# \$45 million in renovations to the O'Connell Center

## New seats and sound system

The Stephen C. O'Connell Center will get a \$45 million face-lift next year, UF and the University Athletic Association announced Tuesday.

The UAA will contribute \$35 million and UF will finance the rest of the renovation, which is set to begin in March and end in December of 2015, said O'Connell Center Direc-

tor Lynda Reinhart.

"The scope of the project is going to be gutting the whole building, renovating it with new seats, new club seating and a club lounge," said Bahar Armaghani, assistant director and project manager for UF's Office of Planning, Design and Construction.

The renovation will also bring in a new high-definition video board hung in the center as well as an updated sound system.

However, Armaghani said the main renovation will be a prominent entryway facing east toward the James W. "Bill" Heavener Football Complex.

Located between gates one and two, the

new entrance will expand into an open circulation area with additional concession stands, ticketing and retail sales areas.

Reinhart said there are currently four entry points but none of them are distinct. She said the funding will give the center a more modernized look.

But not all changes are cosmetic.

Internal improvements like plumbing renovations and electrical rewiring will improve comfort and reduce energy consumption, Reinhart said.

## Children's Hospital rankings improve

The UF Health Shands Children's Hospital has been ranked among the nation's best children's hospitals this year, according to a new U.S. News & World Report list.

The annual report of pediatric centers was released Tuesday and evaluated 116 hospitals. The hospitals were then ranked in 10 specialty areas, and the top 50 hospitals with the highest scores were listed in each of these specialties. Shands Children's Hospital was ranked among the top 50 in seven of the 10 specialty areas.

"These rankings speak to the prominence that the University of Florida has nationally," said Dr. Scott Rivkees, chairman of the department of pediatrics in the UF College of Medicine.

"It shows that how we are continuing to excel and improve in this very important part of the UF mission," he said.

The hospital's rankings are especially impressive as it is a relatively small program compared with the larger hospitals listed on the report, he said.

"There's no other program in the United States of our size that has ranked as high as we did across the board," he said.

The hospital was ranked No. 14 in diabetes and endocrinology, No. 27 in cardiology and heart surgery, No. 34 in gastroenterology, No. 35 in pulmonology, No. 36 in neonatology, No. 41 in cancer and No. 41 in nephrology.

Of these seven, the hospital was ranked higher in five specialties compared to last year.

# UF student banned from campus for public masturbation



Local police identified a UF student on Wednesday after back-to-back public masturbation incidents earlier in the week.

Gainesville Police filed a sworn complaint for lewd acts against 18-year-old UF student Eric Cody Moxam after a joint investigation with University Police, according to a UF emergency notification.

A female student called UPD on Wednesday after she witnessed Moxam masturbating while sitting on a bench near Little Hall on Tuesday around 11:30 a.m., according to the notification.

Gainesville Police also responded on Monday to reports of Moxam allegedly masturbating near Sorority Row, according to the notification.

Moxam has not responded to multiple requests to comment.

The woman who reported the incident to UPD said Moxam sat next to her on the bench for about 10 minutes after which she noticed him masturbating. She then left the area.

UPD filed a sworn complaint against Moxam for lewd/lascivious acts as well as trespassing Moxam from campus, according to the notification.

"He's trespassed from campus," said UF spokeswoman Janine Sikes, meaning Moxam cannot attend class or set foot on campus for an undetermined amount of time.

**Court: Warrantless cell tracking unconstitutional**

MIAMI — A federal appeals court has ruled that investigators must obtain a search warrant to collect records from cellphone towers that are often used to track suspects' movements. A three-judge panel of the 11th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals agreed on Wednesday with the American Civil Liberties Union that the cellphone data is protected by the Constitution's ban on unreasonable searches and seizures.

The ruling means authorities must meet a higher legal standard of probable cause in order to gain access to the data.

The ruling came in the Miami case of Quartavious Davis, who is serving a 162-year sentence for a string of armed robberies.

The 11th Circuit let his convictions stand.

**Fla. school bus driver fired for letting son drive**

TAMPA — A 52-year-old school Hillsborough County school bus driver has been fired after an investigation found she let her son drive the vehicle without students on board.

The Tampa Bay Times reported that Robinson admitted she allowed her son to take the bus to have it cleaned and detailed on April 27.

Robinson says she was fired in retaliation for speaking out about problems in the department over the past few months.

School district officials said retaliation had nothing to do with Robinson's firing.

