Utility rates likely to rise

City council members held a workshop Thursday on a proposed utility rate hike, but took no action.

Council heard from consultant Malcolm-Pirnie Inc., which outlined a number of scenarios designed to recoup past losses.

In addition a hikes in the 3 percent range, under a fiveyear program adopted in 2007, council will consider additional increases this year.

Consultants laid out a series of scenarios that increase rates, creates a reserve in the Utility Fund where none had existed before, uses surtax proceeds, and increases debt ser-

"On a preliminary basis, pending additional information, analysis and discussion, council expressed a preference for a middle approach, but no decision was made," wrote Mayor Ed Martin in an e-mail dated Jan. 14.

"Utilities fees are, under law, supposed to pay the costs of the services, but the city, involved in some major capital expenditures, did not raise the rates until about \$9 million had been used from general revenues to support the utilities fund, creating a loan obligation to the city's general fund.

'In 2007, the previous council passed a resolution raising utilities fees by 3 percent a year for a five-year period to help

Venice dredging project begins

New sand is being added to Venice Beach.

The dredging of the Venice Inlet is anticipated to deposit more than 30,000 cubic yards of sand on the beach. The sand primarily will come from shoals that built up in the Intracoastal Waterway along Snake Island, located east of the inlet.

"Boating should not be impacted," said Chuck Listowski, director of the West Coast Inland Navigation District. However, boaters are urged to use caution navigating in areas near where the dredge crews are working. Listowski said buoys will be placed to mark the location of the dredging pipeline.

Sarasota County Commis-

sioner Nora Patterson, who serves as her county's WCIND representative, said, "I think it's the first dredging in a long time in the Intracoastal Waterway. It's been a hazard for boaters trying to get in and out of the inlet.'

The sand is being deposited on the public beach area just south of the Jetty Villas.

Gas getting scarce on the island

Gas has become a rare commodity on the island of Venice in the first few days of 2010. Of the three gas stations operating last year, only one continues to dispense gas.

To make the situation worse, there is a possibility next month that the only station pumping gas on the island may stop for a limited time.

The only station still dispensing gas is the Citgo station on Business 41 at West Miami Avenue. Operated since 1994 by Bob and Chandra Patel, it has underground tanks that were installed a few years ago to meet the new stringent standards that have led other stations to go out

of the business of selling gas. "In three weeks all the gas pumps are being replaced with new state-of-the-art dispensers," he said. This will resolve problems encountered by some ustomers pumping gas during the recent cold spell.

The Patels have lived in Venice since 1991. For two and a half years they operated a gas station south on Business 41 that closed because the underground tanks needed replacing and there were problems with well-water usage.

With the start of the new year the most central gas station, Island BP, 116 North Tamiami Trail at the Venice Avenue Bridge, closed. A handwritten notice on the kiosk door states "Store closed — out of business." The inventory has been removed from the small store and the pumps are covered.

Former manager Rajan Markose confirmed that the sta-

tion had closed because new underground storage tanks were required and the \$250,000 replacement cost was not available Ryan from a lender. The station is



owned by AMJ Oil Company of Chicago.

The third island gas station, Shell, near Venice Regional Medical Center, stopped selling gas a few days ago. Arrangements had been made for a contractor to start replacing the underground storage tanks on Jan. 4 but he had to delay until the end of January. Manager Gary Patel said the job, including installation of new pumps, should be completed in four weeks and they will be selling gas again around the end of February.

Venice Area Chamber of Commerce President John Ryan said it is unfortunate if some gas stations in this area make the business decision not to replace tanks. "My biggest concern is, these businesses occupy prominent locations and if they look and become blighted this will affect the whole community,"

Board: No rental violation

Neighbors thought they had the property owner dead to rights. They spoke to renters who said they had a lease. They took down their license plate numbers and photographed the visitors to Venice.

But in the end the city of dropped charges against a property owner who was accused of violating the city ordinance banning shortterm rentals.

The municipal Code Enforcement Board voted 4-2 on Jan. 7 to drop all new actions against Marty L. Gwynn, who owns a home on Darling Drive.

It's the second time Gwynn has been brought before the code board. Gwynn is already taking the city to court appealing an earlier alleged violation

on the grounds that the reservation was made prior to the ordinance going into affect.

Gwynn's attorney, Grady Huie, said that denying the reservations amounts to interfering with an existing contract and is therefore unconstitutional. He also argued, in this instance, that the city simply didn't make its case.

A city ordinance passed in July 2009 bans short-term rentals except those that were already licensed. After that all others were to cease.

Dates disputed

In this latest code enforcement action, the board was faced with a city case that con-


Getting Anderson in the loop

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the fourth in a series of stories on shade meetings. In the first story we reported that the first shade (private attorney-client) meeting regarding the Pier Group lease litigation, held Oct. 10, 2006, began with a prediction by the city's lead attorney that it had little chance of prevailing. A second story detailed how city council spent the next two and a half years seeking concessions, largely to limit the size of a restaurant renovation. It was followed by a third story on how evidence against the city's position that the lease was invalid mounted. The following story explores City Attorney Bob Anderson's role in the dispute.

It's standard operating pro-

cedure to blame a governmental body's current difficulties on previous administrations. So it was when new members on Venice City Council inherited a legal challenge against



Pier Group, owners of Sharkv's On The Pier restaurant.

The discomfort was with a lease negotiated back in 2000 and amended in 2003 by then city manager George Hunt.

Hunt had his own way of doing things. He asked for authority to become lead negotiator over a new lease being negotiated with Pier Group without the participation of City Attorney Bob Anderson.

Later, convinced the city was getting a raw deal because there were blanks in some of the terms of the lease, Council Member John Moore challenged it.

On May 9, 2006, he persuaded fellow council members to join in the challenge. At a public meeting, Moore moved to authorize the city manager and city attorney to nego-



FWC limits fishing due to chill kill

The recent cold snap caused a "widespread" saltwater fish kill, so state wildlife regulators closed fishing for snook, bonefish and tarpon Saturday to protect what's left.

Several area sport fishing guides said Saturday they don't expect the closure to have a significant impact on their business. They also said they support the action to allow the fish to recover, even though the state has no firm estimate of the amount of fish killed.

"They're being proactive," said Ralph Allen, owner of King Fisher Fleet in Punta Gorda. "They recognize this is a very important fishery worth a lot of money to the state. And rather than having to wonder if the fish really got hammered, they've gone out and done something."

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission issued a set of executive orders to accomplish the closures. They include:

• Extending the current closed fishing season for snook statewide until September. Normally, the season opens for March and April and September through November, so the closure only affects the two-month spring

• Closing fishing for bonefish and tarpon until April. Normally, there is no closed season for these species.

 Removing certain harvest regulations to allow people to net dead fish and dispose of

The closures will protect surviving snook that spawn in the spring and give FWC's research scientists time to evaluate the extent of the damage, FWC Chairman Rodney Barreto said in a release.

