### Praying for a better tomorrow

The Gadsden County Sheriff's Office, the Quincy Police Department, the Gadsden County Baptist Association along with other religious organizations are sponsoring a National Day of Prayer observance at noon May 1 on the steps of the Gadsden County Courthouse. There will be various ministers from throughout the county praying for issues such as: families; the military; and federal, state and local governments. The public is invited. Since the first call to prayer in 1775, when the Continental Congress asked the colonies to pray for wisdom in forming a nation, the call to prayer was continued through U.S. history, including President Lincoln's proclamation of a day of "humiliation, fasting, and prayer" in 1863. Each year, the president signs a proclamation, encouraging all Americans to pray on this day. Last year, all 50 state governors plus the governors of several U.S. territories signed similar proclamations.

## Paving the way for progress

State to fund more county road improvements

Gadsden County Commissioners met April 15 for their regular meeting. Future improvements of five county roads were a topic of discussion. Funding for the project will be provided through the Small County Outreach Program, the County Incentive Grant Program, and the Small County Road Assistance Program — all initiatives instituted by the Florida Department of Transportation.

"It's been a lifesaver for this county," said Robert Presnell, county administrator, in a Times interview. "We're talking millions of dollars." Presnell said these programs have accounted for the restoration of about 30 roads in Gadsden County. From a list of 15 roads compiled by the county administration, the commissioners must determine which roads are in most dire need of repair. According to

Florida Statute Assistance Program, 339.2816, the official provision behind the grant is contingent on the Small County Road

## One shooting suspect cleared, two in custody

A new suspect is now in custody following two initial arrests after the April 11 daytime shooting at Gadsden Arms Apartments on Stewart Street in Quincy, according to an April 18 press release from Quincy Police Department.

Chauncey Reed Hawkins, 18, of 1444 Jakes Drive, Tallahassee, is being held at the Leon County Jail.

He is charged with robbery with a firearm, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, accessory to aggravated battery with a firearm, accessory to aggravated assault with a firearm, accessory to shooting into a dwelling and accessory to discharging a firearm.

**Rizterrious Lavont Robinson**, one of the first two

suspects arrested, turned himself in April 12 to Quincy Police Department. He has since been cleared and released. According to the April 18 report, a witness recanted testimony concerning Robinson's alleged involvement.

Chazdin Jamarick Miller, 19, is still being held. His bond is set at \$350,000.

According to the same QPD report, the case is still open. QPD investigators continue to seek, locate and interview additional witnesses. The department anticipates more arrests will be made in association with this shooting. Anyone with information about the shooting should call Quincy Police Department at 850-627-7111 and ask for Capt. Troy Gilyard. Informants may also be eligible for a reward if they call Crime Stoppers at 850-574-8477.

## Big step for athlete, school

### Sutton signs NCAA scholarship

Isaac Sutton of Gretna became the first Tallavana Christian School student to be awarded an athletic college scholarship. On April 17, Sutton signed to play basketball at the University of Maryland, Eastern Shore.

Sutton's new team, the Hawks, an NCAA Division I program, competes in the Mid-Eastern athletic conference. The conference includes Florida universities, such as Bethune-Cookman and Florida A & M. "This is just the beginning," said Sutton. "It's not just all about me. It's about the kids."

According to Issac Livingston, Tallavana Christian's basketball coach, Sutton distinguished himself through his work ethic. Livingston said Sutton always put in extra effort, staying after school to work on his game.

"He works that hard in school on his academics as well," said Livingston. "He did everything he was supposed to do." The entire school was present to witness the signing and applaud Sutton's accomplishment. Sutton, visibly

moved by the event, thanked God, his coach, his teachers and his parents.

Jeffery Reed, Tallavana Christian's athletic director, said the scholarship may have broader implications for the school's developing

programs. He said the scholarship gives students "something to strive for."

The athletic director said the school is working toward building a new program.

## New mushroom emerges in Quincy

The morel or Morchella mushroom has never been officially documented or in Florida — until now. Pam Anderson and Steve Cutshaw, both employed at Torreya State Park, found the lone specimen when conducting a plant census at Rocky Comfort Farms in

Quincy. "It's a very rare find for our area," said Cutshaw, the park manager. "Morels have a very short window of time to grow, so they're very hard to find." Debby Parramore, Rocky Comfort Farms' director, invited the rangers to conduct their plant census when she decided to

open a new trail through a part of her property where she wants to preserve the native condition.

"In the northern climates, they grow a little more abundantly — but still in limited numbers," said Cutshaw.