# Man allegedly hit car, found with weed, pills

► HE HAD 14 GRAMS OF WEED.

A Gainesville man was arrested on Wednesday after allegedly having 14 grams of weed in his car, along with prescription pills.

Police arrested 26-year-old Theodore White on charges of possession of a controlled substance, possession of less than 20 grams of weed, not having a valid driver's license and leaving the scene.

White was driving a car eastbound on West University Avenue and hit another car, creating about \$3,000 in damage to the car, according to a police report. White did not stop and continued driving eastbound on West University Avenue.

An officer located the car White was driving at the Gainesville Regional Airport.

After questioning, White told officers he drove the car but said a car backed into his. A records check showed that White did not currently have a valid driver's license, according to the report.

An officer saw a plastic baggie containing 14 grams of weed laying on the driver's floorboard. Underneath the weed baggie, an officer found a small plastic baggie containing tablets later found to be Xanax pills.

After questioning, White admitted to possession of the weed and 25 Xanax pills. White said he uses them both for personal use.

Officers booked him into the Alachua County Jail about 1:15 a.m. on Wednesday. He was released Wednesday at about 12:25 p.m.

By how much, Reinhart couldn't say. Project managers have yet to choose a design team that will finalize the sketch and create a more detailed timeline.

Two-time All-American and one-time All-SEC UF swimmer Lindsey McKnight said the center could use the renovation.

"For some of the big dual meets, people end up standing

on the sides just because there's not enough room for seating," she said.

The 20-year-old UF political science junior said she's especially looking forward to the new chairs.

"I've known people to even bring seat cushions 'cause they're sitting there for so long," she said.

During the 10 months of renovation, no one will be sitting there.

Reinhart said UF is planning

to relocate practices and concerts during that time but has yet to secure a space.

In order to be completed by the December 2015 deadline, the project is slated to begin in March. If the design team agrees, it will begin even earlier, Reinhart said.

"We're looking at every opportunity that we have to make it as efficient as we can," she said. "It's gonna be a great project, and we're going to have a great product when it's finished."

Mark Amox, the executive director for UF Health Shands Children's Hospital, attributes this jump in rankings to the hospital's awareness of and dedication to areas that need improvement.

Kerry Caputo, a 21-year-old UF biology senior, works as a student volunteer at Shands through the Streetlight program, which partners volunteers with chronically ill teenage patients. Caputo cites the excellent personal care and compassion of the staff and volunteers as one of the reasons the hospital has achieved these national rankings.

Like a sports team victory, these new rankings offer the UF community another reason to celebrate its school.

"It's another source of pride," Caputo said.

## Local startup Paracosm wins \$50K

Gainesville 3-D tech startup Paracosm won second place and \$50,000 at this year's CAT5 Awards Competition in Orlando.

For the competition, which took place June 3, Paracosm focused on the mechanical, electrical and plumbing industry's use of its product.

"There are so many inefficiencies, structural errors that happen simply because people don't have good data and information about existing buildings," said business development team member Gannon Wilder. "With our device, they are able to go and scan the places... so in the future, it really

reduces labor inefficiencies and other kinds of errors."

Paracosm plans to use the CAT5 prize money to further grow the company, hoping to increase customers and improve technology.

The company provides 3-D capture and reconstruction technologies. Its product applications range from creating spatial intel-

ligence for robots to using 3-D models for renovation projects.

"Paracosm's team has an exciting aesthetic edge, which is rare for folks who are very good at technology development," said Andrea Wesser, associate director of the University of Central Florida Venture Accelerator.

Hysence Technology took home the \$100,000 first place prize, according to the Space Florida website, one of the sponsors of the competition.

Paracosm is currently working on pilot projects with the U.S. Department of Transportation in Washington, D.C., and with NASA's Virginia facility. Its next target market is forensics and the recreation of crime scenes.

## Sexual assault ranks don't make the list

An activist group is trying to push the Princeton Review to include information on sexual assault in its rankings, but members of the UF community disagree.

The activist group, Ultra-Violet, is asking the Princeton Review to survey students about how their schools are dealing with sexual violence on campus, according to the group's website.

"The Princeton Review is simply not equipped to take on the task accurately," said Rita Lawrence, an interpersonal violence prevention coordinator for GatorWell Health Promotion Services. "The way that they do surveys, they send it out, and the responses they get on average is 333. Is it reliable to say that 333 people are representative of a campus of 50,000?"

