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# Disarray at SVTA

## Steele rescinds resignation; post eliminated

### Board accepts Pra's resignation, freezes severance package.

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LIVE OAK — The Suwannee Valley Transit Authority Tuesday accepted the resignation of its administrator and abolished the director of operations position after its previous occupant rescinded his resignation during the meeting.



The six-member board expressed concern for the authority's future, faced with an administrative void and financial unknowns as state-ordered changes to how the authority contracts and collects money take effect tomorrow.

Commissioners spent much of the meeting discussing how to proceed now that Administrator Gwendolyn Pra (who was absent from the meeting) resigned from her position as the authority's top non-elected official effective today.

"We've lost two key positions," said Floyd Webb III, SVTA's Planning/Special Projects Manager. "You can count on everything going to snail speed immediately on anything that's got to be done."

Or so they thought — until SVTA attorney Hal Airth made an announcement clarifying Steele's position.

### Steele rescinds resignation

"Mr. Steele has confirmed he has not resigned," Airth said. "He does not intend to resign. I understand there was a draft letter of resignation submitted on his behalf. He has specifically rescinded that. So, at this

time, the board can consider Ms. Pra's resignation but not take any action on Mr. Steele nor discuss any matter dealing with him directly ... Do not discuss

Mr. Steele's issues at all." When Columbia County Commissioner Bucky Nash asked Airth to elaborate on what issues the authority could

or could not discuss regarding Steele, including issues of comp time, Airth replied, "Those are not matters on the agenda. What's on the agenda is the resignation of administrator and the director of operations."

However, Suwannee County Commissioner Ricky Gamble took issue with Airth's explanation.

### 'Agenda not set in stone'

"There was no agenda published, no commissioner received an agenda," Gamble said. "The agenda is not set in stone. An agenda, to my knowledge, can be added to or stricken from at the behest of the meeting."

Commissioners debated with Airth for roughly five minutes

## Common Core-based grading nearly a go

### Schools would be assessed by new state standards.

TALLAHASSEE — A measure aimed at streamlining the state's school-grading system and pausing the most serious consequences for some schools is one step away from Gov. Rick Scott's desk.

The Republican-controlled House readied the bill (SB 1642) for passage Tuesday, battling away complaints from Democrats that the proposal still doesn't give schools enough time to prepare for a new state test set to be used in the coming school year.

Modeled on a blueprint developed by Education Commissioner Pam Stewart, the plan is an effort to simplify the confusing grading formula, making it easier for school administrators and parents to

## Lawsuit against Decker dropped

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A civil suit brought against a local Third Circuit judge was dropped after both parties agreed to dismiss the case due to a lack of legal support for the allegations.

Third Circuit Judge Andrew Decker III faced allegations of legal malpractice when plaintiffs Daniel Dukes and William Woodington accused Decker of misrepresentation and breach of fiduciary duty during foreclosure proceedings in 2011 and 2012.

In their original complaint, the plaintiffs said Decker "wrongfully duped" Dukes and Woodington into conveying their interest in real estate jointly owned with Paul S. Bryan during foreclosure proceedings with TD Bank. "As a direct and proximate result of [Decker's] breaches of

# Colleagues, family remember Weaver

## Former director of Dees-Parrish died at 89 Friday.

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John Robert Weaver, a stalwart in the local mortuary community who served in the business from the late 1940s until earlier this year, is remembered by friends, family and colleagues as a teacher, professional and an honorable gentleman.



Weaver, 89, died Friday, just 10 days short of his 90th birthday.

Debra Lynn Parrish, owner of Dees-Parrish Family Funeral Home, said Weaver was one of her best friends and her mentor for 27 years.

"He never forgot anything," she said. "His brain was as sharp as a tack until the day he had a stroke — even afterwards he knew

who we were. He was the sweetest person you ever wanted to know."

Weaver was the funeral director in charge at Dees-Parrish Funeral Home, but had more than 50 years' experience in the business.

"He served at the Wilson Funeral Home with the old time funeral directors, Theo

Guerry, J.B. Daniels from Live Oak and Branford, Ross Henderson, Joe P. Burns from Perry and Preston Sherrill from Sherrill-Guerry Funeral Home," Parrish said. "They all served together at the Wilson Funeral Home and separated and each opened his own individual firm."