More fish

The cold snap, which lingered for more than a week, included several nights during which temperatures dipped into the 20s in Southwest Florida. The temperatures in the Gulf of Mexico dropped below 50 degrees.

"I've seen quite a few snook, catfish, some sand bream, ladyfish, a few jacks, a lot of baitfish, anchovies, a few tarpon, some spadefish and a few others (dead)," Allen said.

However, the closure will have little effect on the charter business because anglers can still catch trout or redfish, which are less cold-sensitive, he said.


Snook are regarded as a subtropical fish, while trout and redfish inhabit bays as far north as the Carolinas.

"I think it's a good idea," said John Wood of Offshore Express Charters of the closures. "Snook (are) a warmwater fish. The cold slows their metabolism down so much it just kills them."

The closure won't affect his business because he primarily fishes offshore for other species, he said.

Rod Walinchus, editor of the Sun's WaterLine section, said the snook closure will have some effect on the inshore fishing industry.

"Sure, people like to fish for snook, but under the circumstances, I think they'll under-

stand," he said. "Personally, I think it's the right thing to do. I think the snook are stressed and need time to recover."

Walinchus said he's hearing reports of a "massive fish kill," in the neighborhood of 20,000 dead. The visual impact may be alarming, but that doesn't mean the snook fishery is in trouble, Allen said.

"People tend to get excited when they see a pile of dead fish," he said. "But for the statewide population, that might not make a significant dent.

"My experience in the last 35 years: There's usually more fish left than you think.'


However, he added that the cold snap was also the coldest he's seen in the area in 35 years.



had the necessary permits. He testified that a rental Web site showed the home was available from Oct. 1-18.

But neighbors said the rentals didn't occur at that time.

Ron Becker, who lives next door to the property, testified that two couples from Ohio occupied the home between Oct. 19-26. One couple was get-

ting married.
"They told me they gave a deposit," Becker testified.

Golden Beach Associates President Bruce Lebedun testified to the same, and a second three-day visit by unknown persons Nov. 26-29 at the same location.

Without viewing the contracts, however, the board was left to consider testimony by witnesses who said they did not $have \ personal \ knowledge$ that any money exchanged hands.

"It would be nice to have that information." said Board Chair Robert Young.

"We are not given an opportunity to speak to the owner of the property (to ask), did you collect 'X' dollars for that week? It prevents us from asking the questions we need to ask.

"You don't put rentals on there if you are not going to rent. It's not there for a freebie. We can rely on the Web site. They marked the dates that aren't available. That, to me, is reliable evidence."

"The Web site shows they are advertising,' replied City Attorney Wayne Hall. "I don't know if anybody rented."

Hall said the board has the authority to issue subpoenas, and could do so to secure the information in the future, but it would increase the cost of doing business.

Lacks transition

Huie asked the witnesses if the occupants, if they were renters, could have staved a week but paid for the month.

No one had an answer.

"It's the city job to prove they were violating the city ordinance," Huie said. "It's not my job. Rent means rent. There is no evidence here today that these were rentals.'

'They were in violation," said Board Member Patricia Boruff, "but because of the circumstance of when they made the reservation I feel we should be lenient. When you plan a wedding, you are planning months in advance. If you got canceled at the last minute, as a renter, it would be pretty devastat-

"Eyewitnesses said one thing. The Web site said another. Right there we are conflicted," said Board Member Joe Dalton. "I have a real problem based on those two items. If, in the future, there are other" alleged violations brought before the board "there should be a lease agreement" to consider. "We are talking

about setting a precedent down the road."

"This is what I was exactly concerned about when council rushed this (ordinance) through," said Board Member Jon Preiksat, an attorney. "The ordinance has created this problem. And for those of us involved in this, we have raised those issues. And frankly, one of the things was, how are you going to enforce this ordinance?"

Preiksat and Hall agreed there was no tran-

sition language in the ordinance.

"It needs a transition," Hall said.

After two failed motions to find the property owner guilty, Dalton made the motion to find him not guilty. It passed 4-2 with Young and John Wood voting against. The code board was considering whether to fine the property owner \$3,250 for the two separate alleged violations.

Cut taxes and make more money

In today's economy, every businessperson is looking for ways to maintain business profits. Ideas for increasing sales and cutting costs abound. You've probably tried most of them. But there's one source of cost saving that is often overlooked, and it can be surprisingly effective.

Most businesspeople don't think of taxes as a profit source, but saving a dollar of taxes can be even better for your financial health than cutting a dollar of costs. Why? When you reduce your taxes, you get to keep 100 percent of the savings. On the other hand, when you increase profits by increasing sales or cutting costs, you must share a portion of your additional profit with the IRS.

Consider this example. Say you do an exhaustive study of your operations and figure out a way to cut \$10,000 of costs. If sales are unchanged, you'll boost your pretax income by \$10,000. Assuming a 39 percent corporate income tax bracket, you'll pay \$3,900 in taxes on the \$10,000 income, leaving \$6,100 of after-tax profits.

Now let's look at an alternative scenario. Assume you do some serious tax planning and identify \$10,000 of tax savings. That's \$10,000 less

that you'll pay to the IRS and \$10,000 more cash in your bank account. Conclusion: A dollar of tax savings has more financial impact than a dollar of cost reductions.

Depending on how efficient your business is, you should be on the lookout for ways to cut costs. But don't give up when you've run out of cost-cutting ideas. It's highly unlikely that your business is taking advantage of every tax-saving opportunity available. As this example shows, effective tax planning could be the most direct way to end up with more money.

If you own a business, a thorough business and tax review may reveal tax-cutting opportunities.

Residents of South Venice, eastern Englewood and northern North Port will benefit next year from the completion of an urgent care and family medicine center in South Venice.

In September, construction is scheduled to start on the new phase 2 building adjoining the Center of Surgical Excellence, 8421 Pointe Loop Road, next to Walgreen's near the Tamiami Trail/Jacaranda Boulevard intersection.

An extension of Gulf Coast Medical Group, it will operate under the umbrella of Health Management Associates of Naples, owner of Venice Regional Medical Center. Doctors employed by GCMG are on the staff of the hospital.

"It will be a mini-emergency room with minimal wait times, operating seven days for urgent care," said Emma Kate Scoville, GCMG marketing coordinator. The new center will be an extension of fast-expanding GCMG's 1700 E. Venice Ave. facility.

"They will assist with minor emergencies — fractures, cuts and sprains," said Scoville. Major issues will go to the emergency room at VRMC.

GCMG has 10 centers between South Sarasota and North Port employing 43 doctors providing internal and family-practice services including primary care, neurology, endocrology and pulmonology.

City officials are urging the general public to use caution during the dredging project.

