Mrs. Grace Conway of Arredondo was shopping in the city yesterday. She favored The Sun office with a call, renewing her subscription.

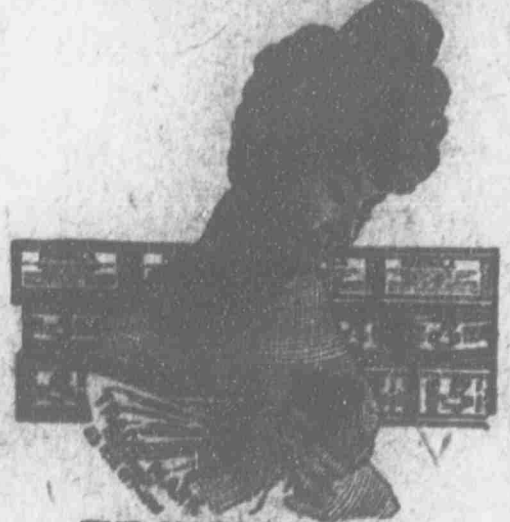

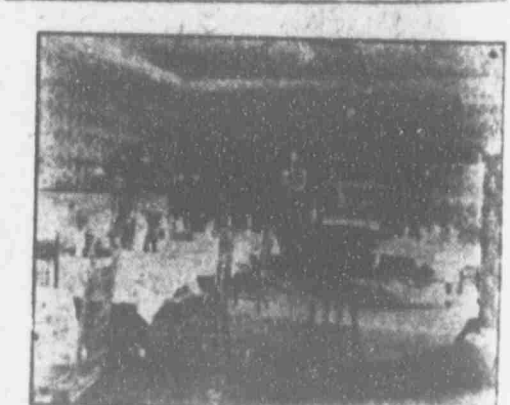