Bill boosts penalty for cross-county crimes

TALLAHASSEE A person crossing county lines to commit a burglary would be subject to enhanced charges under a bill passed by the Senate Tuesday.

The measure (HB 427), which passed 25 to 15, would allow prosecutors to push for a more serious penalty for felony burglary committed by cross-county criminals.

The ability to beef up the charges could also allow judges to ask for higher bond for a suspect, as well as potentially longer or more severe sentences, which are loosely dictated by state law according to the degree of the crime.

For example, under the proposed law, a third-degree burglary could become a second-degree charge if the suspect lives

in Miami-Dade County and goes into Broward, commits a burglary, then heads back home.

Opponents of the bill said it would add an unnecessary law to the books as crime is dropping.

"The crime rate in Florida has dropped because of good policing and ample prosecution," said Sen. Arthenia Joyner, D-Tampa. "Today it's county lines, tomorrow it will be zip codes."

Added Sen. Maria Lorts Sachs, D-Delray Beach: "Let us not vote for a bill that targets Floridians."

The measure provides wide latitude to allow law enforcement to determine county of residence, including place of employment or where a person is enrolled in school.

Survey says: Consumer confidence remains flat

GAINESVILLE — Florida's consumer confidence is remaining flat.

The monthly University of Florida survey released Tuesday shows the state's consumer confidence declined to 79 in the month of April. That's on a scale of 2 to 150 benchmarked to 1966 at a value of 100.

The new survey rating declined one point from March.

Chris McCarty, director of the UF center that does the survey, said the rating remained relatively flat because of a lack of significant economic news. He said that he would expect consumer confidence to remain stable in the next few months.

McCarty did warn that the ongoing dispute over Ukraine could darken consumers' mood.

Congressman Grayson accuses wife of bigamy

ORLANDO — U.S. Rep. Alan Grayson said in papers filed last week that his wife of almost 24 years, Lolita, was married to another man at the time she married the congressman in 1990.

Grayson says he was unaware that his wife was still married when they wed.

The Graysons have five children, and the congressman is seeking parental responsibility for the four minor children.

'Idol' winner to help open monument

WASHINGTON — "American Idol" winner Candice Glover will help reopen the Washington Monument, which has been closed since a 2011 earthquake.

Organizers say the R&B singer will join the Old Guard Fife and Drum Corps, U.S. Navy Band and boy and girl choristers of the Washington National Cathedral Choir for the May 12 re-opening ceremony. Glover will sing "America, the Beautiful."

The "Today" show's Al Roker will host the event. Interior Secretary Sally Jewell, National Park Service Director Jonathan Jarvis and philanthropist David Rubenstein will help celebrate. Rubenstein donated \$7.5 million to cover half the restoration cost.

Book by father of Serena, Venus comes out May 6

Serena Williams' father says he won't return to Indian Wells, Calif., the site of a tournament his daughter has skipped since 2001, when their family was booed — and subjected to racial epithets, according to his new book.

"I would never go back," Richard Williams said in a telephone interview.

But he added that it's up to Serena whether to play at Indian Wells again.

His book, "Black and White: The Way I See It," comes out May 6. It goes into detail about how Indian Wells, in his words, "disgraced America."

Serena was on the entry list for the event this year but withdrew, citing a back injury.

In 1962 Weaver opened the J. Robert Weaver Funeral Home until ill health forced him to retire in 1981. He then went on to work at Biggs Funeral Home and later Dees-Parrish.

"He was irreplaceable. It was an honor to work with him," Parrish said. "He taught me a lot and he was a good teacher. He led by showing you how to do it, he didn't tell you how to do it — he led by example. He was gentle and he was a gentleman. He was loved our business and he honored our business."

Parrish said the love of Weaver's life was his wife, Virginia Townsend Weaver and the two volunteered at the Lake City VA Medical Center for several years.

Weaver volunteered at the facility for 16 years, totaling approximately 1,229 volunteer hours, while Mrs. Weaver volunteered for 15 years, totaling about 1,261 hours.

Nicky Adams, assistant chief of Voluntary Services at the Lake City VA Medical Center, said she knew both of the Weavers from their volunteering efforts with the coffee program.

"Mr. Weaver was a veteran and he enjoyed being around other veterans," she said. "Some of things volunteers do might not be huge, but it doesn't take huge things to help people appreciate what you do."

