Tenn. Man Injured in Glades County Accident

A man was seriously injured early this morning in Glades County when his truck veered off the road while towing a trailer, the Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) reports.

At around 3:22 a.m., 89-year-old Calvin

Roark, of Bristol, Tenn., was driving his 2014 Dodge Ram with trailer in tow northbound on U.S. 27. near the intersection of County Road 733, according to a report released by FHP.

Roark reportedly lost control of his truck after the front of his vehicle turned sharply

to the right and he veered off the roadway onto the grassy shoulder. The truck came to a partial rest in a water filled ditch, according to the report, and Roark was transported to Florida Hospital in Lake Placid with serious injuries by Glades County EMS. Roark was charged with careless driving by FHP.

FWC Catches Commercial Turtle Poachers

FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Three Lakeland men and an Okeechobee freshwater turtle farmer were caught illegally harvesting, selling and buying wild-caught freshwater turtles as a result of a Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) investigation.

"Turtles are a popular, commercially available food item throughout much of the world and, as a result, overharvest has occurred in many countries," said the FWC's Lt. George Wilson, who led the effort. "To prevent overharvest here, the FWC

proactively banned commercial harvest of all native wild turtles in 2009," Wilson said.

Wilson and other FWC investigators throughout Polk and Seminole counties developed the case over a three-and-a-half-month period after the March 21 arrest of My Van Vo (DOB 04/19/83) of 6935 Raymond Ave., Lakeland. Van Vo was caught by FWC officers on Lake Apopka in possession of 87 live softshell turtles weighing in excess of 500 pounds.

Subsequently, FWC investigators learned two other Lakeland men were poaching fresh-

water turtles on Lake Marion, Lake Haines, Crooked Lake and Lake Walk-In-Water as well as from the St. Johns River. The two men were transporting and selling their illegal catch to Harden and Son's Turtle Farm in Okeechobee.

The three men were known to be involved in the illegal capture and exchange of a total of 2,100 pounds of live turtles.

"We hope our efforts to protect wild turtle populations help ensure everyone has the opportunity to see freshwater turtles in the wild and harvest them recreationally," Wilson said.

The FWC worked with the State Attorney's Office in Florida's 19th Judicial Circuit to charge Canh Van Nguyen (DOB 03/15/66) of 1226 Fairlee St., Lakeland, and Lieng Su Pham, (DOB 02/04/45) of 312 Lanceolate Dr., Winter Haven, with two felonies and four misdemeanors. The owner of the turtle farm, Franklin Gene Harden (DOB 11/28/58) of 3403 SW 26 Ave., Okeechobee, was charged with three felonies and four misdemeanors.

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

Services, Agape Christian Academy, Tobacco Free Florida, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and the Florida Forest Service.

Throughout the many stands, representatives from the various organizations eagerly handed out whatever they had to offer. Some took it upon themselves to make getting those materials more fun, including making information more relatable to children. Among the materials available were information on diet and nutrition, bike and road safety, water safety, fire safety, poison control, hurricane preparedness, weather education and health tips.

Outside, the Hendry County Sheriff's Office set up a maze-like obstacle course in the parking lot called the Bike Rodeo, through which children had to ride successfully before earning their own free bike helmets.

There were also vehicles outside for the children to examine, including a GCSO crime scene unit van, the school bus they would use throughout the year and a swamp buggy.

Inside, Mary the Clown greeted the children as their parents went to the various booths offering pamphlets, books, treats, supplies and more, in a long circular hallway. All families had to get the signatures of 10 other booths in order to receive the long-awaited backpacks at the end of the hall.

The booths certainly were not in competition with each other; in fact, the various groups represented seemed to admire their neighbor's efforts, as with the Florida Forest Service and Tobacco Free Florida.

Luis Aguilar, from Florida Forest Service said, "We plant the seed for safety. Before

we give supplies, we make the children promise not play with matches."

Two small children came by the stand and Aguilar proceeded to ask them for the promise. One of them exclaimed, "What are matches?" After an explanation the children walked away thrilled with their Smokey Bear booklets.

Aguilar stated afterward that this is now a common occurrence, "Kids don't know what matches are anymore. ... Possibly because of effective publicity and the anti-smoking campaign. ... No smoking means fewer matches."

Angelica Peña, of Tobacco Free Florida, seemed flattered but skeptical about Aguilar's explanation, stating that the anti-smoking campaign does help to educate the general public, but probably was not the main reason children do not know what matches

are, dental and auditory health, as well as free height, weight and hemoglobin checks.

Traci Thomas, Center Manager for the Moore Haven Center of FCHC, stated that the focus for the FCHC has always been migrant, seasonal farmworkers and underprivileged families. Children with no immunizations and families with little means of income are at risk when going back to school, said Thomas. FCHC is aware that most families cannot afford proper care throughout the year and do not know how to receive financial aid. That is why FCHC works personally with their patients to assess their situation, sets them up with one of their Health Benefits Coordinators and assists them in any way possible, she said.