Venice Vice Mayor Ernie Zavodnyik said the sand will be deposited above the mean high tide line and will be monitored to ensure it meets Florida Department of **Environmental Protec**tion standards.

The dredging is nowhere near as massive as the city's beach renournishment projects in the past. However, Zavodnyik said the sand will replace a section of public beach that has been experiencing erosion.

Listowski said the \$650,000 project could take 45 days to 60 days, depending upon the weather. Due to the depressed economy, he said, the project cost is half the original estimate.

Council members complained during many of the seven shade meetings, saying they suspected city leases were not getting the scrutiny they deserved.

"We all agree. It's a horrible deal," Anderson said. "Maybe the lesson we're going to get out of this is y'all need to scrutinize the work product that you are asked to approve. In hindsight, there is no way this should ever have been approved by the Venice City Council."

"If there's a lesson to be learned," Moore said, "it's how one four-page innocuous little agreement with a 20-page lease incorporated into it, which was blank and unsigned, didn't get the kind of scrutiny it should have gotten at the time.

"It just illustrates, in my mind, the legal implications and consequences of everything you do every day when you vote on stuff here on city council.

'This is the worst example of not paying attention that I've ever seen.

"Thank goodness that's not how we do business now," Anderson said.

"It seems as though the city at

a different atmosphere, and you people will not duplicate that," Anderson said. "That's one of the lessons learned. I agree with Judge Moore wholeheartedly about ... you all need to scrutinize these documents. Whether they come from me or they come from (Assistant City Manager) Nancy (Woodley) or they come from anybody on city staff, you should be asking the tough questions, and if we don't have the answer, continue it to the next meeting and demand answers from us."

"This was from a previous time where basically city council ... said, 'City manager, you're the guy. You negotiate, you put these deals together, you work them out. City attorney, all we want is you to say whether or not the form is in a legally correct fashion. We don't want you to get into the substance. That's for the city manager to determine.' And it got us into problems with the golf course. It got us into problems with Sharky's, and I could give you a whole laundry list of problems. Thank heavens this council doesn't subscribe to that way of doing business.

You expect my comments, my recommendations. You don't necessarily have to embrace them or operate in accordance with them, but at least you hear me out. I think that's the way the system has to work. Just because we put something in front of you doesn't mean you just have to rubber-stamp it. Make us prove to you that's the best we can do. Then we won't get into these crazy predicaments.

"For the record," said then council member Rick Tacy, "I wasn't on council when this lease was voted on. There was a mind-set and there were some (council members) that were totally adamant that Bob (Anderson) was not to be involved at all with any lease negotiations, not even to review (them). Trust me, I got my head bit off a couple times sitting on the side asking why Bob (Anderson) hadn't reviewed it."

"I am glad that we're out from under that cloud," Anderson

"I think we've made it pretty clear since then that we want your opinion on things," Moore said. "If you see anything that is going to have an adverse legal consequence to the city that we're doing, please tell us and speak up and let us know what it is so we can have that to consider."

"And that's, why, quite frankly, things are not moving through as quickly as they used to, because now I do a more in-depth review," Anderson said. "We're all going to be better for it."

Sales taxes are escaping the collection web

welve years ago, when the Internet was still in what we'd consider a formative stage, Florida joined a coalition of states trying to come up with a way to impose state taxes on online sales.

Sort of. The state never made the commitment to full membership in the compact.

A lot has happened in the cyberworld in a decade. This past Christmas season, national online sales surged 5 percent, reaching \$27 billion. That's following year-over-year hikes of 10 and 11 percent, for the Christmas season alone.

It's obvious where this is going. Still only 4 percent of all retail sales in this country, the Internet sales engine is gaining momentum.

But Florida still gets virtually nothing in sales taxes when residents buy books, clothing and flat-screen TVs over the Web. A handful of people follow state law — you are responsible for reporting and paying sales tax on everything you buy online — but that's a joke. No one does it, other than a few people working in the governor's office and the tax department. No one expects John or Jane Q. Public to fess up and pony up at tax time.

Recently, two state lawmakers joined with advocacy groups including AARP and Florida TaxWatch to press, once again, for the Legislature to bring Florida into full membership with the 22 other states that have ratified the Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Agreement. The measure comes up every year but has fallen short. Apparently, lawmakers don't want to be seen to be imposing "new taxes."

Something else must be afoot, though, because that is nonsense.

Florida law already calls for consumers to pay taxes on Internet purchases. It's just not enforced. This multi-state compact presents a simplified ways for businesses to collect sales taxes and remit the money to state governments. Signing on fully — Florida is now just a nonvoting member of the coalition — could help speed the process.

The state actually might be able to collect some sales tax from out-ofstate businesses that sell products to Florida consumers.

Just like the stores on Main Street or in the mall.

That's one main argument in favor of the program: It levels the playing field for the Florida's bricks-and-mortar businesses, which collect state and local sales taxes, as well as payroll taxes for local employees and property taxes for local government. As it stands right now, it's simply unfair that consumers can window-shop locally and buy globally, saving 6 or 7 percent off the top.

The other main argument is that Florida's budget depends on sales tax revenues. The way our tax laws are set

up, more than 70 percent of state taxes already come from the sales tax pool. Online sales are the fastest growing segment of the retail sales sector, but these sales are, essentially, skirting existing tax laws.

Eventually, it will take an act of Congress to implement a fair national system. It will come some day, after more years of online sales growth and more data showing the compact's system isn't overly disruptive. For the time being, there is no good reason for Florida not to take the final step and join the other states working on a solution.

Florida taxpayers already are losing out on an estimated \$2 billion each year from those who ignore the requirement to pay the taxes on Internet purchases.

Try doing that the next time you're buying something at the mall or on Main Street.

You can't. And that's the point.



Recently, one of the newest members of Venice City Council, Emilio Carlesimo, submitted an article as a guest columnist titled "Let Common Sense Guide Us." What Council Member Carlesimo fails to mention is that the situation at Venice Municipal Airport is not your normal situation where a simple common-sense approach in itself can provide the best outcomes or

Most would agree that the city has spent too much time and money on airport related issues. Unfortunately, time and money have been necessary to start untangling the mess that was created years ago to correct the wrongs of exaggerated or falsified operation counts at the airport that got us here in

The "small" citizens group Council Member Carlesimo refers to is the same "small" citizens group that disputed the ridiculous number of flight operations more than two years ago and helped save our public golf course. More recently, this same "small" group helped provide valuable information and data to DY Consultants in arriving at an irrefutable operation count at the Venice airport using a variety of Federal Aviation Administration-acceptable methodologies, all substantiating a B-II airport classification.

Council Member Carlesimo stated, "It is clear from all of our airport consultant's documentation that this is a C- II airport and always has been." To the contrary, DY's consultants are still scratching their heads on how the Venice airport was ever classified a C-II airport because the actual flight operations yesterday, today and in the future did not and do not support a C-II classification. More important, today there exist a number of FAA design-safety deficiencies at the airport for a C-II classification requiring either modification to standards or the expenditure of tens of millions of dollars that will drastically change our golf course and surrounding residential areas.