The fear is that students may also use these rankings to avoid schools with poor rankings in the hopes of avoiding sexual violence, rather than informing themselves about the pervasive nature of sexual violence, Lawrence said.

Consistency is another concern, said Associate Dean of Students Chris Loschiavo.

His concerns stem from questions about how the Princeton Review would make sure the surveys would fairly compare a variety of factors among universities, such as campus size and resources.

"Unless they come up with a fair system of being able to figure out how to track and then evaluate the rankings, I don't know that it's going to

make a lot of sense," Loschiavo said. "You're not comparing apples to apples."

While the consensus is the Princeton Review may not be the proper avenue for these requests to have the desired impact, Diamond Delancy, a 19-year-old UF public relations junior and president of the Women's Student Association, believes that the real benefit of this request is the increased dialogue about ending sexual violence.

"It may seem radical, but it's been a long time coming," said Delancy, who herself was a victim of sexual assault.

"I think they're doing what they think is best, and they're trying to find an answer for a question that's been ignored for a really long time," she said.

### Sexual assault statistics for college-aged students

- 3,330 forcible sex offenses were reported on campuses in 2011, according to an Education Department survey, .
- This was a 51 percent increase from the 2,200 reported a decade earlier.
- More than 75 percent of women who reported a rape were under 25 at the time of their assault, According to an Education Department survey, .
- More than 25 percent of victims of reported rapes are between 18 and 24.

### Clearing the air: Monday's coitus interruptus column

On Monday, the Alligator ran a column titled "Pull and pray: Yay or Nay?" singing the praises of the pull-out birth control method. We realize that the piece didn't emphasize a few key pieces of information: That, like all birth control, the pull-out method isn't for everyone, and furthermore, the study quoted in the article stipulated that the pull-out method should be used in conjunction with other forms of birth control.

However, that doesn't mean the pull-out method is bad: It all depends on who is using it.

Like drinking alcohol or firing a shotgun, the safety issue isn't about the act itself: It's about who's doing it. And like all birth control methods, you should consult your doctor or a Planned Parenthood consultant before trying it. Students can also schedule a free consultation at the UF Student Health Care Center.

The pull-out method is most effective for couples in a committed relationship, and it's also best used concurrently with other forms of birth control. The Guttmacher Institute study stated, "One-third of women at risk of unintended pregnancy used withdrawal as a contraceptive method within the past 30 days, often in combination or rotation with more effective methods."

According to Planned Parenthood, of every 100 women whose partners use withdrawal, four will become pregnant each year if they always do it correctly. Of every 100 women whose partners use withdrawal, 27 will become pregnant each year if they don't always do it correctly.

The other elephant in the room when it comes to the withdrawal method is what happens immediately prior — pre-cum. Does it get you pregnant? Scientists aren't sure yet, but a 2010 study of 27 men showed that 11 of the men's pre-cum contained sperm, and in 10 of those cases a "reasonable proportion of the sperm was motile."

At any rate, the existing research on pre-cum is inconsistent, but it should still factor into your decision on whether or not to try the pull-out method.

New York Magazine's "The Cut" put it best when referencing the "pullout" generation: "Every single American woman who's now in her childbearing years came of age in the era of legal birth control. Many were prescribed the pill before they even started having sex. For years, the pullout method was taboo — seen as non-birth control for ignorant risk-takers."

This is changing as organizations like Planned Parenthood and Bedsider seek to paint a more accurate picture of what the pull-out method can look like. Despite its negative reputation, spread in part by pop culture, the pull-out method can be a viable option — within reason.

But the numbers don't lie: Coitus interruptus can be an effective form of birth control if you're with a partner you trust and if you consider using additional methods of contraception and sexually transmitted disease protection, like a condom or dental dam.

### Obama gives hope to students with loans

Earlier this week, President Barack Obama outlined key changes to how millions of Americans repay their student loans. After years of typical political talk about student loan reform, someone finally took action on a growing issue that seriously threatens our economy.

Just six years after the Great Recession devastated the economy of the U.S., a new bubble appears ready to burst, and it's a bubble familiar to many of you reading this column: student loans.

Most estimates peg the total student loan debt in the U.S. to somewhere around \$1 trillion. That's an astounding number. Not only are current and former students amassing gargantuan amounts of debt — unlike most loans — student loans can neither be refinanced nor can they be wiped out if you were to file for bankruptcy. If you hold student loan debt, you might not qualify for a mortgage, be able to finance a new car or start your own business.