The Weavers volunteered with recreation services, the eye clinic and the coffee program.

"They were the bright, shiny faces, conversationists that served veterans and their family members coffee," Adams said. "They give a friendly face to the VA, that's what our

volunteers do."

Weaver's daughter, Nancy Ruth Weaver Reissner, North Florida/South Georgia Veteran Health System deputy director, said her father volunteered because he believed in giving back to the community.

"My mother and my father both married their loves of their lives so the one thing I learned from them was priorities, God, family, country and love," she said. "They just showed love on their children. They were a couple that adored each other, their children, God and their country. They believed in hard work and always going the extra mile and they preached it."

Robinette Weaver agreed with her sister's comments about living with their parents and growing up together as a loving and caring family unit.

"It was like being in the Cleaver family," she said, comparing her family life to that of the fictional family from the "Leave It To Beaver" television show.

Col. Walter T. Weaver (U.S. Army-Ret.) said his father was a man of integrity.

"He was a great father and a great inspiration," Weaver said. "He was probably one of the wealthiest men that I have ever known and that's not financial riches. He cared, he was loving, was kind and he was considerate. He was an inspiration."

The younger Weaver said his father gave him the basics and foundation for life to be a father, how to be a role model and how to treat others.

"He always told us that no one is better than you and you are better than no one," he said. "And being in the military, he said that a private is just as important as the general and pay as much respect to each."

understand the marks.

The measure would also do away with the penalties schools could currently receive for the grades assigned in the 2014-15 school year. That move is in part an effort to make up for the state switching from the FCAT, now in use, to an exam crafted by the American Institutes for Research.

The new assessment will measure how well students are learning the state's new education standards, based on the Common Core benchmarks being used in dozens of states.

Democrats say the phase-in period isn't long enough. An amendment offered by Rep. Joe Saunders, D-Orlando, would have given schools three years to adjust to the new system.

"Teachers and principals need adequate time to ensure competency in instruction of our new

state standards — time that, frankly, we haven't given them, even in this bill," Saunders said.

Education groups, including the Florida Education Association, the state's main teachers union, have also called for a longer phase-in period for the new test.

But Rep. Janet Adkins, the Fernandina Beach Republican sponsoring the measure, suggested Saunders' amendment would put the good of schools and adults ahead of what students need.

"For those on the back rows asking for more time, I ask you to ask yourself: Whose best interest does a delay serve?" she said.

The amendment failed on a 73-45 vote.

The proposed changes come against the backdrop of years of disorder within the school grading system, including repeated steps by the State Board of Education to prevent schools from dropping more than one letter grade in the wake of changes to the school report-card formula.

fiduciary duty," the plaintiff's amended complaint read, "[Woodington and Dukes] lost leverage with which to negotiate with TD Bank ... [and were] exposed to a greater portion of liability to creditors."

Dukes and Woodington filed their original complaint March 15, 2013, but agreed to dismiss the case with prejudice April 6 pursuant to Florida Statute 57.105 regarding cases that are "not supported by material facts necessary to establish the claim or defense" or "would not be supported by the application of then-existing law to those

material facts."

Dukes and Woodington were also protected against penalties under the 21-day safe harbor remedy.

"We felt it was frivolous from the beginning," said Attorney Richard Burton Bush, Decker's legal representative in the case. "Judge Decker as an attorney did absolutely nothing to harm them. He didn't do anything that was unethical or violated his duty as a lawyer. When they came after him in the civil lawsuit, they expected ... he would just give up, pay money and walk away. He would not and did not do that."

Donald St. Denis, Dukes and Woodington's attorney in the matter, did not return a call for comment.

# Man faces charge of sexual battery

A White Springs man was arrested after allegedly sexually assaulting a minor, CCSO reports.

Joseph Bryan Davis, 28, of White Springs, was arrested around 12:16 a.m. Sunday after inappropriately touching a female minor between the ages of 12 and 16 following an evening at a Steak 'n Shake, according to the arrest report.

When deputies made contact with the mother and victim, they learned Davis, his friend and the victim left the Steak 'n Shake in a blue Dodge Dakota to drive down Commerce Drive near the Country Club "just to talk," the report said.

During the drive, Florida Highway Patrol stopped the truck for a broken tail light, the report said.