What DY Consultants is truly struggling with is how to tell the FAA that previously submitted data relating to the Venice airport used by the FAA to justify upgrading the airport from a B-II to a C-II sometime in the late 1990s was falsified and exaggerated.

At the Dec. 12 airport workshop, the community (including VASI, VABA, neighborhood activists, golfers and consultants) all reached a consensus and supported the classification of the Venice airport as a B-II (ARC B) facility.

Common sense would suggest that it is time for city council to direct our consultant to complete the study based on the B-II classification. With that plan in hand, the city can move forward to develop and implement the necessary programs to maintain the highest quality of life for all Venice residents and the safety and utility of our airport.

Turnovers plagued the Venice boys and girls basketball teams against Manatee but only one came away with a victory in the Class 5A-District 10 games on Tuesday at Manatee

Five points by Manatee's Travon Montgomery to open the fourth quarter gave Manatee a 44-28 lead.





Project in West Villages delayed

The downturn in the economy has led to troubled times for Thomas Enterprises, the largest developer in the West Villages

Improvement District. City officials say a representative for the developer - Stan Thomas of Newnan, Ga. — recently retrieved plans for a Publix supermarket that was scheduled to be built in The Prado at the West Villages, a shopping center proposed for U.S. 41 on the west end of North

That project, which Thomas Enterprises spokesman Bruce Williams said several months ago was to begin in January, has now been delayed due to the downturn in the economy and the lack of residential construction in the area, according to Publix spokesperson Shannon Patten.

"It's almost impossible to finance any new construction these days," Williams said Thursday. "We still have a lease with Publix. We still are going to build it. These are the side effects of the economy we have now.'

Meanwhile, in November Thomas put three of his hundreds of properties into bankruptcy protection: The Rim, a 2-million-squarefoot shopping center in San Antonio, Texas; Village Pavilion in Smyrna, Ga., and Prospect Park in Alpharetta, Ga. Smyrna and Alpharetta are near Atlanta.

Williams says those bankruptcies have no bearing on the West Villages Improvement District.

"The notes matured and there is no capital out there at this time," he said. "We are working through the court system to come up with a viable plan to refinance those projects. But that has no bearing whatsoever on what is going on with Thomas Ranch and the West Villages Improvement District."

Normally reluctant to speak to the media, Thomas, 55, consented to an interview with the Atlanta Journal-Constitution last year. He spoke frankly about the impact of the downturn on his business, particularly the pain associated with layoffs that reduced his work force from 750 employees to 50.

Some nights I go home and I'd like to crawl under the bed. We wept and cried and cried," he said of the lay-

Textbook case

While many developers nationwide were blindsided by the economic downturn, Thomas's plight could be used in future business textbooks as a case study of the real estate debacle.

Thomas purchased approximately 16,000 acres in south Sarasota County from the Taylor family in 2002 for \$73 million, according to Sarasota County Property Appraiser records. He changed the property's name from Taylor Ranch to Thomas Ranch in honor of his father, "Mr. Earl" Thomas, who died in 1999.

The land included

about 8,000 acres in South Venice that the city of North Port annexed in 2002 and property that remained in unincorporated South Sarasota County.

Part of the property approximately 2,200 acres — was sold to Pulte Homes and became Sarasota National, a troubled South Venice golf course community where homes are still being sold "and golf is still being played," Williams said. Some 1,500 homes originally were planned there but only 30 were built and sold, according to a Pulte spokesperson.

"All the homes have gorgeous views," Williams said.

Other parts of Thomas Ranch also were sold, including what are now the North Port subdivisions Gran Paradiso and Islandwalk, whose residents will one day shop at The Prado.

The Venetia development on U.S. 41 and Myakka River Trails on River Road are properties in South Venice that Thomas Enterprises bought from the Taylors and completed.

The Gran Paradiso project has foundered. Only 14 homes have been built and sold in the 1,068-acre community designed to accommodate 1,999 homes. Islandwalk has done better, however. Pulte has sold approximately 300 homes in Islandwalk, an 830-acre development presently designed for 1,869 homes.

Thomas Enterprises has spent much of its time and money trying to get The Prado off the ground and funding infrastructure improvements by the West Villages Improvement District, which was created by the state Legislature at Thomas's request.

Doing business as Fourth Ouarter Properties, Thomas still owns approximately 6,200 acres in the WVID and 3,800 acres in South Venice and is current on his WVID non-ad valorem assessments. The company paid more than \$4 million to the district for 2009 and several million dollars before that from 2005-08.

But the downturn in the economy is preventing Thomas Enterprises from progressing with The Prado and other grand plans for the West Villages. Thomas, a former college football player, is concentrating on small victories.

'The state of the West Villages Improvement District is fine," Williams said. "It is functioning as it is supposed to and that is to sell bonds and use the money to construct infrastructure."

Williams cited both practical and aesthetic improvements:

- The 3 1/2 miles of water and sewer lines that "we ran from North Port to the property."
- The "beautiful" landscape on U.S. 41.
- The West Villages Parkway, a road currently under construction that will connect River Road to U.S. 41, "alleviating a lot of traffic at U.S. 41 and River Road.'

The parkway will open in late spring or early summer, Williams said.

Many area gardens suffered damage during last week's record cold spell.

To prune or not to prune is the question this week.

"Don't cut anything back until April 1," said Debbie Truesdale, the director of nursery operations at Hazeltine Nurseries in Venice. "It is possible to have a freeze in March. Our rule of thumb is to do nothing until there have been several weeks of warmer weather."

Do not prune, trim nor feed any of the plants," she added.

Truesdale said most of the plants will come back. I toured the nursery with her Friday afternoon, looking at brown ixoras, brown Christmas palms, a butterfly garden that was mostly brown, and brown vines on a pergola near the entrance. Nearly everything looked good because of the precautions taken by the

"The ixoras look the worst," she said.

When all danger of frost has passed, the ixoras will be cut back to half the size they are now.

Christmas palms and other self-cleaning varieties that drop branches and do not need trimming will be left alone. The brown branches will fall to the ground and new crown branches will grow, she said. If any of those varieties had frost on the leaves for more than a few hours or over several days, they might not make it, but most should make it.

They took all the equipment out of the barn, which was then filled with plants. More plants and trees were crowded into the greenhouse, which had been filled with cut Christmas trees just just a month or so earlier. They covered many plants that were still outside with freeze cloth, a sheer polyester material sold in 6- by 50-foot rolls for \$25. It can be reused for years, she said. Out in the fields of trees and other large plants, staff members gathered about midnight on the first night when a freeze was imminent, waiting to light smudge pots as soon as the temperature hit 32 degrees and held for more than two hours.

