BOCC reconsiders impact fees

Attorney to draw up ordinance reducing residential construction fees

CHIPLEY — The Washington County Board of County Commissioners on Thursday sent Attorney Jeff Goodman back to the drawing board over a proposed ordinance that would have eliminated impact

fees on residential construction for two years.

District 3 County Commissioner Charles Brock brought up the subject of lowering impact fees at the last commission meeting, and the panel asked Goodman to draw up an ordinance lessening impact fees for residential construction.

Brock said the fees are about

\$1,500, and that is a lot of money for young couples just starting out to have to come up with.

The ordinance would not have affected impact fees for commercial construction.

During the public hearing portion of the meeting, however, the wisdom of doing away with county revenue, however small, was

questioned.

“I don’t think taking away any revenue when the county hasn’t given raises in what, six or seven years, is a good idea,” said Roger Hagan, county emergency manager.

Commissioner Joel Pate agreed.

Diver’s family rescinds reward

COLLIERVILLE, Tenn. — The parents of Ben McDaniel, a 30-year-old cave diver who went missing after last seen diving in Vortex Spring almost two years ago, rescinded their \$30,000 reward for fear of inexperienced divers getting killed in search of their son.

This decision was made shortly after the death of 43-year-old Larry Higginbotham last month.

Holmes County Sheriff’s Office reported there was no indication that Higginbotham was in search of McDaniel when he drowned.

Marianna Fire Chief Byron Bennett assisted in the dive to recover Higginbotham’s body and said

rescinding the reward was "for the best."

"There have been a large number of expert divers from this area and all over the country who have searched every nook and cranny and inch of that cave, and unfortunately, we strongly believe that he is not in there," Bennett said. "There's so many people out there today that want to go out there and try to help, and when you get out there in a situation as dangerous as it is in those springs out in Vortex, you don't want to become the next victim."

"If this passes, I am not voting for any tax increase later," he said. "It's just not right."

The commissioners voted down the ordinance 3-2.

After the vote, Commissioner Todd Abbott said 95 percent of Florida counties had done away with or decreased their impact fees by 75 percent. The subject then was reintroduced as a motion to have Goodman come up with an ordinance lowering the impact fees on residential construction.

"How much would you like it lowered, Mr. Brock?" Commission Chairman Hulan Carter asked.

"Fifty percent?" Brock said. Abbott also suggested the reduction just be for 12 months.

Goodman said he would rewrite the ordinance and bring it back before the commissioners in May.

The commissioners also voted to accept a settlement in a 5-year-old, multi-lawsuit litigation with the owners of Sikes Sand Mines. As part of the settlement, the board voted to grant a special exception application, which originally had been denied to the mine in 2007.

Goodman said once the judge signs off on the settlement, the details of the agreement will be made public.

said. "Notably, some of the projects that resulted in enormous benefits for the county have included more efficient and advanced fire and medical services (establishment of 911), youth recreation improvements (addition of new parks and boat landings), securing SCOP (Small County Outreach Program) funding for the resurfacing of approximately 300 miles of county secondary roads, additional road paving through CBG (Community Block Grant) funding, improved and expanded road and bridge department, implementation of recycling and waste management programs, and increased senior citizen services," Brock said.

Brock also serves on the Tri-County Board of Directors and is an active supporter of the Council on Aging.

"During my tenure as a commissioner, I am especial-

ly proud of the construction of two new county libraries, servicing all ages, and the continued improvement of health care as a result of the progress made by Northwest Florida Community Hospital," Brock said. "I want the people to know that the accomplishments achieved during by years of service have not been made alone. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the former and current commissioners and county employees for all their hard work on many projects that have resulted in huge benefits for our county."

"I realize that our county has many challenges to face in the years to come, and if we are to remain a great place to live and work, we will need to support our local businesses and bring additional jobs to the area," Brock said. "I believe my experience,

particularly in the areas of governmental regulations and funding allocations, have equipped me with the skills to meet these challenges head on."

Brock is a lifelong resident of Vernon. He attended Vernon High School and Chipola State College. He has four children, who all live and work in Washington County. He is a member of Ebenezer Baptist Church.

"I have children and grandchildren who live in Washington County, and I want them to be able to enjoy this great county long after I'm gone," Brock said. "I have always been a very dedicated commissioner and have worked full time in my elected position. I would like to ask the people of Washington County for their continued support as I begin the process to seek re-election for District 3."

71-year-old former Marine ElliptiGos coast to coast

BONIFAY — Rick Hermelin is a 71-year-old former Marine, who has made his newest challenge a 100-day, 3,000-mile run from coast to coast on an ElliptiGo to raise money for the Semper Fi Fund. The Semper Fi Fund is a nonprofit fund set up to assist the injured or critically ill members of the U.S. Armed Forces and their families.

Hermelin began his journey at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in Parris Island, S.C., on March 23 and is planning on finishing his journey in 100 days, which will land him at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in San Diego on June 30, 2012.

"I'm a former Marine and started in San Diego on March 23, 1959," said Hermelin. "I served for four years, from 1959 to 1963 as

an Aviation Communications Technician."

