
Tropical Storm Andrea brought moderate rainfall to the area, according to the Suwannee River Water Management District.

Most of the rain from the storm, 3-4 inches, fell in Taylor, Lafayette, and Suwannee counties. Flooding on the Suwannee River was not expected, but the rain did help

recharge lakes and the Floridan Aquifer.

Rainfall from TS Andrea was 1-2 inches in the Santa Fe basin, which is about a typical week's worth of rain in June. The upper Santa Fe River and its tributaries were already relatively high from earlier storms, but fortunately the rain from Andrea will only cause small rises which will

## FCAT 2.0 Students below average in most grades in reading, math, science

The 2013 Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test 2.0 results are in for grade levels 4-10 in reading, 4-8 in math and 5 and 8 in science and the results show that Hamilton County students are below average in most grades. According to officials, the scores below represent the percentage of students performing at a satisfactory level and above as determined by the standard used for school grading for the subject area. The percentage of students scoring achievement level 3 and above for FCAT 2.0 is listed below. Here's how Hamilton County schools fared this year.

Hamilton County Veterans Service Officer Clay Lambert updated the Hamilton County Board of County Commissioners on the progress of the Veteran's Memorial Park during their meeting on Tuesday, June 4, and he said the project is moving forward.

"We have our concrete work completed out front by the columns," said Lambert.

## Old hospital to be demolished after asbestos removal

Demolition of the old Trinity Community Hospital (TCH) property in Jasper will begin soon after being delayed due to asbestos being found inside the building that needed to be properly removed according to strict safety regulations.

On Aug. 13, 2008, the doors to TCH were chained and padlocked by mutual agreement of the facility's owners and the state Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA). TCH was to focus on capital improvements, management changes and overall improvements of hospital services to better meet the needs of the local community and they stated they expected to reopen after appropriate changes were made and approved by the AHCA.

The doors never reopened and in

## Hamilton escapes Andrea's wrath

Nearly a year after Tropical Storm Debby, the region was hit with yet another tropical storm. This one was named Andrea, but she was mild compared to Debby, with no major damage or flooding reported, according to officials.

On Friday, June 7, the day after the storm, Hamilton County Emergency Management Director Henry Land said, "No damage has been reported."

Land also said Hamilton County received about 2.5 inches of rain.

The only thing Andrea accomplished was to keep folks on edge Thursday and Friday as they await-

help sustain the levels in the lower Santa Fe.

Parts of Madison County received up to three inches, which should be welcome after getting less than an inch in May.

In Georgia, 2-4 inches fell on the Okefenokee, which was not enough to cause flooding but will keep the upper Suwannee good for boating and paddling

in the coming weeks.

Flooding was not expected on the Withlacoochee or the Alapaha rivers, but enough rain fell that it is likely the Alapaha River will run all the way to the Suwannee River, which is unusual for this time of year. Most of the river in Florida is frequently dry in the summer.

The Aucilla River is not expected to flood, but levels should im-

prove there and be good for paddling.

Levels on the Steinhatchee and Econfina rivers are now above normal for this time of year. The Waccasassa River was very low after several months of drought. The storm caused a rise of only a few inches.

As for the rainfall outlook, the forecast calls for normal summer rainfall patterns in the near future.

been placed, Lambert said, and they were scheduled to arrive within a week.

"Those sales are continuing to increase," said Lambert. "Once the word got out about the first 100, we started generating more sales. We're starting to get a lot of stuff from outside the area; former Hamilton Countians that are learning about this off of Facebook and contacting me. I still believe the plaza area is going to be a self-paid-for project. I'm really hopeful of that."

Before going any further with the project, Lambert explained that an aging sewer line needed replacing. He is

working with the city of Jasper and county officials on replacement of the sewer line that runs from the old high school out to the city main. This particular sewer pipe is near where the pavilion will be constructed. Rather than take a chance on it rupturing and causing future issues at the park, Lambert asked to have the sewer line replaced now before construction of the pavilion begins.

"The city is going to provide us with the PVC pipe material," said Lambert. "I've just got to coordinate who's responsible for the sewage line."

