



## Early voting opens Monday

Early voting for the Aug. 28 primary election begins on Monday, with Taylor County voters facing as many as five state and federal races, along with four local races and a referendum question. Early voting will take place each day from Monday, Aug. 13, until Saturday, Aug. 25, from

8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Supervisor of Elections new office located at 433 U.S. 19 North. Additionally, sample ballots have been mailed out to Taylor County voters this week, showing the races that will appear on the ballot depending on party registration and district location.

According to figures provided by Supervisor of Elections Dana Southerland, among Taylor County's 12,000 active registered voters, 6,343 are registered Democrat, 4,393 are registered Republican, 63 are registered with other parties and 1,201 have no party affiliation. Those registered

Republican or Democrat will have the chance to help narrow the field in a number of races ahead of November's general election, including: **U.S. Senate** Republican voters will choose between Roque "Rocky" De La Fuente → Please see page 2

## Stolen tractor recovered, trespasser found sleeping in abandoned camper



A handgun, a receipt for syringes, a substance that field-tested positive for methamphetamine and additional drug paraphernalia were seized from Christopher Benton.

A Perry landowner made an unusual discovery on his property on Mattie Carlton Road Wednesday – a large New Holland tractor that didn't belong to him and a trespasser asleep in an abandoned camper. The landowner immediately called authorities after finding the tractor, and it was while they were searching the area that the trespasser was found. "The property owner stated he has been having trouble with trespassers on his property and suspected they were involved in something that was not good," Taylor County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) Chief Chuck Mincy said. "Deputies responded to the scene, assisted by the

Perry Police Department. The property owner showed them the tractor and then they found a man asleep in an abandoned camper that was also on the property. They woke him up and got him outside. → Please see page 8

## Commission to re-open budget talks on Aug. 30

For the first time since voting 3-2 to tentatively raise the county's property tax (millage) rate nearly 7% next year, commissioners will meet to discuss their 2018-19 budget on Aug. 30 at 9 a.m. During the county's most recent regular meeting on Monday, Clerk of Court Annie Mae Murphy, County Administrator Ted Lakey and at least two commissioners requested the county hold a special meeting to further discuss the budget. When the time came

for Lakey to discuss any informational items, he asked the board, "Do we need to hold another budget hearing?" Murphy, Chairwoman Pam Feagle and Commissioner Malcolm Page all indicated they were in favor of another meeting. "I think it is necessary, because we still have some unanswered questions," Feagle said. "The issue is that you agreed to up the millage .5 mills..." Murphy began. "We set a tentative millage rate," Page interjected.


"The board voted to tentatively raise the millage rate .5 mills, but you did not instruct us what you plan to do with it," Murphy said. "We need you to decide how to allocate the additional revenues within the budget," Murphy said. "If you wait until the first public hearing to change budget allocations, it can put a strain on the financial staff and assistant county administrator to prepare a consolidated budget allocation by the Friday ad → Please see page 3



## Spradley seeks to retain county seat

County commission Dist. 3 candidate Steve Spradley said his nearly 40 years of experience in public service "has prepared me to be your county commissioner." He is seeking the seat as a NPA (no party affiliation) candidate and will be on the Nov. 6 General Election ballot. # Candidates and platforms outlined for Congress, governor and cabinet

and current Gov. Rick Scott to advance to November and face incumbent Democrat Bill Nelson, who is running for a fourth term as one of Florida's U.S. Senators.

De La Fuente, a longtime businessman, unsuccessfully ran for the Democrat Party nomination for U.S. president in 2016 and is currently running for U.S. Senate seats in six different states, including Florida. On the issues, he calls for finding alternatives to jail and prison for nonviolent offenders; supports the right to bear arms under the Second Amendment while also supporting "reasonable" gun control legislation; does not support repealing the Affordable Care Act, instead suggesting a "course correction" and calls for comprehensive immigration reform.

As for Scott, who is nearing the end of his second term in office as governor, his stated issues include: calling for term limits for all members of Congress; requiring a supermajority vote in both houses to approve a tax or fee increase; providing the executive branch with line-item veto power; and requiring congress to pass a budget before getting paid themselves.

### U.S. House

Democrat voters will also have two choices -- Brandon Peters and Bob Rackleff -- for their nominee for Florida's Second Congressional District, who will face Republican incumbent Neal Dunn in November. Dunn was first elected in 2016 and is running for second term in office.

Peters lives in Levy County, has worked as a civil trial lawyer and taught law at Florida A&M University. On the issues, he opposes cuts to Medicare and Social Security; supports increasing access to higher education and vocational training; supports reforming the Affordable Care Act; and wants to invest in infrastructure.

Rackleff, a U.S. Navy veteran, served on the Leon County Commission from 1998 to 2010. On the issues, he supports "Medicare for All," a fully-funded infrastructure program and eliminating the wage cap on Social Security.

### Florida Governor

In the Florida governor

race, a total of eight Republicans and seven Democrats are vying for a spot on November's ballot, which will also include four no-party-affiliated (NPA) candidates.

