Judge: No water for Bay County

Bay will not be allowed to drill wells in Washington

TALLAHASSEE — Bay County failed to demonstrate it is entitled to draw water from a well field near

the Washington County border, an administrative law judge ruled Thursday.

Judge David Maloney, in a 95-page ruling on evidence presented during several days of hearings last fall, recommended the Northwest Florida Water Management District deny Bay County a permit to drill wells that opponents said would threaten the lakes of Sand Hills.

The proposed wells have been controversial since Bay County applied for a permit to drill them in

March 2010. Bay County initially wanted a permit to draw an average 10 million gallons of water per day — later decreased to 5 million gallons per day — from the Floridan Aquifer for 20 years. Washington County and The Knight Trust, which owns a considerable amount of land on both sides of the county line, appealed to the Division of Administrative Hearings.

“It’s a complicated issue, but it comes down to the basic questions: Do you need the water, and will it cause environmental harm?” said

Doug Manson, lead attorney for the Knight Trust. “And they failed on both of those.”

Maloney wrote that Bay County and the district would need to establish three things for the permit to be granted: that there was a need for the water in Bay County, that the drawdown of water wouldn’t affect the environment and that it was in the public interest to allow Bay County to take the water.

Both parties hired numerous

BOCC moves ahead with boat ramp fees ordinance

CHIPLEY — Using a boat ramp in Washington County might start costing fishermen \$40 a year.

The Board of County Commissioners asked Attorney Jeff Goodman to come up with an ordinance instituting county park user fees of \$40 per year for a family of four during the BOCC meeting on July 19.

The fee would include boat ramp usage and camping at county maintained parks.

Public Services Director David Corbin told the board that every Monday, his staff of three is busy trying to collect all the garbage left at county parks over the weekends.

The county Parks and Recreation Department maintains public parks and boat landings along the banks of the Choctawhatchee River, Holmes Creek and on many

lakes, according to the county website.

According to the website, the county has constructed several boat ramps with monies from Florida Boating Improvement Program grants — grants that are administered through the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission.

Cedar Tree Boat Ramp, Jenkins Landing Boat Ramp and Stewart Lake Boat Ramp are some of the boat ramps either refurbished or constructed through these grants,

according to the website. There are also boat ramp facilities at Two Creek Estates (Fanning Branch Park) and Litard Log.

The department employs inmate supervisors and use inmate labor to construct, refurbish and upkeep the parks and boat landings, according to the website.

The department also is responsible for the various county parks and local community centers,

including Hicks Lake Park, St. Joseph Community Center, Blue Lake Park and Daniels Lake Sports, Campbell Park, between Vernon and Ebro, and Hunter Park in Vernon.

Community centers include Blue Lake Community Center; Five Points Community Center; Hinson Crossroads Community Center; Orange Hill Community Center and the Sunny Hills Community Center.

"Our budget is only \$6,000 a year," Corbin said. "We can only do what we can do."

"I know we need this, but I don't want to shove it through in just one meeting," said

County Commissioner Charles Brock.

Chairman Hulan Carter said the county would need a new ordinance setting the user fees for county facilities.

Commissioner Todd Abbott compared using boat landings to using golf courses. "Every time I go play golf, I expect to pay," he said. "I wouldn't expect the golf course to be provided for free."

"I have no problem charging \$40," Commissioner Donnie Strickland said as he made the motion for the county attorney to draw up an ordinance.

Goodman said he would bring the use fee ordinance back to the BOCC in August.

The One-Stop career center and the district data center are housed in the historic high school, along with the Spanish Trail Playhouse.

The mold inspections were requested after district employees working in the old high school reported health concerns.

Much of the damage came from water leaks that were not repaired or from HVAC lines that were backed up and overflowing, Zak said, resulting in water and mold growth.

"The north wing of the old high school was not inhabited, and the high temperatures in there contributed to the mold growth," he said.

Superintendent Sandra Cook said the air-conditioning had been shut off to the north wing of the building.

There are two layers of ceiling tiles in the old school, and most of the mold is found in the upper level of tiles, Zak said.

"By your report here, do you think we need to move out of the building?" Board Member Susan Roberts asked.

"Everyone has a different reaction to mold," Zak said. "But there is not extreme mold proliferation in the air."

Zak said the report recommends "all water and mold affected building materials should be properly remediated." GLE does not provide cleaning services, he said, but they do recommend steps to take to correct the mold problem.

"It is a standard remediation protocol," he said. "We have a general scope of the work that needs to be conducted."

