## HURRICANE PREP

# Michael still a threat

We may escape a direct hit, but dangers remain.

As Hurricane Michael continued a collision course with the Florida Panhandle on Tuesday, Columbia County looked like it would be spared the brunt of the storm's wrath — but it's still too early to breathe a sigh of relief, according to emergency officials and the National Weather Service.

Michael's projected path was well west of the Lake City area as of Tuesday afternoon, and it was unlikely to shift directions drastically that close to landfall, said National Weather Service meteorologist Phil Peterson. But tornadoes are still possible here, while tropical storm-force winds and hurricane-force gusts are expected, said Columbia County Emergency Management Director Shayne Morgan.

The worst of Michael will likely hit the county between Wednesday and Thursday, forecasts show.

The county will likely see sustained winds of 15-20 miles per hour, Morgan said, emphasizing that nothing was set in stone.

"Can't rule out heavier winds," he said.

Peterson said gusts could reach 40 or 50 mph.

Morgan said there was still a concern the winds would blow tree branches into power lines.

Isolated power outages are likely and widespread outages are possible, Morgan said Tuesday afternoon.

County Public Works Director Kevin Kirby said he's organized his staff into teams, each with a designated zone to patrol and search for anything blocking roads.

"Our main goal is to keep

At the county fairgrounds, one of the state's three mobile command centers, utility companies are gearing up and getting ready for any action Hurricane Michael might bring.

Roughly 300 trucks, 880 Florida Power and Light employees and 1,350 linemen in all, plus contractors, are at the ready to restore power wherever needed in the wake of Michael, said

Bill Orlove, FPL spokesperson.

By 3 p.m. Monday, lines of bucket trucks had formed and mobile offices were being constructed from crates brought in on flatbed trailers.

Orlove said they had everything they needed to be fully functional regardless of what happened to the local power grid.

"We could feel effects of rain bands, high winds and heavy rain," Orlove said. "Our crews can restore power so long as sustained wind gusts are below 35 mph, as long as it's safe to do so."

Orlove said they were gathering here to help affected area customers, but also to assist other utility companies in areas of the state hit harder by Michael.

"We're prepared to assist our other partner electric companies, and to assist them in helping our fellow Floridians," Orlove said.

The area has served as staging ground for utility crews for years, and multiple hurricanes among them Irma, Matthew and Hermine.

Sarasota and Daytona Beach were the two other staging areas in the state for the storm.

Orlove said he'd driven from FPL's Palm Beach headquarters Monday.

"This time of year we need to be at the ready," Orlove said. "We're putting

## Party in the Pines, major country concert, canceled

Reason for abrupt cancellation unclear.

Party in the Pines, a widely promoted country music concert at Bienville

Plantation in Hamilton County, has been canceled.

Robert Morey, the owner of Bienville Plantation, gave the Lake City Reporter the news by phone late Tuesday afternoon.

The reason for the cancellation was not immedi-

ately clear.

"There are a lot of forces in play beyond our control we don't understand," Morey said. "It will take a while to sort it out."

He said his first priority would be to refund sponsors and customers for tick-

et sales, though for the time being, "all our funds are held by the artists' agency."

"We beg for understanding," Morey added.

He said a news release would be issued later Tuesday, but the Lake City Reporter was on an accel-

erated press deadline due to Hurricane Michael and could not wait.

It is not clear if Party in the Pines will be rescheduled for next year.

"I can't be optimistic right now," Morey said. Party in the Pines

debuted in October 2017 and was set for Oct.19-20 this year in White Springs.

"This was an event that was so impactful to the community," Morey said.

The Zac Brown Band and Little Big Town were scheduled to headline.

Ron Barker, principal of Belmont Academy, helped present the awards to his students and later commented on the accomplishment. "That is a lot of people for a school this size," Barker said.

## Humane society readies for post-storm strays

Bring in the dogs, bring in the cats and make sure the cows, donkeys, horses and pigs have somewhere dry to go and something to eat as they wait out Hurricane Michael like the rest of us, a local animal official said.

Each year there are hurricanes and each year, despite the magnitude, the humane society assistant director said they see an

uptick in rescues and strays from storms.