In other words, student loans will follow you, haunt you and cripple you until you pay them off.

Thankfully, some in Washington, D.C. are finally starting to take action, including Obama.

An executive order signed by the president caps student loan repayments at 10 percent of one's annual income and forgives loans after 20 years if they're not paid in full. It's the first steps to avoiding a crisis and helping millions of Americans buried in debt.

In Congress, Sen. Elizabeth Warren of Massachusetts is pushing a bill that would allow individuals to refinance student loans, something desperately needed for borrowers trapped with high interest rates without the opportunity to refinance at a lower rate.

Neither proposal is a perfect plan, but it's far more than anyone's taken in recent years to curb the looming storm generated by \$1 trillion in outstanding student loan debt.

It is imperative that Congress takes action now and doesn't play politics over student loans. Shuffling their feet, ignoring the economic warning signs, or committing partisan warfare over student loan reform seriously jeopardizes the U.S. economy and the ability for young people to get out from the Everest-sized mountain of debt accrued in recent

years.

Our economy is based on the spending habits of consumers. If student borrowers can't qualify for loans to buy houses, cars or start businesses, what's the future of the American economy or, for that matter, the country?

The cost of higher education has skyrocketed in recent years, and in many cases, the only way to afford college is through student loans. Loans keep the dream of a college education alive for millions of Americans, but that dream quickly becomes a nightmare following graduation.

Thoughts of paying more than a monthly interest payment on student loans are nothing more than distant fantasies for young people struggling to find a job with decent pay. With student loan reform, that fantasy gets a little closer to reality, and the stranglehold around the necks of millions might soon be lifted.

Some might disagree with the idea of providing solutions to the student debt crisis. After all, students should understand the risks of loans before borrowing, right?

Students certainly need to understand the risks of borrowing before they agree to bury themselves in debt, but treating them like indentured servants is not the right solution.

Still think we should ignore the problem? Here's another consideration: To avoid a full-blown economic meltdown in 2008, Congress bailed out the big banks to the tune of \$700 billion. If consumers are the engine that drives the American economy, what can be done for those buried in student loan debt?

In no way is this a call for the federal government to simply forgive \$1 trillion in student loans: That would be ludicrous. Instead, we need to offer student borrowers options that allow to them to pay off their loans. Politicians are actually offering real solutions to the student loan crisis, and it's time we support the reform proposals.



## Friday at The Hipp: 'Night Moves'

Ecoterrorism, the subject of Kelly Reichardt's "Night Moves," is a tricky topic to think about.

For many of us, the wanton destruction of the environment — with no thought for the future or the welfare of other living creatures — is tantamount to a capital offense. It is senseless, idiotic, and — most maddening of all — out of our control. I can understand the temptation to become a vigilante and do what politicians and businessmen are too scared to do.

This is the topic of "Night Moves" — a tense, unsettling film that uses the passions and convictions of ecoterrorism to explore guilt and how we handle our lives falling apart.

Three unlikely partners hatch a plan to blow up a local dam. Josh (Jesse Eisenberg) is a troubled and humorless man living on an agricultural co-op. Dena (Dakota Fanning) is a college dropout who bankrolls the operation out of her trust fund. Harmon (Peter Sarsgaard) is a former Marine. We follow them through the two phases of the act: the buildup and the inevitable consequences.

Josh is the leader and the focus of the film. He's the most passionate and deliberate of the three, but Reichardt and Eisenberg make him too relatable for him to be evil. You know where he is coming from. His motive for destroying



the dam is clear — he muses that it is killing all the salmon so that you can run your fu\*\*ing iPod all day. His chemistry with Dena and Harmon is expertly placed on the edge of confrontational. Eisenberg gives all he can

to the role and is excellent. He manages to be vulnerable and intimidating at the same time.

The theme of technology and convenience destroying nature is powerfully shown through the cinematography. "Night Moves" is a beautifully composed movie. One memorable sequence shows serene, silent mountains and rivers before cutting to a blaring bulldozer on a landfill.

Reichardt's feel for the natural world is appropriate for as real a movie as this. There are no thriller clichés — the majority of the screen time is quiet dialogue. Tension is built instead through a growing sense of dread. Enough little things go wrong that I thought the plan wouldn't work — that they would be caught or killed.

The last scene will seem unsatisfactorily ambiguous to some but to me, the best endings leave you thinking and analyzing. Reichardt didn't need to tidily wrap it up. "Night Moves" is a great film that will be in my mind for a while.

