KISSIMMEE – Sixteen area African American leaders were honored by U.S. Rep. Darren Soto Feb. 16 when he read their biographies into the Congressional Record in Washington, D.C. as part of Black History Month. Rep. Soto gave Congressional Certificates to several of the 16 at his field office in Kissimmee Feb. 23. Some of the 16 include:

The family of James P. Austin of Lake Wales was honored. Austin made staff sergeant during World War II. After the war he and his family founded the Lake Wales NAACP, of which he was

president for 33 years. Austin was the first African American mayor of Lake Wales.

Lawrence Epps graduated LWHS in 1969, the first year of integration in Polk County. Epps got an associate's degree and became a special deputy with PCSO for six years. The Epps Funeral Home owner and ordained minister served the community for four decades.

In 1993, Keva Harris was the first African American woman to be hired as an officer by the Haines City Police Department. Harris was promoted to captain in 2017 and is a longtime member of the Haines City NAACP.

Wanda Faye Howard is

the first female president of the Lake Wales NAACP. Howard is a long time Lake Wales volunteer, among other community involvements.

Shawn Kinsey of Winter Haven is the current chairman of the Polk County Democratic Executive Committee, past president of the Winter Haven NAACP and member of the Winter Haven Public Education Partnership board, among many other community involvements.

A long time resident of Winter Haven, Recy Taylor was kidnapped and assaulted by six men in Alabama in 1944.

Webber president gets death threat over arming school staff

BARTOW – Polk County Sheriff Grady Judd is not waiting on legislators in Tallahassee to protect county students from gun violence.

Current federal and state law states, in part, that the only people authorized to carry weapons on school campuses are law enforcement officers. Sheriff Judd recently described these laws as lunacy, saying people can be armed in many areas of the community but not schools,

and that state legislators are working to change that.

If passed as written, Florida House Bill 621 and Florida Senate Bill 1236 would allow school administrators to have military veterans or retired law enforcement officers who have completed additional training specific to school shooter scenarios to be armed on campus in addition to school resource officers. The earliest that either bill could be passed into law is July 2018.

In the meantime, since it's currently legal for a

law enforcement officer to be armed on campus, Sheriff Judd created something called the PCSO Sentinel Program. This program is about putting teachers, coaches or other volunteers through 135 hours of specialized training and deputizing them. Said volunteers would have no law enforcement authority beyond protecting students in the event of an active shooter scenario. To date, the only county school administrators to initiate such help are administrators at Southeastern

University in Lakeland, which started using the PCSO Sentinel Program in 2017.

On Feb. 22, Webber International University in Babson Park became the second county school to complete the process of being part of the PCSO Sentinel Program.

Webber International University CEO and President Dr. Keith Wade said in August 2017, PCSO staff were providing active shooter training on campus, and afterward, he and his

Bartow cheer: best team on planet

BARTOW – The Bartow High School varsity and junior varsity cheerleading teams were recognized Feb. 19 by the Bartow City Commission for recently earning world and national championships respectively.

After winning their fifth consecutive state 2A FHSAA Championship Feb. 4 at the University of Florida, the varsity team went on to compete at the national level Feb. 10-11

at a ESPN Wide World of Sports facility at Walt Disney World in Orlando. The Yellow Jackets finished second nationwide Feb. 10, but on the following day, they finished first in a world competition in the large co-ed division.

It was their first ever world championship.

The junior varsity team won their first ever national championship Feb. 10, also in Orlando.

The varsity team has won over 100 awards over the past 15 years according to the Bartow City

Commission proclamation. They have been state 2A champions every year since 2014.

The Bartow City Commission proclaimed Feb. 19 as 2018 Yellow Jackets Varsity Co-Ed Cheerleading Championship Day.

Fire Restaurant to unveil new look this week

After five years stoking the “Fire” at Fire Restaurant, these business owners are getting ready to unveil their complete vision for Fire — a remodel that reflects the food they serve and the atmosphere they desire.

As Ashley and Brett Hill say, they serve “upscale food, in a casual atmosphere, at a reasonable price.”

The designer, Brett says, is the same one who did Grove Roots and The Bike Shop in Winter Haven, Charlie Schiller.

“The bar will be a little smaller and a little more cozy,” says Brett, and some of that seating will move to a lounge area where the storefront was. There will be one entrance, and everything will look different, “more trendy and cool,” Brett in keeping with their vision.

None of the seating capacity will be lost, Brett says.

Grey, black and white will be the colors, with white tabletops.

“It is really going to transform this place into a totally different world,” he says.

The couple met with a restaurant consultant who ate their food, then remarked that their food did not match their current furnishings.

“This restaurant is more like an Irish pub type of deal,” Brett says.

Brett is a trained chef who went to culinary school in Orlando and served 18 years at Disney as a chef.

“I had a lot of experience with fine dining and restaurants out of Disney,” he said, noting that now they have an opportunity to blend the food that has made them famous with their new decor.

“And the restaurant has a new dinner menu coming out as well,” he says.

“It’s pretty exciting.”

The couple has lived in Winter Haven the last 8 years, and before that, lived in Orlando. They opened their first restaurant in Lake Alfred about ten years ago, a little sandwich shop called Fromage.

They later moved to Auburndale and opened up Fire, and after selling it, moved to Winter Haven to their present Fire Restaurant.

They say they love downtown Winter Haven

and the people they have met. Many of the clientele followed them from Lake Alfred and Auburndale as well.

“We live literally less than two minutes from here,” says Brett. “We are here every day.”

Brett says that Six/Ten, Anita Strang with Main Street and The Winter Haven Chamber of Commerce have done “some really wonderful things here.”

Brett adds he wanted to bring the fine dining concept to a casual dining atmosphere, using the same philosophies as he did in fine dining.

“It doesn’t cost any more to give great service. That’s what we focus on, really, food and service, and it’s been good for us,” he says.

Ashley enjoys the small town, the regulars, the familiar faces.

“The feel of the town,” Brett adds, is great. “Everybody knows everyone, and it is a good feeling. You know, when you can provide really great food and give people an opportunity to relax, it is rewarding - serving. You have to love it to be in this business. It is a hard business to be in. If you

don’t love it, you won’t be successful. This is all we know.”

Ashley attended Penn State University for hotel restaurant management.

“So we kind of make a good team, we think, as far as the restaurant,” Brett says.

Fire will be open this coming Friday at 11 a.m. for regular business, Brett notes. The two phase project will first open the dining room. About a week later, the bar will open.

Guns on campus: a close question

As long as Grady Judd is sheriff of Polk County, we believe Polk will receive more than its share of headlines throughout the state, and occasionally the nation.

The anecdotal observation — he may occasionally be in error, but he is never in doubt — applies to one of the most quoted sheriffs in the nation.

For our part, we believe Judd is doing an excellent job, while we reserve the right to differ with his judgment from time to time.

In the wake of the murder of 17 students and faculty at Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School earlier this month, Judd has made headlines with his declaration that he believes that both faculty and students should carry weapons on school campuses.

We believe that concept is fraught with peril. While some teenagers have the emotional maturity to carry deadly weapons on campus, we don't believe that standard can be universally applied.

Judd's initiative to deputize faculty members at

two private universities — Southeastern in Lakeland and Webber International in Lake Wales — to carry weapons on campus after extensive training in both law and marksmanship is a closer question.

Both institutions are private schools, not state universities. The nature of private schools is that they have more latitude in their policies than public schools. Students or faculty who find themselves at odds with their policies are free to leave.

In that regard, private schools are akin to other private employers who may forbid or allow employees to carry firearms at the workplace.

Public schools at all levels operate under a different paradigm. They are governed by the laws of the state.

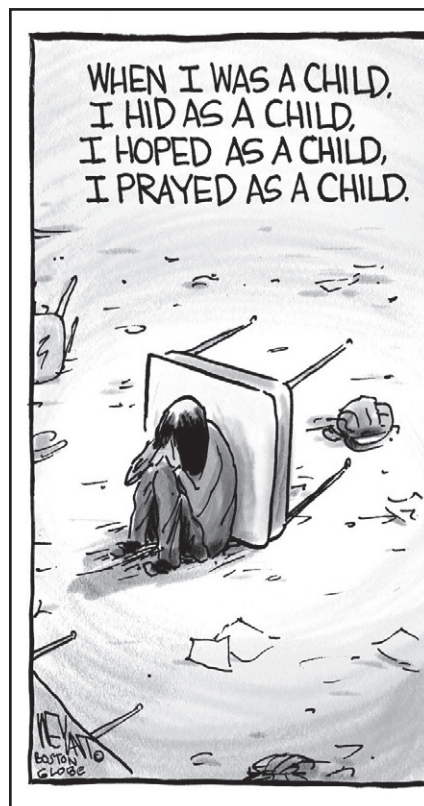
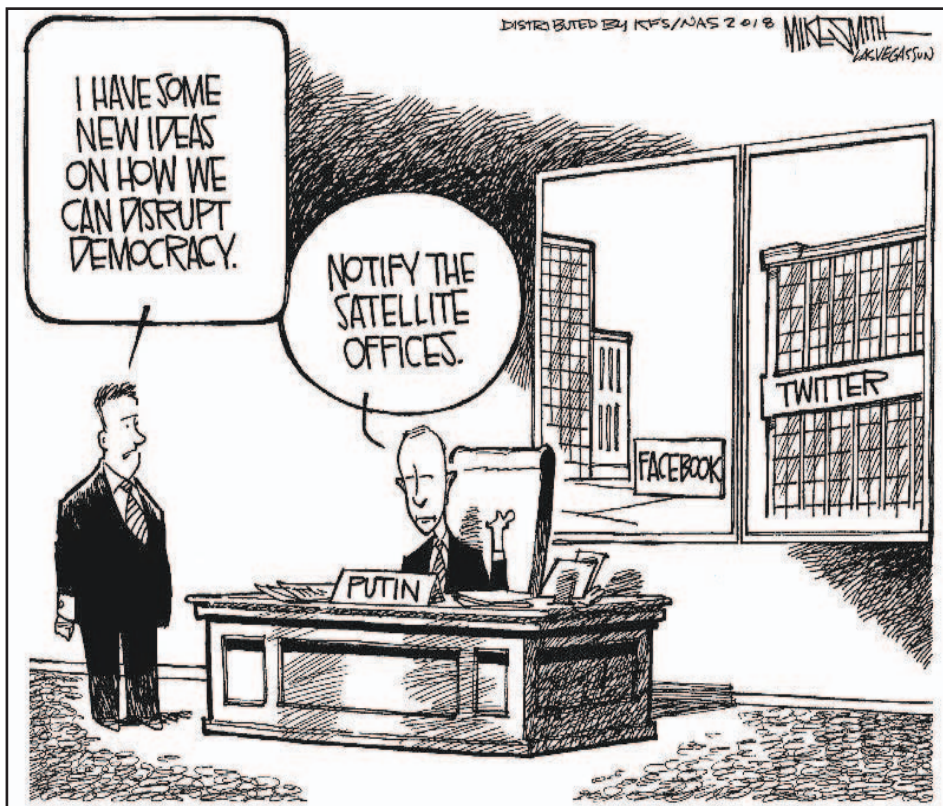
And as public institutions, they are entitled to the services of publicly-funded school resource officers

whose presence on campus serves multiple purposes, including responding to crises that threaten the safety of students and faculties.

