Have Returned from Annual Meeting K. of P. Well Pleased.

Grand Chancellor Louis C. Lynch, Robt. E. Davis, A. M. Cushman and Geo. P. Morris and wife, have returned from St. Petersburg, where they went to attend the annual session of the Grand Lodge, Knights of Pythias, which was in session in that city for three days last week, Mrs. Morris representing the Pythian Sisters.

According to the report of the delegates attending from Mt. Vernon Lodge, the convention just closed was one of the most enjoyable ever held in the State, as well as one of the most largely attended. The good people of St. Petersburg exerted every effort for the entertainment of the visitors, and with remarkable success, as their stay in the "City by the Gulf" will not be forgotten.

The question of selecting a permanent location for the Grand Lodge was again brought up. Jacksonville entered for the place, but Gainesville was a close competitor and a strong one. Captain George M. Lynch, formerly of this city but now president of the Jasper Normal Institute, Jasper, making a most magnificent plea in inviting the Pythians to make their future and permanent home here.
