Goodwill plans apartment complex

All facilities will be wheelchair accessible

CHIPLEY — Goodwill Industries-Big Bend plans to build a 15-unit apartment complex for people with disabilities in Chipley.

The initial zoning request was approved by the city Planning Commission on Feb. 23, and the matter will go before the City Council for approval on March 13.

"Chipley had a good feeling about it, and we knew from our service center there that there was a need

for accessible housing," said Donna Warlick, vice president of housing development for Goodwill Industries-Big Bend. "We have been trying to put apartments in as many communities as we can."

Based in Tallahassee, Goodwill Industries-Big Bend has 313 apartments built so far in its region, and is providing homes to 399 people, Warlick said.

"There is a great need for quality and affordable housing for residents in any community and Goodwill Industries-Big Bend has provided this valuable need admirably in our city," wrote Perry city manager Bob Brown, in a letter to Warlick expressing the city of Perry's support for the proposed Chipley apartments.

"We are pleased to have Goodwill

Industries-Big Bend as part of our community," Brown wrote.

The 15-unit complex planned for Chipley will be located behind the Washington Square plaza on Main

Street. One unit will be occupied by the building manager, and there will be four two-bedroom apartments

Saunders to run again for school board

CHIPLEY — Wayne Saunders of Chipley announced on Friday his intention to seek re-election to the District 2 seat on the Washington County School Board.

"During my years as school board member, I have served as chairman and vice-chairman of the board and as the state legislative liaison," Saunders said in a news release.

"I have achieved the distinction of state certified school board member and have kept updated on educational and legislative issues by attending state legislative sessions and all Florida School Board Association conferences."

Saunders holds a bachelor's degree in education and a master's degree in school administration. He was appointed the first director of the Washington-Holmes Technical Center.

"I had the privilege of collaborating with many others to develop the center from its inception and to direct its growth throughout the first 23 years of operation," he said. "I have served in many school positions, including principal at the elementary, middle, and high school levels, classroom teacher and coach at the middle school and high school levels. I have also taught as Adjunct Professor for the University of West Florida."

After retiring from WHTC, Saunders was contracted to evaluate educational programs for the state of Florida, he said.

"I also developed an academic skills lab for Jackson County's Adult Education Program, presented staff development programs throughout the state, and served as accreditation team leader for the Commission on Occupational Education in Alabama, Louisiana, Georgia, Tennessee

Man on motorcycle killed in Washington County wreck

A Mena, Ariz., man was killed Sunday morning when his 2008 Harley Davidson collided with a 2008 Toyota Sienna, The Florida Highway Patrol said.

Gayland Crocker, 69, and Linda Crocker, 61, both of Mena, were eastbound on Interstate 10 in the right lane when Gayland Crocker "made an improper lane change," troopers wrote in a news release. David Hickey, 48, of Enterprise, Ala., was eastbound in the left lane and attempted to take evasive action by braking and steering

to the left in an attempt to avoid the collision, troopers wrote.

However, the front of the Harley collided with the right side of Hickey's Toyota and ejected Gayland Crocker from the motorcycle and into the street. Gayland Crocker was pronounced dead at the scene, troopers wrote. Linda Crocker was taken to a local hospital where she was listed in serious condition, troopers wrote. Hickey and his passenger, 26-year-old Jennifer Clark were not injured in the wreck, troopers wrote.

No charges are expected in the case.

"I had planned to run one more time, but after prayerful consideration it is time for me to start a new chapter in my life. I have been blessed in so many ways in my life, and this job is certainly one of them," McEntyre said in a news release.

McEntyre began her career at the tax

collector's office after receiving a phone call from Ralph Ray, who was an instructor at the Washington Holmes Vocational Technical Center, asking her if she would like a job. She went for an interview with Mr. H. T. Waller, Sr. on Saturday and began working on the following Monday, Oct. 1, 1970. She has been there ever since.