The kids expo is one of the many ways in which they reach out to the community to let them know that help is readily available and easy to obtain for those who need it most.

With 120 toothbrush packages given out by FCHC, 158 backpacks distributed by United Way and the Salvation Army, and approximately 175

families attending, the outreach was considered a huge success. For some of the booth representatives it was their first year, but for all questioned, it would not be their last.

Thomas also stated that they were better prepared this year, "I am happy with all of it... I didn't know how we would top last year!"

Ann Baker, Physician Assistant at FCHC, stated that making sure the children have the supplies they need is more than just a yearly ritual, it brings equality and security to the under-privileged children.

"How can children study hard and get good grades if they worry about basic supplies? Just knowing that they are ready physically boosts their self-confidence," said Baker.

"Hopefully [the children] will eventually not know what lighters or electronic cigarettes are either," said Peña.

Because of the limited supplies, some of the booths invented clever ways, such as a raffling, to prolong the distribution as much as possible.

At the Home Health Services Stand, the representative brought her son and his friend as workers to volunteer at the event. They rushed to give tickets for the raffle as the rep looked on in pride.

"Volunteering helps build character, and it teaches them to serve others, which is what this booth is all about," said the Home Health rep.

FCHC provided free screenings for vi-

Not in Perfection but in Having Shared

Robin Williams was a tragic loss; perhaps more tragic because of what he offered to others. In a world full of suffering and pain, the ability to escape with a few minutes of humor becomes a prize gift. There is a certain irony that someone who could take so many outside of their day-to-day suffering and grief could not do it for themselves.

Those who wanted to quote to Jesus the dictum "Physician, heal thyself (Luke 4:23)" remind us all that what people can do for others, they may not be able to do for themselves. There is something about the healer having to admit that he needs healing. One theologian (Henri J. M. Nouwen) expressed it in the title of one of his books; "The Wounded Healer." The idea is that we can help one another not only because of our gifts of healing but because of our understanding of their pain through our own wounds from life.

I had the privilege of working with a man talented in languages but who was totally blind to seeing that others had difficulties in learning them. He did not see that everyone wasn't as talented as he was and limited in his understanding of his own gift. He drove others off by his blind spot. Part of the tragedy is not seeing the gifts that we have to give to others come by just being here. We don't have to be perfect. All of us have some kind of gift to offer. Some of the great healing capacities of communities of faithful committed people lies not in their individual perfection, but in their capacity to share because they are among the hurting, as well.

A while ago, I recalled hearing about a man who had a terminal illness and decided to spend his last days looking at comedies instead of moping and feeling sorry for himself. His illness went into remission. Whether or not it was due to his choice to be happy at the end remains an open question, but whatever the cause, his decision to not be embittered or down was heroic. Whatever kept him from living a full life would not ruin his capacity to enjoy the days he had.

The Biblical account of Judas Iscariot taking his own life is about a man who cannot shake off the guilt from his act of betrayal (Matthew 27:3ff) and the refusal of others to help him atone for what he had done. The message of the incarnation is, "I have been there, I know of your suffering and pain, I have lived with you and can understand, share it."

The message of the importance of forgiveness is likewise highlighted in Judas' attempt to come to terms with what he had done; perhaps our acts of forgiveness will one day literally save a life! We can understand why someone can feel he no longer can cope with life; we can also understand the tragic loss.

Perhaps we cannot change the circumstances that drive people to do desperate things; but we can provide the comfort, the understanding, the sharing that comes with realizing we've all had our own bad moments, too. This quality makes forgiveness all the much easier; who can really cast the first stone or deny that they've had their own minutes of hurting?

One of my clergy acquaintances told of the person who stayed away from Church, telling him, "The Church is full of hypocrites!" and therefore he was not going to have any part of it. The response from the clergyman was, "That's all right, there is always room for one more!" The community of the faithful is where we can

step outside of ourselves for a short while; to be strengthened and then returned to the world outside. The strength comes from the sharing, not perfection. It is in our drawing to the one who has overcome the world and sharing with Him. Then we can go out and heal and be healed too. That changes the world, others, ourselves.

GAS PRICE UPDATE

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have fallen 1 cent per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.34/g Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 8,237 gas outlets in Florida. This compares with the national average that has increased 2.3 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.49/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 14.9 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 16.3 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 8.9 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 4.2 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"The national average has now dropped to its lowest level since February, and with the end

of the summer driving season nearing, we'll likely see gas prices continuing the downward trend," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Oil prices last week dropped to \$95/bbl briefly before rising the next day back to \$97/bbl, but the important factor is that prices remain under triple digits. For motorists, we're nearing the point that gasoline demand drops- after Labor Day- and also the upcoming switch back to cheaper winter gasoline will also put downward pressure on prices in mid-September. While a short term increase in gasoline prices is never out of the question, as we grow nearer to September, the likelihood of a spike decreases. It won't be long before we'll start to see a few cities seeing averages under \$3/gal: areas of Tennessee and South Carolina are already getting close," DeHaan said.