Hermelin said that he wanted to stay active and it wasn't long before he got a taste and a passion for running.

"It took me 35 years, but I achieved my goal of 100 marathons, 100 half-marathons and 100 10K races," he said. "I wasn't done yet, I needed a new goal, I needed a new challenge."

It just so happened that a friend of his had a love for bicycling but could no longer bicycle because of issues with his lower back, so instead he switched to the ElliptiGo, a machine where you stand up straight and peddle.

"It reduces impact without taking away from cardio," said Hermelin.

He said it wasn't long ago that he heard of a program to raise funds for injured Marines and coincidentally the program was

based in San Diego.

It wasn't long after that he started talking with the founder of ElliptiGo and former Marine Bryan Pate and soon ElliptiGo became his main sponsor for his newest challenge.

"It's amazing how everything fell together, I needed a new challenge, I always wanted to go from coast to coast and now I had worthy cause and a sponsor," said Hermelin. "I'm still in awe at how this all worked out."

His journey has brought him through so many homes and agencies that are more than willing to help, he said.

"I've been hosted by individuals, former Marines, stayed with some great families and even some fire facilities," said Hermelin. "They've all been so very kind and generous."

During his stay in Chipley he was hosted by The

Armstrong House, a ministry of the West Florida Baptist Association.

"This is a chance for me to meet people, real people," said Hermelin. "I could've stayed in hotels, but as an engineer I know what it's like to stay in hotels and you don't meet very many people that way."

He said it was important to meet people in order to spread awareness of the Semper Fi Fund.

Hermelin said he set the goal at \$10,000.

In the past week, I've had the privilege of playing instrumental music twice. In one case, the songs were religious tunes, and in the second case,

they were secular classical numbers. I've always felt an intense spiritual connection to music, so even the non-religious music left me with a sense of awe. For me, music and art provide very strong points of connection to the Divine. The truth is, nearly any interest can be transformed into something sacred. Opportunities for religious life don't end at the door of one's house of worship. Everyday activities can be turned into spiritual experiences, and that includes hobbies and

pastimes.

A friend once told me that the most important thing he ever learned from his parents is the importance of cultivating a "passion." That passion can be a hobby, sport, philosophy or anything else, as long as it thoroughly captivates your interest. For some people it might be photography, while for others, it could be horse riding, sailing, gardening or computers. Whether you enjoy quilting, golf or writing poetry, these activities can become spiritual experiences.

The arts are particularly adaptable to spirituality, as evidenced by the immense global output of sacred art, literature and music. Religion has been responsible for the production of some of the finest art the world has ever known. But if you're not the artistic type, don't worry. Whatever

your passion is, it can provide a path to spiritual awareness.

Some pursuits naturally lend themselves to religious reflection, while others may require slightly more effort. For instance, if you're into collecting objects, such as stamps or figurines, it might seem like a bit of a stretch to turn it into an opportunity for spiritual reflection. But stop for a moment and imagine what it took to bring these items into your home. Pick up any random piece from your collection, and think about how it provides a direct connection to the hundreds of people who may have handled it before it came into your possession. People conceived of these objects in their minds, made them, packaged them, shipped them, sold them, and may possibly have owned them before you. Right there, you have an incredible chain of human beings to whom

you are now connected, simply because you own this item. Many religious teachings involve the realization that all people are interconnected, not only with each other, but with God. Take a moment to wish blessings upon all of these individuals to whom you are now connected, your fellow children of God, the amazing and unique beings whose efforts have resulted in your ownership of this single object.

If you're a farmer or gardener, ponder what really goes into every flower, vegetable, fruit or berry that you grow. Nearly everything the farmer or gardener touches is a product of the divine gifts of sunlight and rain. This is also true of livestock. They are also products of both nature and the farmer's care. Nature is the handiwork of heaven, and there's nothing as intensely attuned to nature as nurturing plants and animals. Simply watching

a seedling push its way through the ground is a religious experience beyond compare. Take a moment to bless the plants, animals and people whose lives are being sustained by your efforts.

If your work or hobby involves making products for others, bless those products. It doesn't require a huge ritual. Say a little prayer over them, or even just send your best wishes to whoever receives these items next. It doesn't matter what you're making, whether you're knitting a shawl, working in a furniture factory, or selling someone a hot dog at a convenience store. Somebody will be using these objects, and because of that, you have an automatic connection to them, whether they realize it or not. Envision them as fellow creations of the Almighty, because that's precisely what they are. You are not detached from them. You never were. The

trick is to remain mindful of it.

If nothing else, just be thankful for the sheer pleasure that you derive from your various activities, whether that pleasure comes from income or the joy experienced while doing them. Don't just go swimming; give thanks for the beautiful water in which you're immersed, the weather, the people with whom you're sharing your time, and the fact that you're healthy enough to be out in the water.

Consider the opportunities you have every day for realizing how interconnected you are to nature, humanity and God. There's nothing that people can do, no matter how seemingly trivial, that lacks this basic connection. Regardless of what you do in your daily work, or even in your spare time, there are always endless opportunities to reap the dual benefits of spiritual reflection and gratitude.

