Recycling Numbers Weak in G.C.

Only 5 percent of solid municipal waste is recycled

While recycling rates seems to be on the rise in Florida, with the state recycling 49 percent of solid municipal waste in 2013, up one percent from 2012, Glades County is trailing far behind the state average and recycled less than all but one of the 67 counties. In a report released by the

Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) July 3 detailing each county's rate of both traditional recycling and total recycling, Glades County recycled merely five percent of its solid municipal waste and earned zero renewable energy credits, which are calculated based on the amount

Lightning Safety

Millions of lightning flashes happen each year and lightning can claim one or two victims at a time. Lightning strikes usually do not cause mass destruction of property, so it may not be considered a "high-risk" to some people. However, lightning has killed approximately 100 people in the last few years.

According to the National Weather Service Storm Data, over the last 30 years (1981 to 2010) the U.S. has averaged 53 reported lightning fatalities per year. Only about 10 percent of people who are struck by lightning are killed, leaving 90 percent with various degrees of disability.

Lightning can strike as far as 10 miles from the area where it's raining. That's about the same distance that you can hear thunder. So if you can hear the thunder, that means you are within striking distance. Most lightning deaths or injuries happen in the summer, so take the time to educate your family on lightning safety: "when lightning roars – go indoors!"

There are some indoor dangers to remember, as well. Stay off of corded phones and computers during lightning.

If a person is struck by lightning, call 911 and get medical care immediately. Heart irregularities, cardiac arrest, nerve damage and burns are common when someone gets struck by lightning. However, with proper treatment, including CPR if necessary, most victims survive a lightning strike.

You are in no danger helping a lightning victim. The charge will not affect you.

Lightning is primarily an injury to the nervous system, often with brain injury and nerve injury. Serious burns seldom

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

Respect: It's Biblical and Can Really Help

One of my sources commented on some of the faiths that permeate in the mid-East these days by noting, "They haven't had their Martin Luther yet."

He meant that Christianity had undergone a great reformation in the past as a result of much soul-searching and revision with what the world had come to discover in the Renaissance. Maybe the universe wasn't three stories; maybe it would be better to worship in a language

understood by all, maybe it would be better to break down some of the separation between the clergy and those they served.

The result? A "re-formed" faith, not only for those who separated, but also for those who stayed. In a dialog between the Lord and John, John seems upset and goes to Jesus. "Master" said John, "We saw a man driving out demons in your name and we tried to stop him because he is not one of us (Luke 9:49)." The answer was "Do not stop him," Jesus said, "for whoever is not against you is for you. (v.50)." The disciples were concerned about which of them would be the greatest (v46-48).

The answer is that "...he who is least among you all -- he is the greatest." Apparently, power

struggles were known in Jesus' day, as well as concerns about just who had the inside track and who had the right "brand loyalty." My own experience has shown me many of these issues are still with us.

One of my former acquaintances suddenly found herself facing a terminal illness. She was someone I knew to be of a different faith tradition than my own and she started to talk about the strength she was now getting from what she believed.

It was different than what I believed, yes, but doubtless something that was giving her strength as she faced a major crisis in her life. She had my utmost respect and I offered whatever comfort I could to her.

If I could offer anything in the way of helping her "cast out the demons" she was facing, it was hers to have... "whoever is not against you is for you." She eventually succumbed to a tragic illness; my comfort was in knowing that she found her own way and it served her well.

Occasionally, I have been invited to join other religious bodies. My question is, "What do you have to offer?" To date, it is nothing that I do not already have in my own household of faith. John was concerned when people who were suffering were helped by someone serving them in the Lord's name, but because they were not known to John, they were thus suspect to him. Jesus resolves the problem ("Other sheep I have of this fold. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice..." John 10:16).

There have been special moments when I've enjoyed dialoging with those whose traditions are unfamiliar to me, causing me to see things from another perspective, causing me to rethink some of my own points of view, letting me know

about why we're different and what we share in common. These are the moments that are best taking place when there is no crisis or when someone is not facing a great difficulty in their lives.

I believe it comes from the kind of respect that Jesus is telling John when He talks of not worrying about "who is the greatest" or "who is against you."

In the meantime, the "Reformation" still goes on. We see people who respect one another's differences, openly dialog and search for truth, carry out what we are called to do when "differences" or "greatest" becomes an issue.