"When you walk through the Spanish Trail Playhouse side of the building, it's exciting," Board Member Terry Ellis said. "You see an example of a com-

munity coming together to make things happen."

The theater was renovated with more than \$21,000 in donations, and none of the money used came from tax dollars or grant funds, said Kevin Russell, director of the Spanish Trail Playhouse.

"If you want to see what can be done with an old high school, I recommend you go to Hartford, Ala., and look at the old Geneva County High School," said Board Member Wayne Saunders. "The city of Vernon has not done a bad job, either."

Board Member Pam Cates said if the school district does as some point move our programs out of the old high school, she would like to see it turned over to the Spanish Trail Playhouse with a stipulation that if they ever moved out, then it would revert back to the school district.

Russell said he would like to see the old high school become a community arts center one day, with classrooms available for teachers of art and music classes and workshops.

Board Member Vann Brock said it would have been very difficult to relocate the data center, especially with school about to be back in session.

"We live in the South, mold is always a problem," Roberts said. "We had to be concerned about our people's health, and this is wonderful news for us. Now we know the direction we need to head in."

Cook said she was not on a vendetta against the theater nor was she trying to bulldoze the old high school. "I am 100 percent in support of the Spanish Trail Playhouse," she said.

The next step will be for the district to seek an estimate on the cost of clearing the building of mold.

experts, who testified to the environmental effects; Maloney found the Knight Trust's experts and evidence more convincing.

According to the ruling, Bay County and the district couldn't establish with the evidence they presented that Bay County needed the water because the county already has a water supply sufficient to meet the demands of the population. The plan was for the well field to serve as a backup water supply in the event the Deer Point Lake reservoir; Bay County's current water source, was contaminated.

Maloney also decided taking the water would not be in the public interest, in part because the permit didn't restrict emergency withdrawals to "an amount necessary for essential use."

"The failure to show what the impacts will be to these natural systems of extraordinary ecological and environmental quality is weighty when balanced against a need that doesn't exist and that may never arise..." Maloney wrote.

Representatives of Bay County and

the Northwest Florida Water Management District declined to comment on the ruling Thursday.

"This is a win for the environment and a win for the people who live in the lakes region," said Audubon Florida executive director Eric Draper, who testified during the hearings and worked to organize opposition to the permit among people who live near the lakes.

That the Knight Trust was involved and willing to contribute resources to opposing the permit was important, Draper said.

"It made all the difference, because they were able to hire all the experts," Draper said.

Manson said Maloney's factual findings were "very binding," but his recommendation could theoretically be ignored. Though he was reluctant to count chickens Thursday, he thinks Maloney's ruling should put the issue to rest.

"That will probably mean that there won't be a well field there for a long time," Manson said.

2 sentenced in armed robberies

CHIPLEY — Two teenagers have been convicted and sentenced for armed robberies committed in Chipley in 2011.

Sentenced were Tatjana Mimic, 15, of Jacksonville, and Dustin Dickens, 17, of Bonifay. Mimic received a sentence May 7 of 10 years in the Department of Corrections for armed robbery. Dickens received a sentence June 21 of three years in the DOC for armed robbery, followed by 12 years of probation, according to a report from the Chipley Police Department.

On June 8, 2011, Mimic entered Gorgeous Nails

Salon at 1611 Main St. in Chipley, where she produced two firearms and demanded all the money from the register, according to the report.

Mimic fled along with other subjects in the car. Investigators identified Mimic as being involved in several armed robberies, including the Chipley robbery and a robbery in Leon County.

On Nov. 13, 2011, Dickens entered the BP HandiMart at 1230 Main St. in Chipley, where he concealed his face and produced a firearm and demanded the money from the register drawer. Dickens then departed the store with cash from the register.

"We are happy to have these convictions and sentences," Police Chief Kevin Crews said. "The Chipley Police Department worked hard on these cases that turned out with great results. It is a shame that such young individuals have made such bad decisions so early in their lives that it will affect them for many years to come."

Former Chipley resident remembered

CHIPLEY — Former Chipley resident Mary Wells Perdue died in Pensacola July 8. She was a graduate of Vernon High School in 1947. She worked for the Florida State Welfare Department in Chipley.

She was born Feb. 15, 1928, in Caryville to Alex Wells and Arleva Cook Wells.

Mary was the fourth child born to this couple. The young family was forced to flee their Caryville home in the July 1929 flooding of the Choctawhatchee River. Almost all their household goods were destroyed, as were the belongings of many other families in the area. The family moved to West Bay Florida, where they became re-established and returned to Washington County in December of 1929.