The choices available to Republican voters will be: Don Baldauf, Ron DeSantis, Timothy M. Devine, Bob Langford, John Joseph Mercadante, Bruce Nathan, Adam H. Putnam and Bob White.

Baldauf, who lives in Bradenton, has a platform that includes a pledge to eliminate all direct federal income tax for all Floridians. He also opposes sanctuary cities and supports gun rights.

DeSantis has represented Florida's sixth Congressional District since 2013. Endorsed by President Donald Trump in his bid for governor, DeSantis' platform includes being "100% pro-life and a strong defender of the Second Amendment."

Devine, who lives in Leesburg, ran as a write-in candidate for governor in 2014.

Langford is from Tallahassee, but little is known about his platform.

Mercadante is from Miami and has a platform that includes enhancing transportation, protecting workers from worker's compensation abuse and resolving nursing home abuse.

Bruce Nathan is a Tallahassee physical therapist and is running on a platform on fixing "Florida's worst problems," including corruption, human trafficking, the state's veteran suicide rate and Florida's implementation of medical marijuana.

Putnam, Florida's Commissioner of Agriculture, has a platform that includes fighting for less government, supporting gun rights, immigration reform and border security, career training and reducing regulations.

White is from Melbourne and is chairman of the Republican Liberty Caucus of Florida. His platform includes campaign finance reform, eliminating common core standards, protecting gun rights, opposing sanctuary cities and supporting criminal justice reform.

On the Democrat side, the candidates include: Andrew Gillum, Gwen

Graham, Jeff Greene, Chris King, Philip Levine, Alex "Lundy" Lundmark and John Wetherbee.

Gillum, the mayor of Tallahassee since 2014, is running on a platform that includes criminal justice reform, "common sense" gun safety policies, comprehensive immigration reform (including the abolishment of ICE) and supporting LGBTQ rights.

Graham, who represented Taylor County as of Florida's Second Congressional District in the U.S. House from 2014-16, has a campaign platform that includes: increasing teacher salaries and environmental protections, criminal justice reform, opposing the repeal of the Affordable Care Act, supports LGBTQ equality, a ban on assault weapons and universal background checks for all gun sales.

Green is a real estate entrepreneur running on a platform that includes increasing Florida's minimum wage to \$15 per hour, criminal justice reform, opposes Trump's immigration efforts,

supports LGBTQ equality and a woman's right to choose, as well as "common sense" gun safety solutions.

King is a Florida businessman with a law degree from the University of Florida. His campaign platform includes: gun safety reform, criminal justice reform, affordable housing, LGBTQ equality, ethics reform, workforce training and affordable college.

Levine was mayor of Miami Beach from 2013 to 2017. His platform for governor includes: affordable healthcare, "common sense" gun reform, criminal justice reform, government accountability, immigration reform and LGBT rights.

Lundmark is a realtor in Vero Beach, and his platform includes a comprehensive education reform agenda, criminal justice reform to reduce prison populations

by 50 percent, police reform and gun reform.

Wetherbee is a businessman from Jensen Beach, and his platform includes immigration reform and gun control.

### Attorney General

The governor's seat isn't the only statewide position without an incumbent running for re-election.

In the attorney general race, there are two Republicans -- Ashley Moody and Frank White -- and two Democrats -- Sean Shaw and Ryan Torrens.

Moody, who was a circuit judge in the Thirteenth Judicial Circuit before resigning to run for office, received an endorsement from sitting Attorney General Pam Bondi. White is a Florida legislator and is the chief financial officer and general counsel for the Sansas Dealer Group.

Shaw has been a Florida legislator from Tampa since 2016. Torrens is also from Odessa and has had his own law practice since 2012.

### Commissioner of Agriculture

Additionally, a total of four Republicans and three Democrats are running to follow Putnam as Florida's Commissioner of Agriculture. On the Republican side, the candidates are: Matt Caldwell, Denise Grimsley, Mike McCallister and Baxter Troutman.

Caldwell has been a member of the Florida House representing District 79 in Lee County since 2010. Grimsley has been a member of the Florida Senate representing District 26 in central Florida since 2012; she also served in the Florida House from 2004 to 2012. McCallister is a retired U.S. Army Colonel and university instructor. Troutman is a former member of the Florida House, having represented District 66 from 2002 to 2010 in Pinellas County.

On the Democrat side, the candidates are: Nicole "Nikki" Fried, Jeffrey Duane Porter and Roy David Walker.

Fried, who lives in Ft. Lauderdale, is an attorney who has worked in private practice and in the Alachua County Public Defender's

office. Porter is the mayor of Homestead currently serving his third term. Walker is from Plant City and holds a master's degree Environmental Policy and Management from American Public University, performing research with the United States Geological Survey, National Park Service and the Florida Fish & Wildlife Commission.

### Other Races

The Florida Chief Financial Officer race will not appear on the primary ballot because incumbent Republican Jimmy Patronis only has one Democrat challenger, Jeremy Ring.