Taking those precautions, the nursery only lost about 50 plants, Truesdale said. That is not bad for a 96-acre nursery filled with trees and plants.

A vine climbing up the pergola near the sales center looked the worst.

"That's a thumbergia vine," she said. "We will cut those back to about 1 foot from the ground and it will grow back."

But there will be no cutting until April 1.

"Michelle (Hazeltine) is adamant about that," Truesdale said. "People get in a hurry and that is the one thing you do not want to do." Michelle is Truesdale's sister and is mar-

"Magnolias are fine," Truesdale said. "Giant bird of paradise probably will not die but may take six to eight months to recover."

Plumarias (frangi-pangi) will likely need heavy pruning, especially if all the leaves are brown. Truesdale suggested cutting them back to about half the size they are and then watch for the new sprouts. Some hibiscus may look bad

but should come back after pruning — but not until April.

"Our butterfly garden got zapped," she said. "In April we will cut it all the way back and may have to replant about half of it. We have to wait and see."

That is the Hazeltine mantra this time of year. Despite the color, even the brown leaves offer some protection for plants should there be another freeze. The closer to the Gulf the better. "It is like having a heating pad," Truesdale said about living near the water, where temperatures often are a few degrees warmer. If we have another frost, cover the plants again. Make sure the crowns are covered, for it is frost and/or ice on the leaves that does the damage. Covering the trunks does

not matter, she said. Use freeze cloth, sheets or even garbage bags. If you use garbage bags, remove them when temperatures rise above freezing during the day because they can bake in the black bags. Freeze cloth can be purchased from Hazeltine and other nurseries and garden supply outlets.

As of Dec. 4, 91 manatees were killed by watercraft in Florida during 2009, approaching the record of 95 watercraft deaths set in 2002.

Concentrating watercraft inshore, in the same waters inhabited by manatees, could help account for the rise in mortalities, but this is not a necessary outcome.

Each and every boater, through careful boating practices and compliance with speed zones, can greatly reduce the number of manatee injuries and deaths from boat strikes.

Save the Manatee Club members are calling for boaters to slow down in manatee habitat, obey the posted speed zones, and immediately report manatee injuries to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission at (888) 404-3922 so that a timely rescue can be initiated and the manatee can receive life-saving treatment.

Save the Manatee Club offers boaters and shoreline property owners free boating banners and aluminum dock signs to remind fellow boaters that manatees are present.

The welfare of individual manatees thoroughly depends on boater compliance with posted speed zones.







GOREN BRIDGE

Q 1 - As South vulnerable, you hold:

★ K Q 7 5 2 ♡ 8 3 ♦ J 7 3 **♣** A K 8

Your right-hand opponent opens the bidding with one heart. What action do you take?

A - How did this one slip in? You have a fair hand, but nowhere near strong enough to double and then bid spades. All you can do is overcall with one spade and see how the auction develops.

Q 2 - As South, vulnerable, you hold:

♠ Q 7 5 4 ♡ K 9 3 2 ♦ K Q ♣ A 10 4

Your right-hand opponent opens the bidding with one heart. What action do you take?

A - What would you like to do? You have a good hand with good defensive values, but are not strong enough to overcall one no trump and your heart length militates against any other action. Pass - you might get a chance to enter on the next round, depending on developments.

Q 3 - Both vulnerable, as South you hold:

♠ K 10 9 3 ♡ Q 7 2 ♦ A J 7 4 ♣ 10 6

The bidding has proceeded: WEST NORTH **EAST SOUTH** 1♠ What do you bid?

A - First, don't bid one no trump — the last thing you want to do is discourage the opponents from bidding on in spades! You have a very sound raise to two hearts, so go ahead and make it — it could push them to a level where you might suggest they have gotten too high!

Q 4 - North—South vulnerable, as South you hold:

♠ Q 8 5 ♥ 9 3 ♦ K 7 6 2 ♣ A 9 6 3

The bidding has proceeded:

WEST **NORTH EAST** SOUTH 1* 1♡ 1♠ What do you bid?

A - Just because you have 9 points does not mean you have to get into the action. With a shaky stopper in your left-hand opponent's suit and no support for partner's suit, this is not the time to roil the waters. Pass. Had East not responded, you could have ventured one no trump. To do so now invites trouble and helps locate the cards for your opponents.

Q 5 - Neither vulnerable, as South you hold:

▲ J 10 9 3 ♡ Q 9 5 4 ◇ A 8 ♣ J 5 4

The bidding has proceeded: NORTH **SOUTH** WEST **EAST** 1♡ 2* 2♠ ? What do you bid?

A - You have a very good hand defensively, and it looks as if the opponents are headed for trouble — East's two spades is forcing. Pass and wait to see where the opponents end up. If you bid now, you are bailing the opponents out of a difficult spot.

Q 6 - Both vulnerable, as South you hold:

▲ 87 ♡ AKQ763 ◇ Q98 ♣ 74


The bidding has proceeded: NORTH SOUTH WEST EAST **Pass** What do you bid?



Venice Regional awarded heart failure certification

The Joint Commission has awarded Venice Regional Medical Center Disease-Specific Care Certification for its heart failure program.

To earn this distinction, a disease-management program undergoes an extensive, on-site evaluation by Joint Commission reviewers every two years. The program is evaluated against Joint Commission standards through an assessment of a program's processes, the program's ability to evaluate and improve care within its own organization, and interviews with patients and staff.

certification "This means Venice Regional Medical Center does the right things and does them well for heart failure patients," said Jean E. Range, executive director, Disease-Specific Care Certification, Joint Commission.

"Venice Regional Medical Center voluntarily pursued this comprehensive, independent evaluation to enhance the safety and quality of care we provide," said Robin McGuinness, chief nursing officer at the hospital. "We are proud to achieve this distinction." The hospital also achieved Stroke Center Certification through The Joint Commission last year.

The Joint Commission launched its Disease-Specific Care Certification program in 2002. It is the first program of its kind in the country to certify disease management programs. A list of programs certified by The Joint Commission is available at www.jointcommission.

According to the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, heart failure develops over time as the pumping of the heart grows weaker. It can affect the right side of the heart only or both the left and right sides of the heart. Most cases involve both sides of the heart. "Heart failure is a serious condition." McGuinness said. "About 5 million people in the U.S. have heart failure and it contributes to an estimated 300,000 deaths each year."

Currently, there is no cure for heart failure. However, researchers are finding and testing new treatments. People who have heart failure can live longer and more active lives if it's diagnosed early and they follow their treatment plans. For most, treatment includes medicines and lifestyle measures.