Dale Griffin, with the Humane Society of Lake City, said there was an easy solution if pet owners only would, "take the responsibility for their pets just as they would somebody else in their household."

He's worked with Humane Society and Columbia County Animal Control for 10 years, and has seen a decade's worth of hurricanes and the resulting increase in strays.

"That happens every year," Griffin said. "We find them loose or we find them in the yard."

Griffin said there were a few actions residents should take depending on their hurricane plan.

"All domestic pets should be put indoors in some way, with food and water to at least get through the hours of the storm," Griffin said.

He said if a pet owner was planning to leave the area, if possible, they should take their animals with them.

"In a perfect scenario, if they leave, they take their pets with them," Griffin said. "If that's not an option at least they secure them."

First on Griffin's list of what-not-to-do was chain a pet.

"Leaving them on a chain is definitely not a good thing to do," Griffin said. "We have had the times where we've had to remove the dead bodies from the chains."

On Tuesday, the humane society was doing its own preparations for Hurricane Michael.

## Parties spar over voter reg deadline

As what Gov. Rick Scott called a "monstrous" storm barreled toward the Panhandle, Florida Democrats filed a lawsuit asking a court to extend Tuesday's deadline for voters to register for the November elections.

The federal complaint came after the Scott administration gave elections supervisors in dozens of counties in the path of Hurricane Michael — a potentially devastating storm expected to make landfall Wednesday — more time to register voters.

Late Monday night, Secretary of State Ken Detzner issued a directive authorizing elections supervisors whose offices were closed Tuesday "to accept paper voter registration applications for the 2018

general election on the next day that his or her office is reopened."

"This will ensure that each supervisor of elections office has the same amount of days to register voters at their offices," Detzner wrote.

Voters also have the option of registering online until 11:59 p.m. Tuesday, a deadline that wasn't extended, Detzner said in the memo.

But in the lawsuit filed Tuesday against Detzner, lawyers for the Florida Democratic Party argued "his 'solution' is insufficient and confusing."

"It does not adequately protect the voting rights of Florida citizens who cannot register to vote by the October 9 registration deadline," party lawyers Mark Herron and Marc

Elias wrote in the 17-page complaint asking a federal judge to issue an injunction banning Detzner from enforcing the Tuesday deadline and extending the voting-registration period until at least Oct. 16.

Scott "is focused on keeping Floridians safe as a major hurricane rapidly approaches our state," spokesman John Tupps said in an email.

The lawsuit came as Scott, who is running against Democratic U.S. Sen. Bill Nelson in November, held news conferences Tuesday in Northwest Florida and further south on the Gulf Coast and urged residents and visitors to prepare for what the governor warned could be "the most destructive storm to hit the Florida Panhandle in decades."

Take Stock in Children, a statewide nonprofit mentoring program with a scholarship incentive, needs volunteers to serve as mentors to high school students.



Mentors in the "Change a Life Over Lunch" program are paired with deserving, low-income, at-risk students.

the infrastructure open," Kirby said.

The county declared a state of emergency Tuesday morning during a meeting at the Combined Communications Center.

Lake City officials did the same later in the day.

Tuesday morning, the communications center was packed with representatives from the county, city, school district, local Florida Department of Health office and various law enforcement agencies, among others.

Before the meeting formally opened, emergency management officials from various Florida counties held a conference call to give status updates.

Morgan said Columbia County would be opening emergency shelters at Winfield Community Center, Fort White Community Center and Westside Community Center.

"Our forecast is much more favorable," Morgan said during the meeting.

County public schools will be closed today and Thursday, Superintendent Lex Carswell announced Tuesday, citing anticipated tropical storm-force winds.

"We can't transport kids under those conditions," Carswell said. "We want everybody to be safe."

Florida Gateway College is closed today, as are all Third Judicial Circuit courts.

The Columbia County Tax Collector's office will be closed today and Thursday due to systems in Tallahassee possibly being compromised.

The county announced its offices would be running on a skeleton crew.

## Electric co-ops make ready for Hurricane Michael

Electric cooperatives are finalizing preparations and enacting emergency plans ahead of Hurricane Michael's landfall.