Taylor County's representative in the Florida House, Halsey W. Beshears, received no challenger from either party and earned another term in office without opposition.

### Local Races

The only partisan primary for a local office will be between Taylor County Commission District 4 incumbent Pam Feagle (D) and challenger Ronald Glenn Ratliff (D). Democrat voters in that district will choose who moves on to face Douglas Cruce (R) in November.

Since Taylor County School Board and Perry City Council seats are nonpartisan, those races will appear on the primary ballot, and all voters within that particular district will be able to vote, regardless of party affiliation.

Additionally, because none of the races have more than two candidates, those races will be decided in the primary election with no run-off in November.

On the school board, District 4 incumbent Delton "Danny" Lundy is running against Eugenia L. "Gina" Jolley.

On the city council, District 4 incumbent Alan Hall will face challenger Mary Williams, and in the District 5 race, Tonya Holton and Ward Ketring are vying to replace Councilman (and Mayor) David Sullivan, who is not running for re-election.

### NEW RESTAURANT COMES TO PERRY

The new owner of the building that housed the Coachman Restaurant promised that he planned to reopen a restaurant at that site in "three months (of purchasing the site) or so, that all of Perry can be proud of."

Restaurant owner **Bob Green** said that tentative plans call for the opening later in 1983 of a restaurant that would rival establishments like Steak 'N Ale and The Brown Derby.

"This will be a classy restaurant," Green said. "I've lived here for nine years, and in that time I've heard of a need for a restaurant that serves something other than country cooking. People looking for more contemporary food fare have always had to go to Tallahassee and Gainesville to get it. In a few months, they will have it here."

### NEW CITY OFFICIALS

Joe Yarbrough was re-elected Mayor of Perry on Aug. 9, 1983, at a re-organizational meeting of the Perry City Council. Councilman Thomas Demps

was elected vice-mayor in the same re-organizational meeting. Both men were elected unanimously by the other members of the city council and took over their posts immediately.

### REPAIR SCAM NAILED LOCAL WOMAN

A local Perry woman was the apparent victim of a home improvement scam and a subsequent forgery, according to the Taylor County Sheriff's Department, and officers warned area residents to be wary of possible bogus businesses offering to do home improvements.

**Lt. Hugh Poppell** reported that the woman made the complaint after a \$5 check she had given to the suspect was cashed at Citizens Bank for \$50. Poppell said that on June 27, a white male suspect who cashed the check in the name of Eric D. Ambrosio, came to the woman's home and told her he would do tree work by trimming and spraying.

The woman said she told him she would need her son's approval before any work was done.

She also reported that the suspect left, but later returned and told her he had sprayed the trees, and that she owed him \$15 for the work.

The woman told Poppell that she talked him down to \$5 because she never authorized the work, and wrote the man a check.

Mark Wiggins was one of six prize winners Monday, Aug. 8, 1983, at the GO Taylor Roller Rink. He was presented with a University of Florida pillow by Women's Civic Organization president **Audrey Sanders**.

The WCO sponsored the special roller-skating night to raise money for the

Needy Children's Fund.

### BUILDING ADDED AT GLADYS MORSE

The biggest change at Gladys Morse Elementary School for the 1983-84 school year was the addition of a new classroom. Although the classroom was not ready for use until after school began, it helped alleviate some of the cramped quarters at the school. Other construction held during the summer included the removal of asbestos that was found in classroom ceilings at the end of the previous school year. Although school officials said the asbestos presented no health threat to students, it was removed and new ceilings were put up.

### INVOLVED PARENTS WAS PRIMARY GOAL

Getting parents involved in their children's education was one of the primary

focuses at Perry Primary School for 1983-84, and the teachers and administrators outlined a number of special programs aimed at parents. One new attempt to bring parents into the schools was a Parent Education Night. Scheduled for early in the school year, parents would learn more about the Title I program, would learn about the new report card and grading systems and would learn more about the Primary Education Program. Much more information about the schools was to be available to parents at the Parent Education Night.

## The trophies that remain

There used to be plaques, certificates and ribbons to remind me of the years I spent as a Taylor County 4-H member.

For years -- from 1977, when I began actively participating in 4-H and the Jerkins Heights 4-H Club, until 1988, when we moved into a new house -- my grandmother proudly displayed them on her living room wall.

I had returned from college and was working as a radio reporter and deejay for WPRY, so I was there to help her move. My grandmother wanted to place the plaques, certificates and ribbons on a wall in her new house, but I talked her out of it.

So, I made room in my closet for the large box they were packed in.

Several years later, I moved back to Gainesville for another tour of duty at the University of Florida. That August, four months after I moved, my grandmother passed.

The box, filled with my awards, was still in my bedroom closet when my grandmother's house was destroyed by fire a year later.

All wasn't lost though.

I still had plenty of indelible memories. I had taken my 4-H record book with me when I moved to Gainesville, so I still had a collection of photos and a timeline to go with my memories.