At least two Polk County law enforcement agencies — police departments in Lake Wales and Auburndale — have instructed their officers who are not engaged in other duties to visit schools on a regular basis. We believe this innovative use of police resources makes good sense.

There are several options that can discourage attacks like those that have occurred in Parkland and other cities. Among them are better screening of mentally ill persons who seek to buy firearms and forbidding the sale of devices to convert legal firearms into illegal automatic weapons.

Public school teachers have their hands full with their task of educating their students. We believe law enforcement officers — not faculty members — should be the first line of defense against campus violence.

Chronologically gifted Polk Countians with long memories may remember when Billy Graham preached in Bartow nearly 57 years ago.

Graham, often referred to as "America's preacher," preached at an Easter sunrise service in Peace River Park on April 2, 1961.

Born on Nov. 7, 1918, Graham was 42 years old and already one of the world's best known clergymen when he spoke at the amphitheater in the park east of Bartow that today is home to the Florida Sheriff's Youth Villa.

According to research by Lloyd Harris, Bartow's historian laureate and source of most of the information for this column, attendance was estimated by the Florida Highway Patrol at more than 35,000. That is based on the FHP's estimate of 17,000 cars.

The site had designated parking for 12,000 of them.

The park opened at 10 o'clock on

Saturday night for the next morning's service. The Bartow High School DCT Club served coffee and doughnuts all night.

At 4:30 a.m. Sunday, traffic was backed up bumper-to-bumper for 3.2 miles, all the way back to the courthouse.

The service began at 6.

The semi-circular venue of concrete seating was built on the shore of one of the phosphate pits on the mined-over site that was developed as Peace River Park. It had seating capacity for 10,000

worshippers.

U.S. Sen. Spessard L. Holland, a life-long Bartow resident, attended, and was invited by Graham to join him on the outdoor stage.

A 500-voice choir recruited from Polk's churches performed.

George Beverly Shea, a member of Graham's "crusade team," was the featured soloist.

Graham preached for 50 minutes. At the close of his sermon, some 350 people — young and old, black and white — responded to his altar call.

Graham's Easter service was part of a year-long observance of the centennial of the creation of Polk County, which was carved out of the east end of Hillsborough County in 1861.

Billy Graham's ministry began as a street preacher on Tampa's Franklin Street. He chose that venue, he later quipped, "because no church would have me."

He graduated in 1940 from Florida Baptist Institute (now Trinity College) near Tampa.

He had already preached to an estimated 2 million worshippers over a 16-week series of rallies at Madison Square Garden in 1957 before accepting the invitation to preach in Bartow four years later.

In his lifetime, he reportedly preached in more than 185 countries and territories to crowds estimated to total more than 215 million people.

Graham died last Wednesday at the age of 99.

On Easter Sunday morning, 1961, his ministry came to Bartow.

Lemuel Geathers: A Living Time Capsule

Few people have witnessed the sea change in race relations and community progress that Lemuel Geathers Sr., lived. Few people describe it as eloquently.

Geathers, ninety-two years young as of this writing is a life-long Winter Haven resident. The Winter Haven of 1920 was actually two distinct villages: Winter Haven and the then separately incorporated Florence Villa. (The two villages would merge in 1923.) Geathers was born in his family's home in the Pughsville neighborhood located in southwest Winter Haven.

His mother, widowed when Lemuel was a young boy, had but a third grade education but she successfully saw her four children graduate with college degrees. Mr. Geathers proudly notes that he and wife Juanita saw their six children do the same.

He speaks with pride of his US Navy service to our country in WWII and, while away in the war effort, he occasionally would see news reel footage that included scenes from Cypress Gardens proudly noting to his service buddies, "That's my home."

Geathers also notes with interest, "When I was a young boy I was not allowed to go to the public library, and later I served on the Library Board!" During his life's journey, he has worn many hats from electrical contractor to grove owner — landlord to hospital board member — and more. In 1973, he was elected the first African American Winter Haven City Commissioner serving as mayor in 1975.

While serving as mayor he notes the commissioner seated next to him said to him, "You have no business being here." But Geathers casually adds that he never let such comments stand in his way. "I learned long ago to build relationships with other leaders within the community. It was those individuals who became a part of successful commission votes and community projects that might never have been accomplished through confrontation." To his credit,

Geathers worked with community leaders, including the late Richard Dantzler to develop successful integration plans for Haven schools. He also was instrumental in efforts to establish the original Polk State College campus on what was then the city golf course.

For his bridge-building work within the community Geathers was awarded the 2010 Banker's Cup Man of the Year Award. During his acceptance speech he joked, "I'm surprised I was nominated ... there aren't too many people I haven't offended over the years!" He proceeded to speak about his life with great eloquence prompting one attendee to note, "I

could have listened to Mr. Geathers all night."

Lemuel Geathers is a walking Winter Haven history book. He has participated in programs at the Winter Haven Museum and on behalf of the Winter Haven Woman's Club. He is often quick to say, "I love everybody. I've seen a lot in my day ... some good and some bad ... but I just love this community. I LOVE Winter Haven."

Distracted Driving

One of the worst problems that we have on Florida roadways are distractions; texting while driving is perhaps the one most often talked about, but there are plenty of others. Talking on the cell phone, eating while driving, doing your makeup, shaving, and even a simple conversation with someone else in the car is enough to impede your concentration on your driving.

As it stands now, current Florida law allows you to talk on your cell phone. Texting on the other hand (or any hand, for that matter) is a big no-no. The law (Florida State Statute 316.305) essentially says that no driver can use the internet or type on a wireless device (cell phones) while driving. You are legally allowed to text while you are stopped at a stop light, but don't be that person who is so focused on their Facebook perusing that they didn't notice the light changing to green, and now you have twelve angry drivers behind you eager

to go.

The law does have some exemptions such as emergency vehicle operators, or people using their phones as a navigational device, or even someone who is reporting an emergency, or criminal or suspicious activity. Although for that, it is so much simpler just to call 911.

If you're fortunate enough to have one of those self-driving cars, feel free to text away. You're exempt too (as long as the car is in autonomous mode at the time).

Under current Florida law, an

officer cannot pull you over for texting and driving, because it's considered a secondary offense. The officer would have to pull you over for a primary offense, such as speeding, or driving without a seat belt. But there are several bills being considered in the Florida legislature that aim to change it to a primary offense if signed into law.

You might be surprised how many times a law enforcement officer has heard somebody say to them, "You need to make it against the law for somebody to talk on the cell phone while driving." The simple reason we don't make such a law is because law enforcement officers don't make laws, we only enforce them. Your representatives in the state legislature make the laws, so you need to reach out to them about changing laws.

I can't imagine why anyone wouldn't think there is a problem with texting while driving. I'd like to share some interesting statistics

about motor vehicle crashes from the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. There were more than 395,785 crashes in Florida in 2016 (the most recent available data). Of those crashes, 241 fatalities occurred in crashes where distracted driving played a role in the crash. While 241 seems like such a small number out of nearly 400,000 crashes, imagine if one of those 241 deaths was your spouse, your parent, or your child. Keep in mind that there were 3,500 crashes that resulted in injuries that incapacitated someone. I'm talking about people who lost a leg or an arm, or had their back broken, or a pelvis shattered. And there were thousands more crashes with minor or no injuries. Every one of these crashes was avoidable. When you drive a car, your number one priority is operating that car in a safe manner. So please, drive like your life depends on it. Because it does.

staff were told about the Sentinel Program. Dr. Wade said they enthusiastically agreed to start the process.

The concept of arming teachers or other volunteers on campus has elicited emotions nationwide, both from those who support and those who oppose the concept. Immediately after signing the contract between Webber International University and PCSO Thursday, Dr. Wade said his life was threatened by somebody who did not agree with the policy of arming school staff.

Last week dozens of students from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School traveled by bus to Tallahassee to lobby for a state ban of all assault weapons as opposed to lobbying to arm their teachers according to multiple media outlets. The teenager who killed 17 at the Broward County school on Valentine's Day used an assault rifle.

Sheriff Judd said the politics of gun control are bogging down the process of protecting children. On Feb. 23 he and Rep. Ross Spano announced a series of measures they are recommending to reduce the threat of mass casualty shootings.

"We must have a multi-layered approach to keeping our schools

and our community safe," Sheriff Judd said.

Judd admitted that arming teachers, a big part of his plan, was not a guarantee that school shootings would end.

The school resource officer at Marjory Douglas High School reportedly was caught on tape doing nothing when the shooting started on campus Feb. 14. The Associated Press reported that a second police officer was helping to maintain a campus baseball field when the shooting started. That second officer rendered medical aid and got a description of the shooter from said student instead of bypassing casualties and going after the gunman as officers are trained to do.

President Donald Trump reportedly referred to the school resource officer as a coward and proposed to pay armed teachers extra salary.

The good guys with guns also reportedly visited the gunman's house multiple times over the past few years and did not take much action to stop the killer. Teachers would be no more apt to run toward gunshots than trained officers. But putting more guns on campus seems to be how Florida state legislators want to solve the problem. On Friday Florida Gov. Rick Scott announced his own three point plan to prevent gun violence: banning the sale of firearms to

anybody under the age of 21, having trained officers in every school by the start of next school year and banning bump stocks for all.

Several local law enforcement personnel posted comments last week about the Brevard County school resource officer who was caught on tape hiding. Several said nobody knows how they will react when the shooting starts, whether that be an officer or a trained teacher.

Dr. Wade was asked what the student body thought about arming school staff. Dr. Wade said there were mixed feelings. He said initially as many as 30 of his staff volunteered for the training. Not that many will be trained although he did not want to say exactly how many have started. Those who did are scheduled to complete training within 90 days.

"I want help from down the hall, not down the street," Dr. Wade said.

Sheriff Judd said there are several other school administrators who may be announcing participation in the Sentinel Program in the coming weeks.

"When that mad man walks on to the campus intent on killing our children we are going to immediately engage him and shoot at him a lot until the threat is neutralized and he cannot harm our children, period," Sheriff Judd said.

Lake Wales election canceled

LAKE WALES – Members of the Lake Wales City Commission voted to cancel the April 3 municipal election Feb. 20.

The election would have allowed voters to pick commissioners for seats three and five in Lake Wales and vote to change the city commission term from two to three years. Members of the commission voted unanimously to cancel the election because Deputy Mayor Robin Gibson ran unopposed for seat five, because nobody qualified for seat three and because it was not likely many would turn out to vote if the only thing on the ballot was increasing term limits.

Commissioner Terry Howell said she accidentally did not realize the deadline to qualify herself to be re-elected was at noon on Feb. 16. She said she attempted to turn in her election

paperwork that day, but after the noon deadline.

City Attorney Chuck Galloway recommended Howell resign from her position May 1 when her term officially ends. At that point, members of the commission could vote to either appoint Howell for at least a year or appoint another person.

Howell told commissioners that she wanted to retain her seat on the commission.

Galloway said regardless of who the commissioners voted to appoint to fill the seat, that appointment would only be until April 2019, the next municipal election. Deputy Mayor Gibson, also a lawyer, said according to the charter an appointment would last the full two year term. City manager Ken Fields requested more time to research which legal opinion had case law to determine who was right and that he would return with more information at a subsequent commission meeting.