"As Hurricane Michael strengthens and threatens Florida, the state's electric cooperatives are prepared for a strong storm with anticipated power outages," said Mike Bjorklund, general manager of the Florida Electric Cooperatives Association. "As always, the safe-

ty of co-op employees and members is our first priority. We are working with restoration personnel from Florida and neighboring states to coordinate a comprehensive power restoration process. These additional crews and resources will be essential as Florida's electric co-ops work to restore power once the storm dissipates."

"We are very fortunate to have the help of our state association," said Suwannee Valley

Electric Cooperative CEO Michael McWaters. "They provide the invaluable service of obtaining aid from other electric cooperatives and directing it to where it is needed most."

Once the storm passes, impacted Florida co-ops will conduct damage assessments, while implementing power restoration plans.

our plans in place."

As of Monday afternoon he said there had yet to be any reported outages.

"The storm looks like it's going to be west of our area," Orlove said.

"Right now this is pretty much a monitoring center."

However, he said no speculation could be made of the likelihood in the future with what he called

"residual outages" a likelihood.

He directed customers to FPL social media, both its Facebook and Twitter accounts for updates.

# Pharmacy traffic was up in preparation for hurricane

As Hurricane Michael bore down on Florida Tuesday, residents swamped local pharmacies to get their prescriptions filled before the storm hit.

Joel Rosenfeld, pharmacy manager at North Florida Pharmacy, estimates that there had been a 20 percent increase in orders as the storm approached.

"Yesterday (Monday) we filled 1,000 prescriptions and we don't know how many we're going to fill today, but people are concerned," he said Tuesday. "We might

not have power like last year because of a hurricane, but they're thinking ahead and trying to have all their medications in case something bad happens."

Rosenfeld equated the surge of customers getting their prescriptions filled to people stocking up on water to prepare for the storm.

North Florida Pharmacy provides a 24/7 emergency service and if a customer determined they needed a medical item, someone on staff would help them.

"We haven't had any requests after hours to fill anything yet," Rosenfeld said.

"There are no plans to change our hours.

Even if we don't have power we'll still be open. We had a generator last year, so on the day there was no power, we were still open, but we did have decreased hours."

AJ Ward, pharmacist/manager at Baya Pharmacy, also said the store has experienced increased traffic with customers looking to get their prescriptions filled as soon as possible.

"There's been a heavy influx of patients," he said. "The influx began yesterday (Monday) morning. We haven't quite doubled in prescriptions filled, but we've greatly increased."

Ward said the pharmacy has enough staff to accommodate the increase.

"Everybody is wanting to wait" to get their orders filled, he said. "Nobody is wanting to go home and then come back and I get that."

Ward said the pharmacy will maintain its current staffing numbers as the storm approaches and he expects the number of patients looking to have prescriptions filled will be steady.

"It's important to get their prescriptions filled now in case there is a power failure or a gas shortage and they can't get to us," he said. "That way they'll have all their medications if the storm does hit here. People need their medication, definitely."

## Powell's rip of Trump falls on deaf ears

Colin Powell, who served in the lead spot at the State Department under George W. Bush, took a nationally televised opportunity on CNN and turned it into hit job on President Donald Trump. Again.

For starters, this time, he characterized the White House as immoral; dinged the administration for its crackdown on illegal immigration; and called out Trump for sidestepping the "we the people" of the Constitution in favor of a "me the president" approach. Everybody's entitled to an opinion.

But Powell's been on an anti-Trump rant for years. He should realize Trump supporters, when confronted with the arguments of Never Trumpers, simply dig in deeper on their Trump support.

"We're walking away from agreements, we're walking away from the alliances that we used to have," Powell said. "The president goes to Europe to a NATO meeting, but he starts out by insulting some of the other participants, our allies. America has to take a hard look at itself."

For what exactly? For pulling out of bad agreements?

Trump, who campaigned in part on pulling America out of terrible deals — the Iran nuclear agreement that compromised Western and Israeli security, the horrible trade pacts that buoyed global wealth at the expense of American ingenuity and America's economy — is simply honoring his campaign promises. It's no surprise he's ending these agreements; it's what he promised voters he'd do.

These are deals that don't work for America and Trump, the "America First" president, is taking decisive action. That's what good leaders do.