When Mary Hodges, her predecessor, decided to retire in 1996, McEntyre ran for office with

BONIFAY — Old Oaks Vineyard in Bonifay won a silver medal for its red table wine entry in the commercial competition at the 2012 Florida State Fair International Wine and Grape Juice Competition.

The contest was held Feb. 9-12 at the Florida State Fairgrounds in Tallahassee.

Old Oaks Vineyard was established in 2006. Old Oaks Vineyard is the only winery in Holmes County.

It is a small winery with the vineyard producing Blanc du Bois and Champanel grapes for wine-making. The winery will open this October on Saturdays from noon to 5 p.m. with complimentary tasting of the various wines produced.

The winery is owned by Bridget Keegan and opened six years ago.

and 10 one-bedroom apartments.

The complex is expected to cost \$1.4 million to build and should be ready for occupancy sometime next summer, Warlick said.

The housing is being built with federal funds, and the rent will be prorated based on the resident's income, she said. The facilities will be completely wheelchair accessible, including the laundry room and community room.

A lot of people don't realize what it truly means to be wheelchair accessible," Warlick said. "I had one lady at one of our complexes tell me that this was the first time she had been able to check her own mailbox."

The facility will be called the GIBB Chipley Village. Similar villages exist in Florida in Tallahassee, Panama City Beach, Marianna, Perry and Springfield. Goodwill also has villages in Georgia in Thomasville, Bainbridge and Cairo.

The apartments often

exceed the American with Disabilities Act requirements for accessibility, Warlick said.

Residents for the apartments will most likely come from Chipley and Washington County, but Goodwill will accept applications from anyone, regardless of where they live.

When the apartments are about 120 days away from being ready for occupancy, Goodwill will advertise and begin accepting applications from prospective tenants.

Getting the building fully accessible is a priority for Goodwill, Warlick said. Details like roll-in showers, door handles and electrical outlets that often are taken for granted can

"People don't always think about the little things, like being able to check the mail, or reaching faucets, but it's the little things that mean a lot to folks," Warlick said. "One of our residents was happy because she could visit all her friends for the first time."



The month of March is here, and the "prattler" never finished his February topics.

February has double meaning in the life of a writer. On the bright side, it is his day of graduation from the University of Florida in 1952. On a sad note, Feb. 2, 1990, is the date my brother, Circuit Judge Clyde B. Wells, along with his hunting

companion and pilot, Jim Loudermilk, were killed in a Pensacola plane crash. Killed also were two quail hunting dogs.

My friend and fellow graduate from the University of Florida, Randall Roberts from Valparaiso, always calls me on the anniversary of our graduation and also remembers it as the day of Clyde's death. Judicial Assistant Joyce Hughes, who worked with me for most of my years in the judge's office, vividly remembers the somber visit of Sheriff Fred Peel and Captain John Jenkins, who brought the tragic news to your writer on that fateful Feb. 2 Friday afternoon. She called me that day to say she well remembers of the significance of that loss in my life.

Feb. 16 brought to my attention that my mother, Marie Harris Wells, born on that date in 1906, would have been 106 years old. My thoughts immediately went to her when I awakened that morning at 7 a.m. to a driving rain and knew that I should be making my way to Patillo's for the 7:30 a.m. third Thursday meeting of the Chamber of Commerce.

Since April 1988, I have been master of ceremonies of chamber meetings, a job handed to me by Ole Ellis, then executive director. It continues on under the leadership of Tommy McDonald and Ted Everett, who presently holds the title, and looks to me for that function.


Thinking of my recent cold, congestion and cough, I was questioning the wisdom of going out into the inclement, rough and rainy weather for the chamber meeting, when my mother's soft and tender voice came to mind so clearly: "Perry, I don't think you should be out in this weather." I heeded her imagined advice and covered up my sleepy head for another nap.

I encountered Ted in Walmart a few days later and explained the reasons for missing the chamber meeting and feel that I received an "excused absence" from the executive director.

My name, Perry Edward Wells, makes me the namesake of Horace Edward Harris, my mother's younger brother; born Feb. 27, 1908. He became a career Bonifay barber at age 17.

