**CHIPLEY** — Washington County Board of County Commissioners wished its deputy clerk Dianne Glasgow a fond farewell

during its regularly scheduled meeting on Dec. 21.

"You've provided 21 years of dedicated service to this county, and I know that we've created many memories together," said clerk of court Linda Cook

"I just hope you take all the good ones with you."

Glasgow received a plaque in commemoration of her 21 years of service to Washington County.

"I want to say that Dianne has been a tremendous asset to the county

# BEHIND BARS

The Washington County Drug Task Force, consisting of the Chipley Police Department and the Washington County Sheriff's Office, reports multiple arrests as a narcotics investigation that spanned several months has concluded.

The investigation included the sale of methamphetamines, marijuana, crack cocaine and controlled substances, as well

as an extensive undercover operation involving the sale of synthetic marijuana.

"The drug task force consistently fields complaints in reference to the sale and use of illegal drugs. During this latest round-up, our task force performed a concentrated undercover effort based on information that a local convenient store was continuing to illegally sell synthetic mari-

juana," said police chief Kevin Crews. "We had put store managers on notice that the new law was in effect and if sale continued they would be prosecuted. We found a store not in compliance with the law, and that store manager went to jail."

# Local women killed in accident on I-10

On the evening of Dec. 20, on Interstate 10 just west of the Highway 79 exit in Bonifay, at 9:43 p.m., a 2002 Lincoln four-door car, driven by Janice

Gail Hodges of DeFuniak Springs, was traveling in the outside lane, with a 1997 Ford pickup driven by Kayla Ann Dady Miller of Westville also in the outside lane behind her.

Miller lost control of her vehicle as she tried to pass Hodges.

The right side of Hodges vehicle collided with the left side of Miller's vehicle.

After the two vehicles collided Hodges vehicle came to rest on the outside westbound grass shoulder.

Miller's vehicle came to a rest on the inside westbound grass median after

the left side of her car collided with a tree in the median. Seatbelts were in use by all involved in the accident and alcohol was not a factor.

Kayla Ann Dady Miller, 22, of Westville, was pronounced deceased at Southeast Alabama Medi-

cal Center in Dothan, Ala. Her passenger, Matthew Beasley, 28, of Clarksville Tenn., had minor injuries and was transported to Doctor's Memorial Hospital in Bonifay. Janice Gail Hodges, 62, of DeFuniak Springs, had no injuries and was not transported.

continue.

Rhythm DRI was postponed until the Jan. 10 meeting of the Washington County Planning Commission during the regularly scheduled meeting of the planning commission on Dec. 6, under the stipulation that Florida Landings can provide a development order by Dec. 10.

At the meeting, several residents requested that the Rhythm DRI public hearing be postponed until February to allow the residents ample time to review paperwork and present their concerns at the public hearing.

DeRuntz advised that the meeting of Jan. 10 remain and that if adequate information had been provided, they can table the issue until February.

"This hasn't given the public adequate time to air out their grievances," said commission member David Morris. "The good people need their concerns addressed."

Commission member Al Keown added that if the paperwork wasn't received until the day before the meeting, then that wouldn't be enough time for citizens to review and research the paperwork.

"They've had 30 days to submit a development order," said Keown. "Once it's submitted, allow the public to review it for 30 days."

The citizens agreed that 30 days would be an adequate amount of time for review of the development order, and the planning commission voted and approved to continue the public hearing on Rhythm on Jan. 10, providing that the developer can provide

the required documents by Dec. 10.

Though the necessary development order was not submitted by Dec. 10, DeRuntz said they would still discuss the Rhythm DRI project with the developers present at the Jan. 10 meeting and do so without a public hearing.

A representative from Florida Landings, Scott Henderson, expressed the company's concerns and revealed that the investors are pushing for a February deadline.

"We've held a meeting with Bay County in which they wanted detailed hydroponics involving the rate of consumption," said Henderson. "However, these studies cannot be conducted without a DRI. They also want to ensure that all road paving be done prior to any phases."