But Powell, who's always had a problem with this president, calls it immoral.

"My favorite three words in our Constitution is the first three words, 'We the people. We the people,'" he said. "Recently, it has become me the president as opposed to we the people. You see things that should not be happening. How can a president of the United States get up and say that the media is the enemy of Americans? Has he read the First Amendment? ... If we keep doing things like this and creating additional fissures, it's not going to serve use well on the international stage. I hope the president can come to the realization that he should really stop insulting people."


This, from the guy who was outed in September 2016 for slamming Trump, in emails that went public, a "national disgrace," and an "international pariah" who was fueling the "racist" "birther" movement against Barack Obama.

Thing is, though: Trump supporters are on a bit of an edge now, feeling a bit raw and angry over a very evil leftist attempt to destroy the character, reputation and career of Brett Kavanaugh — make that Supreme Court Justice Kavanaugh. Powell's anti-Trump attack is bad timing.

He just appears part and parcel of the whole movement to destroy conservative characters.

And while people may be listening — because his face is on the TV screen — fact is, Powell's ability to influence stands at zero. His opinion, on Trump, just doesn't matter.

## Facebook surveillance? Bad timing

Facebook Inc. constantly asks its users how they're feeling about the social network. Those temperature checks of more than 2 billion people must give the company evidence that it has passed the peak of public suspicion stirred by its fumbles in protecting people's digital information, doubts about the company's political motives and scandals about its role as a tool for foreign propagandists, conspiracy theorists and violent mobs.

Facebook knows its audience — or at least it has a lot of information about it. But I think Facebook is still misreading the mood.

Facebook on Monday unveiled two home gadgets for video chats like those on Skype or FaceTime. The company has been working on video conference hardware for some time but decided to put the project on hold earlier this year because of public outrage about Facebook's data-privacy practices.

With the debut of the Portal device and its sibling, the Portal+, the company has apparently decided that now is the right time to persuade Americans to put Facebook microphones, data-harvesting technologies and video cameras inside their homes. To which I say — nope. And also, why?

Offering devices that sit permanently in living rooms and facilitate conversations with friends and family is a different kind of intimate relationship than people already have with Facebook. The company has made technology tweaks to the Portal devices to guard people's privacy. Bloomberg News reported that the microphone and camera can be turned off, and some of the computing functions are done on the devices themselves rather than by firing digital information back-and-forth to Facebook's computer systems. These devices are still too much of a leap of faith right now for Facebook to ask of its users. I can't understand why Facebook

is risking the fragile faith of the public and government officials by releasing hardware that seems at best ancillary to its business future. Is now really the right time to pitch Americans on Facebook-branded home surveillance devices? Remember that the company has forever tried to bat down conspiracy theories that it taps smartphone microphones to collect information about people's phone calls and private conversations. CEO Mark Zuckerberg even had to address that question from members of Congress. When people already suspect that Facebook is spying on them, it is a bridge too far to ask them to plant a literal Facebook listening device in their homes.

A Pew Research Center survey conducted in the spring found that a large share of Americans reported taking breaks from using Facebook. Another Pew poll found a majority of Americans of all political affiliations believe social networks censor political speech that the companies find objectionable. In North America, daily use of Facebook has flatlined, although it's not clear that is a result of its image problem. None of this is solid proof that Facebook's many scandals have turned people away from using the social network, but they are data points that people may not like or trust Facebook wholeheartedly.

Again, Facebook may have a better handle on people's faith in Facebook products than anyone

else, including me. Or the company may be blind to public sentiment. I was stunned that after months of controversy about how Facebook mishandled people's personal information, Zuckerberg, in an interview in May with Wired, seemed surprised at a question about possible public backlash to a Facebook online dating service he had just announced.

It's possible that even as Zuckerberg and others at Facebook apologize at every turn for violating the public's trust, they still don't really grasp how much they violated the public's trust. It wouldn't be the first time that Facebook's instincts are wrong.