This building must be seen to be believed. Hurricane protection was the first consideration of museum director Dr. Hank Hine. He got that and so much more in what is sure to be considered one of the most stunning museums in the country if not the world. Aircraft 'invasion' kicks off Warbirds weekend

aturday morning, don't be surprised when the skies fill with the roar of aircraft as they signal the beginning of the Florida Warbirds fundraising weekend. Individual pilots, Greg Rineer, a supporter of the Wounded Warrior Project said, have volunteered to fly from Charlotte County Airport to Rotunda and back. "It will be amazing," he said, adding that as many as 50 aircraft may join in.

Many of the aircraft will then be on static display as part of the Florida Warbirds, Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Weekend on both January 23 and 24. The display is not just an opportunity for aviation enthusiasts to wander around a large exhibit of military aircraft from many eras – it is an opportunity to raise funds for several causes close to the organization's heart.

Proceeds of the inaugural event to be held at the Charlotte County Airport, Jim "Zack" Olzacki, president and commander of the EAA Florida Warbirds Squadron 24 said, will benefit the Wounded Warriors Project, the Special Operations Warrior Foundation, and the Young Eagles, an organization that promotes aviation to young people.

"Our focus for this event are these organizations," he said adding many people may not be familiar with the Special Operations Warrior Foundation. "It is a foundation created to make available to children of deceases special operations warriors who have died in combat and left their families much monetary benefit. It also helps put their children through college."

The event, he said, is sure to have a "wow factor," as attendees view a variety of aircraft like the C-47, P-51 Mustang, Yak-P, and F4F Wildcat.

Visitors will also be able to take a ride in the Valiant Air Command C-47, "Tico Belle," a World War II aircraft of the Normandy Invasion. Seats for this are limited and must be reserved in advance. The cost is \$175 per person. "People can call 941-639-6187 to

For sail: 200 homes on cruise ship

n the worst economic storm in decades, a Beverly Hills company has an ambitious plan to build a \$1.1-billion cruise ship, set to cast off in 2013. But instead of offering four- or five-day excursions as typical cruise lines do, the business plans to sell half the cabins as floating homes.

Opulent cabins aboard the ship Utopia now range in price from about \$3.7 million to \$26 million. But even at these prices, a key draw will be location.

During the Cannes Film Festival, the ship is slated to drop anchor near the south of France in the Mediterranean sea. During the carnival celebration in Rio de Janeiro, the ship plans to dock off the coast of the Brazilian city. On New Year's Eve, cruise ship operators hope to take passengers to Sydney Harbor in Australia to enjoy the fireworks display.

But some cruise industry experts doubt the project can stay afloat in the rough waters of the current economy.

"The promises don't mean a whole lot until the keel is laid," said Stewart Chiron, a cruise expert and president of Leisure Pro, a travel marketing business.

Utopia Residences Co. placed an order last month with Samsung Heavy Industries to build the 971-foot, 105,000-ton ship, scheduled to launch from South Korea. Once completed, the Utopia will offer 204 cabins that can be rented like hotel rooms for limited periods.

An additional 200 cabins will be sold as permanent residences, with prices ranging from about \$3.7 million for a 1,400-square-foot home with two bedrooms and two bathrooms to \$26 million for a 6,600-square-foot cabin with four bedrooms and three baths.

Utopia officials say purchasers would be buying a cabin on the ship but not an ownership share of the ship itself.

"They are not condominiums, and the residents do not own the ship or common areas," said David Robb, chairman of Utopia Residences.

In addition, the cabin owners would have to pay regular fees for utilities, security, concierge services and access to private onboard clubs.

Some of the cabins feature hardwood floors, marble kitchen countertops, recessed lighting, walk-in closets and fireplaces. Owners and renters would have access to the ship's many amenities, including three swimming pools, tennis courts, an outdoor movie theater, a miniature golf course, shops, restaurants and a "lazy river" meandering around the deck.

In addition, Utopia would perpetually cruise the seas, coming to port so passengers could enjoy the world's most celebrated sporting and cultural events. Among the events on the Utopia itinerary are the Tour de France bicycle race, the Monaco Grand Prix car race and the America's Cup yacht race.

"The beauty behind this product is that it's a global product," Robb said.

Much of the funding behind the project will come from Frontier Group, a private

equity investment group based in Los Angeles and Washington, D.C.

The project comes only weeks after Royal Caribbean International launched the Oasis of the Sea, the world's largest cruise ship, at 1,181 feet long.

The King Kong of cruise ships weighs 225,000 tons with a capacity of 6,360 passengers.

The idea of a luxury residential cruise ship is not new.

The team behind Utopia, including Capt. Ola Harsheim and Chief Engineer Tor Hansen, launched a similar, 644-foot residential ship called the World in 2002. The following year, the residents of the World bought the ship and hired a management firm to operate it. The ship continues to navigate the seas, stopping last month in Bateman's Bay in southern Australia.

Harsheim has been a cruise ship captain for nearly 40 years and sailed with Royal Viking Sea before launching the World.

Hansen previously worked as chief engineer with Crystal Cruises and Cunard.

Still, at least one attempt at launching a residential cruise ship has not been successful.

In 2002, Ocean Development Group teamed up with Four Seasons Hotels and Resorts to propose a 720-foot luxury residential cruise ship to set sail in 2007. But because of financing problems, the plan fell through.

Erik Hvide, a consultant and investor with Ocean Development Group, said the company could secure commitments to buy only about 30 percent of the 112 units on the ship when the global economy began to sink.

Because the financing to build the ship was contingent on the sale of at least 60 percent of the units, he said, the project failed

While Hvide still believes the concept of a luxury residential cruise ship can succeed, he said he doubts the current economy will support the Utopia project.

"If anything, getting financing today is more difficult than it was two years ago," he said.

But Robb — a Harvard Business
School graduate who co-founded Frontier
Group along with Frank C. Carlucci, a
defense secretary during the Reagan
administration — said he is confident that
Utopia won't suffer the same fate as the
Four Seasons ship.

"This ship has significant financial backing and very significant industrial partners who have enormous resources," he said.

Robb said Utopia Residences has already received purchase commitments for about 16 percent of the residential space on the ship.

The cabins are being sold through Prudential Douglas Elliman of New York.

Other cruise experts say that the idea of launching a residential cruise ship for the super-rich may sound irrational during tough economic times, but that the market may improve by the time Utopia launches in 2013

Ask Airfarewatchdog: Air travel Q&A

(MCT)— Q: What day(s) and time(s) of day will yield the cheapest tickets? And what days of the week are most advantageous to fly. We are flexible in our travel plans.

A: Airlines can adjust airfares at virtually any moment, and the number of seats at the lowest fares can fluctuate minute by minute, as the cheaper seats get sold, or the airlines make more seats available at the lowest fares.

So there's no really best time of day or day of week to buy fares. That's why it's important to sign up for airfare alerts (to find services offering them, simply Google "airfare alerts" and sign up. Then pounce when the fare goes down, which really could be any time.