I give it four stars out of five.

# Local band The Savants of Soul: A Swamp Records success story

Justin McKenzie, 25, asked a crowd of about 100 dancing, sweaty concertgoers at The JAM on Saturday night, "Who's thirsty?"

While taking sips from their various pints of beer and water, the members of the audience responded, "We are!"

Sweaty or not, the audience wasn't thirsty for beer or water.

The audience was thirsty for more horn-blasting, feet-moving music from the 10-piece, Gainesville-based soul band, The Savants of Soul, who just completed recording their first album, "Downtown Sound," on UF's student-operated Swamp Records label.

The record company will help the band with marketing the album, including helping with the band's website, logo and potentially organizing an album release party.

"They stood out with their craft and how important their music is to them," Auberry said. "They're the total package."

members Preston Bryant (keyboard/guitar), Deacon Batchelor (drums) and Mark Glick (cello).

Their sound ranged from gleefully misanthropic to somber and heartfelt. Many of the songs on "Christmas Island" deal with death and grief following the passing of Bonnette's grandfather, including the striking ballad "Linda Ronstadt," in which Bonnette describes a true story about breaking down in a museum after seeing a video installation about singer Linda Ronstadt.

"I almost made it through a year of choking down my fears/But they're gone for now, all thanks to Linda Ronstadt," Bonnette sang. In the same show, they performed a track off their 2011 album, "Knife Man," titled "Fucc the Devil," which opens with the line, "I'm gonna f\*\*k the devil in his mouth."

And though the sound is chaotic and frantic, you can relax about getting close to the stage at an Andrew Jackson Jihad show these days.

"Mosh as gently as you can," Bonnette beseeched the audience after a few songs. He went on to gently remind the concertgoers that no one

wants to "get a kick to the melon" by a crowd surfer.

The crowd's high energy, Gallaty said, is due in part to the age of their fans: Though the men of Andrew Jackson Jihad are in their 30s, a considerable amount of their avid listeners are teens and 20-somethings.

"I think it's great," Gallaty said. "The kids are the ones that are gonna be in the bands of the next generation. So yeah, I just think that's wonderful...and I love talking to 'em. I think it's really awesome when they come up and tell me what they think because I remember being that nervous kid when I was that age."

This summer marks Andrew Jackson Jihad's 10th year as a band — 10 years of playing shows, recording and watching their audience transform from nervous kids to musicians themselves. In a recent Reddit AMA, one Redditor asked the band why they've eliminated certain songs from their set lists over the years.

"There are songs off the first album where I'm just like, 'Nah.' It just doesn't excite me anymore," Gallaty said.

"We like to challenge our fans," Gallaty said, "and we like to do what we like to do."

# Wild Iris recognized as one of US's last feminist bookstores

Wild Iris Books, home to Gainesville's feminist community, is one of the last bookstores of its kind in the U.S., according to a story published last week in PolicyMic Magazine, and it plans to stay that way.

Owners Erica Merrell and Cheryl Calhoun have kept Florida's only feminist bookstore running through donations and volunteers.

In 2012, the community showed its appreciation in an astounding way when people donated about \$6,000 to keep the store from closing down, Merrell said.

The money helped the store move

to a better, cheaper location that cut operating expenses by 65 percent and brought the store's 7-year-old inventory up-to-date.

"(National Women's Liberation), as individual women, do our best to shop at and support Wild Iris," said Kendra Vincent, chair of Gainesville's National Women's Liberation.

The store essentially takes the dying art of bookselling and adds feminism behind it, Merrell said.

"Bookstores like Wild Iris carry titles other bookstores don't, or won't," UF English professor Stephanie Smith wrote in an email. "Feminist bookstores put content above competition."

These stores work as anchors in the community by drawing people in and making them want to connect, said Katy Burnett, the president of Gainesville's National Organization for Women.

"If you go into Barnes and Noble, it's not like that," she said. "There are so many books, you don't know what to do. There's no connection."

Although the owners and the workers of Wild Iris don't get a dime of the profits, they hold on because it's not just a bookstore — it's a sanctuary.

"I think every owner of Wild Iris has put something on the line," Merrell said. "Whether it be their house or their credit or a little bit of their

retirement money."

Wild Iris has changed people's lives, she said.

Originating in the 1970s as a women's space, the store has always played a part in the activist movement. It gave the courage for some to come out for the first time, and kids have skipped school to retreat to the store, saying it saved their lives, Merrell said.

