicality. It's rare to find Garfield looking at the person he's having a serious conversation with, rather than down at the railing he's climbing over or the stone he's skipping, accurately portraying a young man with secrets and insecurities. He balances these insecurities with Spider-Man's confidence and melds the two into one cohesive, intriguing character.

Garfield's Spider-Man most distinguishes himself from Tobey Maguire's incarnation during his interaction with others. The dialogue of Maguire's days had a tendency toward forced monologues. Parker's interactions with his close friend, Harry Osborn, and his love interest, Mary Jane Watson, in the Maguire franchise was consistently serious and morose, with few smiles thrown in here and there.

Garfield's Parker is spontaneous and funny, and for this, a tip of the hat is owed to director Marc Webb, whose experience with romance gave the action thriller an intimate, charming feel. Webb directed the 2009 film, "(500) Days of Summer."

However, Webb's pacing of "The Amazing Spider-Man" is anything but slow and sappy. The film lasts 142 minutes, none of which drags. He directs Garfield so that Parker's retains his classical sensitivity while still remaining active. This bit of agency moves the story along and saves us from too many "Peter Parker sits on his bed brooding" scenes – like those we got from Maguire's pouty performance.

Garfield's Spider-Man is just how we like him: swaggering, mischievous and accident-prone. The hero's harmless naughtiness is one of his most enduring attributes. Sure, as one of Marvel's most empathetic, thoughtful characters, Peter Parker struggles with the desire to do right and defend those in need, but as Spider-Man, he relishes his unique position as the one and only web slinger.

## Top of the lineup comes up strong for Gators in home finale

In a season where non-conference mid-week matchups have proved to be potential pitfalls for Florida, coach Kevin O'Sullivan needed a strong performance from the top of his lineup to turn the tide Tuesday night against USF.

Within the first two innings, O'Sullivan got the answer he was looking for and, as a result, the No. 8 Gators (35-18) finished its home schedule with an 8-2 victory against the visiting Bulls (25-27).

Brett Morales, Florida's starting pitcher Tuesday night, gave up a run in each of the first two innings, which were USF's only two runs of the game. Down 2-1 heading into the bottom of the second frame, the Gators top three hitters in the lineup responded to spark a five-run inning.

After a throwing error by Bulls starting pitcher Lawrence Pardo that allowed Ryan Larson to score from first to tie the game at 2-2, UF loaded the bases with a Buddy Reed single, a Casey Turgeon walk and a Richie Martin hit by pitch.

On a 1-0 count, Harrison Bader lined the ball down the left-field line to clear the bases for a three-RBI double to give UF a 5-2 lead.

"I thought Harrison's (Bader) at bat was the probably the biggest with the bases loaded and kind of helped us relax and settle in," O'Sullivan said.

Turgeon, Martin and Bader, who are the Gators first three hitters in the top of the lineup, finished the game 6-for-10 at the plate while scoring six of Florida's eight total runs. Each of the three hitters also recorded

# Don't be fooled by Donald Sterling's apology on CNN

I was 16 years old when I most vividly remember being judged for the color of my skin. I was a black kid with a crush on a white girl, and I'll never forget the way I felt when she told me that her mother had made it clear that our relationship wasn't OK. If the girl's father were still alive, he absolutely wouldn't have let it happen, she said.

Being judged in that way is a pain that is difficult to put into words. It's a hurt that many of you who are reading this will never feel, and I'm thankful for that.

So as I watched Donald Sterling sit in his living room and speak to CNN's Anderson Cooper in a two-part interview, that was the emotional background I carried with me.

That wrinkled and despondent individual rambled, ranted and raved in his first public interview since making numerous racist remarks on an audio recording released first by TMZ and then by Deadspin.com.

If you watched just the beginning and the end of his sit down with Cooper, you may find him sympathetic. But I beg of you, don't be fooled.

To start the interview, Sterling broke down when speaking about his granddaughter, who was told at her Catholic nursery that she couldn't have a snack because candy was not offered to racists (Sterling did not clarify who said those words).

At the end, he cried again about being hurt by V. Stiviano — the other voice heard on the released audio — a woman he thought

cared for him and whom many assumed he was linked to romantically.

But if you watched the middle of the interview, you would have seen an embattled billionaire on the ropes, deflecting blame and trying to drag others down with him.

There was the portion when Cooper asks if Sterling had been in an intimate relationship with Stiviano — something she denies. Sterling tap-danced around the question.

"I don't think a gentleman should discuss any of the personal items that go on with a woman," he said.

It's an interesting, even chivalrous, thing to say. Maybe I'd buy it if Sterling didn't utter the following words in a 2003 sworn deposition:

"Well, I fool around sometimes. I do. When a girl seduces me and tells me all of these hot stories and dirty things and tells me how much she wants to suck on me and takes me shoes off and licks my feet and touches me."

Don't be duped by this man when he admits to the "terrible" things he says, calling them "stupid, foolish and uneducated." He says time and time again that he isn't a racist and appears flabbergasted that anyone would think he has a plantation mentality, even lashing out at Cooper.

