## Car burglar caught, say police

Faces charges in 22 auto break-ins; more charges may follow, say deputies.

Columbia County sheriff's detectives arrested a Lake City man who they believe burglarized numerous vehicles across

the county since late December.

Aaron Charles Bennefield, 23, of 225 SW Wise Drive, faces 22 felony counts of burglary, according to a sheriff's office news release. He also faces charges of grand theft, fraud and dealing in stolen property, according to the sheriff's office.

Additional charges are pending as the investigation continues, the arrest report said.

"We believe that additional burglaries will be linked to the suspect," said Sgt. Edward Seifert, public information officer with the sheriff's office.

The first reported vehicle burglary occurred on Dec. 28 on SW Wise Drive. The victim reported that someone had stolen an iPod shuffle and a subwoofer speak-

er box containing two subwoofers from his 2013 Hyundai Elantra. The vehicle was unlocked at the time of the burglary, according to the arrest report.

On Jan. 2, Detective Terrence Wayne Tyler began investigating multiple vehicle burglaries in the Wise Estates subdivision. Tyler walked house to house and spoke with the people who lived around where

## Virus has health officials on alert

No one here has been infected, but officials advise caution.

The Columbia County Health Department warned about the emergence of a new form of the norovirus that has reached Florida, sending a notification to area hospitals and schools.

While no one in Columbia County has been reported to have contracted the virus, health care professionals were warned it is a possibility.

Mark Lander, administrator at the Columbia and Hamilton health departments, said noroviruses are common and are the most common cause of gastrointestinal illnesses. Gastrointestinal illnesses result in vomiting and diarrhea.

He said while the virus isn't usually fatal, when people die from the virus, it's usually because of dehydration.

## Gaetz: Teacher evaluation not working

FORT WALTON BEACH — Florida's new teacher evaluation system isn't working, and lawmakers should stop making major changes in the state's schools until that plan and other key initiatives are fixed and implemented, Florida Senate President Don Gaetz said.

The former Okaloosa County school superintendent said the test-based evaluation system and a related performance pay plan are too complicated and fail to draw clear distinctions between the best and worst teachers.

The Florida Department of Education last month released the first preliminary evaluation results. They showed nearly 97 percent of teachers across Florida were rated "effec-

tive" or "highly effective." Those are the top two out of five possible ratings.

"How can you have a C or D ranked school in which 85 percent, or 90 or 95 percent of the teachers are classified as effective or highly effective?" the Republican from nearby Niceville said during an interview Monday. "It seems to me that those two

## Inmate dies at Suwannee Correctional Institution

An inmate died at Suwannee Correctional Institution on Friday, Department of Corrections officials confirmed Tuesday.

The inmate was identified as William Bevan, 25.

State officials refused to say how Bevan died or to release any information about the circumstances surrounding his death.

Bevan was serving two five-year and two one-year prison sentences. It is not clear if they were being served concurrently or consecutively.

The two five-year prison sentences were from convictions in Gadsden County for aggravated battery, according to the Department of Corrections website.

The two one-year sentences were for preventing/obstructing extinguishment of a fire.

## BP to pay record \$4B for oil spill

NEW ORLEANS — BP PLC closed the book on the Justice Department's criminal probe of its role in the Deepwater Horizon disaster and Gulf oil spill Tuesday, when a federal judge agreed to let the London-based oil giant plead guilty to manslaughter charges for the deaths of 11 rig workers and pay a record \$4 billion in penalties.

What the plea deal approved by U.S. District Judge Sarah Vance doesn't resolve, though, is the federal government's civil claims against BP. The company could pay billions more for environmental damage from its 2010

# Wallenda makes daring tightrope walk

**SARASOTA**  
Famed daredevil Nik Wallenda glided 500 feet across a wire suspended 200 feet above the ground on Tuesday, wowing several thousand people below in his hometown of Sarasota.

Without a tether or safety net, Wallenda was the lone figure against a blue sky, aided only by a balancing pole. He made the death-defying stunt look easy, but the performance was anything but simple: it took dozens of circus workers to pull and release the thick black cables that controlled Wallenda's wire as he walked. The morning was windier than expected, and at one point near the end, Wallenda dipped down to one knee on the wire, which led to loud gasps among the crowd.

