CHAPTER 5879-(NO. 10)

AN ACT to Provide for the Payment of the Pres-ent Indebtedness of the Florida State Reform School.

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida

Section 1. That the sum of seven thousand nine hundred and twenty-one and 65-100 dollars is hereby appropriated for the purpose of paying the present indebtedness of the Florida State Reform School. Said appropriation shall be paid by the Treasurer of the State upon warrants issued therefor by the Comptroller, and upon requisition and direction of the Board of Managers of the said Florida State Reform School.

Sec. 2. Said appropriation is hereby made pay-able from funds derived from the hire of State convicts, if there be such funds, otherwise from the General Fund. Sec. 3. This Act shall take effect from and after

its passage and approval by the Governor. Approved June *, 1909.