Board members determined that the sewage line was the responsibility of the county and

they agreed to use county personnel to do the labor.

"Once that's done, we're going to ditch the whole area, we're going to grade it, and once all that is done we're going to move on to the plaza area," said Lambert.

As for the pine tree that was struck by lightning, Lambert said the tree still seems to be alive.

He laughed and said to the board, "I did not wish that upon you. That was just a fluke. The day I said that, I wasn't expecting lightning to strike the tree. It just kind of happened."

Lambert said he didn't expect the tree to die as it is an older, stout pine tree, and so it will remain as part of the park.

### Central Hamilton Elementary School

In fourth grade reading, 40 percent of the students scored satisfactory or above, down by six percentage points from last year's score of 46 percent. The state ranking was 60 percent. In math, 35 percent scored satisfactory or above, down five percentage points from last year's 40 percent. The state average is 61 percent.

In fifth grade reading, CHE improved to 53 percent, up 23 percentage points from last year's score of 30 percent. The state average is 60 percent. In math, scores increased to 47 percent, up 23 percentage points from last year's 24 percent. The state average was 55 percent. Science in fifth grade at CHE measured 36 percent with the state average at 53 percent.

In sixth grade, 30 percent of students received a satisfactory and above score on reading, down from last year's 43 percent. In math, the score decreased to 39 percent, down from last year's 50 percent.

### North Hamilton Elementary School

In fourth grade reading, 65 percent of the students scored satisfactory or above, up by 21 percentage points from last year's score of 44

percent. The state ranking was 60 percent. In math, 77 percent scored satisfactory or above, down seven percentage points from last year's 84 percent. The state average is 61 percent.

In fifth grade reading, NHE improved to 48 percent, up one percentage point from last year's score of 47 percent. The state average is 60 percent. In math, scores decreased to 47 percent, down eight percentage points from last year's 55 percent, which was also the state average. Science in fifth grade at NHE measured 48 percent with the state average at 53 percent.

In sixth grade, 45 percent of students received a satisfactory and above score on reading, up from last year's 27 percent. In math, the score increased to 55 percent, up from last year's 53 percent.

### South Hamilton Elementary School

In fourth grade reading, 52 percent of the students scored satisfactory or above, up by four percentage points from last year's score of 48 percent. The state ranking was 60 percent. In math, 57 percent scored satisfactory or above, up 13 percentage points from last year's 44 percent. The state average is 61 percent.

In fifth grade reading, SHE improved to 32 percent, up four percentage

points from last year's score of 28 percent. The state average is 60 percent. In math, scores decreased to five percent, down 15 percentage points from last year's 20 percent. The state average was 55 percent. Science in fifth grade at SHE measured 26 percent with the state average at 53 percent.

In sixth grade, 60 percent of students received a satisfactory and above score on reading, up from last year's 50 percent. In math, the score decreased to 35 percent, down from last year's 73 percent.

### Hamilton County High School

In seventh grade, 33 percent of students scored at 3 or above in reading, down from last year's 36 percent and in math 27 percent scored at 3 or above, the same as last year.

In eighth grade reading, 25 percent scored at 3 or above, down from last year's 27 percent. In math, 27 percent of eighth graders scored at 3 or above, up from last year's 21 percent and 15 percent of eighth graders in science scored at 3 or above.

In ninth grade reading, 37 percent scored at 3 or above, down from last year's 38 percent.

In tenth grade reading, 38 percent scored at 3 or above, up nine percentage points from last year's 29 percent.

students performing at a satisfactory level and above as determined by the standard used for school grading for the subject area. The percentage of students scoring achievement level 3 (satisfactory) and above for EOC is listed below. Here's how Hamilton County High School fared this year.

For algebra 1, 84 percent of seventh graders scored satisfactory or above. The state average was 90 percent. Fifty six percent of eighth graders scored at 3 or above, down from 78 percent last year and 11 percent of ninth graders scored at 3 or above,

down from 17 percent last year. The state average was 52 percent for this grade.

In biology, 48 percent of 10th graders at 3 or above. The state average was 55 percent.

In geometry, 78 percent of ninth graders scored at 3 or above. The state average was 88 percent.