"I think you have more of a plantation mentality than I do," Sterling said. "I think

you are more of a racist than I am because I'm not a racist, I've never been a racist and I'll never be a racist. I don't know what that means so have a (plantation) mentality."

Well Mr. Sterling, if you had a plantation mentality, you'd probably say something along the lines of "I support (the Clippers' players) and give them food, and clothes and cars, and houses," like you did on the audio recording.

If you possessed that ass-backwards way of thinking, you would most likely still believe that those you feel you own are still loyal to you when it is quite clear that they aren't.

You would probably tell Cooper something like, "they're mine and I'm theirs, I would do anything for them and they would to anything for me."

You would cling to false hope and your own pride in saying that your players, "still love you," and you would of course say, "they know I'm not a racist."

See Sterling for who he is: A man in complete and utter denial. Listen to him say that his players' protest of turning their jerseys inside out wasn't a consensus decision but peer pressure from a few within the locker room.

He thinks this is all a media ploy and a witch-hunt. He flat out refutes the concept of NBA commissioner Adam Silver ousting him as owner of the Clippers.

Sterling practically said all Magic Johnson

was good for was being a 6-foot-9 walking block of AIDS. Sterling then pumped himself up by implying that he is better than the former NBA star because he gives to inner-city youth in Los Angeles and publicizes it in a way that Johnson does not.

Johnson got the platform to voice his opinion Tuesday in the second half of Cooper's series and the Hall of Fame point guard took the high road as was expected. He was polished and gregarious with his 1,000-watt smile in a way that Sterling's frumpy demeanor never could be.

Johnson is the face of the franchise that has forever treated Sterling's club like the little brother across the hall in Staples Center, always living under the shadow of 16 purple-and-gold championship banners.

That is Sterling's real purpose for bringing someone who, besides his skin color and sole fact that he was in the initial picture with Stiviano, has nothing to do with the entire fiasco. Sterling saw this as another Laker trying to get the best of him just like when former Clippers vice president Elgin Baylor -- also a Lakers great -- went after him in court over racist allegations in 2009, which Sterling thinks is in no way connected to this situation, I might add.

Sterling reeks of jealousy, hatred and racism, and he reminded us of that in a pathetic ploy to clear his name and make his own attempt to not be forever seen as a reviled figure in the court of public opinion.

Unfortunately for the soon-to-be-former Clippers owner, the buzzer has sounded on

Against the Commodores, the Gators won all three singles matches in straight sets but were forced into tiebreaks in two of the

three doubles matches.

"They are very good in doubles, we barely got the doubles point last time on them," Thornqvist said. "I think just as it was then, the doubles point will be very, very critical (today)."

After an entire season in which the doubles pairings remained fairly consistent, Thornqvist was forced to break up his star duo of Olivia Janowicz and Kourtney Keegan due to Janowicz's injury.

The move worked in the tournament's first match as Brianna Morgan and Janowicz paired up on Court 3 to win the doubles point.

But in its next match against Oklahoma State, Florida dropped the doubles point for just the seventh time this season.

"Our first match against (South Carolina State) was very, very good I thought," Thornqvist said. "We moved a lot and we communicated well. Our (Court) 1 doubles against Oklahoma State was very good, but (Courts) 2 and 3 left a little bit to be desired."

The lack of chemistry between Janowicz and Morgan was apparent in that match as they lost 8-4.

If Florida has any hopes of advancing past Vanderbilt, it must go through one of the SEC's best doubles tandems — No. 20 duo Courtney Colton and Lauren Mira.

Despite the abrupt change in his team's pairings, Thornqvist is confident in the maturity and versatility of his players.

"We have a very even team so I think some of these players you could play three different spots really, and they're very unselfish," he said. "It was really just some of the fundamentals- making first serves and making returns. If we can address that [today] then I think we'll play a lot better."

the 100-meter dash and the 200-meter run — all events in which he has shown he can turn in top finishes for the Gators.

He recorded a first-place, personal-record finish in the 200m during the Tom Jones Memorial Invite on April 19 and took the title along with his teammates in the 100m dash.

But if there's room for improvement, he would like for it to come out of the sprint where the fastest men clock times globally.

"The 100 would have to be the event to work on," Wright said. "I have to work on my reaction time, staying in my drive phase, coming up, and proper form. It's coming along."

With a legitimate shot at the conference outdoor championship this season, Florida will take five of its top athletes who have compiled a list of honors throughout the outdoor season.

Dedric Dukes (SEC Men's Runner of the Week, USTFCCA National Men's Athlete of the Week), Kyra Jefferson

(SEC Co-Women's Runner of the Week), Kyle Strawn (SEC Co-Men's Field Athlete of the Week), Ciarra Brewer (SEC Women's Field Athlete of the Week) and Stipe Zunic (the newly added SEC Men's Field Athlete of the Week) all enter the championships with top marks throughout the season from April to May representing the Gators.

Florida owns nine conference titles — four on the men's side and five on the women's side. In order to bring a title back to Gainesville, the Gators can't rely on all the potential they possess but rather utilize it to finish on top.