There was also one of my favorite teachers, Mrs. Laura Jenkins, and my former neighbor, Mrs. Katrina Morgan.

I can't remember the name of the plant, but nearly 40 years ago, Mrs. Jenkins purchased a plant from me during

my club's harvest bazaar and plant sale.

I thanked Mrs. Jenkins, who was always a big supporter, then instructed her on how to care for the plant.

The last time I stopped by to see Mrs. Jenkins, she took me straight to the carport so I could see what became of the flower I sold her.

She had cared for and propagated the plant like I instructed all those years ago.

"I did what you told me," she said. "And my plant's still here."

Nearly 40 years ago, Mrs. Morgan's husband built a house two "doors" down from my grandmother's house.

The Morgans were already neighbors, having lived two streets over, so when they moved, Mrs. Morgan asked me to help landscape her new yard. I made this one of my 4-H projects.

We planted hedges around the screened-in porch, and we planted patches of flowers around the yard. Then, I instructed her on how to care for everything.

The other day I saw Mrs. Morgan's daughter, Pat, at the store.

"Mom was just talking about you," she said. "She was talking about her hedges and said you planted them years ago when you were in 4-H."

Afterward, I drove by Mrs. Morgan's house to look at the hedges we planted all those years ago.

I smiled and patted myself on the back as I rode by admiring one of the few 4-H trophies I have left.



*Apple, Carrot, Zucchini Bread*

### Ingredients

- 1 cup unsalted butter melted
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 3 eggs, room temperature
- ¼ cup fresh orange juice
- 1 tbsp vanilla extract
- ¾ cups all-purpose flour
- ½ tsp salt
- 2½ tsp baking powder
- ¾ tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- pinch of ground cloves
- pinch of ground nutmeg
- 2 cups shredded carrots
- 1 cup shredded zucchini
- 1 cup diced, peeled apple (Granny Smith, Fuji, whatever you have on hand)
- ½ cup pecans, chopped

### Cream Cheese Glaze/Frosting

- ½ cup cream cheese, softened
- ¼ cup butter, softened
- 2-3 cups powdered sugar
- 1-3 tbsp orange juice as needed

### Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. Grease and flour two 8x4 inch loaf pans. Line with parchment paper and set aside.
3. Place zucchini in a large kitchen towel. Bring up the four corners and twist. Squeeze the towel to extract all the liquid from the zucchini, or as much as you can. Set aside.
4. In a large bowl, whisk together flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg together. Set aside.
5. In a separate large bowl, whisk together the butter and sugar.
6. Add eggs, orange juice and vanilla and whisk until combined.
7. Fold dry ingredients into wet ingredients along with the shredded carrots, shredded zucchini, apples and pecans.
8. Pour into prepared pans.
9. Bake until golden brown, 55 to 60 minutes, or until loaves spring back when gently pressed with fingers.
10. Let cool completely before icing.

### Cream Cheese Glaze/Frosting

1. Cream together cream cheese and butter with a hand mixer.
  2. Add in 2 cups of powdered sugar and continue mixing. Drizzle in orange juice until desired consistency is achieved.
  3. Frost bread and enjoy!


And finally, in the last one is floor wax -- that was the one you used on the hall floor!

## Ahead of first preseason game

# Detroit Lions name Blount co-starter

The Detroit Lions released their first unofficial depth chart of the pre-season this past Monday, featuring former Taylor County High School standout LeGarrette Blount as a co-starter heading into their NFL exhibition opener tonight (Friday) at the Oakland Raiders.

Blount and Theo Reddick were listed as the starting running backs ahead of Kerryon Johnson and Ameer Abdullah on the pre-season depth chart.

On Tuesday, the Lions finished their first joint practice with the Raiders, which consisted of four physical goal-line series reps.

The Lions recently signed Blount to be a 250-pound runningback who can help

in short-yardage and goal-line situations.

Detroit Free Press writer Dave Birkett said, "I spent my day on the sideline behind the Lions' offense, so most of my observations were on that side of the ball. In the goal-line period, the Raiders stuffed LeGarrette Blount on consecutive runs from the 2-yard line, as Blount tried plowing up the middle, but only gained about a yard. On the next play, from the 1, officials marked him down just inches short of the goal line."

Blount is projected to serve as the Lions' short-yardage back this fall, but it was Johnson, the Auburn rookie, who scored the only touchdown in goal-line work along with the second-

team offense.

Blount scored 18 touchdowns in 2016, which led the National Football League (NFL) before converting 8 of 15 runs (53 percent) with one-yard to go in the Super Bowl last year for the Philadelphia Eagles.

Blount won the Super Bowl with the New England Patriots in 2017 before signing a one-year contract with the Eagles where he would contribute to bringing the city of Philadelphia its first Super Bowl trophy.