Mary graduated from Vernon High School in the class of 1947 as valedictorian of the class. She worked in Chipley with the Florida State Welfare Department as it was known in those days. Mrs. Lillian (Jack) Hardin was her supervisor and continued to remember Mary fondly and often asked about her even in her declining years.

While living in Chipley, Mary met and married T. Julius Perdue, a Bell

Telephone Company employee who was assigned to temporary duty here from his home base in Pensacola. The marriage was held in Bethel Primitive Baptist Church on June 4, 1950. The couple lived their entire 62 years of marriage in Pensacola.

This lady was preceded in death by her parents and two brothers, Lee E. Wells and Parker Wells, and one sister, Arkie Wells Revel.

Surviving Mary Wells Purdue are her husband, Julius, sons, Stephen and wife Joyce of Chattanooga, Tenn., Dennis and wife Teri of Lynn Haven, Fla. She has one daughter, Lisa Perdue Szuch and husband Cliff of Gulf Breeze, Fla. The grandchildren are Jeremy Perdue and Ryan, Connor and Nathan Adams.

Other survivors include her brothers Rufus Wells of Ocala, Harrell Wells of Phenix City, Ala., John Alex Wells, Jr. of Pensacola and Carlton Wells and Joel Wells with Bonifay addresses. Her sisters are Wilma Wells Stubbs of Vernon, Imogene Wells Birge of Caryville and Annie Lou Wells Richard of Phenix City, Ala.

She has a host of cousins and other relatives in the Washington County area. Burial was in Bayview Memorial Park in Pensacola.

The same power that allowed us as children to transform an empty shipping box into a fortress or a distore ring into the crown jewels of England can still be a powerful force today. As busy adults, we tend to see cardboard boxes and rings from bubble gum machines as unwanted objects to be tossed away and forgotten, but it wasn't always like that. We were once able to see the possibilities contained within simple things.

Fortunately, it's never too late to regain a sense of curiosity and wonder.

Don't belittle anyone, especially children, for daydreaming. No great invention would've ever

been produced without it. True, there are times when we must shift our focus toward work, school or whatever's currently demanding our attention, but there's always

time for cultivating one's imagination. As for spirituality, it isn't merely about individual improvement but about improving the world in which we live. To that end, it is good idea to put our imaginations to work for the betterment of ourselves and others. We can not only undergo a personal spiritual transformation but can actively find ways to promote charity, peace, education and better ways in which to treat our fellow human beings.

adulthood. Keep telling your kids they're stupid and watch them start trying to live up to it in a desperate attempt to reinforce what they think you want from them.

As I said, imagination is powerful. Instead of misusing its powers to see those around you as failures, try transforming your perceptions of people. True, you might not see immediate change in those individuals—but it'll sure change you. You'll start treating people better, and will also waste less energy on nagging and belittling others.

What kind of a person have you become as a direct result of your thoughts? What's really in your mind and heart? Is your mind a garbage dump overflowing with bitterness and hatred or does your heart reflect the joy and light upon which your mind is continually focused? If you wish to change your heart, then change your mind. Turn your thoughts today toward envisioning an improved life, not only for yourself and your family but for the entire world.

CHIPLEY — Household size and income criteria will be used to determine eligibility for the program, and application cannot be approved unless it contains complete eligibility information. Once approved, meal benefits are good for an entire year. You need not notify the organization of changes in income and household size.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for fee or reduces-price meals, households must complete the application and return it to the school. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

Households that receive SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) or TANF (Temporary Assis-

tance for Needy Families) are required to list on the application only the child's name, SNAP/TANF case number and a signature of adult household member.

Foster children will receive free benefits regardless of the child's personal income or the income of the household.

Households with children who are considered migrants, homeless or run-away should contact the district liaison.

For the purpose of determining household size, deployed service members are considered a part of the household. Families should include the names of the deployed service members on their application. Report only that portion of the deployed service member's income made available to them or on their behalf to the family. Additionally, a housing allowance that is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative is not to be included as income.

All other households must provide the following information listed on the

application:

- Total household income listed by gross amount receives, type of income (e.g., wages, child support, etc.) and how often the income is received by each household member.

- Names of all household members — check "no income" box if applicable; if household member is a child, list school name for each.

- Signature of an adult household member certifying the information provided is correct and

- Social security number of the adult signing the application or the word "NONE" for this household member if he or she does not have a social security number.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the school should be contacted. Children of parents or guardians who become unemployed should also contact the school. For more information contact the District Liaison, Bobbie Dawson, ED., D., at 638-6222.