The suspect and his friend allegedly told the victim they were brothers ages 21 and 18, respectively, according to the report.

The victim told police Davis placed his arm around her shoulder ("she did not initially like this but he would not move it") and then "put his hand down her shirt," the report said.

After the victim pushed Davis away, she said he "was really mad punching

things in the truck after this," according to the report.

Davis allegedly told her "he was not crazy" and that "he just had not had sex in six months," the report said.

The victim asserted she did nothing to make Davis believe he could touch her, thought he was unattractive and just wanted to talk with the other male, the report said.

When deputies made contact with Davis and his friend, Davis initially said they never left Steak 'n Shake with the victim, according to the report.

However, the deputy had knowledge of the FHP traffic stop earlier in the evening, the report said.

Davis then told deputies he was under the assumption the victim was 19 years old, according to the report.

The suspect's friend later told deputies Davis did touch the girl, the report said.

Davis violated probation for a previous juvenile sexual abuse incident by exceeding a court-ordered 10:00 p.m. curfew and interacting with a minor without supervision, the report said.

Davis was arrested and booked into Columbia County Detention Facility without bond.

He faces charges of lewd and lascivious battery against a person 12 to 16 years old and a probation violation.

until Columbia County Commissioner and SVTA Chairman Ron Williams pushed the matter forward.

"I really want to discuss it," Williams said. "We'll suffer the consequences later if there are consequences."

Commissioner Nash moved to abolish the Director of Operations position, but fellow commissioners were concerned whether a single person at the head of the authority could sustain it into the future.

"The previous [administration], there was no operations manager ... Look at the shape it was in," said Hamilton County Commissioner Beth Burnam, referring to Pra's predecessor, Jimmy Swisher. "Are you going to be able to find one person who can keep this agency serving the community at the same rate we have done since Ms. Pra came

and was able to do what she did?"

### Position abolished

The board decided by a 4-2 vote to abolish the Director of Operations position with the SVTA, with Burnam and Suwannee County Commissioner Jason Bashaw dissenting.

The board also discussed at length Pra and her role in developing SVTA into a profitable operation during her two-and-a-half year tenure.

"Ray Charles can see that. He's blind and dead," Williams said. "We made a great improvement ... under the leadership of Ms. Gwen."

However, recent events drew scrutiny to Pra. Board members were not made aware of Steele's criminal convictions during his tour or duty in Iraq or that she allegedly used comp time to double her salary in 2013.

"She said, 'Mr. Williams, I told you I'll stick with you

conducting an audit of the SVTA finances following past and current concerns over the authority's bookkeeping procedures, including whether Pra inappropriately doubled her salary in 2013 through comp time.

The board decided unanimously to withhold her requested severance package until the FDOT completed and presented the findings of their audit still underway.

## The haunting of a president not spooked by drone killings

The Almighty answers to no one in exercising the power of life and death over His creatures, and the president of the United States, despite the powerful weapons at his hand, can make no such claim. Barack Obama has some explaining to do for his drone killings of purported terrorists.

The 2nd U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New York ruled last week that the Obama administration must allow the public to review the internal legal documents that justify the president's drone killings of those, including American citizens, who are suspected of terrorism. The Justice Department had claimed that White House executive privilege shields its internal records from public scrutiny, but the court said by releasing selected portions of the documents, the administration waived its right to secrecy.

Few Americans mourned the death of New Mexico-born al Qaeda chief Anwar al-Awlaki when a drone missile found him in Yemen in 2011. But three others were also blown to kingdom come in the attack, including al-Awlaki's teenage son. "Oops" is not an acceptable response when "surgical" strikes result in collateral deaths.

In a rare moment of candor, Mr. Obama said last year he was "haunted" by drone attacks that lead to the death of innocents. That admission, plus the orchestrated leaking of a Justice Department legal justification for the strikes, are clear signs of a president on the defensive for standing as judge, jury and executioner.

The lawyerly paper asserted that an attack is legal when "an informed, high-level official ... has determined that the targeted individual poses an imminent threat of violent attack" on the United States, when "capture is infeasible" and the strike is "conducted consistent with applicable law-of-war principles." This rationale behind Mr. Obama's kill list left the court unconvinced that he was true to the constitutional limits of his office.