Thirty one percent of 10th graders scored at 3 or above with the state average of 53 percent and 15 percent of 11th graders scored at 3 or above with the state average of 31 percent.

According to the Department of Education, spring 2013 was the first statewide administration of the U.S. history

EOC. Students receive a score on a scale of 20-80, which is called a T-score. On the T-score scale, an approximate score of 50 is the statewide average. Scores are reported in thirds, with 1 being the lowest and 3 being the highest. T-scores are only reported the first year of a statewide test administration.

For Hamilton County, the score was 45 with 47 percent in the lowest third, 29 percent in the middle third and 24 percent in the top third.

For the state, the score was 49 with 33 percent in the lowest third, 32 percent in the middle third and 35 percent in the top third.

# Old hospital to be demolished

July 2010, federal agents arrested seven people on various racketeering and Medicaid fraud charges, among them the owners, father and son Krasnow Sr. and Krasnow Jr.

After sitting vacant for so long, the building fell into disrepair and the medical equipment was outdated and unusable.

In November of 2012, the Hamilton County Board of County Commissioners voted to have the building demolished by the county road department, leaving behind the old clinic, which would be the proposed site of a new rural health clinic.

Demolition of the old building turned out to be a time-consuming process involving all sorts of legalities, such as removal and storage of patient records and what to do with all the hospital equipment.

Then it was discovered there was asbestos inside the building that required special handling in its removal, further delaying the project. Bids recently went out and three bidders responded. There were three options in the bid; Option 1-Removal of asbestos; Option 2-Demolition of the building; and Option 3-Removal of asbestos and demolition of the building.

The bidders from Samsula, New Smyrna Beach bid the following:

Asbestos removal-\$77,600  
Demolition-\$180,993  
Asbestos removal and demolition-\$258,593

Anglin Construction Co. from Gainesville bid the following:

Asbestos removal-\$32,000  
Demolition-\$148,700  
Asbestos removal and demolition-\$180,000

Curt's Construction from Live Oak bid the following:

Asbestos removal-\$34,424.94  
Demolition-\$49,998.86  
Asbestos removal and demolition-\$84,423.80

After much discussion between board members and Engineer Greg Bailey, the board voted to accept the Option 1 bid from Anglin Construction for asbestos removal, and they stuck with their original plan to have the county road department handle the demolition.

Additionally, a chain link fence will be placed around the site during the asbestos removal and demolition of the building for safety reasons.

# Pregnancy Care Center raises \$50,000 at fundraising banquet

The Pregnancy Care Center raised more than \$50,000 at the 4th Annual Fundraising Banquet held on May 28 at Christ Central. 400 people attended the banquet and the program drew 700. Sandi Patty, award-winning singer was the guest speaker. The audience was not disappointed as she sang several songs, including "How Great Thou Art." Sandi has often been simply called "The Voice" and has won a Grammy and over 40 Dove Awards. She spoke about how adoption has affected her life.

Donna Sandage, executive director gave an update on the Pregnancy Care Center, highlighting a large bouquet of 71 daisies, each one representing a life that was saved in 2012. Others included in the program were Pastor Shawn Johnson, Dowling Park, Pastor Adam Page, Lake Butler, Pastor Justin Young, Jasper and Pastor Eddie Blalock, Lake City.

The Pregnancy Care Center serves Co-

lumbia, Hamilton, Suwannee and Union counties. The Center is a faith based non-profit that has helped women with unexpected pregnancies since 1985. All the services at the center are free. Services include pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, parental training, peer counseling, post abortion recovery for those who have experienced past abortions, resources and fatherhood classes. Adoption counseling and referrals are also made through the center.

Future plans for PCC include an ultrasound machine in Live Oak. Since the Lake City facility began administering ultrasounds in 2010, more women and men make the choice to parent. PCC is not government funded and relies on donors and fundraising events to support its efforts. ## Unnecessary tragedy

Last week a federal judge ordered Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Kathleen Sebelius to allow 10-year-old Sarah Murnaghan, who suffers from cystic fibrosis, to be moved to the adult lung transplant list. That gives her a better chance of receiving a potentially lifesaving transplant. Sarah Murnaghan's fate should force us to examine our organ transplant policy.

