J. M. "Murph" Everett to be Inducted into the FFA Hall of Fame

Florida FFA is pleased to announce the inductees for the 2018 Florida FFA Hall of Fame. J.M. "Murph" Everett will be one of five who will be inducted at the Florida FFA Hall of Fame 2018 Induction Ceremony. The Induction will take place on Monday, September 24, 2018 at the Florida FFA Leadership Training Center in Haines City, Florida.

Mr. Everett began a career in Agricultural Education in 1956 after serving in the US Army in the Korean Conflict. He earned the Army Occupational Medal for Japan and the Korean Service Medal and four Bronze Stars, he obtained the rank of Sergeant. He graduated from the University of Florida in 1956 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture. Later he received his Master of Science in Supervision and Administration from Nova University.

His teaching career began in 1956 at Lafayette High School, where he taught for many years before transferring to Trenton High School. He was the FFA Advisor in Trenton until 1992.

Mr. Everett built agricultural education programs that enhanced the education and leadership of the students that he taught. He coached many judging teams and encouraged students to participate in the leadership continuums available through the FFA. Mr. Everett's dedication to the youth in Gilchrist County was extended after his retirement by his election to the Gilchrist County School Board where he served from 1996-2004.

During his time on the Gilchrist County School Board Mr. Everett worked along with a committee to secure funding for the Gilchrist County Agriculture Complex aka the Arena between Trenton and Bell which was built in 2000.

Many students found their vocational calling in agriculture, business, government and other fields due to Mr. Everett's influence. He always embraced new technology and methodology.

Mr. Everett was a native of Wilcox and a longtime member and Deacon of Bethel Baptist Church. He also served his community as the chairman of the of the Bethel and Jennings Lake Cemeteries as well as a founding member of the Gilchrist County Historical Society.

Mr. Murph Everett passed away on January 10, 2011 at the age of 80.

Bell man charged in Dixie crash Friday morning

A Bell man was charged in connection with a single vehicle crash in Dixie County on Friday morning as he was traveling south on CR 351 at SW 449th Street.

James Richard Hill, 27, was driving a 2015 Dodge Journey when the crash occurred at 5:28 a.m. The driver was reported to have run off the highway and struck a tree with the vehicle's front end.

The driver sustained non-left threatening injuries and was charged with failure to drive within a single lane and a seat belt violation, reported Trooper Skelly of the Florida Highway Patrol.

Gilchrist County finds No Code Violation of North Florida Holstein Agriculture Use

The Gilchrist County Commission held a Public Hearing on May 21, to consider a Code Enforcement complaint brought to the county's attention by Jean Wonsler, a resident of Northeast Gilchrist County. Ms. Wonsler reported that North Florida Holstein Dairy is not allowed to plant row crops in an A6 Agriculture Zoning Land Use in Gilchrist County. She pointed out that the 1992 Gilchrist County Land Use book states that agriculture/silviculture land use is allowed following the clear cutting of a forested tract of property. Under the A6 zoning classification, this property should be planted back in trees.

Don Bennink, the owner of the property explained that North Florida Holstein has planted a Bermuda grass on this property and it is a beautiful, most wildlife friendly piece of property in all of Gilchrist County. The property has Bermuda grasses growing in the spring, summer and fall and rye grass is sown into the ground to establish a growing stand in the winter months. The property has four monitoring wells spread out at different locations. Mr. Bennink showed a graph of the results from the monitoring wells in 2016-2017 showed no signs of nitrogen from the monitoring wells on this property. "I think this is the best water in Gilchrist County," he explained in the Monday afternoon meeting.

Mike Roth, President of Our Santa Fe River pointed out that it is a beautiful parcel, but under the A6 Ag Use classification, it requires the property to be planted back into trees. I don't see any trees being replanted on this property, he told the five Commissioners.

Bobby Crosby, Gilchrist County Administrator explained that he has been in communication with Darrel Leach, an assistant state soil scientist with the State of Florida. The scientist explained that Gilchrist County would be better off if they would use information from the State of Florida Soil Science service which is updated annually in place of their 1992 Soil Use handbook. Mr. Crosby explained that under the A6 Ag zoning, the land owner is allowed to graze up to 5000 head of cattle and construct many different types of structures on the property.

Mike Roth recommended to the board that the County should update their land use guidelines for these types of agriculture uses.