The decision to dispatch enemies of the state shouldn't be subject to the political calculus that guides every action of the White House. On the day the appellate court ordered the Obama administration to produce its internal drone policy, U.S. forces joined in an attack backed by drone strikes on an al Qaeda base deep in the remote mountains of Yemen.

At least 55 militants were reported killed. Rather than driven by polls, military commanders are true to their oath of enlistment, to "defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic," when pulling a trigger. Not true of the president.

Despite his pledge to run "the most transparent administration in history," Mr. Obama can't be expected to willingly comply with the court's demand for White House secret drone-use documents. In an era when being president means never having to say you're sorry, Mr. Obama may choose to run out the clock with appeals until his term ends.

If "war is too important to be left to generals," as Georges Clemenceau said, there's no less danger in leaving it exclusively to politicians. With his drone killings, Mr. Obama may be "haunted," but a successor may someday be hunted.

## Mother knew best

Every year when Mother's Day cards show up in the stores, I remember the woman who brought me into this world and often threatened to take me out.

I remember her on other days, too, but especially at Mother's Day. She never cared much for gifts. I could just send a card and give her a call and she'd be happy as a mother clam.

She died nearly 20 years ago of lung cancer after smoking for most of her 70 years. A few months later, I was in a grocery store picking out a Mother's Day card when suddenly I realized I had no one to send it to.

I could send cards to several women who'd been like mothers to me. I loved them dearly. But there was only woman I called "Mama." And she was gone.

It's embarrassing to admit to having a major melt-down over a shelf of Hallmark cards in Safeway. But that is what I did.

I drove home, leaving a cart of groceries in the aisle, ordered a pizza for dinner and started a new Mother's Day tradition: Remembering my mother.

It's not as easy. I'd rather mail a card or make a phone call. Not that my mother isn't memorable. She blazed through life sparking memories like a firecracker in a campfire. But her memories, much like some I'll leave behind, are not all happy. It's hard to live 70 years without a few regrets. My mother may have had more than a few. But she did the best she could. I try to remember that.

Each Mother's Day, I pick a dif-

ferent theme, a different part of who she was that I want to recall. This time it's some of the things she said. For example:

- "You will have children one day and you will know how I feel." It was a threat more than a promise. She was right. I did.

- "You've got to learn to see danger." I did that the minute I gave birth to my first child.

- "Pretty is as pretty does." I'm still working on that one.

- "You can't get blood from a turnip." I never knew what that meant. I still don't.

- "Try to use what little sense the good Lord gave you." I try.

- When I begged her not to send my brother, who was 7 years old and totally blind, to board at the state school, she said, "They'll teach him to read Braille. If he's ever going to have a life, he's got to learn to read." I didn't know at the time those were some of the truest words I'd ever hear.

- When I was a teenager and dared to suggest that she ought to get a life, she replied, "I work five days a week, clean my house on Saturday, go to church and visit my mama every Sunday. I don't need a life. I need help."

- One Christmas, when we fell on hard times (so hard Santa couldn't make it to our house and folks from church gave us a basket with a ham) she said: "Life is a bank. Sometimes you give, other times you take. Either way, it's all the same bank. But try to remember how hard it is to take, because one day, you will do the giving."

My mother was a very smart woman. I spent the first 40 years of my life thinking how different we were, she and I. Lately, I find myself thinking just how much we're alike.

Her favorite question was "When are you coming home?"

My standard reply was, "As soon as I can." It meant not soon and never often enough.

The last thing she said that I can't forget: "You don't know what you've got 'til it's gone."

Mothers come in all varieties. Some never give birth, but spend their lives caring for children who need them.

We all have different styles, different philosophies, different definitions of what it means to be a mother. But one thing most of us can agree on is we'd like to be remembered by our children.

I remember my mother. And someday, when I'm gone, I hope my children will remember me. But in the meantime, I'll gladly take a card or a phone call.

## People tell Congress: Fix Obamacare

House Speaker John Boehner is catching a little heat for making fun of his fellow Republicans' reluctance to deal with immigration reform. "Here's the attitude: 'Ohhh. Don't make me do this. Ohhh. This is too hard,'" he told a Rotary Club crowd in Ohio on Thursday.

"They'll take the path of least resistance," Boehner said.

