A Glades County Attraction: Hiking At Fort Center

Area has lots for families

The Fort Center Trail at Fisheating Creek offers one of Glades County's most interesting hiking trails. The FWCC officially opened the Fort Center Trail in January 2009.

About 300 visitors enjoyed hay rides, interpretive hikes, birding tours, guest speakers, demonstrations, music, and BBQ.

The trail head starts at the west end of Banana Grove Road, off Rt. 78, and it ends at the Fort Center site (about 2.4 miles). Take Rt. 78 from Moore Haven, or from Okeechobee. Turn west on Banana Grove Road at the Fisheating WMA sign, then drive about a mile to the new parking area located adjacent to the FWCC office. Look for the viewing tower located next to the parking lots.

Fort Center Trail is a treasure of interests and activities. Few trails in the region offer such interpretive resources as the Fort Center Trail has to offer. The trail is also a multi-educational experience. You will find information about the archaeology, Native American history, wildlife viewings, and biological interpretations of the Fisheating Creek flood plain.

Morning Crash Involving Teenager Under Investigation

No clear reason as to why she lost control

A Monday morning crash on U.S. 27 just south of C.R. 720 left a 16-year-old in the hospital in critical condition. The accident happened

around 10:30 a.m. as the driver Lynda Michelle Hise was driving northbound on U.S. 27 in her 1993 Ford pickup.

According to a report from Florida Highway Patrol, Hise lost control of her car, for reasons unknown, and corrected.

She was able to get back onto the highway but could not maintain before losing control.

She crossed both northbound lanes and went

onto the grassy shoulder of the highway. She lost control and her vehicle overturned several times before finally coming to a rest upright.

She was flown out to Lee Memorial Hospital where her condition is listed as being critical.

The cause of the accident is yet to be determined. Hise was wearing her seat belt at the time of the accident. FHP is saying that alcohol was not a factor in the accident.

Roadwatch for the Week of July 17

Glades County

•US 27: From Industrial Canal to Lewis Boulevard (in the city of Clewiston): Maintenance project --- Crews will be cleaning the drainage pipes.

No lane closures are expected, but motorists should be aware of equipment and workers in the area.

•US 27: From the Hendry County Line to Old Highway 27: Construction project---The project consists of milling and resurfacing, drainage improvements, signing and pavement.

Motorists should expect single lanes in each direction during milling and paving operations, slow moving traffic and possible minor delays. Flagmen will be on site to assist with traffic. Construction is expected to be completed in late summer 2011. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, LLC.

Hendry County

•US 27: From Stitt Ranch entrance in Hendry County to Old US 27 in Glades County (8 miles): Construction project --- Work continues to resurface eight miles of roadway. One lane in each direction will be maintained during final sod installation operations. Lane closures are also permitted only during the hours of working operations. The 65 mph speed limit will be maintained.

During this project, motorists should expect construction trucks and vehicles to be entering and exiting the roadway. Driving times also may be longer than usual, so planning extra travel time is important.

Motorists also should anticipate changes in routine travel patterns and always drive with care. Project completion is expected at the end of summer 2011. Ajax Paving, Industries is the contractor.

•SR 80: From SR 80 to Collingswood Parkway: Construction project --- This project consists of adding a right turn lane, widening, base work and signing and pavement marking on SR 80 approxi-

mately 400 feet west of Collingswood Parkway. Motorists should expect eastbound lane closures from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weather permitting, Monday through Friday.

Please use caution while traveling through this work zone. The contractor is Better Roads, Inc.

•SR 80: From Cowboy Way to Clark Street: Maintenance permit project --- Contractor crews will be replacing their cable in this area, no lane closures expected, but motorist should be aware of equipment and workers in this area.

•SR 80: At Palomino Drive and Indian Hills Drive intersection: Construction project --- This project will add turn lanes. Crews are working on the travel lanes and outside shoulders along with side drain installation.