Weather is always a topic of conversation in February. The legendary groundhog, who makes his appearance on Feb. 2, predicted more cold weather before spring arrives.

Farmers of our area, including our dad, Hugh Wells, believed strongly

that Feb. 14, Valentine's Day, was the day to plant Irish potatoes, and he did it religiously. He, along with farmers of his era, knew that some extreme cold weather was necessary each winter for the purpose of killing off pesky insects and eggs they had deposited. They knew the bugs would be patiently awaiting the potatoes and other crops for the destructive critters to destroy.

Last month gave us much needed rain, and many expressions of thanksgiving to that Master have been heard frequently. Drought, low water levels in rivers, creeks and branches and the continued low underground water table readings give grave concerns to everyone.

My readers are aware of my interest in bluegrass, folk and traditional music and know of my 22 years of broadcasting this genre of music on the airways of WBCG-AM in Chipley. Recently, my mind began dwelling on the mention of some form of reference to rain, the seasons or weather in many of the songs written by a host of writers and played on the radio broadcast. Most of them are in my record collection and readily available for listening.

Some of my radio faithful listeners will probably recall the popular tune, "February in My Heart," written by Robb Strandlund and Bill Caswell, which speaks of a broken romance, with the girl announcing in February that she would be marrying another in June. This recording is by the Osborne Brothers Sonny and Bobby: "The Days are Short in February - The Nights are Dreary, Cold and Long. I Thought That You Would Never Marry, Now I see that I Was Wrong"

The Merle Haggard tune "I Know I'm Only Shelley's Winter Love" hit

the charts with his recording and was later released by the Osborne Brothers — and many others — with these lyrics: "I know I'm Only Shelley's Winter Love. She Only Seems to Need Me Now and Then. I Know I'm Only Shelley's Winter Love. But She's Mine Alone Until Springtime Comes Again."

Grandpa Jones, June Carter Cash and The Stanley Brothers recorded this weather-related, fast-moving song that produced excellent sales for all artist. Report: Hiring trend continues in February

TALLAHASSEE — Building on their success in helping unemployed Floridians get to work, the state's 24 regional workforce boards reported more than 31,000 job placements in February, including an increase in placements of job seekers who had been receiving unemployment compensation.

"The more Floridians we get back to work, the stronger Florida's economy will be," Gov. Rick Scott said. "If we want to continue this trend of growing jobs, we need to continue helping businesses compete. As businesses discover they can be more competitive in Florida, they will relocate and expand here, which translates to more jobs."

The results from February's Monthly Job Placement Report demonstrate consistent progress, with 31,239 individuals placed in jobs including 7,112 people who were receiving unemployment compensation, up from 6,536 unemployment compensation claimants in January. The boards reported 32,965 placements in January and 25,201 in December. The Monthly Job Placement Report was developed at the governor's direction by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity and Workforce Florida Inc.

Hooked on Outdoors

No one I have talked to is having a difficult time letting go of deer season. Most people are simply glad it is over.

Now is the time to clean up those guns and store them. The only part I regret is having to clean up the black powder rifle. You can load it up and keep it loaded most of the season, but fire it just once or several

times and you have a job on your hands. If you don't really clean, and I mean really clean,

a black-powder rifle after firing you can destroy a very expensive gun by leaving burned powder in the barrel. The next year you will have a rust bucket on your hands. Unlike a center fire rifle that can be cleaned in a so-so manner, a black powder rifle requires special care.

The gun needs to be taken apart as far as a non-gunsmith can take it. Black powder is very corrosive and will ruin the barrel. I got my barrel as clean as I could, but I'm going to have to take the gun outside where I have plenty of room to complete the job. So if you don't like the job of cleaning your gun don't buy a black powder rifle to hunt with.

Of course hunting season is not exactly over. Hunters just switch gears and go for turkeys. Turkey hunting is sort of like quail hunting in that it's a gentleman's sport, but only if you do it right.