That's some welcome truth-telling from the speaker. He relayed another political truth at the Ohio event: Congress is not going to repeal Obamacare.

"(To) repeal Obamacare ... isn't the answer. The answer is repeal and replace. The challenge is that Obamacare is the law of the land. It is there and it has driven all types of changes in our health-care delivery system. You can't re-create an insurance market over night."

Boehner has a sound message there for Republicans and Democrats. Obamacare is not going to vanish. It does, though, need to be fundamentally recalibrated....

When President Barack Obama recently declared that 8 million people have signed up for health insurance under the Affordable Care Act, he admonished Republican lawmakers to stop talking about repeal of the law and move on. "This thing is working," he said. "The repeal debate is, and should be, over. We've been having a political fight about this for five years. We need to

move on to something else."

So he and Boehner seem to agree that repeal isn't in the cards.

That part about "moving on," though. That's just Democrats' wishful thinking.

... The RealClearPolitics average of seven recent polls on Obamacare found 41.3 percent of the public supports the law and 52.7 percent opposes it. That's going to be a factor in the midterm elections.

That points to why the congressional debate over an Obamacare overhaul is gaining momentum among Republicans and Democrats. There are still plenty of questions, plenty of doubts.

Republicans are asking how many of those 8 million people who signed up have paid their premiums. State and industry officials estimate about 10 percent to 20 percent have not yet paid, suggesting that, though they signed up, they won't stay with coverage.

Many of the newly insured are discovering the high costs and sharp limits of their new Obamacare-mandated coverage. One example: Steve Pickett, a Californian who signed up for a platinum plan — the highest level of Obamacare coverage available — learned that two of the orthopedic surgeons listed as being in network would not take his insurance. "I felt totally blindsided," he told a Tribune reporter. He's not an isolated case.

The White House announced that

28 percent of enrollees on the federal marketplaces were ages 18 to 34. That's a good sign for the future of Obamacare. Insurers need a heavy dose of healthy people paying premiums to offset the costs of sicker people. If not, premiums rocket and the law totters.

However, many insurers had hoped for higher numbers of healthier people; closer to 40 percent of the overall pool. That has prompted projections of a major premium increase next year, on top of premium spikes many consumers saw this year.

The debate on Obamacare is far from over. As unlikely as it sounds, the country needs Republicans and Democrats to work together on loosening the mandates and restrictions to tame premium increases and give consumers and insurers flexibility to buy and sell the coverage people want and can afford.

Back to Boehner in Ohio: "So the biggest challenge we are going to have ... is the transition of Obamacare back to a system that empowers patients and doctors to make choices that are good for their own health as opposed to doing what the government is dictating they should do."

The reaction from Congress to that? As Boehner might scoff: "Ohhh. Don't make me do this. Ohhh. This is too hard."

Get it done.

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## Symptoms and solutions for high blood pressure

**Dear Pharmacist,** Are there any natural remedies I can take for high blood pressure? I do take medicine but I want to get off because it makes me cough. Can you help? — T.L., Dallas, Texas

**Answer:** Promise to remain supervised by your physician before going off your medicine, some have to be weaned, you can't suddenly stop. High blood pressure is one of those things I consider a symptom rather than a disease itself. It is "silent" meaning there are few obvious signs that you have it until a big event, for example a heart attack. As blood pressure rises, you may get headaches in the back of the head which may feel worse in the morning upon arising. You may also experience dizziness, blurred vision, ringing in the ears, fatigue, nose-bleeds or the urge to urinate at night. So what are your options? Losing weight by exercising will help. A better diet is a must. Because hypertension is a risk factor for heart attack and stroke, physicians take quick action and prescribe medications to lower blood pressure.

**ACE Inhibitors:** Popular ones are lisinopril, benazepril and enalapril. These medications block your ACE enzyme. Natural foods and supplements that do the same thing in a gentler way include garlic, seaweed, pycnogenol,

omega 3 fatty acids, egg yolks, zinc and hawthorn berries.

**Calcium Channel Blockers:** Verapamil, amlodipine and nifedipine. Medications in this category cause relaxation of the blood vessels. Natural options are omega 3 fatty acids, calcium, magnesium, vitamin E, vitamin C, hawthorn berries, NAC and lipoic acid. You should also eat celery.