"I have to get into a zone where I kind of forget about everything else and just focus on what I'm doing," he said shortly before he stepped on the wire. "Fear is a choice but danger is real, and that's very, very true for my line of work."

The Sarasota City Commission allowed the stunt without a tether. Wallenda wore a tether for the first time last summer when he walked across Niagara Falls because the television network that was paying for the performance insisted on it.

## Chris Cuomo leaving ABC News for CNN

**NEW YORK** — Chris Cuomo is leaving ABC News to host a new morning show at CNN, where new boss Jeff Zucker is moving fast to try to turn around the cable news pioneer that has fallen on hard times.

aging editor Mark Whitaker announced he was quitting Tuesday, officially Zucker's seventh day on the job as CNN Worldwide president. Longtime political consultants and commentators James Carville and Mary Matalin also are leaving.

Cuomo is expected to be paired with current evening anchor Erin Burnett in the mornings. CNN said Tuesday it was discussing other job options with Soledad O'Brien, who will be ending her second stint as morning show co-host.

"Chris is an accomplished anchor who is already an established name in morning television," Zucker said. "What I love about Chris is that he is passionate about every story he tells, never forgets about the viewer and represents the type of journalism that makes CNN great."

## AROUND FLORIDA

### Students break reading record

**TALLAHASSEE** — Florida's public school students have broken the Million Minute Marathon reading record they set last year.

State education officials Monday announced that 1.5 million students racked up nearly 30.1 million minutes of reading time on Jan. 14.

That shattered last year's 23 million minute record by more than seven million minutes.

The event was part of Florida's 5th annual Celebrate Literacy Week.

Susan Snyder's "Grandma's Crazy Chickens" was the official 2013 marathon book. But students could read any book, magazine, blog site or newspaper article of their choosing.

Fifty-eight of Florida's 67 school districts participated. So did seven early learning coalitions.

Kevin Smith, deputy director of the state's Just Read, Florida! program, said research shows children can become stronger students just by reading an extra 20 minutes a day.

### 2 charged with Medicaid fraud

**TALLAHASSEE** — Two top officials in a nursing home management company are being charged with defrauding Medicaid.

The two are accused of using more than \$2.75 million in Medicaid reimbursements for personal expenses. Medicaid is the safety net health care program for the poor.

The attorney general alleges that Council on Aging of Florida CEO Maxcine Darville and Assistant CEO Joanne Carter used Medicaid

money on excessive salaries, mortgage payments and cell phone bills.

The Alachua County Sheriff's Office said Darville and Carter surrendered Monday and bonded out that same day.

They are both charged with one count of organized scheme to defraud, a first-degree felony. If convicted the pair could spend 30 years in prison.

Attorneys for the pair said they strongly deny any wrongdoing and intend to fight the case.

### Missing woman found in canal

**PUNTA GORDA** — Authorities say the remains of a southwest Florida woman who went missing in 1993 were found in a car pulled from a Punta Gorda canal.

The Sarasota Herald-Tribune reports the Buick station wagon was found earlier this month. Police announced Monday that dental records matched Frances Hendrickson, who was 64 years old when she went for a drive on June 30, 1993.

After Hendrickson went missing, police searched canals because she was known to be a poor driver. They used divers and sonar equipment but the search didn't turn up anything.

The newspaper reports the case was reopened two years ago using new sonar equipment. Two weeks ago, the search paid off. Divers found the submerged car and forensic experts went to work identifying the remains.

### Suit to protect rattlesnakes set

**TALLAHASSEE** — Environmentalists are launching a lawsuit aimed

at speeding up federal action on a request to give endangered species protection to the eastern diamondback rattlesnake.

The Tucson, Ariz.-based Center for Biological Diversity and others filed a formal notice of intent to sue the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service on Tuesday.

The environmentalists say the rattlesnake is threatened by loss of habitat and human predation across the Southeast. There are no bag limits in South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Mississippi, Alabama and Louisiana.

