Help plan the future of Fisheating Creek WMA

A 10-year plan for the Fisheating Creek Wildlife Management Area (WMA) will be presented Aug. 1, a Thursday, at a public hearing in Glades County.

People are invited to attend the 7 p.m. public hearing at the Glades County Commission Chambers, 500 Avenue J in Moore Haven.

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) staff will present the draft land management plan for FWC-managed portions of the Fisheating Creek WMA, and people are encouraged to comment and ask questions.

Fisheating Creek WMA is a place full of history and wildlife, as well as outdoor

recreation opportunities. Its Creek Indian name, Thlothlopopka-hatchee, means "the creek where fish are eaten." The first known settlements occurred between 1,000 and 500 B.C., when early inhabitants known as the Belle Glade people built mounds and subsisted by netting fish and harvesting turtles, snakes and alligators.

Today, Fisheating Creek WMA stretches for 40 miles in Glades County along the course of the only free-flowing tributary to Lake Okeechobee. Framed by bald cypress swamps and hardwood hammocks, the tea-colored blackwater creek shows off wild Florida and is critical habitat for native species such as panther, black bear

CCA Moore Haven inmates earn diplomas

A different kind of graduation in Glades County

When Glades County high school seniors walked across the stage to receive their diplomas on June 7, they took a big step toward securing a brighter future for themselves and their families. Recently, another group of students in Glades County took that same walk—only this time, they were inmates at a correctional facility.

Corrections Corporation of America's (CCA) Moore Haven Correctional Facility held a graduation ceremony on June 19. Seven GED and 82 vocational

certificates, for trades that included commercial driver's license (CDL), carpentry, barbering, PC support and nursing management, were awarded to inmates in front of staff and visiting family. The ceremony featured special guest speaker Wenfred D. Dorsey, MA, registered minister and a job coach at the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Department for Lord's Place in West Palm Beach Florida and two inmate graduates who spoke about the benefits of furthering their education.

"Graduations are important in prison: important to inmates to be recognized for an accomplishment, important to their families to acknowledge support, and important to us as staff to under-

During this time she visited many sites in Europe, including Tivoli, in Copenhagen, Denmark, several extraordinary places in Italy including Vienna, Florence, Rome, and the Vatican. The places in the United States where she lived were New Martinsville, WV; Los Angeles, Calif.; and lastly Dublin, Ohio. Carol and Dan were staunch members of the Episcopal church for nearly all their married lives until doctrinal changes caused a permanent split. She was also a group leader and member of the Association of Research and Enlightenment, a spiritual organization based on the readings of Edgar Cayce, also known as the Sleeping Prophet. Carol will be interred at Port Mayaca Memorial Gardens near the site where her dear parents Oda Daniel Carpenter and Ruth Shive Carpenter were buried and not far from where she was born, Pahokee, FL. She was lucky and blessed to have a family that loved her and as important loved each other. Thanks be to our Lord for her life with us.

John B. Boy, 96

LABELLE — John B. Boy, of LaBelle, passed away peacefully July 16, 2013 in Lehigh Acres. He was born Mar. 25, 1917 in Johnson City, Tenn., to David C. and Kathleen Boy and was the second of three brothers.

He graduated from Georgia Tech with a degree in mechanical engineering. During his time at Georgia Tech, John was on the Honor Roll, a member of Omicron Delta Kappa and Tau Beta Pi, Phi Eta Sigma, Bulldog Club, Pi Delta Epsilon, A.S.M.E, Skull and Key, Interfraternity Council, Technique Editor in Chief, Yellowjacket, Blue Print, Student Council, ANAK Vice-President and Athletic Association Student Member.

Following graduation, he worked for Proctor and Gamble at the Buckeye Oil Company until WWII broke out and at that time enlisted in the U. S. Navy. He served our nation throughout the entire war and became the Captain of three different ships - a subchaser, USS C350, a patrolcraft, USS PC613 and destroyer escort, the USS Holton, DE-703. John and his crew from the USS Holton held annual reunions that were filled with great passion and memories of their younger years. While in the Navy on assignment in Miami, John met and married the love of his life, Nancy Adams, who predeceased him.

Shortly after the war, John went to work for United States Sugar Corporation in 1946. Through his engineering ingenuity, he improved the efficiency and productivity of sugar cane harvesting by converting/re-designing track mounted tractors to rubber tires which was combined with his successful redesign of sugar cane loading machines. Those redesigns allowed the Florida sugar cane industry to begin a process of mass production in the fields and factories which ultimately led to the size and efficiency of today's industry.

John later became Executive Vice President of the Corporation in 1961 which led to his promotion to President/CEO in 1970, a position he held until his retirement in 1987. He became Vice-Chairman of the Board of Directors at that time. Under his leadership, the Corporation not only prospered by tripling its production, but he led the way in charitable giving to the surrounding communities of swimming pools, youth centers, an auditorium, day care facilities, housing projects and multiple scholarship programs. Two of his proudest achievements during his tenure as President were the creation of an Employee Stock Ownership Plan whereby the employees would own 47% of the Corporation and the commencement of the diversification of the Corporation into the growing/processing of citrus.

John was the beloved and respected leader of the sugar industry as noted by the numerous accolades that he accumulated and/or achieved during his career which included "Sugar Man of the Year", Florida Agriculture Hall of Fame, Honorary Doctor of Humanities-Florida Atlantic University, "White Hat" award by Agribusiness Institute, President of the Florida Sugar Cane League, President of the Florida Sugar Marketing and Terminal Association, State Director of Florida Chamber of Commerce, Council of 100, Florida Land Council, Florida Farm Bureau, 1975 Citizen of the Year for Clewiston, Florida and Dedication of the Sugar Festival in 1992.

He is survived by daughter, Betsy Terrill (Jim); sons, John Boy, Jr. (Connie) and H. Lane Boy; grandchildren, Jamie Terrill, Christopher Smith, Jennifer Price, Suzanne Boy, Stephanie Crawford, Rachael Boy; and ten great-grandchildren.

Visitation was held Thursday, July 18, 2013 from 6-8 p.m. at Akin-Davis Funeral Home in Clewiston, Florida.

The Funeral Service was held Friday, July 19, 2013, 11:00 a.m. at Evangel Assembly of God, Clewiston, Florida with Rev. Samuel Thomas Ph.D. officiating.

The Hidden Costs of Owning a Pet

America is a nation of pet lovers. About half the nation's households include a dog or a cat, and they spend \$53 billion yearly on pet expenses, ranging from food to vet bills to toys.

Some go a bit overboard. A whopping \$370 million is spent on pet costumes yearly. But even more shocking is the toll our animals take on our electronics budget. American pets have bitten, chewed, licked and otherwise damaged over eight million electronic devices, amounting to over \$3 billion in repair and replacement costs.

Considering that one of every three devices damaged by pets is a smartphone, this could mean up to \$800 in replacement costs whenever your animal runs amok.

The risk of pet-related accidents increases the more pets are treated as family members. According to new research from SquareTrade, if you drive with your pet in your lap, you're over twice as likely to damage your device. And letting a pet sleep in bed with you triples your chances.

Meanwhile, giving your pet too much independence can also increase risk. Two-thirds of

pet-related accidents involving devices happened while the pet was unsupervised.

Accidental Personalities: Every furry friend comes with its own unique personality, and unique set of dangers.

For example, the SquareTrade study found that 21 percent of accidents happened while the owner was using the device.

A temperamental personality can also be a red flag - 17 percent of pet owners

believe their animal friend damaged their device because it was angry with them.

And homes with different pet species are more susceptible to mishaps. Those with both a cat and dog are four times more likely to have accidents with electronics compared to homes with one or the other.


Fido Protection: Despite the growing popu-



larity of pet insurance, many owners don't realize this kind of insurance doesn't cover damage caused by their pets. In fact, three out of four devices damaged were not covered by any kind of warranty.

While there's no sure way to prevent pet-related accidents, consumers can protect themselves by getting a protection plan. For example, some protection plans cover against accidents, like a device getting batted off the kitchen counter, falling in a water bowl or finding its way into the wrong paws. They also cover mechanical and electrical issues, like antennae and Wi-Fi failure, a broken dock connector, or touch-screen failure.

Pets all need exercise, training and attention from their owners, but they sometimes find inconvenient ways to show us.



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Minimizing CWD Risk in Florida

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) will hold a public meeting Aug. 8 in Gainesville to discuss possible options for minimizing the risk of chronic wasting disease (CWD) coming into Florida.

The meeting is at the Paramount Plaza Hotel, 2900 S.W. 13th Street, Ballroom A/B, from 6:30-8:30 p.m. and is open to the public.

CWD is not known to affect people but is a contagious neurological disease affecting deer, elk and moose. The disease is always fatal, and there is no known cure or vaccine. So far, the disease has been discovered in 22 states, two Canadian provinces and South Korea.

The meeting will begin with a presentation by Commission staff on the significance of CWD and will include a discussion on possible solutions for minimizing the risk of the disease being brought into the state. 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Inland Birding Fun: Great Crested Flycatcher

Great Crested Flycatchers breed throughout the Central and Eastern United States, as well as Southern Canada.

They winter in humid forests from Mexico to Northern South America and from Central Florida to Cuba.

In Florida they arrive on their breeding grounds in late March or early April and migrate south between mid-August to the middle of October.

This medium-sized songbird is a large sturdy built flycatcher with a bright yellow belly. It has a cinnamon-colored tail and wings, pale wingbars and a large, broad-based, dark bill. Immature birds quickly molt into adult-like plumage. When resting they will tilt their head to one side inquisitively.

Great Crested Flycatchers are more often heard than seen. They make the same far-carrying "wee-eeep" calls on their breeding and wintering grounds. This species also makes a noisy grating call.

These birds prefer living in open areas in woodlands, old orchards and urban areas with large shade trees. They are often seen hovering around in the top of the canopy foraging for insects and other invertebrates, or picking small fruit.

They catch flying insects, glean insects off of leaves and will drop down from trees to take their prey on the ground. They prefer to fly from place to place on the ground instead of walking.

Their nests are found in natural cavities, nest boxes or other structures, such as mail boxes or rain gutters. These nest cavities are usually filled with leaf litter, hair, feathers, small twigs and trash, which are piled to the top of the cavity hole.

Many of the nests contain snakeskin or crinkly materials, such as cellophane, plastic wrappers or onion skin.

Egg laying in Florida usually takes place in April, May or June.

The female will lay three to eight creamy white to pinkish-brown streaked eggs, which are incubated for 13 to 17 days.

The young are born helpless, but are covered with some down.

Both parents care for the young, defend the nest vigorously from predators and will remove the fecal sacs.

The nestlings fledge when they are 13 to 17 days old, but remain with their parents in the nesting area for about three weeks.

Great Crested Flycatchers are being reported nesting near homes, in parks and wooded areas in inland Florida. Listen for their loud calls or find them watching quietly from exposed perches.

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

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Gas Price Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have risen 6.0 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.61/g Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 8,237 gas outlets in Florida.

This compares with the national average that has increased 3.2 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.68/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 22.2 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 12.1 cents per gallon higher than a month ago.

The national average has increased 9.9 cents

per gallon during the last month and stands 19.0 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"The national average has seen the upward trend continuing, with average prices climbing across an abundance of the U.S.," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "The price of WTI oil continues to rise to levels not seen in quite some time, and that may continue, at least for the time being, to put more upward pressure on gasoline prices. While the worst may be behind us, I do believe the week ahead will likely feature another rise in the national average," DeHaan said.



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Age is only a number, says boxer Julius Bishop

He played high school football under the tutelage of coach Steve Petty with the Moore Haven Terriers. He was a forward on the basketball team and ran track. He did hurdles and triple long jumps. Two of his favorite teachers were Janice Brown and Wayne Reese. Who is he?

Julius Bishop, that's who! At 48 years young, this tall, muscular man who grew up in Moore Haven has returned. Although he has been married nearly one-half of his adult life, he isn't real happy with the term, "middle aged." The title of "Mr." isn't his favorite either so he decided to make some changes in his life that will dispel these typical characterizations.

With the help of close friends like his mentors Larry Cohens, a certified weightlifting trainer with the Seminole Tribe, and James Ball, Edward Smith of Clewiston, a boxing trainer, and boxing coaches Louis and Pappy, he stays motivated. "A few years ago, Larry and I were like the dynamic duo in weight lifting," said Mr. Bishop. "He's somewhat older than I am, too."

Mr. Bishop has trained and competed for the past 11 years in Tough Man competitions. He does most of his training in Okeechobee. The matches consist of Mixed Martial Arts (MMA) such as kick boxing, regular boxing, and jujitsu also called grappling. Jujitsu is similar to wrestling but without punches, and instead of being sent to the ground, the contestant goes into submissions.

At 6 ft. 2 inches tall, and weighing 230 lbs. and with upper arms the size of hams, he is a formidable figure. His training consists of lots of fancy footwork, lifting weights, and learning to punch, or throw a "striker," also called a good punch. He does a lot of cardio exercises that include running, and he is required to have a physical exam every six months.

"I haven't had a broken nose, but I ended one match with a cracked jawbone," he said. "You learn to dance around so you don't get your face hit. You have to protect yourself." He looks somewhat sheepish when asked about what type of healthy diet he follows. "Sometimes I eat whatever I want, but lately I am trying to eat a healthier diet." His advice for a successful training program in addition to having great coaches is to mix up the martial arts. "It's best to learn it all," he advised.

He never gets angry with a competitor. Instead he thoroughly enjoys the competition.

"I don't get mad if I lose. This isn't easy but if you're good at it, you make it look easy," he said. He regrets not staying with the sport throughout his youth.

"We were too young to know we could one day go professional or get paid. I think it is a great career for young people," he said. It helps combat aggression especially if a child has a good coach. It is a great protector for self-defense also. Parents should start getting their children interested around the age of five," he advised. He has toyed with the idea of starting a gym in Moore Haven but until he decides exactly where he wants to reside, it is a distant dream. Locally, only Big Cypress has a martial arts program.

He smiles most of the time and speaks softly and passionately when he talks about his two children, Julius, Jr. and Jumetrius, his one son who is interested in martial arts.

He is quick to give compliments to all who have helped him throughout his life. In 2004, Mr. Bishop's left arm was badly injured resulting in much nerve damage and an aneurysm. He gives much credit for his complete recovery to his surgeon, Dr. Sandra Collins and her staff in Ft. Myers. "I want them to come to one of my fights, so

they can see what they and I have accomplished," he said.

Another who has become part of his group of admired friends, and a local sponsor is Mary Ann Martin, owner of the popular Roland Martin Marina in Clewiston where Mr. Bishop was employed. "I've known him for 10 years. He has muscles as big as his heart. I would not want to feel one of his knock-out punches," she said.

"Her presence in the audience gives me encouragement and makes me feel proud," he said.

Part of his future plan is to turn professional in September. This requires participating in at least five fights. To date he has had

four wins and two losses. He missed winning the Heavyweight Belt at the Immokalee Casino due to a split decision. In Punta Gorda this year he won his first Kick Boxing match but it wasn't a title match. Currently he is training for a Super Heavyweight title. His first match was in Immokalee against a 293 lb. Super Heavyweight champ. "He just wore me down and then gave me a slam," he said. "I am determined to win."

These exciting matches can be viewed at the Immokalee Casino approximately every two months.

Jobless rate up in June

Jobless rates were up all over in June as the Florida rate jumped from 7 percent to 7.4 percent and the nations went up from 7.3 to 7.8 percent according to the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, local area unemployment statistics program.

Glades County's jobless rate rose from 7.7 to 8.6 percent in June. Glades reported 425 residents collected benefits last month.

Okeechobee County saw an increase from 8.0 to 8.8 percent. There were 1,633

residents who collected benefits last month compared to 1,493 in May.

Glades ranked 12th among the 67 counties in Florida. Okeechobee ranked 10th.

Around the region, Martin County had 7.7 percent, St. Lucie County had 10.1 percent, Palm Beach County had 7.5 percent, Hendry County 13.5 percent, Highlands County 8.2 percent, Indian River 9.3 percent, and Osceola County 7.4 percent in June.

Hendry County had the highest jobless rate. Monroe County had the lowest at 4.1 percent.

New Moore Haven High School construction under way

There are many changes on the way for MHHS, starting with the campus plan for this school year. With construction of the new school starting there will be several changes to traffic flow, bus pickup/drop off, parking and arrival at school for car riding students for both MHHS and MHES. A detailed plan of these changes will be available prior to the start of the school year.

Securing funding for the new MHHS project was not an easy task and the Glades County School District had many supporters

On Aug. 8 at 5 p.m., Senators Galvano and Grimsley along with Representative Pigman will be at the school district office for a check presentation for the first installment of the \$23.6 million for construction. If there are none, the petition must so indicate; (e) A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action; (f) A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action including an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes; and, (g) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action. A petition that does not dispute the material facts upon which the Permitting Authority's action is based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise shall contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that the Permitting Authority's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this Public Notice of Intent to Issue Air Permit. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the Permitting Authority on the application have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

Mediation: Mediation is not available for this proceeding.
Objections: Finally, pursuant to 42 United States Code (U.S.C.) Section 7661d(b)(2), any person may petition the Administrator of the EPA within 60 days of the expiration of the Administrator's 45-day review period as established at 42 U.S.C. Section 7661d(b)(1), to object to the issuance of any Title V air operation permit. Any petition shall be based only on objections to the Permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the 30-day public comment period provided in the Public Notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates to the Administrator of the EPA that it was impracticable to raise such objections within the comment period or unless the grounds for such objection arose after the comment period. Filing of a petition with the Administrator of the EPA does not stay the effective date of any permit properly issued pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 62-213, F.A.C. Petitions filed with the Administrator of EPA must meet the requirements of 42 U.S.C. Section 7661d(b)(2) and must be filed with the Administrator of the EPA at: U.S. EPA, 401 M Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20460. "Receipt of written notice of agency decision" means receipt of either written notice through mail, or electronic mail, or posting that the District has or intends to take final agency action, or publication of notice that the District has or intends to take final agency action. 4. A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the SFWMD's decision.
5. A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate.
6. A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
7. A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
8. If disputed issues of material fact exist, the statement must also include an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes.
9. A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the SFWMD to take with respect to the SFWMD's proposed action.

A person may file a request for an extension of time for filing a petition. The SFWMD may, for good cause, grant the request. Requests for extension of time must be filed with the SFWMD prior to the deadline for filing a petition for hearing. Such requests for extension shall contain a certificate that the moving party has consulted with all other parties concerning the extension and that the SFWMD and any other parties agree to or oppose the extension. A timely request for extension of time shall toll the running of the time period for filing a petition until the request is acted upon.

If the District takes action with substantially different impacts on water resources from the notice of intended agency decision, the persons who may be substantially affected shall have an additional point of entry pursuant to Rule 28-106.111, Fla. Admin. Code, unless otherwise provided by law.

Mediation

The procedures for pursuing mediation are set forth in Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., and Rules 28-106.111 and 28-106.401-405, Fla. Admin. Code. The SFWMD is not proposing mediation for this agency action under Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., at this time.

RIGHT TO SEEK JUDICIAL REVIEW

Pursuant to Sections 120.60(3) and 120.68, Fla. Stat., a party who is adversely affected by final SFWMD action may seek judicial review of the SFWMD's final decision by filing a notice of appeal pursuant to Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.110 in the Fourth District Court of Appeal or in the appellate district where a party resides and filing a second copy of the notice with the SFWMD Clerk within 30 days of rendering of the final SFWMD action.

and swallowtail kite.

People come to Fisheating Creek WMA to paddle canoes or kayaks, watch wildlife, camp, hunt and fish. This is a place where hunters have a good chance of harvesting a prized Osceola turkey.

"Fisheating Creek WMA was purchased in order to ensure the preservation of fish and wildlife resources, other natural and

cultural resources, and for fish and wildlife-based public outdoor recreation," said Rebecca Shelton, FWC land conservation biologist. "This draft plan will specify how we intend to do that."

All lands purchased with public funds must have a management plan that ensures the property will be managed in a manner that is consistent with the intended purposes of the purchase.

Hunting and fishing regulations are not included in this plan or meeting; those are addressed through a separate public pro-

cess.

score how significant our work is," said Warden Laura Bedard. "It's all about changing lives."

CCA's Moore Haven Correctional Facility, in partnership with the State of Florida, offers inmates a variety of educational and vocational programming, including college correspondence courses. The facility also has several inmates who are furthering their

education through Stratford Career Institute, Ashworth College, LSU and Ohio University.

Studies have shown that GEDs are at the very top of programs that reduce recidivism. According to the National Correctional Education Association, inmates who earn a GED are 25 percent less likely to reoffend. Inmate graduates also have a higher likelihood of finding meaningful, full-time employment upon release, another factor that cuts recidivism rates. In 2011 alone, nearly 3,000 inmates received their GEDs at a CCA facility.

"The educational staff, including inmate teaching assistants, went out of their way

to give focused individual instruction in the areas I needed the most help with. Thanks to them I was able to quickly complete the program and pass the GED test," said inmate David Denneen, who received his GED. "I am impressed with the educational department and program at the Moore Haven Correctional Facility."

Moore Haven Correctional Facility's inmates join the rest of Florida's accomplished graduates as they celebrate their successes and look toward the opportunities to come.



Generic Prayers ... or Something Else?

Naiman was a commander for the King of Aram (2 Kings 5ff). He did great things for the king, but he suffered from leprosy.

Needless to say, the king was worried about his "valiant soldier" and wanted things to be better for him. A slave girl that served Naiman's wife told her about seeing the prophet Elisha in Samaria. Out of desperation, Naiman tells his king about the possibility of being healed.

The story goes on: The King of Aram asks a favor from the King of Israel, but the latter is fearful. He remarks, "Am I God?" Nevertheless, when Elisha hears of his king's plight, he says, "Have the man come to me and he will know there is a prophet in Israel." Elisha is obviously a man of faith and not daunted by the difficulty of the situation. Naiman shows up at Elisha's house, complete with chariots, horses and contingent. Elisha sends out a messenger to say, "Go and wash in the Jordan seven times ... (v. 10)," and Naiman is

incensed. He talks about better rivers back home, surely the prophet would come out and wave his hand over him, but no, he sends only a messenger. Naiman's servants get hold of him and convince him to do what the prophet bids him to do.

He does it and he is healed. That is the story of many of us. We expect God to act in a certain way for us, but God chooses otherwise. We are anticipating what God should do and He goes and does something else. We call upon Him when our other "gods" let us down, and we don't like the answer.

I see God at work in strange ways sometimes, but He's in there working even if I don't always understand, or things aren't going as I think they ought to go.

That's something I've come to believe and

know. Elisha speaks for the God he knows and doesn't pull any punches. He tells his king, "Have the man come to me ..." and Naiman shows up.

Elisha is a man of faith in spite of the wrangling between kings, or the political ramifications of "what if we fail" or the trying to second guess the powers that be.

He will pray. He has faith his prayers will be answered, and his prayers were answered. Today, I've seen a lot of pray-ers who attempt to be "politically correct" and not offend anyone with their prayers, to try to be all-inclusive lest someone not like their offerings. I believe that when someone calls upon me to pray, they want me to use prayers that speak to the God I know and who will act. I am not denigrating the prayers of others. They do the same thing and I respect their invoking God

as they understand Him. At one level, I believe we all offer such prayers. Elisha no doubt knew there were gods in Aram, but was called upon because of his faith in the God he knew.

That worked and continues to work. I do the same when I call upon someone for any kind of help or offering. Trusting that he is doing the best within his own sphere of activity, profession or vocation. I expect him to offer me the best he has to give as he understands it, taking my needs into consideration but understanding I call upon him because he has something to offer.

In the meantime and in the tradition of Elisha and so many, many others, let us offer our best: that we contribute to the breadth and depths of the traditions of faith, with all of the richness and variety that may add to our understanding.
