

SHAW REMAINS IN CABINET.

Secretary of Treasury Will Not Retire For Some Time.

Washington, Nov. 21.—Secretary Shaw will remain as secretary of the treasury in President Roosevelt's cabinet until the conclusion of the approaching session of congress, and, perhaps, for several months longer.

It has been understood in a tentative way that Secretary Shaw intended retiring from the cabinet after the first of February, if, indeed, he should not be concluded to relinquish his official duties before that time.

President Roosevelt and Secretary Shaw had a conference last February, in the course of which the secretary consented to remain at the head of the treasury department for another year, by which time he would have completed a full four years' term in the office.