Motorists should expect lane closures from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Tuesday through Friday. Please use caution while traveling through this work zone. The project is estimated for completion in late fall 2011. The contractor is Better Roads, Inc.

•SR 29: From SR 80 to Cowboy Way: Maintenance permit project --- Sidewalk repairs are underway in this area. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures while crews work on the concrete pour.

Trucks are entering and exiting the work area, please use caution. This project will be completed by mid-June.

•SR 29: South from A Road to F Road: Maintenance project --- Crews will be reworking the shoulders from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Thursday for the next three weeks. Motorists should expect a lane closure and flagmen will be on hand to assist with traffic.

•SR 29: From Helms Road to E Road: Maintenance permit project --- Crews will be replacing power poles in this area. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures with flagmen on site to assist with traffic.

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Protect Yourself from Mosquito Bites

Now that the rains have finally arrived, it's time to start thinking about mosquitoes. It's so important for you to protect yourself and your family from mosquito-borne diseases.

Mosquitoes can carry West Nile virus infection, St. Louis Encephalitis, and Eastern Equine Encephalitis. Once a person is infected, they may have mild symptoms which include headache, fever, dizziness, and fatigue, but other severe symptoms are also possible.

Mosquito-borne diseases can cause serious illnesses and sometimes death in people of any age, but children and those over 50 are at greatest risk for severe reactions and disease.

Avoiding mosquito bites is the best way to prevent disease. Please remember the five D's:

- Dusk and Dawn – Avoid being outdoors when mosquitoes are seeking blood.
- Dress – Wear clothing that covers most of your skin.
- DEET – When the potential exists for exposure to mosquitoes, repellents containing up to 30 percent DEET are recommended. Oil of lemon eucalyptus can also be effective.
- Drainage – Check around your home to rid the area of standing water, where mosquitoes lay eggs.

Tips on Repellent Use

- Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before applying a repellent.
- In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is appropriate. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old. Oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children less than three years old.
- Infants should be kept indoors or mosquito netting should be used over carriers and strollers

when outside.

•Never apply repellents to a child's hands. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.

•Apply insect repellent to exposed skin or onto clothing, but not under clothing. Do not apply repellent near the eyes or mouth, cuts, wounds, or irritated skin.

Tips on Eliminating Mosquito Breeding Sites

- Clean out eaves, troughs and gutters.
- Remove old tires or drill holes in those used in playgrounds to drain.
- Turn over or remove any empty containers (cups, pots, buckets, etc.).
- Check tarps on boats or other equipment that may collect water.
- Store boats upside down or with a cover
- Replace water in birdbaths and pet or other animal feeding dishes at least once a week.
- Change water in plant trays, including hanging plants, at least once a week.
- Remove vegetation or obstructions in drainage ditches that prevent the flow of water.

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

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Making Plastic From Discarded Plant Material

UF develops method to do so

Plastic may compete with paper in the grocery line, but it doesn't have to compete with the world's food supply, according to University of Florida researchers.

They've developed a way to produce plastic that doesn't use valuable natural resources, such as food or fuel, for raw materials.

The new method uses a strain of bacteria to create bioplastic from discarded plant material, such as yard waste.

Bioplastic, or plastic from renewable resources, is produced when an organism such as a bacterium creates lactic acid while fermenting carbohydrates. The lactic acid can then be converted into long chains of molecules to form plastic.

Current bioplastic production uses food carbohydrates, such as cane sugar or corn starch, as raw materials. Traditional plastic production requires petroleum.

Keelnatham Shanmugam, a UF microbiology and cell science professor, Lonnie Ingram, a distinguished professor in microbiology and cell science, and their co-workers made the development. Their research is published in the May issue of the *Journal of Industrial Microbiology and Biotechnology*.

"As we start using more and more bioplastics, we are infringing upon the use of food material," said Shanmugam. "We'd like to switch away from food-based carbohydrates to non-food-based carbohydrates for producing plastics."

