

Scarecrow Contest slated for October

CHIPLEY — In your travels within the city of Chipley you may have noticed a few special “guests” hanging around.

The scarecrows that precede Chipley Garden Club’s scarecrow contest are beginning to show up around town. On Tuesday, Sept. 18, a “Build-a-Better-Scarecrow” workshop was held at the 7th Street Farmers Market behind the Washington County History Museum. Handouts were provided to participants as Club President Karen Roland demonstrated several techniques for building scarecrows.

The Second Annual Scarecrow Contest will be held on Saturday, Oct. 13, in conjunction with Washington County Historical Society’s Fall Into History Fest at the 7th Street

Roland discussed forms, supports, and different types of stuffing —

recycled shopping bags, crumpled newspaper, hay, etc. She also made suggestions for items to use as heads and hands, ways to decorate faces, scarecrow clothing and setting up venues.

“Use your imagination. It doesn’t have to be just two sticks and an old shirt. Think creatively,” Roland said. Gweneth Collins reviewed the contest rules with the participants and Edwina Showers demonstrated how to make a scarecrow from a tomato cage and a milk jug. Participants were also invited to tour the Washington Co. History Museum.

to make informed career choices and create a framework to increase the likelihood of their success in post-secondary STEM curricula or in the workplace,” according to paec.org. “Two significant by-products are the collaboration of students from across the state and the networks fostered among business, post-secondary, agency, military and education professionals.”

“What we need are STEM talent developers,” Crouch said.

More local businesses that can provide STEM opportunities for students are needed, Hardy said. “The Department of Transportation has been a great supporter of the program, but we can always use more opportunities.”

The FloridaLearns program will also enhance educators’ ability to provide instruction addressing specific learning needs and building on the strengths of each student, according to the website.

Chamber members also heard of the upcoming Chipley Garden Club second annual Scarecrow Contest, which will be held from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Oct. 13 at the Farmers Market on 7th Street.

“We’re really hoping this event will grow,” said Club President Gweneth Collins. “It’s a day of family fun, and we want to draw people to the Historical Society Museum.”

Collins said the museum preserves Chipley and Washington County history and visiting it “is like taking a trip down memory lane, if you grew up here.”

Businesses are also welcome to participate in the contest, and the scarecrows will be displayed around town which makes Chipley memorable to visitors.

“I had one lady say, when she learned that I was from Chipley, ‘Oh! That’s the little town with all the scarecrows,’” Collins said.

Washington County Schools Superintendent Sandra Cook also reminded Chamber members that the 11th annual “Pulling for Education” tractor pull would be held in Vernon on Oct. 13. The annual event raises scholarship money for local students.

“When you’re done looking at scarecrows, come on out,” she said. “If you haven’t been to a tractor pull, it’s really something, and there are usually some old tractors sitting there for you to look at, too.”

Vernon man dies in motorcycle accident

CHIPLEY — A Vernon man died after striking a culvert while riding his motorcycle in Walton County on Sept. 9, according to a Florida Highway Patrol report.

Michael M. Miller, 52, of Vernon was traveling

east on County Road 3280 when he failed to negotiate a curve, veering onto an unpaved shoulder, according to the report. His 2007 Soft-tail Harley Davidson motorcycle traveled about 100 feet on the shoulder before striking a culvert. The motorcycle over-

turned and rotated several times, causing Miller to be thrown from the bike.

The motorcycle came to rest on the eastbound shoulder of the road, while Miller came to rest in a drainage ditch containing water.

The ditch was just south

of the County Road 3280 eastbound lane, according to the report.

Miller was wearing a helmet.

He was taken to Pensacola Sacred Heart Hospital where he died of his injuries, according to the report.

“Nationally, the average is 2.6 officers per 1,000 population in a rural county,” Haddock said. “That would mean we’d need 65 sworn officers.” Currently the sheriff’s office has 32 sworn officers, or 1.3 officers per 1,000 residents.

The sheriff’s office would need to have 25 patrol deputies to meet nationally accepted law enforcement staffing statistics — the county currently has 16 patrol deputies.

Likewise, the average starting annual salary for a deputy sheriff in Florida is \$44,000, while the starting salary in Washington County is \$28,537.60.

“After taxes, insurance and all that is a net salary of \$15,352.22,” Haddock said. The starting salary for deputies has remained the same since 2006, he noted.