City clerk debate

After the 2017 firing of former Lake Wales City Clerk Clara VanBlargan, members of the commission requested the city manager survey how other cities handle the employment parameters of the city clerk position. As it currently stands, the Lake Wales Commission is responsible for hiring and firing the city clerk, and the city manager is responsible for supervising the clerk. Commissioners wanted to know how other cities work in that regard.

City manager Fields said he was satisfied with the current parameters. He said if he became responsible for hiring and firing the city clerk, he would be satisfied with that also. Fields said he did not think having the commission having the responsibility of hiring, firing and supervising the clerk would work.

“The idea of a totally independent city clerk is something that I don’t think works in any city,”

Fields said.

Mayor Eugene Fultz said that 65 percent of Florida cities treat the city clerk position like every other department head, who are hired, fired and supervised by a city manager. Fultz also said according to the Florida Association of City Clerks, however, there is no preference.

“Therefore it’s up to us,” Mayor Fultz said.

Deputy Mayor Gibson said the commission was ill equipped to terminate the employment of VanBlargan in 2017, and that he thought the city clerk position should be like any other department head. Commissioner Curtis

Gibson said he wanted to keep the rules as they are now. Commissioner Howell said she feels like she is in charge of the city clerk, but has no authority to do anything and that the commission should be able to evaluate the clerk, not just hire and fire. Commissioner Tonya Stewart, who cast the deciding vote to fire VanBlargan in 2017 said she also thinks change is needed.

The city manager agreed to come up with some written options so the matter could be put to a vote. A change in the city clerk parameters would require an election. This matter is being discussed now to

determine whether to add the topic to the 2019 ballot.

Lake Wales City Clerk Jennifer Nanek announced that the Lake Wales Food Truck Invasion has returned.

Vendors recently signed a six month contract to return to Lake Wales every third Monday of the month at Lake Wales Park.

Opinionated lines, ominous signs, personal whines ...

You might have missed it, but Polk County has a college basketball team that's ranked No. 1 in the nation, which would be the Southeastern University's women's basketball squad. They are unbeaten, and ranked No. 1 in the NAIA. They just won their third straight Sun Conference title – that's the same league as Warner and Webber play in – and will hope to advance past the Elite Eight, which is where their season ended last year.

It won't be official for a few more weeks, but the disappointment of the Florida Tropics missing out on the Major Arena Soccer League playoffs this season could quickly be offset by some big news from their sister franchise, the Lakeland Tropics, who play in the USL's Premier Development League.

The math, at least, says Lakeland should get an invitation to the Lamar

Hunt U.S. Open Cup, an incredible feather in the team's cap since last year was their very first in existence. And, if it goes their way, Polk County might even get the honor to host a game (it would be likely Wednesday, May 9) at Bryant Stadium in Lakeland. Pretty impressive for a team that didn't even exist a year ago.

The Tropics finished 13th in overall points in the 72-team league last year. In 2017, the PDL had 21 teams invited to the 2017 event, which is the second

oldest knockout style tournament on the globe, dating back to 1914. And never has there been a year when the number of PDL teams invited has gone down, so that's the math part of it anyways.

And just for a little soccer karma just in case, the Tropics Chief Operating Officer Chris Economides was one of the owner of the Rochester Rhinos in 1999. Significant why? Auburndale's Meghan Lindell had a hit and a walk and scored the game's only run in the opener. She is 9-24 so far on the young season. Laura Borders, a Lake Wales native and graduate of Winter Haven, is off to a sizzling 11-for-27 start at the plate. She had a hit, run scored and RBI in the Warriors 5-3 nightcap triumph.

Nice to see Webber drawing from the local softball deep pool of talent. Auburndale's Stephanie Johnson, a pitcher who played at All Saints, and Lake Wales graduate Daisy Riggelman are both freshman who have had some playing time already in their young college careers.

By the way, Webber will scrimmage Polk State Thursday, March 1 starting at 5 p.m in Winter Haven.

Auburndale was third with 30 points. Michael Head Jr. and Joshua Greene brought home individual titles at 154 and 183 pounds respectively. Others to win individual titles include Reese Lot of Fort Meade (119), Darian Crooms of Auburndale (129), Javian Ferguson of Auburndale (169), William Davis of Lake Region (199), Jabari Lewis of Ridge Community

(219), Jemarcus Leatherwood of Ridge Community (239), and Fort Meade's Cleveland Reed (unlimited).

CHOPPED DOWN – We cannot tell a lie, Feb. 22 (George Washington's actual birthday) was not a good day on the hardwoods for a couple of local teams, Auburndale and Bartow, which each fell in boy's basketball regional quarterfinal play. Five Minutes with Tracy McGrady

(Sixty-two and 2,407. Those are two in an array of incredible numbers that Auburndale's Tracy McGrady put up during his amazing National Basketball Association career, that was anything but predestined to be great. McGrady, who was honored by the NBA's G-League Lakeland Magic last Friday, says for a long time, his game was overlooked while playing for the Bloodhounds. He talked about what it was like to play professionally so close to home, his pride in winning the NBA's most improved award early in his career, and what advice he might give members of the Mini Magic who continue to harbor the professional basketball dream. He won the NBA scoring title twice, and five times was a league all-star. And, oh, about those numbers. Sixty-two is the most points ever scored by an Orlando Magic player in one game, and 2,407 is the most number of points scored in a single season by a Magic player. Both marks, of course, are McGrady's.)

SCMG: You grew up here in Polk. What does it mean for the county to have its own professional basketball team now?



TM: "You know, I had to grab my inspiration off the TV, the airwaves, watching guys that I idolized. Now, we can give these kids hope because it's right here in their backyard, you can actually come here and physically see professional basketball players that possibly one day could be NBA players. That's a great thing. They have a great obligation to this community to be class citizens on the basketball court, to represent this area well, and I think they'll get some great support."

SCMG: When you played in Orlando, was there more pressure or less pressure than other places you played?

TM: "I didn't feel any pressure. I mean as it was, I embraced it. I felt so comfortable coming back home. What player doesn't want to be on the basketball court and look up and see your

family there, right? The best support you could possibly get is your family, so there was no pressure for me."

SCMG: If you had a chance to give one or two pieces of advice to a G-League player, what would those be?

TM: "I would tell them to go back and look at my story. I can't tell you anything about the G-League because I didn't play there. But what I can tell you is I was overlooked when I was younger and coming up. I wasn't ranked as a kid in high school until I got in front of the best players in the world on that platform. And when that opportunity presented itself, I made a name for myself. So it's the same with you guys. That's what you have to do. When that opportunity is there, you have to take full advantage. It's not a bad thing that you are in the G-League. Everybody wants to make it to the NBA, I wanted to be ranked when I was in high school but nobody knew who I was. It made me work harder. It made me appreciate the work and I had something to really look forward to. Once I got a taste of it, then I didn't want to look back."

SCMG: Did you take something from growing up and playing in Auburndale

that you might not have gotten somewhere else?

TM: "My thing is I grew up on the playground. I always played against older guys. I have a lot of family there. Pretty much the whole town is my family. I played against my older cousins, and they used to beat up on me a lot, that's where I got my toughness from. And it didn't matter what opportunity it was, how big the stage was, I was always ready for it."

SCMG: More proud of, two time-scoring champion or NBA Most Improved Player award?

TM: "Most improved, because it showed the progress in my game. I didn't settle for just making it to the NBA. Most improved showed this kid worked his butt off to be better than he was the previous year. So that to me was more fulfilling than the scoring titles. The thing was, I came into the league wanting to be a Scotty Pippen type, and all around type player. My first year with the Orlando Magic, there was no Grant Hill, so I had to accept another role. I had to carry the franchise at 20 years old by myself and I had never done that before. It's like 'here are the keys, you have to take us to the promised land.' So I had to grow up pretty quick."

The 2018 Polk County School-Related Employee of the Year award winner is described as a nurse who "compassionately attends to all of the bumps and bruises, as well as tummy aches and loose teeth," at the school, according to Rachel Pleasant, senior director of communications, Polk County Public Schools.

"She also takes care of hungry tummies by overseeing a program that sends backpacks full of food home with needy students so they can have something to eat at home. In addition, she helps maintain the school's clothing closet to ensure students have a nice, clean wardrobe," she said.

Foreman has served at the school for 8 years and says that to see students

learn and grow, it is nice to be the person they come to talk about all kinds of things.

"A lot of them don't have somebody at home they can talk to," she says.

"I love my job. I work in the clinic, but help in the office a lot too," she adds.

"It's a team effort."

Maria Rodriguez, principal secretary, started out at the school as a terminal operator, sitting

right next to the clinic.

"She was always very helpful," says Rodriguez of Foreman.

"Even when she was very busy in the clinic with her little patients."

She knew, Rodriguez said, most of the students at the school by name, and Rodriguez adds that she was not a bit surprised at Foreman

receiving the award.

"She is a very caring and wonderful person," she says. "I knew she was going to have a good shot at it."

What makes a good school nurse?

"Listen to the kids, first of all," says Foreman.

"A lot of times it may not be a physical illness they have."

She has seen a lot over the years.

One time there was a child in Pre-K who had a brain tumor.

"He is older now, at another school. Back then, he did not see, he was non-verbal," she says, but now, he is thriving.

"It warms your heart," she says, to watch children grow.

In her off time, she is a Girl Scout leader for Troop 437 in Bartow. Also having three daughters, she says she stays very busy, and has been involved in Future Farmers of America and 4H, in addition to being the president of the Parent Teacher Organization.

"Part of what I do is PTO, and that is getting parents involved," she says.

She notes it is very important for parents to stay in touch with the school.

Parent involvement makes the school experience "successful," she notes.

Prior to serving as a nurse in the education system, she was a nurse for about 10 years at the jail and served at Boot camp for 5 years. She also worked in pediatrics at Polk General Hospital when it was open.

The Florida School-Related Employee of the Year award recognizes outstanding education support personnel for contributions to their schools and communities.

2018 Teacher of the Year

Michelle Dinwiddie, a 10th-grade English teacher at Lake Gibson High in Lakeland, says she loves interacting with the students and the fact that she can wear “many hats” in her classroom.

Last week, she was announced as the 2018 Polk County Teacher of the Year as Polk County Public Schools celebrated its top educators and employees during an awards ceremony at the RP Funding Center in Lakeland. The two overall winners, along with 12 finalists, received cash awards and other prizes from event sponsors.

Dinwiddie was chosen from more than 200 candidates who were nominated by individual schools throughout Polk County Public Schools.

Criteria included leadership and professional development activities, community and school involvement, and teaching style. Judges reviewed the applications without knowledge of applicant

names or schools. Judges included community members from local organizations and businesses, as well as past winners and finalists.

She and Employee of the Year, Margie Foreman, will move on to compete for state titles.

Each year, the Florida Department of Education names a Florida Teacher of the Year, choosing an educator who has “demonstrated a superior capacity to inspire a love of learning in students of all backgrounds and abilities.”

Dinwiddie says teaching allows her also to enhance her own learning.

“I enjoy seeing student success,” she says.

“I think what makes a good teacher is having high standards and expectations. I think expectations should always be high,” she says.

When she first started teaching, she notes that she lowered her expectations, and quickly discovered it was best if she maintained high expectations and standards.

She brings a lot of enthusiasm to the table, as

she says, “a good teacher smiles on the first day of school.”

“The students enjoy knowing that you love to be here,” she says.

Together, they both acknowledge when they fail, and celebrate their victories, while maintaining, she says, “positivity.”