Using discarded plant material to produce plastic helps keep commodity prices down. The plastic produced from the process is both biodegradable and recyclable, Shanmugam said.

In the study, the researchers tested the bacterium — *Bacillus coagulans* strain 36D1 — for its ability to produce lactic acid in a variety of conditions typical of bioplastic production. The bacterium was collected from a geyser in Calistoga, Calif., which was one of the many places the researchers sampled for bacteria.

Previous attempts to produce lactic acid from discarded plant materials using microorganisms have not yielded enough lactic acid and weren't cost effective.

However, Shanmugam and Ingram found that by adding calcium carbonate to the process, they achieved lactic acid yields as high as those achieved by organisms that fermented food carbohydrates.

Additionally, the heat-tolerant bacterial strain also cut production costs significantly by allowing the process to run at a higher temperature, which reduced the amount of expensive, plant-digesting enzymes required by up to four times.

Cost savings are also achieved by eliminating



the need for food carbohydrates as raw materials since discarded plant waste is less expensive. For example, using straw as a raw material is 13 times less expensive than sugar and five times less expensive than corn or wheat.

Mark Ou, a UF biological scientist and the study's lead author, said increases in oil prices over the last several years have led to more interest in petroleum alternatives for plastic production.

"If we can save some of our oil and turn our plants into our plastic cups and packaging, then we can increase our national security by reducing our dependence on foreign oil," Ou said.

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

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Inland Birdwatching Fun: Tricolored Heron

Birdwatching and developing wildlife habitat can be fun for youth and adults. Food, water, shelter, habitat, and safety are important considerations when attracting wildlife.

Excellent resources to learn about "Landscaping for Wildlife" can be found on the University of Florida's IFAS Living Green website: <http://livinggreen.ifas.ufl.edu/> or at your local IFAS Extension Office.

One interesting bird built for marsh life is the Tricolored Heron. The Tricolored Heron is fairly common, but with decreasing numbers they are designated a Species of Special Concern in

Florida.

This slim, medium sized heron was formerly known as the Louisiana Heron. Adults have a dark slate-blue head and upper body with a purplish chest and white belly.

During breeding season, the Tricolored Heron sports a short white head plume, a buffy throat and fore-neck, a blue face and a blue bill, tipped with black.

Non breeding adults have a yellow face, bill and legs; the throat and fore-neck are white. On juvenile Tricolored Herons, rusty red adorns the

head, neck, upper back, and front parts of the wing.

Long legs enable them to wade and see down through water while using long toes to churn up food and distribute its weight over soft mud. Foraging behavior is very active and it often runs after fish.

A long neck and bill help this elegant bird reach prey which consists of fish, crustaceans, reptiles and insects. Its vocalization is a soft nasal moaning or croaking similar to other herons or egrets.

Tricolored Herons usually nest in colonies with other heron and ibis species. A clutch may contain 3-4 blue-green eggs which hatch in about 22 days. Both parents feed the young.

The young can swim well for short distances at 14 days of age and fledge at about 16-21 days of age.

July Sees Increase In Rainfall

Glades, Hendry see dramatic numbers, Palm Beach needs more

More than half into the month of July and the current rainfall totals are looking more and more encouraging. Recovering from a near-record breaking dry season and a damaging drought, the amount of rainfall that is needed is lacking. It finally looks as if the wet season is finally here in South Florida.

For the Hendry County area, the average rainfall total so far is 4.65 in. What has helped had been the extreme downpours that have been occurring lately. The beginning of July did not post impressive rainfall totals. Around July 7, totals began to rise as storms were more frequent. If rainfall continues in the same pattern for the rest

of the month, Hendry could have a monthly total of 6 - 8 inches. An interesting fact shown in the reports is that 4 in. of the rainfall total occurred during one storm period.