"We're more confident when we are here (Gainesville) because it's our track," Wright said.

"We know how our track is and when we go out to a different track it's just the little preparation the day before we go practice to see how the track feels. Other than that everything is the same, we do what we do at practice and we do that same thing at the track meet."

one walk each.

"That's Casey (Turgeon) and I's job in the beginning of the game; we need to get on base," Martin said. "Our roles change during the game but obviously we try to get on base and let the big hitters do some damage."

Martin not only led the team with his 3-for-3 performance at the plate along with his three runs, but the

sophomore shortstop also excelled on the basepaths for the Gators.

Martin recorded his 16th stolen base of the season, which leads the squad. Also, two of his three runs scored came on wild pitches including the eighth and final run for Florida in the bottom of the eighth inning.

"He ran the bases extremely well," O'Sullivan said. "He was aggressive. That was a really, really instinctual play at third with two outs

there to score the eighth run."

After dropping three straight midweek matchups to Mercer, Florida A&M and Jacksonville, UF came through in the clutch with its 14th comeback victory to improve to 9-4 this season in midweek games.

With the postseason looming, O'Sullivan said Tuesday night's contest was a good challenge for his team to get in the right playoff mindset.

"We talked about that today,"

O'Sullivan said. "We need to learn to understand that very shortly here, there's going to be games being played where if you lose, this season is over. We need to play with a little more urgency."

"I don't want them to think they just need to turn the switch on in the regional or on Thursday night. We needed to start doing this now. We need to play every game like it's our last."

"We needed to play with some

urgency and intensity and not come into this game like we have in some midweek games kind of flat. We needed to try and show that."

The Gators concluded their home schedule with a record of 23-11 and head back on the road to face Tennessee in the final series of the regular season that begins at 6 p.m.

"We should go in and try to win every game," Martin said. "If we do that, we put our destiny in our own hands."

# Muschamp makes rounds across state addressing UF fans

ORLANDO, Fla., — It's not easy to stand in front of a fanbase that

just witnessed a 4-8 season and tell them everything is going to get better.

But that's what head coach Will

Muschamp has faced while speaking to Gator Clubs across the state of Florida for the last month.

The Central Florida Gator Club got its chance to ask the fourth-year head coach questions about the upcoming season on Tuesday night. After one of the worst years the Gators have experienced in recent memory, Muschamp said some of the questions are expected to be tough.

"I just think more than anything, 'Where are we as a program?' I think that's tough — probably fair is a better word," Muschamp said. "The concern of where things are headed and I certainly think that's fair after you go through what we went through last fall."

A true measuring stick for any football problem is how many of the team's players wind up on NFL rosters following the draft. Four former Gators were taken in this year's draft including defensive tackle Dominique Easley, who was taken by the New England Patriots in the first round. Seven more signed free agent deals.

Most notably, cornerbacks Loucheiz Purifoy and Marcus Roberson, who were both projected to be drafted in the early rounds of the NFL Draft, were undrafted after seven rounds. Purifoy signed a free

agent deal with the Indianapolis Colts. Roberson signed with the St. Louis Rams. Muschamp addressed how difficult it is for players to decide whether or not to forgo their senior seasons and declare for the NFL.

"Well the league minimum is like 400-something-thousand now," Muschamp said. "That's \$400,000 a lot more than what they've ever been exposed to. So it's all relative to what you think. My job is to get them all the information—that's a family decision."

The Gators are moving to a spread offensive scheme for 2014 — an offense that has been labeled as one that doesn't translate to the NFL. But Muschamp said it shouldn't be a concern whether the change offensively will affect draft stocks.

"Out of the offensive players taken in the last two drafts — there's been 12 offensive players taken in the top ten — ten of them come in

spread offenses. So it's not bothering those guys investing in millions and millions of dollars the fact of what offenses they come from."

He went on to say that the spread has crept into the NFL more than people realize, specifically at the quarterback position — one of the most scrutinized jobs in the league.

"In the NFL right now last year [for] every snap, 59.6 percent of the snaps were from the shotgun," Muschamp said. "So you're talking about six out of every 10 snaps are from the shotgun. Most NFL teams are in upwards of 70 percent of their snaps being from shotgun."

There are only 108 days until Florida welcomes Idaho to begin the 2014 season, which leaves plenty of time to sort through the issues the team suffered last year.

"This is a real critical summer for us," Muschamp said. "It always is, its every year but a new offense, our guys need to do a really good job of working each other and continuing to broaden everything what we're doing offensively. Same on defense — we've got some young faces at corner and some young faces backing up on the defensive front situation at safety so this is a critical, critical summer for us."

about it," Diep said. "The first two sets were kind of frustrating for me. I didn't feel great, but I kept fighting and I was having fun even though I was a little frustrated. ... I was feeling great in the third set, and I told Mark (Merklein) I was ready for another one."

Diep was also named the ITA Southeast Senior of the Year on Tuesday.

The Gators will enter the NCAA Round of 16 on Friday in Athens, Ga., where they will face the No. 3 Ohio State Buckeyes at 7 p.m.