Facebook isn't completely clueless. The company is savvy enough to address doubts up front about data-privacy protections for the Portal devices. Contrast that with Amazon.com Inc., which last month announced a dizzying number of new gadgets powered by the company's Alexa voice-activated software. Amazon didn't devote a single moment to talking about protecting the information of people who elect to put an all-knowing, always-listening Amazon data-harvesting device in their homes and cars. Given the justified public concerns about digital privacy, this was a stunning omission by Amazon.

Facebook has far more baggage than Amazon, of course. Credit Facebook for making its video chat devices less creepy than they could have been, but that doesn't make them creepy-free. The public is already inclined to be wary about Facebook and its intentions. That's why it makes little sense for Facebook to test people's fragile faith when it has relatively little to gain.

## Finally, something Congress can agree on

In this age of partisan bickering in Washington, we're pleased to spotlight rays of bipartisan congressional cooperation on a national crisis: opioid abuse.

After months of hard work, much of it led by U.S. Rep. Michael Burgess, R-Texas, and Texas GOP Sen. John Cornyn, a comprehensive bill to address the medical and social scourge of opioid addiction lacks only Donald Trump's signature to become law. The president, who declared opioid addiction a national emergency, is expected to sign the bill, providing new weapons to curtail an epidemic that has shattered families and communities.

The measure, which passed the House and Senate by overwhelming bipartisan margins, would make it easier for first responders to obtain naloxone, an anti-overdose treatment, and would increase research into non-opioid pain treatment as an alternative to legally prescribed but addictive opioids. The bill also

offers greater support for treatment programs and drug courts, and steps up law enforcement resources to prevent fentanyl and other deadly synthetic drugs from coming into the United States.

Opioid addiction is such a widespread problem that congressional action is a strong first step but, unfortunately, not a complete solution. Opioid deaths are higher than the peak yearly death totals from car crashes or gun violence. Nationally, opioid-related overdoses occurred at 116 per day in 2016 — five times the rate in 1999, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Opioid abuse is a problem in our backyard, too. In Dallas County, at least 1,928 people have died of opioid or heroin overdoses since 2011, according to a Dallas Morning News review of autopsy records earlier this year. Federal law enforcement officials in North Texas have a nine-agency strike force, one of just a handful across

the country, to focus on violent gangs that traffic in heroin and synthetic opioids from Mexico and China.

Congress needs to stay on top of opioid abuse and be prepared to tweak or expand strategies as the crisis evolves and to provide additional dollars in other budget cycles. The Congressional Budget Office estimates the bill could cost \$8 billion over five years, a fraction of the tens of billions that addiction experts say is needed for treatment and other intervention. A landmark report from the surgeon general two years ago concluded that only about 28 percent of people with an opioid problem receive specialty treatment.

The good news is that Democrats and Republicans found common ground on many issues and didn't let the perfect be the enemy of the good. For now, we'll call that a big win.

Wrapping yourself in a weighted blanket when you feel alone can increase oxytocin levels and provide instant calm.

4. Could it help with attention problems? The gentle tactile feeling of deep touch pressure can work as a relaxer to significantly increase the concentration and performance of children with ADHD.

There is also evidence that the extra sensory stimulation from a weighted blanket can help children improve their fine motor skills, especially if they have autism. In fact, these blankets were first invented as a stress aid for autistic children.

5. Obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) can be challenging to manage, but using a weighted blanket might help to control the symptoms. These heavier blankets boost your serotonin levels, which works to reduce symptoms of OCD, calm the mind and hopefully reduce

compulsions.

For these same reasons, the blankets can also improve other emotional issues or cognitive problems connected to low serotonin levels, including aggression, bipolar disorder, and PTSD. At our deepest core, we all want to be cuddled, right? It's kind of like that!

## Class about Type 1 diabetes has a twist: Students are living with the disease

GAINESVILLE — The sound of beeping during a typical University of Florida lecture might draw a few quizzical glances, some people perhaps wondering why anyone would still be using an outdated pager.

When the beeping interrupts a certain directed research class, however, seven heads look down in unison. All seven have Type 1 diabetes and they know it is the sound of an insulin pump. But whose?

Sometimes a class is just a class. This one is a class and a community.