For the Glades County area, the rainfall is very similar to what has been reported in Hendry County. Rainfall did increase in the past two weeks raise the current total to 4.66 in.

Reports are also predicting that 6 - 8 inches will be the total for the Glades County area by the end of the month. The largest amount of rain that was dumped by a single storm period was 1.31 in.

For Palm Beach County, they have reported the largest amount of rainfall of the tri-county area with a current total of 5.73 in. As with Hendry and Glades, the same spike in rainfall can be seen as beginning two weeks ago.

The largest amount of rain that was reported from a storm period was 2.17 in. The forecasted amount of total rainfall for the month is expected to be from 7 - 9 inches of rain.

Parents should take their children to a healthcare provider for an annual "well-child" check-up and to make sure all vaccinations and medical records are in order. Healthy eating, adequate physical activity and good sleep patterns are also instrumental to success in school.

Parents should talk with their children about traveling safely to and from school. This includes planning safe routes for walking or riding a bike, reminding them to stay on the sidewalk, crossing the street only at designated crosswalks, and showing them how to properly wear a bicycle helmet if they are riding a bike to school.

If your child is old enough to start driving a car to school, please remind them of some of the basic rules of the road. Don't be afraid to talk to your teen about safe driving.

Allow them to take Driver's Education if it's offered at their high school. Ask your vehicle insurance company about programs available to teach teens about safe driving tips.

Children in Florida should never have to be without health care. Insurance can improve a child's access to medications and treatment they may need to control childhood illnesses and decrease absences from school. The state of Florida offers KidCare, a health insurance program for children from birth through age 18. Children can be eligible even if one or both parents are working.

Children covered by Florida KidCare are eligible for comprehensive health care, including sports physicals, doctor visits, check-ups, immunizations, surgery, prescriptions, vision and hearing screenings, mental health care, dental check-ups and hospital stays.

Students with access to these and other pre-

ventative health care services are likely to be healthier and perform better in school.

Before you set out on the hike, be sure to check the map located on the interpretive kiosk (located in the middle of the parking lot) to find where key interpretive points are located.

Carry plenty of water, about three or four pints are recommended per hiker, and a snack or a picnic for your family. Also take your binoculars, a cell phone, and camera. Comfortable lightweight hiking boots are recommended. Sunscreen, insect repellent, and a suitable hat are also important.

To enter the trail, continue to the swinging pedestrian gate, located next to the vehicle gate. You are now entering the Fort Center Trail.

The first mile is improved two-track, open trail. A good hat and sunscreen are highly recommended for this section. You will pass three covered kiosks with interpretive boards along this section. A Florida

rain shower might blow along at any time, so the covered kiosks will provide shelter from storms.

You will see the Creek, pasture, cattle, and marsh along the open stretch of the trail. Watch for deer, turkey, birds, raccoons, armadillos, opossum, wild cats, and wild hogs. Especially keep an eye in the skies for graceful, gliding, swallow-tailed kites!

In about another quarter-mile further, you'll reach the hammock area and a fence line. On the other side of the fence line begins a loop trail leading around the hammock to the south, but for today we are staying on the main trail.

In the hammock area, you'll find huge, ancient oak trees, sabal palms, palmetto, and wild citrus trees. The late afternoon sun gives the resurrection ferns and oak limbs an unforgettable glow.

Next, look for two interpretive points located a short distance down the trail, once inside the hammock. On the right, a short trail leads to a view of Fisheating Creek, and an Indian mound.

On the left, a short trail leads to one of the sacred, ancient ceremon-

ial sites located in the hammock area. The entire hammock area has provided cover and protection for hundreds of years to protect this most important archaeological and historical zone.

The two-track, sandy hammock trail leads to another fence line, then it curves to the right. At this point, the loop trail rejoins the main trail. Continue to hike a few hundred more feet until you see the Fort Center sign on the right. Walk to the sign for an unforgettable, breathtaking view of Fisheating Creek and the hammock.

