Chase prompts drug, property damage charges

CHIPLEY — A Chipley man was arrested in connection with drug and fleeing charges Friday following a high-speed pursuit, according to a news release from the Jackson County

Drug Task Force.

Kay Sharhorne Dean, 38, was arrested in connection with a hit and run, defacing a traffic control device, fleeing and attempting to elude a law enforcement officer, reckless driving, tampering with evidence and possession of a controlled substance (marijuana)

with the intent to distribute. Dean also was issued citations for running a stop sign and littering.

Dean was booked into the Washington County Jail and later released on bond.

The Jackson County Drug Task Force, with the assistance of the Postal Service

and Florida Highway Patrol, conducted an investigation into a suspicious package that was intercepted by the Postal Service.

The report indicates that during the investigation, the package was delivered to a

RHYTHM AND BLUES

CHIPLEY — Even though the Planning Commission eventually voted to recommend the Rhythm project to the Washington Board of County Commissioners, there was no shortage of people against the development ready to speak their minds Tuesday night.

Eighteen residents signed up before the public hearing to voice their objections to Rhythm, and about 10 others commented afterward when Chairwoman Tonya Pippin opened the floor

to comments.

"I think my biggest disappointment is that I apparently haven't done a very good job communicating with the residents," Rhythm project spokesman J. Scott Henderson said. "Many of the concerns they voiced tonight we have worked hard to address."

Concerns ran the gamut from raised property taxes, storm drainage, and an increase in the number of school-aged children, but the recurrent theme was water usage.

"I'm worried about water big

City decries railroad crossings

CHIPLEY — City officials heard about complaints on the maintenance, or lack thereof, of railroad track crossings at the City Council's monthly work session Thursday.

"Seventh Street and Main Street, those aren't in too bad of shape," City Manager Dan Miner said. "But over on Pecan Street, it's a different story."

Alderman Lee Dell Kennedy said he had received several complaints about the poor condition of the railroad crossings in town. Miner said that for years he had dealt directly with the local CSX railroad master, and he always had been told the same thing: "Next July we're going to fix it," Miner said. "It was the same story year after year."

In the meantime, the roadmaster Miner dealt with has left the company, so Miner called CSX headquarters in Jacksonville to complain about the maintenance.

"One of the problems is the responsibility of the railroad for repairs varies from crossroad to crossroad," Miner said. In some cases, the railroad is responsible for repairs up to 10 feet on either side of the crossing, while in other cases, CSX is only responsible from "outside railroad tie to outside tie," he said.

Miner recommended council members and members of the public call CSX at 800-2323-0144 to report poorly maintained crossings. Complaints also can be sent via email to telcsx@csx.com.

According to the CSX website csx.com, "The TellCSX communication program was established to field calls from the public about its concerns. By tracking these issues, CSX is able to proactively address concerns in communities, as well as continue to improve safety performance."

Mayor Linda Cain told Miner to prepare a letter to CSX and she would sign it.

"It would be great if several of our residents also got in touch with the railroad," Alderman Kevin Russell said.

Police: Drug ring nets area arrests


PANAMA CITY — Several men suspected of being involved in a multi-state drug distribution organization were charged in U.S. District Court after they were arrested by federal agents in a bust that resulted in the seizure of hundreds of thousands of dollars in cash, dozens of guns and more than one ton of marijuana.

Rufus Daniel Curington Jr., 70, Charles A. Armstrong, 56, and Joseph Kevin Jeter, 43, all of Vernon; and 71-year-old James Hardesty Moore

of Panama City appeared in court Wednesday afternoon for their first appearance on a charge of conspiracy to possess with the intent to distribute marijuana. Six men from McAllen, Texas, also face the same charge in the Southern District of Texas, and one Central Florida man also appeared on the same charge.

Also arrested were Alberto Gomez, Jesus A. Gonzales, Alejandro Amaya, Daniel Nunez, Jamie Rodriguez-Sandoval, Yerryn Tumbajoy, James Paul Walker and Jesus Servado

Jackson County Sheriff's Office investigates Internet cafes

MARIANNA — Investigators from the State Attorneys Office of the 14th Judicial Circuit and the Jackson County Sheriff's Office served search warrants at two Internet cafes in Jackson County on Feb. 7,

according to a news release. The search warrants were executed following a recent Jackson County Grand Jury investigation into the use of internet time with sweepstakes cards that are played on computers featuring casino type games.

The law enforcement agencies have received complaints and inquires surrounding the adult arcades and electronic game promotions/sweepstakes, according to the release. The search warrants were executed in an effort to further

gather evidence to determine if these establishments were operating legally under Florida statutes. No arrests have been made, but computers and documentation was obtained during the searches. This investigation is ongoing, according to the report.

residence on Sapp Road in Cottondale. The Sapp Road resident received the package then reportedly delivered it to Dean in the parking lot of the Love's Truck Stop located on U.S. 231 near Interstate 10. According to the report, when Dean received the package, the Florida Highway Patrol and Cottondale Police Department attempted to execute a traffic stop on Dean, who was driving a 1994 Ford Crown Victoria on Corbin Road at the Jackson County and Washington County Line.