According to Anderson, Northern Florida's ecological conditions are highly

suitable for the morel's growth, making the mushroom's official debut in Florida remarkable on account of its inexcusable absence of documentation before now.

"We've always thought they were here," said Anderson. "The habitat is per-

## Two accused of robbing Havana visitor at knifepoint

A visiting man was robbed at knifepoint for three one-dollar bills around 2:30 p.m. April 8 inside the Havana Heights Apartments.

According to the Gadsden County Sheriff's Office report, the man said he was visiting a friend in the complex. Robbery

suspects Miles Johnson and Freeman Jackson allegedly stopped him outside as he was trying to leave.

According to the report, Johnson and Jackson aggressively approached him and began shouting profane and threatening statements.

The man, according to the report, asked

not to be hurt — but the profane threats continued. The man said Johnson produced a roughly 4-inch knife and pointed it toward his abdomen. The other

# Local group remembers Confederate soldiers

Finley's Brigade Camp 1614 of the Sons of Confederate Veterans had their seventh annual Confederate Decoration Day on April 19 at the Soldiers' Cemetery in Quincy.

This year's guest speakers were Susan Hathaway of the Virginia Flaggers — an organization dedicated to the public preservation of all Confederate States of America banners (commonly known as the "rebel flag") — and Jim Davis of St. Augustine, commander of the Florida Division of the SCV.

The beginning of the ceremony included prayer, the Pledge of Allegiance, and a salute to the Confederate flag.

"Our heritage is under attack," said Hathaway. "As sons and daughters of the South, we have inherited a birthright that is the envy of all who know about the confederate soldier's courage."

Camp 1614, comprised of members from Havana, honors the soldiers buried in Quincy and actively pursues their identities — a puzzle perpetuated by lost or incomplete records.

In the future, Finley's Brigade would like to construct a monument bearing the names of these now-anonymous men.

The rows of simple

headstones marking the graves of the soldiers were each marked with a small Confederate flag, and later, before the end of the ceremony, a wreath was laid against each stone marker.

The ceremony, however, was not only about the individual men — nor was it only about the past.

"I submit to you that we are not only here to remember these gallant Southern soldiers but also the Southern

culture that spawned them and their beliefs," said Davis. "For you see, my friends, the cost of war is always paid, and it is always to the last full measure," said Davis. "But never forget, not only by the brave soldiers is that cost paid. Our Southern culture has also paid the cost of that war."

The Decoration Day concluded with a spirited rendition of "Dixie" followed by refreshments and an art raffle.

# Spring showers ramp up rainfall

It's not your imagination. It really has been raining more than usual for this time of year.

A close look at the average inches of precipitation recorded by the National Weather Service over the course of three Marchs reveals this spring began wetter than usual in Gadsden County.

"I have not seen this much flooding since I've been a commissioner," said Brenda Holt, county commissioner.

Even within the county borders, rainfall varies. For example, the NWS map illustrates monthly averages in Havana may be different than monthly averages in Greensboro. General trends within the county, however, are still discernable — and they seem to be increasing in severity.

Holt said residents with flooded yards tell her, "It wasn't doing this when I first got my property."

This March, the map shows the county received 6 to 15 inches, with a large section of the county marked in the 8- to 10-inch range — and the southern point juts into an

area with a solid patch of 10- to 15-inch average precipitation for the month.

This past March, the map shows the county received 4 to 10 inches of rainfall, again depending on which specific section. About half the county remained in the 4- to 6-inch range — including the southern point, which averaged the most rainfall this March.

March 2009, five years ago, the map shows the county received only 6 to 8 inches, almost uniformly — with the exception of one spur, pointing northeast from the county's western border, which received 8 to 10 inches.

Accordingly, drainage issues have become points of consideration in both Gretna and Midway. The issue was a matter of discussion at Midway's most recent city council meeting April 3.

And more recently in Gretna, days after

a rainfall, standing water still lines several residential streets, unable to flow anywhere or percolate quickly into the supersaturated ground.

Similarly, according to an April 16 press release from the Northwest Florida Water Management District, significant flooding on Econfina Creek led the agency to close Pitt, Sylvan and Williford springs recreation areas in an effort to preserve public safety.

"Water's going to find the lowest point," said Holt. "It doesn't have a conscience."

Rainfall data for April, of course, are still being collected. Meanwhile, comparing any one given day from year to year is an inconclusive exercise. But if April's numbers, follow suit with March — as recent weather seems to suggest — Gadsden could continue on track for a particularly soggy spring.