With people being executed in our world today simply because they do not believe what some invading force thinks they ought to believe; there is still much to learn in the world. Thanks be to God, our teacher resolved the issue 2,000 years ago. His lesson is there for all of us, both at home and abroad.


CLEWISTON — Rosa Paulina Caso, age 86, of Clewiston, passed away July 7, 2014 in Clewiston.

Inland Birding: Muscovy Duck

The wild Muscovy Ducks are native to the tropical climates of Central and South America, Mexico and southern Texas. The heavier-bodied feral form is found in and around urban centers from New York southwest to Texas, and in Washington and California. They are also found in almost every county in Florida. Muscovy Ducks were intentionally released in the United States as an ornamental species in urban parks and lakes. Today, these ducks are also found in zoos, neighborhoods and farms.

Muscovy Ducks are a member of the duck family (Anatidae) which includes geese and swans. The feral species is easily recognized by their stocky bodies and black, white or mottled plumage. Females are more drab in appearance than the males. Males have red facial bumps on the face over the eyes and at the base of the bill. These warty bumps are often reduced or absent in the females. These large ducks have long flattened tails and large claws. Muscovy ducklings are yellow with buff brown on their tails and wings. Muscovy Ducks do not "quack."

The male's call is a loud,

dry hiss and the female makes a quiet coo. Feral Muscovies are often found in large flocks around lakes and parks where they forage for aquatic vegetation, seeds, acorns and invertebrates. Feeding these birds is banned in many areas in Florida in order to prevent the birds from becoming a nuisance and to help reduce the droppings near residential areas. These bird nest in tree cavities, on the ground, under shrubs and even on balconies. The female lays eight to 16 cream-colored eggs which are incubated for about five weeks. The males often protect the ducklings and will help them search for food.

DRINKING WATER NOTICE

PALM BEACH COUNTY WATER UTILITIES DEPARTMENT HAS DETECTED E. COLI IN A RAW GROUNDWATER SAMPLE AT THE LAKE REGION WATER TREATMENT PLANT

A routine raw groundwater sample taken at one of the wells at the Lake Region Water Treatment Plant in Belle Glade tested positive for E. coli bacteria on July 1, 2014. The well has been taken out of service while further testing is done.

Raw groundwater in the Lake Region comes from wells that go over 1400 feet underground. While E. coli bacteria can make you sick, and are a particular concern for people with weakened immune systems, no E. coli were detected in the distribution system. Treated drinking water was not affected.

What should I do? YOU DO NOT NEED TO BOIL YOUR WATER OR TAKE OTHER CORRECTIVE ACTIONS.

What happened? What does this mean?

- A raw groundwater sample collected from well #7 tested positive for E. coli. This well was taken out of service immediately on July 2, 2014.

- The water from Lake Region wells is treated by state of the art reverse osmosis technology and designed to achieve up to 99.99% removal of any harmful bacteria by prior to distribution to our customers. Treated drinking water was not affected.

- E. coli are bacteria whose presence indicates that the water may be contaminated with human or animal wastes. Microbes in these wastes can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. Fecal indicators are microbes whose presence indicates that the water may be contaminated with human or animal wastes. They may pose a special health risk for infants, young children, some of the elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems.

- The symptoms above are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice. People at increased risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers.

What is being done?

We have temporarily discontinued use of this well while further confirmatory testing is being done. Based on the available information there is no health concern and water is safe to drink.

FWC Provides Guidance on Enhanced Boating Safety Legislation

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) announced changes that were made by the Florida Legislature and approved by the governor to divers-down flag requirements.

House Bill 1049, by Rep. Raschein and Sen. Abruzzo, created an additional opportunity for divers to stay safe. Effective July 1, when in the water, they may display a buoy with a series of divers-down symbols as an alternative to the traditional divers-down flag.

The buoy can be three or four-sided and must

have a divers-down symbol of at least 12-by-12-inches displayed on each of the flat sides. Such a buoy should help divers, especially those in open waters, be more visible to passing boats.

Divers-down symbols displayed onboard a boat must still be a flag at least 20-by-24-inches and displayed at a high point where it is visible from any direction.

Divers may still use a divers-down flag of at least 12-by-12-inches on a float when towed along with them while in the water.