For her, that personal enthusiasm is a choice.

“You choose to be happy. Sometimes you fake it till you make it,” she says, “because there are some days that it is difficult.”

She teaches English 2 all periods of the day.

“Every class period is different,” she says, and the interactions with students are different.

“My goal is to nurture their personality toward goodness,” she adds.

Growing up, she says she knew she always wanted to teach because she was so thankful for the teacher in her life.

“I love teaching, showing, caring, mentoring. I love making people laugh. The classroom is just a great platform for all of that,” she says.

Her principal, Ryan Van,

says she is the “epitomy of professionalism,” and notes that “when you are in her classroom, it feels like a home, not only set for learning. It is decorated so it does not feel like a classroom.

One thing she does is memorize the students — all of her students — by photo and name before the first day of school, then greets them each - by name.

“I feel like a proud father now,” says the principal.

“I am so happy for her.”

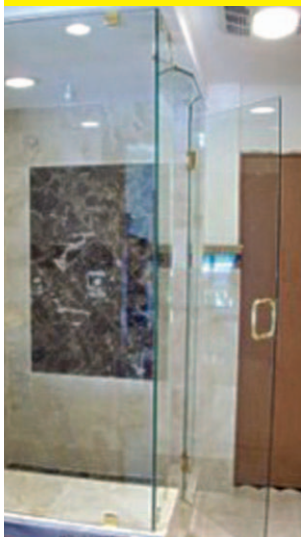

Mayor Fultz gives State of the City speech

LAKE WALES – Mayor Eugene Fultz started the Lake Wales Chamber of Commerce Annual State of the City Luncheon speech off on Friday afternoon by highlighting growth around the U.S. 27 corridor near Eagle Ridge Mall.

Dignitaries with a McGuire car dealership

broke ground on a new business just west of the mall. And at the corner of Thompson Nursery Road, an old motel and a veterinarian clinic are being demolished to make room for a new ALDI which may start construction soon, the mayor said.

The vet clinic, Ridge Veterinary Hospital, is moving to a new building behind the Denny’s.

Close by, a new IHOP restaurant is halfway built. A Wawa/Love’s truck stop is also in the planning stages around the mall.

The mayor said the city needs more hotels in order to earn more money from events going on at the airport.

On the topic of recreation, the mayor acknowledged the need for more, but said

leaders could not get the topic on the ballot for a referendum until 2019. But, he said, the city hired a new recreation coordinator, residents got access to the YMCA pool and construction is underway on the Lake Wales Trail. The trail will connect downtown with the lake on a path with pet water fountains and WiFi. The city pier was renovated, and this year,

city residents celebrated the Centennial. The Lake Wales Arts Festival is this weekend in its 46th year.

“That Centennial celebration was awesome,” Mayor Fultz said.

The city has applied for a federal grant to harden a building to be used as a hurricane shelter, Fultz said. Fire response times have been excellent, and

Lake Wales is one of the safest cities in the area, the mayor said. During Hurricane Irma, no city residents lost water because city staff manually pumped sewage while the power was out.

On the subject of taxes, the mayor said taxes have been lowered four out of the last five years with the exception being this year. Taxes were “rolled over” this year.

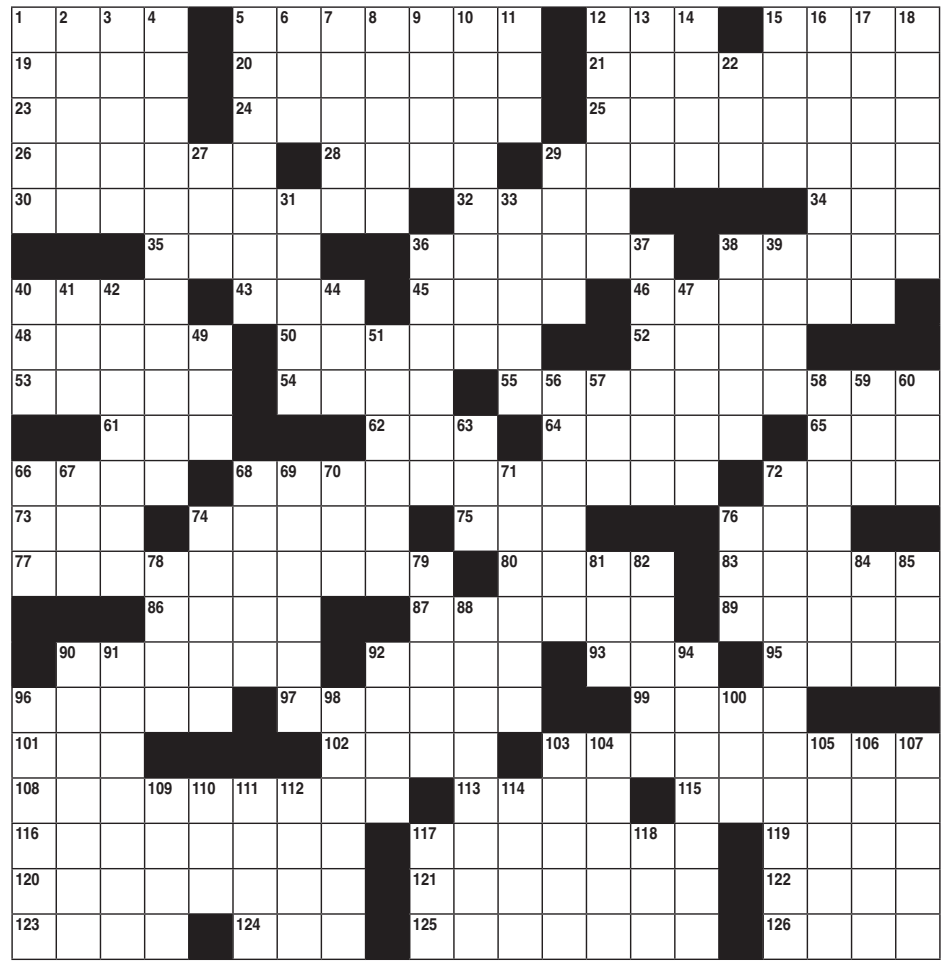

Ground breaks for Carol Jenkins Barnett Center

LAKELAND – At a groundbreaking ceremony at Florida Southern College last week, President Anne Kerr announced the establishment of the Carol Jenkins Barnett Center for Early Childhood Learning and Health at Florida Southern College, which will house a unique interdisciplinary program that will be the first of its kind in the United States linking early childhood learning and childhood health.

“Carol Barnett is one of our nation’s leading advocates for children,” said Dr. Kerr. “Her passion for and dedication to early learning

education and health is both widespread and contagious. It is with great admiration for Carol Barnett and her commitment to young learners throughout America that we name the Carol Jenkins Barnett Center for Early Childhood Learning and Health in her honor.”

The daughter of Publix Super Markets founder George W. Jenkins, Carol is a 1979 graduate of Florida Southern; her husband Barney Barnett is a 1965 graduate of the college and serves on the college’s Board of Trustees.

A new facility housing the Barnett Center

will be built on the northwest corner of Frank Lloyd Wright Way and Jefferson Avenue, next to Roberts Academy. The 17,700-square-foot building will include classrooms and offices for 15 faculty members.

The Barnett Center will be a national model for teacher and pediatric nurse preparation, setting a precedent for interdisciplinary education in early childhood learning and health. Future teachers and nurses will be trained to identify issues that impact childhood learning, including vision and hearing problems, learning

challenges such as dyslexia, oral health concerns, behavioral challenges, and general health and environmental stressors.

As part of the launch of the center, Florida Southern College will establish new programs of study in both early childhood education and pediatric nursing that focus on the impact of childhood health on learning. Health instruction will be incorporated into the undergraduate and graduate education programs in order to combine the best practices in both fields.

According to Dr. Tracey Tedder, dean of the FSC School of

Education and Head of School for the Roberts Academy, “Positive early school experiences are of paramount importance to young children—establishing a foundation for the acquisition of knowledge and gaining the skills that they will need later in life.”

The Barnett Center will also house the college’s renowned Early Learning Preschool/Lab, which will become an integral part of the center, providing a model school for early childhood learning and linking childhood health to learning outcomes.

For many years, children from the greater

Lakeland community have attended the Early Learning Preschool/Lab, a research-based learning program for children age three to six as well as an on-site laboratory for FSC School of Education majors. Currently, the Early Learning Preschool/Lab has a waiting list of nearly quadruple its current capacity. Building a new facility and increasing enrollment as part of the development of the Barnett Center for Early Childhood Learning and Health will provide more opportunities for Polk County families to benefit from stellar early childhood education.

Bostick Heart Center embarks on \$50 million project

WINTER HAVEN — BayCare Health System has approved another expansion project for Winter Haven Hospital that will bring advanced, hybrid technology for the Bostick Heart Center and additional patient rooms.

The expansion will relocate many of the Bostick Heart Center services to the second floor of the new ER and add cardiac catheterization labs, with one specialized as a hybrid operating room that allows for both interventional and surgical procedures.

The hybrid lab paves the way for Winter Haven

Hospital to accommodate the growing demand for minimally invasive heart surgery, such as Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR) that replaces heart valves without open heart surgery. According to national registries and databases that track cardiac procedures, TAVR procedures are continuing to increase, and in 2015 even surpassed the number of valve replacements by open heart surgery.

In many instances, minimally invasive heart surgery allows for patients to be up and walking within a day

or two, and in some cases, immediate relief in chest pain and labored breathing.

Many TAVR patients report benefits of having more energy, being able to return to everyday activities quickly, and experiencing less post-surgical pain.

“We’re advancing the Bostick Heart Center so that we can provide an option without open heart surgery for our patients that are in need of aortic valve replacement,” says Steve Nierman, president of Winter Haven Hospital. “As TAVR becomes more common, it also is reportedly safer.”

Winter Haven Hospital is already nationally recognized for its heart surgery program. We have maintained a “3 star” rating (the highest possible) from the prestigious Society of Thoracic Care Surgeons for ten consecutive years. Each year, this rating places our heart surgery program among the top 10 to 15 percent in the nation.

The new expansion project also adds another 45,000 square feet as a third floor to be dedicated to intensive care units (ICUs). After existing services and patient care units are relocated to the

new spaces, Winter Haven Hospital will start renovating vacated areas. These renovations aim to provide additional and updated patient rooms for acute medical care or recovery after surgery. In addition, the hospital is completing the \$50 million ER department expansion. Design and planning began this month for the Bostick Heart Center and new ICUs; active construction is expected to begin in February next year and complete in early 2020. The subsequent renovations to vacated spaces are expected to be completed in 2021.