One voice of influence — 10 tips for success

I frequently have the opportunity to address youth and young adults who are involved in some

community organization or civic group.

Recently, some 175 members of the City Year/Americorps programs from Orlando, Jacksonville and Miami came to the State Capitol in Tallahassee to learn about the workings of government, and what role they can play in building an advocacy presence for reforming education and improving the well-being of children.

I know City Year well because our son, Josh, served for a year in the Washington, D.C. program — a year in which he developed excellent leadership skills and made a difference with the youth he and

his colleagues mentored. [www.cityyear.org/](http://www.cityyear.org/). After treating the red-jacketed City Year visitors to a number of inspiring speakers, we had some time for conversation. One young man raised his hand and asked, "How can someone as young as 20 make a difference in as complicated a field as politics and public policy?"

One of our speakers, Shevrin Jones, who happens to be the youngest Florida State legislator at age 26, replied that leadership is not age-limited.

"What is important is having the confidence that your cause is just and your commitment is genuine. When I walked my district asking for votes I was often told 'You look too young to represent me.' My answer was: 'I am not too young to listen to you, to learn about problems that need to be fixed, and to have a voice that reflects my values for a better community. You are not too young to vote, to have your say and if you are brave enough, to run for office.'"

The young faces in the audience were easy to read — "If this guy can do it...so can I."

While many people in our nation are turned off by the big money and flood of negativity in politics, I believe deeply the power of the voter, properly motivated and engaged, is our nation's greatest strength and hope for the future.

When I hear that fewer than half of eligible young adults are registered to vote, and only a fraction of registered voters participate in every election, it makes me both sad and angry. So many people fought and even died for our right to vote — and in their honor, we owe it to our nation to take every opportunity to encourage our new generation of teens and young adults to make a difference, one voice and one vote at a time.

As we work to achieve our advocacy goals, I suggest keeping these 10 tips in mind:

- After each encounter with someone new, reflect on what you learned.
- What you say about someone reflects more on you than on them.
- Think first and speak later.

- Decide where you want to be and visit there often.

- Wherever you go, show up in full sprit, with open eyes, eager to learn something new.

- Resolve to be the most positive, kind and considerate person in the room.

- Ask at least three questions of others before you share about yourself.

- Give every person you meet a reason and a way to keep in touch.

- Remember names, but if you forget a name, politely ask to be reminded.

- Admit the errors you commit and forgive the errors of others.

These years were spent saving, relocating and restoring the last depot located on the Apalachicola Northern Railroad. The Greensboro Depot Railroad Museum is open from 1 to 4 p.m. each Saturday and Sunday. Be sure to visit often because exhibits change as more railroad artifacts are donated. A delightful feature of the museum is a dedicated “Kid’s Room” where children can enjoy playing with toy trains. Admission is free, though donations are always appreciated. upon the county's application of a prescribed set of general criteria when selecting roads for repair. Presnell said the research behind the list of 15 possible projects — three from each district — helps preclude the chance of disqualifications via

state's standards.

The statute reads, in part, "The following criteria must be used to prioritize road projects for funding under the program: The primary criterion is the physical condition of the road as measured by the department. As secondary criteria the department may consider: whether a road is used as an evacuation route, whether a road has high levels of agricultural travel,

whether a road is considered a major arterial route, whether a road is considered a feeder road."

This particular grant can pay for two of the road projects — one of which can cost around \$1 million, and one of which must cost less than \$100,000.

The other two programs are accompanied by their own particular sets of provisional language.

Justin Ford from

Preble-Rish, an engineering and surveying firm regularly contracted by the county, attended the meeting.

He offered commissioners his professional opinion regarding road selections. He said Old Federal Road, Tolar White Road and Charlie Harris Loop need repair.

He also said Bell Road and McNair Road are in questionable condition.

After discussion, the commissioners decided to each select one road, rather than generate a group list.

Presnell said from a list of five, the state would probably approve three of the projects — and complete them sometime in 2016 or 2017.

Commissioner Sherrie Taylor chose Old Federal Road. Commissioner Brenda Holt chose Hardaway Highway.

Commissioner Doug Croley chose Porter Mitchell Road. Commissioner Gene Morgan said he would like more time to consider his selection.

Commissioner Holt motioned to approve the five roads, whichever may be selected for proposal via the commissioners' agreed upon one-for-one system. Croley seconded.

The motion passed unanimously.

TALLAHASSEE — Florida A&M University (FAMU) is the home of the 2014 U.S. Intercollegiate Boxing Association's heavyweight champion.