Jean Wonsler told the Commission there are 620 acres of property in the A6 Ag classification. In order to put cattle on this property, the land owner would have to fence the property to keep 5000 head of cattle out of the low lying cypress pond wetlands.

Commissioner Thomas made a motion for the Commission to close this hearing on this Code Enforcement complaint, that there is not evidence found to substantiate a violation of A6 Ag use by North Florida Holstein Dairy. Commissioner Langford agreed as she gave second to the motion. The Commission Chairman took a vote and the boards' unanimous decision approved the action taken.

The County Administrator reported to the Commission that under Florida law, Gilchrist County is required to pay for health insurance for the family of Sgt. Ramirez. Mr. Crosby explained that under Florida law, the family of a fallen officer when he is killed in the line of duty, the county is responsible for the insurance on the remaining family members until the siblings reach the age of 25. The County Administrator reported that he would wait for a response from the children's mother before taking any further action.

Gilchrist County approved the application for Ginnie Springs Outdoors, LLC to hold a fireworks presentation. The county required the applicant to supply a site plan of the area where the display will be held. The plan must document where the



New Septic Rules for small lots in Gilchrist

Small lot owners in parts of Gilchrist County will no longer be allowed to use conventional septic tanks for new homes or mobile homes as of July 1, 2018. The parts of Gilchrist County that will be affected by the new Basin Management Action Plan is mostly located in the southern half of Gilchrist County, west of 129 to the Dixie County line at the Suwannee River and South of 232 all the way into Levy County south of Chiefland. Some 147,443.16 acres in total will soon officially be a Springs Priority Focus Area. Some of the Waccasassa Flats property on the east side of 129 will also be included. This area will be known as the Fanning Springs and Manatee Springs Focus Area.

Wesley Asbell, of the Department of Health in Gilchrist County, Environmental Health Section reported that traditional septic tank permits will not be issued for lots less than one acre in this area of Gilchrist and Levy Counties. Instead those wanting to build a home or move a mobile home on less than one acre lots will have to use an alternative advanced treatment system which will remove 65% of nitrates from the waste wa-



ter. Asbell believes there are around 2,500 such lots in the Focus Area that will be affected.

Those already living in the Primary Focus Area, mainly around springs, will be able to use their current septic system. If the current septic system fails, homeowners can make repairs. If a homeowner with a conventional septic system decides to enlarge their current home, they will be required to change to the advanced treatment system. At this time Asbell wasn't

sure of the cost of these new systems, but he believes that they will be more expensive than a conventional septic tank.

These changes all came about after the Florida Legislature identified 30 "Outstanding Florida Springs" that require additional protection. A total of 24 of these 30 springs were found to have excess levels of nitrogen pollution, particularly nitrate. The ways springs will be protected will be outlined in a restoration plan, known as a Basin Management Action Plan or BMAP. These plans focus on reducing nitrogen pollution that is impacting the water quality of the springs. DEP developed a BMAP for all the springs that are not meeting water quality standards. Each BMAP must identify the sources of nitrogen pollution within the springshed and include strategies to reduce the pollution. Sources of nitrogen include wastewater, water from septic tanks, stormwater runoff, and fertilizer runoff from both urban and agricultural lands. Wesley Asbell will be presenting the information about the BMAP, the Springs Priority Focus Areas and the effect on septic tank permits to the Gilchrist County Commission at the Commissioners' June 4 meeting.

fireworks will be discharged from, an area where the spectators will be allowed to view from, an area designated for parking, an area for the fallout of material from the exploded fireworks, restrooms for the public, and any other planned activities. The plan must also show in detail where buildings, and other towers and structures and highways are located within 300 feet of the discharge area. The applicant must provide evidence of financial responsibility by proof of public insurance liability of no less than \$300,000. The application was approved.

The Gilchrist County Commission will hold a Public Revenue Workshop on July 2 at 3 p.m. to review the different revenue resources that the County Commission could consider for their upcoming budget workshops. The Commission could consider Impact Fees, one half cent sales tax, and (MSTU) municipal service taxing unit.

Santa Fe River Cleanup this Saturday!