As part of an effort to make UF a destination and inviting home for students with Type 1 diabetes, the UF Diabetes Institute offers a two-credit course each spring semester providing

students with an introduction to groundbreaking research underway at the institute. It exposes students to professional pathways in diabetes research that might influence their career trajectories, class organizers say. Sometimes, students attend because they just want to know a little bit more about diabetes.

In the end, it's a course led by the leading minds in diabetes science and treatment for those people the class instructor calls the real experts: students living with the disease.

"Think about how reassuring it is to be in a room where they don't have to explain diabetes to anyone, where everyone understands why you're checking your blood sugar or what an

insulin pump is," said Ashby Walker, Ph.D., a member of the UF Diabetes Institute and an assistant professor who leads the class. "There is no greater support system as an undergraduate than having a robust group of peers around you who know exactly what it's like to live with Type 1 diabetes."

A science background is not a prerequisite, nor, for that matter, is a Type 1 diabetes diagnosis. But the course is geared for students who have a "personal connection" to Type 1 diabetes, an autoimmune disease in which the pancreas stops producing insulin. The disease affects up to 1 in 300 children or young adults, and it can occur at any age.



# Mullen finding a knack for trick plays at No. 14 Florida

New Gators coach using his bag of tricks to ignite team's offense in 2018.

GAINESVILLE — Jump pass. Double pass. Rocker step. Throwback toss. Those are apparently just a glimpse into Dan Mullen's playbook.

The first-year Florida coach has turned to a little trickery to help the 14th-ranked Gators mask their offensive deficiencies.

"Daring Dan" is perfect on the season with them, too.

His latest play-calling masterpiece came Saturday against LSU. Mullen dialed up a throwback pass from seldom-used tight end Lucas Krull, a former left-hander pitcher at Arkansas, to quarterback Feleipe Franks that set up the go-ahead touchdown in a 27-19 victory.

The timing was impeccable. The execution was flawless. The outcome was something Florida players and coaches are starting to expect.

A week earlier, the Gators used a double pass nicknamed "Kodak" to beat Mississippi State 13-6. The play was named after rapper and Florida fan Kodak Black.

So what about Krull's 15-yard

# Offensive line play proves problematic for Bortles, Jaguars

Chiefs had 5 sacks, 24 QB pressures in Sunday's win.

JACKSONVILLE — Blake Bortles was largely ineffective despite a career-high 430 yards passing against Kansas City. His offensive line was the biggest problem.

The Jacksonville Jaguars failed to give Bortles enough time or protection in a 30-14 loss at the Chiefs on Sunday. Bortles was sacked five times, fumbling once, and hurried way more often.

According to Pro Football Focus, Jacksonville's line allowed 24 total quarterback pressures — seven more than any other NFL team in Week 5.

"We take an immense amount of pride in our work," backup left tackle Josh Walker said Monday. "That's going to be the goal of our group this week: to be more determined to be better and do a better job in

protecting Blake. We've got to keep him clean. That's our job and that's what we're going to do.

"We're fine. We're not worried about things. We're going to fix things."

The Jaguars (3-2) might have to make some roster changes to find help.

Left tackle Josh Wells has a groin injury that could cause him to miss Sunday's game at Dallas (2-3), and tight end Austin Seferian-Jenkins is headed to injured reserve and will have core muscle surgery.

Coach Doug Marrone said Wells is "week to week" and Seferian-Jenkins is expected to return later in the year.

Running back Corey Grant (foot) also is done for the season, joining Leonard Fournette on the sideline. Fournette is expected to miss his fourth game of the season because of a sprained right hamstring.

The Jaguars are planning to sign a running back and likely will do the same at left tackle.

Koepka is the sixth player in the last six years to win the award, the longest streak of different winners since PGA Tour players began voting on the award in 1990.

Along with winning two majors, Koepka said he was most proud of his attitude when he wasn't playing. He missed four months at the start of the year recovering from a partially torn tendon in his left wrist but then made up for lost time in a big way.

## Rays extend Kevin Cash's contract through 2024

ST. PETERSBURG (AP) — The Tampa Bay Rays, who won more games than any American League team that didn't make the playoffs, have rewarded manager Kevin Cash with a contract extension that runs through 2024, plus a club option for 2025.