There are more than 88,000 Americans on the organ transplant waiting list. Roughly 10 percent of them will die before receiving an organ. These lost lives are not so much an act of God as they are an act of Congress because of its 1984 National Organ Transplant Act, as amended, which prohibits payment to organ donors.

Reliance on voluntary donations has been an abject policy failure. The mindless rhetoric used to support this policy is: "Organ transplantation is built upon altru-

ism and public trust." It's noteworthy that everyone involved in the organ transplant business is compensated -- that includes hospitals, surgeons, nurses and organ procurement workers. Depending on the organ transplanted, the charges range from a low of \$260,000 for a kidney to about a million dollars for a heart or intestines.

Many people are offended by the notion of human body parts becoming commodities for sale. There's at least a tiny bit of inconsistency because people do sell human blood, semen and hair. But let's think through the prohibition on organ sales by asking the question: How many other vital things in our lives do we depend on donations to provide? Food is vital, water is vital; so are cars, clothing, housing, electricity and oil. We don't depend on donations to provide these goods. Just ask yourself whether having a car, clothing or a house should be determined by the same principle governing organ transplants: "altruism and

public trust." If it were, there would be massive shortages. Why should people have to depend on altruism and voluntary donations to provide something that one day they may need more urgently than food, water, cars, clothing or housing? All objections to organ sales reduce to nonsense, ignorance or arrogance. Let's look at some of them.

One argument is that if organs are sold rather than donated, poor people couldn't afford them. This argument ignores the difference between methods of attaining organs and methods of distributing them. For example, poor people might not be able to afford food, but Congress hasn't mandated that food be donated instead of sold so that poor people can eat. If Congress did that, there'd be massive shortages, and poor people would probably starve. So instead of relying on "altruism and public trust" to feed poor people, we simply allow the market mechanism to supply food and then subsidize purchases through programs like food stamps. The same principle can be applied to organ transplants: Allow the market to supply organs, and if needed, subsidize or provide them through charity.

Another stated concern is that if there's a market for organs, poor people will sell their organs and become ill. From an ethical point of view, if people own themselves, they should have a right to dispose of themselves any way they please so long as they do not violate the property rights of others. Of course, if people belong to the government, they have no such right. By the way, most proposals for organ sales are only for cadaver organs.

Some people have argued that an organ transplant market might lead to murder and the sale of the victim's organs to unscrupulous organ brokers. There are many market transactions that can be abused, such as stock market fraud and product misrepresentation, but we haven't chosen to outlaw the sale of stock and other products. Murder would remain illegal and punishable.

Finally, there's the humane question. If you or a loved one were in dire need of a lifesaving kidney or lung transplant, which would you prefer: being placed on an organ transplant waiting list, or having the right to sell assets or take out a loan to purchase an organ?

# Hell on Earth - Part 2

Last week in Part 1 of Hell on Earth, we gave you the scripture in Revelation 9. This week we want to take a more in-depth look at its meaning. The title "Hell on Earth" does not speak of the hell of Revelation 20: 11-15. The hell spoken of there is the final abode for the Devil and his angels, and all those who do not know Jesus as their personal savior.

Now I know that some do not believe that the God of Love would ever allow anyone to go to a place like hell, but it is clearly taught in the pages of God's Word. Today we speak of a time on earth that will come about during the 7 Year Tribulation period on earth, before the return of the Lord to





## PORTABLE GENERATORS!

Many residents who lose power may turn to emergency generators to ensure a continuous flow of electricity to refrigerators, freezers, lights, fans and other appliances. SVEC urges residents to exercise extreme caution. While generators are a convenience in keeping appliances running during storm-related outages, they can also create hazards for homeowners and electric utility workers.

### When operating a generator:

• Always operate a generator in accordance with manufacturer's guidelines and instructions.

• To avoid **CO poisoning**, never use a generator indoors or in attached garages. Only operate the generator outdoors in a well-ventilated, dry area from air intakes to the home.

• To avoid **electrocution**, plug individual appliances into the generator using heavy duty, outdoor rated cords with a wire gauge adequate for the appliance load.