Blount will make his debut in a Lions jersey as the 2018-19 NFL exhibition season kicks off tonight (Friday) with Detroit taking on the Oakland Raiders at 10:30 p.m. on the NFL

## Keaton Beach Fishing Report

### Trout bite will improve with new moon

Better morning incoming tides around the Aug. 11 new moon should produce better boxes of trout this weekend, as the tide was falling throughout the day last weekend.

I had Gail Gavin of Perry with her grandson George Thurman III out Sunday, and we fished a falling tide

with almost no breeze, yet boated 8 trout and one black sea bass fishing in 5.5-6.5 feet of water.

This was George's first-ever trip out on the Gulf, and this six-year-old caught a 24-inch trout weighing just under 5 pounds! We also had a 23-inch trout in the cooler.

The fish were fickle, and we would catch only one per

stop -- just like last Saturday -- due to the too-little-breeze situation.

Our best drift of the trip brought in four of the trout while we benefitted from the best breeze of the day accompanying the drift.

We fished live pinfish under Back Bay Thunders to land our fish.

I saw a bunch of ballyhoo that had probably been pushed out and south due to the rainfall of late.

I didn't see anything feeding on them, but the water had less than a foot of visibility where the most bait was. We caught our fish in dark, stained water with approximately 24 inches of visibility.

If you must fish plastics, shorten your leaders under your Original Cajun Thunder, or less than the visibility, or else don't expect the trout to be able to see your offering.

The 6-foot-4, 251-pound Stephens chipped in six catches for 121 yards in 2017, but also showed growth when assisting in blocking for the run game. There were certainly some positives to take away from last season, but Stephens is entering his final year with

a never-satisfied approach. "I'm trying to take it to the next level this season," Stephens proclaimed. Stephens has participated in 28 games over the course of his Florida career, but has flown somewhat under the radar heading into last season.

"Oh yeah, definitely. Because I already know, a lot of people probably counted me out, thinking, 'Oh, he's a receiver. It's going to take him a long time to transition.' I mean, it has, but at the same time, I still work," Stephens told Bender.

"People may not see, but I'm still working, getting bigger, getting stronger. I'm just trying to change my body into just being a tight end," Stephens said. From packing on the necessary weight, to getting accustomed to playing with his hand in the dirt, Stephens

has been a man on a mission this year. Florida will open the 2018 season on Sept. 1 when they host Charleston Southern. The following week the Gators will welcome Southeastern Conference (SEC) opponent Kentucky to town.

In 2013, Blount was traded to the New England Patriots and led the Patriots to a playoff bye with a win over the Buffalo Bills by rushing for a career-high 189 yards on 24 carries, scoring two touchdowns and returning two kickoffs for 145 yards with a long of 83 yards, setting a franchise record for all-purpose yards with 334 yards. In the Divisional Round against the Indianapolis Colts, he had 166 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns in a 43-22 victory, but was limited to six yards on five carries in a 26-16 loss to Denver in the AFC Championship game.

In 2014, Blount signed a two-year contract with the Pittsburgh Steelers, but was released late in the season. After clearing waivers, Blount signed a two-year deal on Nov. 20, 2014 to re-join the Patriots for a second stint in New England.

In the 2014 AFC Championship Game, Blount had 30 carries for 148 rushing yards and three touchdowns, as New England routed the Indianapolis Colts 45-7. In doing so, Blount became the New England Patriots' franchise leader in postseason rushing touchdowns with seven. In Super Bowl XLIX, Blount rushed 14 times for 40 yards as the Patriots defeated the Seattle Seahawks by a score of 28-24 to earn his first Super Bowl ring.

In 2015, Blount recorded 165 carries, 703 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns in 12 games before suffering a season-ending left hip injury.

In 2016, Blount re-signed with the Patriots under a one-year deal and finished the season with 1,161 rushing yards, a league-high 18 touchdowns, making him the first Patriot in franchise history to lead the league in rushing touchdowns. The Patriots advanced to the Super Bowl and trailed 28-3 in the third quarter, before rallying all the way back to win the game by a score of 34-28 in overtime against the Atlanta Falcons. Blount had 11 carries for a team-high 31 rushing yards and won his second Super Bowl ring.

as the Eagles won against his former team, defeating the Patriots 41-33, giving Blount his third Super Bowl championship and the Eagles' first in franchise history. Blount is one of

only five players to win back-to-back Super Bowls with different teams along with Ken Norton, Jr., Deion Sanders, Brandon Browner, and teammate Chris Long.

## 'Christopher Robin' may be a movie for kids, but the story aims for the parents

Let's face it, we live in a pretty cynical and jaded time, so it's rare to get a movie these days that is truly genuine and sweet -- in a totally non-ironic way. But, that's exactly what we get in Disney's "Christopher Robin," a live-action adaptation of Winnie-the-Pooh and rest of the residents of the Hundred Acre Wood.