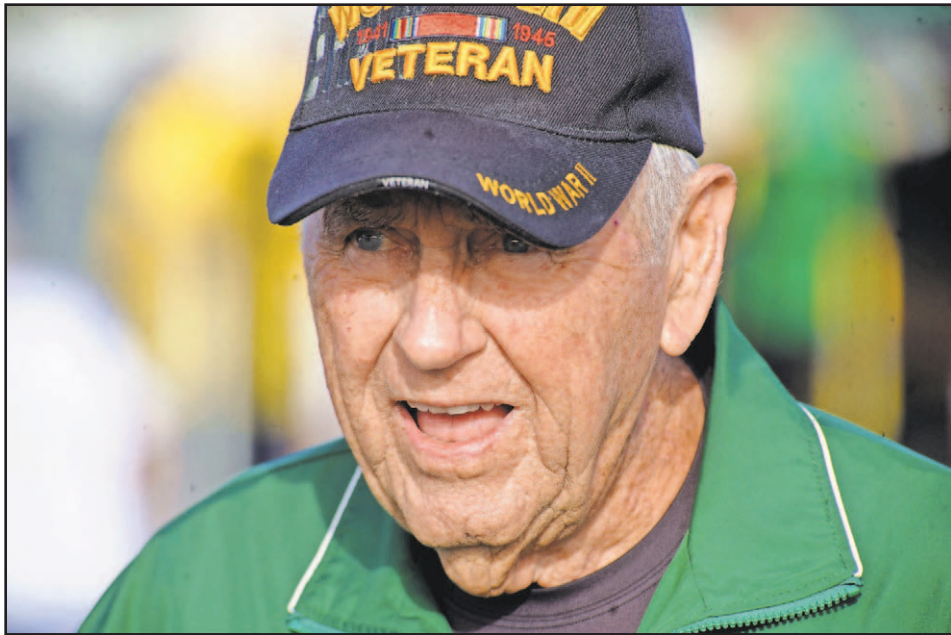

Where the Starry Knights gather

Watercolor artist Steven Schepper found a sunny place in the courtyard of The Garden Ballroom on Sunday during the Starry Knights gala put on by Growing Positivity and Heart for Winter Haven, an evening of honoring non-profits and celebrating art, music, creativity and fashion.

"You realize your life is not your own," he said, while painting Growing Positivity's new logo, adding to his previous comment, "everything you do is somehow connected."

And it was that connection that perhaps those in attendance felt, as Kurtis Flanders, founder of Growing Positivity, brought them all together.

"We just wanted to honor non-profits for all they do," he said.

Yet many of those groups instead wanted to honor him, and it was "Kurtis this," and "Kurtis that," and as Flanders says, "it is not about me."

Schepper said he met Flanders at an out of town event in Spring Hill, striking up a friendship over "weird rare frogs" that they both breed.

Looking across the courtyard to another artist who donated her time to join the festivities, Maribel Krzyzaniak (aka LunaSmile), Schepper said, "And Maribel was like — painting an eyeball on canvas — when she and Kurtis met."

The venues put on by Growing Positivity are growing in popularity, as people drove from as far away as Kissimmee and Orlando to attend.

Artist Ashlyn Mae Bapst brought her Poison Jar Creations Jewelry, a rare art that is gaining some attention. Two of her pieces are on their way to the Orlando Museum of Art. She takes wasp nests, dead bugs, real bones (ethically, i.e. roadkill already dead), and applies copper plating with a "rectifier," an art form known as "electroforming."

Likewise, she and Kurtis knew each other from a previous creatives event, and she gathered great attention at Starry Knights with her fellow artists.

Some art was given away, free, Flanders said.

Food for the evening was provided by Quintessence, music by Darren Scott and Josh Vandyk, venue by The Garden Ballroom, the fashion show by Maniq. in and DJ Shelly Yoki Cisneros was on hand to keep the event moving.

Margaret Jones, director of operations and equipping for Heart for Winter Haven, said those non-profits in the area serve on "large days, and nobody knows the Knights ... those who serve behind the scenes."

Jones, who previously worked with non-profits in Harlem, New York, says true volunteers shine because they have the attitude of "I will help, even when no one sees me."

Such an attitude transformed Harlem, she says, noting, "If we are people of faith ... we can

transform our city."

She enjoys also working with the Winter Haven homeless. "We literally shake their hands, acknowledge their names," she adds.

Several leaders gave testimony to the strength of volunteer work in Winter Haven, with Rick Smith of the Church of the Nazarene giving kudos to Flanders for the countless hours he spends gathering items from Orlando for the church's thrift shop which helps take care of the homeless. They offer showers, laundry,

food and sometimes, apartments for those in need. Flanders and Smith drive home to Winter Haven with loads of furniture, clothing, household items and more, and Smith says Flanders' work effort is "remarkable."

Ducking his head away from the compliment, Flanders said he could not do it without Smith's

help, and noted the evening was not about him, but the many non-profits he invited to attend.

Volunteers were presented with certificates of appreciation and everyone enjoyed goodie bags and free dinner and entertainment at

Starry Knights.

But when asked about the common bond between Starry Knights and honoring the non-profits, and the creatives who drove hours to gather, Artist Schepper says, "It is Kurtis. He brought us all here."

Bomb threat at Legoland

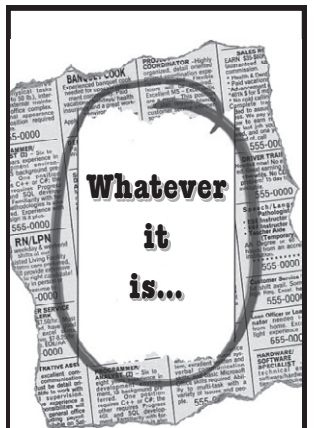
The chief said park visitors kept riding rollercoasters during two safety sweeps of the park over the course of around an hour. Nobody was injured.

"This is not a joke," Chief Bird said. "We take this seriously, and that's why such a large presence was at Legoland."

Initially people were not allowed to enter or leave the park, Chief Bird said.

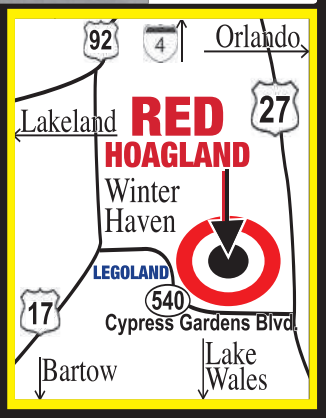

Companies face mounting pressure to pick sides in gun debate

NEW YORK — As the gun debate heats up following the massacre at a Florida high school, companies are under growing pressure to pick a side: whether to stand by the National Rifle Association or walk away.

Metlife, Delta and more than a dozen others have decided to end benefits deals offered to the organization's members. Others, including FedEx, are staying put. The decision to stay or go for many companies involves walking a fine line that can impact their image for better or worse.

"How well can they position themselves so that they're being viewed as honest and supportive of what is a national crisis and not walking away from the Second Amendment?" said Robert Passikoff, president of Brand Keys, a consumer research firm.

The calls for boycotts have been cutting both ways, with gun rights and gun-control supporters threatening to take their dollars elsewhere, depending on a company's decision.

FedEx is the latest company to respond to consumer

pressure, saying it will maintain its discount for NRA members and supports the right to own firearms, but does not believe civilians should own assault rifles.

That response shows the nuances many companies are dealing with in the current debate over guns. Several other companies have also affirmed support for gun rights, but decided to cut ties with the NRA over its positions. Over the weekend, Delta said it would end its discount rates deal for NRA members' group travel and requested it be removed from the organization's website. But, it also said it continues to support the Second Amendment.

Delta's balancing act in particular sparked a harsh response from Georgia's Republican Lt. Gov. Casey Cagle. He threatened to use his position to derail the \$38 million-per-year sales tax exemption on jet fuel that would primarily benefit Delta Air Lines, calling it an attack on conservatives. Delta is based in Atlanta.

The NRA has also pushed back, calling the departure of its corporate partners a "shameful display of political and civic cowardice."

Other companies that have cut ties with the NRA

include First National Bank of Omaha, Hertz, Avis, Budget, Enterprise, Best Western, Wyndham, United Airlines, Chubb, and Starkey Hearing Technology. Still, many others have maintained their relationship, including FedEx and the less-well-known Hotel Planner and eHealth.

The decisions come during an uptick in consumer activism, fueled by social media empowering more people to voice their opinions and values. Companies have become more aware of public sentiment that can be amplified over Twitter and other platforms.

That activist consumer atmosphere — coupled with the Feb. 14 Parkland, Florida, school massacre and the always heated gun-control debate — make this a potentially tricky situation for companies looking to protect their image and bottom line.

"It's a different communication paradigm than it was five years ago and that's the thing," Passikoff said. "The sense of immediacy has increased."

The boycott movement is not just about image. Companies have to take into account their other constituents, particularly shareholders and whether ties to the

NRA will have any impact on their financial performance.

Elliot H. Lutzker, chair of the corporate law practice group at Davidoff Hatcher & Citron LLP, said the boycott movement may have little impact on companies financially. Several of the hospitality firms that have cut ties can figure out just how much of an impact cutting a discount benefit will have and act accordingly.

"It's really a question of fiduciary duty," he said.

The real power lies with credit cards and media companies, he said. Specifically in allowing or blocking purchases of firearms and NRA advertisements.

So far, credit card companies have resisted calls by some consumers to limit their cards' use to purchase guns. Visa said it strives to make its payment services available to everyone within the confines of national and international laws.

"We do not prohibit transactions on our network for the purchase or sale of lawful products and services, including guns in the United States," the company said in a statement. Other credit card companies did not respond to requests for comment.

Manafort's case saddled by side issues, disputes with judge

WASHINGTON — U.S. District Judge Amy Berman Jackson was not amused.

A lawyer for Paul Manafort, the former campaign chairman for President Donald Trump, was trying to justify the multimillion-dollar value of his client's home as part of a bail package. Rather than producing tax assessment or property records, the lawyer submitted to the judge a printout from Zillow, the online real estate website.

"Zillow is actually considered to be pretty accurate, Your Honor," said Kevin Downing, Manafort's attorney. Jackson swatted that aside, insisting she needed "something, some piece of paper beyond just what I got."

On many days, the high-profile, high-stakes prosecution of Manafort — a case already outside the central election-meddling focus of special counsel Robert Mueller's Russia investigation — is

mired in side issues that have left the judge exasperated.

Whatever Manafort's strategy, his team's efforts appear largely reflective of the former international consultant's frustration with what he sees as an out-of-control prosecution — and

a burdensome house arrest from which his attorneys, despite several attempts, have been unable to free him. The halting pace of the case in Washington is about to face another obstacle: With new charges filed in Virginia, Manafort is now going to have to balance a wholly separate case with a different judge and possibly another trial.

Lawyer Downing and Judge Jackson have clashed over the attorney's provocative public statements, Manafort's own ghostwritten opinion piece in Ukraine and even the format of the court filings submitted by the defense. There were also weeks of requests by Rick Gates, Manafort's recently flipped co-defendant, to attend his children's sporting events, disputes over his involvement in a friend's fundraisers and multiple defense lawyer substitutions.

"We've been dealing with the minutiae of bond and soccer practice and

Report: Anti-Semitic incidents soar by 57 percent in 2017

The Anti-Defamation League is reporting a 57 percent increase in anti-Semitic incidents in the U.S. last year, the highest tally that the Jewish civil rights group has counted in more than two decades, according to data it released Tuesday.

The New York City-based organization found 1,986 anti-Semitic incidents last year, up from 1,267 in 2016. That's the highest total since 1994 and the largest single-year increase since the group began collecting this data in 1979.

The ADL said the sharp rise includes 952 vandalism incidents, an increase of 86 percent from 2016. The group also counted 1,015 incidents of harassment, a 41 percent increase from 2016.

ADL national director and CEO Jonathan Greenblatt said the "alarming" increase appears to be fueled by emboldened far-right extremists as well as the "divisive state of our national discourse."

"Less civility has led to more intolerance," he told The Associated Press.

Greenblatt also acknowledged that heightened awareness of the problem likely led to increased

reporting of anti-Semitic incidents.