The final destination with any hunt is to come home with some game. Turkey hunting is sort of like that, except it has to be done in a certain manner or you are just a meat hunter.

The true manner of taking a turkey is to call the bird to you and not sitting half a day around an area you fed deer for six months and the turkeys got used to coming to.

Believe it or not, many people hunt in that fashion. Sit and wait and they will come. Sort of like shooting quail on the ground — that just isn't done by a real turkey hunter. But you would not believe the number of hunters who do so.

I suppose if it sits right with these hunters they never will reveal their secret as long as they come home with a bird.

They always will be great turkey hunters to their friends.

Tournament fish gets ready to run

It's not a rumor. The crew aboard the Full Pull spotted the first cobia of the season Wednesday afternoon just off the beach at Navarre.

However, the crew, which has pulled in the first cobia of the season 10 times to kick off the Destin Cobia Tournament at HarborWalk Marina, wasn't so lucky Wednesday.

"She wouldn't bite," said Capt. Chris Wagner, who was fishing along with Andy Block and Tyler Jenkins.

"All we had were choafer and pinfish," Block said. Not to mention the four-hour window of sunshine to catch a fish.

And they didn't see the cobia until the last 15 minutes.

"Conservatively, she was 80 pounds," Block said. "She was a pretty fish."

The crew got to work the cobia and toss baits at her for about 15 minutes.

"After that the fog rolled in and we couldn't see nothing," Blocksaid.

This was the Full Pull's first time in search of cobia this season. Last year they landed the first cobia of the season on March 10.

"It's been so warm lately, I just knew there would be a fish out there," Block said, "But the ol' girl got away."

The Full Pull was headed back out Thursday in hopes of landing that first one.

However, they soon might find themselves with company on the water as others gear up for the season.

"I'm hoping for a good season," said Capt. John Tenore of the Dawn Patrol, "but it's hard to tell. And it will probably start early," because of the warm weather.

Capt. Tenore took first place in the 30-foot and under division of the Destin Cobia Tournament last year with an 86.6-pounder caught on March 17. "We saw 12 that day

and ended up with three," he said.

The number of fish caught last year overall wasn't real high, Tenore said, "but we had good quality fish."

And if the fish decide to show up early, "We've just got to go with it."

Tenore is making plans to hit the water next week in search of cobia.

But before he does — or anyone does — "You need to make sure all your tackle is in order," he said. "New lines and leaders for the year.

"It's also good to have an assortment of bait," Tenore said. He suggested such baits as choafer, eels, mullet, cobia jigs and tube lures.

Tenore said he likes to take a black and an orange tube lure, until the eels are in for bait.

He said one of the biggest cobia he's ever caught was on a tube lure.

Another tool of the trade are a good pair of polarized sunglasses to be able to spot the cobia in the water. Also bring plenty of clothes, because you never know when the wind might kick up on the water, he said.

As for where, "I like to fish in close if it's not rough," Tenore said, adding that 20 to 40 feet of water is the sweet spot. However, if it's rough, you have to fish outside the break.

Early arrivals of cobia usually show up in 62½ to 63 degree water, "if the conditions are right," Tenore said.

But when the water temps hit 68 to 70, "it's on then," Tenore said.

"We're already getting antsy," he said. "And I wouldn't be surprised if one was caught early."

Capt. Kirk Reynolds of the SS Enterprise, who is usually right in the thick of things, said, "It's going to be an interesting season."

He tends to think the cobia will just "trickle in instead of a big run."

"But it's possible ... we'll see."

And folks might be seeing one sooner than they think as boat captains make plans to hit the water in the next few days.

SEC takes its case to court

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) — The Southeastern Conference is the unquestioned king of college football these days. Six straight national championships will do that for you.

On the court, however, the SEC is fighting for respect.

The league hasn't won a men's basketball national championship since Florida's back-to-back titles in 2006-07, and it has only one Final Four appearance during that span. Its low point came in 2009, when only three teams were selected for the NCAA Tournament.