Being highly visible to boaters is critical to

keeping divers and snorkelers safe in the water.

"Divers should stay within the required distance of their flag or buoy – 300 feet in open water and 100 feet in rivers, inlets and channels, as that's where boat operators are expecting you to be. Boat operators should do their best to stay these same distances away from any divers-down flag or buoy, and all boats being operated within these distances from a divers-down symbol must be slowed to no more than idle speed," said Capt. Tom Shipp, who leads the FWC's boating safety efforts. "This will ensure everyone

gets to enjoy the water safely."

With bay scallop season – which just opened on June 28 – and spiny lobster mini-season – which begins July 30 – lots of divers and snorkelers are taking advantage of the opportunity to get in the water.

"This is a great time for boaters and divers alike to remember to pay close attention to their surroundings and be safe," Shipp said.

Aiding the Fight Against Cancer

Florida Department of Health awards grants to expand research into cancer and tobacco-related diseases

Florida Department of Health

The Florida Department of Health announced that research grants in the amount of \$1,600,000 each are being awarded to the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute and the University of Florida. This grant funding will be used to expand research into tobacco-related diseases, such as lung cancer. Lung cancer is the leading cause of all cancer-related deaths, and is the most common tobacco-related cancer.

“Florida is creating collaborative research networks to accelerate progress in the care of patients with cancer and tobacco-related disease,” said State Surgeon General and Secretary of Health Dr. John Armstrong. “These projects will move us closer to becoming the premier destination for cancer treatment, research and prevention.”

Funding for the awards comes from the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program which supports initiatives addressing tobacco-related diseases including cancer, cardiovascular disease, stroke, and pulmonary disease. The Department will issue a new funding opportunity announcement for the King program as well as the Bankhead-Coley Cancer Research Program prior to July 15.

H. Lee Moffitt’s research project will seek to detect lung cancer early, when it may be treated more successfully. The research focuses on improving the accuracy of cancer scanning using a type of x-ray scan called low-dose CT screening. Moffitt plans to translate the work of their research teams into improved computer software to analyze the scans and provide more accurate results. Moffitt will advance the quality of care and Florida’s research infrastructure by sharing everything in this project (which includes the screening methods, computer software programs, and educa-

tion materials) with hospitals, universities and research institutions in Florida. Moffitt plans to engage health care providers and the community to ensure that the people at high risk know that screening is a lifesaving choice.

The University of Florida will use this new grant to expand an existing research network that includes nearly 40 percent of all Floridians through a network of 22 hospitals, 416 clinics, and more than 3,000 physicians. This project will seek to improve quality of care for tobacco-related diseases by testing new ways of providing care in real-world clinical settings. The project is significant because it will increase enrollment of vulnerable populations in research studies to better understand ways of improving health outcomes for everyone in Florida. The project will expand the existing research network, provide education for physicians on conducting research in real-world settings, and collaborate with the Florida Department of Health to reduce regulatory barriers to conducting large-scale research at many institutions.

State Representative Marti Coley said, “Working to find better treatments and a cure for tobacco-related diseases, such as lung cancer, is so important for the citizens of Florida. I want to express my congratulations to the research teams that have been awarded these critical grants and wish them great success.” State Senator Eleanor Sobel said, “It is important for Florida to stay on the frontline of the effort to address all cancers and specifically those tied to tobacco use. This grant funding from the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program will assist these research institutions in their mission to find cures and share that information with the rest of the state.”

Dr. Daniel Armstrong, Chair of the Biomedical Research Advisory Council said,

“As the state strategic research priorities were being developed, the Biomedical Research Advisory Council recognized an opportunity to fund enduring infrastructure in the prevention, diagnosis and cure of tobacco-related diseases. This infrastructure can benefit investigators across the state and help us realize advances to reduce cancer burden. The funded projects demonstrate desired collaboration across institutions, shared scientific advisory boards, and meaningful ways to include input from research participants and community advisors. Importantly, these projects include specific plans to share results and make infrastructure available to any researcher in Florida.”

“We applaud the state’s continued commitment to funding cancer research and the effort to position Florida as the premier destination for cancer treatment and research,” said Thomas Sellers, PhD, MPH, center director and executive vice president of Moffitt Cancer Center the only NCI-designated comprehensive cancer center based in Florida. “This grant will be used to improve the excellent research being conducted at Moffitt and the funding will enable greater collaboration among the network of research institutions across the state.”