• If connecting into the house wiring is necessary on a temporary basis, homes must have a **transfer switch** installed by a

licensed electrician. A transfer switch allows your house to receive power directly from a portable generator as opposed to power normally supplied by SVEC. Transfer switches isolate the circuits supplied by the generator and prevent backfeeding - inadvertently energizing circuits in both systems.

• Backfeeding can most commonly occur when a generator is connected directly to the electric panel or circuit in a home. Feeding power back into the utility system during an outage will energize the transformer serving the house and could pose a serious threat to line and service and tree crews working to restore power in the area who may not know they are working with an energized line.

If you desire to obtain a transfer switch for residential use the cooperative has approved a meter socket based transfer switch by GENERLINK model number MA23-N or S. Member would purchase the transfer switch through GENERLINK (1-800-886-3837 or [www.globalpowerproducts.com](http://www.globalpowerproducts.com)) and contact the cooperative to schedule installation at no charge.

## Sunscreen Ratings: The Best and Worst for Beach Season 2013

Want to really enjoy your day in the sun? Start by choosing the best **sunblock** out there so you don't have to worry about getting burned. Luckily, the Environmental Working Group (EWG) has just released its **2013 Guide to Sunscreens**, which rates more than 1,400 sunscreens, lip balms, and SPF moisturizers and cosmetics for safety and effectiveness. And some of their findings might surprise you. The EWG report found that only 25 percent of products on the market offer both broad sun protection and low-risk chemical ingredients. "Consumers are understandably confused about sunscreens," Sonya Lunder, lead author of the EWG report, told Yahoo! Shine. "And, unfortunately, they are facing some bad choices."

While sunburns are caused mostly by relatively short but intense ultraviolet B rays, longer UVA rays, which penetrate the body more deeply, inflict more insidious damage and may contribute to or cause cancer. But all sunscreens are not equal in how effectively they protect against both types of rays, says the EWG.

The FDA aimed to make that clearer when it put new sunscreen labeling rules into effect in 2012. One new requirement is for products to test and then label to identify sunscreens as "broad spectrum" if they protect well against both UVB and UVA rays. Those that don't must now carry a "skin cancer/skin aging alert" (although EWG says that the FDA standards on this are too low). Another requirement is that if a product claims to be water-resistant, it must say when, during sweating or swimming, the sunblock should be reapplied (for example, every 80 minutes).

But after analyzing 750 beach and sport sunscreens, EWG noted that the new FDA rules have not yet led to better sunscreens for 2013. "New rules, same old products," Lunder said. Still, learning to look past label claims and look carefully at ingredient lists can be a helpful way around the bad products. Below, the best and worst of what's currently on the market:

So what does the EWG say should be avoided when you make your choice?

**Sunscreen sprays or powders:** Sprays and powders may pose serious inhalation risks — and also make it too easy to apply too little or to miss a spot, leaving tender skin exposed to dangerous rays.

**SPF values above 50+:** SPF refers only to protection against UVB radiation, not the potentially cancer-causing UVA rays. So a high-SPF number may trick you into staying in the sun too long, blocking sunburns but increasing the risk of other kinds of skin damage. The FDA is considering limiting SPF claims to 50+, as is done in other countries.

**Dangerous ingredients:** Avoid products that include oxybenzone (found in 80 percent of chemical sunscreens), which can penetrate the skin, cause allergic reactions, possibly disrupt hormones, and may have a link to a risk of endometriosis and low birth weights. And retinyl palmitate, meanwhile, a form of anti-oxidant vitamin A that has been said to slow skin aging, should be avoided because it's been found to possibly speed the development of skin tumors and lesions when applied to the skin in the presence of sunlight. Safer options block sun with low-risk ingredients such as zinc oxide, avobenzone or Mexoryl SX. Find a complete list of chemicals and their risks here.

Finally, to make sure you're truly protected when the sun's rays are at their strongest, EWG notes, don't completely rely on sun lotions; instead, when possible, wear clothes. Shirts, hats, shorts, and pants provide the best protection from UV rays—chemical-free.