With a story reminiscent of "Hook," the film imagines a world in which Christopher Robin (Ewan McGregor, "Fargo") is all grown up with a wife, Evelyn (Hayley Atwell, "Captain America: The First Avenger"), and daughter, Madeline (Bronte Carmichael, "Darkest Hour"). Unfortunately, Christopher's job keeps him quite busy, and he is forced to cancel a planned trip to the countryside when his boss Giles (Mark Gatiss, "Sherlock") says he needs to work through the weekend. Christopher sends Evelyn and Madeline off on their trip while he struggles to find a way to cut costs in order to save his fellow employees and maybe save the company as a whole.

Arriving at just the right moment -- although Christopher might disagree -- is Pooh (voiced by Jim Cummings, who has been providing the voice of both Pooh and Tigger in countless incarnations of the characters since 1988). Christopher's childhood friend is back because he can't find Tigger and the rest. Pooh needs some help, but he just might be able to help Christopher along the way too.

Visually, the film is a wonderful mix of the Disney adaptations many of us have grown up with and the original version, in which many of the characters were stuffed animals, not actual creatures. I shouldn't be surprised since this is the same studio which delivered the visually stunning "The Jungle Book,"

but the way Pooh and the rest are brought to life on the screen is absolutely amazing and adorable.

Unlike Pooh and Tigger, who were voiced by Cummings, most of the other residents of the Hundred Acre Wood have been recast for this film mostly to give them a more British feel to match the film's London setting. The voice cast includes Toby Jones ("Jurassic World: Fallen Kingdom") as Owl, Peter Capaldi ("Doctor Who") as Rabbit and Brad Garrett ("Everybody Loves Raymond") as Eeyore.

As I said earlier, the story will remind you of "Hook," which also saw a classic child character grow up into a stuffy adult. While that film built on the swashbuckling action of its source material, here we get a slower, gentler story that doesn't really have much in the way of antagonists, aside from the distractions of adulthood. I really liked that Christopher's work wasn't simply a single-minded pursuit on his behalf, because numerous others' financial security was riding on him being able to find a solution to the problem his boss drops in his lap.

As such, I do feel the adults in the audience might relate better with the main story than the children around them, but there is still plenty for younger audiences to enjoy as well. As one might expect, there were a lot of kids in the audience when I saw this on opening weekend, and they gave the film a round of applause when it was over.

While I didn't join them myself -- I almost never clap at the end of a movie -- I did leave the theater with a big smile on my face. This may be a cynical world, but sometimes a wonderfully delightful film can help us forget that it is, at least for an hour or two.

The film is rated PG for some action.

## Weak story hurts otherwise funny 'Spy'

When I saw the trailer for "The Spy Who Dumped Me," starring Mila Kunis ("Bad Moms") and Kate McKinnon ("Ghostbusters"), my first thought was: "Mila Kunis in a spy comedy? I'm definitely seeing that." My second thought was: "Kate McKinnon is in it too? Well, I'm still going to see it." My third thought (yes, I think a lot when watching trailers; I'm a movie reviewer) was: "This sort of reminds me of 'Spy,' the Melissa McCarthy comedy."

Well, Kunis is great in this movie, once again playing more or less the straight woman surrounded by chaos, which she did in both hilarious "Bad Moms" movies. McKinnon is solid but really needs to find a way to tone down her energy.

"The Spy Who Dumped Me" is really less "Spy" and more "Knight and Day" or "The Killers," in which a civilian girlfriend finds out her boyfriend is a secret agent. Fortunately, this movie gives Kunis a lot more to do than the female leads in the other films. What I do wish this movie learned from "Spy," however, is that to be a really good spy comedy, you need to be at least a decent spy movie as well, and that is this

film's biggest weakness.

The story revolves around gal pals Audrey (Kunis) and Morgan (McKinnon), whose lives are turned upside down when Audrey's ex-boyfriend shows up, reveals he is a spy with assassins on his trail and entrusts her with delivering an important package that could prevent the deaths of many people.

Throw in a British secret agent (Sam Heughan, "Outlander"), an annoying CIA lackey (Hasan Minhaj, "The Daily Show") and a psychotic ex-gymnast (Ivanna Sakhno, "Pacific Rim: Uprising"), and you have your movie.

Kunis and McKinnon have solid comedic chemistry, but I wish the story around them was stronger -- or at least more interesting. Likewise, the script falls into the trap many generic spy flicks do by tossing one too many twists into the mix. The last one here really doesn't make any sense and distracts from what is otherwise a decent comedy that provides enough laughs to keep audiences entertained.

The movie is rated R for violence, language throughout, some crude sexual material and graphic nudity.

## What if there were three of you?

In 1980's New York, 19-year-old Robert Shafraan drove himself to college. Upon his arrival, it seemed everyone already knew him, only they kept calling him Eddy. Finally, one of Eddy's friends stopped Robert and stated, "You must be twins!"

Driving into New York City, Robert and Eddy Galland met for the first time (that they remembered), each shocked to see his double. Both had been adopted and both shared the same birthdate. It did seem that they were in fact twins.