University of Florida President Bernie Machen said, “This grant funding enables us to expand on the nationally-recognized research we have been conducting for several years. A key distinction of the Clinical and Translational Science Institute at the University of Florida is to serve as a central source which connects resources, people and ideas that lead to increased collaboration and new discoveries.”

Dr. Myra M. Hurt, Senior Associate Dean for Research, Graduate and Undergraduate Programs at the Florida State University College of Medicine said, “We are pleased to

collaborate on this grant with the University of Florida that will accelerate the sharing of information across the research community and lead to increased potential for better prevention technology and new treatments for patients.”

Stephanie Leeds, vice president for advocacy in the Florida Division of the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN) said, “We appreciate the strategic grant funding that the Florida Department of Health has awarded to these distinguished institutions. Cancers that develop from the use of tobacco affects so many Floridians and their families. It is critical that we remain relentless in our pursuit of better prevention methods, improved treatment and collaborative research throughout our state.”

Martha Bogdan, President and CEO for the American Lung Association in Florida said, “Lung cancer is the #1 cancer killer of women, killing almost twice as many women as any other cancer. On average, less than half of all women diagnosed with lung cancer will be alive one year after their diagnosis. The American Lung Association in Florida applauds this investment of research by the James and Ester King Research Program and we remain committed to working toward a day when Florida families will be free from the pain and loss caused by tobacco-related illnesses.”

Dr. Charles E. Wood, Chair of the Department of Physiology and Functional Genomics at the University of Florida and the American Heart Association member on the Biomedical Research Advisory Council, said, “These awards provide critical resources that will allow for vibrant research on diseases that stem from tobacco use. We are particularly pleased by the new level of collaboration that is now made possible with these specific projects.”

The ‘Move Over Law’

‘Move Over Law’ Amended to Include Utility Service and Sanitation Vehicles

Effective July 1, Florida’s “Move Over Law” is amended to include utility service vehicles and sanitation vehicles to the list of public safety vehicles motorists must already slow down or move over for to protect personnel. Florida’s Move Over Law is intended to protect law enforcement officers, emergency workers and tow truck drivers stopped along roadways while performing their jobs.

Motorists are required to:

Move over when a patrol car, emergency vehicle or tow truck/wrecker is stopped on the side of a road with lights flashing. If such movement cannot be safely accomplished, motorists shall slow down to a speed of 20 mph below the posted speed limit;

Change lanes away from the emergency vehicle if traveling on a multi-lane roadway and able to move over safely; or slow down while maintaining a safe speed of 20 mph below posted speed limit being careful NOT to impede or block the flow of traffic unless otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer. 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Emphasizing the Health Risks of Using Illegal Synthetic Drugs

Florida Department of Health

The Florida Department of Health urges all residents and visitors to consider the health risks of using illegal synthetic drugs. Taken to achieve the high associated with drugs such as marijuana, ecstasy, and cocaine, these synthetic substitutes are life-threatening and addictive. Within the past week, up to 30 individuals in Alachua County became severely ill after using such substances. "As we have seen recently in Gainesville, these illicit synthetic drugs are

dangerous to Florida's children, adults, families and visitors," said Dr. John Armstrong, State Surgeon General and Secretary of Health. "These drugs destroy lives and threaten public health and safety."

Synthetic marijuana, often known as "K2" or "Spice," is one of the substances whose popularity is "alarmingly high," according to the Office of National Drug Control Policy. Labels on Spice products often claim that they contain "natural" psychoac-

tive material taken from a variety of plants. Spice products do contain dried plant material, but chemical analyses show their active ingredients are synthetic cannabinoid compounds.

The adverse effects of synthetic marijuana use may include agitation, extreme nervousness, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, a racing heartbeat, elevated blood pressure, tremors and seizures, hallucinations and dilated pupils. Spice may also raise blood

pressure and cause reduced blood supply to the heart. In a few cases, it has been associated with heart attacks. Regular users may experience withdrawal and addiction symptoms.

Anyone experiencing an adverse reaction to an illicit synthetic substance should contact their local poison center as soon as possible by calling 1-800-222-1222. If there is a life-threatening situation call 911 or go to the nearest Emergency Room.