The agency last year agreed to conduct a review of the request, but spokesman Tom MacKenzie said it will be several years before that can be accomplished. He said that's because the service already is reviewing 400 other species due to prior lawsuits filed by the center.

### Man, 78, fatally stabs wife

**KENDALL** — Police say a 78-year-old man became so enraged when his wife refused to cook him a hamburger that he stabbed her to death.

Miami-Dade police say Bartolo Gelsomino confessed to killing his wife 71-year-old Ana Gelsomino on Jan. 21 and staging a burglary to cover up the crime. He faces second-degree murder charges.





The Miami Herald reports the couple's daughter found her mother's body in the home.

## BP: Company pleads guilty to manslaughter, will pay \$4 billion

spill.

Vance noted that the company already has racked up more than \$24 billion in spill-related expenses and has estimated it will pay a total of \$42 billion to fully resolve its liability for the disaster in the Gulf of Mexico.

The judge said the \$4 billion criminal settlement is "just punishment" for BP, even though the company could have paid far more without going broke. In accepting the deal, Vance also cited the risk that a trial could result in a much lower fine for BP, one potentially capped by law at \$8.2 million.

The criminal settlement calls for BP to pay nearly \$1.3 billion in fines. The largest previous corporate criminal penalty assessed by the Justice Department was a \$1.2 billion fine against drug maker Pfizer in 2009.

The plea deal also includes payments of nearly \$2.4 billion to the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation and \$350 million to the National Academy of Sciences. The two groups will administer the money to fund Gulf restoration and oil spill prevention projects.

The \$4 billion in total penalties are 160 times greater than the \$25 million fine that Exxon paid for the 1989 Valdez spill in Alaska, Vance noted.

Before she ruled, the judge heard an apology from a BP executive and emotional testimony from relatives of the 11 workers who died when BP's blown-out Macondo well triggered an explosion on the rig and

started the spill.

"I've heard and I truly understand your feelings and the losses you suffered," Vance told the family members.

Keith Jones, whose 28-year-old son, Gordon, died in the rig explosion, said \$4 billion isn't adequate punishment.

"It is petty cash to BP," he told Vance. "Their stock went up after this plea deal was announced."

Billy Anderson, whose 35-year-old son, Jason, of Midfield, Texas, died in the blast, recalled the trauma of watching the disaster play out on television.

"These men suffered a horrendous death," he said. "They were basically cremated alive and not at their choice."

BP agreed in November to plead guilty to charges involving the workers' deaths and for lying to Congress about the size of the spill from its broken well, which spewed more than 200 million gallons of oil. Much of it ended up in the Gulf and soiled the shorelines of several states. The company could have withdrawn from the agreement if Vance had rejected it.

BP America vice presi-

dent Luke Keller apologized to the relatives of the workers who died and for the spill's environmental damage to the Gulf Coast.

"BP knows there is nothing we can say to diminish their loss," he said. "The lives lost and those forever changed will stay with us. We are truly sorry."

Most of the families of rig workers who were killed or injured in the explosion already have settled their claims against BP, through a process separate from this plea deal.

Courtney Kemp-Robertson, whose 27-year-old husband, Roy Wyatt

Kemp, of Jonesville, La., died on the rig, said workers had referred to it as the "well from hell" before the explosion.

"By cutting corners, they gambled with the lives of 126 crew members to save a few dollars," she told the judge before turning to address Keller. "They gambled and you lost."

A series of government investigations have blamed the April 20, 2010, blowout on time-saving, cost-cutting decisions by BP and its partners on the drilling project.

Vance told victims' relatives who were in court that she read their "truly gut-wrenching" written statements and factored their words into her decision. She also said she believes BP executives should have personally apologized to family members long before Tuesday's hearing.

"I think BP should have done that out of basic humanity," she said.

BP also has separately agreed to a settlement with lawyers for Gulf Coast residents and businesses who claim the spill cost them money. BP estimates the deal with private attorneys will cost the company roughly \$7.8 billion.

In a court filing before the hearing, attorneys for BP and the Justice Department argued that the plea agreement imposes "severe corporate punishment" and will deter BP and other deep-water drilling companies from allowing another disaster to occur.

