FIRE One killed, one injured

CHIPLEY — One person died and another was treated for smoke inhalation when three people were trapped in a burning building in Washington County near the Chipley city limits on June 29.

Chipley Fire Chief Floyd Aycock said he believes it was an electrical fire that destroyed the building on South Boulevard.

"It was an out building with an apartment in it," the fire chief said Friday.

The fire department responded to the fire at about 10:30 p.m. on June 29. "There were three people present at the time."

The third person was not treated for smoke inhalation. No names have been released by officials.

"I'm waiting on the fire marshal's report before I can release anything else."

The building was a total loss, Aycock said.

Kiwanis Club honors Chuck Yates

CHIPLEY — World War II veteran Paul Gordy was the guest speaker July 3 at the Chipley Kiwanis Club for the club's Independence Day lunch.

Before the main program, the Kiwanis club presented Co. Chuck Yates, USMC (Ret.), with a plaque honoring his sixteen years of service with the Chipley Kiwanis Club. The plaque was presented by Bruce Christmas.

After Memorial Day, Paul Gordy, a World War II veteran and pilot of B-17 bombers with the 8th Air Force spoke to the club about the B-17 aircraft and his last mission in World War II — a mission in which he was shot down and captured by the Germans. He returned this past Tuesday for the club's Independence Day lunch to share with the club his experiences as a Prisoner of War.

After his B-17 aircraft was hit with anti-aircraft fire on July 19, 1943, Mr. Gordy and his crew bailed out (parachuted) over the North Sea. A German Search and Rescue Aircraft picked him, along with 6 of his crewmembers, up after spending 12 hours in the North Sea. Three of his crewmembers were never found.

A German colonel initially interrogated Mr. Gordy. Mr. Gordy was impressed with the German's command of English and queried the German only to learn that the Colonel had graduated from Princeton University. Mr. Gordy shared that although all he would tell the German was his name, rank, and serial number, that the Germans had a book with all of the information on the 8th U.S. Air Force. The Colonel already knew much about Mr. Gordy's aircraft and squadron.

About a week after his capture, Mr. Gordy and his crew were

moved from the coast, through Frankfurt, and on to Stalag Luft 3, a prisoner-of-war camp in Poland. Mr. Gordy remained there for much of the war.

Upon Mr. Gordy's initial arrival, Stalag Luft 3 held many British POWs. And, to his surprise, Mr. Gordy met an acquaintance from DeFuniak Springs. But, as the war continued, so many U.S. airmen were being shot down and captured that Stalag Luft 3 was expanded to accommodate the increasingly large number of POWs. Eventually, the POWs were segregated by nationality and rank.

The POWs organized themselves as a military unit and each man had assigned duties. Not having any experience as POWs, the men had to learn to operate as a team and take care of each other. Food was scarce and consisted mostly of soup, potatoes, and cabbage. If the men received any meat at all, it was always horse meat.

The men wore only the clothes that they had on when captured. The clothes that Mr. Gordy was wearing when shot down were the only clothes he wore for the first 3 to 4 months of captivity. The men lived in open-style barracks. Mr. Gordy had 15 roommates who slept in bunk beds that were three-beds high. After one-half year, Mr. Gordy's brother was also captured and placed in the same POW camp as Mr. Gordy.

Occasionally the men would receive a "care package" from the Red Cross that contained spam, soap, chocolate, and other items not provided by the Germans. Mr. Gordy stressed that he was in a POW camp, not a concentration camp of the sort used in the genocide of the Jews. And, the Germans had signed the Geneva

Convention that dealt with prisoners-of-war and their treatment. Life was very harsh and unpleasant, but the U.S. and British POWs held by the Germans were not tortured or killed.

So many U.S. bombers were shot down because the U.S. and British fighter aircraft did not have enough fuel to escort the bombers all the way to their targets and back. Once the allied fighters left the bombers to return to base, the U.S. bombers were extremely vulnerable to German fighters and anti-aircraft fire. On one single raid into southern France, 60 U.S. bombers were shot down. The total airman shot down on this one raid was 600.

As the war continued, and the Russians advanced from the East into Poland, Mr. Gordy was moved from Stalag Luft 3 to Nuremberg, Germany. In Nuremberg, he endured 2 months of non-stop bombing by U.S. and British forces as the allies continued to hammer the

Germans. He recounted seeing up to 50 U.S. bombers shot down and exploding. The British flew at night and the POWs could see tremendous flashes as the bombers exploded in the air. Mr. Gordy stated that to this day he still will not attend a fireworks show.

Mr. Gordy was finally liberated by General Patton's army on April 29, 1945. With him were another 90,000 U.S. and British POWs.

As we celebrate Independence Day, it is sobering to be reminded of the sacrifices made by so many over the history of our country to ensure we maintain our independence.

Juveniles cause problems on Fourth of July

CHIPLEY — The Fourth of July brought more than burgers, celebrations and summer heat — for the Chipley Police Department the Fourth brought headaches.

"We didn't send out an announcement this year, we figured as long as they kept it orderly and safe, everything would be OK," Police Chief Kevin Crews told the City Council in the council's workshop on Thursday. This year, the children decided orderly and safe weren't going to happen.

"We had a group of 30 or more kids from both the north and south sides of town shooting fireworks at cars and houses, some of those kids were as young as five years old," Crews said.

"When we have complaints, we have to go out and investigate them," Crews

said. The children were reportedly shooting fireworks at cars and houses.

