State park admission free on Sunday

On Sunday, there will be free entry to Florida's state parks to mark National Park and Recreation Day.

"We will be very, very, very busy," said Brian Addison, park manager of St. Andrews State Park in Bay County. "We've been very busy every day, in fact. Especially on the weekends."

To beat the crowd, Addison recommended people arrive early. The gates open at 8 a.m., and people are often lined up waiting to get in. Early arrival is particularly important for those who want space at a pavilion, some of which can be reserved in advance. The park closes at sunset.

TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE

Woman charged with drug and child abuse

VERNON — Washington County Sheriff's Office has reported the July 12 arrest of Amy Karen Watson, 26, of Chipley on drug and child abuse charges.

A WCSO report indicates that deputies responded to a call about a reckless driver at the Tom Thumb in Vernon. Deputies said when they arrived, they found Watson passed out behind the wheel of her vehicle with a lit cigarette in her hand that had burned a hole in the steering wheel.

With Watson were her two children, ages 6 and 3, in the back seat of the vehicle.

After deputies woke Watson, they received permission to search her vehicle and found nine syringes, drug paraphernalia, hydrocodone and oxycotin, according to the arrest report.

Both children were taken into protective custody, and Watson was arrested and charged with possession of a controlled substance without a prescription, child neglect and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Watson is being held at the Washington County Jail on a bond of \$8,500.

DOE awards \$3.6 million in rural school grants

PANAMA CITY BEACH — The Florida Department of Education awarded \$3.6 million Thursday for the creation of special programs in 13 rural North Florida school districts.

The award presentation was conducted during the closing ceremonies of the 44th annual Leadership Conference at the Bay Point Marriott.

"We are just really excited," said Patrick McDaniel, executive director of the Panhandle Area Educational Consortium (PAEC).

The Race to the Top federal

funds will be distributed by PAEC, which represents small, rural school districts. The grant will be for three years starting in the 2011-2012 fiscal year and will be used to identify and train students in science, technology, engineering and math curriculum (STEM).

The school districts in the Florida Panhandle and Big Bend that will benefit from the funds include Calhoun, Franklin, Gadsden, Gulf, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Liberty, Madison, Taylor, Walton, Wakulla and Washington counties.

"We will use this money in the district to identify students for STEM opportunities," McDaniel

said. "This grant means that students in small rural districts will have access to some new courses."

The announcement of the grant was made by Mary Jane Tappen, the deputy chancellor for curriculum, instruction and student services for the Florida Department of Education.

"We need to find a way to grow our gifted and talented students in this area," Tappen said. "I'm thrilled that PAEC was awarded this grant, and I look forward to working together for the next three years."

"We still have a lot of work to do," Tappen said.

Kiwanis Club hears from Dixie baseball coach

At their July 5 lunch meeting, the Kiwanis Club of Chipley welcomed Dr. Gabriel Berry, coach of the district champion 9- and 10-year-old Dixie Youth boys baseball team, heard a report on the Take Stock in Children mentoring/scholarship program from David Solger and inducted one new member, Tommy Sasser.

Berry's hard-hitting baseball team has won battles over rivals Bonifay and Graceville to advance to the state playoffs. Chipley Kiwanis donated

\$300 toward travel costs and congratulates the entire team on their extraordinary season.

David M. Solger, president and program coordinator for the Washington County Take Stock in Children, explained how the program works to encourage and support young students through mentoring and the funding of college tuition.

The program is made up of six principles:

- * A student's personal commitment to success

- to promote self-accountability: Since 1995, more than 16,000 children in the state of Florida have been enrolled in the Take Stock in Children Program. Upon selection, students and parents/guardians sign contracts agreeing to fulfill specific performance standards.

To be awarded their scholarships, students must stay in school, maintain good grades, exhibit good behavior, remain crime-free and drug-free and meet with their mentors once

weekly. Students are held accountable; if they do not fulfill program standards, they risk losing their valuable college scholarship.

- * Parental involvement — increasing the chances of success: Parents or legal guardians are responsible for supporting and encouraging their children's academic success by developing positive relationships with teachers, mentors, school administrators and Take Stock In Children staff and by playing active roles in

the educational, cultural and school-based activities of their child.

- * Motivation and support — volunteer mentoring: Each child is matched with a caring adult mentor who meets with the student at his/her school for an hour each week. These volunteer mentors are recruited, trained, supported, monitored and evaluated by Take Stock in Children. Mentors provide academic and behavioral motivation, guidance, friendship and support and are encouraged to continue their service over a multi-year period with their Take Stock in Children student.

- * Academic assistance — student advocates/case managers: Each child in the program is assigned a student advocate/case manager who meets with the student and provides assistance and program support to ensure his/her academic success. Student advocates work closely with mentors and school personnel to confirm each child is achieving continued success.

- * College scholarships — hope for a better future: Each child who successfully fulfills the requirements of Take Stock in Children receives a fully paid college tuition scholarship. Students who prefer post-secondary vocational training may select a vocational education option or a course of study at a community college leading to a two-year technical degree.

Continuation of mentoring — increasing likelihood of college graduation: Beginning in 2010, college transition and retention services are provided for qualified candidates through their freshman year of college attendance.

Solger said candidates are made of three groups: those with low income but who are otherwise not at risk, making up 10 percent of candidates; those at high risk with one or more parent or sibling incarcerated in large or single-parent families, making up 20 percent of candidates; and the remaining 70 percent, candidates who might not have active risk factors but are on the fence and might benefit from the encouragement and accountability the program provides. All successful candidates must be a first-generation college candidate from his family. The local board is made up from more than 80 volunteers and has had some success with local honor and valedictorian high school graduates. Vernon High alone had seven scholarships in 2009. Last year, seven more scholarships were awarded countywide, and 12 scholarships are available in 2011.

Funding of scholarships is made possible from the donations of private citizens and bright futures/matching state grants. This year will mark 100 students served with tuition scholarships at a cost in today's money of more than \$14,000. charged in the robbery of Gorgeous Nails. The Washington County News is withholding the name and photograph of the girl in accordance with its policy not to report the names or print the images of juvenile offenders.

According to Crews, the girl entered the business at closing time and held employees inside at gunpoint, demanding all the money from the register. The suspect fled the scene in a red Pontiac.

Since the crime was reported, officers of the Chipley Police Depart-

ment have worked with the Leon County Sheriff's Office and Jacksonville Sheriff's Office in pursuing and identifying the suspect. As a result, the girl has been charged in this armed robbery and an armed robbery that occurred in Leon County.

"Through the coordinated efforts of several law enforcement agencies, we have been able to work together to clear two armed robbery cases to include the robbery that occurred at Gorgeous Nails," Crews said.