Anti-Semitic incidents at schools and on college campuses nearly doubled for the second year in a row, with 457 such incidents reported in non-Jewish schools last year, the ADL report says.

"We should see this as an alarm, a very loud alarm that should get the attention of all of us," Greenblatt said.

The ADL and other groups have reported a surge in the number of incidents in which far-right extremist groups have posted racist and anti-Semitic fliers on college campuses. ADL

spokesman Todd Gutnick said the report's tally only counts incidents in which fliers had explicitly anti-Semitic messages.

The ADL also counted 19 anti-Semitic physical assaults last year, a 47 percent decrease from 2016.

The harassment incidents included 169 bomb threats against Jewish institutions, nearly all of them by two men. The ADL report said more than 150 bomb threats against Jewish community centers and day schools last year were allegedly made by an 18-year-old Israeli-American Jewish hacker, who was arrested in Israel last March. Separately, a

former journalist from St. Louis pleaded guilty to making a string of fake bomb threats to Jewish organizations last year in the name of his ex-girlfriend in an effort to disrupt her life.

In a note about its methodology, the group said, "ADL is careful to not conflate general criticism of Israel or anti-Israel activism with anti-Semitism. However, Israel-related harassment of groups or individuals may be included when the harassment incorporates traditional anti-Jewish references, accusations and conspiracy theories. Also

Kushner's security clearance downgraded per Kelly policy

WASHINGTON — The security clearance of White House senior adviser Jared Kushner, President Donald Trump's son-in-law, has been downgraded, according to two people informed of the decision.

Kushner had been operating with an interim clearance at the "top secret/sensitive compartmented information" level for more than a year. Now he is only authorized to access

information at the lower "secret" level, according to a White House official and a person familiar with the decision, both of whom spoke on condition of anonymity. Neither source was authorized to discuss the decision publicly.

Chief of staff John Kelly ordered that White House officials with interim clearances pending since before June 1, 2017, lose their access to the nation's deepest secrets if they hadn't received permanent clearances by last Friday. A White House official confirmed

to The Associated Press that Kelly's order has been implemented.

Trump could have reversed Kelly's decision and unilaterally offered Kushner a clearance, but deferred to Kelly.

"I will let General Kelly make that decision and he's going to do what's right for the country and I have no doubt he'll make the right decision," Trump said Friday, when he addressed the security clearance issue for the first time.

Kushner's attorney told the AP that Kushner's

ability to do his job won't be affected by any change to his clearance.

"Those involved in the process again have confirmed that there are dozens of people at Mr. Kushner's level whose process is delayed, that it is not uncommon for these clearance reviews to take this long in a new administration, and that the current backlogs are now being addressed," said Peter Mirijanian, a Kushner spokesman.

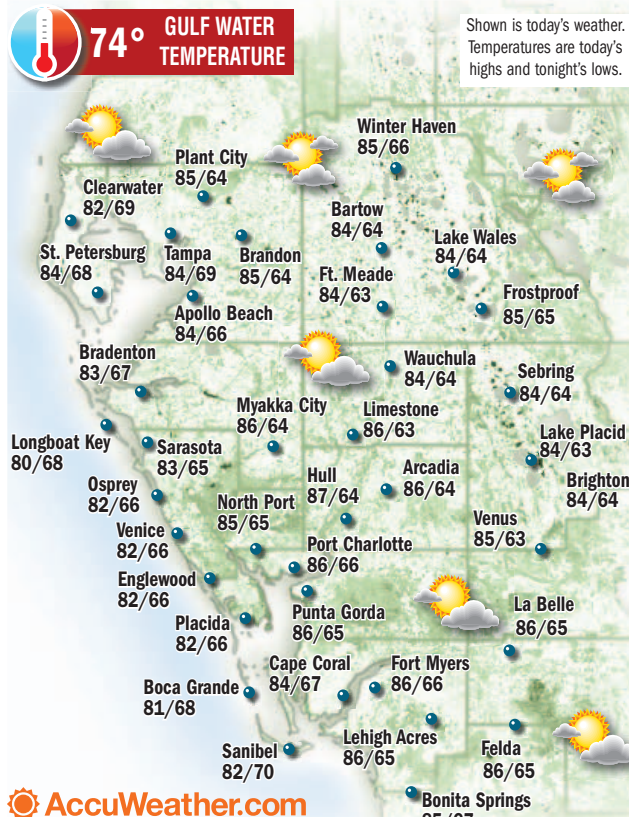

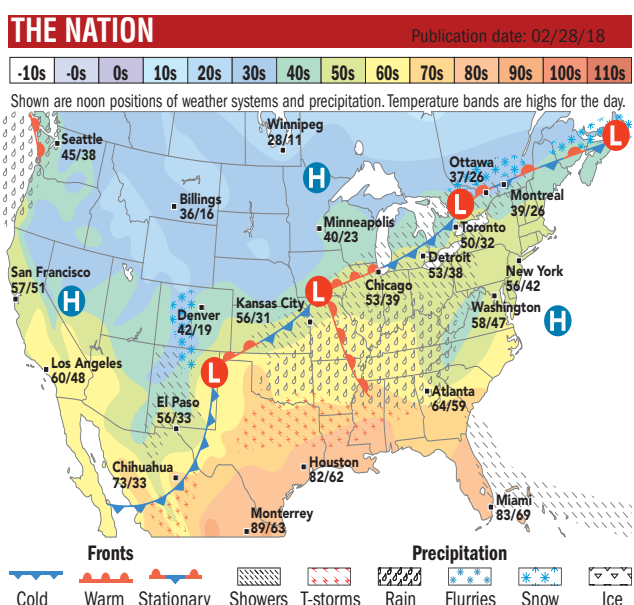

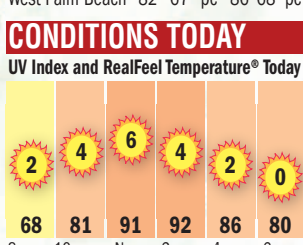

Trump names campaign manager for re-election bid

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump never stopped campaigning after winning the White House and now he's making fresh moves to establish his re-election effort.

The president on Tuesday named former digital adviser Brad Parscale as campaign manager for his 2020 election bid, a sign he is prioritizing loyalty as he works to secure his own political future in what is shaping up to be a bruising midterm election cycle for the GOP. The rise of Parscale, largely unknown in politics until just two years ago, has been inextricably linked to Trump's own political success.

In a statement, the Trump campaign said Parscale will lead "advanced planning" for the 2020 effort, and that the campaign also will be engaged in the midterm elections.

But the announcement turned heads on Capitol Hill, where Republicans have been lobbying the president for months to keep focused on the November 2018 contests — with leaders and political aides warning Trump that Democrats could gain subpoena power over his administration if Republicans lose the House or Senate.

The campaign also announced that former deputy campaign manager Michael Glassner will serve as chief operating officer, while the president's daughter-in-law, Lara Trump, will serve as senior adviser.

Trump, whose poll numbers have lagged recent predecessors, has left little doubt about his intention to seek re-election. He filed the paperwork to organize his re-election committee on Inauguration Day, held his first campaign rally on Feb. 18, 2017, and has mused publicly about potential Democratic challengers.

Parscale has long been close with the Trump family, a priority for the president as he begins planning his re-election strategy, according to a person familiar with campaign planning but not authorized to speak publicly about private discussions.

The Austin-based digital consultant, an ally of Trump son-in-law and senior adviser Jared Kushner, ran the Trump campaign's digital operations in 2016, which included sophisticated social media targeting.

Trump reaches deal with Boeing on new presidential planes

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump has reached an informal deal with Boeing to provide the next generation of presidential aircraft, the White House says.

Deputy press secretary Hogan Gidley said Tuesday that the president negotiated a \$3.9 billion "fixed price contract" for the new planes, known as Air Force One when the president is on board. It follows years of negotiations between Boeing and the U.S. Air Force — and Trump's personal intervention since his election.

In December 2016, Trump tweeted that costs for the program were "out of control, more than \$4 billion," he added. "Cancel order!"

The White House now says the original cost estimate was actually over \$5 billion for the two airplanes and development program.

Boeing chief executive Dennis Muilenburg met multiple times with Trump to discuss the Air Force One contract, most recently last week.

Gidley said the agreement would save the taxpayers more than \$1.4 billion.

Boeing, in a statement, said it is "proud to build the next generation of Air Force One, providing American Presidents with a flying White House at outstanding value to taxpayers."

"President Trump negotiated a good deal on behalf of the American people," they said.

The agreement includes the two 747-800 aircraft, and the cost of modifying the commercial planes with the equipment needed to support the president, including external stair, large galleys and a secure communications suite.

House GOP leaders dismiss Trump plan to arm teachers

WASHINGTON — House Republicans declined Tuesday to sign onto President Donald Trump's proposal for a federal mandate to arm teachers in the wake of the Florida school massacre, and also made clear their aim is to oppose further restrictions on guns.

House Speaker Paul D. Ryan, R-Wis., speaking as Congress returned from a long break after the Feb. 14 killing of 17 students and teachers by a former student armed with an AR-15 rifle, said decisions about teachers' use of weapons should rest with local authorities.

"That is really a question for local governments, local

school boards," he said of the proposal to arm educators, which Trump repeatedly has promoted since last week.

"As a parent myself and as a citizen, I think it's a good idea. But as speaker of the House, we should respect federalism and respect local jurisdictions."

Ryan instead cited "system failures" and mental health issues as "the kinds of things we are going to be discussing with our members, with the Senate and with the president." He did not include gun restrictions in that list.

"There are a lot of questions that need answers," Ryan added. "What we want to do is find common ground to make a difference."

The day's events suggested an election-year struggle for House and

Senate Republicans — how to confront rising national support for gun restrictions, and the powerfully emotional testimony of the high school victims, without reversing their long support for expansive gun rights.

Teenage survivors of the shooting at Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Fla., have led a dramatic public fight to expand background checks before guns can be purchased and to limit the availability of semiautomatic weapons such as the one used by 19-year-old Nikolas Cruz. But Ryan and other leaders made clear that congressional Republicans consider local law officials' handling of warnings about Cruz to be their prime focus.

"There was a colossal

breakdown in the system locally," Ryan said, citing Cruz's run-ins with law enforcement and the FBI's failure to investigate after its tip line received detailed allegations that he might be planning a mass shooting.

"Of course we want to listen to these kids, but we also want to make sure that we protect people's due process rights and legal constitutional rights while making sure that people who should not get guns don't get them."

Trump last week also proposed raising the minimum age for purchasing long guns from 18 to 21. But after a weekend meeting with several executives of the National Rifle Association, he has dropped that proposal for a federal age minimum,

which the organization opposes, from his public remarks. His spokeswoman, Sarah Huckabee Sanders, suggested Monday that its fate was up in the air.

The president has persisted in pushing for legislation encouraging the arming of teachers, which the NRA supports, though it has generated opposition from teachers, law enforcement officials and politicians of both parties.

Trump said that while teachers should not be forced to carry weapons, those who are "adept" at shooting should — and should be eligible for bonuses if they do. Addressing wary governors this week, he said the federal government could help pay for bonuses.

public relations and people changing their minds about where they want to live and unsettled questions concerning representation since October, and it's unacceptable," Jackson recently said, lamenting to lawyers that they hadn't yet set a trial date.