"That's why we all do it, even though we struggle on the side."

Despite the array of definitions surrounding feminism, Merrell describes it as striving for equality for everyone.

"I try really hard with this store to be very gender-fluid and very

conscious about the language we use because I have never thought that feminism was just for women," she said.

As for what is actually featured on its shelves, the store tries to give every voice some shelf-space and give value to everyone's story, whether it be the voices of minorities, kids, women or the disabled.

The store also offers antique jewelry and sells online books on its website.

"I think that it's really important to have spaces like this," Vincent said. "It says a lot about the Gainesville community that we're able to continue to support a feminist bookstore here in town."

## Phillips resigns as wide receivers coach for personal reasons

One year, six months and eight days after he officially joined the Florida football staff, Joker Phillips is out as the Gators' wide receivers coach after resigning Wednesday, according to the school's website.

"I'm thankful for the opportunity that the University of Florida and Will Muschamp provided to me and my family, but at this time I have decided to step down from my position on the UF coaching staff for personal reasons," Phillips said in a statement released by UF.

Muschamp announced that graduate assistant Chris Leak, who quarterbacked the Gators to a national championship in 2006, will replace Phillips.



Leak joined the offensive coaching staff in May 2013 after a few stints in the Canadian Football League and Arena Football League following his graduation from Florida in 2006.

Phillips, who coached Kentucky to a 13-24 record from 2010 to 2012, joined the Gators to help turn around a struggling receiving corps that suffered through four different wide receivers coaches from 2009 to 2012.

With the constant turnover at the position, Phillips vowed to be a long-term solution when he was initially hired.

## UF sprinters off to fast start at NCAA Outdoors

After the Gators' subpar effort from the previous NCAA Indoors, the Florida track squads had another chance at redemption.

With 25 athletes (12 women, 13 men) having traveled to Eugene, Ore., for NCAA Outdoors, Florida put on an impressive start qualifying 11 of the first 16 athletes to begin the competition.

The defending champion 4x100-meter men's lineup sprinted to an easy first place finish — clocking a time of 38.77 seconds advancing Antwan Wright, Hugh Graham Jr., Arman Hall and Dedric Dukes to the

finals.

"I think this is one of the most exciting championships we've been to when you look at the qualifiers," coach Mike Holloway said. "Looking at it overall we've been as healthy as we have all year long."

With the commanding opening to Day 1, other Florida athletes stood out in qualifying fashion.

Ryan Schnulle traveled back in the final stretch of 800-meter run to take second place and qualify for finals with a time of 1:49.48.

His co-800 meter runner senior mid-distance Sean Obinwa, who ran

## Four-star QB verbally commits after attending football camp

Florida has landed its quarterback of the future.

Sheriron Jones (6-foot-2, 189 pounds, Moreno Valley, Calif., Rancho Verde High) verbally committed to Florida on Sunday following his attendance at a football camp in Gainesville. Jones is the No. 10 ranked quarterback in the 2015 class.

Despite meeting with coaches throughout the weekend while at camp, the quarterback said it wasn't the coaching staff that convinced him to play his next four years at UF — it was the players he talked to that won him over.

"They basically were like, 'If you want to be here, you're going to be here and everyone's going to love you here,'" Jones said. "It's like that at every college, but I felt like

those guys were being like big brothers to me, and I felt like it was family."

Jones specified that fullback Hunter Joyer, defensive tackle Joey Ivie and tight end Tevin Westbrook were responsible for truly making him feel at home.

California is a long way from Florida — in fact, Gainesville is more than 2,000 miles from his hometown of Moreno Valley. But Jones said he was willing to commit wherever he felt most comfortable, however far from California that may have been.

"I felt like I was at home in Gainesville," he said. "I was open to going anywhere, as long as I felt like it was family oriented. I didn't pay any mind to going across the country."

Jones added that offensive coordinator Kurt Roper easily convinced him that his skillset will fit in UF's new system, and he

## Gators in NBA playoffs not producing due to limited minutes

With the Miami Heat and San Antonio Spurs still vying for an NBA championship, two former Gators are playing, but neither is making much of a contribution to his team's postseason run.

Heat power forward Udonis Haslem — who averaged just 3.8 points per game on 14.2 minutes per contest in the regular season — has registered 36 points in 14 postseason appearances.

Haslem logged a mere three minutes in the first three games of the NBA Finals, with his only recorded statistic being a personal foul in Miami's 98-96 win in Game 2.

