Chipola student raises \$20,000 for research

MARIANNA — Chipola student Hillary Saunders recently raised \$20,000 for the Hearts of Promise Foundation and presented Dr. John Mayer, professor of surgery at Harvard Medical School and a senior associate in the Department of Cardiovascular Surgery at Children's Hospital Boston, with the check during his visit to Chipola College on Monday, Nov. 14.

The Hearts of Promise foundation was established in honor of Saunders' cousin, 9-year-old Holly Turner, who has a congenital heart problem.

Saunders invited Mayer as a part of her Phi Theta Kappa service project. She also raised the money through a fitness walk, pancake breakfast, Beanie Baby sales for children having surgery and cookbook sales. Funds will go to research being conducted by Mayer at Children's Hospital Boston. The goal of this research is to grow valves and arteries from a patient's own tissue, thus eliminating the need for multiple open-heart surgeries for thousands of children.

Mayer spoke to Chipola students, faculty and the community at 11 a.m. in the Chipola Theatre. At 6:30 p.m., he spoke to physicians and medical personnel at a dinner in the Continuing Education Conference Center.

Mayer grew up in Tampa. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Yale

University and his Doctor of Medicine from Yale University Medical School. He completed post-graduate training in general surgery and cardiothoracic surgery at the University of Minnesota.

Mayer served for three years in the U.S. Air Force Medical Corps and then began his career at Children's Hospital Boston and Harvard Medical School. He has published extensively in the field of pediatric cardiac surgery and tissue engineering. The tissue engineering research has been carried out in the Cardiac Surgery Research Laboratory at Children's Hospital Boston. His group developed the first tissue-engineered cardiovascular structures (pulmonary artery patch, single heart valve leaflet, complete trileaflet, heart-valved conduit) that have been implanted into animals.

Mayer is author or co-author of more than 300 scientific papers and 30 book chapters. He serves on the American Board of Thoracic Surgery and is a past president for the Society of Thoracic Surgeons.

Saunders also has raised funds through awareness presentations to church and civic groups, Beanie Baby sales for children having heart surgery at CHB and Hearts of Promise cookbook sales. All funds raised will go to Mayer's research.

Police catch armed robbery suspect

Crime Stoppers tip leads to arrest in BP robbery

CHIPLEY — Recently arrested for the Nov. 13 armed robbery of the BP Handimart on Main Street in Chipley was 17-year-old Dustin Dickens of Esto.

The suspect entered the store at 5:10 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 13, then produced a black handgun and demanded money from an employee. The suspect fled the store with an undisclosed amount of money and left

the area in what was described as a small silver SUV.

The Chipley Police Department, in conjunction with the Washington County Sheriff's Office, Bonifay Police Department and Holmes County Sheriff's Office and with several calls to the TIPS line, were able to identify and pursue the suspect. Dickens is charged with armed robbery and is being held at the Washington County Jail.

"Through the coordinated efforts of the citizens calling the TIPS line, we have been able to work together to clear the armed robbery case," said Chipley Police Chief Kevin Crews.

TDC reviews event advertising funding

CHIPLEY — The Washington County Tourist Development Council approved several advertising assistance requests for local organizations at its regularly scheduled meeting Nov. 21.

The TDC approved of Friends of Falling Waters' request for \$2,000 in advertising assistance for the 50th anniversary edition of Legends & Lore, to be April 20-21 at Falling Waters State Park.

"Next year will mark the 50th anniversary of Falling Waters State Park, and for the past 50 years Falling Waters has conserved its unique flora and fauna, preserved the cultural history of the area and educated young and old alike," said the park's Scott Sweeney.

The TDC also approved of the Preserving Our Past Association's request for \$1,500 in advertising assistance for the upcoming Holmes Valley Heritage Day Tractor Pull and Show to be March 3 on Wilderness Road in Vernon.

"I would like to thank the TDC for their outstanding support to not only us but our community," said Sandra Cook, superintendent of Washington County Schools.

The council also approved of Vernon Athletic Booster Club's request for \$3,000 in advertising assistance for the third annual Orange & Bluegrass Festi-

val to be April 27-28 at The Groves at Lucas Lake.

During the workshop portion, Sharon Liggett, a guest speaker from River Way South Apalachicola Choctawhatchee, talked about improving tourist development.

"The emphasis on rural areas is what your area has to offer, such as historic homes, birding, hunting, biking, nature trails, etc.," Liggett said. "What has proven to make this dynamic is when these various organizations co-operated together to create tourism package deals, because people just don't want to come all the way out here to experience just one thing."

She also suggested various ways to improve Chipley's signage to help better guide visitors around.

"Right now you have excellent signage, clearly representing Chipley as a city with a rich historic heritage and yet instills a sense of pride in leading the way to the future," Liggett said.

The TDC reviewed possible Facebook profile images and decided to request for revised images.