The Justice Department has reached a separate settlement with rig owner Transocean Ltd.

## County officials' texts to be probed

ORLANDO — The new top prosecutor in Orlando is asking the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to investigate whether any laws were broken in the way Orange County leaders handled their text messages.

State Attorney Jeff Ashton said Tuesday he has met with FDLE agents about starting an inquiry.

Several Orange County leaders deleted messages from their phones. The messages may have shed light on who they were communicating with during a contentious Orange County Commission meeting over a ballot measure that would have mandated some businesses to offer sick leave to workers.

The text messages are considered a public record if they involved discussions on county business.

data points have to have some relationship to each other."

Besides the evaluation system and pay plan, Florida's schools also are phasing in far-reaching national Common Core State Standards, a new test for assessing student performance based on those standards and end-of-course exams.

These changes are "all like rockets that have been shot in the air," Gaetz said.

"We need to quit shooting rockets into the air. We need to give schools and school districts, teachers and parents time to institutionalize the reforms that have already been made. We need about a two-year cooling off period."

The evaluations will be used to determine teacher salaries under the performance pay plan, which is supposed to go into effect next year. Both are part of a 2011 law that also ended tenure for newly hired teachers. The law is being challenged in court by the Florida Education Association, the statewide teachers union.

Gaetz blamed the Department of Education and former Education Commissioner Gerard Robinson for failing to adequately support and help school districts in implementing the new law. He said he's counting on Robinson's successor, Tony Bennett, to simplify the evaluation system and pay plan and make them understandable.

"If you can't explain it, then you can't defend it," Gaetz said. He added that lawmakers who passed it, including himself, would be hard pressed "to explain how this system works and how it's fair and rational."

vehicles had belongings stolen. He noticed a pattern. The suspect would walk down a row of houses to see which vehicles were left unlocked, and would steal only from them, according to the arrest report. The burglar also struck only at night, Tyler believed.

Friday, a homeowner in Azalea Park reported a burglary of his vehicle. He said the vehicle had been left unlocked and several of credit cards, including his Lowe's and Home Depot cards, had been stolen from the center console. Later in the day, he noticed his Lowe's card had been used at the Lowe's store in Lake City.

From the surveillance footage obtained from Lowe's, detectives were able to identify the suspect as a white man who drove a Chevrolet Colorado four-door truck, according to the arrest report.

On Saturday, Rebecca Tenneboe, a homeowner in Wise Estates, told Deputy Kevin Bailey she knew where her stolen Dell laptop was. The computer had been taken from her unlocked car on Jan. 9. She said that her neighbor, Caitlin Bennefield, had found "a suspicious Dell computer" in her residence and that when she turned the computer on the user profile name was "Rebecca," according to the arrest report.

Later that day, Tyler spoke with Bailey. Bailey said he had watched the Lowe's surveillance video, and "he believed the suspect in the video appeared to be Aaron Bennefield, the estranged husband of Caitlin Bennefield," according to the arrest report.

Sunday, Tyler spoke with Caitlin Bennefield at her mother's residence about what Tenneboe had reported.

Caitlin said she has been estranged from her husband, Aaron Bennefield, since mid-December, and that she had been staying with her mother, according to the arrest report.

She said around Jan. 23, she stopped by her home, and Aaron Bennefield was not there. She found a bag that contained a computer, which she didn't think belonged to him. When she turned the computer on the profile name was "Rebecca," and she believed the property was stolen, according to the arrest report.

Tyler then went to Aaron Bennefield's home in the Wise Estates, and found Aaron Bennefield inside his white 2005 Chevrolet Colorado truck. Because handguns had been stolen from some of the unlocked vehicles, he was put in handcuffs for the protection of law enforcement, according

to the arrest report. The handcuffs were removed once it was determined Aaron Bennefield did not have a weapon, according to the arrest report.

Tyler asked and received permission to search the vehicle and the home, according to the arrest report.

When Tyler searched the cab of the truck, he found two stolen handguns, a .380-caliber semiautomatic, which matched the serial number of a firearm stolen from a vehicle in Azalea Park, and a Colt .45-caliber semiautomatic handgun, which matched the description of a firearm stolen from a vehicle in the Callaway subdivision.

