AN ORDINANCE

To Prescribe the Design and Provide for the Execution of the Public Utility Bonds of the City of Gainesville. Whereas, under and by virtue of the provisions of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Issuance of Bonds and the Creation of an Executive Board under the Provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of Florida, entitled, 'An Act Extending and Enlarging the Territorial Limits and the Powers of the City of Gainesville, a Municipal Corporation Organized and Existing in Alachua County, Florida, and Providing for the Exercise of Those Powers,' approved 5th September, A. D. 1905, an election was held in the said City of Gainesville, Florida, on the 10th day of October, 1905, to determine whether or not the issuance of bonds provided by said ordinance should be at that time approved by a majority of the qualified electors of said city at said election; and

ville a Municipal Corporation Organized and Existing in Alachua County, Florida, and Providing for the Exercise of Those Powers," approved 5th September, 1905, and published once each week for four consecutive weeks in a newspaper printed in said city; the beginning of such publication being made immediately upon its adoption and approval, which ordinance and the issuance of which bonds were approved by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors of said city, at a special bond election duly called and held under the provisions of said Act and ordinance on the 10th day of October, 1905.

It is hereby certified that the issue of bonds, of which this is one, is made in strict conformity with the Laws of the State of Florida and the said ordinance of the City of Gainesville duly authorizing the same, and that all proceedings and things essential to the validity of this bond have duly happened and been performed, and all requirements of laws and ordinances have been fully complied with by the proper officers in the issuance of this bond.

In testimony whereof the City of Gainesville has issued this bond, bearing date the 1st day of January, 1906, and has caused it to be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the President of the City Council and attested by the City Clerk of said city under the seal of the corporation.