The 40-year-old Cash had one year remaining on a five-year, \$5 million deal he signed when he replaced Joe Maddon after the 2014 season.

Financial terms were not disclosed. Both Cash, who had no previous managerial experience when he was hired, and management said it was an easy decision to continue their relationship after a bounce-back season.

for plays until about four or five years ago. That's just one we've had for a long, long time. But, sorry. I've got to be more creative than just throwback."

One will mind plain as long as it's productive.

And the Gators (5-1, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) have been productive while winning three straight. It hasn't been particularly pretty on offense, mostly because the team's line is a work in progress and Franks is far from a polished passer.

Mullen, to his credit, has found ways to get the most out of both.

He's not asking the line to try to handle more physical fronts in a league filled with them, and he has Franks making quick reads and, if nobody is open, scrambling for yards.

Add in some deception, and Mullen and the Gators are doing enough to complement a stout defense that continues to be the backbone of the team.

"He's got every trick in the bag and he knows when to call the right play at the right time," Krull said. "He's tremendous at what he does."

On a first-and-10 play at the LSU 17 and trailing 19-14, the 6-foot-6 Krull started in motion from right to left, took a hand-off that resembled an end-around and then pulled up and floated a pass back to Franks, who had slipped into the flat mostly unnoticed.

Franks was tackled at the 2, setting up Lamical Perine's touchdown run on the next play.

"I was hoping someone would run with me and I'd kind of snatch it off someone's

head or something like that (and) make 'SportsCenter' top plays," Franks said.

It certainly will end up on Franks' growing highlight reel.

He threw a jump pass for a touchdown in the season opener , stirring memories of Florida great Tim Tebow. Franks started the double pass last week, the one that ended with Kadarius Toney's 20-yard TD toss to Moral Stephens.

Franks' 13th touchdown pass of the season came Saturday on a rocker step to Stephens, another play Tebow made famous at Florida. Franks took the shotgun snap, stepped toward the line of scrimmage like he was about to tuck it and run, and then rocked back and completed a 3-yarder to Stephens.

"It wasn't really an ode to Tebow," Mullen said. "It was an ode to score touchdowns. When you get down in there, you got to defend the quarterback because we're willing to run the quarterback, and Feleipe is a willing runner. So all of the sudden that adds an extra person. Eyes get caught to him, people lost man coverage and we get somebody wide open in the end zone."

Mullen insists there are plenty more wrinkles in his playbook. Others could show up Saturday at Vanderbilt (3-3, 0-2), which has dropped 26 of the last 27 in the series.

"We have a bunch of them and you practice them," Mullen said. "It's more about your comfort level at executing it because it's a big risk-reward play."

"You pick trick plays for certain defenses, certain looks, how they fit. We've got a bunch more in the back pocket for when the time calls. If you call it at the right time and it works, you look like a genius, right? Or you call it and it doesn't work and: 'That guy's an idiot. How did they think that would work?' It's a lot about timing."



"When you add and you're missing some key players, you have to play to the strengths of what they can do," Marrone said. "It is a challenge for us, but there are teams that go through those same challenges. It's going to be on us as coaches to do a good job of putting in the right plays, going to the right people and being able to go

and execute it." The O-line was Jacksonville's weak link last year, failing to create holes for Fournette in the second half of the season. The Jags thought signing All-Pro left guard Andrew Norwell to a five-year, \$66.5 million contract in free agency would solidify the front. But Norwell has been average, at best, while playing alongside three different left tackles: Cam Robinson, Wells and Walker. Robinson is out for the season with a knee

injury. "We need to trust in each other," Wells said. "The expectation level is still going to remain high. We need to put our head down and go back to work." The Jaguars essentially abandoned the running game after falling behind 20-0 late in the second quarter. That put a lot of pressure on Bortles and even more stress on the line, which really struggled against speedy linebacker Dee Ford. Bortles completed 33 of

61 passes, with one touchdown and four interceptions. "Everyone is in a tough situation," Marrone said. "You turn around the next day (and) you want to run the football. Looking back, maybe we started throwing it a little too early. Maybe we just were pressing too much early. ... You're always going to look at that and you're not going to sit here and say that, 'Hey, we're a team that wants to throw the ball 60-something times.'"