Likewise, former Gator Matt Bonner has made minimal contributions for the Spurs off the bench this postseason, averaging just 1.2 points per contest since the regular season concluded.

The 6-foot-10 power forward's best outings in the postseason came in Games 4 and 6 of the Western Conference Finals when he recorded a combined 14 points, five rebounds and two assists against the Oklahoma City Thunder.

Bonner notched two points on a pair of free throws and an assist in San Antonio's 111-92 win against Miami in Game 3 of the NBA Fi-

nals on Tuesday, his first recorded statistic in the series.

**Gators work out:** With the NBA Draft set for June 26, three Florida players have been busy working out with various NBA teams.

Patric Young has practiced for multiple teams over the past two weeks, including the New York Knicks and the Chicago Bulls.

Young, the 2014 Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Year and an honorable mention AP All-American, paced the Gators with 41 blocks while ranking 12th in the SEC with 6.2 rebounds per game. He finished his UF career as the 11th player in Gators history to finish his career with at least 1,300 points and 800 rebounds.

Scottie Wilbekin recently worked out with the Charlotte Hornets as well as the Knicks, hoping to show he's worthy of a draft pick. The Gainesville native was the 2014 SEC Player of the Year and a third-team All-American after averaging 13.1 points per game and pacing the Gators with 3.6 assists per game and 56 steals in a team-best 34 minutes per contest.

Casey Prather, who led UF with 13.8 points per game on 60.3-percent shooting, has worked out with the Philadelphia 76ers, the Heat and the Hornets but is not expected to be drafted.

# Sterling fights against notion he is mentally unfit to run trust

LOS ANGELES — A trial will be held next month to determine whether Donald Sterling, who opposes his estranged wife's planned sale of the Los Angeles Clippers, was properly removed as an administrator for the family trust that owns the team.

An attorney for Shelly Sterling went to probate court Wednesday to request a trial to confirm that as sole trustee she can proceed with

the \$2 billion sale to former Microsoft CEO Steve Ballmer.

The development is the latest in a legal tug-of-war that has ensued following the NBA's decision to ban Sterling for life after racist remarks he made emerged in a recording in April. Sterling is fighting the decision and suing the league for \$1 billion.

The trial, which was granted exceptionally quickly, will begin July 7 and last four days. The deadline for the sale is July 15, which is also the date the NBA Board of Govern-

nors is scheduled to vote on whether it will approve the sale.

Donald Sterling's lawyer, Bobby Samini, left the courthouse without comment after a clerk announced the trial schedule. Neither Sterling was present.

"I just want to resolve this as quickly as possible," NBA Commissioner Adam Silver told The

Associated Press in Miami on Wednesday, when he appeared at an NBA Cares event.

The crux of the case will center on the question of whether the 80-year-old Sterling is mentally competent to be a co-trustee of The Sterling Family Trust, which gives him the authority to determine the team's future. According to the trust's terms, he can be ruled "mentally incapacitated" after being evaluated by two doctors, said Pierce O'Donnell, Shelley Sterling's attorney.

According to court documents, three doctors examined Donald Sterling in May and concluded that he suffers from "mild cognitive impairment consistent with early Alzheimer's Disease" or some other forms of brain disease.

One doctor, James E. Spar, who is affiliated with the division of geriatric psychiatry at UCLA, said he believes "Mr. Sterling is at risk of making potentially serious errors of judgment, impulse control and recall in the management of his finances and his trust."

# American Outlaws aim at goal of increased fan support

JACKSONVILLE — Beautiful chaos precedes the beautiful game. It's hot and sticky, just the way it will be every afternoon for the next four months in Northern Florida, but they are not deterred. They march for the sport they love. They march for their country's colors and the team they're so passionate about — their only hope is that their passion bleeds over to you. If you hang around them long enough, it's impossible not to get swept up in the red, white and blue fever they exude from their pores right along with the sweat from the June heat.

They are the American Outlaws, the rabid fan base with more than 125 chapters nationwide that meet mostly in bars to cheer on the U.S. men's national team whenever they play. They boast a membership of over 10,000 people, collecting dues of \$25 per year per person. They won't let a chapter start in a particular city until 25 people have gotten together to pledge the yearly amount.

On this day, the Jacksonville contingent, founded in 2010 with a mission "to get an organized but chaotic following of the U.S. men's national team," tailgates before the 2-1 win over Nigeria in the final send-off game before the team heads to Brazil to compete in the World Cup.