A few more hundred feet to the north marks the end of the official trail. You'll arrive at two picnic tables located under an oak tree. What a perfect place for a snack, picnic lunch, and maybe a short nap!

You might walk just a bit further up the two-track trail to enjoy a view of the vast, open Fisheating Creek marsh. If you walk far enough to clear the hammock line, you'll see a rolling view of Cowbone Marsh to the west. With binoculars, a view of the edge of the Cypress balds located about 7 miles to the west should be visible.

Fisheating Creek winds a total of 12 miles across this side of the Fisheating Creek Wildlife Management Area, between Rt. 78 and the western edge of Cowbone Marsh.

Allow plenty of time to return before darkness. Depending on your hiking speed, and stops along the way, your hike should take about an hour to two hours to reach Fort Center.

You can hike, walk, run, and ride bicycles on the Fort Center Trail. Primitive camping is allowed anywhere on the Fisheating Creek Wildlife Management Area. Make sure you park in the 2nd lot located next to the fence, and leave a note on your windshield with contact information and your camping location.

No weapons or hunting allowed in this part of the WMA. Fishing is legal with a proper Florida freshwater license, so you might take a fishing pole, and try your luck.

Overall, including the return trip, the Fort Center hike is about 4.8 miles in length overall. Next time, we'll add the loop trail around the hammock area.

Enjoy the Fort Center Trail!

Things Happen

We live in a wonderful world, but things happen. And when they do, sometimes we're the bug, and sometimes we're the windshield.

One night Taylor watched a huge female turtle heave herself up the beach to dig her nest and lay her eggs into the sand. The next day while trying to find the nest, Taylor found tracks showing the female turtle had gotten confused and headed into the dunes away from the sea.

Following the trail, Taylor found the turtle exhausted and all but baked. After pouring water on her, Taylor fetched a park ranger. The ranger flipped the turtle over on her back, wrapped tire chains around her front legs, and took off in his jeep, dragging the turtle over the dunes and down onto the beach.

At the ocean's edge, he unhooked her and turned her right side up again.

The poor turtle lay motionless in the surf for a while. As waves broke over her, she lifted her head slightly, moving her back legs as she did, until one of the waves made her light enough to find a foothold and push off, back into the water that was her home.

Watching her swim slowly away and remembering her nightmare ride through the dunes, Taylor noted that it's sometimes hard to tell whether we are being harmed or saved by the hands that turn our world upside down to help us.

It reminds me of a story about a little bird who didn't fly south soon enough for the winter. It wound up on the ground, slowly freezing to death. When things looked really dim, a cow happened by and dropped a big warm cow pie on the little bird.

The warmth of the cow pie revived the little bird, who felt so good he stuck his head out and began to sing. A fox coming by heard the singing and snatched the little bird up and swallowed him.

The moral of the story is that everyone who dumps on us isn't necessarily our enemy, and everyone who pulls us out of the manure we find ourselves in isn't necessarily our friend.

Finding Faith in Strange Places; Like My Driveway

One lady mentioned being stuck one day on a freeway. Traffic was crawling and no headway was being made. As she looked down, there was a blade of grass growing from between the cracks in the asphalt. She didn't see it when traffic was moving at 60 miles per hour, but there it was!

I recalled grass growing up from the cracks in my own driveway and reflected about what I was seeing too.

The grass in my yard has all of the benefits of growing; sunlight and water, soil that is nourished by the elements and opportunities to be fertilized. That grass under the driveway, though, has none of these benefits conducive to life yet it grows anyway.

That grass under my driveway has a lot of tenacity, a lot of drive, it has spirit! The will to live, even under the most difficult conditions imaginable is a lesson that blade of grass shows me. We tear it out, spray it with chemicals but it comes back!

God has implanted it with a faith to seek to

move upward, to seek the light even if it is only a shadow through a crack, to be rooted even if the soil has been "treated" and is never watered, to grow under the poorest of circumstances. Eventually that grass will grow and crack the driveway even more; that's a will power to be reckoned with!