The conference tournament starts Thursday in New Orleans. It'll be yet another chance for the rest of the SEC to show that the league is more than Kentucky and a bunch of other teams.

The No. 1 Wildcats (30-1, 16-0 SEC) completed an undefeated run through the league with their 74-59 win over No. 22 Florida on Sunday. They own the conference's lone Final Four appearance since 2007, reaching the national semifinals last season before falling to eventual national champion Connecticut.

Kentucky coach John Calipari joined the SEC following the 2009 season when Mississippi State, Tennessee and LSU were the only teams selected to the NCAA Tournament and finished a combined 1-3. The Tigers were the highest seed of the group, a No. 8, and lost to

top-seeded North Carolina in the second round.

Calipari is 40-8 in the SEC's regular season with the Wildcats, but he bristles at the mention of the league's recent struggles. He believes the SEC has "five or six" teams capable of reaching the second weekend of play in this season's NCAA Tournament, and that "no one" will want to play teams such as the Gators, Vanderbilt and others come tournament time.

The perception of the SEC as a second-tier league has had a direct impact on its NCAA tournament selections in recent years. Last season, Alabama won the West Division and had a 21-11 overall record following a loss to Kentucky in the SEC Tournament, 12-4 in the league's regular season.

The Crimson Tide's resume, however, wasn't enough to earn an NCAA selection as the SEC was left with five teams in the field.

In order to generate more discussion about SEC teams in the NCAA field, the conference changed its setup after last season. It eliminated the two-division format that had been in place since the 1992 expansion that brought South Carolina and Arkansas to the table, leaving a singular 12-team league.

Alabama, which finished fifth, would have once again won the former West Division with its 20-10 overall record, 9-7 in the SEC.

Tractor pull a reminder of independence

I was disappointed the Holmes Valley Heritage festival had to be canceled because of the awful weather we endured Friday and Saturday. Driving down Saturday morning, the weather was in spurts drizzle, then monsoon, then drizzle again.

In Morrow, Ark., the Rustic Relics Antique Tractor Club holds a tractor show and pull twice a year, and predictably, it rains on at least the spring event every year. The last time I attended the Arkansas event, I took along a friend, Robin, and her 3-year-old son, Rowan.

Rowan definitely enjoyed the noise and power of the tractors, and he even won a bronze medal in the children's

pull. And it actually didn't rain while we were there, which in itself was something of a miracle.

(It started pouring as we drove away.) The Morrow event is a two-day affair, and they offer dry camping at the site for attendees.

Rowan's mother, Robin, was a single mom at the time who also has a mild case of cerebral palsy and is for the most part wheelchair-bound. So it was usually a treat for Rowan to get to go out in the country and run wild as 3-year-old boys like to do. I was also there to chase him if need be, which was usually the case.

My friends came to mind twice this week, because not only did the

tractor pull (which is being rescheduled for April 14) make me think of them, so too did the wheelchair-accessible apartment complex Goodwill Industries-Big Bend is planning to build in Chipley.

Wheelchair accessibility is something that, thankfully, most of us don't have to really think about. But if you have ever been in a wheelchair or have a family member or friend who is handicapped, you know how unfriendly most places are, even if they don't mean to be and even if they meet every ADA requirement.

I remember when Robin had just moved to Arkansas from San Francisco and was in the process of returning to the university to pursue her law degree.

I stopped by campus to meet her for lunch and was really shocked by how inaccessible the food court was to a person in a wheelchair.

The University of Arkansas's student union had been recently remodeled. But trying to navigate the Burger King was a chore. The drink fountain was too high for her to reach, she couldn't roll up to the counter properly and navigating the common tables area was in itself quite a feat.

And this is in a state and federally funded facility that went out of its way to be ADA-compliant.

Vice President of Housing Development Donna Warlick said at least twice in my interview with her that the Chipley apartments will exceed the ADA

requirements. That is important, because for day-to-day living, the ADA requirements aren't nearly enough. There are so many things we take for granted that become major chores when your mobility is limited.