That said, if you're flying on a route served by Atlanta-based Airtran or a competing airline on that route, then Monday nights and Tuesdays are a good time to look for fares, since Airtran typically has a sale every week. And if you're looking for last minute weekend fares, Delta typically releases these fares

release them Monday or Tuesday.

Performing arts center clears final hurdle

t didn't take much convincing for Venice City Council to approve final agreements for the planned performing arts center on the Venice High School campus.

The council voted unanimously at its last meeting to approve an interlocal agreement with the Sarasota County School Board and a fee agreement between effected parties.

"Upsizing that school auditorium will give citizens a first-class performance center at a cost savings to your citizens," said Sarasota County Schools Chief Financial Officer Scott Lempe.

Lempe said the \$12.8 million center will have a stage four times the size of that found in a high school auditorium.

Council Member John Moore said the same documents that City Council members were approving were crafted 10 years ago at North Port High and "have withstood the test of time."

He thanked civic organizations like the

Venice Area Chamber of Commerce who promoted the community performance center.

"Everybody had their eye on the target," Moore said. "You know, this is just the most incredible opportunity for the city of Venice. This vote is the most exciting of my seven years here."

A small audience of supporters broke into applause upon the unanimous vote approving the documents.

The performing arts center will be part of the new Venice High School, a \$90 million project that will be built in phases. The center is part of the last phase, set to open in 2015.

Venice arts groups including the symphony, concert band and numerous vocal groups will share use of the new center with the high school.

The 1,000-seat performing arts center is molded after a similar center at North Port High School, which is also shared by the city and school. The city of Venice will contribute \$7.5 million to the project over four years.

Mythbusters' put urban myths and conspiracy theories to the test

ormer special-effects artists
Adam Savage and Jamie Hyneman are the co-hosts of "Myth-busters," Discovery Channel's popular science program that tests whether everyday assumptions, conspiracy theories and urban legends can hold up through rigorous experimentation.

Savage, 42, and Hyneman, 53, recently spoke by phone from the Bay Area, where most episodes are produced.

Q. What are you guys working on today?

Jamie: Well, we're out at a runway in Alameda. We're testing whether a slushy drink thrown out of the window of one car going at highway speeds, when it hits a car going in the other direction, does it actually bust the windshield and potentially kill somebody?

Q. And what's the verdict?

Adam: We've just come to a conclusion on the slushy cups themselves and are about to move on to cans of soda, which we think will be a much more lethal projectile. And if they're not sufficiently lethal, we have a machine to fire them at lethal speeds.

Jamie: We haven't clocked it yet, but it's somewhere subsonic, I can say that. It's like a shoulder-mounted thing that's really cool.

Q. How did you come up with the idea to test this myth?

Adam: This actually came from a news story we got about a woman supposedly injured by a cup of soda.

Jamie: It's a perfect story for us, because it was a Styrofoam cup, for crying out loud!

Q. You guys are famous for elaborate setups for your experiments, such as when you investigated which falls to Earth first, a bullet dropped or a bullet fired. The weapon's firing and the bullet's release had to be simultaneous.

Adam: That in itself took about 13 hours to achieve. The thing that is really delivering for us is the high-speed camera, which is one of the most precise and beautiful tools we've ever used. It's a digital camera that shoots in HD resolution at almost 7,000 frames per second. It can quite easily stop a bullet completely cold, perfectly still and in-frame for us.

Q. The show is in its seventh season now. How has it changed?

Jamie: It's not like we showed up and were cast into this series ready to go. We had some skills beforehand. But the kind of understanding we have of the way the world works now, it's really been mind-opening. The show is reflecting that.

Q. But not all the shows can count as groundbreaking scientific inquiry, right? Some seem like just for the heck of it.

Adam: We've got one coming up called "Spy Car," which asks, does the standard movie triumvirate of oil slick,

smoke screen and spreading tacks from the back of your car actually help prevent people from chasing you?

Q. Do you have a Holy Grail myth, some cherished experiment you haven't been able to test yet?

Adam: We started talking a couple years ago about doing Leonardo da Vinci's screw-type helicopter. And that led quickly to a discussion about us building a successfully flying, human-powered helicopter. This is something we'd like to do on the show. There's a prize for human-powered helicoptering, and nobody's won it yet. We'd like to take a crack at that.

Q. Are you worried about running out of myths to test?

Adam: We're on something like the 170th hour of "Mythbusters," and we've still got a list of about 60 myths lined up through next season, and about another 100 or so on top of that. As far as we can see, there's absolutely no shortage.

Charlie Hood returns in Parker's 'Iron River'

ron River" (Dutton, 369 pages, \$26.95), by T. Jefferson Parker:
Mexico is paying a high price for America's appetite for illegal drugs.
The drug cartels have murdered an estimated 15,000 people in that country in the last three years. Recently the violence has spilled across the border to the American Southwest.

Americans, T. Jefferson Parker writes, "are complicit in the problem." Not only are we the market for the drugs, but also the source of the weapons with which the drug lords arm their private armies.

"Iron River," the title of his new crime novel, is a metaphor for the illegal trade in American-made weapons, everything from cheap handguns to military assault rifles, that flow to the cartels from hundreds of American gun dealers.

Parker wants you to understand how difficult our gun laws make things for the good guys. He wants you to know that the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, assigned to stem the illegal flow of weapons, is outnumbered and outgunned. He wants you to know how hard it is for poorly paid Mexican police to resist the corrupting influence of drug money.

He wants you to know that this is a war, and that the good guys are losing.

While Parker has a serious message to convey, he is also a popular novelist with a need to entertain. In "Iron River," he succeeds brilliantly at both.

Charlie Hood, Parker's smart, likable young series character, has been detached from his job at the Los

Angeles Sheriff's Department to give the ATF a hand in tracking down illegal gun sales along the border. His first case, busting up a deal outside the Guns a Million gun shop, goes bad, and in the ensuing gunfight, a bystander is shot to death.

The victim is a young
Mexican about to enroll in
a California university. He
also happens to be the son of one of
Mexico's most powerful drug lords, who
retaliates by kidnapping an ATF agent
named Jimmy Holdstock and pulling out
his fingernails.

The attempt to rescue Jimmy forms the spine of the story.

This is Parker's third novel featuring Hood, and in this one, he also brings back Bradley Smith, the oldest son of Allison Murrieta, a charming outlaw who was Hood's love interest in the first book in the series.

Hood has always been impressed with Smith's brilliance and ambition,

but troubled by his impulse to follow in his mother's footsteps. For two books now, Hood has

tried to steer Smith in the right direction. In "Iron River," Smith finally makes his choice.

Parker also intro-

duces a compelling new character, an inventive young gun-maker named Ron Pace, who is trying to save the family business from

bankruptcy and win the girl he loves. His plan: Create an inexpensive, fully automatic pistol, complete with silencer, and sell them by the thousands to one of the cartels.