Tyler asked Aaron Bennefield how he came to possess two stolen handguns. Bennefield said he bought them from people he didn't know on Northwest Long Street.

Then Tyler asked him about the purchases he had made at the Lowe's in Lake City, Bennefield said he had found the card at a gas station, according to the arrest report.

Eventually, Bennefield said "he had fallen on hard times and had began smoking marijuana," according to the arrest report. He said he had made a bad decision and broke into about 15 cars in Azalea Park. He denied burglarizing any

vehicles in the Creekside subdivision, Wise Estates subdivision or the Callaway subdivision, according to the arrest report.

After the sheriff's office obtained a search warrant, investigators found multiple items that had been reported stolen, including items from Wise Estates subdivision, Azalea Park subdivision and Callaway subdivision, according to the arrest report.

Bennefield was placed under arrest and transported to the Columbia County Detention Facility.

According to the arrest report, other items including small electronics, flashlights, sunglasses and knives were recovered during the search but have yet to be identified.

The Lake City Reporter has received numerous reports of vehicles that were burglarized in recent weeks. In many cases the victims did not file reports with law enforcement because nothing was taken.

The sheriff's office asked that anyone who had a vehicle burglarized during the past few weeks to contact the Detective Division at 758-1095 "to help detectives determine if the recovered property is yours."

"Keep hydrated," he said. "That's a big part of treating a norovirus."

Superintendent of Schools Terry Huddleston said precautions have been put in place at district schools.

"If someone has the virus we certainly don't want them at school," Huddleston said.

"The virus is mutating to a 'fitter' strain and is attacking a non-immune population," Jan Vinje, a Centers for Disease Control epidemiologist, told the Washington Post.

The virus, named GII.4 Sydney because it is believed to have originated in Sydney, Australia, was responsible for 204 passen-

gers becoming ill on the Queen Mary 2 cruise ship, according to news reports.

Norovirus is a highly contagious virus, and individuals can get the norovirus from an infected person, contaminated food or water, or by touching contaminated surfaces. The virus causes your stomach or intestines or both to get inflamed (acute gastroenteritis). This leads to stomach pain, nausea, diarrhea and vomiting, according to the CDC.

Norovirus is the most common cause of acute gastroenteritis in the United States. Each year, it causes about 21 million illnesses and contributes to about

70,000 hospitalizations and 800 deaths. Norovirus is also the most common cause of foodborne disease outbreaks in the United States, according to the CDC.

It takes exposure to only 20 particles of the virus to be infected, according to the CDC.

Norovirus can spread quickly in closed places like day care centers, nursing homes, schools and cruise ships. Most norovirus outbreaks occur from November to April in the United States, according to the CDC.

Lander said children, the elderly and people with weakened immune systems

are the most vulnerable. He said noroviruses spread easily, and large gatherings of people are the biggest concern.

The norovirus is not airborne but is spread through fecal matter and vomit, Lander said.

Noroviruses, like most viruses, are resistant to antibacterial hand sanitizers, Lander said. He said that the best defense against the norovirus is hot, soapy water, as far as cleaning the skin. When there's a situation that results in fecal matter or vomit on a surface, the health department recommends using a disinfectant approved by the Environmental Protection

Agency, and cleaning the surface with diluted bleach.

Even after symptoms subside, the person will be contagious for 48 hours, Lander said.

The health department recommends:

■ Send people home who are vomiting or have diarrhea from group settings or work for 48 hours after symptoms resolve.

■ Wash hands with soap and water, and most definitely wash hands after using the restroom or changing diapers and before eating or preparing food.

■ Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces, bathrooms and toys.

## First get the science right

**T**he first step in protecting the state's environment is getting the science right. Yet Florida uses a flawed model for assessing how groundwater pumping affects the surrounding landscape. It's irresponsible, and state water managers need to correct it.