In the last 12 months, the sheriff’s office has lost eight deputies. Haddock estimated the cost of training a new deputy at \$7,817.89 — which means the loss of the eight deputies cost the county a total of \$62,543.12.

“What really hurts is the knowledge of the community and the people that walks out the door when we lose an officer after one, or five, or seven years,” Haddock said. “That knowledge is priceless.”

Meanwhile, demand for the sheriff’s office services is growing. Calls to the county increased from 6,754 calls in 2005 to 27,753 calls in 2011. So far in 2012, the county reports 18,270 calls for service as of July 31.

“Demand for services is not going down,” the sheriff said. “Calls for us, for fire and for EMS keep going up.”

“With the increase in calls, have you gotten more deputies?” Commissioner Todd Abbott asked.

“No sir, we’ve got less,” Haddock said. “We had 19 deputies last year. My goal is to get 21 officers.”

Haddock said ideally he would like to have seven officers per shift, instead of the five deputies per shift he now has for patrol. “We’ve had to cut back at the jail, we’ve cut back everywhere,” he said.

For 2012-13, the county has cut the sheriff’s office budget by \$150,505 and the department took a \$206,000 cut in 2011-12, according to the sheriff’s report. Since 2007, the sheriff’s office budget has been trimmed a total of \$643,170.

The sheriff’s office has generated a total of \$3,292, 093 since Haddock was elected in 2005, according to the sheriff’s report. The sheriff’s office collected \$179,355 in civil service fees, \$29,198 in jail subsistence fees, \$34,030 in jail medical reimbursement and \$3,049,510 in inmate housing contracts.

“That money goes back to the board, for you to spend as you see fit,” Haddock said. Medical reimbursement expenses are especially hard on the sheriff’s office, and Haddock commended Chairman Hulan Carter for the board’s work to help keep expenses under control.

“You have to provide medical services under the law,” Haddock said, “but they can get real expensive, real fast. We had one case where we had a heart cath inserted, twice.” That bill alone was about \$250,000, Haddock said.

The jail revenues also took a hit when the county lost its contract with the Department of Correction to house inmates. Abbott asked if the loss of the state contract would impact jail staffing.

“We can absorb the cut,” Haddock said. “We have 20 officers at the jail, which was designed for 26 officers.” The limited personnel means the number of inmates the jail can house is also limited. “Right now, we can provide about 150 meals,” Haddock said.

Haddock also said the sheriff’s office is looking into working with Washington-Holmes Technical Center to see about getting vehicles refurbished and back on the road to get more life out of the department fleet.

“We’re doing what we can,” Haddock said. “We’ve set our vision, and we’re looking forward, and I’ve told the staff we’re going to do what we can do.”

CHIPLEY — Edwina Showers of Chipley Garden Club presented the City of Chipley's September 2012 Yard of the Month to 617 Rustin Drive at the Washington County Chamber of Commerce meeting on Thursday. Mary and Kenneth Rustin have resided at this address since 1961. They have also earned the Yard of the Month award three times in the past — November 1999, October 2005 and February 2008. Driving by the first thing you notice is a well-maintained lawn and a circle driveway shaded by mature Bradford pear trees and a beautiful old holly tree covered with green ber-

ries. The beds beneath the trees feature Giant Lilyturf (evergreen liriopse) with its purple flower spikes and rows of bright red coleus. Lilyturf also lines a walkway passing by a birdbath and a sundial nestled in a bed of red Knockout roses and susanqua camellias. On both sides of the home, crepe myrtle trees lead your eye to backyard swings and hints of hidden gardens in the backyard. Accents are scattered throughout — a bed of yellow lantana, another of orange marigolds and variegated lilyturf, and yet another of nadina — and the North and South boundaries are lined with neatly trimmed burgundy loropetalum and azaleas hedges. The Rustins' yard can be called a "yard of many weeks, clusters of red ber-

ries will cover the holly tree and the crepe myrtles' leaves with turn orange, burgundy and bright red. Their Knockout roses will continue to bloom off and on all year. In the spring, the azaleas and camellias' dark pink flowers will pop open and, as Summer returns, the crepe myrtles will bloom and brighten up the yard. A little planning in your garden can result in years of beauty and Chipley Garden Club could be just the place to learn how to do it!