One thing that I tend to forget — and I suspect I am not the only one — is someday, we all will need help. We might not all wind up in wheelchairs, but pretty much everyone will face mobility issues, especially as we continue to age.

I have had gout (which is a form of arthritis in which crystals of uric acid form in one's joints causing inflammation and limited mobility) since I was in my early 30s, and just recently I have had sports-related issues with both knees that had me hobbling around with a

cane. Nothing makes you miss your knees like not being able to use them.

Too often, we take our good health, along with all of our blessings, for granted every day. But for some people, the world is sometimes literally just out of reach.

Thank goodness for organizations like Goodwill Industries, who are there to help put things right, even if it is something as simple as a shower that can be rolled into, or a mailbox that is within easy reach.

As I write this, Bruce Springsteen's song "Independence Day" is playing on my stereo.

That's quite appropriate. Because Goodwill Industries' housing program is all about just that — independence.

And we all need a little independence.

He also suffers from nerve damage to his right arm because of a surgery that was done to remove the cancerous tumor from his jaw. Over a three-day period, Bender spoke to students at Vernon Middle School, Roulhac

Middle School, Chipley High School, the Washington County Christian School and the Washington-Holmes Technical Center.

He also spoke at training for the Florida Region One Tobacco Specialists in Panama City.

"I really feel my presentations have a big influence on the decisions people make about using tobacco," Bender said. "I want to give them something else to chew on."

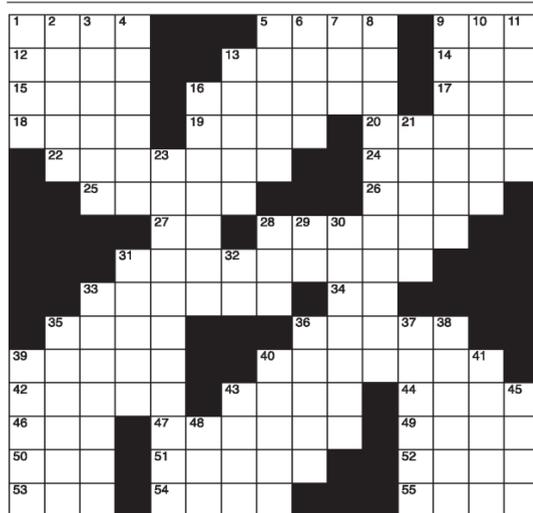

Cuban Santeros wary of Pope visit after JP II snub

HAVANA — They cast snail shells to read their fortunes, proudly wear colorful necklaces to ward off illness, dress all in white and dance in "bata" drum ceremonies.

But although their Afro-Cuban Santeria religion owes much to Roman Catholicism, many are decidedly unenthusiastic about Pope Benedict XVI's

March 26-28 tour of Cuba, even if it is being hailed as a watershed moment for a church seeking to boost its influence on this Communist-run island.

Santero priests still remember the last time a pontiff came to town — and flatly refused to meet with them. They are expecting no better treatment this time, and some are openly disappointed. Their religion is by far the most popular on

the island, with adherents outnumbering practicing mainstream Catholics 8-1. Yet as far as the Catholic church is concerned, "we live in the basement, where nobody sees us," said Lazaro Cuesta, a Santero high priest with a strong grip and a penetrating gaze.

"We have already seen one pope visit ... and at no moment did he see fit to talk to us."

Cuesta's bitterness stems from what many Santeria leaders see as an unforgivable snub by Pope John Paul II during his historic 1998 tour.

Before that visit, Santero high priests, or "babalawo," led a daylong ceremony to ask the spirits to protect John Paul and make his trip a success. As men, women and children danced to the throb of African drums, the priests blew cigar smoke and spat consecrated alcohol to salute the dead.

But while the pope met with Evangelicals, Orthodox leaders and representatives of the island's minuscule Jewish community, he never deigned to meet with the Santeria practitioners who had danced for his good health, nor even to acknowledge their faith.