The Tampa Bay Times reported recently that state water officials base all their permitting decisions on computer models that rely on a false assumption. The models assume the underground area known as the aquifer flows at a steady rate through layers of sand and gravel. In reality, the land beneath is composed of karst, a more porous limestone that is full of holes, both big and small. The difference means that water can travel at a much faster rate than the computer models imply, according to current and former state water officials. The net effect is that pollution can be carried much more quickly into the drinking water supply, and state officials have an inaccurate picture of what pumping may do to regions across the state.

An experiment by a team of scientists in 2010 illustrates the depth of the problem. The team dropped fluorescent dye into wells and sinkholes at Silver Springs. Under the state's model, the dye would move toward the springs in cycles ranging from two to 100 years. But the dye dropped by the team rocketed through the aquifer, crossing half the 100-year distance in only six months. The models are so off-base, said David Still, the former director of the Suwannee River Water Management District, that "they shouldn't be used to make decisions."

Yet the regional water management districts rely on the models in deciding how much pumping to allow and assessing the impact on nearby springs, lakes and wetlands. Officials say they can "tweak" the models to take into account any obvious signs of environmental degradation. But that is no substitute for a model that accurately measures the flow rates in Florida's distinct water basins.

The water districts should work with Florida's Department of Environmental Protection to update the Florida models. The process may involve some time and expense, and any final model may be imperfect to some degree given the nature of measuring hollow areas in the ground. But these models must be more precise to provide better protection of both the aquifer and surface water.

## The Nixonian Obama

**R**ichard Nixon got governing wrong, very wrong, and went so far in ignoring legal prohibitions that distraught opinion jettisoned him from the White House. Though far removed from Nixonian criminality, President Barack Obama seems the least inhibited violator of constitutional safeguards since then, and just might get away with it unless we as a people still care about such things.

The Nixonian failings were summed up in "The Imperial Presidency," a 1973 book written by Arthur Schlesinger Jr., a historian who also spoke out on current events and served in the White House during the Kennedy administration. He argued it was growing war powers in a turbulent world that led to expanded domestic abuses of foundational principles.

These principles, these grand doctrines that have to do with liberty, justice, orderliness and governmental limits, are well summed up by the phrase "rule of law." In a republic, it means that representatives of the people determine laws that will govern not just us but the government leaders themselves. A far more trustworthy arrangement than allow-

ing a few arbitrarily to impose their druthers on the rest of us, the rule of law was made a special wonder in America by our Constitution. It pledges in amendments to protect our individual rights and masterfully divides up power so that one part of government over here checks and balances another over there.

Schlesinger's concern was the imbalance of presidential power that had kept growing and growing until it got entirely out of hand in the Nixon years. His was an administration that followed others in promulgating war acts Congress had not approved, that avoided enforcing laws through varied devices and grossly overstepped still other bounds, ultimately even plotting a burglary. It was as if the only curb on a president was an election every four years, Schlesinger said.

Our democracy did finally catch up with Nixon. I can in fact

remember people happily saying after he resigned that "the system works." But does it? In Obama, we have a president who, among multiple other constitutional bombardments, forgot Congress in his revisions of at least three American laws and made appointments to the National Labor Relations Board and a newly established Consumer Financial Protection Bureau without Senate approval. A president can so act under law if the Senate is in recess. The Senate — by a determination only it can make — was not in recess at the time.

There's a dismaying incongruity here. These two agencies have extraordinary authority, are answerable to hardly anyone or anything, and issue massive gobs of rulings on matters large and small, itself a mighty march from the sensitivities that inspired a revolution. Meanwhile, the man making the appointments is mainly regulated by a Constitution with relatively few rules and can't get them straight, even though he could potentially visit far more catastrophe on us than those citizens the agencies are aiming to control.

The D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals has now ruled

that Obama acted as if he can appoint people to such positions whenever and however he pleases, and flatly says: "This cannot be law." Hurrah, but don't suppose this ruling is the final word or that Obama won't yet sneak past the law on this and far more, a thought that brings us back to the Schlesinger book.

The last chapter, written three decades ago, frets about future presidents — meaning presidents of more recent times — and what it will take to keep them reasonably in tow. The answer, Schlesinger believes, is a public spirit that shakes hands with the spirit of the Constitution. He then quotes the 19th-century poet Walt Whitman, who said tyranny can enter this country any time it chooses and that there is just one "bar against it," namely a "resolute breed" of us Americans. We are either vigilant, demanding rule of law, or we aren't, in which case we won't get it.