We are holding a cleanup of the Santa Fe River this Saturday, June 2nd. There are two components to this cleanup for which we need volunteers:

Beginning at 9:00 a.m., we will meet at the 47 boat ramp. We have several divers committed who will be shuttled upriver to Myrtle's Fissure. They will be cleaning along the river bottom, passing trash to those in canoes on the surface. We need volunteers for these canoes to take the trash from divers, pass the divers empty bags, and empty the full bags into the canoes. We will have two motor boats to help collect trash as well. We also need volunteers to work at the boat ramp to empty the cans/bottles/other trash of various invertebrates that may have taken up residence in the trash. We like to do our best to return them to the river.

Protect against mosquito-borne diseases

EEE Positive Horse Identified in County

Due to the identification of a EEE (Eastern Equine Encephalitis) positive horse in Gilchrist County, Florida Department of Health (DOH) officials emphasize the importance of residents and visitors protecting themselves against mosquito-borne diseases. The public should remain diligent in preventative measures like "Drain and Cover."

Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used. Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week. Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.

Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use. Cover skin with clothing or repellent.

Clothing - wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.

Repellent - apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

CFEC Gears up for the 2018 Hurricane Season

As the 2018 hurricane season begins, Central Florida Electric Cooperative is hoping for the best but has prepared for the worst. Last August, Irma's destruction to Florida, including CFEC's territory, was catastrophic, leaving more than 26,000 CFEC members and 78% of our accounts without power. This year, CFEC has reflected on the lessons learned from Irma's wrath and has gone the extra mile to prepare for this hurricane season for our members, our employees, and our community.

Since last year, CFEC has prepared extensively for this hurricane season through trainings, meetings, and drills. Similarly, CFEC's wholesale power provider, Seminole Electric Cooperative, has been preparing as well. In March, representatives from CFEC participated in a Seminole working group to finalize a 2018 Hurricane Preparedness Guide for our member's use. You can find this guide at any of our locations, on our Facebook page, and at www.cfec.com. In May, Seminole, headquartered in Tampa, held a hurricane preparedness drill using lessons learned from Irma, in coordination with their power plant personnel, to confirm that all Seminole locations are prepared to operate their facilities in a safe, reliable manner throughout potential storms.

While CFEC and Seminole prepare for this upcoming season, there are also things you can do for you and your family. Checklists are simple, condensed ways to make sure you have what you need to be prepared.

Before the storm you should create an emergency supplies kit and family emergency communication plan.

Discuss the plans with your family. Know your hurricane risk, including the approximate elevation level of your property and if the land is prone to flooding. This will help you prepare for a possible storm surge and any tidal flooding.

Secure your home and cover all windows with either storm shutters or boards, clear loose and clogged rain gutters, and bring all outdoor furniture and plants indoors.

You should learn your community hurricane evacuation routes. During the Storm you should listen to the radio or TV for information, if possible.

Monitor your cell phone and/or email, as many communities have text or email alerting systems for emergency notifications. Keep your cell phone fully charged throughout the storm event, if possible.

Turn off all utilities if instructed to do so. Otherwise, keep the refrigerator thermostat on the coldest setting and keep the doors closed.

One of the students, Molly O'Sullivan, has already used the certification to obtain a job. She starts at Gulf Coast Supply, a roofing manufacturer in Jonesville, on June 4

where she will use AutoCAD, one of the programs the students practiced in the class.

The class also used what they have learned to create two remote-controlled robots, one each for Bell and Trenton, to mop the gym floors.

They said Bell head basketball coach Chuck Mehl came up with the idea, but the engineering and construction was completely up to the students.

Gag Season Opens June 1 in Gulf Federal and Most Waters

Gag grouper will open for recreational harvest in most state Gulf of Mexico waters and all federal Gulf waters June 1, and will remain open through Dec. 31.

Franklin, Wakulla, Taylor and Jefferson counties are excluded from this opening because they have their own season from April 1-June 30 and Sept. 1-Dec. 31. Monroe County is also excluded from this season because it follows the Atlantic state season.

Gulf state waters are from shore to 9 nautical miles. Federal waters begin where state waters end and extend to 200 nautical miles.

The minimum size limit for gag grouper in Gulf waters is 24 inches total length, and the daily bag limit is two fish per person within the four-grouper per person aggregate limit.

If you plan to fish for gag grouper in Gulf state or federal waters from a private recreational vessel, you must sign up as a Gulf Reef Fish Angler (annual renewal is required). To learn more, visit MyFWC.com/Fishing and click on "Saltwater Fishing," "Recreational Regulations" and "Gulf Reef Fish Survey" under "Reef Fish."