Parker writes Pace's portion of the story in first person and the rest of the story in third person. The device, increasingly popular among crime novelists, is one that some readers find distracting, but Parker pulls it off about as well as it can be done.

As always with a Parker novel, the characters are superbly drawn, the

California landscape is evocatively portrayed and the exceptional prose swings from lyrical to hard-boiled.

Here, in a letter Hood writes to his mother and father, Parker gives us a glimpse of his character's fears and why he chooses to do what he does:

"Things are unraveling here. It's something larger than the guns and the murders and the mutilations.

We're losing the rules of being human. I feel like there's a big storm coming, something terrible and cleansing. In some very mysterious way, I feel needed here."

Since the days of Raymond Chandler, California has produced some of our finest crime novelists, and today the likes of Michael Connelly, Don Winslow and Joseph Wambaugh continue the tradition. With "Iron River," Parker demonstrates again that he belongs in their company.



Pat Boone's not ready to retire just yet

et's make this clear right up front: Pat Boone, the '50s teen idol turned all-around entertainer and entrepreneur, doesn't have to work another day in his life.

At 75, Boone could spend his days

on the golf course if he wanted — there's one just across the yard, in fact, from the home he and wife Shirley bought in the Coto de Caza community in Orange County, Calif., a few years back.

But while his offices in West Hollywood look like a museum to all things Pat

 — with gold records and movie posters and memorabilia covering the walls — Boone says he's not done yet.

"My wife and I are talking right now how to slow down," he says with the smile that made him the wholesome hit of the pop charts and teen magazines of the late '50s. "But here I am creating a new theater in Myrtle Beach (S.C.) and a PBS special and a radio format.

"I can spell 'n-o' I just can't say it," Boone says. "I've always said yes to every good idea I've seen."

Which explains why he's busy putting together a special that will run on PBS stations in March, busy preparing to open and book a musical theater on the South Carolina coast, busy with the Gold Label record company, busy with his latest book, and a host of other projects.

"I can see the potential," he says of the ideas he takes on as projects. "And if I'm working with somebody, I want to see them succeed, too."

Pat Boone says he would love nothing more than a chance to be one of the celebrity mentors on "American Idol."

"It would be fun if 'American Idol' said, 'Here's a guy who sold 45 million records,' although I don't know if it will happen. Because I think over the years, the younger people in the entertainment industry, because of my other activities ..."

He trails off, but it's clear where that

sentence is headed: Boone's strong Christian beliefs and views on political issues such as gay rights, especially in his weekly opinion columns, aren't exactly mainstream Hollywood material.

Even so, from a purely historical

point of view, Boone makes a good case as the original 'Idol,' who for three straight weeks in 1953 won the "Ted Mack Amateur Hour" — a talent show where viewers picked the winners — and by doing so landed a recording contract and a stream of hit singles throughout the last half of the '50s.

"I recorded starting in 1955, and in the first 11 months of my career before Elvis's first (hit) single, 'Heartbreak Hotel' - I had six million-selling singles," Boone says, not mentioning, though it's well known, that Presley opened for him before his own stardom exploded.

Boone was such a big star — and a "safer" star in many ways than Presley — that at 23 he landed a television variety show, "The Pat Boone-Chevy Showroom." Each week huge stars -Ella Fitzgerald, Nat King Cole, Tony Bennett and Count Basie, to name just a few — came onto the show to perform songs on their own or as duets with Boone.

Those shows, which Boone owns and which have almost never been seen since they originally aired, are being edited into the PBS special, "Pat Boone — Love Letters In The Sands Of Time," which will air March 6 during the annual pledge drives held at stations around the country.

"I'm amazed," he says of the experience of looking at the shows again after so many years. "For a kid, 22, 23, to walk onto the set and host people like Nat King Cole, Sammy Davis Jr., and sing with them and act like I belong with them?

"They had to look at me as a raw kid," he says. "But we made it work."

Asked again why he keeps going in so many different directions at an age when most people start to take it a little easy, Boone laughs and says again that he just can't help himself.





"Extraordinary Measures" is a sometimes moving, solid if unsurprising account of a father's tireless efforts to use his business acumen to develop a cure for his children's fatal genetic disorder.

Brendan Fraser plays John Crowley, an on-the-rise marketing executive who comes home to a loving wife (Keri Russell) and two adoring children. But the kids, under the age of 9, are in wheelchairs. They have Pompe Disease, a disorder that is certain to kill them before their 10th birthdays.

Doctors just want the Crowleys to comfort their kids because nothing can be done. But John isn't ready to watch them die. He does his homework, reaches out to any and all who are working on the disorder. That's how he tracks down Dr. Robert Stonehill. Harrison Ford plays Stonehill as a curmudgeon, holed up in his Nebraska lab, dodging phone calls and callously ignoring the human side to his research.

"This is a theory, not a therapy," he growls to Crowley, when John, frantic over the latest hospitalization, finally reaches Stonehill. So John cuts to the chase. How much to develop a drug, test it and take it to market?

Egos clash as John quits his job





and gambles on raising funds and starting a bio-tech company. The script slips into tedium as we see the proud, pigheaded scientist's ways of nearly derailing the operation, repeatedly, and the father's willingness to mortgage his and Stonehill's future to save the kids.

But Tom Vaughan ("What Happens in Vegas") finds plenty of heart in Robert Nelson Jacobs' script (based on a true story). When scientists and businessmen forget who this is all about, Crowley brings in children with wheelchairs. Fraser is well-cast as an emotional guy who manipulates emotions (as does the film) to win arguments. He holds his own in most scenes with Ford, who also was "on the nose" casting.

The movie's biggest shortcoming is its lack of surprise. When you cast David Clennon, famed for his icy "thirtysomething" business titan, as an icy business titan, you're not taking risks. As studio debuts go, "Extraordinary Measures" isn't extraordinary. It's simply safe.

Is my USB key secure?

(MCT) — Q. Is my USB key secure? A. A USB key, also known as a thumb drive or USB drive, is a kind of digital briefcase — a place to store files while you move them from one computer to another. If you're carrying around confidential business or personal information and want to keep it safe, look for a USB key that features encryption, or scrambling, of your data and requires your PIN or password to access it.

Government or business users who want to make sure an encrypted USB key is secure, however, must look carefully at how these security features work. To achieve the highest level of security, a USB key must include a dedicated security computer chip, for example a smart card chip. This tamperproof contain-

er securely stores the data encryption key and verifies your PIN/password to access the data, so it is not vulnerable to attacks on the USB key software. In addition, the key should comply with strong, militarygrade encryption standards, such as the U.S. government's Advanced Encryption Standard 256 (AES-256).

For example, researchers recently hacked into popular USB keys claiming to be secure. Using a flaw in the USB key software that checks your password, the researchers were able to read the data on these "secure" devices without knowing the password. 
