

LUMBER MILL SOLD ON NEWMAN'S LAKE

J. A. Maulsby Sells Big Cypress Plant to New York Parties.

TIMBER WAS SOLD ALSO

The Tract Involves Several Thousand Acres of Fine Cypress Timber, Which is Among the Best in the State—Deal May Mean Big Thing.

Another important deal has been made in this county which means the transfer of many thousands of dollars. J. A. Maulsby has sold to the Sea Coast Lumber Company, a rich corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York, the saw mill plant, together with all the timber rights of same, of the business situated on Newman's lake, near Fairbanks.

This mill, while not as large as many, is one of the most modern and up-to-date in the State, cutting cypress timber exclusively. The plant, which is comparatively new, having been erected about two years ago, has a capacity of about fifteen thousand feet per day, and works a large number of hands at the mill and logging camps.

The consideration of this deal as filed in the office of the clerk of the circuit court provides a payment of \$10 cash and other valuable considerations, but it is known that the deal involved thousands, as the acreage in timber alone is extensive.

It is understood that operations at the mill will be unmolested, the new proprietors carrying the business on without the loss of a day.

Newman's lake swamps abound in the finest kind of cypress, and there is no determining just what this purchase may mean to that section at this time.

DOCKET WAS HEAVY.

Levy County Had Lots of Legal Business at the Term Just Closing.

Notwithstanding that the docket of the circuit court of Levy county, both civil and criminal, has been larger the present term than for several years, the court is making fine progress and will succeed in disposing of many cases before the closing of the term. This congested condition of affairs was caused by the fact that at the spring term Judge Pinnell, who had a great deal of business with the court, was ill, and it became necessary to postpone many cases. These cases naturally took precedence at this term.

Only one week is provided for the fall term of the circuit court for Levy county, owing to the fact that time is limited, the fall term opening in Baker county, at Macclenny, Monday.

Solicitor Calhoun has been quite busy during the week in the grand jury room. He was ably represented in the circuit court room, however, by Judge Syd L. Carter, former State's Attorney, and one of the most competent lawyers in the State.

Members of the bar from Gainesville who have had occasion to attend the session of the Levy county circuit court state that the court is making excellent progress, having disposed of quite a number of cases. Among these were a few cases of selling liquor in a dry county.

The fall term of the court at Bronson must adjourn tomorrow night, as Circuit Judge Wills and Solicitor Calhoun must be in Macclenny Monday.

Alachua county has the advantage of the longest term in the circuit, since this is the last county in which a term is held.

GINS ALL BUSY AT ALACHUA

Five Hundred Bales Reported Turned Out So Far.

650 BALES ARE IN STORAGE

Monteocha Ginner Has Turned Out Fifty-Five Bales So Far, but Expects to Gin One Hundred More—Crop Open in Field, but Labor Scarce.

The cotton season at Alachua seems to be at its height just now. All three gins of that town are busy, according to reports, and five hundred bales were turned out from the Alachua gins up to Wednesday of the present week.

The Alachua Cotton Warehouse Company has now in storage about six hundred and fifty bales of cotton, including a few bales left over from last year's crop.

Geo. W. Maines, who conducts a ginery at Monteocha, was in Gainesville Friday. He is operating three gins, and reports that he has turned out so far this season fifty-five bales. He may possibly gin 100 bales more, making a total of 155 this year, against 228 last season.

Mr. Maines states that the cotton is about all open in the fields, and the farmers are now busy picking. The same report comes from the Alachua section. Pickers are very scarce, and some planters are offering as high as \$1.25 per hundred for gathering, but find it impossible in many instances to secure labor at that price. The negroes, who comprise principally the cotton pickers, are offered better inducements in the sawmills and naval stores farms, where they prefer to work.

The condition of all crops has been more or less retarded by adverse weather conditions, but it is evident that cotton has suffered most.

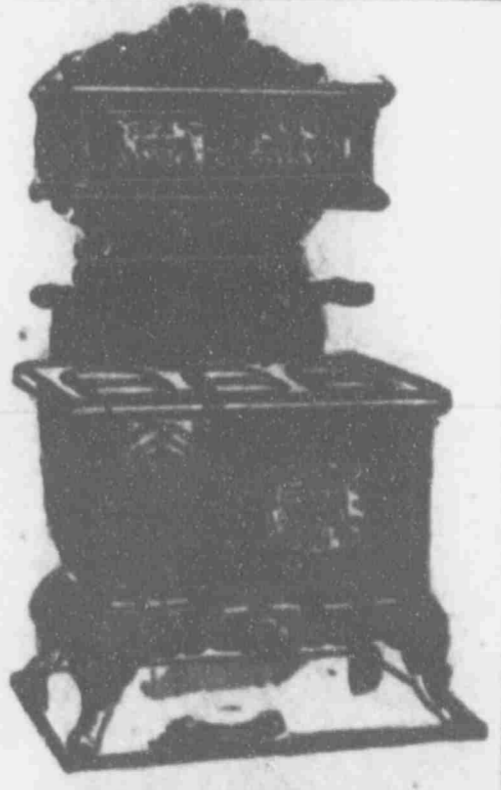