Experts say as many as 80 percent of islanders observe some kind of Afro-Cuban religion, be it Santeria, which is more properly known as Regla de Ocha-Ifaor, or one of its lesser-known siblings. Practicing Catholics number fewer than 10 percent, and as elsewhere in Latin America, that share is under assault from conversions to Protestant and evangelical

denominations.

The 84-year-old pope's schedule is considerably shorter than John Paul's five-day visit was, and it includes no events with Santeros, or leaders of any other religions for that matter.

A Vatican spokesman, the Rev. Federico Lombardi, said Benedict's schedule could still be tweaked, but he absolutely ruled out a meeting with Santeria representatives.

Lombardi said Santeria does not have an "institutional leadership," which the Vatican is used to dealing with in cases when it arranges meetings with other religions.

"It is not a church" in the traditional sense, Lombardi said.

A decision not to meet with Santeros is in keeping with Benedict's history of vehement opposition to any whiff of syncretism — the combining of different beliefs and practices — on the ground that it could somehow imply that all faiths are equal.

Some also blame historical racism toward Santeria's Native American and African traditions. The pope may oppose these traditions, but they are an integral part of islanders' daily life, even that of its Catholics. All Cubans know that a woman dressed in yellow honors Ochum, a patron of feminine sensuality related in Catholicism to the Virgin of Charity. Believers crawl on hands and knees in processions of homage to Babalu-Aye, or St. Lazarus, protector of the sick. Relations between

Santeros and Catholics have improved since the early days of the island's 1950 revolution, when Afro-Cuban worshippers were ostracized by both the church and the Communist Party, and those who dared to attend Mass decked out in all-white Santero garb were routinely ejected. However, priests still give homilies critical of Afro-Cuban religious tradition.

The two faiths have arrived at a tense coexistence while inhabiting dramatically different spaces in island society. Cardinal Jaime Ortega, the head of the Catholic church in Cuba, consults with President Raul Castro on weighty political matters; Santero babalawos tend to the spiritual needs of the majority. Neither side talks to the other.

Scholars say Santeria, which was imported to Cuba through slaves brought from the Yoruba tribe of Nigeria, remains on the political margins due to its scattered, nonhierarchical nature, centuries of taboo and the latent racism that keeps Afro-Cuban faiths from being fully accepted in the fraternity of religions.

"Santeria is as much a religion as any other," said University of Havana ethnologist Maria Ileana Faguaga Iglesias. But "its structure is not vertical; it does not have a maximum leader; it has no buildings and it has never been part of any political power."

When it first emerged on the island, prohibitions forced Santeria practitioners to hide their worship of "orishas," or spirits, behind the names of

Catholic saints.

During Spanish rule and in the early years of the republic, Santeros had no choice but to accept Catholic baptism since church parishes were the only ones keeping birth registries.

"Historically, at some point all Santeros had some Catholic practice. The Catholic Church was power and was official, and others were persecuted," Faguaga said.

By the end of the 19th century, Santeria began emerging from underground. Today, it flourishes openly and has spread through emigration to the U.S., Puerto Rico, Venezuela and elsewhere.

Santeria "is very extended among the people, more so than when I was young," said Monsignor Carlos Manuel de Cespedes, vicar general of Havana and great-grandson of one of Cuba's founding fathers. "Not just in people of African origin, but also in people of European origin, whites, who today are also Santeros."

Santeros nevertheless took it as just another sign that on an island with a white majority, some still see it as a slave-barracks faith, an idea that goes against Cuban ideals of respect for diversity.

John Paul's decision to ignore the Santeros, Cuesta said, was a decision "to deny our national patrimony ... brought to us by men in chains who arrived as slaves in this country."

If there are rifts in your family, do your best to heal them, and strive to help your family and always be there in times of need. We should have this same attitude to our extended family, to our aunts and uncles, nieces and nephews, and even distant cousins. But, we should also realize that we are all God's children and thus part of the human family. No doubt it pains God to see his children fighting and killing each other, no less than it pains human parents when they see their children fighting.