**Diuretics:** Blockbusters like furosemide and hydrochlorothiazide, these medications cause you to urinate more which reduces the amount of fluid in your blood vessels. When you reduce the squeeze in those tiny cramped ves-

sels, pressure goes down. Natural, gentle "water pills" include vitamin C, potassium, vitamin B6, hawthorn berry, taurine and CoQ10. Celery too!

Certain foods and supplements are direct vasodilators, meaning they open up the blood vessels, thus relieving some pressure. These include taurine, potassium, omega 3 fatty acids, and you guessed it, celery! Even 4 stalks a week could help, more if you like it. Juice it, dip it in hummus or sunflower butter, and if you just can't eat it, then consider supplements of "celery seed" extract. Compounds in celery like "3-n-butylphthalide" are known to reduce blood pressure. In China, this compound (extracted from celery seed) is sold as a drug to reduce beta amylose-induced neuronal apoptosis, which confers protection for people with stroke, dementia and traumatic brain injury (TBI).

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## Foster kids win under health law

MIAMI — Thousands of foster youth are gaining health insurance under the Affordable Care Act.

The new law extends Medicaid coverage for former foster youth who have

aged out of the system and are under the age of 26.

Florida officials say roughly 10,000 former foster youth are eligible. But they aren't automatically enrolled and need to apply for coverage. The provision is aimed at giving

former foster youth the same opportunity for health insurance as their peers who are able to stay on their parent's insurance until they turn 26.

Nearly 6,000 former foster youth applied for Medicaid as of early April.

Columbia High has a way of pulling out dramatic victories against Oakleaf High and Tuesday's Regional Semifinal win against the Lady Knights was no different.

Trailing 2-1 in the bottom of the seventh, Erin Anderson delivered a single to score Tatum Morgan and Brandy Morgan and give the Lady Tigers a 3-2 win.

# Sterling banned for life by NBA

NEW YORK — Issuing about the strongest rebuke that he could, NBA Commissioner Adam Silver banned Los Angeles Clippers owner Donald Sterling for life Tuesday for making racist comments in a recorded conversation, the first step toward forcing a sale of the club and permanently removing Sterling from the league.

Silver also fined Sterling \$2.5 million, and again expressed outrage.

"I fully expect to get the support I need from the other NBA owners to remove him," Silver said.

Several owners immediately chimed in with support of Silver's decision. Sterling, the league's longest-tenured owner and someone with an estimated net worth of about \$2 billion, did not offer any immediate comment.

The penalties, which were announced only three days after the scandal broke, are the harshest ever issued by the league and among the stiffest punishments ever given to an owner in professional sports. Silver said a league investigation found that Sterling was in fact the person on the audiotapes that were released over the weekend and immediately sent shock waves throughout the game.

"We stand together in condemning Mr. Sterling's views," Silver said. "They simply have no place in the NBA."

Sterling acknowledged he was the man on the tape, Silver said.

Sterling still owns the team, but going forward he is immediately barred from attending any NBA games or practices, being present at any Clippers office or facility, participating in any business or player personnel decisions

involving the team, or being part of any league business.

It's unclear how Sterling will respond.

"This league is far bigger than any one owner, any one coach and any one player," said Silver, who as commissioner has broad powers under what's typically called the "best interest of the game" clause of the NBA constitution.

But Silver works for the owners, and he will need 75 percent of them — if all 30 teams vote, he'll need 23 on his side — to force Sterling out of the league completely.

The fine will be donated to organizations dedicated to anti-discrimination and tolerance efforts that will be jointly selected by the NBA and the Players Association, Silver said.

"This has all happened in three days, and so I am hopeful there will be no long-term damage to the league and to the Clippers organization," Silver said. "But as I said earlier, I'm outraged so I certainly understand other people's outrage. This will take some time and appropriate healing will be necessary."

After the announcement, the Clippers' website had a simple message: "We are one," it read.

"We wholeheartedly support and embrace the decision by the NBA and Commissioner Adam Silver today.

Sterling's comments were released over the weekend by TMZ and Deadspin, and numerous NBA owners and players have condemned them. Even President Barack Obama weighed in on the crisis, the first of Silver's brief tenure as commissioner.

"Commissioner Silver thank you for protecting our beautiful and powerful league!! Great leader!!" Miami Heat star LeBron James wrote on Twitter.

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
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
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
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