Dean then accelerated onto the right shoulder of the roadway striking a road sign and the Florida Highway Patrol attempted a "precision immobilization technique" maneuver on Dean's vehicle, as he turned southbound onto Jarous Road in Washington County, according to the report.

Dean reportedly sped down Jarous Road then turned westbound onto Alford Road, and police said Dean was tossing items from his vehicle while he was attempting to flee from law enforcement.

Near the intersection of Kent Road, Dean pulled to the shoulder of the roadway and subsequently was placed under arrest. According to the report, during the pursuit of Dean's vehicle, speeds in excess of 111 miles per hour were reached.

Police said the items thrown from the vehicle included the postal box, packaging and a vacuum-sealed bag that contained about 1/4 pound of high-grade marijuana.

Police said the investigation is ongoing and additional arrests could be pending.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office and Chipley Police Department also assisted in the investigation.

Rodriguez Sandoval, all in connection with charges of conspiracy/possession with intent to distribute marijuana.

All suspects were charged federally and are being held at Bay County Jail.

Assistant United States Attorney Gayle Littleton told Magistrate Larry Bodiford she anticipates firearms charges against the defendants, as well. The defendants face a possible life sentence if convicted as charged and a minimum mandatory sentence of 10 years if they have no prior convictions. Littleton said three of the four local defendants have prior convictions that would result in enhanced sentences and the minimum mandatory sentence would be 20 years.

According to the criminal complaint against the four local men, Curington and Moore spent time in federal prison after being convicted of the same offense in the late 1990s. When an attorney for Moore requested he be released for health reasons until a detention hearing scheduled for Monday, Littleton said he had complained of the same health issues the

last time he was arrested. "This is not Mr. Moore's first rodeo," Littleton told Bodiford.

The defendants are suspected of being involved with a drug distribution operation based in McAllen with ties to violent Mexican drug cartels. Large amounts of pot allegedly were stashed in Vernon and distributed to other defendants in Central Florida, and cash from those defendants was held en route back to McAllen.

Court records, including a criminal complaint filed in Florida's Northern District that provides details of the investigation and arrests of the defendants, and an 80-page arrest affidavit filed in Florida's Middle District, allege truckloads of pot were sent from McAllen to Curington's stash house in Vernon on a regular basis. Dollar amounts in the millions made the trip in reverse. In some cases, large amounts of cash reportedly were buried underground.

At some point, the records state, the defendants apparently became concerned the stash house had been identified by law enforcement and moved

the warehouse to Jeter's property, which is where a search warrant was executed Tuesday night. Federal agents had tracked a shipment using GPS and aerial surveillance to a gated property on Jeter Lane. Jeter and Armstrong were at the gate and were arrested immediately. Both men were armed.

When agents moved in, several men who were unloading a shipment from a truck scattered into the woods. In a shed on the property, officers reportedly found more than 2,700 pounds of pot wrapped in plastic, covered in fabric softener and axle grease, and then rewrapped in plastic.

One man, Adolfo Tamez, of McAllen, escaped into the woods. In court Wednesday, Littleton said another arrest had been made that afternoon, but she didn't say who was arrested.

Warrants were executed the same day at the residences of Curington, Armstrong and Moore; more than \$600,000 in cash and 30 guns were seized as a result of those raids, authorities reported.

Curington allegedly kept several hundred pounds of the deliveries and sold it for \$800 a pound. He allegedly sold about 1,600 pounds a year, and he had \$156,490 cash when his property was searched. Moore reportedly was a customer of Curington's, buying about 50 pounds every month or two. Armstrong, who had \$431,000 at his property, said he was paid to act as a lookout for the operation and had helped to store and load cash for shipment, according to federal authorities.

The case was the result of an investigation by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, and the Drug Enforcement Administration.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the Sheriff's Offices of Bay and Washington counties, as well as local law enforcement agencies in McAllen and Orlando, also were involved in the investigation, which according to court records began in 2006.

time," Richard Odom of Chipley told commissioners. "Not only am I concerned that they are going to use so much, but what are they going to do if they run over? Shut the water off on the old folks?"

The developers predict they might use as much as 692,000 gallons a day in the project once it is fully developed. This makes adjoining property owners nervous about their own wells going dry.

"I truly believe this is the wrong location for such a project," resident John Legg of Chipley said, citing the delicate ecology of Washington County.

Cottondale's Brian Bearwood noted Rhythm is being proposed for the last

area of contiguous undeveloped land in the county.

"This area is an ecological hotspot," said Bearwood, a certified planner and landscape architect. "It's been recognized as such since the 1980s."

Mary Jo Hendershot of Chipley said she worried the project ultimately would fail, leaving the county with a "blighted community."

"I believe if the comprehensive land-use plan is going to be changed, it should be changed for the needs of the residents, not for the interests of some big-money developers," she said.

Attorney Linda Loomis Shelley of Fowler White Boggs, a Tallahassee firm representing the Rhythm development, opened the Rhythm portion of the meeting explaining the developers were seeking approval of comprehensive plan amendments, the Development of Regional Impact and the Planned Unit Development for the developers. Rhythm now goes before the Washington County Board of Commissioners at 9 a.m. Thursday for final approval.

