Chipley man arrested on fraud charges

CHIPLEY — A Chipley man was arrested May 17 in connection with felony fraud for using a fake ID to purchase pseudoephedrine pills, according to a police report.

Police say Glenn Stewart of Chipley used someone else's driver's license to purchase pseudoephedrine while Stewart was out on bond on a possession of meth charge. The person whose driver's license Stewart used is in state prison, according to police.

Stewart was booked back into the county jail on felony fraud charges, according to police.

The Chipley Police Department began investigating a case of fraud on May 16 when officers responded to a local retail store, where a man reportedly had used another person's driver's license as a form of identification to purchase pseudoephedrine pills.

Pseudoephedrine is an ingredient often used in making methamphetamine.

The determination that fraud might have happened came from officers interviewing store employees and viewing video surveillance, according to the report.

Trends in bank fraud are shifting from paper checks to electronic access, Andrews said. Phishing online is identity theft. The thief tries to compromise your password by using false emails or using malicious websites that ask you to click on a link. Never click

on unknown links. If an email comes from an unknown source or appears unusual, don't reply, but use the telephone to call the vendor. Thieves also use key logging tools to record your keystrokes.

Thieves also have been successful in a technique

called corporate account takeover, whereby they can divert funds to other destinations. The key to combating this kind of fraud is employee education. A key to protecting yourself is to not click on attachments to unknown emails and never to respond to any request

to provide account information or passwords either via phone or email.

When choosing passwords, avoid birth dates and family names. Use "@" instead of "a" and other special characters. Also, shred personal information before throwing paper away. A good suggestion is to use gift cards for Internet transactions.

It was also noted that you can receive a free credit report by going to annualcreditreport.com. There are three credit bureaus, Equifax, 800-525-6285, Experian, 888-397-3742, and Transunion, 800-680-7289. You can check with each of these companies to check your credit.

Credit card thieves also can use skimming devices to gather credit or debit card information, Andrews said. A good idea is to let the credit card company know when you travel because they watch for unusual charges from unusual locations.

Featured in March’s 2012 Spring Gardens & English Tea, the corner of Fifth and Forrest at Shiver’s Park is a welcoming sight to folks visiting the park. Most any day you drive or walk by 750 Fifth St., you will see Edwina Showers out working in her cottage garden. Tom-Tom the yellow cat sashayed by recently as Edwina remarked, “I spend a lot of time out here. There’s always something to do — weeding, mulching, dividing, fertilizing, watering, and transplanting — the list goes on and on. My garden keeps me busy, but it’s also very relaxing!”

Milton Brown presented the formal request to the council and answered any questions they had. Brown explained how the tobacco industry specifically targets and manipulates our youth with candy flavored tobacco products.

The board unanimously passed the resolution. With the Caryville resolution passed, Washington County became the first county in Florida to have all their municipalities as well as the County Commissioners pass resolutions and proclamations requesting retailers not to sell candy flavored tobacco.
