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Lady Terriers head to state finals

The Moore Haven Lady Terriers clinched the regional finals Friday night against St. Pete Christian Barron's, 18-10.

The Lady Terriers will advance to play for the state championship title. This is only the second time in school history that the fast pitch girls softball team has advanced to state. The first time was in 2009.

The state championship will be played in Vero Beach. Semifinals will be on Friday, May 9, at 2:20 p.m. against Carlwood. If the Lady Terriers advance, they will play on Saturday, May 10.

As the Lady Terriers took the field for the regional finals, you could feel the excitement in the air. The bleachers were packed full of fans, and chairs were crowded along the fence.

Jacqueline Phares, the starting pitcher for the Lady Terriers, didn't disappoint the fans. She started the game off with a bang by striking the first two batters out. The top of the inning was quickly over with no score from the opposing team. The Lady Terriers took advantage of mistakes made by St. Pete and scored six runs on three errors, two walks and two hits in the bottom of the first. Lexi Story #27, and Kalgary #33, Johns both led the inning by hitting singles with Kalgary also getting an RBI. The second and third innings were both a draw with neither team scoring any runs.

In the top of the fourth, the Lady Terriers seemed to be falling apart with five errors, four walks and three hits allowing the St. Pete Christian Barrons to score 10 runs. Coach Pedro Navarro realized that Jacqueline was struggling, and so he brought Olivia Everett in to pitch.

"I never lost confidence in the girls," Navarro said. "We have never trailed this early in the game, and it was good for the team to pull themselves out of a hole. I wish some of the fans had the same confidence in the Lady Terriers that myself and the coaching staff have in them. The confidence that we have in these girls was proven correct in the

Inland Birding: Cattle Egret

The Cattle Egret has many common names, including cow crane, cow bird or cow heron.

This bird emigrated from Africa to South America, then to Florida. It was first reported in Florida in Clewiston in 1941 or 1942 (Florida Breeding Bird Atlas).

By 1960 it had been reported throughout the state and has had a spectacular range expansion.

This medium-sized, stocky, white heron has a sturdy, yellow bill, swollen throat, hunched posture and thick neck. Breeding adults develop orange-buff feathers.

Cattle Egrets are more at home foraging in grass than in water. They follow cattle, horses and tractors to catch the insects that are stirred up. Cattle Egret's eyes are positioned for binocular vision during feeding. While at the breeding colony, this species gives a quiet, throaty "rick-rick" call, but otherwise it is largely silent.

They usually nest in colonies with other wader species. Their nest, a small untidy platform of sticks in a tree or shrub, is constructed by both parents who share incubation duties for their clutch of two to five blue-green eggs.

The eggs hatch in about 23 days. The chicks are born covered with down and are fully feathered in 13-21 days. They fledge at about 30 days and become independent at about the 45th day.

SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans Available

Announcement following Secretary of Agriculture Disaster Declaration

U.S. SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced that federal economic injury disaster loans are available to small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private non-profit organizations of all sizes located in Florida as a result of freeze and frost on Jan. 7 to 31, 2014.

The disaster declaration includes the following counties: Alachua, Baker, Bay, Bradford, Broward, Clay, Columbia, Duval, Gilchrist, Glades, Hendry, Holmes, Levy, Marion, Martin, Nassau, Okaloosa, Okeechobee, Palm Beach, Putnam, Santa Rosa, Union, Walton and Washington in Florida.

"When the Secretary of Agriculture issues a disaster declaration to help farmers recover from damages and losses to crops, the Small Business Administration issues a declaration to eligible entities affected by the same disaster," said Frank Skaggs, director of SBA's Field Operations Center East in Atlanta.

Under this declaration, the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program is available to eligible farm-related and nonfarm-related entities that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. With the exception of aquaculture enterprises, SBA cannot provide disaster loans to agricultural producers, farmers or ranchers.

The loan amount can be up to \$2 million

with interest rates of 2.625 percent for private non-profit organizations of all sizes and four percent for small businesses, with terms up to 30 years. The SBA determines eligibility based on the size of the applicant, type of activity and its financial resources.

Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition. These working capital loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that could have been paid had the disaster not occurred. The loans are not intended to replace lost sales or profits.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure website at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.

Disaster loan information and application forms may also be obtained by calling the SBA's Customer Service Center at 800-659-2955 (800-877-8339 for the deaf and hard-of-hearing) or by sending an email to disastercustomerservice@sba.gov. Loan applications can be downloaded from www.sba.gov/disaster. Completed applications should be mailed to: U.S. Small Business Administration, Processing and Disbursement Center, 14925 Kingsport Road, Fort Worth, TX 76155. Completed loan applications must be returned to SBA no later than December 16.