Wausau at odds with FDOT

WAUSAU — Wausau officials found themselves at odds with the Florida Department of Transportation when a grant-funded sidewalk project to George M. Rogers Recreation Complex was washed away in the recent heavy rains and DOT decided to send Wausau the bill for repairs.

The City Council heard about the situation during the April 12 meeting, and the council still is discussing ways of approaching the issue.

The council approved of the final reading of Ordinance 12-001, "establishing an ordinance stating how a golf cart may be safely oper-

ated on or across a public road or street."

This regulates how a golf cart can be operated on a county road or municipal street that has been designated by the county or municipality for the use of golf carts.

A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Wausau Town Hall.

Preble-Rish Inc., the town's engineering firm, gave an update on their current projects.

For the Rural Development Water System Improvements, "there will be a meeting held with Mayor Roger Dale Hagan and North Florida Construction to discuss items that the town is dissatisfied with. The punch list and the retainage pay application will not be approved until the town signs off on the proj-

ect," according to the engineer's report.

For the community development block grant well, "the pump and motor has been ordered."

For the energy grant, "the substantial completion meeting has been held and the punch list has been delivered to Guyson Construction for the Town Hall Improvements portion of the grant; the substantial completion meeting for Contract B was held April 13; and the town needs to hold a workshop prior to each of the next two Council meetings to develop an energy conservation strategy."

The council also approved of selling its surplus meters and to buying or seeking prices on a storage building.

VPK eligibility, registration under way

CHIPLEY — For Aiden Wheeler, his day starts as mom signs him in at Kids World in Chipley.

He and mom head into Miss Jesse Foxworth's voluntary pre-kindergarten classroom. Within seconds, Miss Jesse greets them with a big welcoming smile, and with a quick kiss goodbye from mom, Aiden heads straight to the colorful carpet for circle time to start his VPK day.

Each weekday, more than 250 4- and 5-year-olds start their days at one of 24 VPK classrooms across Washington and Holmes counties.

"I believe VPK helps lay a path for kindergarten," said Tanya Wheeler, Aiden's mom. "His participation here gives him interaction with other children as well as helps teach him concepts he might not learn at home." Tanya would know; Aiden is her second child to go through VPK.

Lynne Eldridge, executive director of the Early Learning Coalition of Northwest Florida, agreed. "This environment, with the teacher's facilitated support,

allows the receptors of the child's brain to perform at their best. What happens when the brain is performing at its best is learning.

"What makes VPK such an important experience for children is that participating in an early learning program helps the child and family prepare for the transition to formal education," she continued, noting that "parents have many different options to choose from when selecting a VPK provider. Private child care centers, faith-based centers and school districts all offer the VPK program. Today's parents have many possibilities and should be able to find a VPK program that suits their family's needs."

VPK is free and available to any child who is 4 on or before Sept. 1, 2012, and resides in the State of Florida.

The Early Learning Coalition of Northwest Florida is a nonprofit organization that exists to grow healthy children, parents and the relationship between them. It administers child care resources and referrals, school readiness and voluntary pre-kindergarten programs in a seven-county service area. 

Cook speaks about FCAT at Chipley Lions Club meeting

As FCAT week in Washington County continued, students worked hard to pass all the necessary requirements in order to stay on track for graduation. Meanwhile, both teachers and parents hoped their children would rise to the challenge and be successful in their academic endeavors. Yet some parents and children might get an unexpected surprise when they receive their FCAT scores.

The Florida Department of

Education has implemented a change in FCAT scoring designed to address the inequities of the previous version of the FCAT. Superintendent of Schools Sandra Cook took time out to discuss what this means for Washington County students last Thursday at the Chipley Lions Club meeting.

Under FCAT 1.0, students scoring a level 3 or 4 in elementary and middle school become a Level 2 in high school when the student's performance has not decreased and even when the student makes academic progress.

To deal with this issue, FCAT 2.0 has been created.

What does FCAT 2.0 mean for student performance? A significant portion of students who previously passed FCAT 1.0 will fail FCAT 2.0. This means that those students who fail will need to take remedial courses to bring their scores up in order to graduate. This makes for a busier schedule for students who might be trying to balance school work and extracurricular activities like football or band. So despite the fact that FCAT 2.0 is a more consistent

measure of a student's academic performance, some sacrifices will be made in order to transition to this new version of the test.

Overall, there are three major effects of FCAT 2.0 that will be felt throughout the county: School grades will fall significantly; there will be increased costs to school districts because of an increase in the number of remediation classes; and potential elimination of elective courses will be considered in order to accommodate an increase in remediation courses.

Cook reminded the audience that "lower FCAT test scores do not necessarily indicate that a student learned less this year than in prior years." With hard work on the part of students, parents and educators, this time of change can be less painful.

The Chipley Lions Clubs thanks Dr. Cook for bringing this important issue to the group and encourages anyone interested in becoming a member of the club to attend the meetings at noon second and fourth Thursdays at Patillo's.