Henderson then explained that the investors have pressed on them a February 2012 deadline.

"We've been pushing this development since February of 2008; it's been four years, and I've been dealt with a difficult position because they say they're only granting us one last extension that must be resolved by February of 2012," said Henderson. "We'll work with you, but we don't have any more time. We've got to push it; we don't want to, but we have to."

County Attorney Jeff Goodman said he was aware of Henderson's deadline.

"I am aware of the deadline being pushed by the investors," said Goodman. "But I am also aware of the many unresolved issues the county has as well."

The Washington County Board of County Commissioners recognized longtime deputy clerk Dianne Glasgow for her 21 years of service at its Dec. 21 meeting.

Washington County EMA Director Roger Dale Hagan announced an upcoming declaration for Hazardous Materials Awareness Week to be held Jan. 22-28.

BOCC also received a check from Florida League of Cities in the amount of \$22,546.

"Because you're a member of the board of trustees, this is just money generated by your insurance premium on the property covered," said John Pat Thomas of Florida League of Cities. "There will be reduction in cost for this year in the same amount; Merry Christmas."

Goodman asked that the BOCC approve of names recommended for the new MSBU Committee, which are Chuck Bahr, Earl Stewart, Frank Konefal, Sal Zu-

rica, Pat Scuggs, Randall Weekley and Chuck Ward.

"I would recommend that you approve the names to arrange for these MSBU funds to help the southern part of the county," said Goodman.

BOCC approved the recommended names.

Zurica asked that the BOCC take careful consideration not to allow anyone with conflicting interests as a member of the committee.

"I assure you, we will follow the guidelines accordingly," said Commissioner Joel Pate.

BOCC approved of the county manager's recommendation to purchase 40,000 to 50,000 tons of milled asphalt from Anderson Company for the half-off reduced rate of \$12 per ton on Pate's stipula-

tion that the milled asphalt won't be used until the road is ready for paving. BOCC approved with a vote of 4-1, with Commissioner Charles Brock voting "no."

BOCC also approved of the consent agenda, which includes:

Request for the clerk of court to pay vouchers for November 2011 in the amount of \$1,291,526.42.

Agreement with Dr. Samuel E. Ward for medical director of Washington County Ambulance Service.

Award letter for Homeland Security Grant Program funds in the amount of \$20,000 for the period of Oct. 1, 2011, through April 30, 2014, to Washington County. These funds are provided by the Department of Homeland Security through the Florida

Department of Emergency Management and awarded to Washington County. Funds are to be used solely for costs related to preparedness activities associated with implementing the State Homeland Security Strategy. BOCC also approved to use said funds as recommended by Hagan.

Single lot subdivision exception and variance for minimum lot area requirement for James and Valyuda Ussery, owners of 1547 Williams Road, Chipley. The Usserys have requested the placement of a single-family residence (mobile home) to provide a home for their son to accommodate his transition from renting to ownership.

The next scheduled meeting is set for Jan. 19, 2012, at 9 a.m.

The message was a mixture of scripture with illustrations in a modern context, with Dr. Cooksey presenting with obvious enjoyment and enthusiasm that enhanced



## Book Closing

**Washington County, FL** - Carol Finch Griffin, Supervisor of Elections announces the "Book Closing" date for January 31, 2012 Presidential Preference Primary Election is January 3, 2012.

By law, Florida is a closed primary state and as such, the PPP is a partisan election for registered Republicans only. Only registered Republicans will be able to vote in the Presidential Election. However, we do have a referendum on the ballot that ALL voters will be able to vote on. All voters may request a vote-by-mail ballot for this election.

For eligible voters who did not previously request a ballot, they are still available upon request by calling the elections' office at 850-638-6230, by submitting the request in writing or by using the on-line request form on [www.wcsoe.org](http://www.wcsoe.org). Written requests must include the voter's date of birth, signature, and Washington County residence address. Vote-by-mail ballots cannot be forwarded but can be mailed to a temporary mailing address if outside of County. Voters are encouraged to confirm their mailing address when ordering a vote-by-mail ballot. Requests are fulfilled immediately, with ballots being mailed daily. The deadline to request a ballot to be mailed is Wednesday, January 25, 2012.