FAMU student Willie Ferrell not only took home the championship belt earlier this month, but also defended his title as the 2013 heavyweight champion.

I wonder if my faith will ever grow deeper or stronger, if I'll ever have more passion for God, more desire for holiness.

Sometimes I think I must surely be the sorriest excuse for a Christian in the history of Christendom.

Sometimes people ask me when my next book is coming out, and I tell them probably never. I explain the publishing market has changed dramatically, which is true, and people don't buy books the way they used to — also true.

I tell them maybe God has me in Time Out, which may also be true. That happened once before when I was full of arrogance and pride and God let me embarrass myself publicly. I don't know if I got any better while I was in Time Out, but ever since I've been scared to be arrogant — I still am, but now I'm scared when I am, which might be progress. I don't know.

But the real reason I am not writing any more books is that I'm waiting to get better, for my faith to grow deeper, for me to have more passion for God, for my lukewarmness to heat up. I've been waiting for a while now.

Times like this, when I wonder if I'll ever get better and be usable for God, I remember a pastor I met years ago.

When she was younger, she joined with a traveling evangelist and went all over the country preaching seven days a week. Eventually, she burned out and also became disillusioned by some things she witnessed, "phoniness behind the pulpit," she said, and left the ministry for a while.

During her "time out," she got caught up in a cocaine whirlwind, using and selling. Here's the best part of her story: The whole time she was getting high, she was also sharing the gospel and praying with her druggie friends who would come to her with their spiritual questions.

She never stopped her ministry; it just took a different route.

be available for barley, hop and other agricultural

products. Whether drawn from lakes, rivers, groundwater or a local water system, brewers rely on the protections of the Clean Water Act to ensure the quality of our

main ingredient. Beer, after all, is 90 percent water. Fouling of our water supply — whether we draw directly from a water source or from a municipal supply — threatens our ability to produce our great-tasting beer and our bottom line.

However, loopholes in the current Clean Water Act have made it possible

to dump waste into many small streams and tributaries without fear of prosecution. In many cases, the loophole has rendered the EPA (and its sister agency on clean water issues, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers) unable to protect communities. Lawsuits and weak policies left over from the 1980s have left many

streams without adequate protection

Under the new safeguards proposed by the Obama administration, hundreds of communities will now enjoy the full protections of our nation's clean water laws. Bringing these streams and wetlands under the umbrella of the Clean Water Act will also help protect drinking water for 117 million people. It will safeguard natural flood protection, since wetlands and streams help catch and soak up rain. This is no small benefit; 9.6 million homes and \$360 billion worth of properties lie in flood-prone areas. Similarly, brewers rely on clean water to sustain their businesses and are cheering the new protections, as are hunters, anglers and wildlife-lovers

The EPA has done a terrific job of coming up with these new rules.

They don't give the agency any additional power that isn't already granted to them by the 1972 Clean Water Act. They're based on a thor-

ough review of more than 1,000 pieces of scientific literature. And they'll give the business community a much-needed dose of certainty going forward. Business organizations, such as the American Sustainable Business Council, of which our company is a member, have endorsed the rules.

While the rules won't be finalized until after a 90-day comment period — to be determined soon — there's a lot here for businesses to like, and very little not to like. Protecting our waterways is good for business, specifically businesses that rely on clean water to make great beer. There is no substitute for clean and abundant water for our business, for communities and for individuals. These proposed rules will offer the clarity and certainty that we need to continue to grow.



**Fire Roasted Corn and Chorizo Dip**

Serves: 8 to 12

- 3 to 4 ears Sunshine Sweet Corn
- 1 small onion, peeled and sliced into rings
- 1 small red bell pepper
- 1 cup cooked chorizo
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 pound spicy pepper cheese, like pepper-jack or habanero cheddar
- 1/4 cup chopped green onions

Preheat oven to 400°F and preheat grill to high heat. Remove cornhusks and corn silk, and place fresh Florida Sweet Corn, onion slices and red bell pepper on grill. Grill corn and bell pepper for 8 to 10 minutes, turning every 2 minutes until all sides are slightly charred. Grill onion slices for approximately 3 minutes per side. When veggies are cool enough to handle, cut corn off cob. Then chop onions and pepper, removing pepper seeds. **Charred Corn Tacos with Radish Zucchini Slaw**

Serves: 4

- 4 ears Sunshine Sweet Corn
- Extra virgin olive oil, as needed
- Salt and freshly ground pepper, as needed
- 1/2 cup torn cilantro, parsley and mint leaves
- 1/2 small red onion, thinly sliced
- 2 1/2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 1 teaspoon maple syrup
- 1 cup radishes, cut into matchsticks
- 1 small zucchini, cut into matchsticks
- 1 jalapeno, seeded and thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup (2 1/2 ounces) crumbled Cotija or feta cheese
- 10 to 12 small (6-inch) soft corn tortillas

Brush corn with olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Over hot grill or open gas stove flame, char ears of corn until well blackened but not completely burnt. Remove from heat; cool. With large knife, shave off kernels into bowl. Add cilantro, parsley, and mint; reserve.