I begin to see what Jesus was saying about having faith like a mustard seed (Luke 17:6ff). If you have it, you can uproot trees or move mountains, or accomplish the impossible. When you have faith, you can do well under the most difficult of circumstances.

Faith, though, is not being manipulative and saying "I believe - so let me get my way." It has to do with the nature of who we are, whom God has made us and are intended to be. The grass is to cover the earth and in its own way knows of its reason for being created.

When human beings do likewise, faith brings fulfillment. We are here to help, to share, to love, to respect, to make peace, to do good when we can; and when we're about why we're made, faith will give us all sorts of power and abilities beyond what we imagined.

Board approved FDOT's \$731,568 contract for resurfacing Williams Rd in Ortona.

7. Use of Impact Fees in Glades County (Taylor)

Board approved Road Sup't Avant Brown's recommendation to utilize \$127,232 West District Road Impact Fees to pave Thatcher Blvd and North Avenue in the City of Moore Haven. Commissioner Storter inquired why the City of Moore Haven has not requested these roads to be paved with their unused \$221,769 in the Transportation Trust fund that can only be used for city streets. She also commented that of the impact fees collected in the West District, 19 were for units west of SR29 in the Muse area and 7 units in the City of Moore Haven.

Board approved R/S Brown's recommendation to use \$158,578 East District Road Impact Fees to enhance the Harney Pond Bridge, coordinating with FDOT to create a safe pedestrian crossing.

Board approved R/S Brown's recommendation to use \$16,734 Parks Impact Fees to enhance Indian Mound Park.

Board acknowledged Public Safety Director Bob Jones recommendation to withhold disbursement of \$8,166 EMS Impact Fees until the determination is made for the construction of a new EMS station between Lakeport and Buckhead Ridge, thus no action was taken at this time. The impact fees must be expended by October 1, 2012.

Board at this time also approved expending

\$6000 from the Boat Ramp Improvement budget to annex a concrete slab ramp next to the existing one at the Buckhead Ridge Community Park.

County Attorney

Pringle stated that at the July night meeting, we will have the option to rescind the current burn ban. He said he is continuing to work on the Curry Island lease with DEP.

County Manager & Department Heads

Public Safety Director Bob Jones stated we have recently had plenty of rain and can safely relax the burn ban.

Commissioners Items And Comments

Commissioner Storter inquired of the time frame for the auditors as they take up much of the Finance Clerk's time and the budget notebook was not available until last week. Mrs. Choban stated new auditors do take more time their first time auditing county records.

Commissioner Storter commented that Commissioner Beck had mentioned last October the possibility of reconstructing the old restroom facility at Harney Pond into a pavilion. Commissioner Beck stated it should not take much to do, and should qualify for use of one-cent discretionary funds for recreation and asked Community Development Director Larry Hilton to examine the facility to determine if corner posts would be suitable to reuse.

Commissioner Giesler thanked Bob Jones, Avant Brown and the Volunteer firemen for their assistance in the park enhancement project at Buckhead Ridge Community Center.

Commissioner Beck thanked Commissioner Jones for willingness to serve on the Value Adjustment Board. Mr. Jones had pointed out (item 3 above) that he has served 12 times in the last 19 years.

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Healthy Back to School Tips for This Year

Tips For Packing Healthy School Lunches

The rush of getting the kids out the door in the morning can make packing a healthy lunch

seem like an impossible burden.

The typical parent will pack around 200 school lunches yearly, and planning them all requires some serious nutritional skills. Not only do parents need to know how to choose healthy fare, but they need to know how to pick foods their kids will actually eat.

"When you plan your child's lunches, be sure to choose items that are both healthy and fun," says Edmond Sanctis, co-founder of Sahale Snacks, a producer of all-natural nuts and nut blends.