## House threatens to dock senators

**I**f the Senate can hold out until May 18, the Democratic-controlled body will have gone four years without passing a budget.

This is a big deal to House Republicans, who regularly pass a budget even though it goes nowhere. When not much else is going on, the House Republicans go into high dudgeon — dudgeon being their default mode — and berate the senators for shameful dereliction of duty.

If anybody — say, the general public — noticed, it might cause a great hue and cry among the good-government types, but the fact is, it goes largely unnoticed, even, one suspects, by many senators.

The House Republican leadership feels that by voting this week to put off a potential default by the U.S. government for four months, it deserves at least a little something — say, a budget from the Senate, preferably one that they can tear apart and ridicule.

The new chair of the Senate Finance Committee, Patty Murray, promises that she'll "try" to have a budget passed by the May deadline, even though the senators are badly out of practice at this sort of thing.

The House thought this assurance a little weak and that the Senate needed bucking up on the budget, so this week it added an amendment that the senators will not get paid unless and until they pass a budget.

The senators are paid \$174,000 annually. Since this represents a nice chunk of change for most of us, the 98 percent who aren't hedge-fund managers, losing that amount of money could hurt. But don't forget that this is Congress we're dealing with.

According to the newspaper Roll Call, over half the senators are millionaires, and others are just a few dollars short of that mark, and could get by quite nicely without their senatorial pay.

Unfortunately, as so often happens with Congress, the Constitution appears to have thwarted the House plans. The 27th Amendment, passed in 1992, another great year for political mischief, says, "No law, varying the compensation for the services of the Senators and Representatives, shall take effect, until the election of Representatives shall have intervened."

The Republicans are so unpopular with the American public that the Democrats would probably be willing to give up that \$174,000 to see

a special House election held. But since one poll shows that the idea of a communist takeover is more popular with the public than the Republicans, it might be best not to take a chance.

The Republicans who dreamed up the no-budget, no-pay scheme like to assume the rough-hewn-workingman persona when explaining it: "When I was splitting rails (or some such appealingly masculine occupation), if I didn't work I didn't get paid."

This sounds like the tough, harsh medicine the Senate needs to act.

Besides, there's that pesky 27th Amendment. The Republicans talking about docking senators' pay for nonperformance generally skip over the fine print in explaining how this no-pay-for-no-work scheme will turn out in the end.

What happens is that the pay of the nonperforming senators goes into an escrow account. If the senators don't pass a budget — don't even show up for work, for that matter (they barely do, anyway, according to the congressional calendar) — they get all that money back at the end of the current Congress.

Not to be too terribly cynical, but even if the senators don't pass a budget this year or next, they'll still probably demand a hefty interest rate on their escrowed pay.

Torrey Pines was his fourth win in his last 16 starts on the PGA Tour. Perhaps a better indication of his game is consistency. He has finished in the top


10 in six of his last seven tournaments around the world, which doesn't sound like that big of a deal except that he hasn't had a stretch like that since he "left" at the end of 2009.

## Kelly doesn't know if hoax affected Teo's play

SOUTH BEND, Ind. — Notre Dame linebacker Manti Te'o didn't show any signs of being affected by the girlfriend hoax leading up to the BCS title game, but his play indicates it may have taken a toll, coach Brian Kelly said Tuesday. "Hindsight is 20-20. I didn't think going into the game he was affected by it.

But he didn't play his best. Alabama had something to do with that, clearly. But I really don't know," Kelly said.

"It's a lot to weigh on the shoulders of somebody. I think we can make the leap that maybe it did. But I think Manti would know for sure."

Te'o said in an interview with ESPN after the news of the hoax broke that it did not affect his performance

in the title game blowout.

Kelly spoke to reporters Tuesday by conference call for the first time since the Irish were beaten 42-14 by Alabama in the BCS title game on Jan. 7. He said his interview the Philadelphia Eagles was mainly to get more information about coaching in the NFL, and his heart remains in college football. He's also working on a contract extension with Notre Dame.