Their reunion became a local news sensation, which drew the interest of 19-year-old David Kellman, who saw the photo of the twins and was shocked. They looked just like him! Twins separated at birth reuniting 19 years later is a regional story. Triplets? That went global.

This story, and everything that happened afterward, is told in the new documentary "Three Identical Strangers," directed by Tim

Wardle ("One Killer Punch").

As I said in my preview of the film last week, the trailer for this film does a great job of setting up the greater mysteries unearthed by the triplets' discovery of each other, as well as the long-term ramifications of what happened when they were babies. I won't spoil those revelations here, but I will say that the documentary does a wonderful job pacing out the story, setting up the questions and providing the answers (when they're available) at the right moments.

This is fascinating story with deep questions, not just about the events themselves, but beyond as well.

If you are a fan of documentaries, or just enjoy stranger-than-fiction tales from real life, this is definitely one worth checking out while it's still in theaters.

The film is rated PG-13 for some mature thematic material.

## 'Teen Titans Go! To the Movies' reminds us DC can have fun too

The "Teen Titans" animated series, which aired on Cartoon Network from 2003 to 2006, will always have a special place in my heart. Not only did it feature strong storytelling and interesting characters, it was also responsible for rekindling my brief childhood infatuation with comic books, a hobby that has cost me hundreds of dollars and still takes up a significant percentage of my closet space.

In 2013, Cartoon Network debuted "Teen Titans Go!" which featured the same characters and voice actors, only in zanier, goofier incarnations, with Robin (Scott Menville), Beast Boy (Greg Cipes), Cyborg (Khary Payton), Raven (Tara Strong) and Starfire (Hynden Walch) spending more time singing songs and eating burgers than actually fighting crime during the 15-minute-long episodes.

The show divided fans, but while it definitely relies on slapstick humor and little-to-no plot, it can be surprising with just how smart and subversive the writing is at times, often breaking the fourth wall and injecting plenty of meta humor on comics and the entertainment industry.

I wasn't sure what to expect from the series' feature film debut, "Teen Titans Go! To the Movies," but I was not prepared for just how funny it would be. In fact, this may go down as one of my favorite films of the summer.

Sure, there is plenty of juvenile slapstick humor -- it is akids' movie after all -- and musical numbers, which range from mildly annoying to truly inspired. Still, comic book fans of any age will be able to appreciate just how much effort was put into placing so many references, from the obvious to the obscure. For example, they cast actor Nicholas Cage as Superman. (Cage was once set to play the superhero in the ill-fated "Superman Lives," a film so beset by production issues before its demise that a documentary was made about it.)

The story of "Teen Titans Go! To the

Movies" is admittedly simple, but the film still manages to feel like more than simply a long episode of the show. Robin, tired of the Titans being looked down upon by the rest of the superhero community, decides the only way they will be taken seriously is if they have a movie made about them, because Hollywood is making superhero movies about everybody these days. Thus, they head off to Warner Brothers Studios, where they are again rebuffed, with the director (Kristen Bell, "Frozen") telling them they don't even have a proper arch-nemesis. Fortunately, the villain Slade (Will Arnett, "The Lego Batman Movie") is in town ready to commit some crimes.

What follows is 90 minutes of the writers having a lot of fun at their own expense, as well as Warner Brothers, DC Comics and the superhero-movie craze. You don't have to be a "Teen Titans" fan to get a lot of the humor, which flies at you fast and often. There is as much fourth-wall breaking and meta humor in this movie as in either "Deadpool" movie, only this one is rated PG.

On a side note, I really liked that the original voice cast gets top billing in the credits. Often, when an animated series is brought to the big screen, the voice actors who gave life to the characters are either cast aside altogether for big-name talent (as what happened with the "The Lego Ninjago Movie") or buried under the "guest" stars (as with the "My Little Pony" movie). The only actors to get top billing here are Bell and Arnett, and only after the main cast. That's a refreshing change to how things usually go.

Overall, "Teen Titans Go! To the Movies" is a hilarious, irrelevant, borderline subversive superhero film that is perfectly safe to bring your children to, unless you don't want them to see you laughing just as hard as they are.

The film is rated PG for action and rude humor.



## THIS WEEKEND AT THE MOVIES

If you thought that after getting six movies last week we'd get a light weekend this time around, you'd be mistaken, because another four films are opening in wide release.

Up first is "BlacKkKlansman," the latest joint from director Spike Lee, telling the true story of Ron Stallworth (John David Washington, "Ballers"), an African-American police officer from Colorado who was able to successfully infiltrate the local Ku Klux Klan and become its leader. The cast also includes Isiah Whitlock Jr. ("The Mist"), Alec Baldwin ("Mission: Impossible - Fallout") and Adam Driver ("Star Wars: The Last Jedi"). I wasn't familiar with this story prior to seeing the film's trailer, but it definitely has me intrigued.

The film is rated R for language throughout, including racial epithets, and for disturbing/violent material and some sexual references.