Public is Asked to Help Collect Wildlife Data

Florida east coast anglers encouraged to help FWC collect red snapper data

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is asking anglers to help gather important information about the Atlantic red snapper fishery. The recreational red snapper season in Atlantic federal waters (beyond 3 nautical miles in the Atlantic) is open for 8 days this year: July 11, 12, 13; July 18, 19, 20; and July 25 and 26.

Researchers at the FWC's Fish and Wildlife Research Institute (FWRI) will be out along Florida's east coast during each day of the season, asking recreational fishers about their red snapper trips and their catch. This special survey is needed to gather more precise information on the numbers of red snapper caught by recreational anglers and spearfishers during the harvest season. Researchers will also collect biological samples of harvested fish (which will not affect the fillets) to help determine the age of each red snapper.

Last year researchers collected 1,701 samples from red snapper harvested during the three-day recreational season.

"Information shared by recreational fishers during this cooperative research effort is an important opportunity for fisheries scientists to obtain valuable data that can be used to assess the health of the stock and sustainability of the fishery," explained FWRI researcher Beverly Sauls.

"Data provided by recreational anglers during the 2013 season helped to make the 2014 season possible—these data are integral to understanding the Atlantic red snapper fishery."

While the federal opening will have no minimum size limit and a bag limit of one fish per person per day, in Florida state waters (from shore to 3 nautical miles) there is a 20-inch total length minimum size limit, and a bag limit of two fish per person, per day. Vessels with red snapper smaller than the state's minimum size limit must travel through state waters without stopping and have fishing gear stowed.

When anglers catch a tagged red snapper, FWC researchers ask that they report it to the Angler Tag Return Hotline: 800-367-4461. When calling the hotline, anglers should indicate the species, tag number, date and time of capture, catch location, fish length, type of bait used and whether the fish was kept or released. If the fish is released, the angler is asked to leave the tag in place to help with future data collection.

of renewable energy produced using solid waste as fuel and are used to calculate the total recycling rate. Glades County was almost dead last in recycling rates in Florida, surpassing only Hardee County, which recycled three percent of its solid municipal waste in 2013, according to the report.

Though Glades County's recycling rate increased one percent from 2012, the 2013 numbers don't bode well if the county hopes to reach the 75-percent recycling goal by 2020, which was established by the state in 2008.

The DEP report highlights that in order to help meet the statewide 75-percent goal within the next six years, commercial recycling efforts should be increased.

According to the report, commercial solid waste accounts for about 55 percent of total municipal solid waste collected, however, only about half of the commercial solid waste is being recycled.

Recent Lightning Storm Ignites Wildfire in Glades County

Wildfire reported 11 and a half miles south of the Highlands/Glades County Border

If the woods are thick and engines can't safely gain access to the fire, control lines are created around the fire by the Florida Forest Service dozers. By creating control lines around the fire, the dozer with plow is removing vegetation and leaving behind a strip of bare soil that stops the spread of the fire. Simply put, the bulldozer is removing the fuel from the fire triangle, causing the fire to go out.

Florida Forest Service was called out to a wildfire east of State Road 27 on Woodland Road. Thunderstorms and wind played an important role in the growth of this wildfire. Increased wind speed and switching wind direction amplified the fire's behavior, causing the fire to spread rapidly. Firebrands, or leaf litter on the fire, carried by the wind would land ahead of the main fire creating new wildfires. Wildland Firefighters waited for passing wind conditions to become more favorable while hold-

ing and improving control lines made by dozer and plow units. Additional resources from Highlands County were also brought in to advance in suppression.

Containment vs. Controlled?

A wildfire is considered contained when a control line has been completed around the fire and any associated spot fires, which can reasonably be expected to stop the fire's spread.

A wildfire is considered controlled when it is "dead out."

Despite recent rainfall, wildfires can quickly ignite, so please practice fire safety.

Be careful when using fire for any-

thing, including campfires and barbecues. Make sure someone watches the fire at all times until it is out.

Closely watch for any sparks that might fly from equipment you may be using.

Be sure that spark arrestors are in place on all engines used near wildland fuel. Have these engines tuned so they don't back fire.

Please report any fire immediately to 911. If parking on dry grass or brush, remember that the heat of your car can start a fire.

Take some time to pick up your yard and clean your roof so you don't invite a wildfire to your home.