Separately, as the pre-trial doings proceed, Manafort is suing special counsel Mueller, accusing him of overstepping by indicting him for conduct "unmoored" from the Russian interference. Manafort is accused of acting as an unregistered foreign agent and orchestrating an international money laundering conspiracy to hide millions of dollars he earned from his foreign political work in eastern Europe.

Manafort spokesman Jason Maloni took more shots at the prosecution's fairness last week, suggesting its tactics violated Manafort's constitutional rights. And after Gates' guilty plea, Manafort himself waded into the

debate despite Jackson's gag order, maintaining his innocence against "untrue piled-up charges."

Attacking the prosecution is common in cases like this, but former Justice Department prosecutor David Weinstein said judges shouldn't be antagonized.

"If you continue to thumb your nose at the system itself," he said, "that's going to have a negative effect on the way the judge treats any statements you make."

Downing did not return a message seeking comment. Maloni declined comment.

Tensions surfaced from the first court appearance last October, when Downing, a former Justice Department lawyer and an imposing courtroom presence with pinstripe suits and well-coiffed hair, exited the courthouse into a sea of news cameras to proclaim his client's innocence.

"There is no evidence," Downing declared in a message that echoed the president's own oft-repeated contention, "that Mr. Manafort or the Trump campaign

colluded with the Russian government."

Among those who heard the message was the judge, who three days later scolded the lawyers.

"This is a criminal trial, and it is not a public relations campaign," she said in the first of a series of tense courtroom encounters. "So I want to make it clear, from this point on, that I expect counsel to do their talking in this courtroom and in their pleadings, and not on the courthouse steps."

Just weeks later, the issue arose again when prosecutors revealed that Manafort, from the confines of house arrest, had helped ghostwrite an opinion piece on his foreign consulting that was slated to be published in an English-language newspaper in Ukraine. Compounding the problem, the government said that one of Manafort's collaborators was believed to have ties to Russian intelligence.

Though prosecutors said Downing had assured them he'd take steps to prevent publication, the lawyer insisted

his client had done nothing wrong. It's unfair that Manafort "must simply remain silent while his reputation is battered, and potential jurors in this district might be tainted," Downing argued.

The op-ed ultimately was published. Prosecutors, demonstrating their ability to monitor Manafort's actions, tracked each edit he made in a version of the piece they pulled from his email.

Jackson didn't hold Manafort in contempt but issued a stern warning: Don't do it again.

Gates also came close himself to running afoul of Jackson's gag order by appearing via video at a fundraiser organized by a friend who complained of an "unfair prosecution." Both defendants, Jackson said, needed to use more "common sense."

Besides adversarial run-ins, there have been curious struggles with document filing — random notes were submitted by Manafort as an appendage to one filing before being withdrawn — and instances

in which the judge has said she's not even sure what defense lawyers are seeking.

Early in the case, Jackson scolded Downing for saying he had filed a bond review motion when he actually had not.

"Don't tell me if something says something it doesn't say," Jackson said.

But no issue has been more contentious, or drawn-out, than Manafort's bail package.

The lawyers have repeatedly tangled over the value of property Manafort has pledged to meet the \$10 million amount — and the lack of documentation the defense team has produced to support its arguments.

That's where the Zillow printout comes in. In December, Downing submitted it to justify the \$4.725 million estimated value for one of Manafort's homes.

Dismissal of the adequacy of the document, Jackson observed, "If you had to sell it tomorrow or insure it tomorrow or refinance it tomorrow, you would get an appraisal, you wouldn't print out a page from Zillow."

included are cases of picketing of Jewish religious or cultural institutions for purported support for Israel."

There were six incidents in which Jewish institutions were victims of vandalism and harassment for their purported support of Israel, Gutnick said.

Rabbi Shmuel Herzfeld, of Ohev Shalom-The National Synagogue in Washington, said neo-Nazis in the U.S. are emboldened "in a way I have not seen in my lifetime."

"It's scary," said Herzfeld,

whose synagogue received a bomb threat in April. "I think there is no question that it's on people's minds, and there is more of it out there."

The ADL is urging Congress to pass legislation to expand federal protections against bomb threats to religious institutions. The legislation, approved by the U.S. House of Representatives in December, awaits action in the Senate, the ADL said.

Greenblatt also urges "all public figures" to speak out against anti-Semitism "whether you're the president of the United States or the head of the local P.T.A."

President Donald

Trump was widely criticized for saying there was "blame on both sides" after violence erupted in August at a white nationalist rally in Charlottesville, Virginia, where 32-year-old Heather Heyer was killed when a man drove his car into a crowd of demonstrators. Greenblatt said Trump's statements about the rally were a "serious failure of moral leadership" and a "low point" of his presidency.

"There's no question we would love to see the president call out anti-Semitism as consistently and clearly as he does other issues," Greenblatt said.

Kushner is one of dozens of White House aides who have been working without permanent security clearances for the better part of a year.

White House press secretary Sarah Huckabee Sanders told reporters Tuesday that she would not comment on individual security clearances but called Kushner "a valued member of the team, and he will continue to do the important work that he's been doing since he started in the administration."

With a top-secret clearance, Kushner would have had access to information about covert operations and intelligence sources and methods. With a secret clearance, he would still have access to

intelligence assessments, but not necessarily the information behind why the U.S. knows what is being shared with him.

The downgrade would mean that anyone giving top-secret material to Kushner could be accused of mishandling classified material, according to David Priess, who wrote a history of the President's Daily Brief, the highest-level intelligence document produced in the United States. Still, a president has the ultimate authority to classify or declassify information, so he could show the brief — covering hot spots around the globe, U.S. covert operations and intelligence about world leaders — "to whomever he damn well pleases," Priess tweeted.

"We just don't report something we've heard. We call, we check and we verify," Greenblatt said.

There are three levels of security clearances. Disclosing information deemed "confidential" would "damage" national security. The unauthorized disclosure of "secret" information could cause "serious damage" to national security. "Top secret" disclosures would cause "exceptionally grave damage" to national security.

The White House's handling of security clearances has come under intense scrutiny in the wake of revelations that former White House staff secretary Rob Porter had worked for more than a year with only interim clearance. Porter, whose job gave him constant access to the most sensitive of documents, had been accused of domestic

abuse by his two ex-wives. The White House has repeatedly changed its timeline about who knew what and when about the allegations, and the scandal has weakened Kelly's standing, both among staffers and the president.

Kushner has been forced to repeatedly correct omissions in his "SF-86," the government-wide form used to apply for clearances, as well as his financial disclosure forms, which experts said could delay or even nix his chances of earning a clearance through the normal process. Kushner has also come under scrutiny in special counsel Robert Mueller's ongoing investigation into Russian interference in the 2016 election.

Puerto Rico: Treasury cuts \$4.7B disaster relief loan to \$2B

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico — Puerto Rico's governor said Tuesday that the U.S. Treasury Department has cut a \$4.7 billion disaster relief loan available to the U.S. territory by more than half, and he demanded help from Congress.

Gov. Ricardo Rossello said federal officials reduced the amount to \$2 billion without providing an explanation nearly five months after Congress approved the loan. He warned the move puts Puerto Rico in a "dangerous financial dilemma" and that his administration could be forced to cut some essential services as the island continues to struggle after Hurricane Maria.

"Any material interruption to Puerto Rico's public services will only exacerbate outmigration of its population to the mainland and further deepen and prolong Puerto Rico's decade-old fiscal and economic crisis," he said.

Tens of thousands of Puerto Ricans fled to the U.S. mainland after the Category 4 storm, which hit as the island was struggling to restructure a portion of its \$73 billion public debt load amid an 11-year recession.

Rossello said it seems the Treasury imposed certain loan restrictions to make it "extremely difficult for Puerto Rico to access these funds when it needs federal

assistance the most." He also said Treasury officials told his administration last week that they do not intend to forgive the loan.

Congress had approved the loan in October to help Puerto Rico recover from the storm, which killed dozens of people and caused up to an estimated \$94 billion in damage. Some 15 percent of power customers remain in the dark, and more than 700 families are still living in hotels across the island. Last week, Puerto Rico's power company obtained a \$300 million emergency loan that will help keep it operating only through late March, according to a federal control board overseeing the island's finances. The board said it plans to request more loans in upcoming weeks.

It is unclear why the \$4.7 billion federal loan was reduced. A Treasury spokesperson did not immediately return a message for comment.

In January, officials with the Treasury Department and the Federal Emergency Management Agency sent Puerto Rico officials a letter stating they were temporarily withholding the loan because they did not believe the government was facing a cash shortage as it had previously warned. Federal officials said the money would be released via the Community Disaster Loan Program once the island's central cash balance decreased to a certain level.

Rossello said talks with Treasury officials are ongoing even as he has asked Congress to intervene.

Taxes and Retirement Savings

Dear Mr. Berko: I have \$362,000 in my 401(k) account. It took me 22 years to accumulate that amount. Now I'm told that Washington is considering a tax on the current value of everybody's retirement accounts to help pay for the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. Is this true?

My wife and I recently moved back to Fort Lauderdale and discovered you're no longer on the air with your great call-in radio show. Why? We've tried to remember your great definition of the word politics. Could you repeat it for us?

— JS, Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

Dear JS: It takes a daunting amount of preparation to host a call-in radio talk show for two hours twice a week. And after a dozen delightful years of hosting a fun-filled financial program on WFSB and writing this column, something had to give. The column won!

My definition of politics comes from two words: "poly-," a combining form of Greek origin meaning "many," and "ticks," a noun denoting bloodsucking parasites. It's so apropos today! With very few exceptions, it's difficult to imagine a more fitting definition of Congress, as well as a great many elected officials in our 50 state legislatures. However, it also poignantly speaks to the intelligence and indolence of the voters who put them in office. Resultantly, the voter shoulders a great deal of the blame for a lot of our nation's problems. And yes, Congress wants to mess with our retirement accounts in hopes of finding enough revenue therein to pay for the tax cuts.

The first scheme that's being floated (still in subcommittee) is to restrict

the amount of money all workers could save pretax in 401(k) plans to \$2,400 annually. Today workers in a 401(k) can save up to \$18,000 a year, and those who are older than 50 can save \$24,000. Because contributions are pretax, workers who have been saving \$18,000 annually would pay taxes on an additional \$15,600 of income. This additional tax would help pay for the tax cuts.

A second plan notes that Americans have saved over \$7.6 trillion in 401(k)-type defined contribution plans, plus \$8.6 trillion in individual retirement accounts, some 70 percent of which was rolled over from 401(k) accounts. That totals \$16 trillion (nearly enough to pay off our national debt), and this amount grows larger each year. So far, this \$16 trillion is virgin territory; it's an untouched and untaxed asset that has nearly every "pollutician" in Washington salivating.

Members of Congress want to figure out a way to tax this money and help pay for the tax cuts. And they want the money now. So they devised an ingenious second scheme to tax those trillions now rather than wait for the money to be slowly withdrawn five or 15 years hence. The incentive is to pay lower taxes (10 percent) on your retirement plan distributions now rather than wait until you retire

and pay a much higher tax rate. Congress figures that if it offered a low tax rate of 10 percent on 401(k) money transferred to tax-free Roth accounts, it would theoretically generate new taxes of \$1.6 trillion. And that would easily pay for the tax cuts. That's an expalidocious idea, and I'd take advantage of that offer in a Sioux City second!