The group rivals — even at some points surpassing — the wildest Florida-Georgia tailgate in sheer craziness outside EverBank Field. It's fine if you don't believe it, this is America after all. How many people actually care about soccer?

The answer is thousands, and it's clear to see how unbelievably passionate they are about the 23 men you'll see competing on the pitch Monday evening against Ghana.

Smoke bombs go off in the middle of a lot next to Russ Doe's Sandwich Shop, which serves as the Outlaws' gameday base of operations a few blocks away from EverBank. The continuous pounding of a drum is the pulsating rhythm of the afternoon. It keeps the different chants on beat hours before the game even starts.

A young man that has climbed on the roof of Russ Doe's leads the chanting crowd below in a rendition of "I believe that we will win." The natives yell their own rallying cry "Duval," a nod to the county that comprises the nation's largest city.

But beyond the beer and the incessant yelling, there is family. Many at the tailgate aren't members of the specific Jacksonville Outlaws chapter or even residents of Florida at all. They're no-

madic supporters that follow the team wherever they go, linking up with fellow Outlaws once they get to their destination.

"This is what I do," said Jonathan Slate, president of the Nashville, Tenn., chapter of the American Outlaws. And like his fellow fans, he travels far and wide to see the US play.

"This is my hobby. This is 100 people that I've become friends with and who have become family for me with the soccer games and everything."

The conversation is cut short. A group wants anyone within shouting distance to know that "you can't score on Timmy Howard (the U.S.' goalkeeper)," because — pardon the French — "he's big and tall like a f\*\*\*ing brick wall." The chant goes on and on "fourth verse, same as the first." But it's "a whole lot louder and a whole lot worse."

For the last decade, Andrew Wagner has been traveling around, following the team to games. The US-Nigeria matchup is his second time in Jacksonville for a game, and he's seen the team in Washington, D.C., Philadelphia, Tampa, Nashville and Columbus, Ohio, to name a few of his stops.

"I think (the fan support) was a lot different in the last World Cup cycle," Wagner said. "A lot of what the American Outlaws do definitely help create that hype because everyone can latch on to a single group and come together like this."

He's a lot like Mike Fera — coincidentally a University of Florida graduate. But Fera has upped the ante as a member of the Outlaws, not just going to domestic games but also traveling abroad to see the team play.

"My big thing now is I go to the away games," he said. "That's like a tight knit community. This is fun, but when you go to away games it's the same 40 faces in a hostile environment. You walk into Kingston (Jamaica) and you develop lifelong friendships when you're like 'damn, if we're not boys, we're about to die.'"

These soccer fans come in all shapes, sizes, colors and, obviously, genders. One Outlaw from Atlanta named Skylar Ward spoke to alligatorSports about what it's like to be a female member of the group. She says she doesn't get the typical treatment female fans of other sports teams get. Nobody asks her if her boyfriend got her into it, or which midfielder she finds most attractive.

"You don't really get that with soccer," she said. "I think it's because Americans are just now catching on to the soccer bus that whether you're man or woman it doesn't really effect it, everyone's just jumping on board."

While the Outlaws are the host of the packed pregame party, it's not just limited to members. Many that aren't affiliated with the supporters group at all come, looking for a good time with friends and hopefully a victory for the U.S. Together, they form the largest crowd to ever watch a game in the Southeast as more than 52,000 people fill EverBank Field to watch the game. Thanks to that, the members of the Outlaws find the greatest vindication that their push to grow soccer hysteria in this country is working.

"This is the most validating thing for a soccer fan," Fera said. "As a soccer fan, you're kind of on the outskirts of sports fandom, your average bro is just going to make fun of a soccer dude. But over here, 50,000 people like this? This is what it's about."

With an hour left before the game is set to kickoff, the march begins. Up Church Street to Parker, then a right on Duval ending at the gate outside the stadium. They cheer with anticipation, and they carry with them a movement. They want you to join them, to support the team they love so dearly. One day, they hope they won't be outlaws, but instead just as mainstream as any other fan of the major sports in this country.

Until then, listen closely, and do not tread on them. The American Outlaws will continue to cheer with all that is in them for their team and for their sporting way of life.

If the men's national team comes to your city, they will flood it in droves, painting your downtown the colors of the American flag.

Unlike that of a human's, the beauty of their chaos is not fleeting. The American Outlaws are here to stay.