"Dog Days" is an ensemble comedy-drama in the vein of "Mother's Day" and "New Year's Eve," in which a series of interconnected storylines come together, bringing their various characters along for the ride. Only this time, instead of connecting the various storylines around a holiday, they all revolve around dogs and their owners in Los Angeles, Calif. The movie is directed by Ken Marino ("How to Be a Latin Lover") with a script from Elissa Matsueda ("The Miracle Season") and Erica Oyama ("Burning Love"). Meanwhile, the wide-ranging cast includes Nina Dobrev ("The Vampire Diaries"), Vanessa Hudgens ("Spring Breakers"), Finn Wolfhand ("Stranger Things"), Lauren Lapkus ("Jurassic World"), Eva Longoria ("Desperate Housewives") and Ron Cephas Jones ("This Is Us"). Director Garry Marshall, who helmed most of the holiday-themed ensembles, died last year, so it looks like others are following in his footsteps.



The movie is rated PG for rude and suggestive content, and for language.

"The Meg" is an action-adventure thriller from director Jon Turteltaub ("National Treasure") about a man named Jonas Taylor (Jason Statham, "The Fate of the Furious"), who is still recovering from a disastrous expedition to the Mariana Trench. Five years later, he discovers that a 70-foot megalodon, long thought extinct, is alive and well and looking for dinner. The story is based on the 1997 novel, "Meg: A Novel of Deep Terror," by Steve Alten, which I believe I read back then, although I have no recollection of what happens in the story. The premise seems interesting, and the film's arrival just weeks after Discovery Channel's Shark Week cannot be a coincidence, but the marketing campaign has left me confused, as it seems bent on adding a lot of humorous undertones, which seems like the wrong direction to go with this kind of story.

The movie is rated PG-13 for action/peril, bloody



images and some language.

Finally, we have "Slender Man," a horror film based on the internet urban legend which originated around 2009 on the online forum Something Awful when posters were challenged with creating a supernatural being. One poster submitted a few doctored photographs along with some creepy text, and the legend was born, becoming one of the most well-known creepypastas around (essentially the horror story equivalent of an internet meme). Slender Man gained worldwide notoriety when two young girls blamed the being as the reason why they stabbed their 12-year-old friend. Of course, now we have the movie, which tells the story of how the being haunts and abducts children and teens. Directed by Sylvain White ("The Losers"), the film boasts Joey King ("Going in Style") as its most well-known cast member.

The film is rated PG-13 for disturbing images, sequences of terror, thematic elements and language including some crude sexual references.





## Make sure your child is getting enough sleep




School-aged children are busier than ever before, and some may be sacrificing sleep to accommodate their lifestyles. The National Sleep Foundation says school-aged children need between nine and 11 hours of sleep each night to function at a healthy level. Sleep deprivation can be linked to a host of health ailments, including issues affecting the development of the brain. Growing evidence suggests that lack of sleep can cause disturbances in metabolic rates that could affect the risk for cardiovascular disease, diabetes and obesity. A recent study from Johns Hopkins University found that, for each additional hour of sleep a child gets, the risk of that child becoming overweight or obese decreases by 9 percent. Children who slept the least, according to the research, had a 92 percent higher risk of being overweight or obese compared to children with longer sleep

duration. The NSF adds that poor or inadequate sleep can lead to mood swings, behavioral problems and cognitive problems that impact kids' ability to learn in school. To promote good sleep habits in children, parents and other caregivers can establish consistent sleep/wake routines; ensure children avoid excess caffeine, particularly late in the day; create a cool, dark sleep environment; keep televisions and other media devices out of bedrooms; and help children work through stressors that may impact sleep.

## FROM THE RECIPE BOOK

### Fire up the grill for fresh veggies

Vegetables are more versatile than many people may know. Steaming or sautéing vegetables might be among the most popular ways to cook veggies, but grillmasters know that it's not just main dishes that taste great when cooked over an open flame. As the following recipe for "Charred Green Beans with Lemon Verbena Pesto" from Karen Adler and Judith Fertig's "The Gardener & The Grill" (Running Press) can attest, grilled vegetables make for simple yet satisfying side dishes.

and pulse to puree. Slowly add the olive oil with the processor running until the mixture thickens and emulsifies, about 1 minute. Season to taste with salt and pepper. The pesto will keep in the refrigerator for 7 to 10 days, or it may be frozen for up to 3 months. Place the grill wok or basket directly over the fire and stir-grill, tossing the beans with wooden paddles or grill spatulas until crisp-tender, about 5 to 8 minutes. Transfer the grilled beans to a large bowl and toss with about 1/4 cup of the Lemon Verbena Pesto or to taste.

#### Charred Green Beans with Lemon Verbena Pesto

Serves 2 to 4

- Green Beans
- 1 1/2 pounds slender green beans
- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- Lemon Verbena Pesto
- 1 cup fresh lemon verbena leaves (substitute fresh lemon balm leaves)
- 2 garlic cloves
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup pine nuts or English walnuts
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- Fine kosher or sea salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste