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U.S. Sugar Producers File Antidumping, Subsidy Cases Against Mexico

America's sugar producers on March 28, asked the United States government to take corrective action against Mexico's sugar industry for dumping subsidized sugar onto the U.S. market and inflicting harm on U.S. growers and taxpayers.

The antidumping and countervailing duty petitions filed with the U.S. International Trade Commission and U.S. Department of Commerce allege that the Mexican industry has shipped sugar to the United States at dumping margins of 45 percent or more and has received substantial subsidies from Mexican federal and state governments.

All told, these actions will cost U.S. sugar producers nearly \$1 billion in net income for the 2013/2014 crop year, according to the filings.

The North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) "gives Mexico the right to export sugar to the United States on a tariff-free and quota-free basis—but that does not give the Mexican industry the right to export its surplus to the U.S. market at dumped prices, nor does it permit the [Mexican government] to subsidize its sugar industry without regard to the impact of those subsidies on U.S. producers," the petitions read.

The Mexican sugar industry—20 percent of which is owned and operated by the Mexican government—has rapidly increased exports to the United States in recent years, rising from nine

percent of the U.S. market in 2011/2012 to nearly 18 percent in 2012/2013. Over that same period, Mexico's historic surpluses have sent U.S. sugar prices to unsustainable low levels.

U.S. prices have been cut in half since late 2011 and are now trading at the same lows of the 1980s. U.S. sugar policy also incurred a taxpayer cost in 2013, after running at no cost for the past 10 years, as the U.S. Department of Agriculture

ing flood of dumped and subsidized sugar from Mexico has overwhelmed the U.S. market and USDA's efforts, and we've been left with no alternative but to file these cases."

Hayes noted that this is now a legal dispute and that the facts are straightforward.

"The Mexican sugar industry exported dumped and subsidized sugar to the United States, and as a result, it caused tremendous

business.

If U.S. producers are harmed, these laws permit duties to be imposed on the imported products that benefit from subsidies or are sold below fair market prices—that is, sold at a price that is lower than the foreign producer's cost of production or the price they charge in their home market.

"We are more efficient than Mexico's sugar industry and can compete with anyone in a free market," Hayes added, "but it is hard for U.S. farmers to succeed when a subsidized industry that is largely government-controlled is dumping its product."

NAFTA explicitly permits the filing of antidumping and countervailing duty cases, and NAFTA countries have filed 114 antidumping and countervailing duty cases against each other since the trade deal went into effect. Of these 114 cases, Mexico has filed 31 cases against the United States, and the United States has filed 30 cases against Mexico, not counting the pending sugar petitions.

The sugar producers' petitions were officially filed by the American Sugar Coalition, which includes: American Sugarbeet Growers Association; American Sugar Cane League; American Sugar Refining, Inc.; Florida Sugar Cane League; Hawaiian Commercial and Sugar Company; Rio Grande Valley Sugar Growers, Inc.; Sugar Cane Growers Cooperative of Florida; and United States Beet Sugar Association.

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May is Women's Health Month

Common women's diseases and how to prevent them by living healthier

Did you know that May is recognized as Women's Health Month? When women are fulfilling the role of caregiver to children, spouses and parents, they often forget to take care of themselves. Here are some key facts and information regarding women's health.

Heart Disease

Heart disease is responsible for about 29 percent of deaths in women, according to the Center for Disease Control (CDC).

Many women do not realize they are suffering from heart disease, even though they may show symptoms. Some of those symptoms include being out of breath or not being able to walk up one flight of stairs. Although more men die of heart disease than women, females tend to be under-diagnosed, often to the point that it's too late to help them once the condition is discovered. Women can reduce their risk of heart disease by modifying their lifestyles to include well-balanced diets and exercise.

The American Heart Association lists risk factors for heart disease as:

- Increasing age
- Smoking
- High blood cholesterol
- High blood pressure
- Physical inactivity
- Obesity and being overweight
- Diabetes

Breast Cancer

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women. It is second to lung cancer as the leading cause of death for women.

Experts say the fear of breast cancer can sometimes be exaggerated, stopping women from going to their doctors for screening, or pushing women to make rash decisions about mastectomies, when they may not be necessary.

The American Cancer Society lists the following as risk factors for breast cancer:

- Increasing age
- Genes. Nearly five percent to 10 percent of breast cancer is linked to mutations in certain genes
- Family history of the disease
- Personal history of the disease
- Race. White women have a slightly greater risk of getting breast cancer compared with African-American women. Yet African-Americans have a greater chance of dying from this disease.
- Early onset of menstruation (before age 12) or menopause after age 55
- Not having children
- Too much alcohol
- Poor diet
- Obesity

Stephen F. Sener, MD, president of the American Cancer Society, recommends controlling your weight, exercising, quitting smoking and talking to your doctor about your risk and appropriate screening for breast cancer.

He also says to keep risk factors in perspective. "Just because your mother didn't have breast cancer, it does not mean you are immune to this problem," says Sener.

At the same time, it's also important to note that some women who have one or more risk factors never get breast cancer.

Osteoporosis

Hunched backs, back pain and frailty used to be things older women had to accept before doctors knew anything more about osteoporosis. Now, there are steps women and girls can take to avoid such problems. Osteoporosis threatens 44 million Americans, of which 68 percent are women, reports the National Osteoporosis Foundation. Osteoporosis is largely preventable. The behaviors that women develop in their childhood, in their adolescence and in their early adult years really play a significant role in the development of the disease. That's because bodies build up most of bone mass until age 30. Then new bone stops forming and the focus is then on maintenance of old bone. It is never too late to keep bones strong and avoid fractures. Your body will do what it can to repair bone damage, but you have to provide the tools for it, such as adequate calcium consumption and weight-bearing physical activity. Talk to your doctor about your possible risk of osteoporosis, and what you can do to prevent problems.

Risk factors for osteoporosis include:

- Increasing age
- Small, thin-boned frame
- Ethnicity. White and Asian women have the greatest risk
- Family history
- Sex hormones
- Anorexia
- Diet low in calcium and vitamin D
- Sedentary lifestyle
- Smoking
- Excessive alcohol

Depression

Depression appears to affect more women than men. The National Institute of Mental Health reports that about 12 million women are affected by a depressive disorder each year compared to about six million men.

Dorree Lynn, PhD, a psychologist and author of *Getting Sane Without Going Crazy*, says women need a connection with others in their lives. "They need that sustenance," says Lynn. "If they don't have it, they tend to get depressed."

Sometimes, hormonal changes can also trigger the condition, particularly after pregnancy (postpartum) or around menopause.

Other risk factors for depression include:

- Family history of depression
- History of heart problems
- Serious chronic illness
- Marital problems
- Substance abuse
- Use of drugs that could trigger depression, such as medicines for high blood pressure or seizures
- A stressful life event, such as job loss or death
- Diseases that could trigger depression, such as anemia and thyroid disease
- Recent serious illness or surgery
- Childhood history of physical or sexual abuse
- Being a worrier or being overly anxious
- Having an eating disorder or an anxiety disorder

To help reduce risk of depression, find reasons to get up in the morning. Things such as work, community, love, pets and volunteering can be good reasons.

Big O still among top 10 rankings by Bassmaster

Bassmaster's 100 Best Bass Lakes Of 2014 announced

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — Bassmaster Magazine's third annual ranking of America's best bass fisheries has been announced, and there is a new champion. Lake Michigan's Sturgeon Bay beat out the hottest fisheries in the U.S. to take the No. 1 spot for 2014. Texas and California tied for the states with the most entries on the list; both have eight lakes ranked in the Top 100. Some stalwart lakes fell out of the rankings completely, new lakes were added, and Lake St. Clair, last year's No. 1, fell out of the Top 15.

Months of research, catch-rate data and countrywide polling by the publication's staff created the ultimate bucket list for anglers looking to fish the most productive waters in the nation.

Lake Okeechobee was ranked #6, and the review praised the Big O: “The Big O is in the middle of an upswing right now, which puts it squarely in the race for the best

bass lake on the planet. Recent tournament weights haven't been the highest we've seen on this south Florida fishery, but the bass are still there and still as big as ever. Thirty-plus-pound limits are still being weighed in consistently, and fish more than 10 pounds are not unusual. Plus, there is something about flipping grass on this historic body of water that elevates your level of anticipation. The size of this fishery hinders its production as it can take a while for an inexperienced angler to dial in the bite. But once you unravel the secrets of the Big O, you'll think it should have been rated much higher than sixth on this list.”

The ranking is a little better than last year when it was ranked #8. In 2012, BassMaster ranked Lake Okeechobee as the #2 bass fishing lake in the nation.

Other Florida fisheries ranked in the top 100 included the Kissimmee Chain of Lakes at #21 and the St. Johns River at #48.

“The Bassmaster 100 Best Bass Lakes project spawned from our desire to not only identify traditionally good bass fisheries, but

also to spotlight lakes that are red hot right now,” says Bassmaster Editor James Hall. “Our goal is to make the annual rankings as objective as possible by using the most current data available from state wildlife agencies, current tournament data and expansive polling of the B.A.S.S. membership.”

This year, Bassmaster not only asked each state's wildlife department to list their best lakes, but also asked the department to rank the lakes and offer reasons for each ranking. All the B.A.S.S. Nation presidents and conservation directors ranked the lakes they frequent as well. And to make sure no lakes were overlooked, the 580,000-plus Facebook fans of B.A.S.S., as well as a 3,500-member panel of avid anglers, chimed in.

“Our master list included more than 180 great bass fisheries. Once we had this foundation, the real work began,” Hall says.

Phone calls to area guides, Internet research and angler interviews brought the cream to the top. After identifying the Top 100 fisheries, the rankings were sorted by a blue-ribbon panel, including bass pros, out-

door writers and fishing industry insiders.

Although many rankings were debated by the panel, the top spot was not. “Sturgeon Bay is absolutely on fire right now. It is beautiful. The smallmouth here are giant — nobody even blinks at 6-pounders. And it's not unusual for an angler to catch 60 bass per day. That's what it takes to be named America's best bass fishery,” Hall says.

Lake Amistad, once ranked in the Top 10 on this list, no longer makes the cut. “We aren't sure what's to blame for Amistad's poor production lately, but this typically awesome fishery is struggling right now,” Hall explains.

Although several new lakes are now ranked in the Top 100, California's New Melones Lake made the biggest splash among the newcomers, earning an inaugural ranking of 51.

“This lake has become a world-class spotted bass fishery, and the current pending world record spotted bass caught there in March (10.48 pounds) puts an exclamation mark on that statement,” Hall says.

- Thai Massage aligns the energies of the body using gentle pressure on specific points. Thai massage also includes compressions and stretches. The therapist moves and stretches you into a sequence of postures. Thai massage is more energizing than other forms of massage. It is also reduces stress and improves flexibility and range of motion.

- Reflexology is sometimes called foot massage, but it involves more than the feet. Reflexology involves applying pressure to certain points on the foot that correspond to organs and systems in the body. 

bottom of the fifth when the girls rallied and scored nine runs, bringing the score to 16-10."

Assistant coach James Story said he didn't have any doubts about the Lady Terriers giving up when they got behind. He said, "I saw when the girls came off the field that they were ready to fight."

The Lady Terriers didn't disappoint their coaching staff when they rallied in the bottom of the fifth.

First to bat was #32, Sydnee Cypress who smashed the ball out to centerfield for a triple. The next two batters, #33 Kalgary Johns and #00 Alaina Lee both walked. Olivia Everett #1, was next to bat. She almost knocked the yellow off the ball, sending it out to right centerfield for a triple bringing Cypress, Johns, and Lee in to score.

The crowd was on their feet cheering as Everett's RBIs brought the score to 11-10. You could feel the momentum change as the girls were running in and the crowd was going wild. Lexi Story #27, was next to bat and hit a fly ball out to left field, getting the Terriers first out, but getting an RBI by bringing Everett in to score bringing the score to 12-10. Jacqueline Phares #13, walked, and then #18, Jessi Osceola crushed the ball to right field for a double. Savannah Devine #3, then hit a single bringing Phares in to score. Senior Skyler Burke #10, the team's shortstop said, "I feel like we are leaving a legacy. I hope that the coach next year talks about us like Pedro has talked about the 2009 team that went to state. I hope that the seniors that are here now have set a good example for the younger players." Skyler said she is thinking about trying out for the softball team at Troy State University in Alabama, where she is planning on attending college.

Freshman Alexis Story #27, the team's catcher said, "It means the world to me, because this is the first experience I've had going to state. Especially because I am in the ninth grade." Gas Price Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have fallen 3.0 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.69/g Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 8,237 gas outlets in Florida. This compares with the national average that has fallen 1.4 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.64/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 28.2 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 3.9 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 9.2 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 13.4 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"Finally, the news motorists have been waiting for- it appears that at least for now, the national average has peaked," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Since February 7, gasoline prices have been on an upward trajectory in a majority of the U.S., and at least for now, prices have broken that upward trend and have stabilized. This is great news, as it likely means in the next couple weeks that gasoline prices will begin seeing more downward momentum. By Memorial Day, if there aren't major refinery kinks that develop, we could see the national average dropping into the \$3.50s, or perhaps even lower," DeHaan said.

What We Do in Public Health: Environmental Health

Environmental Health has a major role in the overall mission of public health through its efforts to prevent injury and disease by controlling environmental risks. The Florida Department of Health's Environmental Division monitors and regulates activities that may contribute to the occurrence or transmission of disease. It strives to ensure a safe water supply, sanitary disposal of sewage and elimination of vectors for disease transmittal.

Some of the local services provided by the Environmental Division of the Florida Department of Health in Hendry and Glades Counties include:

- Food and waterborne disease investigations
- Inspection of public pools, mobile home and recreational vehicle parks, food establishments and group care facilities
- Inspection of tanning facilities
- Monitoring of drinking water systems
- Investigations of groundwater contamination
- Institutional inspections
- Septic tank inspections
- Monitoring medical waste
- Rabid animal investigations
- Regulation of migrant labor housing
- Drinking water lab

Environmental Health regulates private and small public water supplies by collecting and analyzing water samples for bacterial contamination, and permitting and inspecting well installations. It checks for setback compliance, possible contaminant sources and proper well installation to prevent contamination.

Any onsite wastewater treatment and disposal (septic) system installed or repaired in any county is required to have a permit. Environmental Health will help to design the new system based on anticipated water use, type of soil at the site, proximity to surface water and separation from the wet season groundwater elevation. Due to the high water tables in southwest Florida, drain fields are elevated in a mound to prevent groundwater contamination.

Food programs in "not for profit" agencies, or adult care facilities are licensed by Environmental Health. Food safety inspections are conducted on a regular basis in these facilities. The Dept. of Business and Professional Regulation inspects restaurants, however, outbreaks of food illness (regardless of the source) are investigated by Environmental Health.

Environmental Health regulates the housing for migrant farmworkers and inspect for compliance with minimum housing standards, sanitary site conditions, overcrowding, safe water supply and sanitary wastewater disposal.

No one is allowed to house more than four unrelated migrant farmworkers without first obtaining a permit. Housing units are inspected a minimum of eight times per year. Investigations are conducted routinely for unpermitted migrant housing.

Environmental Health regulates and inspects mobile home parks and recreational vehicle parks to ensure a safe and healthy environment for the residents by checking for insect and rodent harborage, safe water supply and sanitary sewage disposal.

Public swimming pools and spas are licensed and monitored semi-annually for compliance with disinfection and safety regulations. If a pool is considered as "non-compliant," the pool is closed.

Due to the risks associated with ultraviolet light, tanning salons are regulated and inspected. Environmental Health checks the facilities for safe operations and sanitary operations of the tanning beds and eye-protection equipment.

When biomedical waste is improperly disposed of, it can create a significant health hazard for sanitation workers and the general public. Environmental Health enforces rules for health practitioners who generate bio-hazardous waste and provide education and supplies for "in-home" generated sharps (needle) disposal.

Because of the endemic nature of rabies in Florida, Environmental Health investigates all animal bite reports. A suspected animal will either be quarantined for 10 days or euthanized and the brain sent to a lab to be analyzed for rabies infection. Rabies is considered a fatal disease when contracted by humans.

Environmental Health also investigates and enforces abatement of sanitary nuisances which are considered a public health hazard (this is a requirement by Florida Statute). This may include sewage on the ground, harborage for flies or rats, dead animals and/or decomposing garbage.

Alley blames emotional distress and overindulging around the holidays for packing on the pounds—something most everyone can relate to. Excessive weight carries several health consequences, including heart disease, which often turns fatal. Statistics show one in four women will die from heart disease. And women aren’t the only ones. In fact, according to the National Institutes of Health (NIH), coronary heart disease—the most common type of heart disease—remains the No. 1 killer of both men and women in the United States.

According to the American Heart Association

and American Stroke Association, vascular risk factors associated with heart disease – like arterial stiffness – are now emerging as possible risk factors for VCI. However, researchers suggest a simple change in lifestyle could help lower one’s risk of developing cardiovascular disease – and possibly VCI – simply by following these healthy habits:

- eating a balanced diet;
- exercising;
- maintaining normal weight;
- minimizing stress; and,
- not smoking.

Additionally, in a study published by the NIH, drugs used to treat hyperinsulinemia and onset diabetes could actually decrease a patient’s risk of cognitive impairment. This as we wait for the U.S. Food and Drug Administration’s stamp of approval on a drug specifically designed to treat VCI.