One group even fired fireworks at a Chipley Police officer from two sides of the street as he exited his vehicle, then they ran from the officer. A back-up officer arrived on the scene and helped apprehend a few of the children.

"What we ran into last night were groups of 12-15 year olds, some 10 year olds, and even some 5-6 year olds running around shooting fireworks with no supervision," the chief said.

Among the children apprehended for shooting fireworks at the officer was a 10-year-old girl, who had gotten scratched up on her arm while fleeing police through the woods.

"This morning the girl's momma was in my office, angry, so I had to deal with that," Crews said. "If you run through the woods in

the dark, fleeing the police, you're likely to get scratched up."

In shooting fireworks at the officer, not only could the officer have been injured, but the children could have been injured more seriously trying to flee, the chief said.

"Is there anything that you could do with the parents?" Council Member Kevin Russell asked.

"Undoubtedly not, but I would if I could," Crews said.

In other business, City Administrator Dan Miner reported that CSX work crews were supposed to be in Chipley by the middle to end of July to work on the much-neglected railroad crossings. The city has been trying to get CSX assistance in repairing some of the crossing for months. "There is supposed to be a crew in Milton working this way, but I don't want to jinx it," Miner said.

Miner also recommended the council change the city general election run-off date to Sept. 11 since the city elections and the county elections are in close proximity this year. The city general election is Aug. 7, and the 2012 Primary Election is Aug. 14.

"I went by Carol Griffin's (Supervisor of Elections) office and she suggested the council consider moving the election from August to March in the future," Russell said.

"I know, people have been mentioning it to me, too," Mayor Linda Cain said. "It is definitely something we will have to discuss."

The council also briefly met in executive session with City Attorney Michelle Taggart to discuss a possible settlement and an upcoming trial in the matter of two pending cases, Stoyak v. Chipley and Harrell v. Chipley.

Morals aren't one size fits all

All sane people have morals. This is true whether they're religious or not. Unless you're a complete psychopath, you've got some sort of moral compass.

As a child, I was told by well-meaning (but ill-informed) people that non-religious individuals don't have morals. I figured out as a young child that was false. I couldn't help but notice that the local atheists weren't running amok in the streets and burning the entire city down. I was even told that all non-Christians are devoid of morals, but that, too, proved to be false. I saw no Hindu gangs, no Pagan lynch mobs, not even a Buddhist shaking me down for lunch money. The fact is, most human beings, regardless of belief, understand that certain acts are universally abhorrent. That's why there are legal prohibitions against murder in nearly every culture. When people do end up having moral lapses, they're

often found to be religious, which puts yet another dent in the old argument about non-believers being amoral. Prisons are full to the bursting point with people who profess religious belief.

At any rate, how are your morals? Have you taken a moral inventory lately? Try it. What acts are so offensive to you, personally, that you're willing to fight against them? What are some moral principles that you wish everyone had? What are "deal breakers" for you, things you simply will not tolerate? Get a sheet of paper and start writing them down. The results may surprise you. You may very well discover, as I did, that your morality changes as you age. Nobody thinks the same way in their senior years that they did as a teenager. It's perfectly acceptable, if not absolutely necessary, to change your mind about certain issues as time goes by.

Do your morals match

your religion? I left a religious group after many years. I eventually realized that their teachings violated several of my moral principles. Leaving was difficult, but I learned something from the experience. I learned that I am not obligated to remain with groups I find unethical. Even within the past year, I've encountered organizations and individuals whose teachings I find morally questionable. In my younger years, I might have stuck around in an attempt to be polite. As I age, though, I'm becoming acutely aware that time is both precious and fleeting. Spending that time tiptoeing around unethical people, no matter how nice they might seem on the surface, is a serious waste of the remaining time I have left on this planet.

What I find immoral and what you find immoral

may be different. There are certain widespread viewpoints I'll never subscribe to. Don't

expect me to support groups that advocate censorship, anti-intellectualism, gender bias, or discrimination on the grounds of race, religion or sexuality. I'm opposed to forcing religious beliefs upon others, including children. Any religious organization that starts dictating how people should vote needs to have an exit sign clearly marked, because I'll be looking for it. But that's just me. You may support opposite viewpoints, in which case, I'll still let you take me to lunch. A difference of opinion isn't enough to chase me off, because it's important for different sides to try understanding each other.

It's crucial to get your morals straightened out. Find beliefs and

affiliations that align with your morals, rather than changing your morals to suit whatever group you're joining. If you find yourself abandoning your morals just to keep up with your neighbors, something's wrong. And don't condone moral lapses just because an authority figure does. Just because a teacher, preacher or police officer makes a racist joke doesn't make it right. If a community leader supports something you find morally objectionable, it may become necessary to speak out. It can be frightening to go against the status quo, but if you feel that something is wrong, stand up for what you believe in.

The reason it's important to work out your moral stance is because, as humans, our actions are interconnected. When people refuse to speak out against injustice, there can be dire results. This is how wars and genocide are both

started and perpetuated. When a certain group becomes targeted for discriminatory treatment, the larger community often thinks that such policies could never be turned around and used against them. But when you start playing the game of denying rights to others, don't act surprised when your own rights are next on the chopping block.

It's important to take stock of your morals. Proclaiming that you're a moral person means nothing when you don't even know what your moral position actually is. There's no such thing as second-hand shopping when it comes to morality. Sure, there are certain things that your parents, teachers and others may have told you are moral or immoral — but what if they're wrong? Remember, other people don't get to decide your values for you. That's something that you'll have to determine on your own.