Shelley walked the commissioners through the major changes, page by page. Many of the changes came about as a result of meetings with the commissioners, the school board and with the public, she said.

"Is the county adequately protected?" Pippin asked County Attorney Jeff Goodman.

"From the county perspective, this document has been thoroughly vetted," Goodman replied. "You all have done your due diligence as far as the county is concerned."

"Where you have asked them (the developers) to give, they've been willing to give," Goodman added. "I don't want my recommendation to affect your decision, but I believe this document is legally sufficient."

The first speaker from the public was Harry Gunzel, who questioned whether or not the commission had published the date of the public hearing sufficiently before holding the meeting. "How can you in good conscience hold this meeting having not met the requirements of the state?" he asked.

Pippin replied that the meeting was advertised in September for October and the current hearing was a

continuation of the previous meetings.

"Two years ago our county was ripped apart by the gas line," Nan Thompson of Chipley said. "We lost 2 acres. We were paid for it, but we had no choice," she said, adding that the Rhythm project was equally divisive.

"I hope you have looked at the whole picture," Thompson added. "I think there are too many unacceptable answers."

Catie DeRosia of Chipley asked if the county wouldn't be liable for storm runoff pollution from the development that might make it into the county's streams and lakes.

"The county would not be responsible. The utility is responsible," Senior Planner Michael DeRuntz said.

After all the comments were heard, the board took a 10-minute recess then returned to vote on the Rhythm project.

It took two motions and an explanation from County Attorney Jeff Goodman before the Washington County Planning Commissioners unanimously agreed to recommend the Rhythm project to the Board of County Commissioners.

The first motion for approval, made by Pippin, was declared null because no one offered a second to the motion. The anti-Rhythm audience burst into applause and gave the commissioners a standing ovation.

Then County Planner Hilton Kelley asked if the panel could vote again.

County Attorney Jeff Goodman explained to the commissioners that although two members were missing, since there was a quorum then they could vote.

"It takes a majority of the commission to take an action that is binding," Goodman explained. Therefore, for a vote to count, the four attending members would have to vote unanimously.

A few minutes later, the motion was resubmitted by Vice Chairman Jim Ackerman, seconded by Pippin, and voted on unanimously by the panel.

The crowd of about 50 residents attending who were against the Rhythm project went from elation to dejection.

"Thank you for nothing," one woman yelled as she left the meeting. "You failed your job!"



3 juveniles arrested in connection with burglaries

CHIPLEY — Three teenagers were arrested recently in connection with burglary following a traffic stop, according to a Washington County Sheriff's Office.

During a traffic stop, officers with the Chipley Police Department noticed that a vehicle occupied by 6 people contained items that might have been stolen.

After speaking to the occupants of the vehicle, police said the juveniles admitted to spending most of the evening driving around burglarizing homes.

Investigators with both the Chipley Police Department and Washington County Sheriff's Office interviewed the subjects and discovered that a home on Fifth Street, as well as a vehicle and a home on South Boulevard, had been burglarized by the teens.

The three are facing felony charges and are being charged as adults, according to the sheriff's office.

Arrested were Dakota Wade Gates, 17, in connection with principal burglary of an unoccupied structure and petit theft; Brandon Lee Jones, 17, in connection with principal burglary of an unoccupied structure; and Ike Michael Winship, 17, in connection with principal burglary of an unoccupied structure and petit theft.

KMS 4th graders arrange dried flowers

CHIPLEY — Several classes of fourth graders at Kate M. Smith Elementary School spent time this week learning about dried floral arrangements and making their own designs to enter in the upcoming 4-H Youth Fair.

On Feb. 7, several members of Chipley Garden Club visited Ms. Whitaker's classroom where the fourth-grade students were gathered. Linda Pigott, club member and retired teacher, talked about containers including several types that were recycled. Club members recycle coffee containers and other upright plastic containers for this purpose. Students

were invited to think creatively and "bring your own container" for the Wednesday event.

Vonceil Coggin, the club's floral design committee chairperson, explained the basic principles of floral design. The students sat attentively as she demonstrated how to make a basic design of dried floral materials. She explained about the tall line materials, focal points and filler (transitional) flowers — components the youth fair judges would be looking for — and color contrast.

Chipley Garden Club collects dried material all year round for this special event. Club members arrived early morning Wednesday at the PE pavilion loaded down with boxes

of dried materials — hydrangeas, cotton, dock, lamb's ear, chive flowers, twisted limbs, papyrus, butterfly bush blooms, roses, chrysanthemums, Easter lilies, lavender, cock's comb, millet and several wild grasses — and containers filled with sand were brought in. Julie Dillard, a 4-H youth development agent, was also on hand. As the students arrived, club members reminded them of the basic techniques learned the day before and assisted as they chose materials and containers for their creations.

By the end of the event, 30 fourth-graders had created wonderful array of beautiful dried floral arrangements which they will be able to enter in the fair later this month.