Voted ballots must be returned to the elections' office by 7:00 p.m. election day, January 31, 2012. Due to the size of the ballot and an envelope re-design, one first-class stamp will be required to return the ballot by mail. Voted ballots may also be hand delivered to the Supervisor of Elections' Office in Washington County. Voted ballots may NOT be turned in at the polls on election day.

Written or telephonic requests for vote-by-mail ballots must come from the voter, or an immediate family member or legal guardian on behalf of a voter. Voters may pick up ballots for themselves at the elections' office beginning Wednesday, December 21st, but not for someone else until five days before the election, or Thursday, January 26, 2012. Those picking up ballots on behalf of someone will need a written request from the voter, designating them as the person authorized to carry out the ballot. The designee will be asked to provide a photo ID and to complete an affidavit before releasing the ballot to them.

**Washington County, FL** - Carol Finch Griffin, Supervisor of Elections announces the Canvassing Board will meet Tuesday, January 17, 2012 at 10:00 AM to conduct logic and accuracy tests on the voting equipment to be used in the 2012 Presidential Preference Primary Election to be held on January 31, 2012 and to perform any other duties as prescribed by law.

Absentee ballot certificate envelopes for the 2012 Presidential Preference Primary Election received prior to 8:00 A.M. on Tuesday, January 31, 2012, will be available for public inspection from 8:00 A.M. until 9:00 A.M., January 31, 2012, at the Supervisor of Elections Office. Those wishing to inspect absentee ballot envelope certificates received after 8:00 A.M. on January 31, 2012, must be present throughout the day.

Pursuant to Section 101.68 (2)(c)2, Florida Statutes, if any elector or candidate present believes that an absentee ballot is illegal due to a defect apparent on the voter's certificate, he or she may, at any time before the ballot is removed from the envelope, file with the canvassing board a protest against the canvass of that ballot, specifying the precinct, the ballot, and the reason he or she believes the ballot to be illegal. A challenge based upon a defect in the voter's certificate may not be accepted after the ballot has been removed from the mailing envelope.

Canvassing Board will reconvene on Tuesday, January 31, 2012 at 9:00 A.M. to begin opening and processing absentee ballots and perform any other duties as prescribed by law; however, the ballot will not be tabulated until 7:00 P.M. on January 31, 2012.

Canvassing Board will reconvene on Friday, February 10, 2012 at 4:00 P.M. to canvass absentee ballots from overseas voters and perform any other duties as prescribed by law.

It may become necessary for the Canvassing Board to reconvene at times or places other than those specified above. If so, the location, date and time will be announced at the conclusion of the pertinent meeting and posted on the doors of the Washington County Annex.

All meetings of the Washington County Canvassing Board are open to the public and will be conducted at the Supervisor of Elections Office, located at 1331 South Blvd., Suite 900, Chipley, FL 32428.

generations about the high cost of freedom. Regent Wilkerson then introduced honored guest, NSDAR Vice President General Sue C. Bratton. Mrs. Bratton spoke of DAR support for the military and our veterans from WWI to the present. The ceremony ended with Brenda Beauchamp-Morse singing "Amazing Grace" accompanied by her autoharp.

Mary Robbins, Blue Springs Society Senior President/Chairman of the C.A.R./DAR Wreath Project, directed the "Procession of Wreaths" from St. Luke's MacKinnon Hall into the churchyard. Wreaths for Capt. Jesse Robinson and Gen. Homer V. Milton, who served during The War of 1812, led the procession. Blue Springs Society Honorary President Adrian Schell carried the wreath for Capt. Robinson and Vice President Gabrielle Simpson placed the wreath for General Milton, her fourth great grandfather. Veterans of the American Civil War were next to be honored with wreaths. 