However, it would be only a stopgap measure, because the revenue from this potential tax would be a one-time event. It wouldn't address the growing deficits plaguing the nation because Americans are too lazy to become informed voters. That's why there are so many crooks in Congress. Eventually, Congress will propose a value-added tax. This is a consumption tax imposed by 160 countries across the oceans, fleecing citizens to pay for government pet programs. This consumption tax is placed on a product whenever value is added at a stage of production and at the point of retail sale. The United Kingdom, for example, has a flat 20 percent value-added tax, while the VATs in Germany, France, the Netherlands and Spain range between 5 percent and 21 percent.

A 5 percent VAT here in the U.S. would produce an extra trillion dollars annually for members of Congress to use to pay for repairing our infrastructure or otherwise spend while lining their personal pockets.

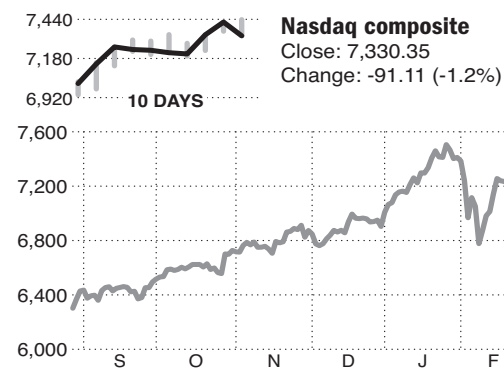
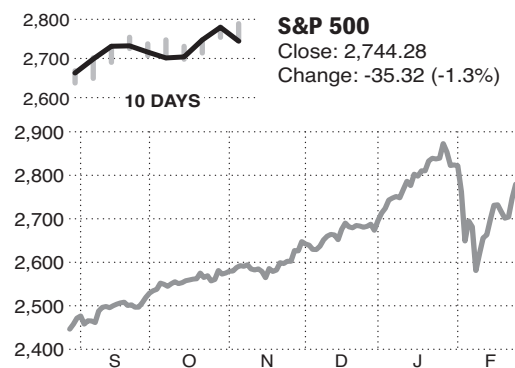

Here's what to do after chronic kidney disease diagnosis

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 76-year-old woman. I read your column daily, but I do not remember reading anything about chronic kidney disease. I have just been diagnosed with CKD and have been reading as much as I can get my hands on. This is very frustrating, since much of what I find is contradictory. However, my biggest concern is that the doctor sent me to a nephrologist, who told me that I have CKD, stage 3 — and then nothing!

In my reading, I have found that this is a common complaint of people who have CKD. One is diagnosed, after having several expensive tests run and money made for the medical institutions. Then nothing is done until one is at stage 5 and needs either a transplant or dialysis — again, moneymakers for the medical institutions. The sad thing is that stage 5 probably could be prevented through education and active care.

What can be done to raise awareness of CKD, and what can be done to provide better care for

patients who have been diagnosed, before they reach stage 5? — L.M.

ANSWER: The definition of "chronic kidney disease" is based on the kidneys' ability to filter out the toxins the body makes. One chemical, creatinine, has been a good marker for kidney function. The lower the creatinine level, the better kidney function and higher the "creatinine clearance," the number that defines the stage of chronic kidney disease. Stage 3 CKD is a creatinine clearance between 30 and 59 (yours is 44, according to the lab report you sent me).

However, as people get older, kidney function decreases. The rate is variable, but it averages around 7.5 per decade. Because of this, many people will get to the point of a diagnosis of CKD when they have normal kidneys that have aged as expected. I think this is the case in you.

Unfortunately, there are no treatments proven to slow, halt or reverse the loss in kidney function associated with normal aging. I don't believe your doctors are looking to make money for the medical center, they are looking to see whether you might have any cause other than "normal aging" as a cause of kidney damage. The labs you sent show no such cause, which means there is no specific treatment.

What distresses me about your story is the poor communication you received. Knowing that your kidney results are most likely a function of normal aging, that there are no treatments necessary and that it is unlikely you will progress to stage 5 (end-stage,

requiring dialysis or transplant) would likely have been very reassuring.

DEAR DR. ROACH: Your column from January about thymus cancer states that the thymus is located in the neck. Perhaps you meant the thyroid, which is in the neck. The thymus is under the sternum (at least that is where mine was removed from)! — R.H.

ANSWER: You are right about the thymus location. I did mean the thymus, but I was thinking of its starting place in human embryo development. It originates in the neck (just like the thyroid and parathyroid) then settles in the anterior superior mediastinum, the front upper part of the chest, at about the level of the heart and in front of the lungs. It often is removed in people with myasthenia gravis, where its removal may help long-term control of the disease, or with a tumor of the thymus. I can offer as excuse only that it's really important in early development in the immune system and has very little role in adults.

Cheers, protests as German court lets cities ban diesel cars

BERLIN — Handing environmentalists a landmark victory, a German court ruled Tuesday that cities can ban diesel cars and trucks to combat air pollution, a decision with far-reaching and costly implications in the country where the diesel engine was invented in the 1890s.

The ruling by the Federal Administrative Court stirred fears from motorists, auto dealers and other businesses worried about the financial impact. And Chancellor Angela Merkel's government scrambled to reassure drivers it would seek to prevent such drastic measures by pushing other ways to reduce urban pollution.

Diesel automobiles are a popular alternative to

gasoline-powered ones in Germany, with about 9 million diesel cars and several million trucks, buses and other vehicles affected by the ruling.

Overall, 1 in 3 passenger cars in Germany, home to such automakers as Daimler, Volkswagen and BMW, are diesel-powered, though the cleanest, most modern models would probably still be allowed even if cities decided on a ban.

"It's a great day for clean air in Germany," said Juergen Resch, head of the group Environmental Action Germany, which had sued dozens of German cities for failing to meet legally binding emissions limits.

While diesel cars produce less carbon dioxide and tend to get better mileage than gas-powered vehicles, they emit higher levels of nitrogen oxides,

or NOx, contributing to respiratory illnesses and 6,000 deaths annually, according to government figures.

Two German states had appealed lower court decisions that suggested bans on particularly dirty diesel cars would be effective. Germany's highest administrative court rejected that appeal Tuesday, effectively instructing two cities at the center of the case — Stuttgart and Duesseldorf — to consider bans as part of their clean air plans.

What comes next is an open question.

It's not clear whether cities will actually move to ban diesels. And if they do so, it remains to be seen whether automakers will be forced to upgrade exhaust and software systems or buy back vehicles; if the government will offer consumers incentives; or if owners will be left on their

own, forced to bear the costs.

The Leipzig-based administrative court said cities won't be required to compensate drivers for being unable to use their diesel cars.

Speaking on behalf of automakers, Matthias Wissmann, president of the German Association of the Automotive Industry, stressed that the government could ease the uncertainty by not leaving it to cities to decide on a case-by-case basis.

"We hope it comes to sensible national regulations," he said.

European cities considering diesel bans like Copenhagen and Paris will be watching how the situation plays out in Germany as they make their own decisions.

Jeff Schuster, an analyst with the consulting firm LMC Automotive

near Detroit, said diesel bans could spread to other polluted European cities. But he said the market in Europe, China and elsewhere was already headed in that direction because of the big push toward electric vehicles and the damage done by the Volkswagen diesel-emissions

cheating scandal. Diesels make up a smaller part of the American auto market, and so any bans in Europe would have little effect on the U.S., Schuster said. For the past two years in the U.S., only 2.7 percent of registered vehicles were diesel, according to Kelley Blue Book.

UN humanitarian chief calls Yemen conditions 'catastrophic'

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — The U.N. humanitarian chief is warning that conditions in Yemen are "catastrophic" after three years of war, with 22.2 million people needing aid. And the U.N. envoy is accusing both the Saudi-backed government and Shiite rebels of prolonging the conflict.

The U.N. officials painted a dire picture of the Arab world's most impoverished country plunging into the world's

worst humanitarian crisis and facing massive destruction as a result of what special envoy Ismail Ould Cheikh Ahmed called the parties' continuing "destructive pattern of zero-sum politics."

Undersecretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs Mark Lowcock warned the Security Council that "famine remains a real threat."

Cheikh Ahmed disclosed that a peace agreement had been about to be reached, but the parties refused to sign at the last minute. He called for fresh negotiations.

Despite outcry, Iranian minister addresses UN rights body

GENEVA (AP) — An Iranian government minister facing European Union and Swiss sanctions for human rights violations has criticized U.S. and Saudi policies at the U.N.'s top human rights body, defying calls for him to stay away.

Justice Minister Seyyed Alireza Avaei's visit was criticized because he's faced EU sanctions for six years for his role in arbitrary arrests, denying prisoners' rights and

increasing executions in Iran.

At the Human Rights Council on Tuesday, Avaei blasted the U.S. decision to recognize Jerusalem as Israel's capital, calling it "illustrative of gross violation of human rights" of Palestinians.

He criticized a blockade of Yemen by a Saudi-led coalition involved in a three-year "war of aggression" there.

About 100 demonstrators denounced Avaei outside the U.N. Geneva.

The U.S. delegation said it was "appalled" Iran sent him.

UN official concerned by allegations of torture in Turkey

ANKARA, Turkey (AP) — A top U.N. official has expressed concerns over increased allegations of torture and ill-treatment in police custody in Turkey.

Nils Melzer, the U.N. special rapporteur on torture, said Tuesday he was alarmed by allegations that people detained for suspected links to U.S.-based Muslim cleric Fethullah Gulen or to outlawed Kurdish rebels were "exposed to brutal

interrogation techniques" including beatings, electrical shocks and threats.

A U.N. statement quoted Melzer as saying: "no serious measures appeared to have been taken by the authorities to investigate these allegations or to hold perpetrators accountable."

There was no immediate response by the Turkish government which in the past declared commitment to a policy of "zero tolerance" to torture.

Turkey accuses Gulen of masterminding a failed coup in 2016 — an allegation the cleric denies.

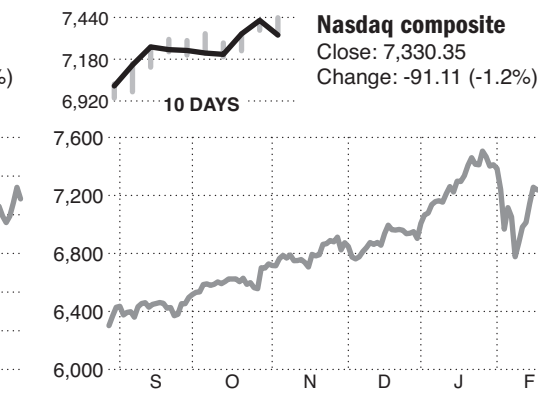
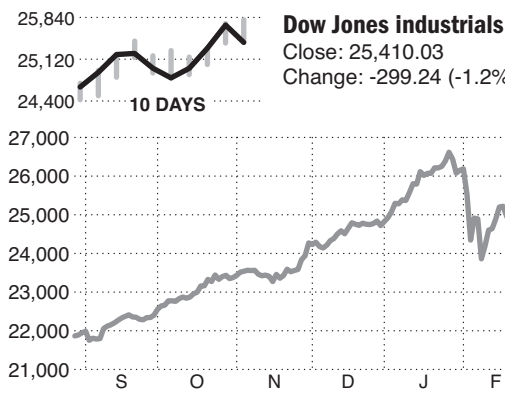