In small bowl, combine onion and lime juice; let stand 10 minutes. Stir in maple syrup, radishes, zucchini, jalapeno and 2 tablespoons of oil. Season with salt and pepper; set aside.

Heat your tortillas one of two ways: Wrap whole stack in foil and place in warm 250°F oven for 15 minutes, or coat cast-iron skillet with thin layer of oil and heat over high heat; warm each tortilla 30 seconds to 1 minute each side, until lightly blistered.

To make tacos, fill each tortilla with 1/4 cup corn. Top with cheese and radish-zucchini slaw. Serve with lime wedges, if desired.



One day during a five-day high, she was pulled over by the police. She said that's when she came face to face with the mercy of God. Even though she had cocaine all over the seat of her car — and a gun — the officer let her go.

That scare was enough to shake her up, and eventually she stopped using drugs and returned to full-time ministry as a pastor.

What I love most about her story is how, even when she was high, God still used her to minister to others. She "had church" even when she seemed far from God.

You may disagree that God can use someone who is steeped in sin, and no church should allow an adulterous or illegal drug-addicted pastor to lead them. But that's not the point I'm trying to make here.

I'm talking about how God uses sinners, for that's what we all are, to reach other sinners with the gospel of grace, and he doesn't wait until we reach a certain level of sinfulness.

Even the Apostle Paul, the greatest Christian who ever lived, called himself the "chief sinner" (1 Timothy 1:15).

A few months ago, I came to church early and sat in the parking lot debating stuff with myself. Without a whole lot of faith, I asked God to please show up for me, telling him that I needed his mercy in my life, because without it I'm toast.

Frankly, I didn't expect him to answer my prayer, because I felt I didn't deserve it. But he graciously humbled himself and showed himself in so many ways, but most personally in the songs we sang: "If you tarry till you're better, you will never come at all ... Not the righteous, not the righteous; sinners

Jesus came to call ... Let not conscience make you linger, nor of fitness fondly dream; all the fitness he requires is to feel your need for him" and then finally, "He has washed us with his blood."

The truth is, if I tarry till I'm better — well, I'll never be "better enough." I will always have need for improvement.

Even so, just as I am, wherever that may be in my spiritual process, God can use me. After church that night, with the hymns still echoing in my mind, I hugged my bulletin all the way out to my car. God is so good.





fect.”

Anderson said the mushrooms tend to come up around the time dogwood trees are blooming.

She said morels often prefer alluvial soil — loose sedimentary soil that was once either submerged or deposited by a body of water.

“We have a lot of biodiversity,” said Cutshaw. “Our whole area can offer some amazing finds.”

The mushroom was removed from the ground and sent to Dr. Matt Smith, curator of the mycology herbarium at University of Florida, for a more thorough examination.

“He requested that I collect it and dry it out,” said Anderson. “He was very excited.”

According to Anderson, farmers have been trying to commercially raise morel mushrooms for more than a hundred years.

So far, none of these attempts have succeeded.

This has helped develop the search for morels into a type of wide-spread recreational hobby.

“People hunt these like crazy,” said Anderson. “The word got around. I had people calling me from Indiana and Colorado.”

“They are the most delicious culinary mushroom you can ever put your mouth

on,” said Anderson. Parramore and the Rangers said they would be watching the

area next year, intent on possibly finding more of the elusive mushrooms.

The Rural School and Community Trust is a national nonprofit organization that addresses the crucial relationship between good schools and thriving communities. Its work addresses both the school-based practices and the pol-

icy contexts that support rural schools, their communities, and their students.

The School Fund is one of three programs — the Leonore Annenberg Scholarship, Fellowship and School Funds — administered by the Annenberg Public Policy Center at the University of Pennsylvania. The School Fund resources must be of immediate and

direct value to, and use by, students.

Greenville Elementary in Greenville was also selected to receive a grant from the School Fund. It will use its grant for technology to expand its music and visual arts curricula.
